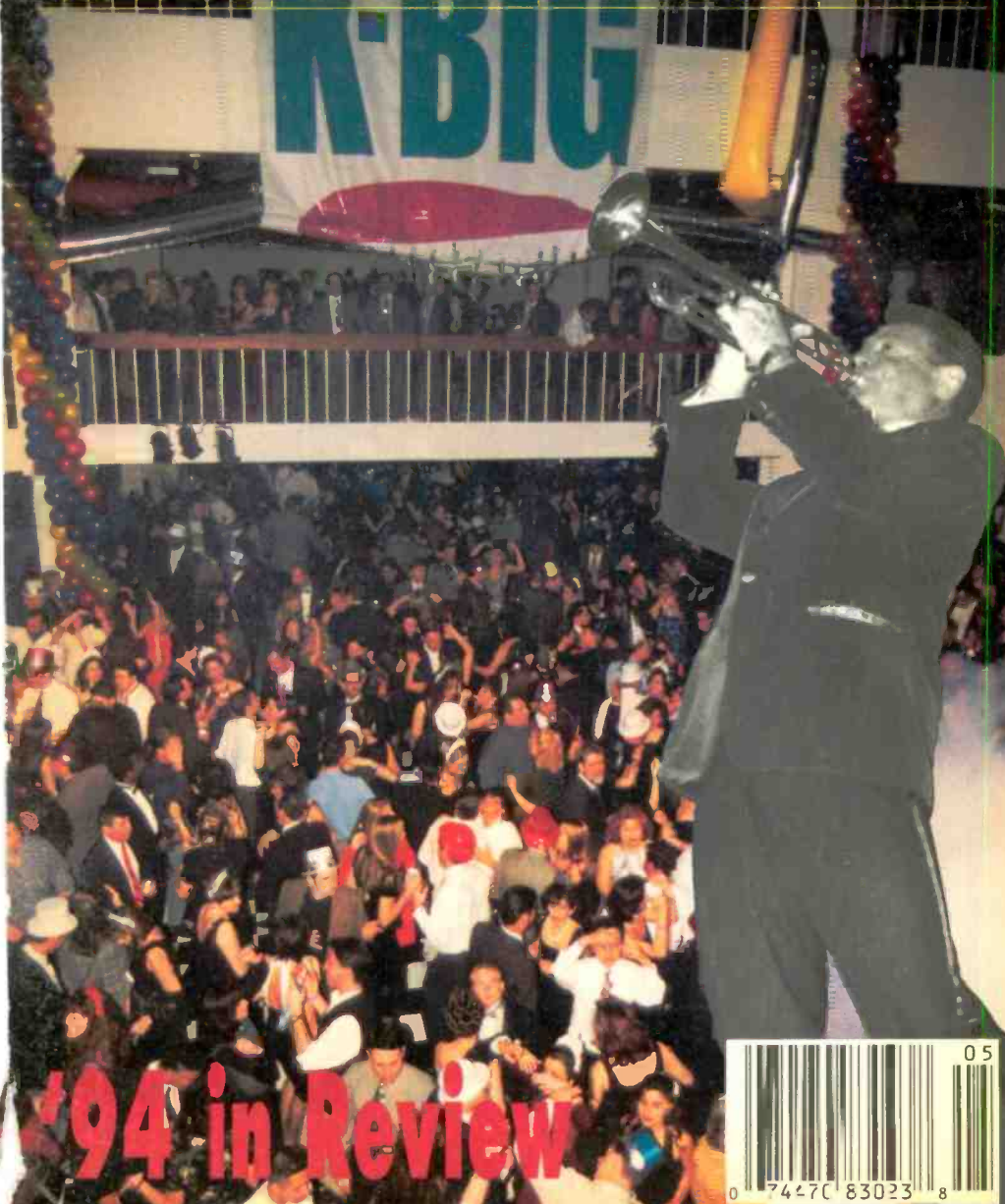

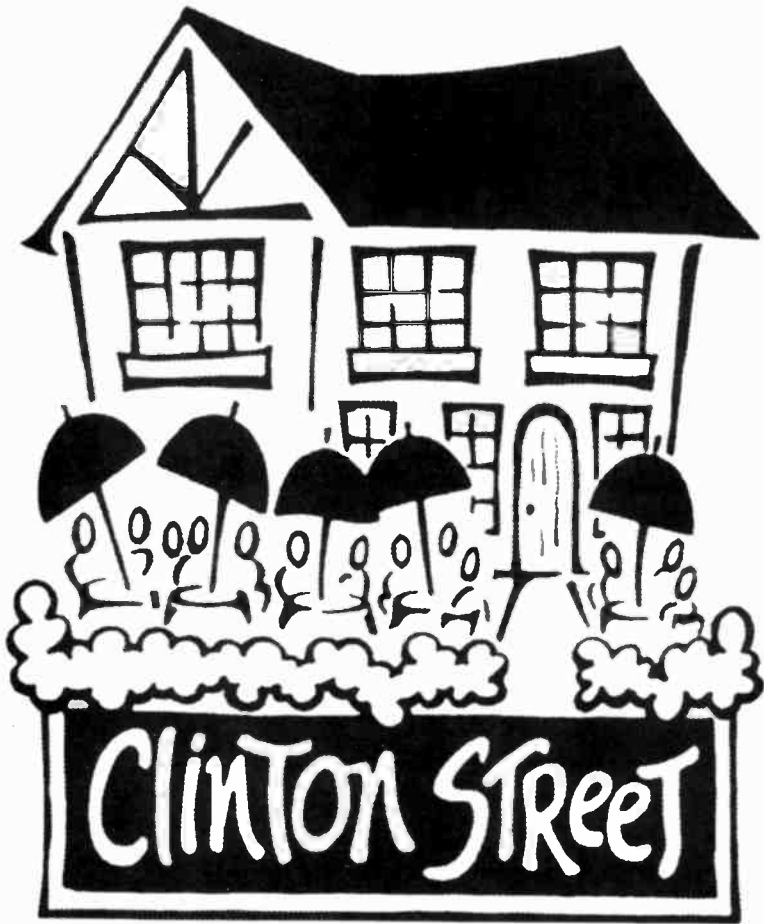

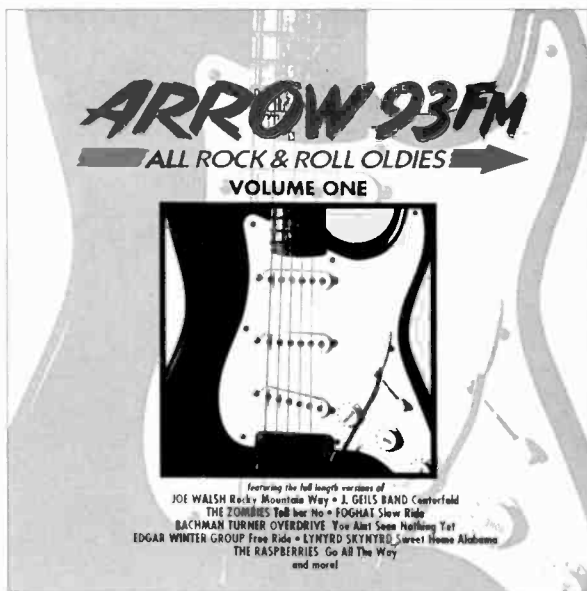

KFI Host Takes to the Tube

More radio stars are crossing over to television than ever, it seems, with KFI (640 AM) being a major case in point. KFI's evening talk host Stephanie Miller joins colleagues Rush Limbaugh and Bill Handel next September when she gets her own shot at becoming the next Johnny Carson. Disney execs noticed the comedy call-in show host when she was still in her first month at KFI doing weekends. The syndicated show is already set to air in more than 60 percent of the nation's television markets according to Miller.

The comedienne majored in theatre at USC and honed her skills performing with the L.A. Connection and at The Improv. Returning to her native Buffalo, N.Y., she stumbled into radio when a friend invited her to contribute comedy routines to his morning radio show. Her material was well-received. She went into radio full-time with her own morning show, mixing music with comedy at WCMF in Rochester, Hot 97 (WQHT) in

New York and WCKG in Chicago before arriving at KFI.

Miller loves the freedom of an all-talk station.

"I can go full out from 7 to 9 without hearing my boss say, 'Shut up and play the music,'" she said. "Besides, being in L.A. radio is like getting paid to audition for every producer in town."

