

F YOU have been thinking of buying a new radio set and are undecided whether you should or not, you can help yourself to another cock-tail and buy yourself three or four.

Neither television or magic tubes are going to cause today's receiving sets the least embarrassment. Television is at a similar stage as radio was ten years ago—the day of the crystal and the old "cat's whisker."

Television, as we said before, is not an invention; it is merely the development of a combination of radio and moving pictures. It will be at least three years and possibly five before it has reached that stage where one would monkey with it unless they were extremely experimental.

In the meantime, if you have one of the newer receiving sets you have something that is much more efficient than you realize. The only thing that is needed to improve radio reception, that is in a general sense, is higher powered stations.

Then we will get distance as clear as we now get local. According to ad-vance reports we will be granted this advantage some time this summer.

Then we can listen to Philadelphia at St. Louis, the Kentucky Derby, or any of the major sports events just as clearly as we hear Dick Sharp or Ken Stuart describe a fight or wrestling match.

Reports from the East are to the effect that the first week of dual broadcasting on one channel, such as has been undertaken by a station in Hartford, Conn., and one at Baltimore, Md., has been most successful.

It is true there are a few minor adjustments to be made, but the tests so far have demonstrated the idea is feasible.

Under the old schedule one of these stations had to close down while the other was on the air; now they both go on at the same time. Their listen-ers being favored with clearer and better programs.

Coloradoans Hunting For Meteors Now

A good many listeners of KOA, Denver, were made meteorite conscious by the recent five-minute talk on the subject broadcast by H. H. Nininger, curator of meteorites at the Colorado Museum of Natural History, judging from the mail response.

Many specimens of rock, which his listeners judged to be meteorites, were sent to him from all parts of the state. He has not had time to analyze all of them yet to determine whether a genuine meteorite was discovered through his talk. In addition to the specimens, a large number of listeners reported seeing meteorites fall, giving the location in which "the meteor man" might find them.

English Worried

Some apprehension is being felt by theater interests in England because the British Broadcasting Corporation has applied for a music and dancing license for the super studio being erected in its new broadcasting house. The studio will seat an audience of 1,000, and it is feared that box office receipts will soon be added to the revenues of the Government-owned broadcasting monopoly, which collects an annual tax of about \$2.50 on every radio receiving set used in the British Isles.

Gramophone Record Business Is Ruined

As rapidly as their contracts expire costly names are being dropped by the mechanicals. There are exceptions but in general Victor, Brunswick and Columbia, faced with terrifically depleted revenue from their discs, are anxious to escape contracts that carry guarantees, as in the case with most of the important, long established recorders.


Gene Austin's leaving Victor is as significant as Victor's other recent change of combining its distributors with RCA's radio jobbers.

Conspicuous examples of high guarantees that cannot be earned on present sales are Ben Bernie for Brunswick and Paul Whiteman for Columbia. Bernie's contract with two more years to go was considered a good contract for the mechanical rather than the bandsman when first signed three years ago. Now it's Bernie, not Brunswick, that's favored. In many instances have conditions been reversed. Disc sales are off as much as 65% and generally at least 50%.

National Networks Have Problems Of Their Own

The two large national broadcasting companies are having considerable trouble with their rapidly growing list of affiliated stations; seems as though some of the newer units have been ducking and dodging features the national broadcasters have to offer.

The reason for this is very evident. While local stations in various cities are keen on certain programs from either of the networks, they can sometimes sell time to local advertisers for much more than they get for being a chain outlet.

As a matter of fact a station releasing a national program gets \$50 an hour evenings, or \$25 an hour during the day. In contrast to this their own rates for spot advertising programs run as high as \$1,000. At a recent meeting of traffic managers here the consensus was that

At a recent meeting of traffic managers here the consensus was that less than 70% of a network's commercial programs received an outlet over the stations selected by or sold originally to the advertiser, and in many instances such programs came in for less than 60% national coverage during evening peak hours.

One traffic manager went on record as saying that of 38 stations under his supervision he wasn't sure of more than 18 of them when it came to placing at least 90% of the network's commercial programs.

