- 666 JAPAN JOEK Osaka NHK1 clear 1203 11/4. (Maguire)
- 660 UNID stn with 4 note IS 0955-1000 12/7. (Maguire) R. Lumiere signs on with a little IS on a piano and I think 1000 is their s/on-CH
- 666 PORTUGAL Lisboa in w/romantic female vocal o/SAH, some second audio (probably the German), 0722 12/22. (Connelly) Wouldn't 0722 be a bit late for Germany? Maybe I ought to check the SR charts before saying that, but no time now.....CH
- 670 ALASKA KDLG Billingham 12/16 1116-1155 noted testing w/TT and mx, might be worth a check between SunM and MM 1100-1130, sometimes puts on a TT and sounds like a full 5 kw here. (Vernon)
- 711 FRANCE Hennes briefly atop WOR on car rx w/FF disco and talk; WOR just a low side het 2235 12/17. (Connelly)
- 719 PORTUGAL Norte poor to fair w/Christmas vocal mx; slopped by CMGN 0210 12/23. (Connelly)
- 720 USSR unknown FS 12/12 1226 male in JJ, 1229:20 FS IS, 1229:40 address given for recordings of R. Moscow, 1230 male w/nx in EE. This service probably //1251, 630 1100-1300 w/JJ and EE pgms, neither frequency audible here to check. (Vernon) Seems like 1251 ought to be audible occasionally since you have good luck with other FE Russians....CH
- 730 MEXICO Mexico City XEX fair w/CKAC nulled; Corona Cerveza ad, SS talk 0647 12/23. (Connelly)
- 738 AUSTRALIA 2NR Grafton 12/16 1204 nx, 1206 single tone and sports, not a particularly good signal here. (Vernon)
- 738 POLAND Poznan 12/7 0518 continuous instrumental mx, local like sig //fair 1305, 1260, 1206, //1368 good between 0517-0520. (Vernon)
- 740 COLOMBIA HJNS Valledupar fair w/TODELAN net ID, chimes, 0630 on 12/23. (Connelly)

747t HOLLAND strong het against WHEE noted on car rx 2240 12/17. it seemed too loud for Upper Volta, since 765 was only at average strength. BHC-909 was in as a loud het at the time, so northern routes were open; therefore, the Dutchman is suspected. (Connelly)

747 JAPAN JO1B Sapporo most consistent and loudest NHK 1144-1202 10/28, ID by female 1200 11/2, 1030-1200 11/4 //JOB. (Maguire)

760 COLUMBIA HJAJ Barranquilla on channel, good w/LV de Barranquilla ID and accordion mx, atop CMC1 K. Reloj 0640 12/23. (Connelly)

765 SENEGAL Dakar fair w/AA talk by man 2135 12/22. (Connelly)

810 BAHAMAS Freeport very good w/gospel mx and preaching, followed by three Radio Bahamas jingles, then "Santa Claus is Coming to Town" 0600 12/24. No other stations were noted on 810 at the time. (Connelly)

810 SCOTLAND Westerglen et al, K. Scotland 12/6 0619 reports about the meat market, good o/CHQR/KGU. (Vernon)

820 CUBA good w/SS talk //670, 690 0634 12/23. (Connelly)

828 JAPAN JOBB Usaka 1144-1202 10/28, NHK ID 1200 11/2 and 11/4. (Maguire)

830 DOMINICAN REPUBLIC H1JB Santo Domingo loud/dominant w/SS version of "Jingle Bells", "H-i-j-b Mas Musica" jingle, then "We Are Family" by Sister Sledge 0637 12/23. (Connelly)

830 HAWAII KIKI Honolulu 0705-0830 11/26 w/WCCO off, 0730 ID. (Maguire)

837 JAPAN JOQK Niigata NHK1 1051 11/4. (Maguire)

855 SPAIN Murcia good w/male SS talk 0204 12/23. (Connelly)

860 DOMINICAN REPUBLIC H1LR Santo Domingo potent w/R. Clarin ID, festive LA mx 0653 12/23. Maybe this is back to full power. (Connelly)

873 JAPAN JOGB Kumamoto 1310 11/4, only Japanese still needed. (Maguire) Don't really understand this; if you heard it why do you still need it? And does this mean that you have heard every other station in Japan?? CH

882 ENGLAND R. Wales, Washford 12/12 0909 still in w/good sig, talk about why Mistletoe is associated w/Christmas. (Vernon)

