As "Dr. Tweedy," Frank Morgan no longer tells those tall ones. But he has lots of fun with the role—on and off mike.

SIMULTANEOUSLY Frank Morgan observed his eighth anniversary in radio and created his new radio personality as *The Fabulous Dr. Tweedy* in the Summer replacement show for Jack Benny on NBC. The show caught on so well that his Summer sponsor signed Morgan for his own Fall spot and, without a hitch, the series continued in the 7 p.m. Wednesday spot on NBC.

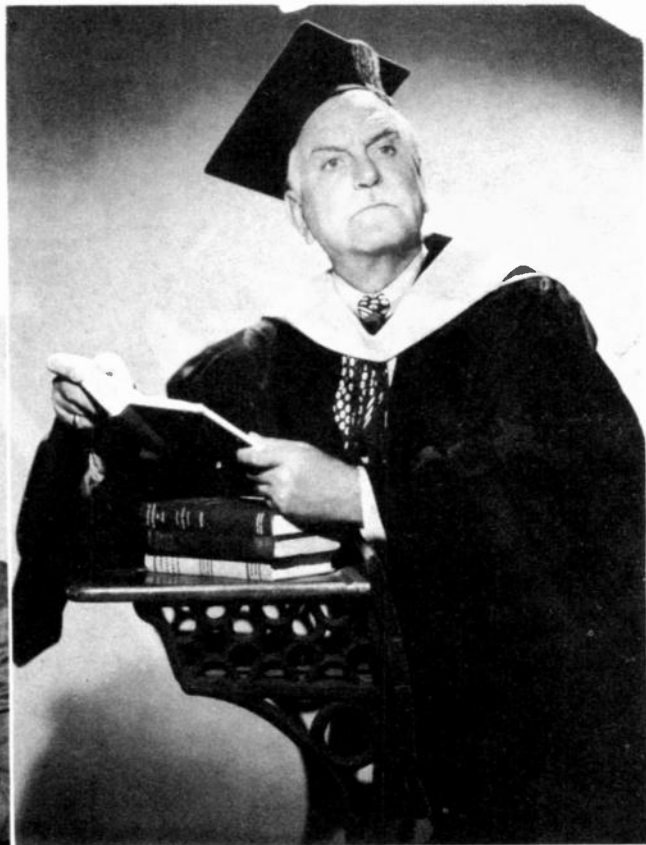
The character of Dr. Tweedy—Thaddeus Q. Tweedy—is much more to Morgan's liking than the prevaricating personality he had built up on the Fanny Brice show and various other variety shows over a period of years. Dr. Tweedy is a sympathetic, lovable, if irrepressible fellow and there is a complete, well-rounded story on each broadcast with various changing characters contributing to the interest.

The Fabulous Dr. Tweedy is written by well-known writer Robert Riley

Crutcher who earned his first radio fame as scripter of the Eddie Bracken show.

Nana Bryant who plays Miss Tilcy on the program played with Morgan twenty-two years ago on Broadway in "The Firebrand" and it was a bit of a coincidence when she was cast for the part. They hadn't met during all the intervening years.

As Dr. Tweedy, Morgan plays a professor of philosophy in a girl's college. Imagine his amazement when there turned out to be a real Dr. Tweedy, a professor of philosophy, at Loyola University in Chicago. The "real" Professor Tweedy, of course, had to take a lot of good-natured ribbing from his students, but he has developed a warm friendship with Morgan, the make-believe educator. Now Morgan corresponds with the Chicago professor, talks to him on long distance and when confronted with a characterization prob-

lem or when in need of local college color, seeks the professor's technical advice.

Recently, Morgan got some good local academic color from U.C.L.A. where, as judge, he picked the most beautiful coed for the Homecoming Queen and participated in all the college's Homecoming Week activities.

"It was just like going back to college," Morgan chortled, "only this time all I had to worry about was 'looks,' not books."

