If the gentlemen from the tannery will move back by the open window we will now take up our sermon for today: "Hell Fire and Damnation."

After spinning the dial last Sunday night in search of some listenable music, I suddenly became aware of the fact that religion on Sunday nights is in command of the air lanes. Out of 16 stations which I tuned in my futile search for melody, I discovered 30% of them giving newscasts and another 60% featuring ministers and their Sunday sermons.

Now I hold no grudge against religious programs; I do in fact recommend them. Religion on the air is a vital and necessary part of radio's public service obligations. Radio should, and does, have a commendable percentage of religion on the air. This is as it should be. I do believe, however, that a big percentage of religious programs could be improved to meet the present-day standards of broadcasting. To paraphrase a saying by David Sarnoff, president of R. C. A., "When religion enters radio, it enters business."



A truth frequently in evidence in the broadcasting business is that people do not like to be 'preached at.' They do not want to be told to do things. You don't like it, and I don't like it. How much more effective is the subtle power of suggestion.

When a preacher goes on the air shouting of brimstone and hell-fire, his potential audience is immediately divided into two parts; one half agrees with him—the other half disagrees. The latter half, in disagreement, will tune him out. Therefore, one out of every possible two listeners is eliminated. This big audience that is immediately lost could easily be saved by a little showmanship.



When I found nothing to my liking last Sunday night, I decided to listen to one of our more melodramatic preachers of the air. In five minutes I was convinced that there was no hope left for me; that I was doomed to eternal stoking in the nether re-

Record Audience Looms

Radio began to tilt its nose optimistically and look forward to 1943 developing into the biggest listening year in 21 years as national surveys indicated last week that the rubber shortage (curtailed driving) and the ever-increasing possibility of frequent blackout tests would keep most entertainment seekers at the family hearth this spring, summer, fall and winter.

Despite the fact that U. S. has been in the war only four months and the tire ban in effect an even shorter time, attendance figures at movie houses and night clubs are off 10 to 20 per cent as compared with this time last year.

Both the tire and war factors figure to be reflected in soaring program rating figures by Hooper and C. A. B. (Crossley). Nighttime listening for February was rated at eight per cent over February of last year.

Broadcasting executives last week were plotting dynamic campaigns to awaken possible sponsors to the increased audiences to be available immediately. An influx of new advertisers to the airlines, due to such augmented listening groups, would probably more than offset cancellations due to priorities and wartime causes.

Allen's Stock Up

Fred Allen's withdrawal several weeks ago from the competing spot opposite Eddie Cantor on the Wednesday night broadcasting schedule to the Sunday night hour formerly occupied by the Ford Sunday Evening Hour began to pay Texaco (Fred's sponsor) dividends with the Crossley program rating report showing a 10 per cent gain for the Texaco Star Theatre.

While Allen was increasing his listening audience, Shirley Temple's 'Junior Miss' shows were credited with an initial program rating of 'practically twice as good' as the average rating of new programs, according to Cooperative Analysis of Broadcasting.

Both Cantor's 'Time to Smile' and 'Mr. District Attorney,' the two programs formerly opposing Allen on the Wednesday schedule, also showed increased audience gains. KNX, 6 p.m. Sun.

esting announcements are slated to come out of these meetings in relation to the Kyser hour-long 'Musical Knowledge' on NBC.

There is some speculation already that the format of the Kyser broadcast may be revamped, although there is much indication, too, that Kay will continue on in the same style of program for at least another year.

Kay, who loves the army and navy boys so much that he wants to do more for them than is physically possible for any individual, is almost certain to be voted down by Hill on the subject of visits to out-of-the-way camps even though Kyser wants to bear the major portion of the expense involved.

The North Carolina pride is due back in Hollywood no later than June 1, and his original plan of visiting at

least 50 camps appears now to be out of the question as far as practicability is concerned. KFI, 7 p.m. Wed.

Salute From South

NBC and BLUE have announced an imposing array of top-ranking programs (currently being aired out of Hollywood's Radio City) which will travel to San Francisco the week of April 26 to May 3 to help dedicate the official opening of NBC's new broadcasting center.

Jack Benny will have the honor of being the first to broadcast out of the new, modernized building on Sunday, April 26, at 4 p.m. Later in the day 'One Man's Family' (first heard from Bay City 10 years ago) will present its program from the new studios.