940 CUBA Reloj outlet o/others w/usual pgm 0654 12/23. (Connelly)

963 INTERNATIONAL WATERS R. Carioine 12/7 0718+ rr pgm, mx in various European languages, but male anncr seemed to be DD. 0800 male w/nx, must go into DD pgm after EE religious pgms which begin at 0500 s/on. 12/8 1658 instrumental mx, 1700 EE pgm with rr and Steve Bishop. (Vernon)

972 SOUTH KOREA HLCA Kimje 1108 11/4 thru XEJ. (Maguire)

1017 TONGA A3Z Nuku'alofa 12/13 0950 fanfare then bongo drums and annct "Radio Tonga News" by male, female followed w/nx in native lingo. Very impressive annct for tape collection, s/off began w/wx forecast 1002, ended 1005. (Vernon)

1017 UNID AA-sounding chant, poor; audio chopped up by slop-Morocco possible, or maybe Turkey; GG stn not noted, 0220 12/23. (Con)

1020 VENEZUELA YVRS La Ascuncion o/u KDKA w/Margarita ID and an apparent on-the-air wild party 0658 12/23. (Connelly)

1025 COLOMBIA ?? "L Voz de .... Victor" 0828-0831 11/26, s/off 0831? (Maguire) Only HJ here is Ecos del Combeima, check SW // if necessary to confirm. CH

1035 PORTUGAL Porto Alto fair w/female Broadway-style vocal 0656 12/22. (Connelly)

1044 MOROCCO Sebaa-Aioun poor to fair w/flute jazz 2133 12/22. The sunset TA cx were mediocre compared to the good European SR cx. (Connelly)

1053 ENGLAND Start Point et al fair to good w/Moody Blues //1089 0654 12/22. (Connelly)

1070 VENEZUELA YVMA Maracaibo good w/clear Mundial Zulia ID, then slow SS ballad; hetted by pest Emissor Atlantico HJAG on 1071 on 12/23. (Connelly)

1089 ENGLAND Crowborough/Orfordness fair through WBAL slop: Moody Blues mx //1053 0654 12/22. (Connelly)

1107 USSR Arkhangelsk 12/8 2210 probable source of instrumental mx, Xint sig o/AFN w/US FB game. (Vernon) Why not Kaunas?? CH

1134 UNID loud het growl, probably from mixing of several Spanish locals 0649 12/22. (Connelly)

1143 USSR Kaliningrad FS 12/8 2133 male and female w/jokes or stories between mx (all EE), local-like signal, listed 500 kw, //1386 listed w/1000 kw much weaker. Frequencies of 194, 201, 219, 262, and 321 meters MW given at 2158 and 2201. (Vernon) I don't think 1386 has ever used the 1000 kw; I'd believe a couple hundred kw based on their sig when on 1385-CH

1161 FRANCE Strasbourg good w/man and woman in FF 0648 12/22. (Con)

1179 ROMANIA Bacau 12/8 2301-2302 noted w/choir mx, probable anthem s/off, //1152. (Vernon) Nice....CH

1188 JAPAN JOKP Kitami NHK1 1125 11/4. (Maguire)

1197 WEST GERMANY Munich VOA fair w/discussion of economy by man in EE, hetted by someone on 1196 0645 12/22. (Connelly) 12/16 1721 good signal, best TA at this time w/talk about black slavery in America. They'll break from the Empire next, mark my words, hi. (Vernon) Not to worry, they'll run when they see the first redcoat-CH

1200 VENEZUELA YVOZ Caracas good w/Radiotiempo ID, SS anncr wished all a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year 0704 12/23. (Connelly)

1206 CHINA Kuming clear 1130 11/4. (Maguire)

1206 FIJI Sigotoka 1, 12/2 1058 GSTQ anthem, 1100 male w/Radio Fiji One s/off annct mentioing 558/639/684/1206 and believe 1467, also Fiji 3 FM, "till 5:55 tomorrow morning. So Fiji is here! Fair sig, no QRM, not noted since though. (Vernon)

1206 FRANCE Bordeaux loud w/France Culture pgm //1377; man and woman in an Asiatic lang, maybe Vietnamese, 0558 12/22. "Convoy" by C.W. McCall, then FF discussion of CB radio in USA; like a local 0643 12/22. (Connelly)

