ON THE STATIONUS STATIONERY

From KBIM-910, Roswell, New Mexico, to Ray P. Edge, of special interest to all DXers.

"Dear Mr. Edge:

"I am pleased to say that the letter to you by Mr. Aher was an exact quote of a letter to him about a week ago, which letter was also a verification of an excellent report of reception. 5/1/64

"I should like to use this space in your bulletin for a message which should be of importance to all radio club members. My subject is verification of reception reports. You see, gentlemen, I am sitting on the other side of the fence; perhaps we can briefly communicate through it. Although in the technical end of things at an AM and FM broadcast operation, I too get a bang out of hearing some flea-powered fellow on the other side of the country tuning up his rig. And I get an even bigger bang out of receiving a report from someone who happened to hear one of our middle of the night transmissions. I don't check the report against the program log; on a test transmission there is no program log. But since I do all the checking of the station, I know what was sent. Frankly, I have yet to receive a report that included wrong program (music, talk time, etc.) information. I do, however, insist that the report include sufficient data that I can tell that reception did occur. Just recently, however, I received an astoundingly accurate report of daytime reception over a distance of about 2000 miles. It was 8 days old. Now, really, gang, is this reasonable? Next on my list of suggestions would be to not ask for veries from ground-wave-distance stations. I file these reports on the round file; they serve me no purpose except to know that someone was listening - our advertisers can tell us that. Certainly it was no challenge for the receiver. Please, troopers, what data you do send should be accurate. I don't appreciate reports that say "about 900 kilocycles". Get a list of the standard stations if you are really sincere. Tell us how strong the signal was. How strong was the interference? From whom? What time in what time zone? What kind of receiver and antenna? Did the signal sound normal? Distorted, or tinny? Now - please - get that report in the mail right now. Go right down to the corner and drop it in the air-mail slot. And if your buddy down the street sends in a copy, he'll never get a reply. And neither will you. I appreciate and will reply now to a prompt accurate report. My wastebasket is full of the other kind. But now that you've read these hints, maybe you'll get a little higher percentage of replies. We here, by the way, don't care about postage. Some stations do. Play it safe, enclose a stamp. Play it safer yet and enclose a stamped addressed return envelope. Type the report and envelope. Be sure the return address is plainly indicated. Burn your QSL cards - they are next to worthless. Put in your letter all possible pertinent data; a QSL card seldom has room for a clear signature. Thanks for the ear; I now expect the fellows at NRC to come through with more fine reports.

"Ray: I think this should be a help to us both. I have included every trend I can think of. And believe me, there have been some rotten reports. For example ag in, the QSL business. One fellow about 500 miles away said he heard our station ID (That's all!) "on about 920 kilocycles." His return address was listed in small handwriting on the back side of the card. Damn, what an ill-conceived card! I had to start enforcing this one-week-deadline after I started noticing cards and letters from folks coming in bearing a striking resemblance in format to those received about a week earlier. Evidently some little band started up telling their buddies on carbon paper what's going on. And the tourist; this character obviously passed through town and wrote down stuff he heard on the radio. Then when he got home he wrote out his reception reports. I suspect this character will get all sorts of juicy reports - some may even be legitimate.

"Of course sometimes we get a report of distant reception from spy a housewife or a postman or milkman or some other non-club listener. These are handled in an entirely different manner. As logic dictates, most technical mentions are left out, we explain how ice it is to be heard so far away, how freak atmospheric conditions probably prevailed, etc. and on and on. I imagine we've thrilled more than one white haired little old lady! And what kind of report is finest of all? Those from other radio or TV stations. Why? Because they know what kind of data we appreciate receiving. You'll never hear a report from one of these fellows saying they heard us on a Hallimasher 5 and our ID came through, they think, on about 900 on the dial. They forget when and the report is undated and so forth." (signed) JAMES L. TONNE, W5SUC, CE, KBIM-910.

COLOMBIA---HJKA-540, "R. Horizontes" sked 0530-0000 with EE news 1745 & 2345, with Colombian and world news sponsored by Braniff Airlines (NNRC)

GREAT BRITAIN---"Radio Caroline" and "Radio Atlanta" remain in the news. "Caroline" is on 1519kcs from 0000-1600 from ship named after Caroline Kennedy and moored off of Harwich, Essex. "Radio Atlanta" is on M/S Mi Amigo moored off Frinton, Essex, and is on 1493kcs 0000-1400 EST; their QRA is 47 Dean Street, London W1. Because of various entanglements the British government is currently planning no action against them. Meanwhile, our old friend "Radio Manx" was supposed to have opened by now, but "Radio Caroline" usurped their allocated frequency! A Manx businessman is planning a third pirate station in the near future. (RSDXB; KB; & Mort Meehan)

GREECE---Re previous articles that Pyrgos Radio Station was to be put off the air, its suspension was temporary and it is again operating normally (DX-Alliansen)

GREAT BRITAIN, ctd.---Just in from Ken Brownless. "Radio Caroline" QRA 54/62 Regent St., London W1. Both "Atlanta" and "Caroline" are 10kw. "Radio Sutch", power unknown, frequency variable, situated on wartime anti-aircraft fort off Shoeburyness, Essex, barely audible on mainland. Operated by pop singer "Screaming Lord" Sutch who has spent \$11,000 on equipment with running costs \$840/week--no commercials, chances for unknown "beat groups" etc. who would (?) give donations to Sutch if they became successful. Action will be taken later on this year by the 17 nation Council of Europe (which includes the U.K.) to make it illegal to operate these ships or collaborate with them. ISLE OF MAN --Pye Radio of Cambridge has shipped BCB/VHF XR to Isle of Man, which is now being erected at Onchan. More details later on this, Radio Manx." MERSEYSIDE "POP PIRATE." On June 4, it was announced that the 121 long Blue Angel will be anchored off the Fylde Coast, just outside 3 mile territorial limit, to beam programs to Liverpool/Lancashire area. Man behind it is Alan Williams, Liverpool nightclub owner; syndicate requires one or two more people. (KB)
