### Bing Comes Home

Although young Bob Crosby did himself proud with two smooth emceeing jobs for Bing on the Kraft Music Hall while the Great Crooner joined the Hollywood Victory Caravan for two weeks of one night stands across the country, it was great to have Bing back in "the hall" last Thursday.

The atmosphere in Studio B at NBC's Radio City has a certain lift and lilt when Bing is around; the place and the people seem to be peppered with oomph and personality.

As Radio Life's editor stood in the wings with Dinah Shore (she's always around when Bing's in view) and Bill Berch, who helps script the Crosby show, during a rehearsal of one of Bing's tunes, it was easy to see why the studio was jumping and in the groove.

Bing radiates something electric when he faces a mike or a person. Out there at the mike he retains something of the subdued nonchalance that is a highlight of his makeup, and yet he clowns and ad libs through a lyric that keeps everybody laughing.

Bing was thrilled about his two weeks on the road with the Hollywood Victory Caravan, and although he didn't volunteer his souvenir program which carried pictures and autographs of many of the stars who made the trip, he went hunting for it when we made it known that we'd like to look it over.

Well, we thumbed through Bing's Victory Caravan souvenir program and made mental notes of some of the things the stars wrote to Bing over their pictures.

The program was almost like a high school annual, and every little line probably has a special meaning to Bing.

Bert Lahr wrote: "To know you is to hate me!"

"It was really grand knowing you better during this trip—your fan," was Charles Boyer's salutation.

Photographer Gene Lester (he shot those Fontana Hen Derby pictures in last week's Radio Life) quipped: "I've invented a flash bulb with hair on it!"

Alfred Newman, the noted conductor who led the Caravan orchestra, drew a bar of music and wrote: "You're my thrill, Bingo!"

"You're as wonderful a person as

you are a singer," was Rise Stevens' inscription.

All Bing had to say about the trip was that "it was great!" We failed to ask Bing if he would mind Radio Life reprinting the above autographs from his souvenir program, but before we had the opportunity he was off to croon "Lily of Laguna" with Mary Martin. ### Show Stealers

On a "Command Performance, U. S. A." program transcribed in Hollywood's Radio City the other night for release via shortwave to Uncle Sam's armed forces throughout the world, two of radio's less-publicized teams practically stole the show (as far as the studio audience was concerned) from such stars as George Raft, Deanna Durbin, Dinah Shore and Rudy Vallee.

The show-stealers were Lum and Abner, co-proprietors of the Jot 'Em Down Store in Pine Ridge, and Brenda and Cobina, the two young ladies with a sense of humor as sharp as a hatchet and faces to match, formerly heard on Bob Hope's show.

Brenda and Cobina went through their hilarious "blind date" routine in which they are preparing to meet a couple of soldiers. Typical dialogue:

Brenda: When I was at the beach

the other day everybody said I looked like Veronica Lake.

Cobina: I know you've been trying to look like Veronica Lake . . . but you've got it backwards.

Cobina: Oh, dearie, let's not fight. Let's finish dressing for our blind date. How do you like my long winter underwear?

Brenda: It's very pretty, but your escape hatch is open!

Lum and Abner, who only once before in their radio broadcasting career had broadcast in front of a studio audience (National Barn Dance, Chicago, several years ago), gave out with one of their typical homespun routines—and were given what practically amounted to an ovation when they left the stage.

George Raft, who rarely makes a radio appearance, demonstrated a swell air voice in a smooth emcee job. The following letter from Seaman First Class W. C. M. somewhere in Australia served to introduce Raft:

"Dear Command Performance: Recently you read a letter from a sailor who heard about Betty Grable keeping company with George Raft. The blue-jacket tried to sell Betty on the fact that he had a nice, big battleship, so why should she waste her time with a Raft? Well, from what we saw of the way George made love to Ida Lupino in a picture we caught down here, that guy's no Raft—he's a destroyer! How's about letting us hear from him?"

That was George Raft's command to appear on "Command Performance" and he sauntered up to the microphone as Announcer Paul Douglas said, "Well, here he is, Buddy—Betty Grable's one-man convoy, George Raft!"

Dinah Shore, introducing a new tune called "Conchita Marcheta, Lolita, Pepita, Rosita, Juanita Lopez," became the first star to appear on "Command Performance" twice.

### Papa Jimmie Fidler

Jimmie Fidler, the Blue Network's expert disher-upper on things Hollywood, passed out cigars by the dozens around Radio City last week.

Reason: An eight-pound, blue-eyed baby girl, born May 7, and adopted by Jimmie and his comely wife, Bobbe, after whom the baby was named.

The famous reporter-commentator and his wife have been contemplating the addition to their family for some time, and Mrs. Fidler has been taking special courses in baby care in anticipation of the event.

