From the pages of DX News:

50 years ago ... from the October 8, 1955 DXN: Roy Millar, Issaquah, WA looked forward to the new DX season when all his DX'ing would be done by tape recording, using a "Time-All" clock to monitor two frequencies and, on occasion, even three or four frequencies.

25 years ago ... from the October 6, 1980 DXN: Dave Yocis' Musing revealed that he was 18 and a sophomore at Michigan State University, majoring in math and computer science, and that his main DX interests were LA's and domestic GY and WC DX.

10 years ago ... from the October 9, 1995 DXN: Robert C. Pote, Greenwood, IN checked in with his first Musing, saying that he enjoyed both DXN and DXAS, noting that things had changed since "back in the early '60's when I lived in S. suburban Chicago ... with fewer stations signing off, call letter changes, AM simulcasting FM stations, etc."

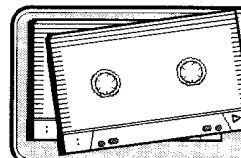

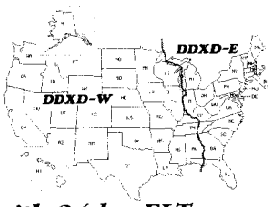

- **Please check your logs for errors before you send them to me.** I am often trying to beat the clock in submitting the column to Paul, and need to be able to trust what you send me.
- **Please make sure handwritten logs are legible.** I reserve the right to reject anything I can't read.
- If you don't report hearing a clear call ID or local identifying information, your log will be placed in the UNID/PRESUMED area of the column. **Quote what you heard.**
- Readers are very interested in **reception quality.** Include it in your logs!
- A station has to be at least 50 miles away from your listening location to be considered DX.

Thanks for your attention to these things. Good DX to all!

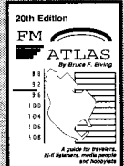

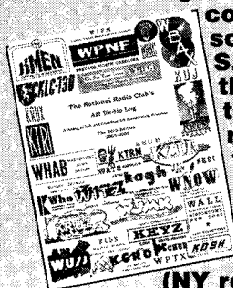

Ben Dangerfield European Trip Report

In mid-September we went on a tour that spent three days in Slovenia and ten days in Croatia with side excursions to Trieste, Italy and Montenegro. Also cut through a corner of Bosnia. As we were constantly on the go my DXing was limited plus being in hotel rooms and anyone knows the buzzes that occur in most hotels unless there is an outside balcony. I used my Sony-100 with a Gerry Thomas designed Q-Stick (passive ferrite rod with tuner) which did improve the weak signals but also made the noises louder. Daytime DXing varied. In Slovenia the nearby 918 Ljubljana was very strong, with 1170 Beli-Cris and 1134 Croatia fair. And a Slovenian on 549 kHz. Not much else there days as we were in the mountains. The best daytime DX was from Dubrovnik in the southwest corner of Croatia on the Adriatic. There in the middle of the day I found about a dozen Italian stations, mostly on the other side of the Adriatic. The loudest was 1449 Squinzano, but stations on 693, 1314, 1431 and 1116 were also

good. Bari is on 1116. But from Dubrovnik the strongest daytime signals were from the Albanians on 1089, 1395 and 1458 kHz. 1134 Zadar was good and 774 Hrav was fair. Also heard days there were 630 Tunisia, 675 Libya and 1008 Corfu, Greece. On the way down the Croatian coast we did a tour of Zadar but I couldn't find the towers for 1134 kHz. A local guide told me the main tower was atop a mountain just north of the city on the Adriatic but there must be more than one tower as they run directional at times and I think, southeast to northwest, which would put them on the great circle path to North America. Incidentally, this station is off the air from early morning to mid-afternoon. The Zagreb area - which we also visited - is covered by 1125 Deanavec. Nighttime listening is very interesting throughout the area of my trip. What you hear best are stations in Romania (several), Bulgaria (several) and Albania. Turkey on 702 and 1017 is very good and Egypt on 774, 819, 864 and 1107 kHz. Several Greek stations come in easily, among them 729, 999, 1494 and 1512 kHz. Libya is also very loud, especially on 1251 kHz. And of course, 1521 Saudi Arabia. Italy is easily heard, especially 900 Milan, and Vatican on 1530 and 1622 kHz. One of the loudest stations heard nightly is 810 Macedonia which is easily identified. Stations in northern Europe are not as good except for the Germans while France and Spain are fair. I just didn't have time to keep a detailed report. I loved Slovenia and Croatia and the scenery, the food, the beer and wine, and the people were terrific. One final observation: I didn't hear a peep out of 846 Rome so they are either off or using low power.