1215 CHINA ?? very weak 1135 11/4. (Maguire)

1215 UNID loud OC, not stable (wobbling frequency somewhat) 0700 on 12/22. (Connelly)

1233t CZECHOSLOVAKIA woman, possibly talking in a Slavic lang, at low audio level 0640 12/22. (Connelly)

1242t FRANCE poor w/man and woman in FF, sloped by nulled local WOCCB 0543 12/22. (Connelly)

1251t LIBYA Tripoli 12/4 1658 AA type instrumental mx, 1700 bell chimes, then 1700:30 three pips. Male in AA followed w/probable nx. Xint sig 1658, faded and lost by 1702. (Vernon)

1287 CZECHOSLOVAKIA/UNID Pargue present w/cl mx at low audio level; SAH and traces of second audio (pop mx) noted 0541 12/22. (Con)

1286 UNID the stn I have been hearing here is apparently not a TA but instead a Latin. Was heard at 0912 1/1 on a night when there were only a few of the very strongest TA's detectable. (Hutton)

1304 UNID het against 1305 0548 12/22. (Connelly)

1305 UNID talk by woman, poor w/1304 het 0548 12/22. (Connelly)

1314 NORWAY kvitsoy 12/7 0526 instrumental mx, fair sig //630. (BV)

1341 NORTHERN IRELAND Lisnagarvey fair w/woman in EE atop het scream 0632 12/22. (Connelly)

1350 USSR various, 12/8 2102 USSR anthem noted, then silence. 2103 male noted in RR-sounding lingo and cl mx. Maybe 2 stns here, with one s/off at 2102. (Vernon)

1368 UNID maybe Poland-choral mx at 0540; soft mx o/SAH at 0630 12/22. (Connelly)

1377 FRANCE Lille fair w/woman in FF 2204 12/21 slightly weaker than St. Pierre. Also good w/mx 0452 122/25 in unid lang. (Eckman)

1386 USSR Kaliningrad FS 12/8 EE service 2132, male and female w/jokes or stories between mx, poor sig //1143. (Vernon)

1395t ALBANIA/UNID-stn with woman in Slavic lang mixing w/a jamming type signal (low, raspy, wobbly het) 0537 12/22. (Connelly) Have never seen reports of Albania or anyone else being jammed on this channel-CH \* Lushnje fair w/woman in EE 2131 12/21. Also noted at tune-in 2040 12/24. Good sig at 2058 w/"Internationale" then IS. FF pgm 2100-2130. (Eckman)

1413 UNID BBC World Service 12/8 1715+ Scottish soccer final with Aberdeen versus Dundee United, local-like signal, ended 0-0 after extra time. 1721 other soccer mentions, then letters from WS listeners concerning sports on the WS followed by reports from English Division One games, lost by 1734. Is there a new BBC xmtr here? Oman seems unlikely considering signal strength and distance involved. Checked the dial after 1734, only the big Euros in. (Vernon) Sorry fellow, haven't seen any info on a new xmtr on this frequency-CH

1422 WEST GERMANY Saarbrucken good w/female pop group vocal 0534 12/22. (Connelly) Very strong w/Christmas mx 0608 12/25. (Eckman)

1440\*\*\*\* LUXEMBOURG Marnach logged here on this domestic channel for the first time: I believe this might be the first US logging of it in the US. Man in GG u/domestics, occasionally up to equal level 0532 12/22. Annrc said "hier ist Radio Luxembourg", then more GG talk often over-riding C\*GO w/WF1Q off, then a Dr. Hook record was played 0702-0705 12/22. Good highband TA cx here on Cape Cod this morning. (Connelly) Congratulatlons! CH