Shake, Rattle and Roll

KLOS (95.5 FM) has felt the burn of numbers crashing through the stratosphere after many years of stellar ratings. Longtime Bob Coburn, Joe Benson and Geno Michellini got their pink slips and the revised format brings uptempo presentation with more emphasis on new music. KLOS program director Carey Curelop explained all the changes at his station.

"In August 1994 we started to revamp our musical direction," he said. "We wanted to make it a more contemporary-sounding radio station rather than a classic rock station that plays new music occasionally. Once we made the music changes — in order to complete the transformation — we needed to change the talent."

Former fill-in KLOS personality Randy Maranz takes the 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. shift. Ex-KNAC 105.5 personalities Long Paul and Remy Maxwell are in charge of the 2 p.m. to 6 p.m. and 6 p.m. to 10 p.m. time slots, respectively.

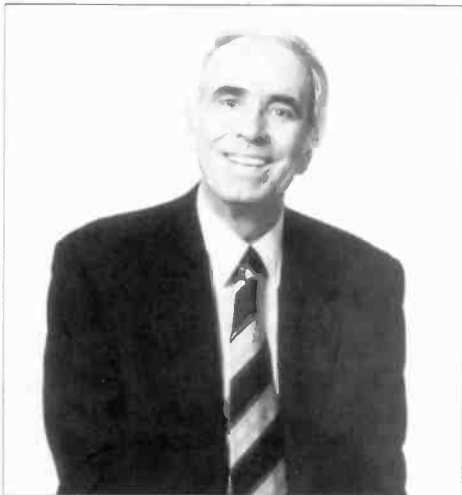
With hard-rocker KNAC's imminent demise, the moves make sense, especially now that Arrow 93 and KLSX have just about locked in all the retro-rock listeners. KLSX snapped up mellow Joe Benson and Bob Coburn.

Briem's Replacement

Ira Fistel has some big shoes to fill over at KABC now that Ray Briem has vacated the slot he held for 27 years. Fistel has a moderately conservative take

on the issues of the day. L.A. night owls were accustomed to Briem as he garnered the best talk show ratings in town during the time slot. Some may recall his early days spinning platters at KGIL and KLAC before becoming a talk show host in 1967.

Snyder Comes to KGRB

CBS created a new late-night programming block by incorporating "The Late Late Show" with Tom Snyder into a three-hour radio program. The new show consists of a live simulcast of Snyder's CBS television show with two extra hours of interviews with Elliott Forrest, a for-

mer classical announcer on WNCN in New York. KGRB AM 900 is carrying the new show locally Monday through Friday at 8 p.m. to 11 p.m. Before coming to CBS, Snyder hosted his own program on CNBC called "Tom Snyder." The 40-year broadcasting vet is also remembered for his nine-year stint as host of "Tomorrow" starting in 1973.

Perky Perot

Ross "will you let me finish" Perot finally gets his chance to have the last word every Sunday from 9 p.m. to 10 p.m. on KABC. The billionaire businessman-turned-politician will field calls from

all over the country on a variety of national issues. Tribune Radio Networks is the syndicator of the show, which is broadcast live from KRDL in Dallas.

KIEV Sports Banter

Irreverent sports talk host Ed Bieler takes the fans' side during "Superfan," his weekday talk show from 5 a.m. to 6 a.m. Superfan was heard on KIEV in the '70s, and he returned to KIEV late last year. Veteran sports host/reporter Fred Wallin is also back at KIEV. He was the overnight personality on the old KMPC Sports Talk Radio. His TV sports background includes Channel 52's "Superfans on Sports" and Roy Firestone's ESPN "Sports Look."

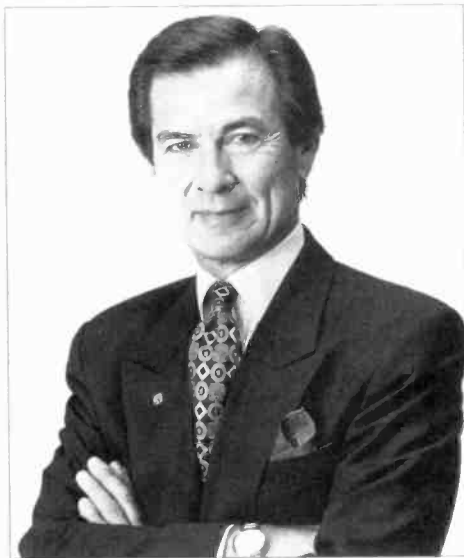

Exposing Stereotyping

Multiculturalism has come to KABC 790 Saturday nights from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. According to host/actor/broadcaster **Mario Machado**, the aim of "The Voice of Multiculturalism" is to challenge listeners to honestly express their fears and beliefs.