Morgan himself attended Cornell University at one time, but did not graduate, the spirit of adventure beckoning him into a life that has been as varied and colorful as his fictional ones on stage, screen and radio. The "fabulous" Morgan has known the salty brine as a ship's stoker, the woolly west as a cowboy, the vicissitudes of salesmanhip a door-to-door toothbrush peddler and he has sold advertising and real estate. Once he even had a fling at being a pool shark (not swimming pool). He has hummed his way on freight trains and has known what it means to be broke and hungry in an unfamiliar city.

All of this knockabout career was by choice and not necessity. His family owned the famous Angostura bitters business and the original plan was for Frank and his brother, Ralph (the well-known actor) to enter the firm. Both had other plans of their own.

WHY SO MANY mystery-crime shows? This question seems to be a very timely one, especially since there are more of these programs popping up all the time. Let's hash the situation over, once and for all. Are mysteries a bad influence on our children? Or are they just adventurous entertainment. First let's do a bit of sorting.

Among programs that really stress crime-does-not-pay (at least they usually say it at the end of each broadcast) there's *Gangbusters*, *Mr. District Attorney* and *This Is Your F.B.I.* They go in for cold realism, with sordid characters unlike any most of us will meet. What with all the shooting sound effects and rough language, they're the kind of program your Junior simulates when he plays cops and robbers.

Psychological dramas like *Suspense*, *The Whistler* and *Inner Sanctum*—with their personal touch of explaining why they did what they did, plus a surprise ending—seem the most popular. They're

wonderful for Junior if he plans to be a psychiatrist!

The Thin Man and *Mr. and Mrs. North* are frothy comedy-mysteries, yet hardly children's fare.

Suave gentlemen-detectives who have crept out of story books into radio include *Philo Vance*, *Bulldog Drummond*, *Count of Monte Cristo*, *Perry Mason*, *Sherlock Holmes*, and the *Case Book of Gregory Hood*. These gentlemen go more for analytical deductions than bloody details.

Then there are the westerns, cartoon serials and other bold adventure stories built especially for the youngsters—with their definite pattern of "good guy" vs. "bad guy" and virtue always triumphant. Such as *Lone Ranger*, *Dick Tracy*, *Terry and the Pirates*, *Jack Armstrong* and *Superman*. I think parents enjoy these stories more than their children! (By the way, *Kid Stuff* on Page 8 gives a listing of various children's programs.)

And the newest addition is the tough-guy detective who usually has as many tricks up his sleeve as the villain, but somehow always happens to stay on the right side: *Sam Spade*, *Boston Blackie*, *Fat Man*, *Michael Shayne*, *Cime Photographer* and the latest, *Pat Novak for Hire*. Being women, we get a little thrill out of their Clark Gable-roughness but what the children get out of it besides a lesson in realism, I don't know. Of course, most of these stories come after the younger ones are supposedly tucked in bed.

Here are two separate opinions that seem to typify what the two schools of thought are saying about mystery dramas:

Dear Virginia Dickey:

I am an old lady of seventy-two who leads a rather humdrum life and depends a great deal on the radio for entertainment. I am sure I have no criminal

tendencies but programs such as *Gangbusters*, *Mr. District Attorney* and *This Is Your F.B.I.* bring me the excitement my life lacks. They are well acted and hold one's interest to the end. I know this is a strange taste for an old lady, but I'll bet there are a lot of others.

JIMMIE FIDLER, star teller of true tales about Hollywood stars, hasn't a good radio voice. It's thin and rusty.

Jimie Fidler isn't a good script reader. He frequently trips over his words, gets tangled up in his lines.

But is Jimmie Fidler listened to? A mere ten million sets tune him via ABC each Sunday night—that's all!

And to the relatively infinitesimal percentage of those listeners who grouse about Fidler's voice and Fidler's delivery he replies: "I do not

pretend to be a trained 'reader' and I do not fret about muffed lines. I'm a newspaperman who knows his job. If that isn't satisfactory, I'm sorry."

