During the last few weeks while the Carrie Carter Talent Search was under way, it was revealed that, second to a desire to be on the radio, the housewives seeking auditions were looking forward to the vacation away from home that would come to the winner. Many frankly admitted they were intrigued by the new-style vacation the contest offered.

Each winner in the Carrie Carter Talent Contest will be given a role on "The Carters of Elm Street" broadcast, over KHJ-Mutual Don Lee 8:45 to 9:00 a.m. daily Monday through Friday, for a two-week period on the program; will be paid at the American Federation of Radio Artists' rate of \$112.50 per week, together with the round trip traveling expenses and living expenses during the two weeks in Chicago, where the program originates. Moreover, each winner will have a role written to fit her own individual type and personality; she will not be forced to adapt herself to a part already conceived. This is purported to be something entirely new in talent contests.

Santa Ana Cantando Club Sings On KVOE

From the studios of Santa Ana's KVOE to the coast-to-coast Mutual Don Lee Broadcasting System will go the songs of the 65-voice Santa Ana Cantando Club men's chorus on Monday, June 3, from 12:30 to 12:45 p.m.

Directed by Joseph J. Klein, who each year directs the 500-voice choir at the Easter Sunrise Services at Forest Lawn Memorial Park in Glendale, the Santa Ana group will sing "Lift Thine Eyes," by Frederick Knight Logan; "Ave Maria," by Franz Schubert; "Border Ballad," by J. H. Maunger, and "Reaper's Song," a Bohemian folk song.

The personnel of the singing organization, with a repertoire of over 300 songs, is made up of men representing 30 businesses and professions. Miss Ruth Armstrong accompanies the group at the piano.

Unknown to radio listeners three years ago, Abbott and Costello began in vaudeville like the majority of comedians of the present day. Their first radio appearance, in the Spring of 1938, was so successful that they have become a regular and increasingly popular feature.

Abbott, born in Coney Island, was literally brought up in show business, while Costello hails from Paterson, New Jersey. After varied careers they met backstage at a Brooklyn burlesque house in 1930 and the team of Abbott and Costello was formed. Following their climb to radio fame, they scored a success in the Broadway musical, "The Streets of Paris."

FOOD FILOSOFY

HERE is a curious item that came to our attention recently. We wonder if any of our modern restaurants can compete with it:

It seems that if a really fastidious epicure had entered a good French restaurant back in about the year 1800, he could have had his choice of any of the following items: 12 soups, 30 poultry or game entrees, 24 fish entrees, 60 beef, mutton or veal entrees, 16 roasts, 74 entremets or side-dishes, and 62 desserts or pastries. In all, 277 means of satisfying the appetite. No wonder the French speak of l'embaras du choix! There are enough selections here to cause a true gourmet to have a nervous breakdown while trying to decide on his dinner.

★ ★ ★

With all the variety offered above, however, we doubt if our epicure could have ordered chili con carne, so let us offer you our own recipe for this dish right now—just in case you yourself should run into a book-length bill-of-fare that does not include it.

For chili con carne as we like it, we use the following ingredients:

2½ pounds of lean beef from the round, cut in cubes ½ pound of kidney suet, ground; 1 teaspoon oregano, ground 3 cloves of garlic, chopped very fine; 10 chili peppers, soaked and passed through a sieve so that only the pulp can be used 2 bay leaves; 1 tablespoon of ground comino seeds; 1 cup of catsup; 4 cups of stock, made out of beef bones; some salt and 6 chili tepinas.

Chili con carne, of course, simply means "peppers with meat," "chili" being the Mexican name for the kind of pepper used in preparing this dish. But the chili pepper is also known by the more scientific name of "capsicum," and as capsicum it is used quite extensively in medicine as a remedial agent for such ailments as neuralgia, dyspepsia, rheumatism, and even diphtheria and tonsillitis. All this serves to indicate that a little chili con carne is good for you, so let us proceed with the recipe:

Place the kidney suet in a heavy kettle or frying pan, and when it is melted, add the beef, garlic, oregano, bay leaf, comino, salt and chili tepinas. Cook this for 20 minutes, stirring constantly. Then, mix the pulp of the chili peppers with the beef stock and catsup, and when it is thoroughly mixed, add the mixture to the meat and let the whole business come to a boil. When it reaches a boil, reduce the gas flame and simmer for about 10 minutes.

