RITA HAYWORTH'S first USO Army camp tour took her deep into the heart of Texas. On the first leg of the journey, soldiers started calling her "the queen," and the name stuck, because Rita earned it. Besides doing her regular stint at shows, she spent all her spare time with the men. She went to service clubs, rode in jeeps and tanks, visited mess halls, signed twenty thousand autographs. In fifteen minutes she posed for more pictures than she does in a month in Hollywood. At one hospital, Rita found a lad asleep. Because he had missed her personal appearance, she had the photographer take a picture of her kissing the sleeper. He was the happiest kid in the Lone Star State when he was told what had happened, and got the autographed picture to prove it. On tour Rita lost ten pounds, but kept her title!

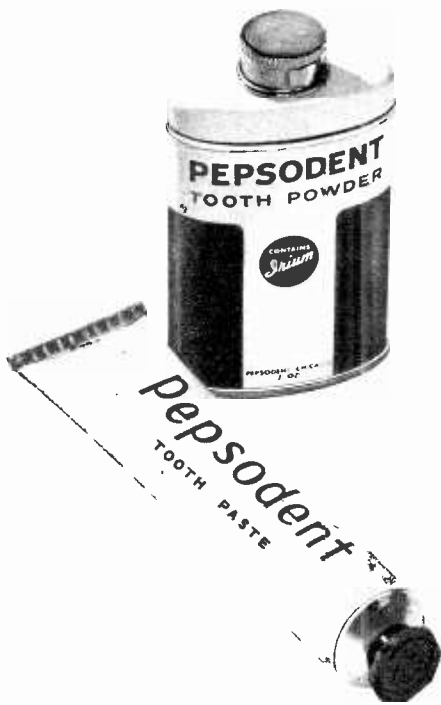

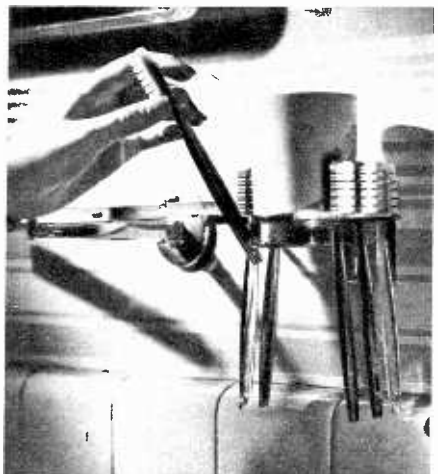

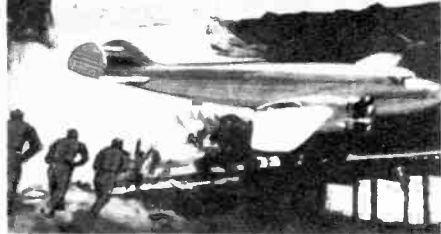

FOOD for victory is a living slogan to Irene Rich. The glamorous star of the "Dear John" series is a lady farmer who makes her California ranch a serious and profitable business. Foodstuffs, feed, poultry and livestock from the ranch find their way to markets throughout the state.

Irene went into the ranching business shortly before the war began, bringing to reality long-cherished dreams. The war demand for farm products gave her venture a doubly important place in her life.

Miss Rich is no kid-gloves farmerette. She runs the three-hundred-acre ranch with the help of one solitary hired man. She pitches in on milking and harvesting, tending pigs and feeding stock.

The actress and her daughter Frances planned their ranch home and furnished it with antiques and art objects they had collected. It's done in early American style with gay chintzes and hand-woven rugs.

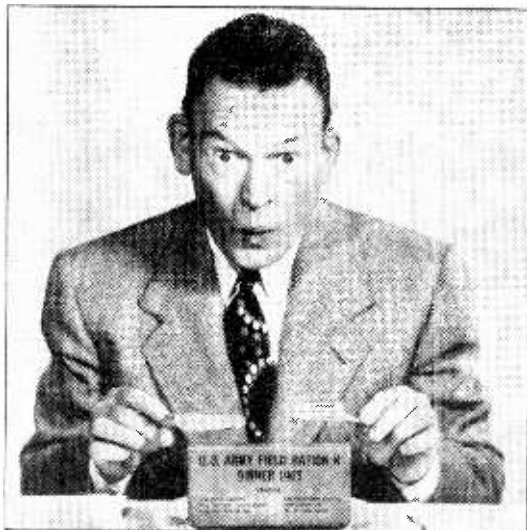

Stokowski Leads NBC Symphony Dec. 6; Licia Albanese, Tibbett Head "La Traviata" Cast; Bob Allen Takes Over Capt. Glenn Miller's Band

