A BIG "KISS" FOR CATHY. In Washington, DC, Cathy Hughes' Radio One, Inc., which owns talker WOL and urban AC WMMJ, Bethesda, MD, is buying Albimar Communications' urban WKYS for \$34 million, giving the company a major stake in Washington's urban market. According to the Washington Post, Radio One may swap formats on WMMJ and WKYS, once the sale is completed. The purchase will give Radio One seven stations in the Baltimore-Washington area. Hughes had made a previous attempt to buy WKYS at the same time as Albimar.

KNOW BEFORE YOU CHANGE; WHAT'S HOT AND WHAT'S NOT IN FORMATS. This week's format chart compares large market commercial formats to those of the smaller markets. Country tops both lists--16.3% of Arbitron markets and a whopping 36.8% of smaller market stations. New to the M Street format charts is the Arbitron Average format share. Compiled with the cooperation of Interep, this gives a quick look at the format market penetration as compared to Arbitron market share. Look in the "RTG" column for this new information.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The Commission has denied a motion filed by David and Carese Bott, joint tenants, to cancel the construction permit it had granted to Omni Broadcasting Company for a new station on 107.5 A (now WJOI) at Germantown, TN (Memphis).

The Commission affirmed the Review Board's decision which granted Omni's application and denied those of Germantown Broadcasting Corporation, and Bott. Omni was the preferred applicant based on qualitative factors enhancing integration. While appeals were pending, the Commission issued a CP to Omni which constructed its station, and started programming tests.

Then, because the comparative hearing rules were thrown out in Bechtel v. FCC, the court remanded this case for further consideration, in response to a motion by Bott.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK (cont'd)

The Commission stated that it would not terminate Omni's operation of its facilities pending further comparative proceedings. The Commission said that contrary to claims by Bott and GBC, the court's remand of a comparative proceeding does not imply that existing service must be terminated. However, the Commission noted that when Omni chose to construct its station, it assumed the risk that the comparative decision in its favor may not survive at the end of the proceeding, and that nothing in this proceeding can change the fact that Omni bears this risk.

FCC Chairman Reed Hundt slapped broadcasters with accusations of being "long on opinions, but short on facts" when it comes to news gathering. In a speech to the Connecticut Broadcasters, Hundt said it's time for broadcasters to adopt similar news practices to those of print publishers. "Since the reality is that broadcasters deliver the news to more Americans than print publishers do, why isn't it time for broadcasters to adopt similar practices?"

Hundt cautioned that, "in the face of auctioning of spectrum space, which in the current narrowband auction is going at \$3.00 per pop per megahertz, the public will be asking more and more what it is that broadcasters are giving back to the public that justifies the fact that they get their licenses for nothing."

Hundt closed his speech by noting, "I'm in this for the public service of the job and you are a key part of the FCC's public. So tell us how to redefine our job, how to simplify your life, and how to serve you better."

The Commission has appointed a new engineer-in-charge of the Detroit field office. He's James Bridgewater, who most recently served as an engineer in the District Office. The office has jurisdiction over Ohio, and portions of Michigan and Kentucky.

The National Association of Broadcasters (NAB) announced that Gary Owens will be the 1995 radio inductee for the Broadcasting Hall of Fame. Owens will be honored Tuesday, April 11 at a special radio luncheon during NAB's spring convention (NAB '95), April 9-13, Las Vegas, NV.

ELSEWHERE

The Radio Advertising Bureau reports that the combined national spot and local radio ad revenue through the third quarter of this year was up 11% as compared to the same nine-month period in 1993. Growth was strong and consistent on the national spot with 12% gain and local with 11% gain over the previous year. Overall radio revenue for September grew 10% on the strength of a 9% gain in local revenue and a 12% jump in national advertising dollars vs. revenue levels during the same month in 1993. This is the 25th consecutive month of radio revenue gains.

