'Something New Added'

Biggest program news of the radio week spotlighted Nelson Eddy as the New Old Gold people continued to live up to their widely-used slogan, "Something New Has Been Added."

Not content with moving the locale of its half-hour (from the BLUE to CBS), New Old Gold 'cleaned house' as far as its format and cast were concerned by (1) failing to renew the contracts of Herbert Marshall, Bert Wheeler, Hank Ladd, Lucille Ball and the Merry Macs and (2) exchanging signatures with the robust baritone, Eddy, who stars in the new series.

Eddy's last regular air appearances were on the Chase & Sanborn broadcasts with Messrs. Bergen and McCarthy via NBC. The baritone's singing and acting chores on that program brought him a weekly pay check of \$6,000. Just what his golden tones will bring him in the way of monetary remuneration on the New Old Gold has not been disclosed.

The triple-threat (film, radio and concert stage) artist's return to the Columbia airmiles is interesting in the fact that he made his radio debut on CBS airwaves back in 1922 as a 'singing reporter' on a Sunday program over WABC-Columbia in New York. In those days Eddy tolled during the week as a reporter on the copy desk of a Manhattan newspaper, attracting the attention and admiration of David Bispham, a leading baritone of the day, who contributed lessons whenever the young reporter could get away from his newspaper duties long enough to exercise his vocal chords.

Eddy, who aired the first show of his new series last Wednesday (April 29) from Columbia Square (too late for Radio Life to review), is being accompanied by Robert Armbruster's orchestra. Eddy signed the contract with the understanding that he could select the orchestra for the program. Armbruster will be remembered for his conducting on the Bergen-McCarthy opus when the singer was a fixture on that show.

Roberts' Crusade

Can we be decent in fighting this war?

Can we observe certain moral standards and still achieve victory against our ruthless foe?

Clete Roberts, Hollywood BLUE Network commentator, posed these questions Wednesday night, April 22, over KECA in a quarter-hour commentary which he devoted to a discussion of comedy show war gags which are

currently circulating and which, according to Roberts' opinion, are in "very bad taste."

Roberts, who has a flair for pointing his nightly comments at 9:15 p.m. to the man-in-the-street and the woman-in-the-kitchen, began his "Clete Roberts Reports" in this manner:

"... I heard one of the worst bits of bad taste the show business has ever thrust upon the American public last night. A comic variety show was going through a nonsensical routine about victory gardens. There was much talk about digging and planting. Whereupon the star of the show mentioned that the Japanese in Tokyo were doing quite a lot of digging. Digging? inquired his lady stooge. What are they planting? Each other, returned the star of the show with a giggle just this side of insanity."

From that point the BLUE commentator, who also heads the network's special events division on the West Coast, launched a verbal lambasting of such comedy gags as the above,

insisting that in his opinion "a good sport never laughs at a beaten foe" ... "a good American will never taunt those who are dying because some warlord has given the orders which mean death whatever is done" ... "such gags are the forerunner of fascism whether they mean to be or not" ... "Capt. Colin Kelly didn't die to make the world safe for a bad tasting joke" ... "Lieut. Comdr. O'Hare didn't go beyond the call of duty in shooting down six Jap war-planes so that a gag man could earn his bread and butter by cudgeling his brain to give birth to a cruel crack."

Saying that he had never, during the course of his BLUE Network broadcasts, asked to hear directly from his listeners, Roberts asked for comments. "I want you to decide whether you want savagery or decency in the post war world. I want to know if you feel that we must be as cruel and bloodthirsty as those axis members whom we denounce for just that sort of thing."

Roberts, in concluding his tirade

against "bad taste," admitted that he had placed unreasonable emphasis on a joke undoubtedly coined in all harmlessness and in all innocence, but declared he had done it to get his point across—that we do not have to lower ourselves to the standards of our enemies in order to win this war.

Apparently from the telephone calls which blacked out KECA's switchboard immediately after the broadcast, Roberts got his point over. The man-in-the-street and the woman-in-the-kitchen were on the phone to tell Roberts personally what they thought of the whole idea. Of the first 10 calls the commentator answered personally, only one disagreed with his views, saying, "I want to compliment you on a fine job you've done to tear down the type of program which is doing such an excellent job to build up morale."