Baritone Was Soprano

Tom Mitchell, the Rainier Rickey Man at NBC's San Francisco studios, won his first spurs as a singer when he took part in "The Holy City" in the St. Thomas Episcopal Church, Boston. Mitchell, a baritone now, was a boy soprano then.

Too much realism in her acting brought Bernice Berwin, NBC star, a bad cut in the hand not long ago. In an NBC radio drama in which she was appearing Bernice was supposed to break a pile of dishes while exclaiming various things in the tone of an angry wife. _____ "Let me break the dishes myself,"

"Let me break the dishes myself," Bernice told the sound-effects man. "I can get the right sound in my voice if I am actually throwing the dishes on the floor as I talk."

The effect was good, but Bernice put so much feeling into the dishsmashing that when the act was over, her fingers were covered with gore, and she is still wearing a bandage on her left hand.

NBC Must Now Approve Of Programs First

Order has gone out from the NBC headquarters that "programs must be definitely outlined and accepted by the program department" before the contract is signed and the advertiser given time assignments.

given time assignments. Means that NBC is getting away from the purely commercial angle which had been becoming more noticeable daily in the company, and is returning to its original intention of bettering the quality of the programs. NBC officials are now certain that the company is powerful enough to dictate to advertisers on the scope, entertainment and merit of the programs. For the first time the program department takes precedence over the sales corps.

Educational Program

A survey of an average week's programs of the Columbia Broadcasting System revealed today that 12.3 per cent of its broadcasting time is devoted to educational programs. This figure compares with the nation-wide average of close to 10 per cent shown by a questionnaire sent out recently by the Federal Radio Commission.

Interesting Programs For Easter Sunday

Easter Sunday will bring some excellent programs to American homes by radio. The sunrise service at Washington, D. C., and Mount Davidson, Cal., will begin the broadcasting. Later in the day Lily Pons, soprano of the Metropolitan Opera Company, will sing and the Philadelphia Symphony Orchestra under the direction of Leopold Stokowski will broadcast over a nation-wide network. The conductor plans to introduce "Lindberg's Flight," a new composition by Weill. This will be followed by the Good Friday Music from Wagner's music drama Parsifal, and Russian Easter, from the pen of Rimsky-Korsakoff.

President to Speak

Addresses by President Hoover, Secretary of State Henry L. Stimson and the Mexican Ambassador, Manuel C. Tellez, will be broadcast on April 14 as part of the celebration of the "Pan American Day."

Has Double Voice

We've heard of persons being "twofaced" and leading "double lives," but it is not often one meets a singer with a double voice like Lee Morse, interpreter of Southern melodies, over Columbia. Her phonograph records have been among the best sellers for eight years. Her dad, the Rev. P. J. Taylor, now 75, was one of the original eight Texas Rangers, of which only three now survive. Lee made her radio "premiere" over WABC last Friday night on the Van Heusen program.

Dana a Cabin Boy

Harold Dana's appetite for building and gardening is being appeased now that the weather makes it possible for him to continue with the work on his cabin near Woodside, Calif. Although dates with the microphone at the San Francisco studios keep the popular NBC baritone very busy, he makes it his business to do all the work on the cabin himself.

Columbia Has New Rule Appertaining To Songs

First intensive measure to limit the number of times one song shall be played on its network daily was placed in effect this week by CBS. Similar action by NBC will follow shortly but along different lines.

CBS now demands the program layouts days and weeks in advance of broadcast which are gone over by the program department and where the same song shows repeats the necessary deletions will be made.

The same song is never to be repeated within three hours during day programs. During night programs CBS will hold one song down to two times. That only after 6 p. m.

Formerly of Seattle

Betty Marino, NBC violinist at the San Francisco studios, had her mind set ön playing the harp when she was a youngster. Betty's father insisted upon her studying the violin. In order to get out of practicing, she used to stick the violin strings in water so they would break. However, when people began to speak of the beauty of her tone, she took an interest in the violin which she now plays so delightfully over the air. Betty formerly lived in Seattle.

Belgian Shepherd Dog Becomes Radio Artist

Duos grow increasingly popular among radio audiences, but there is one duo on the NBC Pacific network which stands out as distinctive.

