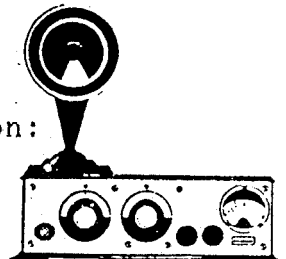

I took it in on a three dollar debt".

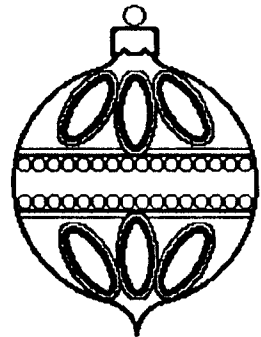
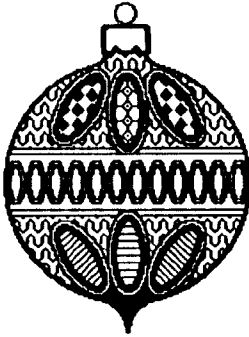


PSARA Meeting Minutes

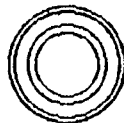
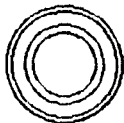