It seems to be satisfactory. He's been broadcasting for fourteen years, reporting the Hollywood scene for twenty-five (since he was twenty-two). Besides his radio stint he turns out a syndicated column for a fancy figure. Asked how much his combined earnings total, he tst-tst-ed: "Tst, tst, what a question!"

Whatever his remuneration, Fidler undoubtedly has moments when he knows he's underpaid. He swears this business of gathering the dope on the smart set of the screen is twice as hard as anything he ever went through in the Marine Corps (World War I).

"Fifty per cent of all my material I obtain myself by covering the studios and niteries," he says. "And for the balance I have to maintain and manage a staff of fifteen, plus as many more spies located in strategic spots, which include producers' offices, cafes, casting offices and dress shops."

"We check all rumors and stories. If rumors are broadcast, they are so branded. And if I broadcast stories that are denied by stars, I do so only if I am thoroughly convinced the denials are cover-ups."

Asked to differentiate between his type of writing and that of Louella Parsons and Hedda Hopper, Fidler described his writing as more editorial than theirs. "I diagnose. I try to remedy obvious faults of the movie industry by suggesting remedies. While I do report, I spend more time commenting and editorializing."

One of his outstandingly successful

campaigns resulted in eliminating pictures based on the lives of public enemies. His editorials attacked the film "Dillinger" in particular; gangster films in general.

Fidler doesn't only report the Hollywood scene—he observes. Out of his long-time, close-range scrutiny comes this penetrating diagnosis of Hollywood-itis:

"Probably no person has ever become a star in Hollywood without becoming slightly swell-headed. I think every actor or actress I have ever known went through at least a brief period of readjustment. The good fellows soon return to normal (and most stars are good fellows) but the jackasses just go on being jackasses until they finally bray themselves out of pictures."

Have you ever heard a neater summary?

Fidler isn't at all reluctant about naming his favorite stars. As for the greatest actress he says "No other actress can compare with Bergman." He is outspoken also in his praise of Paul Muni as the most capable actor. In his opinion Bob Hope and Joan Davis are most deft among the comedy folk. One of his favorites among the young people is wistful June Allyson, but he has many other young favorites "who haven't gotten breaks."

"Luck," says Fidler, "has a lot to do with careers. Many fine actresses who have failed just were not as lucky as less talented actresses who were lucky—lucky enough, that is, to be cast in good pictures."

He also points out that many young players who seem to have talent fail under fire, just as many ballplayers

get to the big league and fail. "But big starters who fail sometimes do come back—like Betty Grable and Linda Darnell."

(Speaking of failure, Fidler, with characteristic frankness, declares he became a radio reporter "because I failed at acting.")

Jimmie Fidler—ex-magazine editor, ex-press agent, ex-actor—is a native of St. Louis, but Tennessee will always be "home" to him. He moved with his family to Memphis when he was ten. In his sophomore year in high school family reverses caused him to drop his education and take a job, and to this good day—no matter how successful he unquestionably is—he bemoans the fact he never graduated.

Fidler is five feet ten, tips the scales around one hundred fifty. As you can tell by his voice, his nerves are taut—so incessantly so, in fact, that he usually spends his vacations "regaining my health."

The most Hollywoodish fact about Fidler is his three failures in matrimony. His Ideal Woman, he says, is "not interested in a career—and not to be found in Hollywood."

We were especially interested in Fidler's personal choice of motion pictures and his favorite book. He names "Seventh Heaven," as made by Janet

thority several times before at Hollywood parties, but she didn't really get to know him until he invited her to his housewarming party. Hyatt had just completed a new hilltop bachelor house in Beverly Hills (the Prince had a castle on a hill!), and Cinderella came away from the ball with a proposal of marriage.