Now the chili con carne is ready to serve, but the chances are that you will wish to serve some beans with it . . . so:

Wash 1 pound of Mexican beans thoroughly and put them in 2 quarts of water together with ½ pound of salt pork and 2 bay leaves. Let this come to a boil and then simmer until done.

Renfrew A Modern Sir Galahad

Radio Tales of Royal Mounties Actually Happened And Are Related By a Man Who Got Them First Hand

FIVE HUNDRED miles through the frozen wastes of the north Renfrew biked, until he reached the missionary pad from the loneliness of his northern post. Then began their long trek back to civilization. In his madness the missionary fought Renfrew—so he was tied down to the sled. But to feed him, and prevent the bonds from stopping his circulation, Renfrew would release the poor fellow a few times a day, and the man would fight with a maniac's strength, and Renfrew would have to chase him, wallowing in the snow, and drag him back to camp and feed him.

The first settlement they reached proved not to be the hoped-for haven. Renfrew, now weak from exhaustion, found the place taken over by drunken half-breeds. But the authority of the Royal Mounties could not be left in question. So, by sheer courage, he tore into the mob of hoodlums, arrested the ringleaders, and proceeded on his almost impossible journey. Finally he reached Port Saskatchewan, where he imprisoned the half-breed outlaws and turned the lunatic over to the hospital.

Now, dear cynics, say it isn't true. Say that although you listen religiously to Renfrew of the Mounted every Saturday night over NBC, you know all along that it's fiction. You are entranced by the incredible feats performed by the red-jacketed Mounty—but after all it's only fiction! Say that such tall tales are okay in story-books, movies and radio programs, but they never really happened. . . .

Well, my cynical friends, it did happen! And so did all the other adventures falling to our hero. Wait—one reservation! These radio adventures didn't literally happen to Renfrew. For our hero is fictitious. Actually he is a composite of all the brave men in the scarlet-jacketed Royal Mounted Canadian Police. So, whereas we admit that all the forces of evil overcome each Saturday night by Renfrew aren't the doing of any one man, we stand pat on this statement: That every episode you hear is based on some actual experience of Canada's several hundred Mounted Policemen.

Renfrew really is the name of a city in Ontario. When Laurie York Erskine—author of the famous short-stories, novels, movies and broadcasts bearing the Renfrew trademark—was looking for a name on which to hang his tales, he got out his spectacles and a map of Canada. When he came to "Renfrew" he stopped. It was what he was looking for. He folded the map—and a world-famous hero was born!

But Renfrew was actually conceived

in the author's mind long years before that—if only in a vague fashion. Erskine, a Scottish boy living in uptown New York, used to learn French from

a lady nearby. One of the reasons little Laurie never paid much attention to his French lessons was a portrait of a tall, handsome man, clad in brilliant scarlet, standing over the mantelpiece. It was the lady's brother, Duncan, who once had served with the Mounties. The lady, realizing that her charge was learning little French, drove a hard bargain with him: For every lesson Laurie learned, he was to be rewarded with a story about Duncan's adventures in northwest Canada. . . . Thus did Erskine learn French, and at the same time conceive a character to be known in years to come to millions as Renfrew.

Many years later, when Erskine was barely eighteen, he augmented his childhood visions of the Mounties through first-hand experience with the Force itself. He was making the rounds of Canada with a theatrical troupe playing