### Henry's Crystal Ball

Bill Henry, NBC commentator, was established last week as a prophet with honor following President Roosevelt's disclosure that Brig. Gen. James H. (Dood It) Doolittle had led the American bombing raid on Japan last April 18.

it was Henry who, on April 25, via his By the Way program, suggested that the bombing of Japanese cities might have been led by the famous Los Angeles ace.

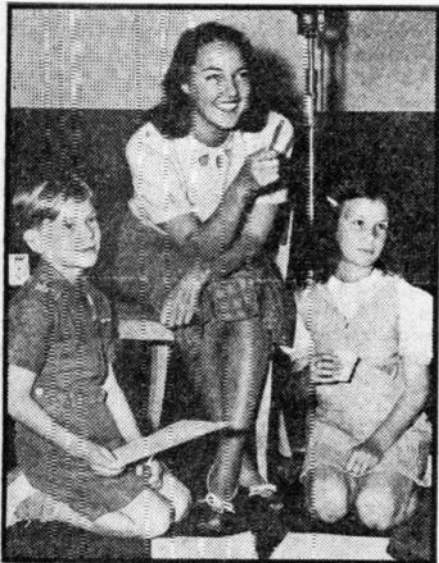

Singing better than ever, although her musical backgrounds haven't been very ideally suited to her unique range on the Burns program, the former Fresno State College coed can also handle dialogue now with the best of them.

### Thrill of a Lifetime

Glenn Miller, the bespectacled man with the horn, whose orchestra has been making musical history during the past two years on the airlines, in the juke boxes and on the screen, handed 12 young musicians and a high school coed singer the thrill of a lifetime last week.

Several weeks ago when Radio Life's editor interviewed the Chesterfield maestro and mentioned that a group of young student musicians out at Covina Union High School had named their swing orchestra The Rainbow Serenaders and patterned their arrangements after his, Miller said, "Why don't you bring the gang in some day for the broadcast; I'd like to meet them."

And so we did. Last week we met William E. Lynch, Covina high's professor of music who has knitted 13 of his music students into the finest little Miller-ish dance crew in the southland, and his Rainbow Serenaders out in front of the Vine Street Radio Playhouse.

John O'Leary, Miller's popular manager, bounced out with an invitation for the Rainbow Serenaders to come inside and watch Glenn's orchestra in rehearsal.

Following rehearsal, Glenn sent for Bill Lynch and his rhythm crew to come back stage to his dressing room. And with Prof. Lynch handling the introductions, Glenn shook hands personally with Vi Piper, who pipes the ballads for the Rainbow Serenaders, and the 12 boys in the band. One of the Serenaders, after shaking hands with the Great Glenn who is down-to-earth and friendly as they come, just couldn't control himself.

"Wow! Mother never told me there'd be a time like this!" he exclaimed, and sat down.

Barney McDevitt, who beats the publicity drums for the Hollywood Palladium as well as Glenn Miller, bounced into the room with an array of cameramen and 12 Harold Teens and a Lillums from Covina had their pictures taken for posterity and Radio Life with their idol, Glenn Miller.

Just before broadcast time, when the Rainbow Serenaders had left Glenn's dressing room and shuffled their way back to their front row seats in the theatre, who should come out from behind the curtains but the King of Swing himself.

And what did he say? Well, Covina's Rainbow Serenaders still can't believe their own ears. Glenn looked out at the sea of faces in the theatre, looked down at the kids from Covina, asked them to stand up, and then

for dinner Friday night and perhaps furnish a little entertainment for the boys?"

All of which demonstrates the lack of red tape in the Hollywood Victory Committee office, and the willingness of radio stars to pitch right in at a moment's notice to do their bit at such out-of-the-way spots as Port Hueneme where the future sailors of the U. S. Navy had been neglected as far as entertainment goes until last Friday night.

## June Raises Havoc

Bert Wheeler relays this story to Radio Life's readers . . .

## Found: A Legitimate School For Aspiring Radio Actors; And Free!

**F**OUR AND A HALF years ago in the small basement of a Hollywood boarding house, a young man who had been in the radio game for many years watched a 19-year-old boy writhe in agony on a makeshift bed. The boy had taken poison.

His moans had penetrated upstairs to the radio man, who had called a doctor. They were able to pull the boy through.

Later when questioned why he wanted to die, the lad told a pathetic story of leaving a small western town and coming to Hollywood in hopes of becoming an actor. Here he was caught by a "recommended" (racket) school which told him that within a few months, after completing a prescribed course, the boy would land a job in radio. Enthusiastically the young fellow tracked down work in a cafe; he almost starved, giving his wages to the racket school each month.

After seven months he lost his job and the school refused to carry him any longer. He pleaded for a chance to continue.

"You're a sucker", one of the "teachers" said. "You'll never be an actor."