- 1458 ALBANIA Lushnje assumed the stn here w/man in unid lang 2140 12/24. No positive ID noted however. (Eckman)
- 1458 ENGLAND R. Manchester 12/12 again topping freq w/local-like sig and local road conditions. (Vernon) 12/7 0700 male w/ID, pips, then male w/nx, noted for first time this season. According to Medium Wave Club stn lost one of its three towers in September, which could account for its absence, if it's back up. (Vernon)
- 1458 ENGLAND one of the British locals briefly o/the slop w/EE talk then Elton John 0707 12/22. (Connelly)
- 1467 MONACO Monte Carlo good sig w/IS 0441 12/22 followed by GG pgm. Noted also at 2040 12/24, xint in EE w/religious pgm 2133. (Eckman) 12/8 2147 male in EE w/religious talk. (Vernon) Loud w/pop mx 0617 12/22. (Connelly)
- 1476 AUSTRIA Wien fair-poor w/choir mx 0609 12/25. Noted also w/good sig 0401 12/22 w/woman presumably w/nx in GG. (Eckman) ORF very good w/lush string mx 0527 12/22. Potent w/Slavic talk, then GG talk 0616 12/22. (Connelly)
- 1476 SABAH Kota Kinabalu 1027-1045 11/12. IS 1027-1030 s/on. (Maguire)
- 1485 ENGLAND R. Merseyside, Liverpool 12/12 0618-0736, signal in and out, plenty of QRM, must s/on after Radio Two pgms around 0600, thought maybe 0630 like London, Manchester 1458. Pgm was nx or nx-related, no mx. (Vernon)
- 1485 ENGLAND R. Humberside, Hull 12/12 just topping Merseyside 0725-0727 w/nx feature, 0727 mx. (Vernon)
- 1485 SPAIN one of the locals clearly dominant and strong w/SS talk 0709 12/22. (Connelly)
- 1494 FRANCE Bastia et al fair to good w/man in FF 0526 12/22. (Connelly)
- 1494 USSR Leningrad FS 12/8 2230 very weak w/female anncr in EE service //1143. (Vernon)
- 1494 UNID fair carrier noted 0513 12/25 but no readable audio. Presume that this was Bastia (French Culture Net) as it seems like most reasonable possibility on this channel. (Eckman)
- 1503t ENGLAND one of the locals probable here w/British EE talk, mx, poor in slop 0525 12/22. (Connelly)
- 1503 POLAND Stargard Szczecinski good w/IS 0459 12/22. Strong slop from WTOP. Also good at 0558 12/25 w/IS. (Eckman) FS 12/8 2230 1/2 poor sig w/EE service, female w/intros to various topics by male anncrs. Audio quality seemed quite muddy to me. (Maybe you have finally got forstbite of the ears....CH) One of the best freqs for Europe here, audio quality good at other times. (BV)
- 1521 CZECHOSLOVAKIA Kosice et al 12/8 2129 instrumental mx, 2130 pips, then IS. Xint sig. (Vernon)
- 1521 SAUDI ARABIA Duba fair w/male AA singing through WKBW slop 0225 12/23. (Connelly) Duba FIANLLY logged to my satisfaction 2040-2245 12/24. Audio finally in at 2244 w/man speaking interspersed by AA chants //15060 for positive ID. - 1548 ENGLAND one or more of the English outlets here 0403 12/24 w/very muddy audio despite good signal strength. No positive ID's noted. (Eckman)
- 1555 MEXICO ??? SS, bad distortion 0430-0505 12/28. (Maguire)
- 1557 FRANCE Nice good w/FF male vocal then man and woman talking in FF 0606 12/22. (Connelly)

- 1557 FRANCE Nice very strong w/FF talk, mx 0555 12/25. Troubled by OC from Caymans-1555 and occasional OC from WQXR. - 1578 PORTUGAL Canidelo fair to good w/light jazz 0713 12/22. (Con)
- 1584 SPAIN Spanish local here w/SS talk o/growl at 0603 and 0714 12/22. Spanish local ID's are not as frequent nor as obvious as the ID's on Latin American SS stns. (Connelly) For those who have not had the pleasure of hearing Spanish locals, they indeed do not trump up their ID's like LA's, and ID every so often, not after every record like so many LA's-CH
- 1593 WEST GERMANY WDR Langenberg fair w/mx 0027 12/25. Noted // to Sudwestfunk's Rohrdorf SW xmtr on 7265 at that time. From around 2300 thru 0430 most West Germans run the ARD Night Pgm hence it should be easy to get // pgms on SWF's SW xmtr's to get positive ID from WDR. This is probably why many EC'ers used to note 1586 and 1602 running // pgms around this time period in past years. (Eckman) Beware however that sometimes they are // and sometimes they are not.... Also, 1586 was only sometimes // to 1602, seemingly only when the mood struck-CH

# SURVEY OF HAMMARLUND RECEIVERS

When I rejoined the NRC in 1977 after many years absence from BCB DXing one of my most pressing needs was for a good communications receiver. I had kept an eye on receiver developments over the years, but none of the newer (unmodified) receivers seemed to have specifications, especially a.m. selectivity, indicative of outstanding BCB performance. Moreover, a glance at the IDXD column in DX News revealed that older tube-type communications receivers, mainly Collins and Hammarlunds, were still very popular among BCB DXers. Since that time I have acquired and used the HQ180A, the HQ150 and the HQ100A and have been very pleased with the performance of each of these fine old receivers.