SportsFan Radio Network (SFRN) announced the acquisition of The Pete Rose Show from Katz Radio Group. The show will run from 7-9 pm weekdays followed by the current 12 hours of weeknight live sports programming originating from Las Vegas. The Premiere Radio Networks will handle the advertising sales for the show. The station has been doing religion since 1988, but after the sale is completed, the station will feature programming "aimed at the nearly 900,000 Catholics in the listening area," according to the press release. The sale leaves Gore-Overgaard with one station--WTMR, Camden, NJ.

Westwood One's third quarter '94 was its best since 1988, according to a press release. Net revenues were up 61% over the same period last year to \$36,491,000. The increase is mainly attributable to the acquisition of the Unistar Radio Networks. Operating income was \$4,010,000 for Q3 '94, up from \$840,000 over the third quarter of 1993.

TAKING THE GOOD WITH THE BAD AT ARBITRON

GOOD: Settling the rumors of a potential merger or buyout with Scarborough, Arbitron's parent company Ceridian, Inc. has signed a letter of intent with VNU's Scarborough market research division to swap interests in each other's divisions. Arbitron will pick up a 50% interest in Scarborough while VNU will get a 50% interest in Ceridian's Competitive Media Reporting. CMR specializes in local competitive advertising information. Scarborough monitors media usage and consumer shopping behavior in 58 major U.S. markets. No word on how the merger will affect jobs at the two companies. Another big question is if the two companies will work together to fix Arbitron's error-plagued processing systems.

BAD: Arbitron has delayed the start of the Fall '94 Phase I Arbitrends by a full week because of the failure of some newly instituted software that double-checks some of the processing, resulting in mis-assigned zip codes for some diaries. Release of the data for all 94 markets will begin Tuesday, November 15.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

In the wake of what some are terming the "Republican Watershed" of this week's mid-term elections, broadcasters can look for new leadership of the congressional subcommittees that wield the most power over the industry. According to Radio & Records, the Senate Communications Subcommittee will likely be led by either Robert Packwood (R-OR) or John McCain (R-AZ). This position is currently held by Ernest Hollings (D-SC). Larry Pressler (R-SD) will end up chairing the Senate Commerce Committee. RBR reports the House Energy and Commerce Committee chairmanship could go either to Carlos Moorhead (R-CA) or Thomas Billey, Jr. (R-VA). The Senate Judiciary Committee chairmanship is also up for grabs, and may go to Orrin Hatch (R-UT).

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK (cont'd)

Inside Radio reports that the GOP may be in power, but the issues won't change--and the NAB's Jim May thinks that all of the battles broadcasters have fought and won over the past two years will come back. May says, "We'll be on the list" of new ways to produce revenue to balance the budget. So you'll probably hear all of your familiar favorites: spectrum fees, performance royalties, etc.

Radio & Records reports that Infinity's purchase of KLUV, Dallas from TK Communications may take a little longer as Americans for Responsible Television has filed a petition to deny that sale because of allegations of indecency on Howard Stern's show. ART says the indecency makes Infinity unfit to be a licensee.

KVCX, Gregory, SD, which is owned by the Wisconsin Voice of Christian Youth, Inc., has applied to take the station to non-commercial status.

ELSEWHERE

Who says you have to have FM's to make money. . .

San Francisco will become home to another AM duopoly as Pacific FM, Inc.'s Spanish KOFY, San Mateo is purchasing urban AC KDIA, Oakland, from 1310, Inc. for \$3 million. Pacific FM also owns KOFY-TV there.

Radio Equity Partners is selling 50,000 watt powerhouse WNOE, New Orleans to Communicom for an undisclosed amount. This purchase by Communicom marks their second major AM purchase. They recently announced their acquisition of WSSH, Boston from Noble. Communicom is returning to the radio business after selling the balance of their portfolio of properties earlier this year to Salem Communications.

Salem continues their major market shopping spree picking up a combo from separate owners. They'll buy Ragan Henry's rocker KKZR, Houston, and Susquehanna's brokered KENR. In a press release, Salem says the purchase of the two stations coupled with the construction of a new 2000 foot tower in North Houston will cost them over \$17 million.