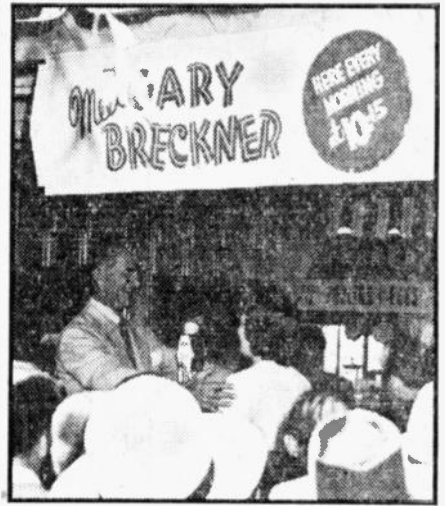
It was then that the disillusioned boy took poison.

His plight hastened establishment of the radio man's dream—a school for young men and women with interest in and talent for radio work. But not just an ordinary school. This one was to be free.

With cooperation of about 20 others, Robert Bice, the young radio man, organized Hollywood's first Free School of Radio, offering three-month courses to those passing auditions. Only qualifications necessary were talent and sincerity.

That was three and a half years ago. Since then, about 150 young people have gone through the courses every year. Forty-one are now engaged in commercial radio. One of the very first pupils was the 19-year-old fellow who had tried to commit suicide. Under Mr. Bice's guidance, he turned out to be one of the finest actors in radio today. The only pay he, or any of the others, has given the Free School of Radio, has been a "thank you for all you've done" at conclusion of the course.

Mr. Bice, whose mother was a Broadway actress, makes his living in the same profession. With the help of about a dozen inter-

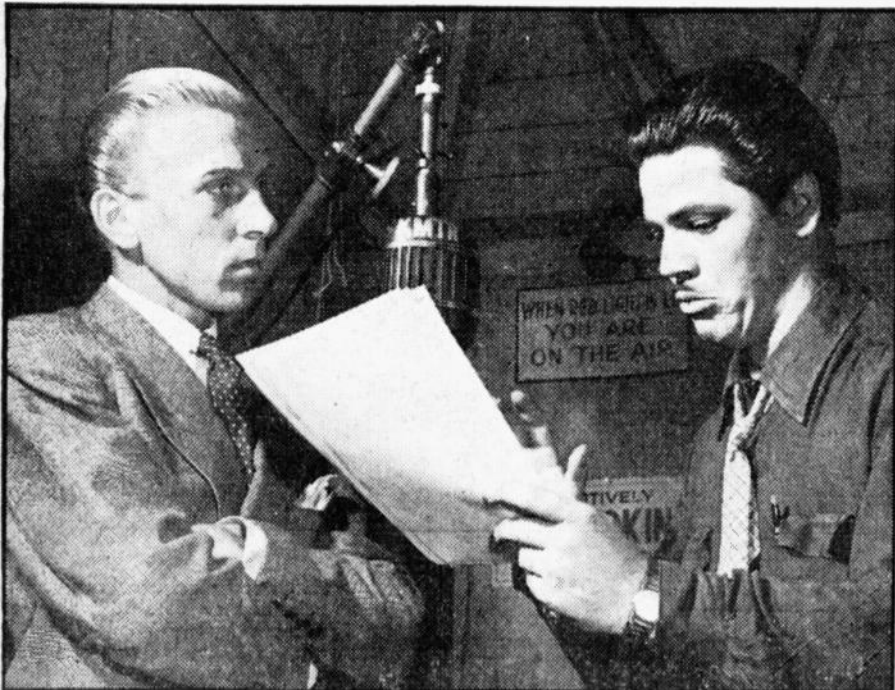

ested people, he continues to hold classes every Tuesday and Friday night at 6814 Sunset boulevard. The group has a stage and sound effects equipment. Each pupil learns the rudiments of radio production, music and sound cuing, announcing, story formula, and even script writing. Talks are given by men experienced in their radio lines. At the end of the course, Mr. Bice and his helpers actually try to deter the students from going into radio. If they persist, they give them all possible help and encouragement.

The school is now auditioning for new classes to start June 5. Says Mr. Bice: "Every year, thousands of people come to Hollywood only to fall into unscrupulous hands and find themselves, often too late, being taken for suckers. This blight has been on Hollywood ever since the early days of motion pictures. Newspapers and columnists have blasted away at

## The Feminine Slant on Dinah Shore, Radio's Sweet Singing Songstress, Who Hails From the Deep, Deep South

**B**ING CROSBY'S No. 1 fan is . . . Dinah Shore!

For years she admired the boo-boo-boo man from afar. It wasn't until she came to Hollywood last spring that Dinah met her idol.

The first thing she wanted to do at Radio City was watch a Crosby rehearsal. Dinah was admitted to the control room, where she hung enraptured on every limp tone.

"He's mahvelous", whispered Dinah, her brown eyes riveted on Bing. "Ah wish you-all would introduce me so's ah could tell him how grand he sings", the little Tennessee girl said wistfully to the engineer.

"YOU mean you haven't ever met Bing?" The studio official was incredulous, apologetic.

