Fans of KCRW-style eclectic music mixes will meet kindred souls at BeBop (18433 Sherman Way, Reseda), a combination performance space and record store secretly nestled in the armpit of the San Fernando Valley. There they'll find local balladeer **Milo Binder** trading quips with the audience, singing about his own ugliness and regaling all would-be gourmets with his personal tribute to "Plankton, Soup of the Sea"— on May 19. Or discover the perky, sometimes quirky female vocalist **Weslie Brown and Her Band of Men**, whose repertoire ranges from the almost Broadway-esque belting of "Mary (All You Need Is A Man)" to the post-David Byrne pop of "Little Pain" on May 24.

On the improvisational side of eclecticism, brassman **Walter Zooli** will perform an assortment of jazz instrumentals on the 25th, followed the next night by the loud, garagey trash-aesthetic rock of **Freudian Slip**. One never knows what to expect at BeBop: the

third Wednesday of every month is devoted to poetry. Anyone can participate. No advance reservations needed. The last Wednesday is reserved for open mike. There's no formal stage, no barriers between audience and performer, no smoking, no drinking and no age limit. Just a warmly casual atmosphere.

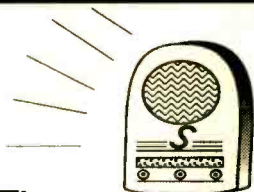

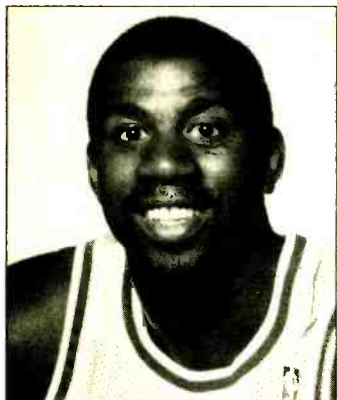

PIRATE MAGIC:



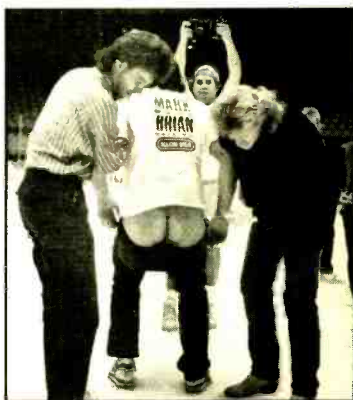
Magic Flushes

PETER POLITICS:**The Nose Knows**

morning gabber **Peter Tilden** got political when he joined the Exxon boycott by cutting a giant Exxon credit card. The boycott was started by **Mike Siegel**, afternoon drivetime host of KING-AM in Seattle, to protest Exxon's mishandling of the Alaskan oil spill. KLSX went a step further by sending a crew of qualified listeners to Alaska to assist in the cleanup. On a nosier note, KLSX recently unveiled morning star Tilden's newest billboard on Sunset Boulevard: a giant 3-D nose and glasses. Says Tilden: "The billboard nose approximates the size of my real one."

RADIO HOLLYWOOD:

Actor/comedian **Michael Winslow**, best known for his roles in the "Police Academy" series, has jumped ship from oldies KODJ to pursue film projects, leaving **Dean Goss** to handle the morning show solo. Meanwhile **Pat Buttram**, known for his role as Mr. Haney on the '60s sitcom "Green Acres," has joined the "Good Morgan Show" on KMPC-AM.

"FM," a series loosely based on Santa Monica's KCRW, is tentatively set for NBC's fall lineup. The show has nothing to do with the late '70s film of the same name. Speaking of NBC, Chicago's famous morning man **Jonathan Brandmeier** has signed a two-year contract with the network to host a late-night talk/variety show beginning in 1990.

AND THE WINNERS ARE:

KPWR Power 106 had the listening power to hold on to the top spot in the winter '89 Arbitron ratings, although it dropped from a 7.2 to a 6.4 while rival KIIS-FM rose from a 5.8 to 6.2. KIIS star, morning personality **Rick Dees**, however, managed to hold off the competition once more to top the morning drive derby.

Elsewhere, adult contemporary KOST continued to rise from a 5.4 to a new high of 5.6, while AC competitor KBIG was up 4.0 from a 3.3 and easy KJOI dipped slightly from 4.6 to 4.5. In the 25-54 demographic, KOST nabbed its 26th consecutive title.

Album rocker KLOS jumped dramatically from a 3.6 to 4.6, thanks in part to morning team **Mark and Brian**, which pulled an amazing 20-plus morning share with male listeners 18-34.

