Well, Fox has shamed me into it this time. (Now if he'd only domestic DX, hi). As my actual loggings, etc. are in DXD, I'll not repeat them. I'll do otherness. This has been my most active & most productive season ever. Totals as of 2/28 show roughly 1,550 stations logged (I will get exact count 3/1, hi), 415 taped, 255 or so verified. I only verie for DX TESTs, new states or outstanding catches. I've given up on the rest as time & postage money are better spent elsewhere considering verie returns, etc. I prefer tapes, anyway. Country total stands at 94, with still a few "easy" ones to go, such as Argentina, Grenada, Trinidad, U.S.V.I., St. Vincent, St. Kitts, Martinique, Gabon among them. I hope to top 100 by season's end. Progress this season - for the months Sept. through Feb. (Pt. 1 - I still have 2/28 to complete totals for and maybe 2/29) loggings (new) go like this: 21, 59, 67, 66, 92, 107. New country logs go like this from season's start of 62: 6, 6, 5, 4, 6, 5. New tapes somewhere around 150 on the season, not all dubbed onto master, so no accurate idea. State totals are 46 heard (I need Alaska, Wyoming, Idaho, Oregon), 40 veridd & 39 taped. To recap equipment, an HQ-150, a TRF, a 4' NRC altaz FET loop, a 2' altaz amplified loop, & a Lafayette RK-825 stereo four-track taper, a variable band-pass audio filter, & occasional borrowed Wollensak tapers for dubbing purposes. Actual location, despite mail address is Parsippany (Par-insipidity to BKA, na) N.J., some ten miles W of Wayne, & more in the swamps. Proposed new local WPRJ-1310 is now being fought by a neighboring town, so more delays seem imminent. WKMB-1070, Stirling, is now on the air as of last week, & another, unfortunately, loud quasi-local, though loopable for WKOK & WKDR. WBRW-1170 is local here, though WWLE and/or WWVA are loopable through it. The big pest days is WNTN-1250, which, as it points its 5kw D-3 at me for an effect of somewhere around 30kw., messes up 122-1280 very nicely. This no chance for WDWL, drat. All times in IDXD are GMT. Pls use one side of the paper, fellows. Tnx.

- 555 St. Kitts? ZIZ noted here on 3/4 0230 to 0303 s/off with same format as when noted a year ago on 585. Get them quick before they move again. Anncg as 570 kHz. (Merriman, Va.)
- 620 Stn hrd here 3/5 2330-0000 7 when had apparent s/off. News by man and woman 2330-2345 then a commentary on the BWI's in heavily Caribbean-accented English by anc; then a calypso-ish organ record, a brief amnt marred by splash, then OC. S/off 0000. Presume the new 10 kw St. Georges, Grenada testing or on limited sked. (Edmunds, NJ)
- 629 Venezuela. Radio Libertad, YVNO Cabimas hrd after HISD s/off at 0500 2/27 with pop mx. It seems that Radio Libertad, YVNO-610 and Radio Cristal, YVSE-620 have exchanged frequencies. (Objio)
- 647 Tunisia. Tunis I was s-5 to 6 2315 3/6. This was the strongest signal from Tunis I in 3 years. The more-consistently received Tunis II on 962 was in more strongly at the same time. (Hoffman, NJ)
- 647 England. Daventry hrd 3/5 0610-0616 with BBC news analysis to 0615 followed by a single Big Ben ring and BBC World Service radio newsreel. Complete fadeout at 0618. (Edwards, NY)
- 655 El Salvador. YSS hrd with ER on 2/21 at 0545; also on 665. (Objio, D.Rep.)
- 660 unID. Count me in - I've hrd English religious service here around 2230-2300 quite a few times but still no ID. But - Alaska - forget it, not a chance in a million. You can't trust a loop reading with an s-9 + 20 dominant signal there. (Hoffman, NJ)
- 674 Libyan A.Rep. el-Gawarsha an unusual s-9 3/6 2255 on till close at 2330. Very little fading. Lots of talk. Big brother on 1124 was 40 over 9 at the same time. (Hoffman, NJ)
- 700 Venezuela. Radio Popular, YVMH Maracaibo hrd s/off at 0355 with NA on 2/23.
- 701 Morocco. Sebaa Aioun has been allnighting it on occasions such as 3/2 when it was heard after 0310. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 760 Colombia. To Schatz: In IDXD 1/29 you heard Radio Nacional and Barranquilla on this spot. Today, 2/27 at 0430 only HJAJ, La Voz de Barranquilla was hrd, Radio Nacional was not. Still a mystery as to both stations being on the same freq. (Objio, D.R.)
- 773 Spain. RNE San Sebastian s/on at 0450 with chimes and anthem. Don't confuse with Stockholm which is supposed to come on at precisely the same time with an I.S. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 825 Costa Rica. Radio Titania on top at 0629 with ID, old rock hits. (Edwards)
- 830 Venezuela. Radio Miranda, YVLT very strong on 2/19 at 0325 and a steady signal with no WCCO. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 854 Peru, most probably here with weak alternating men, male vocal selections 0630+ 3/5, mention of Quito and "Radio Nacional" at 0638. (Edwards, NY)
- 872 Canary Islands. EFJ-57 all alone at s/on 2/21, 0700 and was hrd again the same day at 2253. (Ben Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 900 Colombia. HJBY, La Voz de Cali ID in passing under hetm co-channel intf. 0715 3/6. (Hauser)
- 962 unID. The station Russ Edmunds hrd recently at 2325 must have been something other than Turku, Finland. Turku and other medium-band Finnish stns sign off at midnight their local time, which is 2200, without exception. I checked this out carefully last summer while in Finland. Perhaps the station he heard QRMing Tunis was in Yugoslavia or Bulgaria, which have stations on this freq. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 1115 Morocco (probably) Tangier seems likely Despite the supposed 1 kw, they were all over everything else on 3/6 2256-2312 and peaked at s-3 with Arabic mx. Then at 2313 all I could hear was a tone test. Strange. (Hoffman, NJ)