Other network features being sent

to San Francisco for origination include the following NBCcasts: Hawthorne House, Burns and Allen, Point Sublime, Al Pearce, Whodunit, and The Great Gildersleeve. Blue Network is to contribute: Tune Out Time with Benny Walker, big 'Frisco favorite from Woman's Magazine of the Air cast pinch-hitting for the regular emcee, Willard (Doc) Hall, and a revival of Carefree Carnival which gave such current stars as Meredith Willson, Gogo DeLys and others their initial radio opportunities.

Janssen's Fast Pace

'We will concentrate strongly on playing music for the lover of melodies, for the housewife, for the gas station attendant, for the young schoolboy, for the concerto enthusiasts, and for the men in the service.'

Those were carefully phrased thoughts by Werner Janssen, one of the Southland's favorite conductors, who last Thursday evening over KHJ inaugurated a 13-week series of Standard Symphony Hour programs.

'This is a new approach as far as I am concerned,' declared Janssen, 'and with an accent on the classics and an ear to the future we will be playing music for everyone—for the masses.'

Janssen ascended the Standard Symphony podium last week with a sincere, earnest desire to really contribute something to the air this season. His program, which highlighted among others such selections as 'In Old Virginia' (Overture by John Powell), 'Adagio from Symphony in C Major' (Bizet), and Debussy's 'The Enchanted Cathedral' was well paced, possessed a moving warmth of action and his aggregation of 50 of the West Coast's outstanding musicians respond beautifully to his baton.

KHJ's New Feature

Novel radio news service provided to stations by Associated Press—furnishing not only regular news items but specially prepared feature scripts written for air presentation—has been installed at KHJ, according to Van C. Newkirk, director of Don Lee program operations.

KHJ's subscribing to this new feature, designed to enable staff announcers to present programs on specialized features, is interesting in that KHJ was the first station on the West Coast to buy Associated Press' news service wire when it first was offered to radio years ago.

Wallichs Sets Deal

Radio Life learned exclusively last weekend that Glenn Wallichs, owner of Hollywood's Music City and partner in new record company with Buddy De Sylva, Paramount film producer, and songwriter Johnny Mercer, has ironed out problems on materials required to produce phonograph recordings for his new concern, Liberty Records, and will proceed directly to

Liberty Records plans to record most of its platters in Hollywood with master pressings being made in the east.

First sides made by the new company were recorded last week in Hollywood with part-owner Johnny Mercer, one of top tunesmiths in the nation, recording two sides with a 9-piece instrumental combine and mixed vocal group, and Martha Tilton doing two vocal sides.

Fisher's 10th Year

George Fisher, the only Hollywood commentator Walter Winchell ever thought highly enough of to have him pinch hit on the Jergens Journal during his (W.W.) absence, celebrated his 10th year as a reporter on the flicker factories last week (April 12) and spent a major portion of his quarter-hour over Mutual-KHJ for Mar-O-Oil recalling his first programs about Hollywood personalities.

He recalled that the only person to take exception to his initial broadcast in April, 1932, was Mary Pickford, whose attorney threatened Fisher with a \$100,000 libel suit for stating that she was going to marry Buddy Rogers. The suit was dropped a few weeks later when she and the young actor-bandleader walked the middle aisle. (Widespread publicity that the suit aroused gained for Fisher an immediate audience). George also mentioned during his aerial trek down memory lane that he wanted to repeat a statement he had made often before: i.e. that Hollywood Whispers reports the

human side of Hollywood, it wants to help newcomers, be kind to oldtimers, leave the bad to other gossipers, and report the good to the radio audience.

Commentator Fisher concluded his anniversary broadcast over a transcontinental MBS wire that most of the radio and movie stars don't want deferment in the current conflict. Said he:

'I believe that General Hershey, in referring to Hollywood as a vital industry and offering possible exemption to filmdom, had in mind a few directors, producers and technical experts whose knowledge and ability and money can supply the nation's basic needs as far as entertainment, propaganda and educational pictures are concerned.

'There is no loafing in Hollywood—no requests for deferment. Hollywood is working overtime to do its vital part to make America swiftly victorious. Hollywood is playing its role with deadly earnestness and for but one purpose—to win the war!'