"I told my audience that I had never dined at an African-American's home because I didn't know if their standards of hygiene were the same as mine or whether my car would get stolen while parked in their neighborhood," Machado said. "The phones lit up like crazy with African-Americans calling in to invite me into their homes for dinner — so I could see for myself that everything would be fine."

Machado, who is of Portuguese-Chinese descent, was one of L.A.'s first minority TV anchors. He won the Emmy repeatedly for his work in TV and has appeared in the feature films, "Rocky III," "St. Elmo's Fire" and "Robo Cop" I, II and III, among others.

KGFJ Switches Sound

KGFJ (1230 AM) dropped their rhythm and blues oldies format this fall and will now air gospel music. KRLA's (1110 AM) soul-flavored oldies sound probably hastened the demise of the venerable "dusties 1230," one-time home of such radio greats as Hunter Hancock and The Magnificent Montague.

Soul and rhythm and blues oldies are now heard on KACE (103.9 FM), which made the switch from soft urban contemporary. Kevin Fleming, program director, manages the new FM format from the KOST/KFI facilities in downtown L.A.

"The station now features the biggest artists of the '60s and the '70s," Fleming said. "We are finding that although our target demo is narrowly Afro-Americans and Hispanic between the ages of 30 and 54, our audience is much broader than that."

The current lineup starts with Rico (6 a.m.-10 a.m.), then Antoinette Russell (10 a.m.-3 p.m.), followed by Gillian (3-8 p.m.) and winds up with "The Quiet Storm" hosted by E.Z. Wiggins until 1 a.m. Johnny Morris covers overnights and the weekend schedule is rounded out with Karla, Reginald Utley, Kevin Ross, George Moore and Mark Drummond. The new lineup takes nationally syndicated morning man Tom Joyner out L.A. radio.

One Less Country Station

KHTX AM and FM, a country music station in San Bernardino, was sold and is off the air. The stations will resurrect as a Spanish station. Small adult standards station KRCI, known as Radio Catalina, is also off the air.

Upset at KPFK

The public station, KPFK FM 90.7, went through a major shakeup. Pat Scott, the programming chief for the Pacifica Radio outlet, dismissed the top brass: general manager Cliff Roberts, program director Lucia Chappel and assistant general manager Lisa Fowler in

December. The 112,000-watt FM is rumored to go with more network-style shows along with regular programming blocks dictated from Pacifica headquarters in San Francisco. No replacements have been named for the vacant positions.

Excited About E!

Casey Kasem returned to television last month with "Casey's Top Ten" on E! cable network. Unlike "Casey's Countdown," which ran in syndication from 1980 to 1992, this show lasts a full hour and allows most songs to be played

in their entirety. The rankings are pulled from Radio and Records' Adult Contemporary, Hot Adult Contemporary and Top 40 charts.

"I wasn't looking to go back to television, what with the four radio shows I already do for Westwood One," the veteran host said. "But my wife, Jean, negotiated the deal with E! and I am very happy with the way things worked out. E! is on the cutting edge; they are very creative with a great sense of teamwork. They make me feel like family."

Gingrich 'Revolution'

KCRW 89.9 targets the 104th Congress in a new weekly half-hour report on the strategy and agenda of the Gingrich "Revolution." On Fridays at 2

p.m., David Horowitz hosts "The First Hundred Days," a 13-week series lasting through March. Horowitz co-authored "Destructive Generation: Second Thoughts About the Sixties," a book that Gingrich credits as a major influence on his understanding of left-wing political culture.

Viscott Switches Stations

For those who felt a twinge of abandonment after Dr. David Viscott left KABC, the master of intuitive dialogue and five-minute therapy sessions is back on KIEV (870 AM) weekday afternoons from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. The Boston-accented psychiatrist was reportedly unhappy with KABC's decision to move him from afternoons to evenings when broadcasts of Dodgers baseball games frequently preempted his show. (He may be of com-

fort to many fans if the baseball strike is not resolved this year.)