"They took me into the studio," Dinah related, "and then, when ah was really face to face with the man who can sing like nobody's business, my knees started to tremble, and my hands shook, just the way they do now before a broadcast."

That's how Dinah met Bing.

The story travelled fast. Dinah's masculine friends started a kidding campaign. They began to call her on the phone. "This is Bing", they'd announce in Crosbian tones.

The following Tuesday night Dinah had a date with Skitch Henderson, NBC's crack pianist. She returned to the hotel shortly after midnight, and was just snuggling down for a good sleep when the phone rang.

"This is Bing", announced the voice at the wire's other end.

"Oh, you Skitch Henderson", Dinah replied with just a trace of petulance. "Please stop bothering me, and hang up. Ah'm dreadfully sleepy."

"But this is really Bing", reiterated the voice. "I'm calling at this ungodly hour because the radio people are putting on a benefit in Texas tomorrow night, and we want you to come along.

Short notice. I know, but how's about it?"

Dinah was flabbergasted. She was so embarrassed that she sat frozen against the headboard, unable to say anything except "Yes, Ah'll be glad to go." She was so overwhelmed that she forgot that it was early Wednesday morning and that she must sing on the Cantor show that night.

The episode finally ended right side up. Dinah did her broadcast, then flew to Texas. But something happened and Bing didn't go after all.

The Crooner is Dinah's ideal singer, but she also admits that his and the Ray Milland type are her romantic idols. So are Dinah's Sis and brother-in-law, Maurice, who are the songstress' marital dream pair.

Sis and Maurice had a finger in Dinah's career-pie. The career started when Frances Rose Shore was 10. She already disliked her name, because the other boys and girls taunted her by chanting:

"Fanny sat on a tack. Fanny Rose. Did Fanny rise? Shore!"

Frances Rose's first public appearance, with noticeable applause, was at Winchester, Tenn., her home town, where she sang "I Can't Give You Anything But Love, Baby."

At 14, Frances Rose Shore resolved to try her luck singing in a near-by night club. She sold her voice by phone, sneaked one of her sister's

evening dresses out of the house, and verbally cudgelled the family chauffeur into taking her to the club.

Her first professional appearance (she was promised \$10) came to an abrupt, ignominious conclusion when Frances Rose looked out into the audience and beheld her disapproving parents at a ringside table. Her artistic, ambitious little spirit was steeled to such a catastrophe. She knew that she wanted to be somebody, someday, because she loved to sing — and because she sang "Dinah" with tremendous inner satisfaction, she changed her name to Dinah Shore.

Mrs. Shore died while Dinah was in her middle teens. It was then that Sis and Maurice became such standbys. Her father was a help, too, although at the time Dinah felt as if he were thwarting everything. After minor success at a Nashville radio station, she spent a summer vacation in New York and became so enamored of the metropolis and its radio opportunities that Father Shore was compelled to cut off her allowance to bring her to reason. He promised, however, that if Dinah would come home like a sensible girl, he would let her go to New York when she had finished Vanderbilt University.

When Dinah returned the following summer, she experienced a nightmarish time crashing the portals of big-

**D**INAH isn't a "pretty wench" so no one will be able to say she added Radio Life's editor to her legion of admirers with a display of feminine pulchritude that caught me off balance.

But she has tremendous beauty. Not so much a beauty of face or figure. No, not a display of physical beauty, but something far more important and more lasting—a beauty of mind.

"You know, Johnny, I hope I can someday do something worthwhile and fine in this world to repay in some small measure the wonderful things that have come to me," Dinah said while we were discussing her visits to the army camps.

**When we asked Dinah about it the other day, she was Shore-frank about the question. "I learned that in school when I was running for different student-body**

**offices. If I could call the other boys and girls by their first names I was 'in' for a lot of votes. And it's been a habit with me ever since."**

You're thinking that this girl is quite a politician, aren't you? Well, before we could even put the idea in our minds the other noontime, Dinah had beat us to the punch by adding, "I guess it's the politician in me!" That's disarming frankness for you. The kind you can't find fault with at the moment—or afterwards.

**When you're with Dinah you get the feeling that there's someone who never becomes bored with life or the people in it. She seems to have cultivated an interest and enthusiasm in everything around her that completely bridges those gaps when the world doesn't seem to be going around in a perfect circle.**

Now, now, I know what you're thinking . . . "wasn't there anything the poor guy didn't like about the gal?"

Yes, to tell you the truth, there was. Don't think me 1800-ish, but out heroine wore slacks. And I just can't stand slacks on a lady. And Dinah's a perfect lady!

In fact, true to her sex, she was 20 minutes late to her own luncheon!

city radio. It was a hectic, discouraging procession of turn-downs, audition flops, and bad breaks. "Ah guess the reason one station finally took me in was because ah looked half-starved," Dinah avers.