'Storm' Gets Award

'Against the Storm,' Sandra Michael's daytime drama which was given its first airing via NBC in October of 1939, has been voted the First Award for Drama by the Peabody Committee (Pulitzer Committee of Radio) in New York.

'Against the Storm' has won for itself during two years on the air an enviable reputation for unusual treatment. Not only has the dramatic series appealed to a popular audience but it has won praise for its literary attributes.

Action of the play, which is laid against an imaginary college campus, has given the author an opportunity to present as 'guest lecturers' some of America's and England's foremost poets. Edgar Lee Masters, beloved author of the Spoon River Anthology, and John Masefield, Britain's poet laureate who was 'cut in' by short-wave from London recently, have been heard in the series.

Edna Fischer's Hit

One Man's Family liked it. Their listeners liked it. Now it's on its way to become a best seller.

That is the brief history of Edna Fischer's new song, 'My Great-Great-Great-Grandfather,' which was introduced on NBC's One Man's Family March 22 over KFI.

When Edna Fischer completed 'My Great-Great-Great-Grandfather,' author Carlton E. Morse of One Man's



Family arranged to introduce the tune on his Sunday evening show. In the first of three 'plugs,' Miss Fischer was portrayed singing and playing her song to the Barbour family. On the following week, Dorothy Cordray, NBC starlet, sang a special arrangement of the tune, and on the third Sunday Claudia was heard singing the song to the children.

Just three hearings catapulted 'My Great-Great-Great-Great-Grandfather' into national favor. More than 65,000 orders have been received to date. Miss Fischer's song is published by Tele-Muse Publishing Company and sponsored by Paul Whiteman.

Phil Goes Dramatic

The news that Phil Harris, one of radio's most popular orchestra leaders whose career has assumed increasing importance since his weekly appearances on the Jack Benny show began, is to lay down his baton in favor of a straight acting role on the 'Stars Over Hollywood' broadcast (April 18) is interesting for several reasons.

1) Phil has long nursed a secret desire to do some real acting, and the 'deep south' man-about-town role which Producer Paul Pierce and Author Paul West have written for his CBS-KNX appearance is ideally suited for the Harris technique.

2) There are several new radio ideas being prepared for national sponsors that require a triple-threat romantic guy in the top-line role. Harris' singing voice and directing ability are well known, and if he can handle straight dramatic lines as well as the comedy lines he does on the Benny show he might be in line for one of these new shows, although it is questionable whether he would leave the Benny series.

Dix Davis Scores

Little Dix Davis, young actor who played the role of 'Belly Laugh Barton' on the Jack Benny show before Ransom Sherman grabbed him to portray 'Stanley the Bellhop' on 'Crestfallen Manor' Wednesday nights, has developed a trigger wit while appearing on the Sherman airshow.

Dix was posing for pictures with his boss, Ransom, the other day at Columbia Square when someone suggested that the comedian be shown loading a big bull fiddle on Dix's back which would give the photographer something a little 'different.'

Set against a Western backdrop and written and produced by Myron Dutton, 'The Call of the West' will high-

light in supporting roles to Rogers such Republic movie players as Sally Payne, red-headed comedienne who recently scored heavily in 'Your Blind Date'; Gabby Hayes, Western comic; Bob Nolan and the Sons of the Pioneers, famous cowboy singing combine; and an orchestra under the baton of Marlin Skyles, former arranger for Robert Armbruster's band. **KECA, 6 p.m. Sat.**

Fidler's New Honor

This is the time of year when some Hollywood radio personality is invited to Okemah, Okla., to be guest of honor at the annual '89ers celebration in the small Oklahoma town.

In 1940 Gene Autry was made an honorary chief of the Pawnee Tribe of Indians at Okemah, and last year Don Wilson was the big-shot of the two-day festival.

This year Jimmie Fidler, the BLUE Network chatterbox, gets the feathers tossed at him, and has made plans to airplane out of Hollywood on April 20th in order to be on hand in time for the ceremonies which include the tribal head-dress, a two day stay at the Governor's mansion, and a broadcast over an Oklahoma network in which he will interview Governor Phillips—said to be the first time the famed film commentator has ever interviewed the chief executive of a state. **KECA, KFSD, 7:30 p.m. Mon.**

GIVE US MORE *Glenn Millers!*

Reporter Meets King of Swing; Finds Him To Be Solid Citizen

ACCORDING to the Radio Life office of facts and figures, Glenn Miller, current idol of the young dancing America, is well on the road to being one of the wealthiest musicians ever to slide a gold-plated trombone.