They were married within a month on July 28, 1945. Hyatt designed Ginny's wedding ring—the Von Dehn coat of arms—and they went to their castle on the hill to live happily ever after.

But with the arrival of their heir apparent, the one-time bachelor's castle was outmoded. So Ginny and Hyatt now are in the happy throes of building another mountaintop heaven, also in Beverly Hills.

Ginny's coach-and-four has its modern-day counterpart in the swank midnight-blue, chauffeur-driven Cadillac, Hyatt's Christmas gift last year, which arrived the other day.

Hyatt, who designed their latest castle, calls it the "House of Tomorrow." It's the very last word in post-war castles, boasting an eight-acre plot; a huge picture window that overlooks the Pacific and another window that watches over the San Fernando Valley; a special room to house all of Ginny's recordings, including master records of all her radio broadcasts and movie appearances; and a nursery that's wired for sound so that you can hear David Martin's coos and cries in every room in the house.

(Ginny Simm's program is heard over CBS Fridays at 6 p. m.)

EVERY GIRL DREAMS of growing up and marrying her Prince Charming, having a beautiful castle on a hill and gossamer gowns.

Most girls leave their ideas in the dream world, believing they can't come true.

Not so Ginny Simms. Her story proves that Cinderella lives and breathes today. Her dreams have all come true. She has her Prince Charming, her castle on the hill, gossamer gowns (albeit a bit slinky). And with the arrival in July of her son, David Martin, Ginny has the fulfillment of the greatest dream of all—motherhood.

Her story is the story of an average American girl. She was born Virginia Simms on May 25th in San Antonio, Texas, and moved to California with her parents while still in her early childhood.

She made her debut as an entertainer while attending Fresno State Teachers College, where she was pursuing her ambition to become a school teacher.

An accomplished pianist, Ginny sang her way into her first job when she made an audition for the local Fresno station.

And just like things happen in the story-books, she was heard by Kay Kyser, who signed her to sing with his band.

Five years of trouping with Kyser—during which Ginny became recognized as a top-rung vocalist—followed. On the highways and byways, in the hinterlands and in the big cities, Ginny acquired poise, style sense, and a deep appreciation of people. She was getting ready for her Prince Charming.

When Ginny arrived in Hollywood with Kay to make movies in 1941, her grooming for the Prince's helpmate began in earnest. The little Texas Cinderella, touched by Hollywood's magic wand, was transformed into a glamour girl.

With the acquisition of a coast-to-coast radio show of her own, Ginny became a favorite of GI's and much sought-after by Hollywood swains.

On and Off the Mike

A GAIN THIS SEASON ABC is able to boast exclusive transmission of the Metropolitan Opera's Saturday matinees. Opener is November 16.

Opera seems to be doing all right on the air—well enough, anyway, for sponsors to latch on—despite the protestations of Gatti-Casazza back in 1930. When some hearty radio man presented the idea to the great and formidable impresario, Gatti checked his unbelieving ears: "Opera on the air?" Then spat his ultimatum: "Phooey!"

TITLE-ROLER of ABC-KECA's *The Affairs of Ann Scotland*, new Wednesday night clue-chaser, is Arlene Francis, erstwhile quizqueen on the late *Blind Date*.

YOU COULD say music was pounded—literally—into the head of London-born Lyn Murray, whose chorus enhances CBS' Hollywood-bound *Hit Parade*. His violinist father used to help him recognize a rhythm by tapping it out on young Lyn's head with his bow. The method also accomplished this: It knocked out of his head childhood ambitions to become a sailor, a newspaperman and an actor.

ANOTHER WHODUNIT with San Francisco as its locale, another private eye who gets his clues by reading the script writer's mind, another detective who out-detects the police detectives and who has a constant, charming and romantically-inclined "companion" — that's *Richard Davis, Private Investigator*. He even has *Michael Shayne's* old 8 p.m. Monday spot on KHJ.