During these obscure days in a microphonic maelstrom, Dinah's hungry eyes searched face after face for a smile of recognition—just a nod from somebody calling her by name. She was so anxious to be an accepted part of this exciting life. From this yearning and an inherent politic nature evolved Dinah's amazing faculty for remembering names and faces. She vowed that she would always be the one to recognize and call by name the other person. Today, she schools herself in cataloguing countenances and connecting names with faces. At a recent Hollywood press luncheon, Dinah spent part of her meal-hour repeating guests' names to her manager, who reported that by dessert time, Dinah could call all 30 cognomens.

Dinah says she owes her success to many people—to the engineers who helped her tone down her voice ("Laws-a-massy! Ah sure used to holler!"), Dinah says ruefully—to Vick Knight,—and of course, Eddie Cantor—and especially to Sis and Maurice for helping her keep her feet on the ground when success arrived.

When her affairs became sufficiently important to require clerical assistance, Dinah sent for her former school chum, Marian Ruth ("Rufus") Crane, now the singer's secretary.

Dinah doesn't drink or smoke. She tried to imbibe once at the Waldorf, and when she knocked over a table, decided she had had her first and last drink. She tried to smoke, too, but couldn't muster nonchalance.

Hollyberg is awash with rumors that Al Jarvis's Saturday afternoon record review program was "forced off the air" by pressure from bandleaders and record distributors who were enraged at the way Al's "board of experts" snorted at some of the discs of the day.

### "NO SUCH THING" SAYS AL!

Such rumors are strictly from Vine Street, says Al, who states that the show, which went off just when several sponsors were nibbling, went off the air for the same reason other shows go off the air during the summer months. So there!

As a participant in that program, your scribbler on musical matters caused as much hysteria as anyone by airing opinions that obviously astounded many listeners. For example, there was the day we hinted that this fellow Tschaikowsky, who has been practically supporting Tin Pan Alley now for several years (and without an ASCAP rating, too) might not have been the greatest composer of all time.

You may have heard that someone called the authorities that day and asked that two men in white coats, with a strait-jacket handy, interview me as I left the studio after the broadcast.

That story is not true. There was only one man in a white coat and he did not have a strait-jacket—merely a good sized net; which shows they are accustomed to dealing with music critics in Hollywood.

However, we learned that one wants to be mighty careful what he says on the air—especially about Tschaikowsky. Wonder what these Tschaikowsky fans think about renowned Arturo Toscanini, who during those years he was conductor of the New York Philharmonic Orchestra, simply put his foot down and refused to play Tschaikowsky.

(Yes, when Mr. Toscanini was hired to conduct the NBC Symphony he played Tschaikowsky—and liked it!)

### HARRY ADDS A HORN

Listeners to Harry James' Blue Network Broadcasts from the Palladium are hearing a new tone in Harry's band. It is a French horn, played by Willard Culley, a local boy who joined the band here May 21. Willard's only previous experience in a dance orchestra was when he was guitarist with a high school dance combo. His last steady job, prior to this one, was as 1st horn in the WPA Symphony

here. (A sympho's full battery of horns is four).

Only other dance ork in which you will find a French horn is Claude Thornhill's, and there you will find not one, but two. But Claude uses his horns in place of a couple of trombones (a trombone is a long slender instrument which has a tendency to come apart).

Harry has added the horn to his regular ensemble, which contains scads of trumpets, flocks of trombones, a herd of saxes and a bevy of strings. Arrangers Jack Mathias and Leroy Holmes have added the horn parts to their arrangements, giving the instrument a distinctive, individual voice, injecting what many people miss in dance band arrangements—counterpoint.

In case you are not familiar with the French horn, it is a pipe about 30 feet long, wrapped up in coils so that it can be tucked under the arm. It has valves which help the player to play the right notes. Like the saxophone, the French horn is easy to play badly and hard to play well.

### BITS ABOUT BANDS

A deal is on fire whereby all bands playing at the Palladium will be booked simultaneously to appear on next season's Abbott & Costello airshow. By next fall the transportation is expected to be so serious that big bands will not come to the Coast without added inducements. (Chorus from local bandmen: "Swell! Then we'll have a chance at some of the good jobs here").

For some reason the volume of radio listening throughout the country takes a considerable drop during May and June. Experts have tried to figure out a reason for the decline in listening interest but have failed at every turn.

Possibly it is because listeners become a little weary after the heavy winter schedule of radio production. There are so many good things on the air in the fall and winter that a slackening is bound to be when the weather warms up and people go out at night.

In cases where people become weary of listening to the radio, I have a few suggestions to make. I am afraid that a vast number of people simply don't know how to listen to their radios.

When a person decides to take in a movie, or a play, or a baseball game; or when he wants to read a book or attend a concert, or relax in some similar fashion, he always makes sure that he is going to enjoy himself before he decides definitely on spending his time in these places. He manages, somehow, to get some idea of what he is in for.