- 1130 Nicaragua. YNRC, Radio Catolica, Managua hrd with mx, talk, several IDs in and out with local WNEW 0510-0517 3/1. (Edmunds, NJ)
- 1178 Spain. RNE Barcelona topping all at 2230 3/2 with an unID stn behind. (Dgfld)
- 1196 Morocco. Agadir has been on late several times, and was quite good at 0300 on 3/2. (Dangerfield)
- 1200 Venezuela. Radio Tiempo, YVOZ 0700 3/6 "Radio tiempo todo el tiempo", then began pgm "serenata" giving names of staff on duty, including xmtr engr; WRTVH72 unlist AN; WOAI off early. (Hauser, Texas)
- 1232 Morocco. Tangier also has been on late several times up to and after 0300; something has been going on in Morocco?? (Dangerfield) (T.X.Thrush knows?)
- 1280 Haiti. Radio Metropole, Port-au-Prince hrd on 2/22 with a pgm of pop songs with English deejay at 0330. (Objio, D.R.)
- 1394 unID. Loops 95° - just right for Togo but WRTVH says s/off is 2300 and I hrd an anthem at 2327 on 3/6. Sounded like one played by a Salvation Army band. Very weak, was s-2 or 3 with heavy fading. No sign of Tirana in a period of terrific African reception that night. (Hoffman, NJ)
- 1463.8 Colombia. IDXD 1/29 to Schatz: I hrd today, 2/23 two stations almost on the same freq; one was Radio Monumental on 1462.5 IDing at 0458 (Ciudad Quezada, Costa Rica) as "La Hora Monumental" and announced some cigarettes, s/off shortly after that. The other one on your frequency: 1463.8 IDed at 0502 as "Desde Turbo, transmite Ondas del Darien, una emisora de Cadena Radio Porvenir (la del canal de su preferencia). Colombian pop mx was mostly played. As the station was weak I had too much QRM from a local station on 1480 but when it s/off at 0507, "Ondas del Darien" was heard quite well. Turbo is located on Golfo de Uraba (acc. Nat'l Geo. Atlas-co) but, Golfo de Darien according to other maps, in the neighborhood of the cities you mentioned: Acandi on the Atlantic Ocean (or Caribbean sea); the station is in Depto. de Antioquia, not Choco. (Objio, D.R.)
- 1493 unID. I tend to think the station being hrd with some regularity here is one of the French stations. It loops that way, but hard to spot accurately. On 2/27 I had a dramatic production, with some string music, but the voice sound was soft and I won't vouch for the language, but it did sound French. My mistake was leaving the HQ-180 to eat a quick supper (or in not buying a good tape recorder, hi -ed.) because when I came back, the station was almost unreadable. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 1502 Spain. Two stations were like locals on 2/7 from 0700 to 0730 but any IDs evaded me. There were at least two different signals here at 0715. (Dangerfield)
- 1502 unID. Just caught a s/off here 2302 on 3/6 but no clues. With a bearing of 100° or so, only Senegal VI seems plausible, and that is only 1 kw. Any ideas? (Hoffman, NJ) (With good hiband cx, 1 kw ought to do it -ed)
- 1511 East Germany. R.B.I. Berlin finally hrd here with talk by German anncr with accent, 0510 2/28. (Edmunds, NJ)
- 1520 Mexico. XEYP, El Limon Tamps ID and TC, at times dominating with KOMA et al nulled, as at 0023 1st March. (Hauser)
- 1580 Colombia. Radio Principe, Soledad (Barranquilla) hrd s/off on 2/27 at 0503 with anthem, giving address as Apto. Aereo 2048, Barranquilla. (Objio, D.R.)
- 1594 France. Nimes, et al hrd atop the channel with news by French male ancr and was // 1554 at 0450 2/28. (Edmunds, NJ)
- 1594 England/Portugal/others. CSB-4 is usually dominant here but I could hear the BBC News at 0704 on 2/7. It is not uncommon for the low powered BBC stations on 1484, 1546 and 1594 to be heard well after 0700 in January and February. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 1600 Mexico. XELO, Ciudad Juarez, 2x800 harmonic here, parallel distorted mx on both freqs, 0728 3/6. (Hauser, Texas)
- 1124 Libyan A.Rep. el-Beida sent standard form ltr for 10/26/71 rpt. Letter was dated Jan. 13, however was not postmarked until 2/14 and rcvd here 2/24. Country #57 verified, and the best verie here since Sofia-827 verified in 1965. (Rugg, P.Q.)