Just a man and a dog—but a hush falls in the corridors of the San Francisco studios, when Reginald D. White and Wickee, his "eyes," make their appearance there, to go on the air in their weekly broadcast.

White is a war veteran who lost his sight in his country's services. Wickee is a Belgian shepherd dog a beautiful black and white animal who has dedicated her eyes to the man who represents her entire world. Where White goes, she goes, and where she leads, White follows, as secure in his confidence as she is faithful to their friendship. These two compose a duo in which there is complete harmony.

"Wickee freed me forever from the prison of blindness," White says when someone comments on the air of gayety and serene good-humor with which he faces a world which will never be light again for him. He radiates this spirit through the Spratts program in which he and Wickee tell dog-stories together every Tuesday afternoon at 5:30 o'clock, PST.

Here's An Idea How Television. Radio's Newest Mystery, Operates

RECENT article in the New York Tribune gave a very interesting account of how television operates, we have rewritten the article, to the best of our ability, to make it understood by those not versed in technical terms.

The idea in television is to send a sufficient number of photographs per second to give the illusion of motion, a similar principle to the motion picture camera and projector.

The next step was to convert these pictures into electrical impulses so they could be sent some distance and then reproduced by reversing the procedure.

So they developed what is known as a scanning disk. This is simply a large disk, several feet in diameter, with

holes arranged around the outer edge. The holes are for light to pass through and as it spins it photographs.

As it takes 16 pictures a second, the pictures when reproduced give the impression of motion.

In receiving television images the procedure is quite similar as used in radio broadcasting, only a neon tube is used. This tube is tremendously sensitive.

In order to reproduce the television images it is necessary to use another disk, also with holes and revolving at exactly the same speed as the transmitting disk.

There can not be the slightest deviation, otherwise the neon tube will not reproduce the images.

Because of the small area of the reflector plate in the neon tube the nage received is usually not more han one and a quarter inches square. ut through the use of a special lens his is magnified to a picture about nree inches square.

So, you see, television is really not n invention, but a development; the ombining of the achievements of notion pictures and radio.

gencies Worried Over Demands Of Programs

S OME of the large advertising agen- \mathcal{O} cies in the East, whose training, activities and interests have been confined solely to printed ads, principally to newspapers, have a growing problem that is causing much concern, if not actual worry.

The trouble is that many of the larger corporations and others not so large, are becoming interested in radio advertising, naturally they dele-gate the task of preparing their pro-grams to their advertising agents. These agents, in most cases, are not showmen and the results are not so good.

In addition to that there is the sister of the manager's wife, who thinks she can sing; or Ed Bray out in the shipping room who is a card and keeps everybody laughing on all occasions. The foreman suggests Ed be given a chance and to encourage the help the manager suggests Ed be included on the program.

If you think of going on the air, do not leave the preparation of your program to gentlemen who have been fooling around with type and layouts. Radio advertising is very productive, but you must present features with a lot of "zip" to win public confidence.

There are many agencies who rea-lize that fact and do not even try to be a P. T. Barnum-they leave that to those with a flare for things theatrical.

Seattle Boy Makes Good In California Radio

A S A SALESMAN, he was a fine musician! Bud Williamson, KYA announcer and crooner, discovered this fact when he tried to sell oil contracts

up in Seattle a few years ago. Not that Dud didn't sell the oil, for he did, but his methods were novel, to say the least.

A sociable soul, Dud would visit his customers at their homes in the evenings, taking along his banjo. He would strum and hum and so delight his hosts that he generally got his contracts.

Of course, Tom Smith, Dud's part-ner in the team of "Tom and Dud, the Two Crooners," remains unconvinced that the harassed customers didn't give Dud their business to get rid of him.

Young as he is, Dud knows Alaska of the "gold rush" era, for he was born in 1903 in a log cabin at Sulphur Creek, Yukon, a small town 40 miles north of Dawson.

He was sent to Seattle for his early schooling and then went to a military academy in Wisconsin. He returned to Seattle to finish his education at the University of Washington.

