- 1080 VENEZUELA. YVQJ, R. Barcelona, in w/nx 2200 to 2300 ID 10/5. (Tilbrook, Pa.)
- 1088 ENGLAND. BBC, Droitwich, 0100 9/21. They must be on summer time. (Johnson, Md.) Strong 9/24, 25, & 26. No sign of 1052, however. (Hoffman, N.J.)
- 1097 CZECHOSLOVAKIA. Bratislava, w/Prague relay in EE S8 1930 9/15. (Hoffman, N.J.)
- 1100 COLOMBIA. HJAT, R. Reloj, Barranquilla, regular past two MMs; hrd all AM w/decident signal; Another unid SS hrd in background. (Hoffman, O.)
- 1106 GERMAN F.R. A.F.N., Munich, probably the one w/pop mx 1830 9/26. (Rugg, Que.)
- 1115 ITALY. R.A.I., Bologna, believed to be the one here sporadically 1800-1900 9/26 w/apparently live pop mx, cheering in background. (Rugg, Que.)
- 1124 SPAIN. EAJ15, Barcelona, symphonic mx 1850-1902 fadeout 9/26, back 1906 w/talk in SS. At peaks, signal was really fantastic. (Rugg, Que.)
- 1130 JAPAN. JOQR, Tokyo, S7-8 at 0520 9/26. (Wilkinson, Calif.)
- 1142 ALGERIA. Oran, in and out w/CBI-WRVA from 1813-1915 9/26 w/some Arabic chanting & talk, but too much QSB/QRM for report. (Rugg, Que.)
- 1195 COSTA RICA. TICA, R. Columbia, Puntarenas noted 10/3 to 2400 s/off. (Freeman)
- 1205 FRANCE. R.T.F., Bordeaux, 9/26 0035, unneeded. (Freeman, Calif.) S9+ 0055 9/21. (Johnson, Md.)
- 1210 JAPAN. JOOR, Osaka, in exceptionally early 0419 9/26. (Wilkinson, Calif.)
- 1214 ENGLAND. BBC Light Program good around 1835 9/25. (Hoffman, N.J.) Very clear 1912 9/26, though local WCAU less than 20 miles from here. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- UNID. T.A. 0053 9/21, probably B.D.C. (Johnson, Md.)
- 1220 JAPAN. JOQC/JOHC hrd for a few minutes 0550 9/24. (Wilkinson, Calif.)
- 1223 SPAIN. R.N.E. Madrid, logged 10/8 @1800, strong w/lush music. (Schiller, N.J.) New freq. since 9/1, apparently. Not shown by EBU. (Ed.) Unid. T.A. here, weak. Any ideas? Light music programming. (Hoffman, N.J.)
- 1250 JAPAN. JOIR, Sendai, S7 0507 on 9/26. (Wilkinson, Calif.)
- 1358 UNID. S/off anthem at 1858 9/27 quite clear, but didn't know whose anthem. Could have been R. Bremen. (Dangerfield, Pa.)

- 1376 FRANCE. R.T.F., Lille, 0052 9/21. (Johnson, Md.)
- 1380 MEXICO. KECO, R. Eco, Mexico, D.F. came in strong 0028 10/5. (Hoffman, Ohio)
- 1403 UNID. French language 0053 9/21. (Johnson, Md.)
- 1437 UNID. Spanish anncts & programming at 0115 9/28, did not sound like a L.A. Think possibly a Spanish station. (Dangerfield, Pa.) EBU lists none on 1437, but shows EFJ???, Morno de la Frontera, power unknown, & EFE42, Sueca, 250 watts, on 1433, and on 1439, EAJ13, Mallorca, BALEARIC IS. w/2kw. (Ed.)
- 1457 ENGLAND. BBC West Home Svc., Clevedon, noted 0049 9/21 S9+20. (Johnson, Md.)
- 1466 MONACO. 3AM2, R. Monte Carlo, nowhere near as strong as formerly 0045 9/21. (Johnson, Md.)
- 1475 DAHOMEX. Cotonou, in FF mostly, logged w/fair detail but enough for report 0035-0120 9/28. Real surprise, definitely in the clear. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 1484 UNID. German 0042 9/21, het. QRM. (Johnson, Md.)
- 1495 UNID. EE 0030 9/21, w/ pop music. (Johnson, Md.) Caroline II? (Ed.)
- 1502 POLAND. Warsaw, like a local in evening 10/4. ID'ed in EE, FF & German at 1830, "This is Warsaw Calling". Mentioned Lionel Hampton records, among other items. To 2000. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 1520 GUATEMALA. TGDX (?) R. Centro Americano, logged 10/5 0528 w/strong signal, even over KOMA TT, which likely was at reduced power. This slogan fits TGDX listed on 1500 kc. Nothing I have listed on 1520 matches, Mentioned Guatemala often, and had typical Guatemalan music, like TGJ-880. (Millar, Wash.)
- 1522 UNID. SS noted here 0035. T.A./L.A.??? (Johnson, Md.)
- 1550 MEXICO. XEZL, Jalapa, Ver. Taped clear, definite ID here 9/29 2330, weaving in and out w/XEBG, Tijuana. Has Mexican version of Top 40 format; XEBG has instrumental music of the traditional L.A. variety. (Callarman, Tex.)
- 1570 MEXICO. Unid. heard until apparent s/off 2115 9/30, mixed w/KWIC, KACE, KCVR, CFCR, w/XERF off that evening. Definite commercials, song titles, program titles merited tentative to most logical on list, XEIM, San Blas, Nayarit. On back of returned envelope, San Blas postal employe wrote in SS "There does not exist a radio station in this place." XEEX-1490 also listed here. (Callarman)
- 1594 UNID. Someone here is driving me batty. Weak TA stays on late, til 2200. (Hoffman, N.J.)
- 650 COLOMBIA. HJKH, R. Renacimiento, Bogota, in and out w/XVQO around 2000 10/5. (Tilbrook, Pa.)
- 655 EL SALVADOR. YSS, R. Nacional, San Salvador, in clear for log around 1930 10/5. (Tilbrook, Pa.)
- 720 VENEZUELA. YVQR, R. Cumana, in like local 1900-2100. (Tilbrook, Pa.)
- 730 TRINIDAD. Port-of-Spain in clear 2100 10/4. (Tilbrook, Pa.) Dropped VPLRD call some years ago, Mike. (Ed.)
- 1580 MEXICO. XEDM, Hermosillo, Son. reported 10/8 in annual attempt at verie from easiest SS not yet verified. (Freeman, Calif.)