International News

DENMARK: Danish public broadcaster *Danmarks Radio* (DR) has announced that it is to reduce its budget by 95 million kroner over the next two years. Approximately 100 jobs will be cut... [RN Media weblog, MWC, via ARC *Information Desk*] The LW and MW transmitters in Kalundborg would be closed down - and so DR will stop using 243 and 1062 kHz. The final decision on such a closure must, however, be taken by the Ministry of Culture. Currently DR is obliged to use LW and MW. A decision on the closure of the transmitters in Kalundborg will probably take effect as of January 1st 2007. The foreign language services (in English, Arabic, Serbo-Croatian, Somali, Urdu and Turkish) will be terminated by the end of December 2005. [Stig Hartvig Nielsen, MWC, via ARC *Information Desk*]

MEXICO: XEQOO R.Pirata, 1050 kHz Cancún is now "Imagen 1050." The programming originates in Mexico City. It consists of mostly talk: news, sports, politics. And they have a program in English at 1030 and 0400 UT. The station is now operated by the "Imagen Informativa" network. Their web page is at www.imagen.com.mx. [Elmer D. NETHERLANDS: *Radio 10 Gold* was awarded the Marconi Award for the best radio station in the Netherlands 2004-2005 at the annual Broadcasting Congress. The jury observed that despite being a mediumwave station (1008 kHz), *Radio 10 Gold* has succeeded in reaching a large audience. PHILIPPINES: 1404 DXAQ *Sunshine Radio*, Davao City is a new station. First heard Aug 10, appears to be part of the network Sunshine Philippines Movement (SPM)(Catholic) stations. Announces web site www.sunshineradio.com. The Angel Radyo network has been re-branded as Sunshine Radio. It's announcing all the frequencies marked 'an' in WRTH-2005, and additionally DXBL (listed on 801 kHz - I thought the anct said 810, but either it or I could be wrong) and new DXAQ Davao City 1404 kHz. RAMADAN: Ramadan - First day: October 4 2005; last day: November 2 (or maybe November 3) 2005. Many stations in the Islamic areas of the world have special schedules during Ramadan. Often they operate 24/7 so increasing the chance for DXers to hear them. [Steve Whitt, MWC, via ARC *Information Desk*]

Dredged memories of DX'ing, DX'ers, and the National Radio Club

The relationship between radio stations and DX'ers has provided grist for many a radio historian's mill as well as a great amount of introspection among the hobbyists.

DX'ers of my generation, who started in the '50s and '60s, were part of the second or even the third generation of practitioners in the hobby.

Back during the first generation, when broadcasting (which I define as regularly scheduled programs designed for specific audiences of listeners) was in its infancy, the line between DX'ers and listeners was quite fuzzy. Not just in the minds of DX'ers but in the minds of broadcasters as well.

Analyzing the radio magazines from the '20s and '30s, we find stories about the artists for their fans, how-to articles about antennas and receivers, schedules of radio stations all over America and DX reports, all under the same magazine cover. Many newspapers around the country established clubs for DX'ers. *The Buffalo Evening News*, the *Chicago Daily News*, and the *Toronto Evening Telegram* are found in a list of 1930s clubs in NRC's 50th anniversary book in 1983. The Newark News Radio Club (see <http://www.81.pair.com/otsw/NNRC.html>) continued past World War II even after the newspaper itself dropped sponsorship, finally succumbing in April 1982. Many more newspapers in the '30s published individual program schedules not just for stations in their own market but for stations around the country.

Before the days of national advertising agencies, audience measurement polls represented in the early days by Hooper Ratings and today by Arbitron, computerized engineering techniques that establish coverage areas almost to the inch, among other factors, the relationship between DX'ers and broadcasters was like a marriage. Broadcasters courted DX'ers with QSL cards, EKKO stamps, dozens of DX programs every week and nationwide silence on DX program frequencies and Night Owl clubs to entice reports from DX'ers.

For some strange reason, when I was a teen, I used to enjoy reading letters to the editor in library file copies of, among others, Time Magazine, and recall finding several letters in reaction to KGFJ-1230, Los Angeles, beginning a 24-hour-a-day, seven-days-a-week broadcast schedule shortly after World War II. There was sufficiently widespread opposition AN-7 broadcasts by any station from radio listening hobbyists that it was an issue covered by Time!

Today, only a handful of broadcast engineers are sympathetic toward our hobby; in the '40s and '50s when I was first learning about DX'ing, it was still almost as much of a thrill for radio station personnel to receive a DX report as it was for us DX'ers to hear a new station.