Before getting into my DX, I would like to comment on what I think is some sloppy reporting. Items such as those claiming new stations and countries on the basis of a few words and/or a certain language, but with no definite ID, and often at times when said stations are not scheduled to be on, or are likely to be smothered by other stations, even with the use of loops. I refer you, for example, to the item under 962 kc. I would further like to remark that language identification can be quite deceptive. Personally, the only language I am almost 100% sure of is English. French has been known to sound like Portuguese, Italian, Rumanian and sometimes Spanish. German is similar to Dutch, Flemish, Swedish, Danish, Norwegian and Luxemburgese. Finnish is not at all like anything Scandinavian, but very close to Estonian, and a little like Hungarian. There is a similarity between Czech, Slovak, Slovenian, Serb, Polish, Ukrainian and even Russian. So, I always take it with a grain of salt when someone states that "a person spoke in Ukrainian, or Estonian, or Finnish" or whatever, unless that person is a language expert and I doubt if we have that many on our East Coast. I certainly am no expert, and even when tuning from the heart of Europe, was not always able to identify the language, even when I knew what station I was supposed to be hearing. So, it is just that much tougher to identify a language from over here, obviously. - Ben Dangerfield.

There's nothing I as an editor can add to Ben's remarks. My policy has usually been to accept the reporter's remarks at face value, and not try to second-guess him. This has to assume that the reporter has made a valid identification: For interest, the little blurb that appeared as a filler in DX News a few weeks ago, about WEZ, etc. with 18-letter words with lots of dots over the "a" and "u" letters was written in Finnish, but just try to imagine how it would sound when spoken. Also, it is interesting to note remarks from the West Coast reporters who find Spanish and Japanese very hard to distinguish in noisy backgrounds. I know that Ben is not the first one to raise a question about how one can be so sure that he has made an identification of an exotic language. -ed.

L.A AIRPORTS GRANTED AUTHORITY FOR ONE YEAR..(from FCC News)

An application by the Department of Airports, city of Los Angeles for continuation of authority to operate its "roadside radio" developmental broadcast station, along a section of the Century Blvd. approach to the Los Angeles International Airport, has been granted by the Commission for a test period of one year. A petition opposing the proposal filed by the United Communications Industries was denied.

In the same action, the Commission set certain guidelines for prospective users and suppliers of the radio system.

