We are very pleased to acknowledge your report of KBOI reception during our special D-X program on the early, early morning of November 7.

It may be interesting to you to know that at the same time you were listening, and writing us, so, too, were many others. As we voice this acknowledgement we have heard from 35 different states, 6 Canadian provinces and, already, 2 air mail letters from New Zealand. We are sure there are more who haven't yet written or whose letters are on the way from distant areas.

Perhaps you are aware that KBOI, which was known as KDSH until about nine months ago, broadcasts on a frequency of 950 KC. with a power of 5,000 watts. From midnight to 1:00 am MST on November 7, we broadcast on the night time directional pattern prescribed for us by the F.C.C. and from 1:00 to 2:30 am MST changed to our regular daytime pattern which radiates equally in all directions from a single 300 foot tower.

May we thank you for the courtesy of writing to report your reception of KBOI and wish you happy "D-Xing".
