Two individuals in the past week have succeeded in bringing down upon the ears of the radio industry the collective wrath of millions of people. One of these individuals remains unidentified. The other is Robert S. Allen.

We shall take up first the case of the anonymous individual, someone in the eastern Program Department of the Blue Network. He brought the wrath of the listening public down upon the ears of the radio industry by programming a dull, unimportant and lengthy boxing match last Tuesday night. He didn't know at the time he booked the program that the fight would last as long as it did, of course. It ran much longer than he or anybody else wanted it to, and as a result, "Information Please" had to be cancelled. Thus a very small handful of listeners enjoyed the prize fight while millions were forced to miss one of their favorite programs. Although KECA was not responsible in any way for the mishap, that station's telephones rang far into the night, while sulphurous smoke poured from the receivers.

Let us hope this ill-advised and unwise program official does not repeat the performance in the future. He will live much longer that way. . . .



The case of Robert S. Allen, one-half of the team of Pearson and Allen, is much more serious. Allen, an experienced journalist, made the grievous error of not checking all his facts on a broadcast from Washington.

Mr. Allen, in a confused effort to obtain a scoop, broadcast to the world that the Japanese vegetable gardeners in Southern California had been spraying their vegetables "with more than 35 times the amount of arsenic needed for bug protection."

This statement is untrue.

If Mr. Allen had bothered to check his information he would have discovered that one small gardener had erred in his spray mixture. But he didn't check the facts, evidently, and thus the entire vegetable industry

Tribute to Carole

The untimely, tragic death of Carole Lombard in an airline transport which plunged her mother, close friend Otto Winkler, and 19 others into a Nevada mountainside Jan. 17 saddened the entire entertainment industry.

Probably no radio personality was more deeply affected than Jack Benny by the news that the beloved MGM star had perished in the first plane crash to claim a Hollywood notable since Will Rogers' death.

Jack, a great admirer of the Fort Wayne, Ind., girl who became movie-land's greatest delineator of "screw-ball" comedies, was so shocked by the tragedy that he telephoned his Jello Gang on Saturday morning to say "I just can't go on Sunday."

Benny, who just the day before Christmas had completed his first co-starring role with Miss Lombard in an Alexander Korda film titled "The Censor Forbids," (formerly "To Be Or Not To Be") had completed details for Carole's guest appearance on his Sunday program of Jan. 25 only a day before the glamorous wife of Clark Gable trained east to aid the Defense Bond drive.

As Radio Life went to press on the day of Carole Lombard's death, it was learned that Jack had requested that a program of music supplant his comedy show on Sunday, Jan. 18, out of respect to Miss Lombard. When the sponsor agreed, Jack also asked that only this announcement be made on the air: "Jack will not be heard today, but he will be back again with us next week at this same time."

That's why you heard no Benny quips on Sunday, Jan. 19 . . . why you heard only a program of music with songs by Dennis Day. It was a sentimental tribute to a swell gal by a swell guy who, like thousands of others in the industry who knew Carole Lombard, just couldn't bring himself to joke on a day of such sadness.

Happy Birthday

Befitting the Chief Executive of this mighty land will be radio's contribution to President Roosevelt's anniversary celebration. Entitled "March of Dimes of the Air," the broadcast will afford 60 minutes of star-embellished entertainment over NBC Red, Mutual, and the Blue networks, Saturday, Jan. 24, 8:15 p. m.

Arch Oboler is writing and producing the program, which includes three of his original sketches, "Pay the

Piper," "Marriage—1942," and "A Letter at Midnight." With Gordon Jenkins conducting the orchestra, a streamlined musical comedy will star Marlene Dietrich, Tyrone Power, Bing Crosby, and Mary Martin.

Appeals for the March of Dimes are to be made by Greta Garbo, Spencer Tracy, and Charlie McCarthy. Other luminaries participating number Bob Hope, the Merry Macs, Dennis Day, Fibber McGee and Molly, Deanna Durbin, Claudette Colbert, Humphrey Bogart, Janet Beecher, Jean Arthur, Jimmy Cagney, Thomas Mitchell, and Ronald Colman.

No doubt the President will think life is just beginning at 60!

No Curtains for Quizzes

Quiz fans will still be able to revel in "Information Please," "Quiz Kids," "Dr. I. Q.," "Vox Pop," "Double or Nothing," "Take It Or Leave It," "How Am I Doing," and other favorite programs in the question and answer category, announced the radio stations last Saturday after Washington had promulgated a radio code for war-time

practices including restrictions on quizzes effective Feb. 1.