ARARELY performed work, the Karol Szymanowski "Symphonie Concertante" for piano and orchestra, opus 60, is one of the pieces programmed for the December 11 concert of the Philadelphia Orchestra. Eugene Ormandy, of course, conducts, and the rest of the list offers the Rossini "L'Italiana in Algeri" overture, the Hindemith Mathis der Maler and the Grieg A Minor Piano Concerto. The soloist in the two piano-and-orchestra pieces is Artur Rubinstein.

The Szymanowski piece is the Ukrainian composer's only one for piano and orchestra. It is not strictly a concerto, for the piano is less the solo instrument than is the case in a concerto. In this music, piano and orchestra take turns at being featured. It is dedicated to Mr. Rubinstein.

The spirit of the work is folkish, though its themes are not direct copies from Ukrainian folk numbers. There is a good deal of elasticity in the work's harmonic structure, which, I suppose, answers to the designation of "modern harmony." And the melodic content is itself freely roving, as you might say.

The Grieg A Minor Piano Concerto, which has been making the rounds of the dance bands—at least, the first melodic strain of the opening movement has—in fox-trot tempo, is another composition not too often heard. It was written in 1868, when the composer was a mere twenty-five, and it obtained its first performance at Copenhagen on April 3, 1869.

After its world premiere, Edmund Neupert, who played the piano-solo part, wrote to the composer, "On Saturday your divine concerto resounded in the great hall of the Casino. The triumph I achieved was tremendous. Even as early as the cadenza in the first movement the public broke into a real storm. The three dangerous critics, Gade, Rubinstein and Hartmann, sat in the stalls and applauded with all their might. I am to send you greetings from Rubinstein and say that he is astonished to have heard a composition of such genius. He would like to make your acquaintance."

One of the early admirers of the Piano Concerto in A Minor was Franz Liszt. In his monastery home at Rome, Liszt played the piece at sight before a company of friends, including Grieg, who had come on a visit to the great man's house. The Norwegian composer had not expected such a sterling performance of his work—and at first sight, though he did find that the first movement "was too fast and helter-

skelter."

It has been said by some observers that the A Minor Concerto is, in effect, autobiographical, which may or may not be so. But one could not deny it its youthful elan. The composer's love of nature, too, is said to course through it, and, of course, the music teems with references to folk-tunes.

(The Szymanowski "Symphonie Concertante" and the Grieg A Minor Piano Concerto will be played by Artur Rubinstein and the Philadelphia Orchestra under the direction of Eugene Ormandy over MBS on December 11.)

The Lady of the Camelias

Like the play known in this country as "Camille," the libretto by Francesco Maria Piave of "La Traviata" is based on the Alexandre Dumas novel "La Dame aux camelias." The novel came out in 1848 and the play derived from it was first produced in 1852. Verdi, who saw the stage version in Paris, became smitten with the subject and decided then and there to employ it for an opera.

"La Traviata" was introduced at the Teatro La Fenice, Venice, on March 6, 1853. It was a fiasco. It was laughed off the stage. But a little over one year later the work was given at another Venetian theater, the San Benedetto, and it not only met with success but it soon became the rage all over Italy.

Some of the reasons for the original failure are not hard to understand. In the first place, there was a good deal of bickering between certain artists and the management of La Fenice. Second, the baritone, one Felice Varesi, cared little for his part of the elder Germont, so he gave it little effort. But the most important reason of all had to do with the unsvelte figure of the soprano, Signora Donatelli. She

was said to have an excellent voice, but her proportions were a little too robust to make her a believable consumptive. That was why the audience laughed. It seems, also, that discriminating ladies and gentlemen, who comprised that first audience, would have none of operatic singers dressed in the styles of their day.

The role of Violetta, the heroine, is the opera's chief one. In fact, the opera has become known as a prima donna's opera. Adelina Patti was one of the singers thoroughly devoted to it. Others were Christina Nilsson, Lilli Lehman, Marcella Sembrich, Geraldine Farrar, Luisa Tetrazzini and Amelita Galli-Curci.