Radio Life's editor, sensing a "news-story in the making" while listening to Roberts from a radio in Hollywood, hurried to the BLUE Network news room to interview the commentator and listen to some of the telephone calls which came through.

The telephoned comments went like this . . .

"My name is Jack Martin. I'm leaving for the San Diego Naval Base tomorrow. All I can say is God bless you."

"I am a Czechoslovak. My mother was killed in the invasion of our country. I still feel we should not gloat over the deaths. It is the war lord not the people responsible."

"I have been in vaudeville 30 years . . . as a straight man . . . and you certainly give it to 'em straight."

"I was favorably impressed with your ideas expressed in the script tonight. I should like copies of the script to reprint in the Christian Science Monitor."

Most of the telephone-inners wanted to know what program Roberts had referred to in his mention of the "spring planting" joke, but each time he was asked Roberts refused to divulge the name of the comedian on the grounds that the joke used was merely an example and that his comments were not directed against the comedian, but rather the principle of the thing.

Radio Silence Order

In line with new order issued last week by Richard F. Connor, coordinator of Southern California Broadcasters Association, radio stations hereafter will refer to their leaving the air on orders of the Fourth Interceptor Command as 'radio silence' instead of 'radio blackout.'

In advising the member stations of the order, Connor declared that the change in announcement was made because of confusion in the public mind over the use of 'blackout' when only a silencing order has been issued. Connor stated that silencing of radio by the Command does not necessarily mean that a general blackout will follow.

Baukhage Wins Favor

As the days roll by, radio's newscasters from California to Maine become increasingly important on the world scene. One of the lesser-publicized personalities who air their comments on the moving war picture via the networks to a huge local listening audience, is Baukhage, who is heard from Washington, D. C. Mondays through Fridays in the morning hours.

Baukhage, a soldier and newspaperman in World War I, and judging from his broadcasts, one of the most sincere and honest observers of the current war developments, shuttled up into Ottawa, Canada, last week for a series of on-the-spot BLUE Network broadcasts in which he told of the growing strength of Canada's production machinery and of the spirited views of Canadians for an immediate offensive against axis powers.

In Radio Life's recent interviews with the man-on-the-street and the woman-in-the-kitchen, Baukhage appears to have won a wide following through

his factual and unbiased summaries of world events rather than on the basis of personal views.

A native of LaSalle, Ill., Baukhage (his full name is Hilmar Robert Baukhage) holds a Ph. D. from the University of Chicago. Educated both here and abroad, he followed the Nazi invasion of Poland from Berlin, where he witnessed Hitler's historic speech to the Reichstag in which he announced the launching of the conflict.

According to the latest Hooper 'program rating' survey on West Coast, the newscasts are still topping all daytime programs with Norman Nesbitt's noon-day news for the Broadway over KHJ lording it over all others heard locally between 8 a. m. and 5:30 p. m. Nesbitt's mid-day newscast has a rating of 7.6.

New Lease On Life

In West Coast radio last week there was a striking evidence of the faith and respect Warden Clinton E. Duffy has gained for his San Quentin Prison rehabilitation program during recent airings of the 'San Quentin on the Air' broadcast.

No sooner had the prison broadcast been discontinued (April 16) due to the fact that a majority of the inmates who appeared on the show were scheduled for parole than KFRC, San Francisco Don Lee network station, revealed that it had signed one of the inmate broadcasters to a staff contract.

Tall, thin, boyish-appearing for his 37 years, Ralph Burr—known to thousands of listeners as 'Inmate 65-768' and master of ceremonies of the San Quentin airshow—was the paroled inmate given a new lease on life with the San Francisco station.

Burr, an Oakland boy who won considerable success as an actor, artist and advertising illustrator prior to his prison term, was responsible for the written scripts on the prison broadcasts and the general supervision of the program.

KHJ's Wartime Note

Inaugurating a wartime innovation that may well be copied on other stations, KHJ is now signing off at midnight Sunday nights with these words:

"We are signing off now, to return to the air at 6 a. m.—6 hours closer to Victory!"

Vox Pop's 10th

'Vox Pop,' one of radio's first quiz-the-people programs, swung excitingly into its 10th year with Parks Johnson as its man-with-the-mike last Monday with an on-the-spot CBS aircast from the historic grounds of South Carolina's century-old state military college, The Citadel.