Ethnic formats took a beating with KLVE and KTNQ both down, yet KWKW-AM benefitted from its new frequency, up from a 1.3 to 2.3. Urban KACE dropped from a 1.4 to a 0.9, while KDAY was down sharply from a 1.2 to a 0.6.

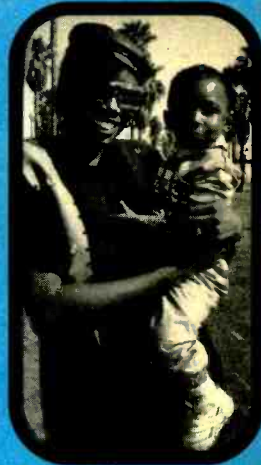

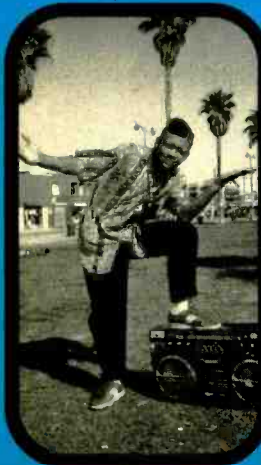

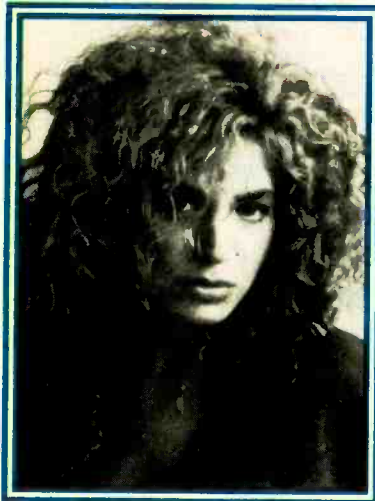

When White sings...

Black music is hotter than ever right now. Just check out the charts and the hit singles from black artists as diverse as Tone Loc, Jody Watley, Living Colour, Bobby Brown, Anita Baker and Karyn White.

But ironically, what's great for the artists isn't necessarily great for the black radio stations. The crossover success of these artists onto predominantly white pop charts has also paved the way for heavy return traffic-- a lot of white but black-sounding artists such as George Michael, Madonna, Taylor Dayne and Sheena Easton are now turning up on previously black-only stations.

Artistically, this musical melting pot works fine. But economically, this trend is beginning to worry a lot of black radio executives who see valuable ad dollars slipping away as more and more black hits turn up on white stations, taking advertising budgets with them. And to make matters worse, in the recent Arbitron

report (that rates radio stations and is a heavy factor in determining the station's ad rates), urban stations went down points.

"I think black radio in general has lost accounts over the past few years, and in particular in L.A.," comments Ed Kerby, president of KDAY-AM. "Let's face it; there's a tremendous black market here-- the third

largest in the U.S.-- but it's simply not recognized. They'll spend a fortune in Atlanta or Chicago, but not in L.A. It's an invisible market here."

According to Kerby, KDAY has countered such trends by aggressively pursuing the cutting edge in black urban music and largely ignoring white crossover artists such as George Michael and Madonna. "We tend to concentrate exclusively on the latest sounds, and about 70 percent of what we play is rap, and most of that's black," he reports.

"If there's a hot track by George Michael, we'll play it," says KDAY's program director Jack Patterson, "but it's on a track-by-track basis. We took the risk of going for the younger audience, and our hottest acts are up 'n comers like Slick Rick, Kwame and Big Daddy Kane-- artists you won't hear on any white stations."

"Crossover may be an issue, but I don't think it's a problem," comments Lee Bailey, president of radio network Lee Bailey Communications. "Good music is good music, and I think it's actually strengthening black radio when white artists cross over and vice versa, because it's satisfying the needs of our audiences, and they need variety too. And look at the large number of black artists get-

ting airplay on CHR stations today.

"To be honest, I think radio is inevitably becoming more homogenized these days, and that's why so much crossover is happening," continues Bailey. "It's hard for a station to stay all-black or all-white.

"The real problem is that there's still racism involved when it comes down to advertising dollars," Bailey states. "Let's face it; some black stations are rated higher than some CHR stations but don't get their share of advertising budgets. Why not? Because it's basically racism."

Over at KJLH, L.A.'s highest-rated

black station, program director Cliff Winston agrees with Bailey's assessment: "He's absolutely right, but that's life," Winston points out. "Black stations have to fight for every dollar of advertising, but it's tough to change people's attitudes. It takes time.