On June 3, 1971, the Commission granted the City a test period through October 31, 1971, to operate a roadside radio system consisting of a 10 watt transmitter operating on 550 kHz. The system was designed to enable passing motorists with automobile AM radios to hear voice transmissions dealing with the availability of parking space, car rentals, aircraft arrivals and departures and other messages relating to traffic movement within the airport complex. When the test program on 550 KHz. had to be discontinued due to interference problems, operations on 830 were authorized.

The City then asked for authority to continue testing on 830 kHz. for a two year period to determine public acceptance of the new system "now that it has been established that interference problems would not be caused and that the system functions well".

The commission said that while the public interest would be served by granting the developmental license, a one year test program should be sufficient to yield the desired information.

The tests were approved subject to the condition that they be conducted on a non-commercial basis, and without promotion involving the public except for the installation of appropriate signs in the vicinity of the test site, and that the test program may be cancelled without prior notice or right to a hearing in the event of objectionable interference. A detailed report dealing with both technical and public acceptance aspects will be due within 90 days after the conclusion of testing, the Commission said.

In its guidelines to prospective users and buyers, the Commission raised the possibility of meeting "roadside radio" requirements on frequencies immediately above the AM broadcast band, and stated that it proposes to investigate this possibility.

The Commission noted that because of the problems associated with the developmental licensing of "roadside radio" systems in the standard broadcast band and the fact that multiple test programs could yield only cumulative data, it does not propose to grant additional authorizations for this purpose. This does not preclude, however, the continued installation and testing of nonlicensed units complying with Part 15 of FCC Rules.

By the time this is in print in both DX NEWS and DX MONITOR, many DXers will have logged 880 KRVN running tests after 0100E which commenced on 021572 and which should continue for about two weeks. IF tests prove satisfactory an STA will be obtained and RS may well begin within the month of March in time to provide most DXers with another catch this season. Daily sked will be 0500-2400 CST with 50,000 watts directional nights and non-directional days. The transmitting facilities are located just NW of Holdrege, Ne and a 900 MHz STL repeatered at Overton will provide the audio baseband from the Lexington studios. The antenna system is a four tower array consisting of equally spaced 300' monopoles driven with non-uniform currents in both phase and amplitude so as to produce a very wide "almost" null of some 15 mv/m @ 1 mile 15° either side of the line of the array towards WCBS. The line of towers lies on the great circle path between 880 KRVN and 880 WCBS and has a bearing of 81°. The front portion of the directional pattern is a very nice 2.5 VOLTS/m @ 1 mile so that few on the WC should have difficulty with KRVN. The proof of this system has been carefully made with a most competent CE at the helm and the technical difficulties not less than state-of-the-art in some major cases. More on the technical layout of KRVN will be published in future issues of the bulletins pending availability of space.

To date a number of DX reports have been received by 880 KRVN during their tests which have consisted of OC with station ID's each half hour. About 10 reports from the WC and one from New Zealand are presently on hand. The following information will be helpful to those DXers logging or taping 880 KRVN and wishing to verify their reception. First, the CE is Bob Bitner, W8SOK, a very top notch technical chap with many years of experience who is devoted to BCB and interested in having KRVN DXed. His responsibilities are many, much more so than most CE, and his day (to put it mildly) is hectic! Thus, all correspondence from KRVN will be handled by Fish in Lincoln. Specifically, DX reports should be sent to: Bob Bitner, CE Radio Station KRVN, 104 West Eighth St., Lexington, Ne. 68850 and the enveloped clearly labeled "DX REPORT". Bob will review each report for its correctness and then indicate whether or not it is to be verified and mail them to Lincoln where the verification will be processed. General correspondence concerning KRVN 880 will also be handled in this manner--Fish will answer all questions the CE feels can be handled from Lincoln. Special DX Test will be arranged and there will be plenty of ET and f/c with and without the directional pattern. Thus CPC boys take note. Club policy of including postage will be expected and reports lacking return postage run the great risk of not receiving a reply. Please state your club affiliation(s) on your report forms and tapes are extra postage too. Tape reports are very much requested, tapes at 1/2 track @ 3.75 ips or 7.5 ips are acceptable. Tape will be returned only if return postage is included. Both Bob and I hope this will work well for the DXers of KRVN and we cordially invite you to "tune in". Swazi Radio Beams To 6 African Countries

BILLBOARD By PETER FELDMAN 2/19/72

JOHANNESBURG—Swazi Radio, a new commercial station, will take to the air from Mbabane on Feb. 5. It has been geared to beam light music programs to six countries.