The cast for the Metropolitan broadcast includes Licia Albanese as Violetta and Lawrence Tibbett as the hero's father. The conductor, Cesare Sodero, makes his broadcast debut with the Metropolitan Opera Company.

("La Traviata" will be broadcast over the Blue Network on December 5, directly from the Metropolitan Opera House in New York.)

Finishing the "Unfinished"

Philip Hale has written of the sketchy third movement of the Schubert "Unfinished" Symphony, "Let us be thankful that Schubert never finished his work. Possibly the lost arms of the Venus of Milo might disappoint if they were found and restored. The few measures of the scherzo that are in the manuscript furnish but a slight hope that here, at last, Schubert would not, as in so many of his works of long breath maintain a steady decrescendo."

Oddly enough, theories have not been wanting as to the whys and wherefores of an uncompleted symphony. One with a bright idea suggested that Schubert had penned this composition as a "tribute to the Glory of the Incomplete." There have also been attempts to finish the Symphony. One of these by a certain August Ludwig of Berlin. He supplied the two missing movements, calling the third a "Philosophen-Scherzo," and the finale, "March of Fate." The four-movement version, believe it or not, was performed in Berlin on December 8, 1892. This Ludwig had conjured all sorts of fantastic and significant descriptive phrases for the two missing movements. The motto of the whole piece in his arrangement went, "Brazen stalks Fate, yet she is crowned with roses and love!"

One can be thankful, in the face of such presumption that these ambitious enterprises have been throttled at birth. Two movements of Schubert may not constitute a whole symphony, but, at least, it does add up to two movements of pure Schubert.

(The "Unfinished" Symphony of Schubert will be played by Leopold Stokowski and the NBC Symphony over NBC on December 6.)

Like Ennis, Bob Allen began with late Hal Kemp

BOB ALLEN, young band-leader who is making much headway these days, can thank his lucky stars that Glenn Miller joined the Army. For Allen, who used to be Miller's vocalist, thus was presented a golden opportunity to lead a band. Prior

to the engagement just mentioned, Allen had been the vocalist for another name leader, the late Hal Kemp. He started out for Chicago, one fine day, armed with much enthusiasm and a round-trip ticket, all set for an audition with Kemp. He made the grade. Today he still possesses the back-home half of the ticket, which he proudly shows to anyone who is interested.

As a matter of fact, Allen is one of a trio of Kemp ex-singers who have climbed rapidly, the two others being Janet Blair and Skinnay Ennis.

This young batonist has several pet theories concerning band singing. He believes that much vocal training is bad for a pop singer. He points to Lyn Gardner, his vocalist, as being a fine, natural singer who possesses the particularly personal quality in her voice which is ideal in the popular field. Janet Blair, for instance, had had a good deal of vocal schooling. This, he feels, stood in her way, while she was with Kemp. However, he continues, her technical skill stands her in good stead in her present work, that of starring in movie musicals.

The youthful maestro is at his best in tunes of a dreamy, melodious character, pieces like "Street of Dreams" or "Sentimental Feeling." The band, however, does not adhere to this type of song exclusively, for its members are a swing-minded group of musicians. In some of the faster tunes, Randy Brooks, twenty-two-year-old trumpet-player who started his career at the age of twelve with Rudy Vallee, sets the pace. Brooks, too, used to be with Hal Kemp. He makes no bones about his dislike of the triple-tonguing that used to be the Kemp band's features. Brooks likes the hot stuff.

One of the things Allen is proudest of is the fact that when he took over the Miller band he was awarded the former's unfinished contract with Bluebird records. However, one hazards the guess that nothing much will be done about fulfilling that until the present ban on recordings is rescinded.

Meanwhile, Allen is looking forward to the day when he will go to Hollywood to replace Glenn Miller in some of the offers the ex-bandman and present captain, U. S. A., had pending.

PROPAGANDA CAN WIN THE WAR AND THE PEACE, SAYS OWI OFFICIAL

Blue Network "Victory Hour" Supplements High-School Victory Corps; Psychiatrist Advocates Offensive Psychological Warfare via Radio

BROADCASTERS, it seems, can endure the perplexities of educational programs just so long. And, likewise, educators working with radio periodically reach a bursting-point. Then they must get together and talk things over.