No More Dollar Discussion

KABC has dropped the weekend show "Money Talk" hosted by financial whiz Bob Brinker out of New York. His low-key common-sense style apparently wasn't cutting it with Southland listeners. (Obviously, Robert Citron of Orange County wasn't listening.)

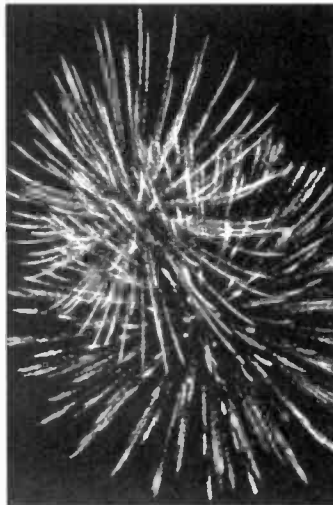

Top 10 L.A. Radio Stories of '94

1. EARS FOR EARTHQUAKE

The January giant shaker not only drove people from their homes, but also tore them away from their TVs, forcing them to depend on their portable or car radios. While news and talk stations provided news, information and therapy for the survivors, their ratings soared. KTWV 94.7 dropped its Wave music to simulcast sister station KFWB's news programming for 18 hours after the earthquake. KCAL Channel 9 even picked up KFWB's coverage for a short time.

KCRW 89.3 instituted "The Earthquake Report," a 20-minute daily update, which lasted a month after the 6.7 tremblor. KNX also devoted its airtime to the disaster, and in April hooked up to Caltech's computer for the fastest information possible.

2. KNX POURS ON THE JUICE

In June, while every news and talk station in town jumped on the juiciest news story of the year, KNX never stopped squeezing the O.J. Simpson saga. With the "gavel-to-gavel" coverage, 1070 listeners didn't miss a single cough in the courtroom. Ratings soared along with Simpson's infamy.

3. KLIT BLOWS AWAY

After a 5-year life span of easy listening tunes, KLITE passed away in July and reincarnated as KSCA FM 101.9, an "adult album alternative" station. For listeners, the new name meant new releases plus lesser known songs by rock, pop, folk and blues artists.

4. TRIPLE TALK EMPIRE

In January, Capacities/ABC added KMPC — the all-sports AM — to its talk empire. In April the new owners threw out the sports, contributing to the Southland's giant talkfest.

5. ROCK GIANT'S SEISMIC SHIFT

KLOS fans were shaken in November when management dropped three voices associated with the classic rock station: those of *Bob Coburn*, *Geno Michellini* and *Joe Benson*. With the reconfiguration of talent came more modern music.

6. TOM LEYKIS HOMECOMING

Fiesty talk host *Tom Leykis*, who KFI fired in '92, returned with a vengeance from Boston. In May, the fledgling KMPC 710 Talk grabbed the popular host, who is syndicated by Westwood One.

7. RAY BRIEM RETIRES

After 27 years, the "King of Overnight of Radio" stepped down from his throne behind the KABC mike. The crusader talk show host rallied his faithful listeners behind his pet causes, such as the Panama Canal, the Pueblo ship seizure and illegal immigration.

8. KKBT DJ DRUG DEATH

In July urban station 92.3 The Beat lost its afternoon DJ, *Captain G*, to drugs. KKBT dedicated its Summer Jam concert to the 33-year-old Greg Beasley.

9. WALK-AND HALL-OF-FAMERS

The National Broadcast Hall of Fame inducted L.A. broadcast greats *Gary Owens* and *Robert W. Morgan* in October. KIQI 1260's Owens also was inducted into the Radio Hall of Fame in November. The *Real Don Steele* entered the Hollywood Walk of Fame in June.

10. KMPC SPORTS HOST DEATH

In July KMPC's legendary broadcaster and sports commentator *Jim Healy* died of liver cancer at the age of 70. The 43-year vet of the airwaves, who wrote, produced, researched and engineered his program, gave his last live broadcast in April.