"It's also a business decision," he adds. "Look at KIIS and Power. POWER has a bigger audience, but less ad dollars. Why? Because it's a largely Mexican audience, and if you're not interested in reaching that audience, why spend the ad money?"

"Basically there's more competition for black listeners than ever, and I try to position our station right

in the middle. We're aimed at the 25-year-old bracket rather than the teens or older adults, and if they want to hear a cut by George Michael or Sheena Easton, we'll play it," sums up Winston.

According to program director Tony Hart, KGJ is largely unaffected either way by crossover because of their format. "We play oldies and classics, everything from Motown to James Brown, plus some of the hotter new artists like Luther Vandross and Anita Baker," he explains. "So it's more down to ratings. And when you get right down to it, there's still the name of the game in radio-- ratings."

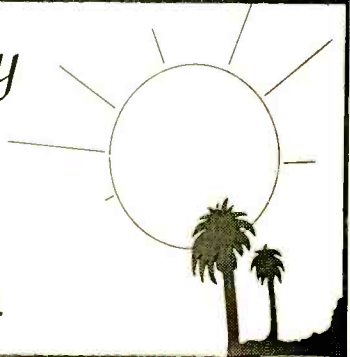

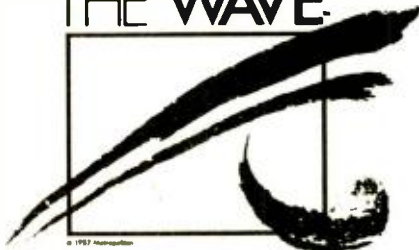

KEEPING GOOD FOLKS JOYFUL

KGJFJ 1230 AM is the oldest black formatted station in Southern California providing programming for the community since 1956. RADIO GUIDE chatted with KGJFJ's music director and chief engineer Johnny Morris, program director Tony Hart and Shirley Jackson, the operations manager.

SHIRLEY JACKSON

I remember walking home from school in Compton and passing this house everyday, and KGJFJ would be blasting out. I wasn't aware it was black radio. I just knew KGJFJ always played music that I could relate to. KGJFJ was THE station.

When I got this job I was elated. It was, for me, remembering what KGJFJ stood for— a powerhouse whose call letters stand for Keeping Good Folks Joyful.

JOHNNY MORRIS

There was always a radio on in my room. I remember when I was about 10, I built my own station. I'm reliving that time now. I started working full-time in radio as a disc jockey when I was 15. I feel privileged to work for KGJFJ. I grew up hearing about it. This place has a lot of history.

SJ During the Watts riots, KGJFJ was one of the few radio stations allowed in the riot area without fear of violence because it was so strong in the community. "Oh, it's cool; it's KGJFJ. Let them in."

The magnificent Montague was a DJ here. He always used the slogan "Burn Baby Burn" and continued to use it during the riots. Back then it created a lot of controversy.

TONY HART

I listened to Cousin Brucie in New York around 1963 or '64, when the Beatles hit. You'd hear a lot of black music then, too. There wasn't that much separation.

JM Radio is radio no matter what format or concept. I like all music, so I think if you like radio it cuts beyond. Back then there was more of a difference between black and white radio. Black radio DJs had more personality. They came on with theme songs, would sing with the records. Now they're pretty closed.

TH You have to remember on KGJFJ the star of the show is the music. People listen to hear our format: classic soul/rhythm and blues and oldies. We don't look at it as black or white music.

JM I think black radio has really evolved along into a more professional

presentation. Of course, musically, it's always been innovative.

TH It's a shame, too, that a lot of people have a stigma about AM. They say they've got this \$6,000 stereo in their car, so why do they want to listen to crackly old AM? But when people discover us, they stay with us. People like the music we play. We don't try to escape reality with our programming, but sometimes it's good to just close your eyes and remember...

Like in 1964, I played a new record by the Supremes. Then in 1974 I played it again. It was an oldie. In 1984 I played it again. I was just listening to my first air check from 1964, and all the records I played were like the ones I played three days ago. Lots of memories. The main emphasis is to try and play records a majority of people will remember.

SJ Radio is magical. It can permeate lots of areas, and you can't see it but you can hear it, so the community it creates gets past geographical boundaries. It becomes a community that's in our minds. KGJFJ reaches out. I gotta say Johnny makes our 1000 watts sounds like 100,000 watts!

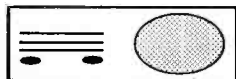