It was my pleasure to attend two of these "get-togethers" within the last month. One was the Association for Education by Radio conference at Stephens College, Columbia, Mo.; and the other was the School Broadcast Conference that is held each year in Chicago. Though both meetings were termed "radio education conferences," each dealt with a different phase of educational broadcasting. The Stephens College meeting attacked the war-time problems of radio stations, whereas the School Broadcast Conference, as usual, was primarily concerned with the use of radio programs in the classroom.

Psychological Warfare

Dr. Louis Berg came to the Columbia meeting from New York to advocate offensive psychological warfare through radio and, in a surprise move, to throw a bouquet to the "soap operas." This latter gesture was particularly interesting in view of the fact that Dr. Berg, an eminent psychiatrist and author, has been a consistent and articulate foe of the daytime serials.

"Entertainment programs," he asserted, "are valuable morale-builders when they help us relax from war strain. But we also need more programs which will show the American way of life, the true color of the enemy, and the things for which we are fighting. Such programs are—or can be—'soap operas.'"

"Music is another of our strong morale-builders," he continued, "but until 'Praise the Lord and Pass the Ammunition' came along we have had no songs with which to march off to war."

Propaganda's Role

Approaching the propaganda question from a different angle. Charles A. Seipmann, one-time BBC official who is currently with the Office of War Information, maintained that propaganda can win the war and the peace to follow. Seeing a need for more of the spirit of '76, he traced man's fight for freedom from our own revolution to the present day.

"In the middle of the nineteenth century," he pointed out, "the stream of liberty bogged down and America fought the bloodiest war in history to release it. Now it has bogged down again—or at least so Hitler thinks. Hitler says men want security more than they cherish freedom. That is the issue of this war. There is no status

quo. We can step back, or we can go forward. We cannot stand still.

"This is the truth radio must communicate to the ordinary man," he asserted, emphasizing that every man must be made to feel that he is a part of the moving tide.

Through propaganda, he pointed out, radio must (1) enable the public to know the enemy, recognize his creed, logic and ambitions, (2) must inform us about our allies, and (3) must show us our own history.

"Propaganda can win the war, and must," he concluded. "Armed victory alone cannot."

* * *

At the Chicago School Broadcast Conference the emphasis was placed on more widespread use of war-time radio in schools. Due to the present, and in some cases, acute shortage of teachers, increased utilization of radio in education was predicted.

Radio as Postwar Forum

Lyman Bryson, director of education for CBS and chief of OWI's Bureau of Special Operations, addressed the annual banquet session in Chicago. Mr. Bryson, familiar to listeners as the moderator of CBS' weekly "People's Platform" series, pointed out that radio has an important function to serve as a postwar forum—not to settle questions specifically, he explained,

but to provide an impartial sounding-board where the real issues can be put before the public to determine for themselves. CBS at present, he revealed, has six research workers in its educational department studying

postwar radio plans, including the handling of discussions of the peace question.

1942 "Award of Merit"

One thing that was done at the Chicago meeting which seemed to meet with unanimous approval was the presentation of the SBC's 1942 "Award of Merit" to quiet, unassuming Robert B. Hudson of Denver. Definitely not a glory-grabber, Bob Hudson through hard and good work has made the Rocky Mountain Radio Council one of the outstanding radio education projects in the country. Though the work of this council reaches listeners only in the region of Colorado and Wyoming, what it has accomplished has a national significance as an example of how a tough regional radio situation can be handled efficiently and with remarkable results.

* * *

"High School Victory Hour"

If you have a boy or girl in high school, you're probably well acquainted with the High School Victory Corps. That's the project through which high-school students in all communities are aiding in the war effort in a great number of practical ways. Some have volunteered for air-raid-warden service, fire-warden service, emergency ambulance driving and the like. Others are aiding employed mothers with the care of their children, are assisting in Red Cross and community-health services and in book and salvage-collection campaigns.

Radio, through the "High School Victory Hour," is playing an important role in this project. In addition to serving as a medium for the promotion of these various activities in high schools, the "Victory Hour" attempts to explain the reasons and objectives of the war, the necessity for various phases of the civilian war effort and the significance of events taking place.

The format of the program follows a popular "variety" pattern that includes music by military bands, interviews with students and with men in service, pick-ups from Army camps and naval bases, appearances by "name" personalities. Every program includes a short analysis of the military situation of the week by a prominent radio commentator, George V. Denny, Jr., moderator of "America's Town Meeting," acts as narrator.

