Andy Rugg tells us we will not need to know any French if you will be only in the Montreal area, as more people speak English than French there, & some speak both. Hello again, everyone. While we're on the subject of good & bad reports, I want to tell you about a report which I sent out, last May 21. First of all, I was listening on 5/20 on a cheap eight transistor portable. I was trying for KDKA-1020 & the Pirates-Dodgers game, but instead, I got rr mx. I thought nothing of this, since the station probably was semi-local WBZ-1030 Boston, on a bad night. The signal was weak. W/the set's calibration being poor, I was almost sure I was on 1030. So when I heard this mx (about 9:25pm EDT) I didn't even bother taking a written log. (I did remember the songs & the approximate times, though). The next morning, I thought I'd take a chance. So I sent a "report" to David R. Brager, CE of KGBS-1020 Los Angeles. I explained the circumstances & apologized for the lack of details. I also asked him to please not send me a verie unless my report checked out w/his station log. Return postage was enclosed. KGBS v/a came in the mail on 5/26, & I was stunned. The card read, "This confirms your reception of this station" & "May 20 1966" was written in on the date line. The card was signed by Brager. If I hadn't really heard KGBS, the card would not have been sent, or at least, the date would not have been filled in. But here's the point. Sloppy reports sent for the sake of obtaining another card for your wall are inexcusable. But in cases where you think you had a station, the best way to find out is to write to the station. The personnel at the station will realize you're sincerely curious as to whether or not you had them, & they can make an allowance for a sub-par report. In my case, I didn't even think I was getting KGBS, but I took a chance. My report certainly was sub-par, but Mr. Brager realized I am not a verie hunter & that I was genuinely curious. There are those who don't believe reports should be sent unless they contain 15 minutes of details. What about cases where DX-ers hear something on freak skips? If a station is a great catch & you hear it for only five minutes & may never hear it again, why shouldn't you send a report? I could hear KGBS for about 4-5 minutes & I know it was a lucky skip, but I still have a v/q. I believe in cases where you hear something on a skip, you should send a report, no matter how skimpy (unless you cannot give any program details). All I gave were two song titles & a time. I've been trying for the WC since the Dodgers moved out there & KGBS is my first. As bas as the verie situation is, now I can't complain. 73s.

The HQ-180 was returned from the factory (Mars Hill, NC) about three weeks ago, at no cost to me, & apparently they did a lot of work on it. In the dark hours the spurious signals are now either non-existent, or almost 100% removable w/the trimmer, but during the daylight hours, there are still quite a few bad spots. Of course, being primarily a tuner of foreign DX, I shouldn't worry too much, but there probably always will be the possibility of a spurious signal lurking in the background of a clear channel. There is also the danger of picking up spurious signals in that afternoon transition period between daylight & sunset & darkness, which bothers me, since that is the time of day, in Winter particularly, when there is a fighting chance of logging some distance signals from the E. So I'm going to try to come up w/some kind of tuner, or selector, that may be able to tune out a few of these signals. Unfortunately, I am about as untechnical a DXer as can be found anywhere, a fact to which any NRCer who has visited my den will attest. Right, Dave Schmidt, Gordon Nelson, & many more? I still like the HQ-180, which has brought me a lot of exciting DX for 4 1/2 years, especially on the split frequencies, but I would caution anyone considering the purchase of one to first test it carefully in his area - particularly if that area is within range of several nearby stations. Well, what DX is there to report? Not much. I haven't sent out a new report in months, though I do try now & then. Cubans & LAs have been dominant for several weeks, although I have noticed RTF-1554, Nice, several times at mid-evening, w/fair signals, on what may be an AN sked. Also, I have noted traces of what may be Springbok-Radio-1286 around 10:30pm, & while I don't need that one, it does mean that some of those southern hemisphere signals may be breaking through. Veries have come in from KBEW R.Scotland, & HJXX. The latter, in addition to sending me a v/1 & pennant sent a program bulletin "R. Mundial) on one page of which were printed three letters: Larry Godwin's, Stewart Drake's, & mine, representing three radio clubs.