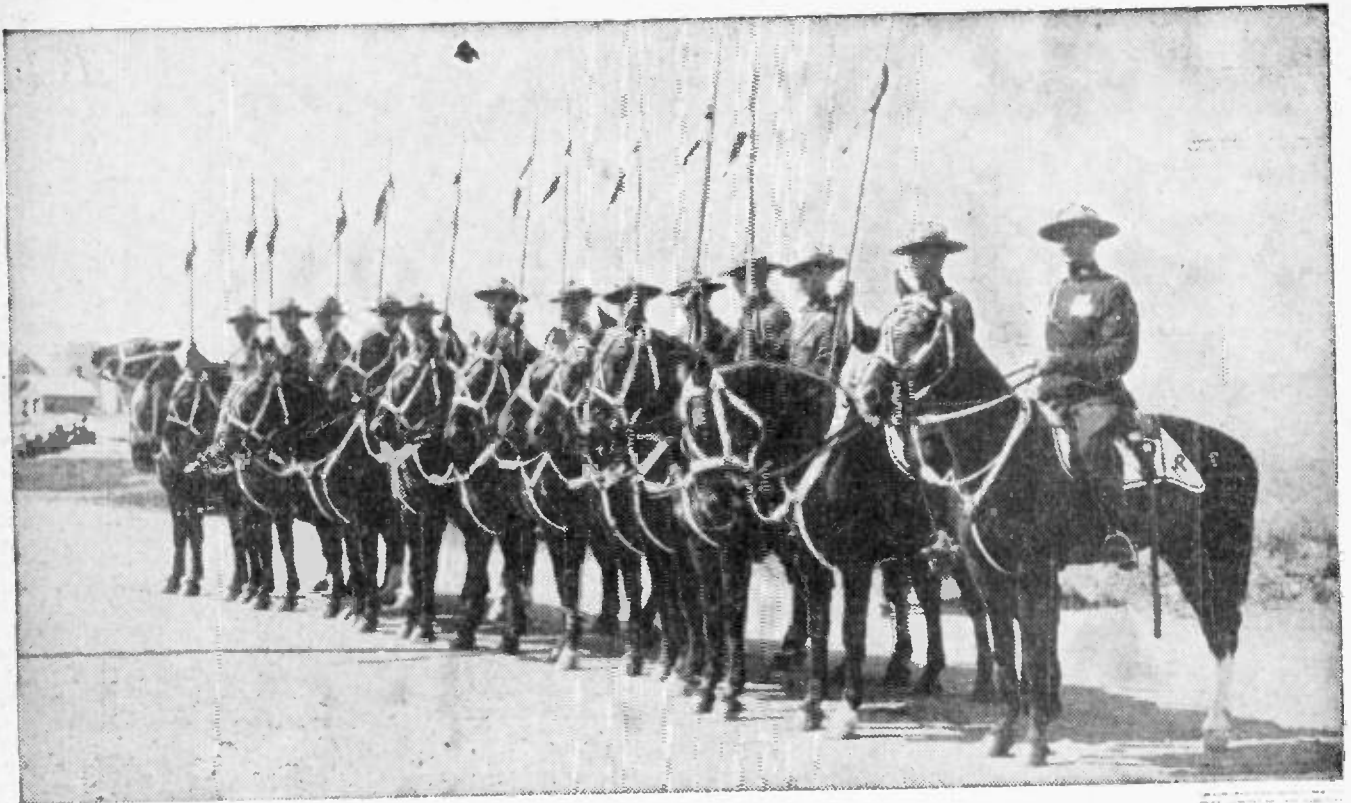
one-night stands of "Peg O' My Heart." When they reached the Mounty country, Erskine (who played the leading male role), quit in order to join up with the heroes of his boyhood days. But disappointment struck a bitter blow at young Erskine: a Mounty's age limit was twenty-two!

However, Laurie had the persistence and good luck to strike up an acquaintance with Colonel A. Ross Cuthbert, then Assistant Commissioner of the Canadian Mounted Police, who took a keen liking to the self-made boy who had dropped school at the age of fourteen in order to help support his family. The Colonel invited him on long patrols through the Canadian wilderness and told him stirring tales of his men's adventures. Then he gave Laurie a letter of introduction to all Mounty officers; and between earning his bread as a reporter and advertising writer, Erskine accompanied them on bitter manhunts, incredible rescue trips, and long treks through the snow-filled wilderness.

He learned that in Canada the lawless element, whether savage or criminal, seldom offered resistance to the Force. He learned that it was true that Mounties have oftimes walked straight into the guns of notorious murderers, without drawing a gun themselves, and the murderers submitted. He learned the rules of fair play that every Mounty must follow to the T: No gun can be drawn until the suspect has actually fired on him; no suspect can be arrested nor a house searched without a warrant; no prisoner can be third-degreed, nor injured in any way during the course of the capture; no prisoner can be embarrassed, nor handcuffed in a public conveyance, for a suspect is always deemed innocent until proved guilty in court.

And Erskine also came to understand that because the red-coated Mounties stand for complete and unwavering justice, they are respected by every criminal in the land, as well as by the collective population of The Dominion of Canada.

