W I B A

This is on Friday morning, April 2nd, and it will be the very first time WIBA has ever broadcast all night, and the occasion is their 40th Anniversary on the air! This is a momentous occasion for WIBA, and for radio itself, and WIBA is honoring the NRC with this five hours of special festive broadcasting. They will trace a history of the music of these 40 years during the course of the program, and will use the 3:00-4:00 a.m. period for testing. 3-3:10, 5kw. non-directional; 3:10-3:20, 1kw. non-dir., 3:20-3:30 5kw. dir., 3:30-3:40, 5kw. non-dir., with an interview with Ross Hansch, of NRC and the WIBA staff at 3:35. 3:40-3:50, 1kw. non-dir., 3:50-4, 5kw. dir. From 1:00-2:00, there will be tunes from 1925-1935, and 2-3, music from the 1935-1945 period. Then, 4:05, it will be 1945-1955 selections, and from 5-6, the songs of the 1955-1965 times. Chief Engineer Norman G. Hahn is especially hoping you'll give him comparative reports on their three modes of operation between 3:00 and 4:00. We think this is C.S.T. They are printing a special commemorative QSL card for this date, so everybody, try to get through the other operating stations on 1310 and hear this fine old station, WIBA. During the 3-4 hour of testing, there will be cycle tones included, plus many IDs. Ross Hansch, who arranged this program, and who has been at WIBA for 25 years, informs us of his station's special anniversary dedicatory broadcast, so let's all tune it in!

This is a brand new station, & will honor the NRC with a special DX show on Monday AM, April 2, from 4-5 a.m. EST. We are not certain what type of music they'll use, but you will be sure it will not be rock, for WBAX & WROV, on 1240 also at this time, will be running that. Look for marches and country music, plus perhaps some cycle tones, and many station breaks. Another local-channel Maine station, WpME-1230, got 36 DX reports recently, and we hope that WMKR will, also. Reports to go to Mr. Jasper M. The latter two will receive letters in Portuguese, whereas my first four Brazilians were reported in EE. Of the 38 veries I have received so far this year, 10 were returned in two weeks or less, 19 in one month or more. So as far as foreign QSLs are concerned, new DXers, be prepared to wait! I added two new countries to the QSL total this week, namely Panama (in the form of HOJ2-1045) & Sint Maarten (PJDS-1295) to bring the country total up to 41. That's 16 new ones in this glorious season. Hank Wilkinson, who deserves a tremendous tip of the hat for his efforts on behalf of the Club regarding Supremacy Ratings, the DX Certificates, & the country list, has turned the latter chore over to me, & there will be a new country list appearing in next week's IDXD section. SOME NOTES ON THE NRC COUNTRY LIST:

- ASCENSION I. Has an AFRIS station on 1600 kc.
- BASUTOLAND. The 1965 Medium Wave Guide shows Maseru on 895 with 8 kw., not in WRTVH
- CEUTA & MELILLA. Spanish enclaves on northern coast of Morocco. WRTVH-65 lists stations on 1150 and 1250, under Spain.
- CONGO, REP. OF. (Leo.) WRTVH-65 shows Radio College, Elisabethville, on 1500 kc.
- ERITREA. Was re-annexed to Ethiopia in 1962.
- MALAWI. Ex-Nyasaland, has stations on 773 and 602 per '65 WRTVH
- RHODESIA. Now the official name for Southern Rhodesia.
- SOMALIA. Although WRTVH-65, does not list it, EBC does have a relay station on Pemba I., a part of Somalia, in the Gulf. British and Swedish DX'ers are hearing it on 701 kc.
- SPANISH SAHARA. FDIS shows EAJ101, Radio Sahara, on 655. A Swedish DX'er, who heard it on 640 announcing 660 says it is in Aioun.
- SWAZILAND. Tiger Radio in Matsapa is shown on 746 kc. in WRTVH-65.
- TANZANIA. Formed by Tanganyika and Zanzibar.

ASIA.