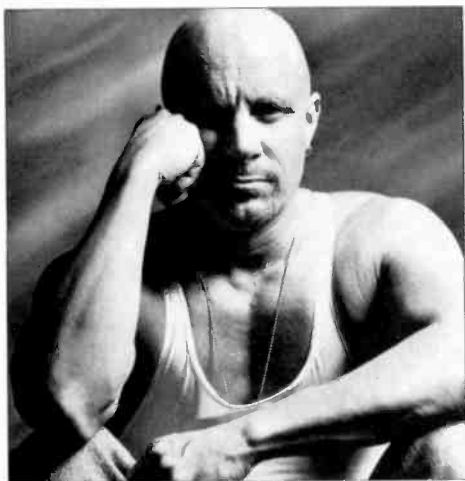

The Nastyman of KIIS

Contributing correspondent Alicia Flannery asked stations' promotions and programming pros to choose their crowning contributions to the community during 1994.

KIIS FM 102.7 & AM 1150

One October morning, DJ Rick Dees announced as a news item, "There's a bald man wearing a wet suit giving away money off the 60 freeway." The next day Dees reported that the same man was still giving away money and suggested that KIIS interview him. Dees learned that the stranger was an unemployed DJ from Guam. It was Nastyman!

Although this event seemed like a promotional event, the idea for Nastyman standing on a freeway did not come from the promotions department.

"In fact, I didn't know Rick Dees was reporting my whereabouts," the Nasty Man said.

How did this whole situation come about?

The DJ from Guam told the story.

"I was on my way to visit my 6-year-old son who lives in Kansas," he said. "As I looked out the window I could see the L.A. city lights. Then the thought hit me: I want to work there; I want to live there. So after my visit with my son, I flew back to Los Angeles."

KLOS FM 95.5

KLOS promotion man Carey Curelop chose the The Mark and Brian Christmas Show at the Hollywood Paladium as his station's star community event. The early-morning concert featured such performers as Melissa Etheridge, Eddie Money, Collective Soul and the Marc Bonilla Band.

Broadcasting live, special guest Dick Van Dyke read "The Night Before Christmas."

KLSX FM 97.1

All KLSX's events in '94 were free, promotion man Scott Segelbaum proudly announced. The third annual Classic Rock Art Show in May boasted 252 celebrity donors' pieces, including those of Jerry Garcia, Yoko Ono, Joni Mitchell and REM. A silent auction raised \$150,000 for the American Foundation for Aids Research.

In October, the station sponsored the KLSX Classic Rock Jam at Woodly Park in Van Nuys with Fleetwood Mac and Roger Quinn. Segelbaum said the free concert attracted a crowd of 40,000.

The last event of the year, the Classic Rock Expo in December, was a giant trading ground for records, tapes, videos and rock memorabilia. Such rock stars as Warren Zevon, John Paul Jones of Led Zeppelin and Greg Lake of Emerson, Lake and Palmer gave autographs.

KLSX invited Heidi Fleiss, who gave an exclusive interview to on-air personality Cynthia Fox. Segelbaum added that the interview received national and international coverage.

KPWR 105.9

Michelle Mercer, program director for Power, billed the "Knowledge of Power Fund" as the station's "most significant project." The station produced a charity

CD with such artists as Tupac Shakur and Ice Cube to raise funds for a performing arts center in L.A. Plans include a technical studio for TV and radio, a 16-track recording studio, a 100-seat theater, and classrooms. The station worked with the L.A. County Parks and Recreation Department to break ground in the summer.

KRLA AM 1110

Although KRLA is not a talk station, listeners call in all day.

Mike Wagner, program director, described his station's contribution of community interaction.

"Through our request and dedication format, our audience calls to chat, send messages and request songs. We also have what we call 'KRLA Cares,' which gives representatives from local public service organizations to actually record their own announcements."

KBIG 104 FM

In conjunction with AMC Theatres, KBIG organized a canned-food drive for the homeless and hungry over Thanksgiving. AMC threw in a free bag of popcorn for every can.

In December KBIG played Santa for Children's Hospital. The station solicited both residences and businesses for toy donations. For a 20-toy minimum, KBIG picked up the toys.

KROQ FM 106.7

If you woke up April 1 thinking KROQ was going to be the same old, same old, you were dreaming. Was Pirate Radio back, via KROQ? Yes! But just for a day.

"We actually try to do the unexpected 365 days a year," said Gene Sandbloom, who doubles as program and music director. "April 1 gives us an excuse to cross the line even further. Two years ago, on April Fool's Day, we became 'The Groovy Hits of the Super '70s.' When we were inundated with complaint calls, we decided to keep this type of programming

on all day.