The April 20th edition of 'Vox Pop' was the fourth broadcast of Johnson's new series which is featuring guest personalities as co-interviewers. Parks had the skill of one Neil O'Malley, Broadway actor, radio announcer, ad-lib expert and World War I veteran of the Marine Corps, as his aide de microphone.

This is the same show for which Gary Breckner, local favorite in man-on-the-street stunts, airplaned east to West Point several weeks ago. Wally Butterworth has left the program after his long-time association with Johnson, and while the show lacks the smoothness and intimacy which highlighted it when Johnson and Butterworth were working as a team it began to listen like itself against last week.

Wheeling's 'Refresher'

One of the truly refreshing, yet rarely heralded, features of every radio week is Wheeling Steel's 'Musical Steelmakers' airtalante to the nation via BLUE each Sabbath at 2:30 p.m.

Last Sunday the Wheeling Steel program, talent of which is made up of actual workers and members of their families who are employed in Wheeling Steel's Steubenville, Ohio, plant, spotlighted an amazingly talented young pianist—Andrew Sopko, Jr., 12-year-old son of an open hearth steel furnace worker at the Ohio plant.

The young pianist displayed unusual ability in a piano solo, 'Valse in E Flat,' which gave Sopko a chance to reveal an inspired right hand on the keyboard as well as a well-rounded knowledge of piano dynamics.

The Wheeling Steel program featured an orchestra and chorus that hit every musical note on the head, and a trio called the Steel Sisters who rendered an arrangement of the current revival of a former hitune, 'Miss You,' that literally caressed the ears of Radio Life's reviewer.

Brunette-tressed singer, who eases the tired feeling Radio Life's editor has been experiencing from listening to Eddie Cantor's recent broadcasts as well as doing her own commercial on the BLUE Friday nights, is to be featured, not starred (at her own request), in a forthcoming Bob Hope-Dorothy Lamour film being produced by Sam Goldwyn.

While on the coast here for her initial movie assignment, Miss Shore will continue her own airshow from the BLUE Network's Hollywood studios in Radio City, although the Can-

tor program is due to fold for the summer season with 'Those We Love,' starring Nan Grey, filling in from Hollywood.

It is understood that the songstress has won her point in a recent battle with her sponsor (Bristol-Myers) which wanted to switch Dinah's commercials (currently: Sal Hepatica, a laxative, and Minit-Rub) to a deodorant (Mum). Miss Shore opposed the shift of product to a deodorant on the ground that the proposed association would be unbecoming for a femme artist. She also is reported to have been very unhappy from the first that her program, which she began last fall, plugs a laxative. KECA, 6:30 p.m. Fri.

O'Connor Dies

West Coast radio was saddened last week by the belated news that Charles O'Connor, 30, announcer for the past five years on the 'Call for Philip Morris' network series, had died suddenly on March 17.

O'Connor, who earned himself a tremendous listening audience through developing a highly individual style of drawling informality in reading commercials on the Philip Morris show, is survived by his wife and a five-year-old son.

The versatile young announcer, who left the cigarette program last fall to free-lance, never used the commercial announcing style that he introduced on the Morris program and which became a trademark for commercials on that show. He joined NBC in 1931 at the age of 20, the youngest announcer ever hired by the network.

BLUE Holds 'Basin St.'

According to reports from New York, the BLUE would have been forced to surrender the 'Basin' program to NBC under the terms of the contract offered Philip Carlin, BLUE vice-prexy. The musicians thought it was a great gag and began to wisecrack about it until they were told to pipe down. 'You're in the Navy now,' said one of the officers. Not until the musicians realized they were being mistaken for a busload of new recruits did they explain who they were.

A newly inducted draftee at Camp Roberts recently asked Hope if he could say something on the air to patch up things with his sweetheart back east who had broken off their engagement and returned his ring.

BOB HOPE, the ski-jump-nosed comedian who does as much to entertain the men under arms as any other man in America, has a new name for army and navy camps.

Bob, who it is rumored, brushes his teeth three times a day with Pepsodent, calls the army and navy camps a radio comedian's Shangri-La.

The NBC comic, who broadcasts from military posts so often he makes news when he goes on the air from Hollywood's Radio City, coined the phrase at March Field, the Riverside air force base.

The commanding colonel had just finished a pretty speech thanking Bobe for helping build the fliers' morale.