He and his orchestra grossed a cool \$100,000 in dance engagements alone in 1941; for three 15-minute Moonlight Serenades for Chesterfield each week his check is \$5,500; his acting contract at 20th Century-Fox calls for \$100,000 per picture; his coin for three weeks' work at the Palladium ballroom in Hollywood last year counted out to \$22,900; he makes 60 phonograph records a year at \$1,000 per record, plus a handsome percentage; and his share of the box-office receipts recently at the Fox Theatre in Detroit totaled \$23,000 for a personal appearance that lasted seven days.

You say, that's enough gold to spoil any young man? Well, that's what your Radio Life reporter said to himself en route the other afternoon to the Great Glenn's dressing room in CBS's Vine Street Radio Playhouse.

Those are thoughts which run through your mind before you meet Glenn Miller. Because once you shake hands with this jitter-gent you're a little too amazed with the unassuming, completely natural guy in front of you to think about the money angle.

Our interview was arranged by Barney McDevitt, a handsome Irishman who beats the publicity drums for the Hollywood Palladium where Miller last year set an all-time box-office record, and who looks after Glenn's press relations whenever the swingsational Miller is in town.

Miller was sitting down in the Playhouse dressing room when Barney and yours truly bounced in at 6:15 p. m. on a Wednesday. While Barney pitched the introductions a long-legged, broad-shouldered bespectacled young man of about 33 summers unraveled himself and got up from

a settee on which he was relaxing.

It was the Great Glenn Miller—in person!

The first thing that strikes you when Miller sits down beside you is that he doesn't begin any 'trumped up' conversation to make you feel at home. He doesn't have to. You're already at ease because the guy is so natural, so much at ease himself that there's no sparring around for an opening.

Seated around Glenn in the dressing room when I came in was John O'Leary, Miller's manager, a producer, and several members of the band. The conversation that had been going on picked up after the introductions were taken care of and I began to feel just like one of the family.

Glenn has been pictured as somebody who'd answer to the salutation, 'Glum Glenn,' but that must have been three years ago before Glenn formed his own orchestra after arranging and playing for everybody else's crew but his own. Now he gives out with a million-dollar smile to match his bankroll. And he's as easy to talk to as your milkman.

Informality was the keynote of our entire 20 minute session together. Glenn was wearing a natural toned single breasted corduroy jacket, brown slacks, a light tan sport shirt and brown leather shoes with a strap buckle.

Every member of the band dresses informally, with the exception of Marion Hutton, the blonde-tressed songstress who always appears before the mike in evening dresses.

'Nobody in the band even owns a tuxedo any more,' said Glenn, 'at least not to my knowledge.'

Oddly enough, however, Glenn's new home out Monrovia-Duarte way in the San Gabriel Valley is called 'Tuxedo Junction,' named after one of the best-selling Miller recordings.

During weekends off from his professional duties, Glenn hurries, with his wife Helen, out to the ranch where he is busy building a white fence. During the week Glenn and his missus (whom he refers to as 'mom') stay out in Beverly Hills in order to be near the broadcasting studios and film sets.

Glenn is entirely devoid of the sleekness, suave manner and big-

shot attitude one used to associate with orchestra leaders—especially those who cater to the dancing public.

His hair is cut just like yours and mine, he wears his glasses at all times (he says nobody would recognize him if he didn't wear his specs), and the only jewelry he was wearing the day we met was a gold Cartier pocket watch which he brought out when I asked him if he wore a timepiece.

'Mom gave me this,' was Glenn's explanation as he opened the back cover of the watch to reveal the inscription: 'To Glenn . . . with love . . . from Helen.'

'Mom' stays pretty much in the background and very little is known about her. However, one of the Modernaires did admit that all the boys in the band nurse secret crushes on the cute, tiny little girl whom Glenn first spied while both were undergraduates at University of Colorado.

