If one reads the International column, he may think all stations reported are heard all of the time & that some people just have better sets or better locations. Some do have better sets etc. but this is not all. I listened numerous time for Romania on 755 @ 10pm. Usually I got nothing & then for a while Bogota came in on that channel & at first it fooled me, especially one night when they played Romany mx but I did get Romania for a short time some evenings. Night after night I could get Portugal at 5:30 or 6 & often until 7pm. Sometimes it came in well on 665, at others 755 was much better & at times 1034 was very good. I think there was one on 882 also. Even though I could hear these stations quite well, there was little reason to believe other TAs would be heard. TAs may be very good on one end of the band & poor on the other. Sometimes everything is open & then you nearly go crazy trying to figure out what to log. I am still of the old fashioned school that holds that best TA DX may be about three days before the full moon.