'What do you mean, helping their morale?' quizzed Hope. 'You ought to see what they're doing to mine! These army camps are a comedian's Shangri-La!'

For Hope's military adventures have

been as funny as his broadcasts.

At Camp Haan, the soldier audience proved so appreciative and enthusiastic that they were literally 'stopping' the show after every gag. Hope finally had to ask the boys to use a little restraint.

'It's the first time I have ever known a comedian to ask his audience not to laugh at his gags,' said Bob. Now he makes the same request before every camp audience. 'Not that my gags are so good,' explained Bob, 'but the soldiers are so grateful for a show they want to make sure they're showing proper appreciation.'

General — (censored!) is noted for his camera shyness. In all the time he's worn stars on his uniform he's okayed only one picture for publication. It's the only one his wife would approve. The public relations officer, knowing all this, asked Hope to help him get the general to pose for pictures. Bob promised, and after

TALKS ABOUT HITLER

Noted Writer Debunks Hitler's Moustache and 'Divine Mission'

Pierre J. Huss will be remembered as the first by-line to head International News Service articles out of Germany during the early incursions of the lowlands by the Nazi war horde. The man who trained William Shirer and other now-famous war correspondents for their job "covering" the war overseas, Huss a short time ago escaped from Hitler's Gestapo and is now in America. For some time he has been aiding the U. S. Intelligence Service with his knowledge of the inner workings of the German war machine.—THE EDITOR.

THE words "Foreign Correspondent" conjure up all sorts of pictures in the mind of the war-conscious American.

What does the phrase, "Foreign Correspondent," mean to you? A Walter Wanger hero, in trench coat, chasing spies in a high powered car across the lowlands of pre-invasion Holland? A quiet reportorial individual in a sumptuous apartment on the Wilhelmstrasse, quietly dissecting the workings of the Nazi mind? A modern Richard Harding Davis, commuting the Atlantic by bomber and by convoy, dodging machine gun and torpedo attack?

His work and high adventure are synonymous. Mayhap I should say, his work and great danger are synonymous.

At least such was the impression I received in an interview with Pierre J. Huss here the other day. Pierre Huss, for eight years head of the Berlin bureau for International News Service, bolted Nazi Germany just two weeks before the Japs struck at Pearl Harbor.

No simple trick, this getting out of Germany two weeks before the Jap juggernaut struck. It took Huss four months to outwit the Gestapo. Yes, four months to convince the goose-stepping aides to Hitler that all was in order and that he should be allowed to leave the confines of that country of so-called "super-men." Persistence worked miracles, though. Persistence and a host of worthwhile "contacts" such as every good re-

porter manages to establish wherever he is working.

Pierre Huss had little to say about how he returned to this country—about the dangers he encountered en route. But Huss had plenty to say about the headman of Germany, Herr Hitler.

Huss, after eight years of acquaintance with the German dictator, reached this conclusion:

"Public Louse Number One! The most amazing combination of liar, actor and bum I have ever known!"

That is Huss' description of Hitler.

Huss proved to be a man who held in utter contempt the German leader's oft-mentioned "divine mission."

Huss told me about the great Nazi party rally held at Nuremburg three years ago . . . how Hitler was addressing the entire populace of the German Reich. . . .

The Nazi dictator was informing his followers of his recently discovered

"divine mission" which was to assist him in safeguarding the peace of the Reich.

Pierre Huss sat opposite Hitler 30 minutes after that speech at a luncheon attended by all of the foreign correspondents and heard Hitler say:

"Divine Mission. I'll give them divine mission. I'll talk about it all day. After all, you have to give people what they think they want in order to get what you yourself want."

Huss told that story, to prove his contention that Hitler is a phoney. (Not that anyone would dispute his opinion.)

Pierre Huss is a quiet, purposeful sort of chap. He strikes one as possessing a vast fund of knowledge about Nazi dominated Europe. But he's not at all a talkative type. If you want to know whether Hitler really likes that silly moustache of his, or why somebody hasn't put a bullet in "Der Fuehrer" Huss can supply the

Whirling dervish of the show business is Ed Gardner, 'Archie' of 'Duffy's Tavern'. Of course he did have one little upset—after he had produced 'After Such Pleasures' by Dorothy Parker and was offered a big job which he turned down. He landed in WPA as director. Then his wife, Shirley Booth (who plays Miss Duffy on the show), made a hit in 'Three Men on a Horse'. Ed was whisked off the WPA list and had to take the agency job he once refused. There followed for him such assignments as writing, directing and producing the 'Believe It Or Not' series, also the Joe Penner, Burns and Allen, and Rudy Vallee shows. He wrote the 'MGM Good News' production and handled 1939 'Texaco Star Theater' from the Pacific Coast. 'Archie' was born while Gardner was directing CBS' 'This Is New York'.—Editor's Note.