With all of this material—derived from living experience—at his disposal, Erskine felt himself equipped to record the adventures of the Mounties. So he returned to the States and, while the stories took shape in his mind, he supported himself by working as a reporter, copy-writer, department store salesman, sundry other tasks. But then came the War, and Erskine hastened to join a regiment of Royal Mounted Cavalry. When this group was disbanded, Erskine went to England, saw extensive

action as a member of the Royal Flying Corps, at war's end was teaching flying to English cub-pilots.

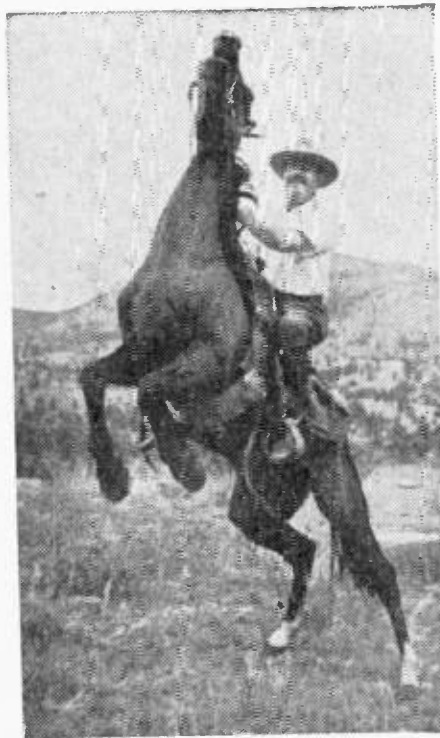
Again Erskine embarked for the States, this time landed a job selling bonds for a Chicago investment house. And although he didn't especially like his work, it led, through a freak of fortune, to the first of his long series of Renfrew stories. . . .

One of Erskine's bond customers happened to hold the Editorship of American Boy. So impressed was he by the magic of Erskine's salesmanship that he asked him what in blazes he was doing in the bond business. Erskine's reply was to the effect that he would much rather write.

One thing led to another . . . and within the month the first Renfrew story had run through the presses and appeared in the pages of American Boy.

Thereafter every one of the tales was snapped up eagerly by Editors. So before long their creator deserted the hand-selling business to go to work on a Battle Creek (Michigan) newspaper.

Later, while working on the Detroit News, Erskine delved deeply into juvenile problems, penology and the general effects of social conditions upon youngsters. In 1925, after more intensive work amongst settlement schools and boy's camp groups, and months of lecturing, Erskine established a prep school for boys in New Hope, Pennsylvania, now

one of the country's leading educational institutions. A Horatio Alger novel would pale beside Erskine's actual life story.

Actor House Jameson plays the hero's role with miraculous fidelity to the author's conception of Renfrew. A blonde, wiry six-footer, with clipped mustache and precise manner of speech, Jameson consummates in person the dreams of a million boys as to Renfrew's appearance. Actually he is as close to being a Moutie, in body and spirit, as any non-member of the Force possibly could be—living his part in everyday life as well as in the radio studio. Jameson has good reason, too, for understanding the Moutie character, having closely observed their work when he was barnstorming Canada with a theatrical stock company.

Renfrew is an ideal hero for boys of all ages, one finer and more splendid than any Jesse James or Robin Hood that ever lived—a hero who disdains the use of violence and trickery. Every boy, according to Erskine, desires to pit himself imaginatively against all sorts of difficulties and dangers, to see himself coping with all kinds of formidable men. Which is the reason for so many boys today seeing in the adventurous bandit the most desirable kind of life. Having a man like Renfrew to hear about, however, fulfills those hero-worshipping tendencies, and at the same time teaches them the lawful responsibilities of life.

RADIO LIFE is in receipt of a fine letter from Elizabeth Goudy, director for radio of the Los Angeles County schools, thanking us for the articles on children's programs. Mrs. Goudy says in part:

"I think the problem of a radio council which would coordinate civic and school groups in the planning and presentation of educational programs locally is one that might well be considered seriously, although I have no specific plans for such. The Rocky Mountain Radio Council has done an excellent job in this respect. If you know anything about this development, I would appreciate more information from you."

Unfortunately I know nothing at all about what has been done in the Rocky Mountain area for educational programs, so I'm hoping that among our readers we may get some worthwhile suggestions. I know Mrs. Goudy would appreciate some comments from listeners outside the field of education and I would, too. Many times it is hard for people too close to a problem to see clearly—"can't see the woods for the trees," you know.