Glenn and I didn't talk about habits although someone in the room mentioned that here was one performer who really stood behind his sponsor's product, meaning Glenn indulges in Chesterfields when he isn't too busy thinking about a broadcast. He swears a little and is one of the most exacting bandmen in the business. Every musician in the Miller orchestra knows he has to deliver, and behind Glenn's tantalizing, often torrid trombone, they deliver the rhythm solid and in the groove.

When Don Wilson, the Jell-O announcer who's handling the Chesterfield commercials while Glenn is on the coast, arrived to go over the dialogue for the stage, Glenn put out his friendly paw and said simply and sincerely:

'Why don't you drop in on us again? We're doing our show here once a week and twice over at Columbia Square, and you're welcome anytime.' And with that, he grabbed his horn and slowly walked onstage to say hello to the kids who have accepted him as their favorite Pied Piper.

That was my first close-up of the Great Glenn Miller.

And all I could think of as I sauntered down Vine street was 'give us more Glenn Millers!'

My Advice To

YOUNG SINGERS

by BING CROSBY



Bing Crosby—the famous singer turns author for a day.

ANY VIEWS I might express about singing on the air are my views concerning popular singing only. I don't know any other kind.

My advice to an ambitious youngster is, don't waste your time thinking about a singing career if you haven't an ear for music. You'll never get any place without it.

If you have an ear for music and like to sing, go to a reputable teacher. If it's his or her opinion that you should continue, go on further.

Avoid confusion. If you want to be a popular singer, don't go to an operatic teacher.

Get yourself a selection of records by popular artists. Play them frequently and listen to them. See how they sing their songs.

If you can't afford records, listen to the radio. That's within the reach of anyone's pocketbook.

When you sing, think about the words of a song. This is important. Sing as naturally as you can. Don't worry too much about tone control, and breath control. Too much vocal control of any kind makes you sound unnatural. Sing in a natural posture without facial contortions.

In a nutshell, be natural. Be yourself. You'll never get anywhere imitating anybody else. Everybody is an individual and everybody has a personality, even if it's hidden. You'll develop your personality by expressing it.

Singing for radio is a question of mechanics. So is singing in a music hall (I don't mean our Kraft kind). Teaching you to sing for radio is more

of a job for a radio engineer than a voice teacher. Don't worry too much about radio technique at first. Learn to sing like yourself. That's the foundation. You can specialize later.

of a job for a radio engineer than a voice teacher. Don't worry too much about radio technique at first. Learn to sing like yourself. That's the foundation. You can specialize later.

If you want to sing on the radio, don't try to start at the top on a big network program. Nowadays, almost every town and city has a radio station. Go to your radio station. If you can't actually go on the air, watch and listen. But don't make a pest of yourself.

If you can't get on the station, or if your town doesn't have one, it's sure to have a place where you can make records of your own voice. For a nominal sum you can get an idea of how you sound on the mike and how you're improving. Nobody else will have to tell you how you sound. It's a break to be able to hear yourself.

Concert or music hall singing is also a matter of mechanics. It's a question of volume and voice projection. You stand up and aim at the back row. I can't honestly tell you any more about it. I never sang in any music hall other than my radio show. Handle each situation separately when you get to it. Don't anticipate problems of specialization until you get to them. I say again, learn to sing first. That's the basic thing.

Go to school if you can, learn languages. It will help you phrase foreign words in songs later on. Learn Italian, Spanish, or any other foreign language, or learn more than one. Education never hurt anyone. Don't let anyone tell you it's a waste of time.

Try to determine in your own mind what you want to be. Don't study for

feature, 'Hobby Lobby,' from hundreds of letters written by Radio Life readers here in the southland, Bixby is the winner of a free trip to New York with all expenses paid, as the guest of the Colgate - Palmolive - Peet Company (sponsors of Hobby Lobby). Bixby boards a crack Streamliner in Los Angeles April 18 for his trip to New York where he will enjoy the sights and make a personal appearance on the 'Hobby Lobby' broadcast of April 25.