The "High School Victory Hour" is broadcast Tuesday afternoons on the Blue Network, and is planned and presented in cooperation with a number of Government agencies, such as the War and Navy Departments and the Office of Education. More than one hundred and twenty stations carry the program—probably a higher percentage than are carrying any other Blue Network sustaining feature.

FORMER JAP MISSIONARY REACHES TOKYO VIA RADIO . . . TELEVISION GOES TO WAR

**BBC Inaugurates New Service for Troops in Africa and Middle East;
RAF Pilot Describes His Reactions During a Night Raid on Genoa**

Service to Troops in Africa

ABOUT a month ago the BBC in London inaugurated a new and very special Overseas Service. Its sole object is to cheer and interest Allied troops in North Africa and the Middle East. There are seven hours of continuous broadcasting entertainment every day for the armed services. The programs are broadcast as follows: 11:45 a.m. to 1:45 p.m. over GSF (15.14); 1:15 to 5:00 p.m. over GSB (9.51); 4:00 to 5:00 p.m. over GSD (11.75) and 5:00 to 6:45 p.m. EWT over GRY (9.60).

Programs of this special service to troops in Africa are entirely different from the regular African Service of the BBC, for the needs of this listening audience is entirely different from a civilian one. These are men and women away from their families, often in considerable danger and nearly always in considerable discomfort. Therefore, especially in the canteen with noise and talk going on, they will not be in the mood for "strenuous listening." Their main need is good light music and variety. The BBC, therefore, aims at providing entertainment broken occasionally with short flashes of "attentive" listening, such as news headlines, two- or three-minute talks by popular speakers, sports news and greetings from home folks or friends. But most of all the fighting man wants to turn on a "tap" of good, light entertainment to cheer and refresh him; lively music to pep him up. The best of Britain's entertainment world, the choice of Britain's bands appear on the program for fighting forces in Africa and the Middle East.

Another speaker on the "Radio Newsreel" stated that during the bombing of Warsaw by the Nazi Luftwaffe, almost half of the twenty thousand buildings in that city were either wholly or partially destroyed . . . Lord Haw Haw, one of Goebbels' chief croakers on the Berlin short-wave station, is doing his best to play down the importance of the Allied successes in North Africa. Says he, "Stalingrad movements will have more effect on the outcome of the war than the North African maneuvers . . . Rommel has more in mind than simply falling back. It is all part of a grand strategy . . . New developments in North Africa will lead not to a weakening but a strengthening of Axis control over the Mediterranean" . . . Heard in the