NBC, CBS, and Mutual networks reassured concerned listeners that already they had been observing the essential points of the new code and that their contemporary quiz programs were those broadcast with special groups with whose backgrounds they were thoroughly familiar, or in studios under close supervision of the networks.

"What the government wishes to avoid," said one radio executive, "is the informal interview in which maybe 20 or so persons take part and where participants with backgrounds unfamiliar to radio producers might have opportunities to transmit messages to the enemy through pre-arranged code. For the same reason, interviews with the "man on the street" are forbidden, as well as musical numbers requested by telephone or telegraph."

So here's the green light, Clifton Fadiman, Bob Hawk, Wally Butterworth, Parks Johnson, Phil Baker, and all you askers of stickler questions worth many shekels. Keep 'em answering!

Another gold star for Bob Burns and his one-man morale building campaign. For more than eight months, Bob has been entertaining the boys in the U. S. Artillery at Panama Canal by remote control. Each week he writes a lengthy, humorous letter to Master Sergeant Clay M. Doster, a member of the unit.

This letter is a highlight of the weekly paper issued by the boys in the Zone. Burns also makes a recording of his CBS "Arkansas Traveler" show, sans advertising plugs, and sends it with his weekly letter. "Come In, Rio"

Newest recruit to the role of a flying radio reporter is Columbia Broadcasting's Eric Severeid. They wanted copies of the song; they wanted permission to use the song in camp shows and Red Cross drives. Many enclosed checks.

Director Vick Knight has had "We've Got A Job To Do" published and this week assigned his royalties to the American Red Cross. **KNX, 9 p.m. Wed.**

The likeable Hawk, quizmaster of the sensational "Take It Or Leave It," turned over his former show to Comedian Phil Baker several weeks ago to devise his new gag-spree, which hit the airplanes as "How'm I Doin'?"

The new Hawk epic, on its initial airing the 9th, hit a smart pace, and the Radio Life family seemed to enjoy the new slant as much as the quizzers who battled it out for the currency in the New York studio.

"How'm I Doin'?" offers new format which enables an extra-smart contestant to earn as much as \$600, looks like a good, long-run breadwinner for the gag-purveying Hawk who will earn a weekly stipend of \$2500 for his idea and ability to kid the customers.

The new quiz differs from the run-of-the-mill question-answer shows in that Hawk selects his contestants before the broadcast, pays them first and asks them questions later. He gives each contestant \$40 each. Each contestant is asked four questions, alternately. Each time a question is missed, the contestant hands over \$10 to his opponent. Each time a question is handled correctly, the opponent hands over the same amount. On the first show a physician won "going away," taking something over \$200 home to his fraulein. Or did he?

A trip to the Hollywood Palladium, the King-size dining and dancing emporium adjoining Columbia Square, is especially interesting these evenings . . . for at least three very apparent reasons.

Frank is the handsome, crisp-appearing soloist, whose baritones have the feminine contingent, young and old alike, literally talking to themselves. He's about the most romantic voice on the air at the moment—that is, among the popular song interpreters, and of course Frank is helped along no end by the fact that Mr. Dorsey allows him to sing the nation's most romantic song, "This Love of Mine," ten or twelve times a night. The tune was written by Frank—so, it's perhaps no more than fair that the ladies should be obliged.

(3) The atmosphere. You get a "lift" the minute you step into The Palladium. The young people have "adopted" the beautiful ballroom as their favorite entertainment medium,