What makes the Hammarlund receivers so popular in the BCB DXer community? The most important reason, I think, is that all of the Hammarlund receivers have adequate to excellent a.m. selectivity together with good dynamic range. Without both of these features, a receiver will not be a good performer on the BCB. Member comments in DX News indicate that most newer receivers are deficient in one or both areas. Granted, one can modify some of the newer receivers by installing mechanical filters (as in the FRG-7 and FRG-7000) or by making SSB selectivity available for a.m. reception (as in the SPR-4), but I have been told that these modified receivers are still no better than the HQ180A on the BCB with regard to a.m. selectivity and dynamic range. The only new receiver in the under \$2000 price range which will outperform the HQ180A is the Dymek DR33C (or one of its variations), and that is primarily in the vicinity of powerful locals. Another reason for the popularity of Hammarlund receivers is their stability, which is a result of their solid mechanical construction, temperature compensation in the HF oscillator, and regulated B+. Also, Hammarlund's edge driven tuning, even in their inexpensive models, is superior to the string driven dials often found in other inexpensive receivers.

In the following table we have summarized the primary features of interest to BCB DXers for Hammarlund receivers of the past thirty years or so. These features include the receiver type, approximate first year of production, the BCB tuning range(s), the primary source of BCB selectivity, and additional remarks of interest to BCB DXers. The single conversion Hammarlund receivers all have 455 khz IF's and the multiple conversion receivers all have a 455 khz strip at some point in the IF's.

In Hammarlund receivers, selectivity is obtained in one (or two, in the case of the HQ150) of three ways--by a five position 455 khz crystal filter, a 455 khz Q multiplier, or multiple tuned circuits in a 60 khz IF strip. The crystal filter has 6/60 db bandwidths of about 4.4/11, 3.6/10.6, 2.8/10.2, 1.0/9.4, and 0.5/9.2 while the Q multiplier is continuously variable from about 2.9/26 to 0.3/18. The 60 khz IF strip in the HQ180 and HQ180A provides 6 db bandwidths of 6, 4, 3, 2, 1, and 0.5 khz with a 60/6 db shape factor of about 2 1/2. We have been unable to find our notes on the SP600JX, but a QST ad gives 6 db bandwidths as 0.2, 0.5, 1.3, 3, 8, and 13 khz.

Popular opinion has it that steeper skirted selectivity is superior to shallow skirted selectivity, and that must be true to some extent; otherwise there would be no need for highly selective IF's. Thus one would expect the crystal filter and 60 khz IF to be about equal in the selectivity department, and the Q multiplier to be a distant third. However, my ears rate the Q multiplier and crystal filter about equal and the HQ180A's 60 khz IF slightly better, though not enough to make much difference in hearing most DX. This contradicts popular opinion, but evidently the Hammarlund Co. thought highly enough of Q multiplier selectivity to make it the primary source of selectivity for their 1958 delux model, the HQ160. And several top veteran DXers use the HQ100(A) or HQ200.

To a first approximation, Hammarlund receivers can be placed in two categories, economy and delux. I would classify the HQ100(A), HQ145(A), and the HQ200 as economy models and the others as delux to a lesser or greater extent. The distinction is not clear cut as can be seen by comparing features. And which receiver may appeal to an individual DXer is often a matter of personal preference. In my opinion the HQ200 is perhaps the best economy model because the product detector makes tuning around with the BFO easier (in the HQ100(A), HQ145(A), and HQ150 the RF gain must be continually adjusted while using the BFO to hunt for weak DX). In the delux class, the HQ180A takes top honors, though some DXers rate the SP600JX as an equal on the BCB.

Several receivers come in an "A" model, whose primary difference from the ordinary model is that B+ is rectified by silicon rectifiers rather than a tube rectifier. And many of the receivers had both a clock option and the option of one or more fixed crystal tuned positions in a so-called "X" model. Thus we find HQ100, HQ100C, HQ100A, HQ100AC, etc. There are also other differences between the older and newer "A" models.