Williamson made his radio debut over KJR in Seattle, later going to Los Angeles to KMTR. Since joining KYA he has become a favorite with radio fams—especially ladies. He also conducts the Metropolitan Hour, a mightly footure nightly feature.

sion is of greater interest than the meager reports of the lower court since it sets out at length the entire evidence upon which Duncan was con-victed. A short history of the case will not be amiss at this time, in order that you readers may recall how this matter arose.

Robert Gordon Duncan, self styled "Oregon wildcat," was employed for many months as the regular announ-cer over a small Portland broadcasting station. Almost from the start he launched a program of vilification against prominent Portland business men and business, striving to injure chain stores as well as to upset certain political domination. When his abu-sive language could no longer be tolerated the federal authorities se-cured enough evidence to put the sta-tion out of business and to sustain a charge of violation of that part of the Radio Act of 1927 prohibiting the use of obscene or indecent language over the radio.

On his appeal from this conviction Duncan's attorney strenuously argued that none of the words used were abusive or indecent within the legal definition of these terms. Since the court of appeals printed a large part of the language proved to have been used by Duncan over the air, I am setting out part of it here so that you may judge for yourself whether or not it violates ordinary decency.

He referred to one individual as the "lowest dirtiest vilest grave robber on the Pacific Coast," and to a number as a "Bunch of infamous, despicable biomes and measurements of stellar grade" thieves and receivers of stolen goods. He stated that the newspapers looked on in silence while a certain individ-ual "looted the school funds and prostituted the school teachers of this dis-trict." The same newspaper is charged with protecting "Sodomites and con-cealing murder, arson and burglary and waxing rich from the wages of thieves." And, "Wait until I get through with some of the trouble vou're getting an ex-convict to make you're getting an ex-convict to make for me and I'll put on the mantle of the Lord and call down the curse of God on you, that's what I'll do. You infamous harlot, you arch criminal, the people should tar and feather you and yours."

The record is replete with other choice morsels, some of which would not look well in this column, and are for that reason left out.

Needless to say, after the court of appeals read through pages of this nature they had little doubt as to the guilt of the accused. They refused to find him guilty of uttering obscene language, but upheld his conviction on the theory that the record clearly

New York—(By Mail)—Two young men diessed in natty spring suits and topcoats and impersonating young butter-and-egg men from the Middle West, have been wandering through the streets of Harlem this week absorbing local color. Messrs. Amos 'n' Andy are in New York.

Coming to New York is one of life's most fearful adventures so far as these Chicagoans are concerned, anyway. They are, says Amos, "mos scared plum to death," and no kidding. Only the fact that there comes times when they feel the need of fresh inspiration, which they can get no other place save north of 125th street brings them hcre at all. Once arrived they like to walk arm in arm about the streets, stopping to chat with a Negro policeman loitering on the corner; keeping their eyes wide open lest some incident common to the neighborhood which might be turned into "copy" escape their attention, or they miss a character who might well be introduced into their broadcast affairs.

All this and a lot more was confided to a group of newspaper representatives at a luncheon given the famous team by M. H. Aylesworth, president of the National Broadcasting Company, this week. The luncheon was a memorable affair. It developed into a one-man performance with Mister Amos in the presiding officer's chair. Story after story, told in his inimitable manner, suspended all action in the dining room for moments at a time. The newspapermen couldn't catch their breath long enough to eat and the waiters couldn't straighten up long enough to serve. His quick wit never failed nor did he falter for an answer during the barrage of questions hurled the length of the table by the inquisitive scribes. Verily, it was Amos's day.

Not that Andy went unnoticed, but Andy was sick and every one tried to save him as much as possible. He had suffered an attack of indigestion, and besides his nose was swollen and was giving him pain.

One interesting thing about these two young men is that while, even in black-face makeup they would hardly resemble their radio characters, they never step out of role. Nor did it occur to anyone present to address them by other than their radio names, although they were first presented as Mr. Gosden and Mr. Correll.

In his more serious moments Amos explained why they permit no one except their announcer in the studio while they broadcast. It is a matter of being self-conscious and oversensitive to the presence of outsiders. They would forget the 'mike." Besides, when they work up a situation in which pathos prevails, they are very apt to get all chocked up over their own acting, and if any one is in the studio pride forbids that they show their emotion. One gathers the impression that Amos 'n' Andy are more closely identified with their broadcast personalities than they are with their own at present.