Cantor Marches Dimes

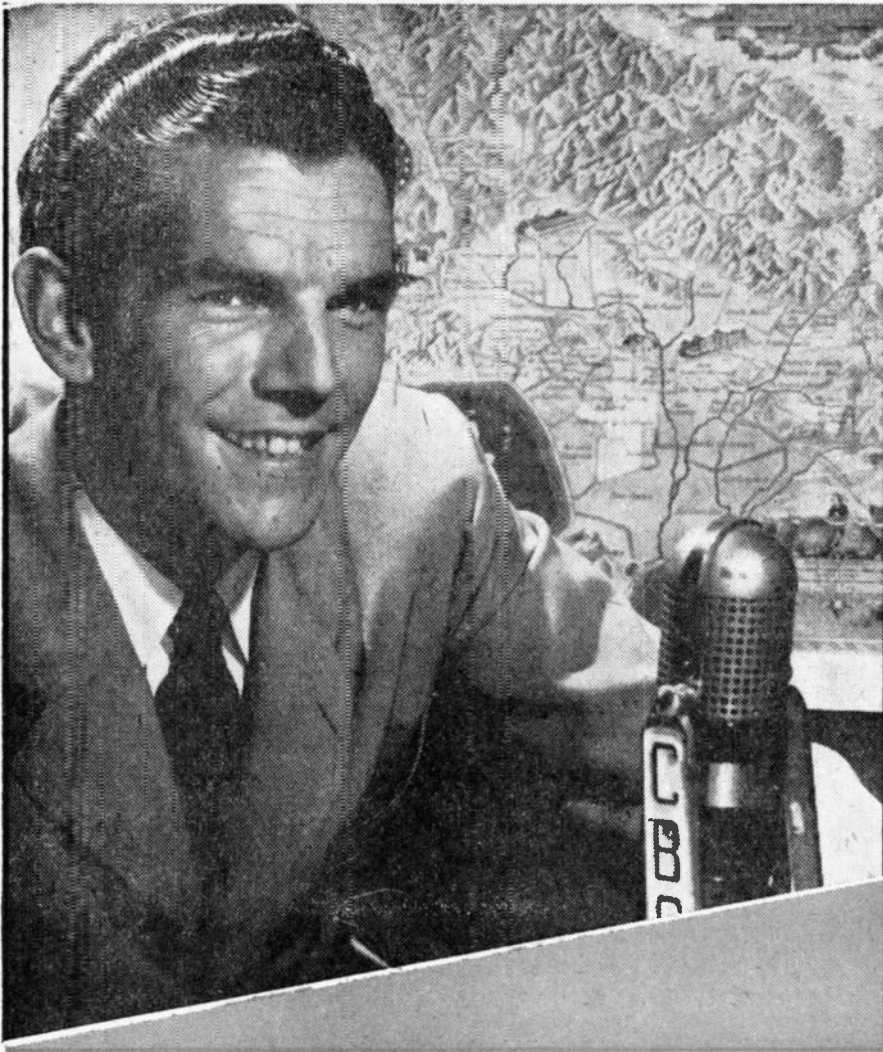

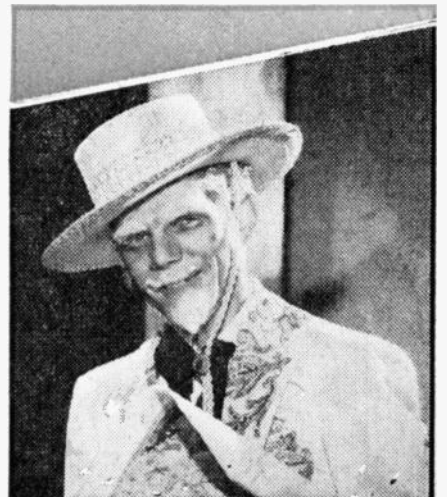
THE spirit, authentic tempo and lifeline of a bygone era are rarely "brought to life" in a manner interesting enough to compel the attention and capture the listening loyalty of us moderns.

However . . . these Wednesday evenings via KNX at 6 p. m. a half-hour weekly dramatic show under the title—"Romance of the Ranchos"—is doing just that!

Drawing upon a fact-filled reservoir of historical material which has been unearthed by a group of smart radio showmen with the aid of California

California-born Maestro Reveals Solid, Realistic Success Formula

AS CHILD prodigy of the cello, he had been required to don long pants to play with the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra and become a member of Musician's Local No. 47.

Now, as a grown man, he was traveling back to his "home town."

The sleek transcontinental train chugged to a stop-over pause at Albuquerque and The Man and his vivacious wife jumped off the steps. Immediately they were pelting one another with snow balls.

At the scuffle's height, came a messenger boy with New Year's greetings to be delivered in song. A trifle off-key, the boy warbled into the chorus of "Auld Lang Syne," then crumpled at the last few measures. Instantly The Man unassumingly finished the stanza for the embarrassed messenger.

How completely confused the boy would have been had he known that The Man was Alfred Wallenstein, maestro of universal renown and musical director for Mutual Broadcasting System!

What he must have sensed, though, was that here was a right swell fellow. Noting an attitude far disassociated from musical genius and a conservative dark business suit under the flecks of snow, the boy probably sized up Mr. Wallenstein as an extraordinarily good-looking executive.