By the early '60s, as most full-time stations went to 24-hour-a-day schedules, six days a week, the all-night broadcasters began to become pests in the eyes of DX'ers and DX'ers began to become pests in the eyes of radio station personnel. But we DX'ers still had Monday-morning silent periods and daytimers licensed to operate only between sunrise and sunset.

Parking on nearly any frequency on Monday mornings brought us West Coast sign-offs, East Coast sign-ons, and many foreign stations in between. Parking on nearly any frequency during critical hours sunrise to sunrise +2 and sunset -2 to sunset brought multitudes of sign-on or sign-off logs every 15 minutes.

And verifications. When I sent reception reports, between about 1956 and 1966, my reply rate was more than 70 percent, without follow-up. It had been better. It's now much worse.

Around the time I was breaking in to DX'ing, the glory days of the '30s and '40s were still in the minds of DX'ers, who felt that radio station personnel were obligated to verify our reports. By the time I joined NRC in 1956, station relations had become a topic of concern. It became such a sin to send a reception report without return postage that anyone caught doing it would be kicked out of the club. There were also minimum standards for reception reports, but not quite so strict as some "purists" who would have required 30 minutes of continuous programming.

Tentative reports were a gray area. If the DX'er had some specific items of programming ... time for a commercial, for example, that could be checked against the log or, better, a short tape ... most of us would not frown on asking radio station personnel if this was their station. A verification under those circumstances, though, was suspect unless station personnel wrote that they had checked what we sent against what was broadcast and it definitely was their station. Many stations automatically verified anything that came their way, and that, unfortunately, resulted in a few DX'ers finding out that they could collect verifications without going through the middleman process (as I put it 40 years ago) of hearing the station.

In the late '40s, *World Radio Handbook* (now *World Radio Television Handbook*) was born as the hobby grew exponentially. On shortwave, several of the international broadcasters had established penpal clubs and answered listeners' letters on the air, broadcast DX tips (a few still do), and solicited reception reports in an effort to hook us as regular listeners. For a while, it was a novelty for tropical band stations in various localities around the world to receive reports and send QSL letters and pennants, but as the number of hobbyists expanded, the novelty wore off and these letters in English or pigeon Spanish were less frequently, if at all, answered.

By 1964, there were rumblings of discord among the hobby clubs as well as in the relationship between broadcasters and DX'ers. A relatively young shortwave DX'er from Wisconsin, Don Jensen, pushed for the formation of the Association of North American Radio Clubs. Shortly after ANARC was formed, the National Radio Club joined, and shortly after that, I became one of NRC's three delegates. I believed in ANARC, supported its activities and (according to a history of ANARC's early days, written by Richard D'Angelo and posted "On the Shortwaves.com" website hosted by Jerry Berg and John Herkimer <http://www.181.pair.com/otsw/index.html>), I was appointed chairman of an Ethics Study Committee.

I wrote "A Code of Ethics for DX'ers" that was presented to the ANARC Board in May 1966. Later that year, D'Angelo wrote, "No unfavorable comments were received regarding the code of ethics drafted by John Callarman. In fact, there were words of praise, and several clubs had already published the code. The European DX Council was making slow progress in forming. They were facing many of the initial problems ANARC faced in getting off the ground back in 1964."

Unfortunately, I do not have a copy of that original "Code of Ethics for DX'ers," but Australian DX'er Bob Padula in 2003 posted a slightly reworded revision of it as the "EDXP (Electronic DX Press) Code of Ethics for DX Hobbyists," noting that the code "was originally formulated about 40 years ago as the outcome of a Committee set up by the Association of North American Radio Clubs," and claiming a copyright, requiring permission of the author for reproduction or quoting.

Since I was the original author and the revised EDXP version is very close to what I remember having written, here is a slightly revised version of the EDXP version of the original:

DX'ERS AND LISTENERS:

"A DX'er is someone who listens to stations for the purpose of hearing the station, without regard to program content

"A Listener is someone who listens to stations for program or message content

THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE DX'ER:

DXers are responsible to the stations they hear: for contact slanted toward the station's interests and for contact to reflect the standard of the hobby overall. DXers are responsible to other DXers: to exchange of information, to maintain the reputation of the hobby, and to maintain personal honesty and integrity. DXers are responsible to the club they join: to use the club as a means of exchange, to cooperate with the club and its projects, and to adhere to the Association's rules and regulations.

THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE CLUB: The club is responsible to its members:

To provide information of value in pursuit of the hobby, to engender a friendly spirit amongst DXers, and to ensure upholding of standards throughout the hobby

The club is responsible to other similar clubs: to exchange information provided by the respective members, to work cooperatively in areas of mutual interest, to avoid antagonism in areas of disagreement, and to assist in policing violations of ethics

THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE STATION:

The station is responsible to its listeners: to provide programming and to maintain good public relations

The station has no responsibility to the DX'er: unless the DX'er is also a listener and unless the station requests the DX'er's cooperation.

SUMMARY:

DXing is basically an individual, personalized hobby. The club should work to prevent individual actions harmful to other hobbyists.

It appears, 40 years later, as the original author of that Code of Ethics pondering what was written in 1965-66, my work 1) reacted in advance to an alarming trend that has adversely affected our hobby, and 2) remains, in my opinion, relevant to our situation today.

It also is disappointing to me that, on April 15 of this year, the Association of North American Radio Clubs was formally disbanded in a vote that was taken among the surviving clubs as a result of discussions at the March 12 Winter SWL Festival in Kulpsville, Pa., the site six months later of NRC's annual convention.

NRC had several years earlier dropped out of ANARC, noting that its primary thrust had become

oriented to shortwave, leaving little of interest to the medium wave DX'er.

But over the years, as recounted in D'Angelo's history, the NRC had more than passing recognition in the annals of ANARC.

Its founder, Don Jensen, was for a time an NRC member, though not active on the broadcast band. In fact, on my way to NRC's Montreal convention, I had a chance encounter with Jensen at Chicago O'Hare Airport. He and I had booked the same flight to Montreal for the gathering. Both of us had been contributors to Kenneth R. Boord's International Shortwave column in *Radio & Television News* in the early '50s and had much in common. We were both professional newsmen, he in print, I in radio at the time (followed by 19 years in print.)

Among recipients of ANARC's Man of the Year award over the years, cited in D'Angelo's history, were NRC'ers Gordon Nelson (1969), Don Erickson (1971), Glenn Hauser (1977), John Clements (1983), Mark Connelly (1984 and 1997), Ernie Cooper (1988), Mike Hardester (1993), John Bryant (1994), and Don Moore (1995). Several of these club members were honored for work beyond the scope of NRC activities.

Our "Confirmed DX'er" columnist, Harry Helms, won the Don Jensen Distinguished Service Award for 2003, the ANARC website <http://www.anarc.org/> shows. Though ANARC formally was dissolved earlier this year, the announcement from acting Executive Director Harold Cones noted that ANARC's "web site is a valuable tool for North American radio clubs and it will continue to operate with funding from NASWA (North American Short Wave Association) and the Winter Fest. In addition, all radio clubs, not just ex-ANARC dues paying clubs, will be encouraged to list on the web site and there will be no charge to any club, in many ways furthering the best communication between clubs."

Many NRC'ers are hams, many of current or former broadcasters, and most of us have DX'ed on other bands besides medium wave. Many of us will miss ANARC, just as some of us oldtimers miss the Newark News Radio Club.

Shared techniques for the new and experienced DX'er

So far we've discussed receivers antennas and logs. Now it would be smart to discuss QSL'ing, That is, receiving verification cards or letters from the stations we've heard in exchange for reception reports. This subject has been written about by much better dx'ers than your humble correspondent. I won't go too much into how to write a reception report, as it is well covered in the booklet sent to new NRC members. Some DX'ers have CD recorders and don't write a report at all, they send the station a CD of what they heard and I'm told it works quite well. My "shack" isn't so fancy so I type up "on paper" reception reports. The NRC log is invaluable in finding station addresses. Sadly it seems, at least in my own experience, that few stations have "station designed QSL cards" anymore. When I mail in a report, in addition to the SASE I also send along a prepared QSL card. This has the stations call, location, frequency, date and time of reception and a space for a station official to sign it. My PPC's were printed by a QSL printing firm. Often they can also be made and printed up on home computers. That way, a busy station staff member reads the report, ensures it is correct, signs the card, drops it in the SASE and mails it. Viola I receive a valid QSL card. Not as pretty as a station designed QSL but just as valid. This is how it is now. Most times the station staff member will also enclose a magnet or sticker or some such goodie. Also let me make it plain, QSLing is optional, nobody is obligated to reply to our reports at all, they do it as a kindness. I am told some DX'ers don't bother with writing reports and receiving QSL's, and are just satisfied hearing the distant stations. To each his or her own. As far as I'm concerned, QSL's forever.