WE'RE TOLD Meredith Willson's writing the script for his 8:30 p.m. CBS show. Now that we've listened we wish somebody would also tell us why.

THERE ARE ALL kinds of ways to get into radio. Lulu McConnell of CBS' *It Pays To Be Ignorant* did it by disobeying doctor's orders to take time out from the vaudeville act she was doing with her husband and rest her voice. She didn't and her larynx was graveled permanently. Now she says "it's the best thing that ever happened to me."

THE ARRIVAL in the mail of a packet of sunflower seeds recalled one of those fabulous stories Gary Moore told us. Seems he came to Hollywood to take a screen test offered him by David O. Selznick, who kept him under contract for two years but never got around to putting him in a picture.

Sure, Gary was offered parts—mostly of the type requiring a phoney name and a beard. One was a fat character role in "Duel in the Sun." When Gary talks about it he gets slightly hysterical—and for good reason: "Do you know who got that part? Walter Huston! Can you imagine ME doing HIS kind of part?"

The seeds? We'd like to spare you, but Selznick's publicity department did it to us. The packet is labeled "Duel in the Sun" flowers.

WILLIE PIPER is the name of radio's newest shy-wistful-timid-lovelorn young man—and of KECA's 8:30 p.m. Sunday airer. Dick Nelson has the title role and his girl friend is Jean Gillespie, who used to be the girl of another shy-wistful-etc. young man name of Alan Young. If the premiere was a true sample, Young and Eddie Bracken might just as well start moving over to make room for Willie. How much kilocycle space is there, by the way, for shy-wistful-etc.?

ONE OF *Fan Fare's* readers wrote in the other day to contest the statement by another letter writer that "radio is free." According to a Public Affairs Committee booklet just issued it's far from free. The Committee has added this and that, as statisticians do, to make these totals:

"The public spends \$632,000,000 a year on radio." (And that's just for sets, electricity and repairs, not commodity prices jacked to cover sponsor costs.) "Advertisers spend \$397,000,000 a year on broadcasting." Ergo, "For every dollar the public spends they get 50c worth of services."

IN ERNEST CHAPPELL's case, working for his wife's relatives has definite advantages. Ernest is the announcer on Frank Morgan's Hollywood program. His wife, Claudia Morgan, is Nora of *The Thin Man*, which originates in New York. Con-

sequently, Ernest and Claudia were kept a continent apart—until Claudia prevailed on Uncle Frank to arrange for Chappell's commercials to be cut in from a Gotham studio.

WE HEAR: Rustlers and ropers are being rounded up for an etherization of "Hop-along Cassidy." . . . A big-time tire maker wants to sponsor Jeanette MacDonald and her husband, Gene Raymond, in a variety show. . . . Angelyn Orr Neblett is stepping into the story telling shoes of her late husband, Johnnie, on *So the Story Goes*.

LARRY SMITH, NBC news commentator, has been signed to play the part of a country newspaper editor in the forthcoming United Artists' picture, "Heaven Only Knows." Radio is certainly lending a lot of its favorite sons to the motion picture world.

WITH only two months remaining in KMPC's "Free Speech Mike" campaign, "Free Speech Mike" is now heard making his daily telephone calls seven days per week, rather than five days. "Mike" has already awarded over \$6000 from his \$10,000 treasury as a result of his calls to Los Angeles' residents. In addition to these telephone calls, "Mike" is also conducting a written contest in which contestants are asked to write in fifty words or less, "I believe in Free Speech because . . ." The dead line for this contest is December 13—so you better hurry! The Grand Prize is a new Chevrolet, plus \$500 in cash for the second prize winner.

HERE'S A BOOK for your "must" reading list. Mutual's blind writer, Hector Chevigny, who pens *Coke Club with Morton Downey*, has written his autobiography revealing his courageous readjustment to life and the writing profession following complete loss of his eyesight. Chevigny has titled his latest book "My Eyes Have a Cold Wet Nose"—referring, of course, to his faithful Doberman "seeing-eye" dog, Wizard. Incidentally, Chevigny was the original author and instigator of Mutual's *Red Ryder* series.