He's all of that—only his business is music. It has been, ever since he was five, although pursuit of his piano career was egged on by paddlings administered because of chronic refusals to practice. When Alfred was six, he was given the choice of a bicycle or a cello for Christmas. It would be gratifying to state that he chose the cello without a moment's hesitation, but it took some cagey manipulation on the paternal part for the cello to merge with priority rating.

"Did I regret the decision?" asks Wally (he prefers to be called that). "At first I was sorry," he says, "but never again."

Ferde Grofe's mother was his first

music teacher. He became that awesomely unique thing, a "child prodigy."

He remembers arguing with his school principal about taking manual training. The cello won out over the saw. Soon Orpheum Theatres engaged young Wallenstein to tour the country. Then he joined the San Francisco

Symphony orchestra, directed by Alfred Hertz.

Famed dancer, Anna Pavlova, heard of the cello-wizard and asked that he accompany her in "The Swan" at Los Angeles' Majestic Theater. At conclusion of the performance Charlie Chaplin, Edna Purviance, Kathleen Williams, and other enthusiastic celebrities pelted the danseuse with flowers from their lofty boxes. She, in turn, tossed the blossoms to the young cellist in the orchestra pit. When Pavlova later toured South and Central America, Wallenstein accompanied her.

His three-year engagement with the Los Angeles orchestra was followed by study in Europe, seven years with the Chicago Symphony and seven with New York Philharmonic. It was while Wallenstein was playing as first cellist under Toscanini in New York that he felt an urge to conduct. Toscanini encouraged him.

Eight years ago Wallenstein came back home to conduct a Hollywood Bowl concert. Such success was scored that by 1936 he was devoting all his time to conducting with the country's major orchestras and in radio.

As a conductor he's distinctive, first, perhaps, because he's an American. He is one of the few who has achieved top rank both as a concert soloist and conductor. He possesses a flair for discovering new composers, new and worthy music; he specializes in presenting seldom or never-broadcast works of great composers like Bach or Mozart. He has conducted over 500 first performances over Mutual, including the first American production of several Mozart operas. His

Heard on RADIO LIFE'S Short Wave

LISTENING POST

By Earl G. De Haven

Boldly charging Great Britain with forcing the United States into the present world conflict against her will, "Radio Tokyo" this week struck with potent verbal force at "age old British imperialism." Quoting this Japanese broadcast: "Britain with characteristic arrogance and selfishness, (unchanged through the centuries), forced the American colonists into a revolution in 1776, repeated the performance in 1812 and again in 1917, and always to the tune of, "Onward Christian Soldiers." Churchill with his 'propositions' and Roosevelt with his 'appropriations', cannot, today, in full measure of cooperation save their colonies in Asia. Destruction of 33,000 ton aircraft carrier Lexington by our navy is added proof that U. S. Navy is impotent against Japan's sea warriors. Japan is determined to sweep every trace of the Anglo-American 'raw deal' from greater East Asia."

B.B.C.'s GSW in London admits "situation in Malaya very grave" with doubt expressed that Singapore can be held. "The thought of Japanese soldiers strutting down the streets of beautiful Kuala Lumpur is not pleasant. In the past two years we have, admittedly, been more concerned with the conduct of trade and commerce, losing sight of the need to defend the colony from an enemy power."

On our side of the once peaceful

Pacific and through G. E.'s powerful shortwave KGEI, San Francisco, this verbal blast titled "Japan Against Japan" was beamed to Nippon for consumption of island empire's inhabitants. "America has no quarrel with you, (Japanese people), but our fight is against your military leaders and your puppet Emperor Hirohito. We know this war, or that waged against China is not by your desire. We know you are unhappy when your fine Japanese young men march away to war, to return a few months, or perhaps only a few weeks later in the form of ashes in a sealed tin can—all that remains of a husband, father or sweetheart. Assert your independence by overthrowing these military leaders." Given first in English, the talk was repeated in Japanese immediately following the English rendering.

Latest broadcast from "Radio Tokyo" at column deadline carried the interesting information that 421 men from Guam, including Gov. Macmillan had just reached Tokyo for internment. "Relatives and friends need have no fear for safety and comfort of these men." "Radio Tokyo" will keep listeners advised of their welfare. Stated the prisoners from Wake Island will reach Tokyo in two or three days. Regarding fate of crew of sunken aircraft carriers Lexington and Langley, "Radio Tokyo" advised—"There were no survivors, vessels and crew were long since sent to the bottom of the sea, thanks to the Imperial Japanese Navy." No mention of activity in Philippine theatre of war during day.