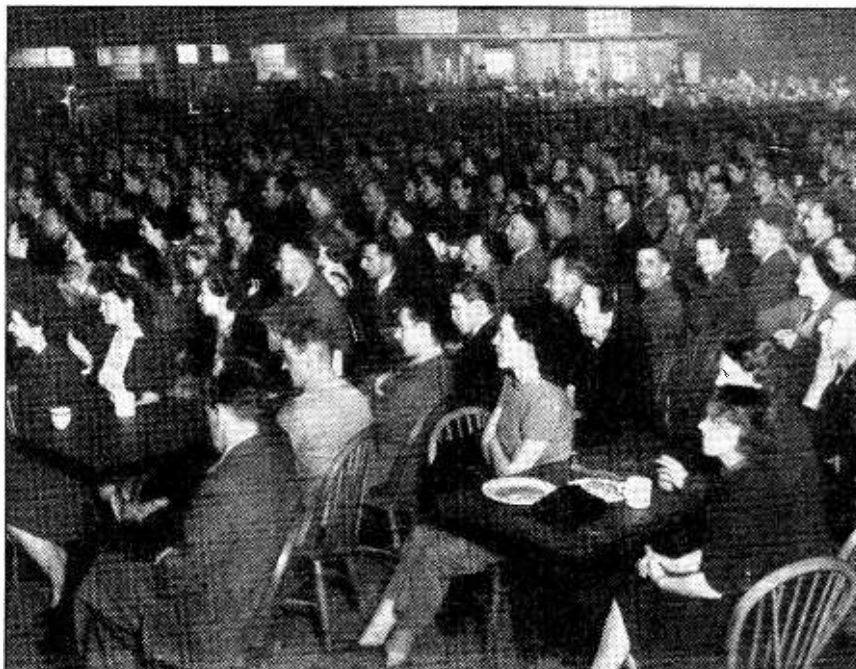

Night Raid on Genoa

What are a pilot's feelings on these long night-raiding trips? A young British R. A. F. pilot, speaking from London, described his own reactions to these long flights as follows: "Last night I was sent on my favorite trip—to Genoa. The route itself is very impressive. The beauty of the trip is fantastic. The double crossing of the Alps, with the snowy peaks glittering below in the cold, frosty light of a full moon is something one will never forget. There is no monotony on this detail, for it is hazardous enough to be thrilling, and at the same time we can get a real punch at the enemy in the place it hurts most. Approaching our target, we crossed the black hills that almost surround Genoa. Below lay the sleeping city, looking small and unreal. We dropped our flares in a line across the city. Soon after, we saw the first bomb flashes. Then we saw fires starting here, there and everywhere. At first looking like pin-points of light, they gradually spread, while the sky became illuminated with the dull red glare of spreading conflagrations. We saw one four-ton bomb hit a building; saw it disintegrate and the walls of the surrounding structures crumble and fall in. Having dropped our eggs, we started back for home. The natural beauty of the return trip was further enhanced by a great white meteor that lit up the whole sky as we crossed France."

Save Your Sugar!

SUGAR-RATIONING is no longer new to you now. For many months you have been stretching your supply and conserving your quota right down to the last grain. Possibly you have given up many of your favorite recipes which call for quantities of this precious commodity. But don't do that. Keep your family in delicacies, desserts and cookies and still conserve your sugar. Your old recipes can be adapted to substitutes—new recipes have been perfected. These are the days when honey, molasses and, yes, even gelatin play an all-important role in your cupboard accessories. So give them a try!

There isn't a family in these United States that doesn't love honey—and I'll make a bet on that! This highly concentrated sweet will zip up your

cakes and cookies—so use your standard recipes and juggle the ingredients. There are two ways of accommodating this new addition. Either reduce the amount of liquid one-fifth for each cup of honey or make the flour measurements scant and reduce the liquids one-fourth. But remember, if you are adding chocolate, fruits, nuts, raisins or dates, do not reduce the liquid one drop. Cut down on the actual baking time, and your creation will be light, moist—truly delectable. Try these cookies on the family and wip their enthusiastic approval!

Chocolate Cookies

- 1 1/4 cups honey
- 1 cup shortening
- 2 eggs

- 2 squares chocolate
- 1 1/2 cups rolled oats
- 1 teaspoon baking-powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon soda
- 2 1/2 cups flour
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 cup walnuts

Melt chocolate. Cream shortening and honey, add beaten eggs, oatmeal and chocolate. Add sifted dry ingredients, walnuts and vanilla. Drop on greased cookie sheet and bake in moderate oven for fifteen minutes. Makes seven dozen cookies.