That's How 'Archie' Was Born— By 'Archie's' Creator, Ed Gardner

ARCHIE was born in the middle of a dilemma . . . which is something like being a Giant rooter in the Brooklyn baseball park.

It was during a rehearsal for a CBS program called "This Is New York."

We wanted a guy to talk New Yorkese. All we could get was voices that sounded like Dodger fans in the left field bleachers.

There is as much difference between New Yorkese and Kings (Borough) English as there is between Oxford and Choctaw.

A New Yorker, for instance, would say: 'Laertes poizinned the point uv his foil.'

In Brooklyn they say: 'Lay-oytees purzinned the pernt of his ferl.'

Well, as I was sayin', one guy after

another gets up in front of the microphone and talks Brooklyn.

Finally I get tired and goes out in front of the mike myself, on account of I got one guy who shows promise. He is only half-breed Brooklyn, on the dislaff side.

While I am demonstrating how it should sound to talk New Yorkese, the gang in the control room is havin' hysterics.

'Why bother with an actor?', they holler back through the studio mike. 'You read it yourself.'

'It's 28 minutes before we go on the air, so who am I to argue with the fates—and the control room mob? So I do!'

And thus 'Archie' is an overnight institution . . . like the accident ward in a hospital.



'Oh hello, Duffy', twangs Archie. 'Say, Duffy, Callahan was just in. He wants his striped pants back—the ones you wore Easter Sunday. What? They split? Where? On the avenco, huh? How? Say, Duffy, when a guy is built like you and has on borrowed pants, no matter how much of a gentleman he is he should leave the lady's handkerchief lay there!'



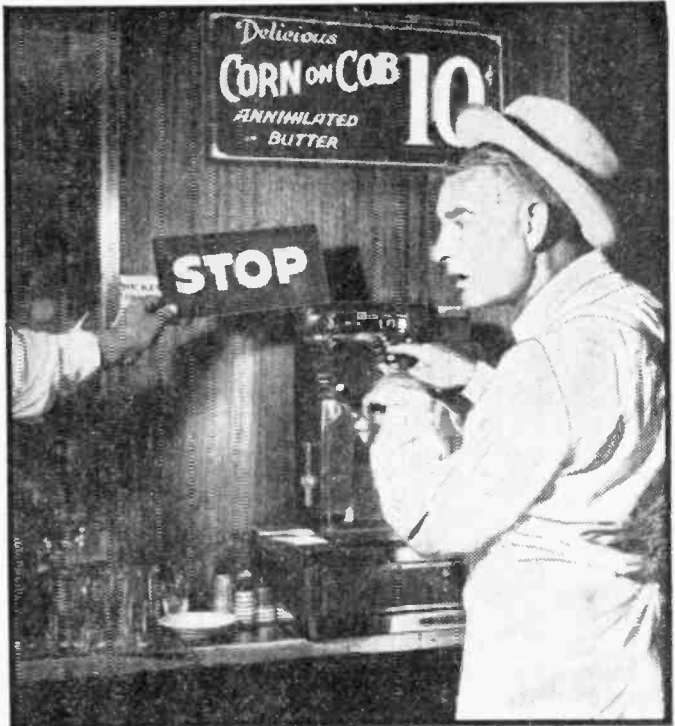
'In this joint I'm maitre 'd—that means silent partner. We cater only to the hoi polloi—that's the best people. When I offered Kate Smith a good job here, I explained that we protect our entertainers. In most places the customers throw things at the entertainers, but here at Duffy's, the management lets the entertainers pitch the things back.'



'You gotta help me out, Miss Duffy', (Archie implores the Tavern owner's daughter). 'My rich uncle's coming here and if I make him think I'm married, I'll get a million bucks. I'll give you some of it if you'll just act like a married woman. You've seen your mother—act like that.' . . . 'Ye-s-s', says Miss Duffy, reluctantly. Then excitedly: 'I'll use my baseball bat'.