In news of Malaya fighting, Tokyo charges that British forces retreating toward Singapore plan to sever water supply line between Johore and Singapore, thus cutting off 80% of Singapore's water supply, and then advise the world that the inhumane Japanese troops were responsible for this crime.

search for new music involves looking over three or four hundred musical scores each week.

Wallenstein's most recent discovery is Parker Watkins, a brawny unemployed Negro who was stopping crowds in one of New York's busy railroad terminals by singing Christmas carols and operatic arias. The colored tenor was granted a personal audition and chance to make good as a featured singer.

Mention "defense of music," and the twinkle in the maestro's hazel eyes fades to cloudiness. "Music doesn't need defending," he states, "and everybody is trying to defend it. If it's good it's going to stand up. If it isn't, it won't. But whether we like it or not, it's here. If it's to live it should be for the masses."

This great musical business man peers ahead, and in the higher taxation to be imposed on the wealthy, who up to now have supported the bulk of good music, he sees a probable limitation on further generous expenditures toward symphony upkeep. As a possible solution he envisions big-business sponsorship, by which an orchestra may be employed for so many services a week, as now, but in several capacities—in concert, ballet, or broadcast, with the proceeds from sponsored broadcasts going toward writing off the deficit.

In a 200-year-old house which he and Mrs. Wallenstein modernized themselves, the maestro relaxes in New Jersey. Asked if he raises cattle or turnips, Wallenstein laughed: "It's too expensive for me to take chances on crop failure, but our very close neighbors have sold out half our share in a fine looking steer and we have exactly 297 pounds of beef in cold storage when we get back east again."

You see he is a realist!

OKAY BY X-RAY:

Arrange alternate squares of veal and pork on small skewers, using about 4 veal and 3 pork pieces for each skewer. Roll in flour seasoned with salt and pepper. Sauté in 5 tbsps. of fat in heavy frying pan, turning to brown on all sides. Then cover and cook slowly ½ hour or until the meat is tender, turning frequently. Place them on platters and serve with brown gravy.

Recipe for Pork Sausage Neapolitan

- 1 lb. of pork sausage in bulk
- 2 tbsps. of Gravy Master, salt and pepper
- 4 slices of Wilson's Ol' Fashund Bacon
- 1 lb. and 12 oz. can of solid pack tomatoes
- 3 eggs
- 1 small onion

Soak in water 6 slices of day-old bread and squeeze well. Mix with 3 eggs, 1 lb. of pork sausage, ¼ tsp. of pepper, ½ tsp. of salt and 2 tbsps. of Gravy Master. When all is mixed, form into small cakes the size of a large walnut but flat. Then chop 4 slices of Wilson's Ol' Fashund Bacon, and put to melt in a thick frying pan. As soon as the bacon is melted, fry meat cakes until brown on both sides. When all the cakes are done, mince 1 small onion very fine, and sauté in the bacon to a golden color. Then open a 1 lb. and 12 oz. can of solid pack tomatoes and put to cook with the onion and the bacon. As soon as the tomatoes come to a boil, reduce heat to simmer, and let simmer for 1 hour. Then put meat cakes in and let cook in the sauce for 30 minutes. Finally, serve meat cakes with mashed potatoes covered with sauce.

If Mr. Allen had bothered to check all his facts he would have discovered that a very efficient staff of chemists inspects all vegetables before they reach the consumer. Too, agriculture inspectors keep a sharp eye in the fields. They do not allow harmful products to be marketed. But Mr. Allen evidently did not check all his facts.

If Mr. Allen had checked all his

facts he would have discovered that by uttering such a statement, true or false, he would necessarily disrupt the entire vegetable marketing situation in the West, put many men out of work and thoroughly sabotage the efforts of government nutritionists and dietitians in improving the diet of the average citizen. But Mr. Allen evidently didn't check all his facts.

I believe that such harum-scarum reporting of the news should constitute a crime. I believe that for the good of radio and for the good of the commentators themselves such violators of the public trust should be prosecuted. By broadcasting such truly dangerous and false statements a

person is as guilty as the bomb planting saboteur.

There goes my New Year's Resolution. I'm carrying a torch again. But this time I intend to use it to burn a couple of people who possibly need a little scorching.