For example, the HQ100 used the Q multiplier in oscillating mode as the BFO, while the HQ100A provides a separate BFO. A crystal controlled BFO was available as an option. The HQ100 series also had a 100 khz crystal calibrator as an option. The HQ180A also had several improvements over the HQ180, such as a vernier fine tuning control of the last conversion over a  $\pm 3$  khz range, fixed and variable tuned BFO, and 3 AVC positions. Generally, the "A" model is to be preferred because it is newer and has improvements over the original model.

The slot (or notch) filter which is available on some models is a very useful feature on some occasions. Adjacent channel splatter and TVI can sometimes be reduced significantly, and annoying hets (when listening in the wider selectivity positions) can almost be completely eliminated. The Q multiplier notch on the HQ150 does not seem to be quite as effective as the passive notch, but is still useful. The HQ150, HQ160, and HQ180(A) all have a built-in 100 khz crystal calibrator which is nice for locating SW stations or calibrating the bandsread tuning for the ham bands. The HQ160 and HQ180(A) have product detectors for SSB and CW which is also useful when looking for weak DX with the BFO. The Hammarlunds without product detectors overload when tuning around with the BFO unless the RF gain is constantly adjusted. Why this should be I don't know (my Hallicrafters SX110 did not have this problem), but the Hammarlund receiver manuals point this out (I suppose so that users will not conclude that their receiver is operating improperly).

In addition to the features we have already mentioned, Hammarlund receivers were built to last both mechanically and electrically. In the HQ180A, for example, I was amazed to find that almost all the capacitors were of the superior silvered mica variety. Indeed, it is said that one of the reasons the Hammarlund Co. went out of business is that no one ever wore one of their receivers out so that eventually the market was saturated.

Perhaps the best way to locate a Hammarlund receiver is through the periodic wanted-for sale column which appears now and then in DX News. I have not seen any complaints about receivers located in this way. Another option is to place a wanted ad in QST, but in this case I strongly advise prospective buyers to inspect the receiver in person before giving any money. Prices are variable, but as a general guideline the following may be useful: HQ100(A) \$100-125; HQ150 \$150-175; HQ160 \$175; HQ180 \$200-250; HQ180A \$300-350; HQ145(A) \$150; HQ200 \$325. The HQ200 price I have quoted is outrageously high, but is typical because few HQ200's were manufactured and it is considered a collector's item. In terms of what you get, it is hardly worth more than about \$125-150.

There are several ways to improve the less expensive models. Since all have a 455 khz IF at some point in the conversion, all can be fitted with a 455 khz mechanical filter. Chuck Hutton has modified his HQ129X with two Collins 2.1 khz mechanical filters and reports that it outperforms his R390A. Mechanical filters are not cheap (\$25 to \$150 or more), but installing one or two 2.1 khz filters in any of the Hammarlund receivers is probably the easiest way to get a state of the art receiver for the BCB. Another way to improve the performance of Hammarlund receivers (except the HQ180(A)) is to add a Hammarlund HC-10 converter. The HC-10 is the HQ180(A) IF/detector/audio and plugs into the last IF tube socket (on any tube receiver with a 450-500 khz IF). To my knowledge, none of the BCB DXers have used the HC-10, but at \$50-\$70 on the used equipment market the HC-10 would seem to be a very useful addition to an inexpensive receiver.

How do the Hammarlund receivers compare to the other older tube type models? In my opinion, very well. The Hallicrafters SX100 and updated SX122 are close in performance to the HQ180(A). But the less expensive Hallicrafters receivers do not have comparable selectivity to their Hammarlund counterparts. For example, the SX110 or its older equivalent have a two position crystal filter which is no match for the Hammarlund five position

crystal filter. Also, the top of the line SX100 and SX122 do not have 455 khz IF's, so adding mechanical filters to them is out of the question. National receivers are so infrequently used by ECB DXers and we know so little about them that we are unable to make any knowledgable comparisons with them. The only receivers that significantly outperform the Hammarlunds are the Collins. The most frequently used Collins are the R388 and R390A. Neither of these is significantly better than the HQ180(A) in the selectivity department. Their advantages are primarily better dynamic range, better shielding (the Hammarlunds all exhibit some pick up of strong locals with no antenna connected), and digital tuning. However, they are much heavier than the HQ180(A) and more difficult to repair, as well as being more expensive.