- ANDAMAN IS. All India Radio, Port Blair, on 1140 is here. Listed under India.
- ARMENIA, AZERBAIJAN, GEORGIA. ARRL lists these as in Europe but they haven't checked their maps too closely. Caucasus Mountains running north of these three S.S.R.'s form the Europe-Asia boundary, say my maps. EDU shows Baku, AZERBAIJAN, on 1016 kc., not in WRTVH-65.
- EAST & WEST MALAYSIA. Malaysia is now going country. Geographic criteria separates Malaya and Singapore into West Malaysia; Sabah and Sarawak to East Malaysia.
- INDONESIA. No medium wave station here. Someone, a few years back, published erroneously that there was one in Djakarta on 1111 kc.
- KASHMIR. Shown on 990 kc. in PAL and WRTVH. Status of this disputed territory between India and Pakistan still in doubt.
- LACCADIVE IS. I can find no reference to a station on the air here. World Almanac shows Kozhikode (Calicut) which has a station as capital of the Indian territory which includes the Laccadives, but this city is located on the mainland of India.
- MALDIVE IS. Can find no information on a station in this independent sheikdom, the capital of which is Male.
- PORTUGUESE TIMOR. P.A.L. Shows a station on 1080 kc.
- SAKHALINSK. An integral part of the R.F.S.S.R., or Asiatic Russia, and less than 50 miles from the mainland. To justify calling this a separate country, we'd have to add Sicily, Hokkaido, Catalina, etc.

EUROPE.

- CORSICA. Ajaccio and Bastia, shown under R.T.F., France, are on this island.
- DODECANESE IS. is proper nomenclature here, to include Rhodes.
- ISLE OF MAN. Has Manx Radio, 1594, not shown in WRTVH-65, and Caroline-1520. By the way, I believe we should count these offshore stations as the country off whose shore they are!
- KALININGRADESK. This is an enclave of R.S.F.S.R. (Eur. Russia) separated by land masses (including Lithuania and Byelorussia) of a good deal more than 50 miles from the remainder of Eur. Russia. Has Kaliningrad-1142.
- KARELO-FINNISH S.S.R. Lost its separate status in 1956 when it returned to the R.S.F.S.R. ARRL still counts it separate, apparently because it has a different ham prefix, but no way to justify it by our criteria.
- SVABARD. (Or Spitzbergen.) One of the three Norwegian stations on 1466 is located on this island.
- WEST BERLIN. Separation by land mass of East Germany of over 50 miles from border of West Germany. By country list criteria, this is a separate country.

MORE NOTES ON THE NRC COUNTRY LIST.

NORTH AMERICA.

ANTIGUA, DOMINICA, GRENADA, MONTSERRAT, ST. KITTS & NEVIS, ST. LUCIA, ST. VINCENT.

Note that Leeward Islands and Windward Islands are solely geographical designations and have nothing to do with the governments of the individual islands. The Windwards are St. Vincent, St. Lucia, Grenada and MARTINIQUE. The Leewards are Dominica (though served by W.I.B.S.) Guadeloupe, Montserrat, Barbuda, Antigua, St. Kitts & Nevis, and Sint Maarten. Each of the seven British Colonies issues its own stamps, and is proud of its separate identity.

BRITISH VIRGIN ISLANDS. C.P. for ZDVI-780, 10 kw. in Rodetown. Not on the air yet.

SINT MAARTEN. As above indicated, is located in Leeward chain (Between St. Kitts & Nevis and the Virgin Islands.) It's over 500 miles from the ABC islands of the Netherlands Antilles. PJD2-1295 is the station here.

SAN ANDRES I. Is off the coast of Nicaragua, in the North American Caribbean. It is well over 50 miles from any other part of Colombia. Has HJHO-890 and HJHU-1260.

OCEANIA.

CANTON IS. P.A.L. Shows a station here on 1480 kc.

CHRISTMAS IS. P.A.L. Shows low-powered station on 1450 kc.

NEW BRITAIN, off the coast of New Guinea, is considered part of the Territory of New Guinea. Distance between New Britain and New Guinea is less than 50 miles. The only station in the Territory of New Guinea is 9RB, Rabaul, New Britain. Shown in NRC Country List as New Guinea.

Okay, ganc, there you have the new NRC country list. 232 countries which have D.C.E. stations operating within their boundaries are included in the above list. GOOD LUCK!