Harry de Laxaux Finds Historical Volume

Harry de Laxaux, NBC continuity writer, resurrected a memento of the theatrical past, the other day, when he found a little yellow book, inscribed "By-Laws of the Golden Gate Professional Club." The club was organized by San Francisco theatrical folk on Broadway, almost a quarter of a century ago, and Harry was one of the founders. Other members included Blanche Bates, Homer Davenport, Jesse L. Lasky, Lucille La Verne, Florence Roberts, Laurette Taylor, Ethel Grey Terry, David Belasco and Holbrook Blinn. Also a member was Olive West, who, after fifty years of "trooping" came home to San Francisco to become a member of the National Players and appear in NBC radio dramas.



D., of the Church of the Epiphany, Washington, and chap-lain to the Senate, and a concluding prayer by Chaplain Evans. During the service the United States

During the service the United States Marine Band will furnish the music, and there will be hymns by the choir of the Knights Templar, under the auspices of which organiation the service is being arranged. Dr. William Temple, who will speak before a microphone specially installed in Bishopthorpe Palace, York, is the second highest dignitary in the Church of England.



Eastern Priest Builds **Up Huge Following**

A PRIEST of a parish of 63 fami-lies, rector of a tiny wooden church capable of holding only about church capable of holding only about 200 people, has grown to be a nation-ally known prophet over the Columbia radio system. He is the Rev. Father Charles E. Coughlin of the Shrine of the Little Flower, at Twelve Mile Road and Woodward avenue, Royal Oak, a suburb of Detroit, Mich., who broadcasts over a network of Colum-bia stations at 7 P. M. every Sunday evening, commanding perhaps the largest audience regularly addressed by any Catholic priest in this country.

If any one had any doubts of the popularity of Father Coughlin's program, this was dispelled recently when more than 200,000 letters poured into the Columbia system from all parts of the country urging that this preacher continue his series of sermons on Com-munism. Inclosing one of his ser-mons, Father Coughlin intimated that pressure was being brought to bear to censor his remarks, and he invited his hearers to express themselves on the subject. The 200,000 letters were almost unanimously in favor of his continuing his talks.

Father Coughlin came to Detroit from a parish in Ontario, Canada, a few years ago, and, after serving as assistant in one of the Detroit churches, was assigned to found the Shrine of the Little Flower in a sparsely settled neighborhood which today provides his little church with but sixty-three families as parishioners. He was quick to perceive the advan-tages which radio presented as a means of reaching a large number of listeners, and inaugurated a series of services, broadcast through one Detroit station.

Fearless in his sermons, he soon attracted widespread attention, and last year he delivered his sermons over a network of three stations, which this year was increased to sixteen Colum-bia chain stations covering the Mid-west and the eastern sections of the country.

He prepares all his own sermons-usually at the last minute and is obliged to maintain a clerical force of 35 stenographers to answer the thousands of requests.

Observations By Radio Leader From England

GENTLEMAN named R. Mil-ward Ellis, chairman of the British Radio Manufacturer's association, who has been studying radio conditions in the United States, has returned to his native heath. Before leaving, Chairman Ellis made the following observations:

Hope for improved broadcasting system in England.

Anierican programs are overcharged with commercialism; British programs are too conservative.

England has less than a dozen broadcasting stations and only two transmitters under government supervision.

Only occasionally are celebrities heard by the listeners in England.

Harry Lauder is heard about once in two years, despite his enormous popularity.

American listeners have a much wider range of programs than the British.

It is not often that more than two or three programs are on the air at once in England.


There is little if any broadcasting in the morning; hardly any in the afternoon. The days schedules begin about 7:30 or 8 p. m., signing off at midnight.

England does not permit any jazz music on Sunday, or broadcasting of any kind during the hours of church services.

Mr. Ellis has no faith in television as a practical or commercial proposition; says that an altogether new line of development will have to be taken before it appeals to the public imagination.