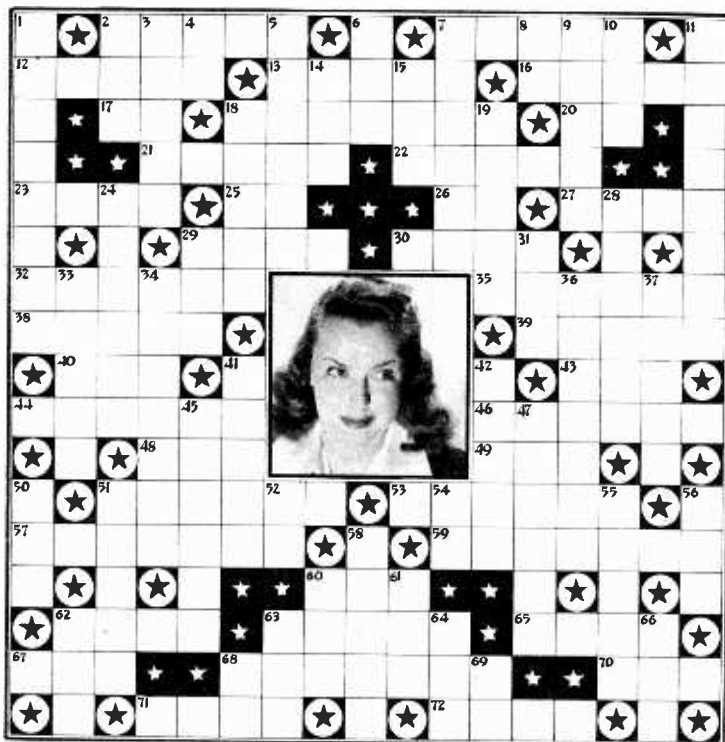

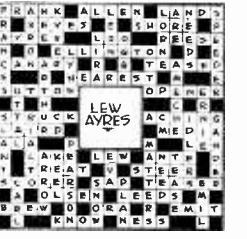

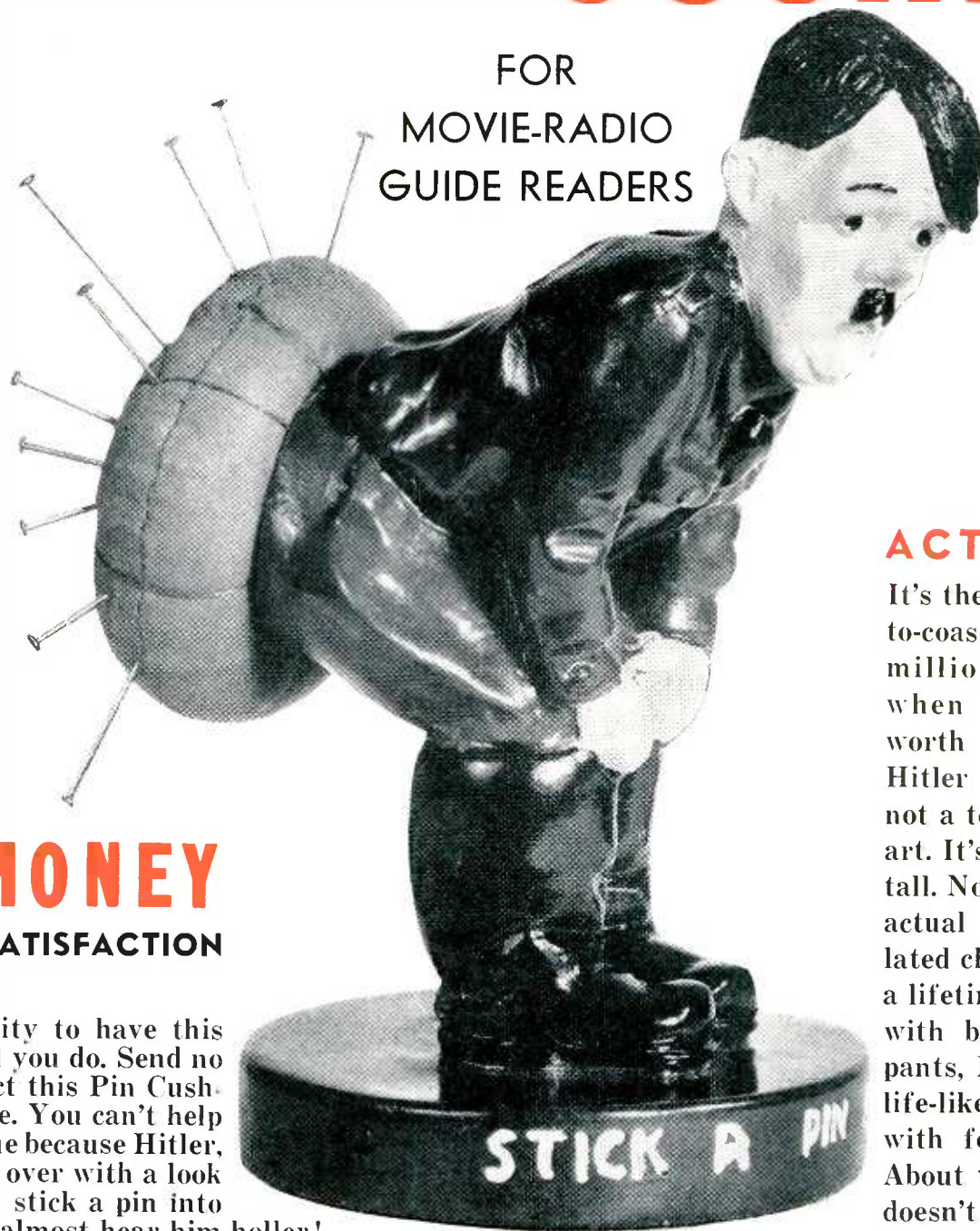