- 830 JAPAN. JOY, Osaka. NHK Tokyo HQ sent QSL-card, letter, schedules, color booklet, returned IRC, etc., for report sent to Osaka region. Japan #5. (Callarman, Tex)
- 840 COLOMBIA. HJLI, Ondas del Caribe, Santa Marta, promptly returned signed prepared card for reception of 2/27; previous efforts fruitless. Signature illegible. (Freeman, Calif.)
- VENEZUELA. YVMY, R. Cronos, Marquisimeto. Apartado Postal 567. Air verie by Lilia Villanueva A. (Tyndall, Vt.)
- 860 MEXICO. XEUN, R. Universidad Nacional de Mexico, Mexico, D.F. Verie states their schedule is 17 hours a day normally from 8:00-1:00 (probably CST). Lists power as 50,000 watts. (Holbrook, Ma.)
- 910 VENEZUELA. YVPP, Apartado Postal 3333, Caracas, Radio Aeropuerto. Air verie by Roberto Vazquez. Been working on him since 10/63. Venezuela #58. (Tyndall, Vt.) Some sources say call has changed to YVRQ. Hank, did letter specify this call?
- 1025 AUSTRIA. Linz II, verified 12/28 report from Vienna offices. WRTVH must be wrong in listing Dobl/Kronstorff here. (Rugg, Que.) Believe Dobl/Kronstorff are transmitter locations, Andy, and Linz II is a studio location. (Ed.)
- 1043 EAST GERMANY. Radio D.D.R. Dresden. QSL specifying date, time and freq. and covering letter specifying location received after f/up to R.D.I. Letter says DDR, Dresden, is a domestic station basically, which explains the difficulties in obtaining a QSL card. Makes it sound as though they do not always verify. (Robie, Mass.) 3 QSL cards and long letter in English by Paul Lindner, who says all mail should be addressed to North American Department, Radio Berlin International. (Tyndall, Vt.)
- 1061 DENMARK. Kalundborg II. Card showing picture of Radio House, Copenhagen, personally typed with a "Thank you for your report," and a note that R. Denmark doesn't verify the numerous listeners reports on LW, MW & FM. It said "The station you received was presumably Kalundborg II, 60 kw." Reminds one of the BBC approach. A few years ago, I got an absolute turndown from Radio Denmark on an inquiry report, quite a contrast to the above, which in my opinion constitutes a verie, and probably more of a verie than the automatics some listeners are getting. This country #91 is added on a 12/29 report. (Dangerfield, Pa.) Yes, Den, when the letter or card definitely indicates your details were broadcast by that station, it's a verie even if they say they don't, hi! (Ed.)
- 1097 CZECHOSLOVAKIA. Bratislava, v/q received from Prague for Country #46 verified. (Rugg, Que.)
- 1115 ITALY. R.A.I. Sent standard RAI QSL for report of 11/22. Date and freq. of reception unspecified. (Rugg, Que.)
- 1187 HUNGARY. Budapest, specific post card verie showing view of Budapest for 11/26 reception. (Robie, Mass)
- 1223 SWEDEN. Falun. Very nice letter and interesting QSL received from Lars Ryden for reception of 2/1. (Robie, Mass.)
- 1322 SPAIN. EAK6, Zaragoza, Radio Popular. Air verie direct from there. Signer: Valentin Sebastian Pardos, Firmado. Add: Oficinas: Don Jaime 1, 60. (Tyndall, Vt.)
- 1340 BERMUDA. ZDM2, Hamilton, sent a quick v/q on f/up. V/s is Ron Evans, PD. 3rd Bermudan verie here. (Rugg, Que.)
- 1466 MONACO. 3AM2, R. Monte Carlo sent usual QSL-card for country #39. No signer. Monaco now 100% verified. (Callarman, Texas)
- 1520 INTL. WATERS. R. C. roline sent v/1 for 1/4 report. (Rugg, Que.)
- 1525 COSTA RICA. TIRRAW, Turrialba, Apartado 97. Verie by Humberto Saborio E., Gerent covered with stamps, via air, special Del. "Entrega Inmediate". And postman rang my doorbell at 7:00 a.m. (Tyndall, Vt.) I supplied call letters. (Ed.)
- 1580 MEXICO. XEDM, Hermosillo, Son. returned a prepared card promptly. Signer is CE, but name not clear enough for use. Been trying 9 years to get a reply from this one. (Freeman, Calif.)