NORWIN CORWIN, CBS' gifted writer-producer-director, returned recently from a 63,000-mile world-circling journey. Corwin made the trip as the winner of the first Wendell Willkie One World Award. He spent a week here in Hollywood before returning to New York to prepare a series of broadcasts incorporating the information he collected during his travels. Tentatively titled, "One World Revisited," the series is scheduled for December on CBS. Watch for it, it should be good listening!

Cranberries for Flavor

FRESH CRANBERRIES are here again and the cranberry season with it. Not that the vivid berry isn't seasonable all year 'round, but there's a special urge at this time of year for the piquancy and zest of cranberries in our menus. For cranberry dishes today we have three forms of the fruit—fresh cranberries, the canned berry sauce and the jellied sauce and dehydrated cranberries.

Cranberry sauce is part of the American tradition. But cranberries are an inspiration to food flavor in various other ways, as the recipes that follow were planned to prove, if proof were needed!

Suggestions (many of which need no definitely proportioned recipes) are so

numerous that they're certain to overflow into coming holiday articles. For example there's Chicken Salad on Cranberry Sauce Slices and here's a sandwich filling that everyone likes: just blend cream cheese and cranberry jelly sauce with a touch of salt (and a bit of mayonnaise if you like, for spreading). Spread on thinly sliced bread. Top with a lightly buttered or margarined slice of bread and cut into two or four triangles for serving. It's "special" with coffee.

Then there's the simple and effective combination of mashed cranberry sauce (the canned variety or your own make of similar consistency) with a prepared packaged vanilla pudding. Prepare the

pudding according to directions on the package. Place mashed cranberry sauce in the bottom of sherbet glasses and pour the pudding mixture on top. Chill and serve with light cream. One package of vanilla pudding is just right for six servings of this combination.

Cranberries have excellent nutritive values too, as you no doubt remember. Their "best foot forward" is probably their generous vitamin C, which is well retained in the cooked whole cranberry sauce. The fruit contains small amounts of vitamin B₁, riboflavin, pantothenic acid and niacin, all vitamins of the B complex group. Vitamin A is also "among those present."

PLAIN OR IODIZED

Cape Cod cranberries are known to hold a considerable amount of iodine. Grown near the sea, the cranberry plant absorbs large quantities of iodine from the soil, which is constantly subjected to ocean spray and salt air.

The pectin content of cranberries is another "good for us" quality. Pectin is valued particularly for its soothing bulk and detoxifying qualities in the digestive tract. Iron is not outstanding in the dark red berry but there's copper there which insures the efficient use of what iron there is. Calcium and phosphorus are also found in moderate amounts.

Cranberries are a natural complement for meats and fowl, which is merely another way of saying how good they are together. But here are the recipes which give you "Cranberries for Flavor," first a reminder-recipe for making your own cranberry sauce.

TEN-MINUTE CRANBERRY SAUCE

1 cup corn syrup* (dark or white)
1 cup sugar

1 3/4 cups water
4 cups fresh cranberries

BOIL CORN SYRUP, sugar and water together 5 minutes. Add cranberries and boil, without stirring, until all the skins pop open—about 5 minutes. Remove

from heat and allow the sauce to remain in saucepan until cool. Makes 1 quart sauce.

*Or use 1 cup maple syrup or 1/2 cup honey.

CRANBERRY NUT BREAD

| | |
|----------------------------------|-----------------------------|
| 2 1/2 cups sifted enriched flour | 1 egg, beaten |
| 3 tsp. baking powder | 2 tbsps. melted shortening |
| 1 tsp. salt | 1 cup cranberries, ground |
| 1/2 tsp. soda | 1/2 cup chopped nuts |
| 1 tsp. cinnamon | 1 tbsps. grated orange rind |
| 3/4 cup sugar** | 1/4 cup orange juice |
| 1/2 cup milk | |

SIFT TOGETHER flour, baking powder, salt, soda, cinnamon and sugar. Combine milk, egg and shortening. Add cranberries, nuts, orange rind and orange juice. Add to flour mixture, stirring only until flour is moistened. Pour into greased loaf pan. Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees F.) 1 hour. Yield 1 loaf.