In Cedar Rapids, Quass Broadcasting is doubling up by buying religion formatted KTOF from Young Broadcasting for \$1.865 million. Quass already owns country combo KHAK-AM & FM there.

As we reported earlier, Jones Satellite Networks adds a Spanish format to its fare as it will handle affiliate relations and ad sales for the California-based Z Spanish Network. The deal is similar to Jones deal with WTEM "The Team" Sports Network. In the same press release, Jones made official General Sales Manager Mike Tyler's plans to leave the company as it moves all of its Dallas-based sales and support functions to its Denver home office.

Sports Byline USA has entered into an exclusive agreement with the USA TODAY Newspaper for USA TODAY's sports writers to make regular appearances on Sports Byline's syndicated radio show starting November 14th.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The FCC announced the unveiling of the new digital "Emergency Alert System," which replaces the old EBS, stating the new system "... will reduce property damage, injuries, and deaths caused by natural and man-made disasters." All broadcasters will be required to purchase equipment, and comply with the new regulations by July 1, 1996. The NAB estimates the cost to the station to comply with the new rules will be approximately \$600.

The good news is the digital system will allow for automated and remote control operations. The digital system also allows for multiple source monitoring, a shortened alerting tone, decreasing the frequency of weekly on-air tests to monthly (although a weekly off-air test will be required), a standard protocol for sending messages, and the ability to broadcast messages in languages other than English.

In addition, broadcasters will be required to modify their existing EBS equipment to be capable of decoding a shortened, eight second version of the familiar two-tone alerting signal by July 1, 1995. After that date, EBS tests will require broadcast of the two-tone signal no shorter than eight seconds and no longer than 25 seconds. Finally, after July 1, 1997, the two-tone signal can only be used to alert listeners to the monthly test or can be used in an actual emergency.

Cable operators will be required to comply with the new EAS by July 1, 1997. Participation by satellite and other services is voluntary.

The Commission has proposed modifying the rules to allow unattended operations of broadcast stations. Although the licensee will still be required to make sure all technical operations are still in compliance, the new rules would allow automatic control equipment to monitor the stations technical aspects, or take the station off the air if something serious happens. If a station chooses to leave an operator on duty, the Commission will no longer require the operator to hold a restricted permit.

The Commission has fined two stations \$2,000 each for broadcasting telephone conversations without permission. The two are KRU Partners' KHSL-FM, Paradise (Chico), CA, and Susquehanna's WNNX, Atlanta.

The National Association of Broadcasters announce that January will be National Radio Month and will mark the 75th anniversary of radio service. The theme of the month-long campaign is "Radio - The Sound of Your Life". The NAB has promotional kits including special music CD with a variety of 30-second and 60-second jingles tailored to 5 different formats, promotion ideas, historical fact sheet, a speech for local radio managers, Radio Month logos, a Radio Month news release, a letter from President Clinton and bumper stickers.

ELSEWHERE

In what is turning into a regular feature of this publication, Arbitron reports more problems with 13 markets for the Fall ratings period. Inside Radio reports that the same software that had a hand in delaying the release of the Phase I Fall Arbitrends was responsible this time, as well. The computer caused Black households and 18-24-year-old men participating in the survey to get lower monetary premiums than they're supposed to, causing the sample for these groups to be lower than it should be. Arbitron is rectifying the problem by raising premiums for these groups for the remainder of the book, and says it's debugging the sample software as quickly as possible.

Gary Fries will lead the Radio Advertising Bureau into the next century. His contract was renewed through the year 2001 at the RAB Board Meeting this past week in Los Angeles. Election of new officers has elevated Federated Media's John Dille as Chairman. Granum Communications' Herb McCord will be Vice Chairman, while Albimar Communications' Skip Finley will handle the duties of Finance Chairman.

If you can't beat 'em, join 'em. That's former WMMR, Philadelphia, morning man John DeBella's motto after his ratings defeat to Howard Stern a while back. He's now on the same team as Stern by joining Infinity-owned WYSP doing 2 pm to 6 pm.