When they stay home and suddenly get an urge for some music, or comedy, or drama, they merely snap on the radio switch. They take pot luck and if they can find nothing of interest at the moment, they make a mental reservation that radio has nothing to offer, and consequently has gone to pot.

The truth of the matter is just to the contrary. Radio offers so much and is so easily obtained, that it is taken for granted. It gives you, at no cost, the finest music, the best drama, the best comedy, the finest all round entertainment, education, and relaxation of any medium in the history of the world!

The proper way to listen, to take advantage of all the good things radio has to offer, is to study the radio log which you will find in the back pages of this remarkable magazine. Study the log as you would study your theatre guide. Be choosy about what you want to hear. You will find something of interest to you for almost every minute of the day.

There are at least 16 radio stations in the Southern California Area. Each of them broadcasts on an average of

17 hours a day. It is quite understandable that out of this terrific amount of production there is bound to be a certain amount of things that you, individually, do not care for. You may be sure that somebody DOES want to hear them, however. To make the efforts of our 16 radio stations suitable for your own personal listening pleasure, it is necessary that you previously make up your mind what you want to hear.

I was talking with a stranger the other night. He was an educated, intelligent and upstanding citizen, but I saw red when he baldly stated: "Radio? It stinks." I asked him if he had ever heard America's Town Meeting, Chicago Round Table, The New York Philharmonic Concert, Information Please and a dozen similar programs of unusually high calibre. He said that he had heard of them but had never taken the trouble to try and catch them. After I blacked his eye, he seemed to get the idea that there is more to radio than he had ever bothered to consider.

for them in a softly tailored suit of brown spun rayon liberally sprinkled with mammoth polka dots.

Why not plan a wardrobe of snoods—those very practical and comfortable substitutes for hats. You can have snoods for every occasion, and still have change left for war stamps, by buying unadorned, inexpensive snoods of various materials and letting your imagination and your trusty needle do the rest.

# MEN, SHIPS, and STEEL

## Ship-To-Shore Broadcast Salutes Merchant Marine

**G** O THE ARMY, to the navy, and to the marines, Americans have been expressing admiration and heartfelt thanks ever since that fateful Sunday at Pearl Harbor when Japan revealed herself as history's colossal Judas.

But there's a fourth breed of fighting men whose inspiring sacrifices are scantily sung—men of iron, who sail our merchant ships!

Meet these men on the streets of Manhattan or San Francisco, and beyond the saltiness of their walk and the look in their eyes, you'd never distinguish them. But see them with feet planted firm on a pitching deck! That's where they live, and work, and salute Hitler's submarines with a well-known American gesture!

The bow cleaves the water into ribbons which rise against port and starboard, then fall away . . . hour after hour and day after day. The wind whips and buffets the bridge; it howls through the rigging. Booms are silhouetted against the cold, glittering stars. The bulkheads creak and strain, and the rolling deck vibrates to the throb of the engines far below.

Danger is always in the next instant, for it comes without warning.

No preparation for heroism here . . . no steeling the nerves against a situation that grows or develops into its climax.

To these men, who are not wearing uniforms or medals, but who are fighting this war with might and main, Columbia Broadcasting system gave a special salute on May 22, National Merchant Marine Day. This date was the anniversary of a significant event. It was in 1819, 123 years ago, that the S. S. Savannah, American-built and owned, steamed into Liverpool harbor from Savannah, Georgia. It was the first steam boat to cross the Atlantic.

The network salute took the form of a half-hour broadcast arranged by the CBS-KNX special events department. It originated from the U. S. Maritime Training Station at Port Hueneme and then switched to the S. S. "American Sailor," somewhere off the Pacific Coast.

Early in February, in my capacity of special events producer, writer, and announcer, I journeyed to Port Hueneme to study the school there. Later, I visited Captain Richmond of the "Ameri-

can Sailor," the 10,000-ton training ship, which is depicted in the accompanying illustrations.

Boarding the vessel, my most striking impression was the youthful resourcefulness of the cadet-sailors. These lads, almost all of them in their 'teens, are typical of the best that America offers. The first student group was composed of lads from the CCC camps. Now the recruits are coming from all walks of life.

Here aboard the training ship, I saw no cringing Nazi fodder, no bullymates of the old school barking orders, no fascist-shirted, little Mussolini-mimics. I saw a mob of healthy, hearty, American boys.

There was plenty of horse-play, plenty of kidding, and when the Speed Graphic appeared, there were all the healthy cracks that kids make to photographers . . . "Send mine to Lana Turner!" "Don't get Butch's puss in the lens, he'll crack it wide open!" and "Could we get a print to send to the folks back home, huh?"

