Hi gang - greetings from the Land of Many Happy NRC Memories at Denver '63! I think the Convention was a success, & the thanks go to the 38 NRCers who registered at the Balboa. I won't give the details of the goings-on here, since a full Convention summary appears elsewhere in this issue, but I will mention that during one of our informal sessions at Big Al's we discussed the possibilities of initiating a new column in DX NEWS to facilitate mail service: Zip Codes Down the Dial. Thanks to Stef & David of Buffalo for the well-wishing telegram, & I would like to say Barbara & I are already looking forward very much to attending the '64 Convention in your city. Actually, I shouldn't say "Buffalo '64" in my Musing, because Buffalo is an Indian word & is therefore foreign. It would be more correct to say "Bison '64" in keeping with the new set of NRC rules, Rule 9 to be exact. DX-wise Dallas John (newest addition to the Denver area) & I heard British Honduras Broadcasting Service on 834 kc/s. (ex-830) around 8/20 for the first time on this new frequency. (Dallas heard it in Illinois). VOA-1178 continues to pound in after 6:30am EST antenna change. I'm looking forward to another fabulous DX season this year, spirited by the NRC. Say, I bought a new Sony 262SL four track mono tape recorder which performs very well. I have a Revere Stereo recorder in good condition (three years old) including foot switch, for sale at \$50 plus freight, if anyone is interested. I received one of my biggest DX thrills last month when I received a tape from 2NR-700 Australia containing a portion of a program dedicated to my distant reception, including my tape of 2NR, which was aired over the ABC Network. Also have a longer L, probably about 250'; running more or less E/W, with leadin off E end, but W end is anchored about 25' high in an Alder tree along creek, & consequently is not more than 10' off ground near center, so will have to get that up higher, or change completely. FM antenna about 75 or 80' high is very good on FM, but doesn't compare with Ls on AM. Together with a Jerrold FMX booster, this antenna delivers signals to Grundig RX of 2; FM stations to date; no Dx, but nevertheless, usually readable signals, ranging from KPDQ to S to CHQM/CBU to N. Favorite station is KLYN in Lynden, Wash. which is probably quite low power, judging from signal, but good mx programming during evening hours (quite limited broadcast hours). Don't believe I'll try to verify any FM stations, but will rather build an "ID Library" on tape of these: enough time involved in writing BCB reports (I hope!) that other types of reports (FM, SW, etc.) just about have to be dispensed with. 1. This season's Domestic Contest will begin at 12:01 a.m. on 9/15/63, and end at 11:59 p.m. on 7/15/64. Stations must be logged between the above dates and must be verified and reported to me by 8/15/64.
 - a. Two stations from each of the 50 States; D.C.; and each Province of Canada will be eligible. The first station from each State or Province will count ONE point; the second station will count THREE points, for a total of FOUR points possible in each State or Province.
 - b. Any Domestic Special TEST or DX for N.R.C. will count an additional THREE points. This station may also be counted for the first or second station in that State or Province.
2. All members of the N.R.C. are eligible. Entry fee is 25¢ and must be sent to your Contest Manager, ERNEST J. WESOLOWSKI, 1416 Pasadena Avenue, Omaha, Nebraska - 68107, before 12/1/63.
3. Final standings will be announced at the Annual N.R.C. Convention in 1964.
4. No station may be re-verified in this contest if first verified after 1/1/61.
5. The Contest Manager will issue the standings about every six weeks in DX NEWS. He also has the right to reject any station that a contestant may issue in error, and have the final decision. Any question that a contestant may ask must be sent along with a self-addressed, 4¢ post card.
6. List of Entries must include CALL LETTERS - FREQUENCY - LOCATION - DATES HEARD AND VERIFIED, and the VERIE-SIGNER'S NAME! Each person SHOULD report his additions at least every TWO months. Do not send me the verie unless I ask for it.
7. Prizes will be awarded to at least the first FOUR winners. Prizes will depend on the number of entrants. This year there are TWO MYSTERY STATIONS worth 100 Report Forms to the first DXer who verifies one of the MYSTERY stations. Only ONE person may win this prize!
8. All Stations used for this contest must be logged within a ten-mile radius from the contestant's home address in his city.
9. The person in First Place in this contest may not take First Place in the Letterama Contest. If so, he will become Second Place in Letterama.

CONTEST #2 - LETTERRAMA

This season's LETTERRAMA contest will begin and end the same times & dates as the Domestic Contest, above.

- a. Stations eligible for LETTERRAMA are all stations in the 50 States, D.C.; and the Dominion of Canada.
 - b. There shall be NO bonus points given for NRC Specials or completed tiers.
 - c. The important thing to keep in mind is that the LAST LETTER of the U.S. and Canadian calls are the determining letters. For instance, in WCBA, the A is the determining letter; in CKWS, the S is the determining letter. The object of the contest is to build tiers and obtain as many points as possible. A tier is completed by obtaining a verification from 26 stations representing each letter of the alphabet. One must work to complete his first tier by obtaining a U.S. or Canadian verie for each letter of the alphabet. When one completes the first tier, in any order, he proceeds to the second tier, etc. Remember that K, W, or C calls can be mixed for each and every tier; such as for A one might use WCBA; for B; KDAB; for C, KABC; for D; CHAD; for I, WOI, etc. But remember, if a DXer has received veries from WCBA & CKDA for example that person must wait until the first tier has been completed before the other A verie can be counted for the second tier. So, it is easily seen that one stacks up points fast when tiers are completed. ONE point for each verie.
2. Rules #2-9 in the Domestic Contest (above) shall apply in this Contest also! Good luck to all!

- August 21 The first delegate arrived in the person of Phil Jacobs.
- August 23-26 A preliminary convention tour was made to the western slope of Colorado by Roller, Jacobs and Godwin.
- August 28 Delegates began arriving and by evening numbered 19. An informal DX get-to-gether was held in the conference room and then later in Larry Schwartz's room.
- August 29 The convention officially began with registration in the early AM. Members then left the Balboa at 8:30 A.M. for a tour of the Pikes' Peak -Colorado Springs area. First in line was the Air Force Academy. At noon, luncheon was served at the Officer's Club. The group then drove up Pike's Peak, through dense fog. The tour ended at Glen Isle where the DX monitoring post was set up. A chicken dinner was enjoyed by those members plus several who joined them from Denver. The all night DX session followed.