The arguments on Daytime Serials continue to rage. Thinking you might be interested in the latest news from that battle-front, I'm bringing you two more defenders. Here's what John J. Anthony, of the Good Will Hour, has to say:

★ ★ ★

"Anybody who would take the trouble to compare daytime radio shows with those magazines enjoying the largest circulations would be impressed with the greater vitality and 'homey' flavor of the broadcast stories. To compare radio serials to Toscanini concerts is like judging a popular publication by the standards of a highbrow magazine. These critics offer no substitute for the interest these programs contain, and as long as this interest remains, the programs will, and should, continue."

Margaret Cuthbert, director of women's activities for NBC, prepared this answer to the "We Are Not Listening" groups:

★ ★ ★

"Audience acceptance is the key to the situation. Programs that are not listened to are taken off the air. We are constantly reevaluating programs, checking on station acceptance and mail count. The good sense of the average citizen never fails in the long run. The public eventually gets what it wants.

★ ★ ★

"Who, then, is to determine the standards and substance of radio material? So far it has been done by the people who compose the listening audience. When a program is not listened to, we assume that

it is not what is wanted. When it has a high audience rating we assume that it is what the potential audience wants."

Pretty hard to refute that logic, isn't it? However, I do have a sneaking suspicion that audiences would accept better class entertainment if they got a chance at it. For instance, what about the success of "Information Please"? (KECA Tues. 7 p.m.) Several network officials have confessed to me that they'd have thrown out that program idea as too highbrow if it had been submitted to them.

Anyhow, this whole question is vital to radio listeners, especially the women in the home. I'd like to hear some expressions of opinion from my readers. Won't you put in your three cents worth and write me your ideas on what you'd like to hear? After all, it's up to you listeners what we get on the air.

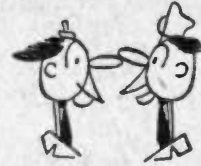

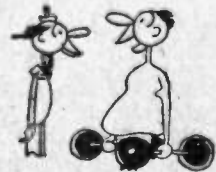

The World on Your Dial

In the issue of RADIO LIFE which carried my story on the unique manner in which the baseball games are broadcast from Tokyo, I promised to advise you where to tune and when to listen for the games of the 1940 season. Well, once again the horsehide coated pellet is being "batted, bunted, and booted" around the diamond in the big Meiji Shrine stadium. You'll have to listen at mid-nite rather than mid-afternoon to hear the Japanese at play, for station JZJ on 11:80 Mc. is releasing the games after 12 midnite and sometimes not until 1 a.m. Strong, steady signals come from JZJ at this early hour, however (time for "mice and milkmen" to play here), and excitement of the crowd was running high the other morning as I "megacycled" my way along the short wave "base paths."

Traveling north and west from the land of majestic and legendary Fujiyama we may visit Manchoukuo, focusing our attention on Hsinking and radio station MTCY. We'll take our morning news with our morning meal, thanks to an excellent review of events the world around broadcast in English at 7:45 a.m. daily. This newscast terminates the "Overseas Program" of MTCY and the martial, yet beautiful strains of the Manchoukuo national anthem furnish a satisfying prelude to the tasks of our day.

Continuing our trans-Pacific ramblings, we may choose instead to guide our modern "magic carpet" to exactly 11 Mc. on the dial where PLP "Provides Likable Programs" of a still different nature, from the powerful transmitter at Bandoeng, Java. This paradisiacal garden spot of the now "orphan" Netherlands Indies offers a variety of features on the program which begins at 1:30 a.m. and is terminated at 7:30 a.m. with the playing of Carrie Jacobs Bond's "A Perfect Day." Transcribed popular dance tunes with the vocal choruses sung in Dutch are broadcast by PLP, particularly for listeners in North America. But—have you ever heard a Gamelon orchestra? This peculiar, drum-like Javanese instrument produces music that is weird, yet beautiful and distinctly oriental. The Javanese gamelon players sit cross-legged in rows on the floor before their instruments, and the number of players in a gamelon orchestra may be fifteen or more.