The "American Sailor" is manned by these youngsters. Routine keeps an active boy even more vigorous. Watches are stood, in and out of port;

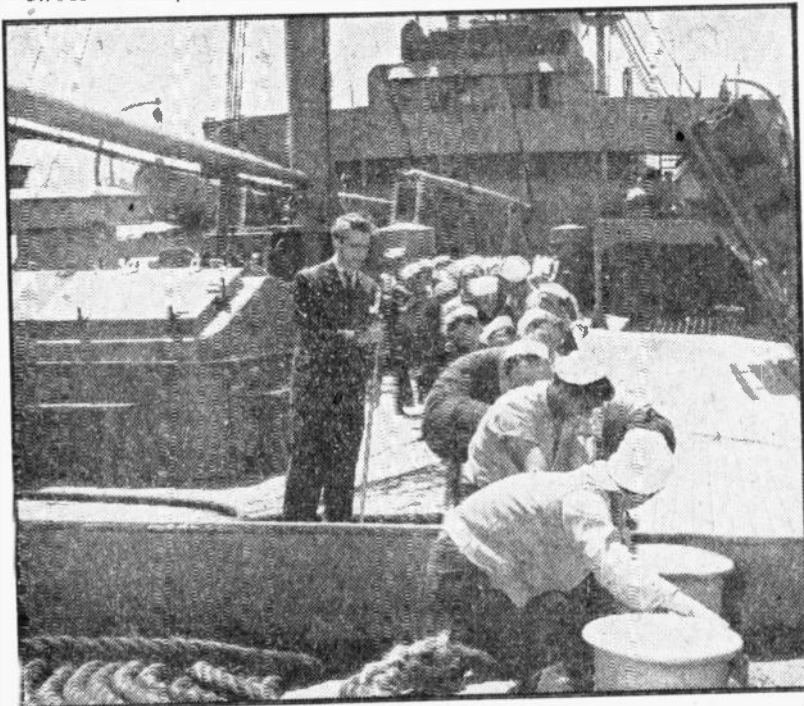




Chet Huntley takes the CBS mike down into the bowels of the S. S. "American Sailor" to interview the "Black Gang" in the engine room.

boys man the wheel at sea; there are classes on board — school keeps whether or not they are at sea; there are trades to master at the lathe, drill press, forge; there is the study of navigation, of radio; above all the boys must learn "how to take it"—a lesson to remember well when America needs them.

Predominant is the spirit of comradeship. Butch from New York, Joe from Salinas, Alfred from Peoria, are buddies now. No longer are their viewpoints limited to the confines of their own locality, for already they are men of the world and they talk with ease about Singapore, Zanzibar, Callao, Rio, and the Straits of Macassar, where they'll soon be sailing.

One of the more eloquent lads said it for all his buddies when he told me: "A ship a day! They are buildin' 'em sideways, bottom side up, and launchin' 'em on banana peels. They're even buildin' ships in Denver, Colorado. So you build 'em . . . we'll take 'em wherever the old man wants to send 'em . . . right into Hamburg, or Tokyo harbor, if need be."

That's the way they feel and talk, these heroes in dungarees, sweaters, and mackinaws. That's the way they talk, and they fight and sail as tough as they talk.

That's why Columbia Broadcasting System staged its ship-to-shore broadcast; it wanted its listeners, from coast to coast, to meet some of these boys.

Britain is applauding them: "Cheerio, men. Keep the sea lanes open!" . . . the people of unconquerable China, the stout-hearted Russians, the Aussies from "way down under," the stubborn Dutch, the Free French—all freedom loving people of the United Nations are cheering on the men of the Merchant Marine.

All 130 million Americans, whose future security depends on the outcome of this war, should join their Allies in their deep-throated cry: "You men of iron! You unsung heroes! Keep up the good work. It is you who will maintain the life-lines to final victory!"

### LET'S ECONOMIZE:

We have talked so much about it, it seems like an old story now, but every idea helps, and in that case we want to pass them along to you.

Know what you're buying. For a change read the labels on cans and packages. They will tell you not only the weight and quality of the article but also what goes into the making of the food and more than likely the food value as well. The important thing is the Government requires that this information be absolutely true.

Use your vegetable juices. Don't throw away the water in which the vegetables have been cooked. Many of the vitamins, minerals and vegetable juices are dissolved in that water. If you don't use it in a gravy or sauce, serve it chilled with some tomato juice, a little lemon juice and a pinch of celery salt. You will find it very good.

Serve well balanced meals. Let your menu planning carry you through the week. That may mean planning ahead several days for some of you, but it's worth it. Make sure that not only every meal is balanced, but that your accumulated menus for the week don't show an overabundance of one thing and a deficiency of another.

### PIECE DE RESISTANCE:

One of Egypt's famous beauties, Cleopatra in fact, concocted the world's most expensive recipe. The ingredients included one pearl and six million sesterces. A sesterce by the way, is a small coin. The pearl and sesterces were all melted together in a huge pot and then served with a special sauce.

The dish caused a small furor in Rome, whose gourmets dreamed up many a recipe to outdo Egypt's

Queen. They were all probably more palatable, but none were ever so extraordinary.