In a short survey article it is impossible to cover all aspects of Hammarlund receivers well. An excellent source of information about receivers is The N.R.C. Receiver Reference Manual which contains, among other things, reviews of the SPR-4, R388, R390A, SX122A, and a capsule review of the Hammarlund receivers. The NRC reprint RR10, "HQ180 Series Receivers", is an in depth review of the HQ180 and HQ180A with user comments. Beyond this, CQ and QST have reviewed most receivers at one time or another, and advertizements in CQ and QST are another good source of information. The following is a list of references I have come across: "The Hammarlund HQ129X." QST, June 1946, 24-25 & 108; "The HQ150 Receiver." QST, Dec. 1956, 26-27; "The HQ100." QST, Jan. 1957, 34-36, also, CQ, Jan. 1958, 46-47; "The Hammarlund HQ160." QST, Oct. 1958, 45-47, also, CQ, Mar. 1959, 52-53; "The Hammarlund HQ145 Receiver." QST, June 1959, 44-46; "The Hammarlund HQ180 Receiver." QST, June 1960, 42-43, also, CQ, Apr. 1960, 59; "Feedback: HQ180 Frequency-Conversion System." QST, July 1960, 45; "HQ100A." QST, Dec. 1961, 60; "HQ145X." QST, Dec. 1961, 60-61. Two other articles of potential interest are: "Hum Reduction In The HQ129X." QST, Nov. 1950, 106; "HQ129X Receiver Improvements." QST, May 1959, 38-40. For those contemplating modifications, NRC reprint R8 "Redoing Older Receivers" is a good starting point.

In conclusion, I would say to those seeking an outstanding receiver for the ECB at a moderate price they should look no further than the HQ180A. The other Hammarlund receivers are good to outstanding ECB rigs, but none of the others have as many desirable features as the HQ180A. In addition to being an excellent ECB rig the HQ180A is a very good general purpose Ham/SWL rig. If it is not as sensitive above 10 mhz as you would like, build or buy a preamp for the high bands. If you want more tuning accuracy, buy and install a digital display, say the KRS DD-2 from Radio West, 3417 Purer Road, Escondido, CA 92025. If you are not satisfied with its selectivity, add mechanical filters. If you want to try out exhalted carrier reception, build or modify a Q multiplier and connect it. If it breaks and you can't fix it, contact Steve Bohac. According to member comments, he is a genius at repairing and overhauling Hammarlunds.

This article was prepared from information in many of the articles cited above, personal experience, Hammarlund receiver manuals (be sure to get one if you buy a Hammarlund receiver), and comments from several individuals. I would like to thank those who have contributed to this article with their knowledge, experience, and assistance, including Steve Bohac, Russ Edmunds, Arthur Peterson, Bruce Portzer, Randy Tomer, and especially Dick Truax. Special thanks to Dan Lester and Stan Stanbury for their comments on the rare HQ200.

Addenda To avoid any misunderstanding of the selectivity issues, I should add that I do most of my split listening in the 2 khz bandwidth position of the HQ180A. Most of the time the 3 khz bandwidth would suffice, but the 2 khz bandwidth is usually slightly clearer and occasionally the 1 khz position is needed. My notes indicate that the 1952 Radio Amateur's Handbook has an advertizement which summarizes the SP600JX's features. Recent selling prices for the SP600JX are \$175-\$225.

Exact replacement parts for Hammarlund receivers are available from Hammarlund Mfg. Co., Division of Pax Mfg. Corp., 100 East Montauk Highway, Lindenhurst, New York 11757, Tel: 516-888-5561. However, their prices are about 5 times the price of equivalent quality components which you can find at any good electronics supply house. I would suggest that you consider them only for parts that are not available elsewhere.

