

WORLD ADMINISTRATIVE RADIO CONFERENCE 1979: AN EXTRACT by Thomas R. Sundstrom. WB2AYA

Docket 20271, Third Notice of Inquiry, was released by the Federal Communications Commission on December 6, 1976. Later on this spring a Forth Notice will be released.

Sections pertaining to the MW band follow; the AM Spectrum SWG (Service Working Group) prepared comments affecting all three ITU regions. Docket 20271 states:

"Broadcast Services "The AM Spectrum SWG requested that the band 535-1605 kHz be continued as allocated to the Broadcasting Service on an exclusive basis, and that neighboring frequencies between 525-535 kHz and 1605-1805 kHz be also allocated in certain regions. As the proposed table reflects, we have added Broadcasting on a primary basis to Regions 2 and 3 at 525-535 kHz; we have continued the exclusive allocation at 535-1605 kHz; and we have added Broadcasting at 1605-1615 kHz on a shared primary basis in Region 2. While 1615-1805 kHz has not been included in the table at this time, additional spectrum space in this band for AM Broadcasting will continue to be considered in view of the potential heavy demand for new stations by commercial, non-commercial, and minority group applicants and in view of the direct public interest benefits of this service. The use of reduced channel spacing (e.g. 8 or 9 kHz) has also been addressed by the SWG. While Regions 1 and 3 have adopted plans to reduce channel separation as a means of increasing the number of channels, this scheme affects adjacent channel interference, the development of AM stereo, and poses serious conversion problems for the U.S. which has developed its AM service largely around the use of directional antennas designed for use only on specific frequencies. Comments on this issue and the extension of the broadcast band to 1805 kHz are requested."

The table indicates proposing deletion of aeronautical radionavigation at 525-535 kHz in Region 2, making Broadcasting the primary service worldwide. Mobile operation would be on a shared basis in Regions 2 and 3.

In Region 2, the table indicates deletion of fixed and radiolocation, and adding Broadcasting on an equal footing with Mobile and Aeronautical Radionavigation at 1605-1615 kHz.

Shortwave Broadcasting Although out of the realm of the NRC's interests. a number of DXers utilize parallels in the SWBC frequencies to hunt MW DX. Docket 20271 says very little here despite many requests from the International Broadcasting SWG.

In a nutshell, there are no proposed changes to the shortwave broadcasting bands between 120 and 11 meters except for one minor deletion. In the unused 11-m band, 25850-26050 kHz is proposed to be reallocated to Radio Astronomy.

Amateur

Some modifications to 160 and 15 meters highlight minor changes and additions, plus a LW band at 160-190 kHz. See the February 1977 issue of QST or 73 for details. No changes on 50, 144, 220, 420 MHz except that Land Mobile can share 220-225 MHz (make that Class E CB!).

HM2 MICHAEL S. HARDESTER. USN - NAVREGMEDCEN - Box 2723 - APO, San Francisco. CA - 96331 Okinawa is a most unusual place from which to DX. The TVI is at a minimum as is local QRN. However, rather than let anyone believe this is an ideal DX location a point should be made: the band (MW) is jammed! For the majority of 10k spaced frequencies (540, 500 -1600), there may be found two to four stations all fighting to be heard. Many frequencies are like NA graveyard frequencies, but with less of the fading characterisites. Also, it isn't a simple matter of listening to one or perhaps two different languages. Here, Japanese, Chinese, Korean, etc. languages are common on a single frequency. With all the jumble, IDs are not that easy, though fortunately the Japanese stations most often give a vocal, EE ID. Presently, there are seven active AM stations on Okinawa: JOAP-550, NHK first network w/lokw; Jork-740, commercial w/5kw; JOXR-780 commercial w/5kw; JOIF-1150 commercial w/5kw; JOAD-1360, NHK second network, & the two USA stations, AFRTS-650, and VOA-1178. Most recently, the FEBC station (JOFF-1020) closed down permanently in accordance with the 1972 Japan/USA Reversion Agreement, and by 5/15/77 VOA-1178 will be off the air, leaving only AFRTs -650 "an experience in listening." The latter two stations are presently using 1,000kw & 10kw respectively. A note for those who like to make notes of "pips": JORR-740 (and its stronger harmonic on 1480) utilizes pips ALMOST identical to NHKs. However, JORR gives a definite EE ID on the hour with the initials of its company, so a mis-ID shouldn't occur.

Besides, there are no NHK stations on this frequency (which I know of). 73.

"The EKKO Stamp Hobby & Method of Verifying in the 1920's" (Part 1, by DICK NORTHUP) Older DXers undoubtedly remember the old EKKO Stamp method of confirming reception reports to American and Canadian radio stations. The article from "The Clipping Corner" in the Jan. 10 issue of DX NEWS brought back a lot of memories of station reporting in the early days of radio. The EKKO Stamps originated in 1924 in Chicago and were avidly colected by many DXers of the time. In brief it was an easy way for stations to check and verify reception reports. The cost was 10% each which went to cover cost of mailing and the station's time in checking and confirming the report. The company put out a nice stamp album with cuts for all the then-operating American and Canadian stations, and collectors could paste the stamps in tiehr proper place. The albums quickly got out of date, of course, & new updated ones were issued every year or so as more stations took to the air. My mother gave me an EKKO Stamp Album for a Christmas present in 1924. & I began my collection in January 1925 by obtaining a stamp from WOAI in San Antonio, folo by WWJ in Detroit and at that time WMAK in Lockport. NY. Not all stations invested in the stamps, but the majority of them did - I would guess about 70 or 80%. If a station did not have the stamps, they could be purchased from the EKKO Company at their effice in the Harris Bank and Trust Co. on Monroe Street in downtown Chicago. provided that you sent them a bona fide verification from the station. I remember thar KDKA. WBZ & WGY as well as old WJZ & WEAF fell into that group, & I was able to get the stamps by sending them the cards and letters, which were returned to me along with the stamps. As the Watertown article points out, the stamps were very colorful and hence nice to have. but they were all alike, the U.S. stamps displaying a bald eagle and the Canadians a beaver, and except for the call letters were never really distinctive of the station. However, better than 90%, I would judge, sent along a verification card or letter along with the stamp to make the "cheese more binding" so to speak. CONCLUDED NEXT WEEK.