Quincy Jones, Geraldo Rivera, and All-Pro Broadcasting's Willie Davis have formed a new radio and television acquisition company backed by Tribune Broadcasting. Qwest Broadcasting's first purchases include Fox affiliate WATL, Atlanta for \$150 million and \$17 million for WNOL, New Orleans. The company has an eye on radio, as well, but no deals have been announced.

ELSEWHERE (cont'd)

In the Southeastern Connecticut (New London/Norwich) market, Hall Broadcasting is buying news-talker WNLC and soft AC WTYD, New London, from New London Broadcasting for \$3.5 million cash. This will give Hall a duopoly in the market with soft AC/talk WTCH and country WCTY, Norwich. Media Services Group was the broker for New London Broadcasting.

Kinetic Communications, who owns talker WMGR (AM) and AC WMGR-FM, Bainbridge, and silent WWGS and country WOBB, Tifton, is buying WRCQ, Dunn (Fayetteville), NC from Metropolitan Broadcasting Associates for \$2.8 million. Michael J. Bergner of Bergner & Co. was the broker.

Liberty Sports, the parent company of cable sports giant Home Sports Entertainment and the fledgling Prime Sports Radio network, will consolidate all of its regional networks with the exception of the Sunshine Network in Florida. Prime Sports Radio claims nine affiliates, so far.

Infinity Broadcasting's WBCN (Boston) Radio has agreed to carry the New England Patriot preseason and regular season games exclusively. Starting with the 1995-1996 season, the three year agreement makes this Infinity's fifth major franchise.

A new book-smart radio show produced by Publishers Weekly is now available Sunday evenings. The show "Between The Covers with Mort Sahl" will feature authors, publishers, agents and readers and is the first show to feature the \$16 billion dollar book publishing business. CLASSIC "ARROW" AND AC 70'S POP. . . The Katz Radio Group's Cristal Radio Research unit has just released a study on the rise of the '70s gold and '70s-based classic hits formats. Among its findings: That the median age of the audience for "Arrow"-type formats is actually older (36) than that of classic rock stations (31) and that most of the audience for '70s-oldies outlets have come not from their '50s/60s-based counterparts but from other ACs.

Contrasting the two formats, both the Arrow-type, 70's-based classic rock and the Pop-based 70's oldies formats seem to create a niche in the traditional 25-54 demo by shearing off the kids (18-24) and the 45-54 demo, creating a highly-targeted 25-44 core. The Arrow-type format is made up of approx 58% men, 42% women. On the other hand, the Pop-based 70's format is more evenly matched at 49% men, 51% women.

BMI GRANTED RATE COURT. BMI's motion to a U.S. District Court in New York has been granted to set up a "rate court," for those instances where an equitable fee cannot be negotiated between BMI and the radio station. Anyone seeking permission to play BMI licensed music would be allowed to do so automatically on request. If no agreement on fees is reached after sixty days, it will go to the court for determination of a reasonable fee.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The FCC has names Saul Shapiro to the post of Director of Technology Policy in the Plans and Policy Office. He'll be advising commission staff on technical issues regarding emerging digital technologies.

The Commission also has a new Inspector General. He is H. Walker Feaster III, who has held many position within the FCC. Most recently, he was Associate Managing Director for Program Analysis in the Managing Director's office.

The holiday season is here, and here are eight more reasons George Bailey should back away from the bridge--according to the National Association of Broadcasters recently issued list of broadcasters' accomplishments for 1994. 1) Fending off the spectrum tax. 2) Fending off beer-and-wine ad warnings. 3) Fending off a proposed \$100-million FCC fee increase to pay for jailing illegal alien felons. 4) Fending off the "performance rights" issue for digital recordings. 5) The new "leasing ad" wording which, NAB says, will bring \$20-50 million in new national revenue. 6) The new communications law overhaul which "secures a foothold for the industry on the information highway." 7) Fending off the health reform package's provision to disallow full deductibility for advertising expenses. 8) Securing SBA regulatory changes that will lead to more small business loan money for station acquisition.