\*\*\*\*\* Some other stations I remember coming in included WPTF N.C. usually atop 580, WAFB on 690 w/Cuba null'd, WRMP Fla. & KYW on 1060, WTIC & WVCB Fla. on 1080 depending which way the radio was facing, & WBSC on 1550. The other EC clears came in too, but were subject to interference from LAs. Stations from the Midwest did not make it. I did not hear Chicago clears & there was no trace of KXEL on 1540, for example. WKY came in but was weak. WKFW was quite good on 1520. But there was no CBE on 1550, no WHAS on 840 (at least when I tuned in) & Latins dominated on other frequencies like 760, 1020, 1120. While I was never sure of our exact location while en route, we hugged the U.S. EC for a while going S, & the dial was jammed with stations all up & down the coast. For example, WBZ, WTIC, WBAL, WNEW & WRVA were all L&C in the daytime when I checked; it was strange hearing them all there next to each other in the day. The regional frequencies were in many cases jammed with two or three or more stations. The local channels were very jammed, but the Atlantic City, N.J. stations dominated atop the noise for a large portion of the trip. WICC was very loud atop 600 for a very long way, with almost no trace of WCAO for some reason, even when WGBM was atop WRKO. The Philadelphia stations were also very loud off the coast, including 560, 610, 990, 1060 & 1210. As I say I never really knew exactly where I was, except somewhere off the coast. An engineer from the NAB whom I met at a convention explained to me that there is a very strong salt water effect for signals right off the coast, kind of like a "shelf" of radio signals, but then the deep waters of the ocean when you get further off the coast kill the radio signals. This is why the day signals in Bermuda were as weak as they were, he said. At present I'm N.Y. broadcast editor for AP, meaning I'm in charge of the metro coverage on the newswire stations in the N.Y.C. area receive. It keeps me busy, so I haven't been Musing too much of late, but I still really enjoy reading DX NEWS each week, including all the Musings and Mothball Memories by ERC & PETE KEMP and all. ## THE IDES OF DECEMBER A TRADITION

\*\*\*\*\* Thirty eight years ago, eight days after Pearl Harbor Day, I got up early in the morning to DX. No particular reason for that day, but I happened to DX on the morning of December 15th, 1941. Next year, I did the same, and it became a tradition. Every Dec. 15th, I would get up early and see what stations were on. In 1941, I recall vividly hearing the brand-new idea of clear channel stations staying on all night to be able to alert citizens to sudden developments, as we were still in shock after the Japanese attack. Stations didn't know what to do with the responsibility of being on all night. Some simply had an open carrier while others programmed music, and several used the music box idea that had been used in Europe for many decades. KFI, Los Angeles, came through very clearly, as well as KNX, KSL, & all of the normally heard stations from the East & Midwest. But anyhow, the tradition continued even during the time I was in the Service, since I had access to a receiver in the Combat Information Center of the battleship I served on. So, for the 38th time, I DXed December 15, 1979, & encountered a dead dial below 900 kHz, except for the normally heard stations. Canadians dominated the dial, beginning with CHML, L&C on 900. I believe I heard CEW, Winnipeg, on 990. It was weak but constant & gave no local ID during the time I heard it. Other Canadians heard were CFRB-1010, CHUM-1050, CHOK-1070, CKOC-1150, CJBK-1290. Outside of new CEW (if that's what I heard), I had no new stations, and nothing exciting. Last Dec. 15th, I had KOA-850, like a local for a half hour. Believe it or not, this is the first time in 38 years I've heard KOA in Pennsylvania. Too many ANs in the East ever since WJW moved from 1240 in Akron to 850 in Cleveland.

CHAPTER CXXIX - "THE GREAT NORTHEAST BLACK-OUT, 9 NOVEMBER, 1965" - by MARK CONNELLY.  
Recently WBCN-FM commemorated the 14th anniversary of the famous power outage which brought a large portion of the U.S. to a grinding halt; listeners called in and recounted their experiences. I was a junior in high school at the time; home was with my parents and brother at 85 High Heath Road in Arlington, Mass. The backyard abutted Menotomy Rocks Park, a wooded area of about 150 acres. Of course, I found this quite a fertile area for "antenna farming". I had a 1965 vintage Realistic TRF for MW & a Hallicrafters "Sky Buddy" for SW. A couple of other kids in the neighborhood & I used to get on CB Ch. 11 w/walkie-talkies to discuss DX; we all read Pop\*Electronics, Radio-TV Experimenter & Electronics Illustrated. Discussions were often about clandestine DX. On MW, I was primarily a domestic DXer, not seriously getting into TA DX until 1966. I listened to out-of-town stations for programming/much as for DX. Musically, I was into folk-protest, British rock, & American soul mx; the first two types were quite available on Boston radio, but the soul mx was more plentiful on N.Y.C. area stations. Murray-the-K on WINS mixed R&B with T-40 very well, Arnie Ginsberg on WMBX was good straight T-40, & WEZ DJ's Dick Summer, Bruce Bradley, & Jefferson Kaye worked a lot of progressive folk & British album cuts into their shows. WKYC-1100 Cleveland had the U.K. T-20 countdown. (continued next week).