The station, which will broadcast to South Africa from a barely 400 meters from the South African border, will compete with the South African Broadcasting Corporation's Springfield Radio and Lourenco Marques Radio.

Heading the station is Mark Wodlinger, an American, whose company Inter-Media of Kansas City owns five commercial radio and television stations.

Wodlinger said Swazi Radio would be "non-political" and reach listeners in South Africa, Botswana, Lesotho, Zambia and Rhodesia.

It would be manned at first by American and South African technicians. Six American and three Johannesburg disk jockeys would handle the broadcasting.

The station would be owned jointly by Wodlinger's company, which will hold 60 percent of the shares; the Swaziland Government (2 percent) and a group of Swazi citizens.

Among the directors are Zach

Nkomo, the Swazi undersecretary for agriculture, industry and mines and General J.P. Goos, a former South African Police Commissioner, who will represent South African interests on the board.

Wodlinger said many South African-based companies had already booked advertising time. There had also been a fair response from commercial undertakings in Swaziland, Mozambique and other neighbor states.

More than 50,000 rand (400,000) worth of advertising had been booked.

Unlike Lourenco Marques Radio, Swazi Radio will be fully automated. Programs will be taped in Johannesburg and transported by Swaziland. Although the station will be equipped with the facilities for "on the spot" broadcasts, this will not be the usual practice and other technicians will work on the Swaziland premises.

The new station will be on the air from six to the nooning until midnight during weekdays and from six until one in the morning at weekends.

There will be no news service and the programs will be devoted to country music, pop, Top 40 and "easy" music.

WKBN Strike

Negotiations conducted by a federal mediator will resume Monday in the three-week-old strike by six newsmen, four announcers, three cameramen and three television directors at WKBN Broadcasting Corp. The mediator entered the negotiations Thursday.

The strikers have rejected a package increase of 8.5 per cent the first year and a 2.5 per cent in each of the next two years of a three-year contract. All are members of the National Association of Broadcast Employees and Technicians.

In addition to the NABET strikers, 18 technicians, members of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, are honoring the picket lines.

Warren P. Williamson III, executive vice president of WKBN, said that NABET had asked a flat \$20 a week increase plus fringes, but scaled down demands to \$40 a week in the first year and \$20 a week in the second year of a two-year contract, plus fringes. At present, newsmen have a top minimum of \$12.50 a week.

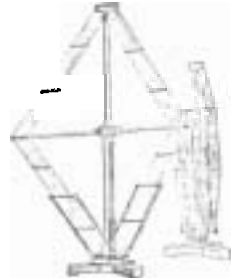
Williamson said that the station has been able to maintain normal operations with supervisory personnel since the strike began Jan. 21. WKBN Broadcasting Corp. operates WKBN Radio and WKBN-TV (Channel 27), both affiliates of the Columbia Broadcasting System.

Behold, a Musing! Hello gang. A few things to comment on, plus a request for some help prompts this Musing. Firstly, Jerry Starr's article on the station's attitude toward NSP & related matters should be required reading for all, & I think should be included in each New Member Packet. I say this because I am scared by the attitude of some DXers writing nasty letters to stations blasting them for not having a silent period or other such silliness as giving awards for stations having silent periods. If everyone would just sit down and realize that broadcasting is a business, and is a service to the listener, not a toy of DXers, the DXers' attitude toward the stations and vice versa would be greatly improved. After all you wouldn't expect, for example, a restaurant to shut down just so you could use their kitchen to cook a meal for yourself. Remember, we DXers are only a very tiny minority compared to the number of people a station serves, even in the wee hours of the morning. Secondly, about the NWT controversy, who cares how they are counted, so long as everyone counts them the same. The same about the Caribbean islands. It really matters little how they are separated so long as everyone counts them the same. If there is a good reason for dividing things up, fine, go ahead, but let's not do it just for the sake of being able to say we now have more provinces or more countries logged. Thirdly, re RJE's query on tapes, I count all stations heard, varied & taped, mainly because no one can say to my satisfaction just what constitutes a DX station, or a regular station. In my case, there are perhaps only a dozen stations I could hear during their entire broadcast sked, & that is such a small number, why not count them anyway? Now my request for help. I would like to know where I can get a table of skip angles vs. skip distance for 1, 2, 3, & 4-hop reception, or a formula for figuring same.