**1/2 cup sugar and 1/2 cup honey may be used instead of 3/4 cup sugar. Reduce milk to 1/4 cup.

CRANBERRY POT ROAST

| | |
|---|----------------------|
| 1 1-pound can jellied cranberry sauce or equivalent | 1/2 tsp. salt |
| 4 pound pot roast | 1/4 tsp. pepper |
| 1/4 cup flour | 1 tbsps. fat, melted |
| | 1 cup water |
| | 4 whole cloves |
| | 1 in. stick cinnamon |

WIPE MEAT with a damp cloth. Mix flour, salt and pepper. Dredge meat. Sear meat until a rich brown color, in the melted fat. Place in a Dutch oven or in deep-well cooker of stove. Add cranberry sauce, water and spices. Cover and cook over low heat 3 hours or until tender, turning meat after 1 1/2 hours. Remove roast to platter. Thicken remaining gravy and season as desired. Serve with the meat.

CRANBERRY COBBLER

| | |
|-------------------------------------|--|
| 1/2 cup corn syrup* (dark or white) | 1/4 cup corn syrup** additional, dark or white |
| 1/2 cup sugar | 1/4 cup sugar (additional) |
| 3/4 cup water | 1 egg, well beaten |
| 2 cups fresh cranberries | 1 cup flour |
| Grated rind 1 orange | 1 1/2 tsp. baking powder |
| 2 tbsps. butter | 1/4 tsp. salt |
| 2 tbsps. shortening | 1/4 cup milk |

BOIL CORN SYRUP, sugar and water together 5 minutes. Add cranberries, orange rind and butter and bring to boiling point once. In the meantime cream shortening with additional corn syrup and sugar and add beaten egg. Sift dry ingredients together; add, alternately with milk, to shortening mixture. Put boiling cranberry sauce into deep casserole or pudding dish and pour cake batter over it. Bake in moderately hot oven (350 degrees F.) about 20 minutes. Serve warm with whipped cream. Makes 6 servings.

SOFTEN GELATIN in cold water 5 minutes; then dissolve over hot water. Whip cream until very stiff; add honey, salt, lemon juice and dissolved gelatin. Fold in the fruit. Turn into freezing tray of automatic refrigerator and freeze until firm. Cut in slices to serve; place on lettuce and top with mayonnaise. Serves 6 to 8.

CRANBERRY SUPPER OMELET

| 4 eggs | 1 pound jellied cranberry sauce, canned or similar texture |

SEPARATE yolks from whites of eggs. To yolks add salt, pepper and water; beat until thick and lemon colored. Beat whites until stiff, cutting and folding them into the first mixture until well blended. Heat omelet pan; butter sides and bottom. Turn in mixture, spread evenly, place over low heat to cook slowly, occasionally turning the pan to brown omelet evenly. When well "puffed" and delicately browned underneath, place in moderate oven (350 degrees F.) about 10 minutes to finish cooking on top. The omelet is cooked if firm to the touch when pressed lightly. Cover one-half with crushed cranberry sauce (or with slices). Fold and turn out carefully to serve. Serves 4.

CRANBERRY CREAM DOUGHNUTS

SPLIT SUGARED doughnuts in halves crosswise. Cut canned jellied cranberry sauce in slices 1/4 inch thick. Mash cream cheese; add a little heavy cream and whip until fluffy. Spread each doughnut-half liberally with cream cheese. Put two halves together sandwich fashion with a slice of cranberry sauce in the middle. Serve with coffee.