'I propositioned Kate at my rock-top price—\$95 a month for 12 shows a night. A big break for the Smith gal, but that guy, Collins, advised her to turn it down. She'd better get rid of him, otherwise he'll ruin her career. What do ya mean signalling me to 'STOP', Duffy? Now don't get sore and fly into a tansom. Calm down, Duff. The lad was so broken-hearted when Bob told him that the Federal Communications Commission didn't allow direct communication, that Hope told him to meet him after the broadcast.

Bob and the young private marched, arm in arm, to the telephone in the administration building and Bob placed a long distance telephone call to the draftee's girl friend. With Hope gagging the conversation and the young fellow asking the young lady to reconsider, the girl not only promised to take back the ring but apologized for having quarrelled.

Hope's constant jokes about the Military Police on his shows finally backfired on him when he visited Camp Haan. When he arrived the MP's were all set to turn the tables on him. A dozen military police met Bob at the main gate and placed him under arrest. They actually tossed the NBC comic into the guardhouse and kept him there until he agreed to wear an MP badge and carry one of their billy clubs during the broadcast. Goodnaturedly, Bob did as was requested and took plenty of ribbing from the soldiers. 'That's one gag I didn't have to write into the script or even ad lib,' Bob told the soldiers.

One of the biggest laughs Hope ever got in an army camp appearance was at the Camp Callan receiving center for draftees. 'Vaudeville isn't dead,' he told the boys. 'The government draft-it!'

Bob's still blushing about the incident which involved a serious-faced young marine at the San Diego base a few weeks ago. Right in the middle of the after-show which Hope always does following his broadcast, a young fellow suddenly leaped to his feet out of his front row seat, exclaiming, 'I enlisted to serve my country, but this is ridiculous!' and walked out of the auditorium.

JOHNNY on the SPOT

Joe E. Brown, the beloved comedian with a serious mein who has just returned from a 33-day-and-night-trek to Alaska where he made 122 appearances before the Army and Navy boys stationed on the Aleutian Islands front, opened his big mouth in Studio G of NBC's Radio City last Wednesday. . . .

And if you know Joe E. like Radio Life knows Joe E., you know that the Grand Canyon-mouthed favorite of millions rarely opens his mouth unless he has something pretty worthwhile to say . . . so the wordage the checkered-plaid-coated comedian pitched between tune-up sessions for a spot of broadcasting on Hank McCune's 'It Happened in the Service' program for Par Soap was well worth earing.

For a fellow just back from the icy wastes of Alaska where American troops are manning the posts and gun positions of one of the Western Hemisphere's most vital war fronts, Joe was hotter than a 4th of July firecracker. Joe had things on his mind . . . facts and convictions he wanted to spill to all America . . . and as Joe E. sat atop a three-foot stool in the studio with a Dixie cup in one hand and a copy of his script in the other . . . we—and that included Announcer Larry Keating, Commentator Hank McCune, Producer Ned Tollinger—listened. . . .

'You know, one has to see what I've seen,' began Joe E., 'you really have to visit those northern outposts over which American boys and Alaskans are together standing guard, to realize what a great role entertainment can play in this war.'

'Those boys are up there where the temperature hits 30 below with regularity. But, there's no griping about the situation from anybody—and I mean down to the privates, too. They're all good soldiers.'

'The camps and outposts I visited were full of men working night and day getting ready for the enemy, preparing gun positions and ever on the alert. Some of the men at the outposts and gun positions are stationed right at their guns for weeks and months at a time. Some don't get into camp at all.'

'I went out to those gun positions by plane. When they couldn't come to me in the camps where I was entertaining, I went to them. They were literally starved for entertainment.'

Well, Joe, tell us—what can we do? That was the question all of us huddled around the comedian chorused almost in unison.

'It's just this,' mouthed Joe E., 'those boys need humor, fun, comedy. Not the kind they get off two-year-old movie films projected upon a flimsy screen by a worn out machine. And the radio can't be relied upon for the American programs can't be heard in most of the areas—either direct from the States or over the Alaskan stations.'

'I'm starting to work right now to get portable motion picture machines sent around to the outposts and the gun positions so those men can have some form of entertainment.'