Bixby will take with him on the train a 48-inch model of the battleship Oregon, one of his 12-boat

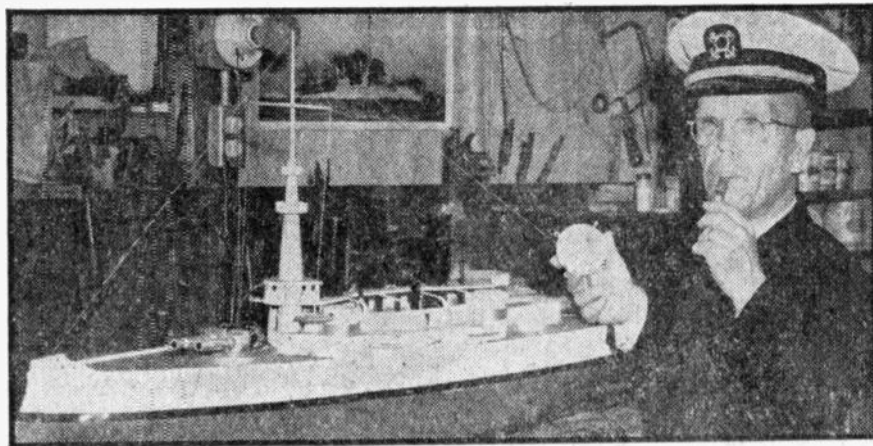
miniature navy which he has built as a hobby during the past 10 years.

All of Bixby's model boats, built on a scale of three-sixteenths of an inch to a foot, are equipped with electric motors and can be controlled from shore by Bixby as far as two miles away. He also can successfully operate the movements of the ships by flipping an ordinary telephone dial connected with a portable five-meter radio transmitter. Each number on the dial can be flipped for an individual movement on the part of the ships. On a lake at night, Bixby can control the actions of his 10-foot, 350-pound U. S. S. California model by flashing a searchlight from the shore across a photo-electric cell on the model. By sending out various numbers of

flashes Bixby can start, stop, steer, back up or fire her guns.

When Radio Life paid the Hobby Lobby contest winner a visit at his Glendale home last weekend, we found a middle-aged, energetic man who has spent approximately 5,000 working hours on his amazing hobby during the past decade.

In Bixby's workshop, located in the backyard of one of Glendale's oldest and most charming homes which he purchased for his family (Mrs. Bixby, two daughters and a son) six years ago, we witnessed a rare sight.

On all sides and in all corners of the workshop—a sign over the door calls it the 'U. S. Navy Yard'—we saw model ships of Bixby's miniature fleet. There, in one corner, lay the model of the famous Merrimac, first American armored warship, and its iron-clad Civil War conqueror, the battle-scarred Monitor. And above them, a 43-inch model of the battleship Oregon, recently damaged at Pearl Harbor; the six-foot model battleship Kentucky of 1900; the U. S. S. California; the frigate Constitution, Old Ironsides, of 1797, and other seaworthy craft including the submarine, U. S. S. Kearsage, and a partly-completed model of the most modern of battleships, the U. S. S. Saratoga.

Bixby could easily be called a 'streamlined hobbyist' for despite the fact that he began his hobby years ago he continues to be a keen student of things nautical and has succeeded in keeping in tune with every new development in the ever-changing mode of naval warfare.

Asked when he first thought of model ships as a hobby, Bixby said: 'As a student at Los Angeles Polytechnic high school 32 years ago I stood atop the San Pedro hills along with 100,000 other persons and watched the U. S. Navy, then painted white and called The White Squadron, steam in to the harbor on a round-the-world

FOREWORD:

Cooking, they tell us, is traditional. Something that always is handed down from mother to daughter along with the family heirlooms and relatives. Despite the traditional system, there are still some cooks in the making who are hitting culinary snags. So we dedicate this article to those cooks and their difficulties. Or, if you like, regard it as an April cooking school for June brides.

DEBUT WITH FISH:

If you're learning to cook, you may as well make up your mind that one day you will have to fry fish. Naturally, if you've ever been around when they fry fish in the open air—on the bank of the river where they were caught maybe—you know how good it smells when it's frying, and how it goes right on smelling up the pan afterwards.

Then step number one in our lesson on how to fry fish is how to do away with the smell. Incidentally, this is also a good way to cook them. Get your butcher to give you several large pieces of brown wrapping paper. Cut each piece in an oval shape and oil it thoroughly on both sides until it's limp. Now fold it down the middle and tuck your fish in. When you're sure he is comfy with all the trimmings like salt and pepper, crimp and roll the edges of the oiled paper until you have a neat little package.