Perhaps an Australian station will appeal to you more. The "down under" land of strange animals and strange birds—Australia, home of the K.K.K.'s (kangaroos, kookaburras, and kiwi-kiwis.). Representing this great island continent with a breakfast broadcast is the new VLQ, standing for "Victory, Loyalty, and Quality." You may hear the strange call of the kookaburra (Australia's national bird), sometime during the program, daily 7:30 to 8:30 a.m. And who knows!—perhaps one of those "kute, kwaint, klevor, kuddly" koala bears will scamper right up the microphone stand and say "hello" to you in his "native" tongue.

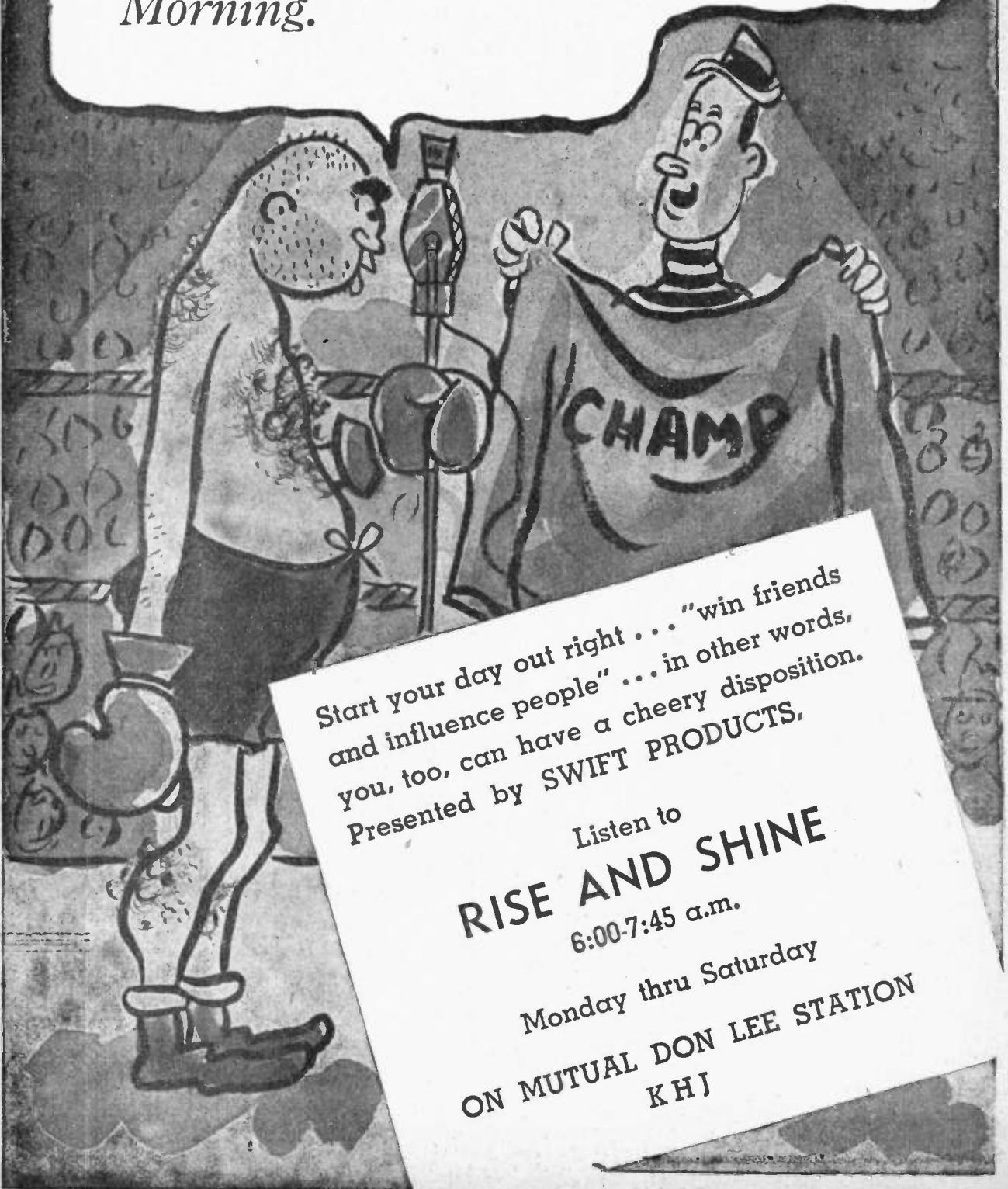