'And you, Johnny,' (and Joe E. looked over our way) 'you and your Radio Life magazine can really make a worthwhile contribution to the entertainment needs of those fighting men of ours up in Alaska.'

'Contact the Jack Bennys, the Red Skeltons, Burns and Allen, Al Pearce, and all of the comedy shows. Ask them to make a transcription of their programs each week, and airmail it immediately following the broadcast to those men. Tell them to address their packages to Lieut. Roy Craft, Fort Greeley, Alaska, U. S. A.'

'Those packages, winging their way to Alaska, will be like gifts from Heaven for those boys of ours.'

That was Joe E. Brown talking. The Joe E. Brown who, against the judgment of army and navy officials who tried to 'talk him out of it,' made a dangerous six-week aerial jaunt to the northern-most outposts of America's far-flung war front to add a few moments of joy to the existences of those men in uniform who stand ready to die if necessary in defense of their country.

On the occasion of KFI's Twentieth Birthday recently, that station's General Manager, Harrison Holliday, was interviewed by the Noon Farm Reporter. Mr. Holliday made several statements which are very timely and which I think will be of interest now. Outstanding quotations from the script follow:

RATION-ALIZING

None of us suffered unduly. It was probably good for a lot of us with sweet tooth tendencies. So don't be worried if, in the future, you hear that other food articles may go on the ration list.

Remember. Let's pull together. You will get your share!

ON THE OTHER HAND

Did you ever hear your grandparents talk of the "good old days," the age of Queen Victoria, when eating was practically a career in itself. Early Victorians were gastronomes without knowing it, for a gastronome is merely a person who eats with relish. And eat with relish they certainly did. 2 cups and 4 tbsps. flour	1 cup butter
4 eggs slightly beaten	½ cup pork or bacon fat
8 tbsps. water	1 pint milk
2 cups fine bread crumbs	3 tps. Gravy Master

Cut the chicken in pieces for serving, wash and dry. Season with salt and pepper, then roll them in flour, dip in slightly beaten eggs diluted with water, and roll in crumbs. Saute in butter and pork or bacon fat in heavy frying pan until browned on all sides. Cover and place in oven at 350 degrees and bake for ¾ hour. Serve with cream gravy made this way: Melt 4 tbsps. butter and stir in 4 tbsps. of flour, and when blended pour in little by little 1 pint scalded milk. Then cook for 3 minutes, stirring constantly. Season with 3 tps. of Gravy Master and stir well. Pass through a strainer, and place in top of double boiler covered so it won't scorch, and when ready serve.

Recipe for Vegetable Goulash

1 bunch of turnips	1 lb. of lamb from the neck
1 bunch of carrots	6 tbsps. oil
1 lb. asparagus	3 tps. Gravy Master
1 lb. fresh green peas	2 tps. salt—¼ tsp. pepper
1 lb. beef from the chuck	½ cup water

Peel 1 bunch of turnips and cut them into 4 parts; scrape 1 bunch carrots and slice them; then cut the tender part of 1 lb. of asparagus, and then shell 1 lb. of fresh green peas. Now cut 1 lb. of beef from the chuck into 1 inch pieces, and do the same with 1 lb. of lamb from the neck. Then brown the meat in 6 tbsps. of oil in a dutch oven, or a thick pot, until the meat gets brown on all sides. As soon as the meat is brown, put to cook with 11 the turnips, the carrots, the peas and the asparagus. Then season with 3 tps. of Gravy Master, 2 tps. salt and ¼ tsp. pepper. Add ½ cup of water and cover the pot tightly, and put in an oven of 325 degrees and let bake for 2 hours, or until done, without stirring. Serve and enjoy.

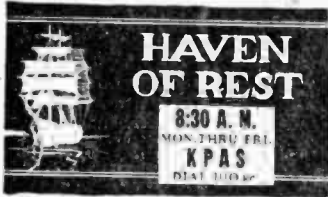

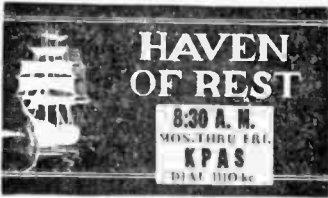

Credit for much of the wierdness of Hermit's Cave goes to Rex Corey, KMPC musical director, for his atmospheric music especially improvised during rehearsals.