"This past year we tried to top that show, and the only thing we could come up with was Pirate Radio. It took a week to prepare. Scott Shannon was among the original DJs we contacted to cut new tracks for us. At 6 a.m. we started broadcasting and once again we were flooded with complaint calls. We had fax

machine messages the length of our hall. When we told listeners who were calling to look at their calendar. They were silent for a minute; then they said, 'Oh.' "

Although the second annual Weenie Roast and Singalong may have an unexciting ring to it, the event is a major concert at Irvine Meadows with such groups as the Violent Femmes, Counting Crows and Beck. Proceeds went to Heal the Bay and Aids Project L.A.

KZLA FM 93.9

For KZLA folks, January '94 meant two things: earthquake and a new name.

After the quake on the 17th, the staff of Z 93.9 — formerly just KZLA — rallied behind their new moniker.

"It was a tragedy for the market, but it gave us an opportunity to help our community," operations manager R.J. Curtis said. "We announced that between Los Angeles and Orange County we wanted to collect 1 million pennies. Through official drop sites and the Z93.9 van appearances, we collected 3.5 million pennies. A final promotion, with the help of five night-

clubs, raised an additional \$15,000. In a period of two and a half weeks, we had a total of \$450,000 for earthquake relief."

To add to its scorecard, the station participated in the nationwide St. Jude's Children's Hospital Radioathon. The morning show set a record of \$130,000. Within a day and a half, \$420,000 was raised for research on cures for children's catastrophic diseases.

KFI 640 AM

When KFI first unfurled its motto, "We cut through the crap," the station's marketing folks were quite proud. But some Angelenos were not impressed.

Bill Lewis, marketing and promotion manager, explained the reaction to the signs.

"In the fall we launched an outdoor advertising campaign, which some people thought to be inappropriate and blasphemous," he said.

"We were asked by the Los Angeles Transit Companies to either change it or remove it altogether."

KFI marketing minds revised their line to "We cut through the carp."

In May the station's afternoon talk team of John and Ken personally involved themselves in the Menendez brothers' case. After a mistrial was declared, the D.A.'s office announced there were insufficient public funds to prosecute properly. With the help of their listeners, John and Ken organized a yard

sale, which yielded more than \$4,000 to the General Prosecution Fund of the D.A.'s office.

Seizing upon the 40th anniversary of the death of his grandparents at Auschwitz, Bill Handel of "Handel in the Morning" fame decided to invite two neo-Nazis to Germany.

"I wanted to take these two guys — John Metzger and Dennis MacClean to the death camp and ask them if they could look me in the eye and say [on the air], "This isn't true.'"

Not realizing that it is illegal to espouse Nazi ideas in Germany, Handel was shocked when police seized his guests at the Frankfurt airport and deported them. Without permission from the authorities to broadcast from Auschwitz, Handel ended up doing the show from a phone booth in Poland.

KLVE 107.5 FM

While other stations are packing their programs with commercials, KLVE 107.5 FM is busy unpacking them.

Programming VP Bill Taner regards this cutback as his station's greatest gift to KLVE listeners.

"We have cut back up to five commercials per hour," Taner said. We feel this dramatic change will accent what we do best: play the romantic music in the proper setting."

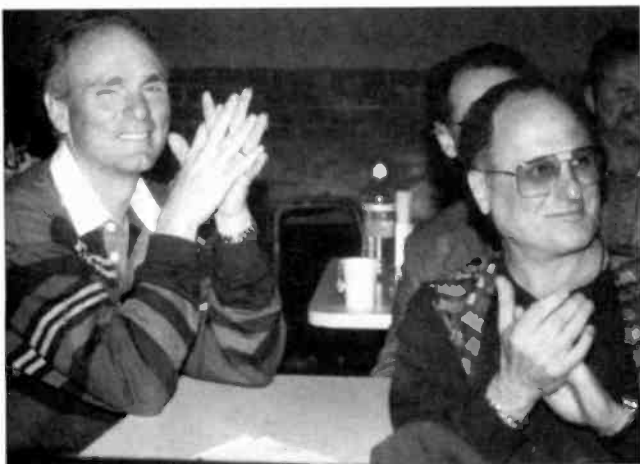