Now comes the important part. You can discard the frying pan, because the fish is going in the oven. By the way, it ought to be a moderate oven. Just place the fish on the rack and leave it there for about half an hour. If you think the paper is burning, just pull out the rack, and add a little extra oil to the package. About half way through you turn over the fish and that will give you a chance to oil the under side.

At the end of thirty minutes you have a fish that would please the most discriminating gourmet. Open up the package and slide the fish on to a hot plate. The skin will come off with the paper and you have the delicate white meat all ready for eating.

THE CABBAGE:

To the French it's a term of endearment; to the English, it's two of their three vegetables; and to the

American, it's the side kick of corned beef. That should settle the question of the cabbage, but apparently it doesn't. There are still people who turn up their noses when the cabbage is passed, or if they are forced to include it in their menu, do so with an I-am-a-martyr air that is sure to lead to indigestion.

Here's a simple "what-to-do-with" cabbage recipe that we think will ease the situation. Steam your cabbage and douse it with butter, salt and pepper just before serving. What could be simpler?

If you insist on serving it with corned beef, be sure to start your beef in cold water and keep it at a gentle simmer during the entire per-

iod of cooking. Skim off the fat at least twice while it is boiling. During this time the cabbage should be sliced across the bottom to cut loose the first layer of leaves. Then quarter it, and half an hour before the beef is done, toss it in to keep the meat company. English mustard or chopped onion make a good relish.

Note: This is Dinty Moore's own version and guaranteed to please!

Recipes of the Week

Dollar Dinner for Four

Red Rock Fish a la Marinara
New Potatoes
Boiled Cabbage Salad with Oil and Lemon Dressing
Bread and Butter
Coffee
And Grapefruit for Dessert

Recipe for Red Rock Fish a la Marinara

2 lbs. red rock fish
1 lb. 12 oz. can solid pack tomatoes
1½ tsp. salt, ¼ tsp. pepper, 2 tssps. Gravy Master
Pinch of thyme or oregano
6 tbsps. oil

Wash in some salted water 2 lbs. of Red Rock fish, then wipe the slices with a damp cloth, and place the slices in a large baking pan. Open a large can of solid pack tomatoes, 1 lb. and 12 oz., and empty into a bowl and mash the tomatoes to a pulp. Season the tomatoes with 1½ tsp. salt, ¼ tsp. pepper, 2 tssps. Gravy Master, and a pinch of thyme or oregano. Now mix all this well so as to have a nice blend, and pour the mixture over the fish. Then pour 6 tbsps. oil over the surface, and put to bake in an oven of 325 degrees for 45 minutes. While the fish is baking, boil in a separate pot 1 lb. new potatoes until tender. When the potatoes are done, drain, peel and serve with the Red Rock Fish.

Put 6 tbsps. of olive oil in a saucepan and, when hot, add 2 spring chickens, 3½ lbs. each, which have been disjointed, washed and dried, and cook them to a golden brown on all sides. Sprinkle 4 tbsps. of flour on the joints, and stir well until the flour gets brown. Add 1 can solid pack tomatoes, 1 lb. and 12 oz., and ½ cup of white wine (sherry), ½ lb. fresh mushroom buttons, which previously have been browned in butter, and season with 3 tbsps. of Gravy Master, 2½ tssps. salt and ½ tsp. pepper. Simmer for 1½ hours. When done place the joints on a large hot platter, pour the sauce over and garnish with mushroom buttons. Sprinkle some chopped parsley over the top and serve.

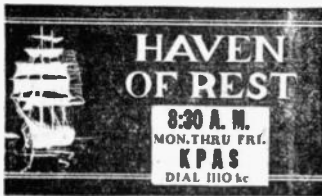

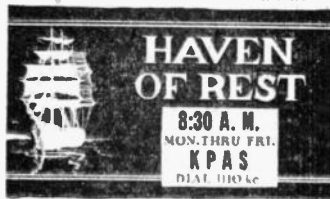

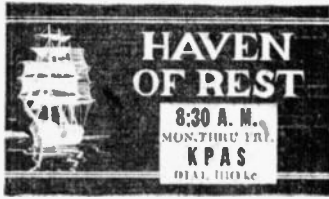