As impossible as this incident seems, historians claim it actually happened, and if it's true, it is no wonder Cleopatra took up with snakes.

### MEAT SAVING:

Aside from the present situation (which incidentally is teaching us a good deal about food conserving) it is always wise to save as much as possible in the cooking of all food. With meat it is twice as important, because cooking with an eye to shrinkage means a juicier, more flavorful meat.

To use the example of two roasts, the one cooked at an average tem-

perature of 300 degrees F will show less shrinkage than the roast done at a higher temperature. The shrinkage is caused by both the process of evaporation and the drippings. The higher temperature also means that the meat will be less tender and due to the larger amount of drippings, less juicy.

However braising should not be confused with the actual cooking. Braising which is always done at a higher temperature helps to seal in the juices and adds flavor to the gravy. For a last pointer, we would suggest browning sliced onion and a snip of garlic in a small amount of fat. This makes a good braising sauce and also adds to the flavor. Careful cooking and wise seasoning means you get the most out of your meat.

### Dollar Dinner for Four

Tenderoni Macaroni with Onion and Cheese  
Asparagus with Butter Sauce  
Sliced Tomatoes with Oil Dressing  
Sauce in Casserole  
Bread and Butter  
Coffee  
Grapefruit for Dessert

#### Tenderoni Macaroni with Onion and Cheese Sauce

$\frac{1}{4}$  pound Wilson's Ol' Fashund Bacon  
2 packages of Tenderoni Macaroni  
3 teaspoons of Gravy Master  
 $\frac{1}{4}$  pound grated American cheese  
1 pound onions  
 $3\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoons salt  
 $\frac{1}{4}$  teaspoon pepper  
3 quarts of water

Wash, peel, slice 1 pound of onions. Chop  $\frac{1}{4}$  pound of Wilson's Ol' Fashund bacon. Into a large pot, put three quarts of water with 3 teaspoons of salt and let come to a boil. As soon as the water is boiling rapidly put to cook the contents of two packages of Tenderoni macaroni and stir well with a wooden spoon. Let cook until Tenderoni Macaroni is tender, and while cooking, put to melt in a large frying pan the  $\frac{1}{4}$  pound of Wilson's Ol' Fashund bacon. As soon as the bacon melts, saute 1 pound of sliced onions until golden in color. Next season with 3 teaspoons of Gravy Master,  $\frac{1}{4}$  teaspoon of pepper and  $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon of salt. As soon as the macaroni is done, drain it, pour the onion and bacon sauce on top and mix well. Sprinkle with  $\frac{1}{4}$  pound of grated American cheese, cover the casserole and put to bake in an oven of 325 degrees for 30 minutes. Then uncover, and let bake until the top is nice and brown.

Fruit Cocktail

#### Recipe for Roast Leg of Lamb with Garlic

1 leg of lamb  
2 cups sherry  
Salt, pepper, butter

Dredge a leg of lamb with salt and pepper. Put into a roasting pan and pour into the pan 1 cup of Sherry wine. Butter the top of the lamb with butter or pure lard. Bake at 375 degrees for 30 minutes to the pound of lamb. Baste frequently. When the meat is well done, bring oven temperature to 400 degrees and brown the top of the leg of lamb. Remove lamb from the pan, putting it on a hot platter. Pour 1 cup of sherry into the pan and let come to a boil. Strain and serve as a sauce without thickening.

Jack Kirkwood, star of the Breakfast Club, is a jolly six-foot, 240-pound guy with a gift of gab. He uses about 100

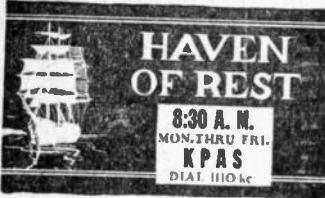
gags for each program, which means that with a five-a-week show, he has supplied more than 56,000 gags since the show went on the air three years ago.

## Trotter's Recipe

Here's a typical southern dish, straight from the extensive recipe files of John Scott Trotter, NBC's Kraft Music Hall maestro, who justly deserves his reputation as a gourmet and who spends most of his spare time preparing just such tasty morsels. Even John, a North Carolinian, doesn't know the origin of Muckalong. "It probably just grew," he says, "from the desire of the southerners to find another way to use rice—their principal food back in the days before the Civil War." But whatever its source, be it Charleston, as credited, or some other southern city, it's a delicious dish and one that often graces the Trotter table.

Ingredients: -

- Young frier, cut in pieces
- Two onions
- 4 cups chicken or veal broth
- 2 teaspoons turmeric powder
- Freshly ground black pepper
- Salt .
- ½-lb. butter or other cooking fat

Method: Heat 1 onion, sliced fine,

to sizzling point in butter and add chicken. Fry to deep brown, turning pieces frequently. As they brown, transfer to another pan with small lump of butter. Drain fat from remaining onions and save. Pour 4 cups chicken or veal broth over onions, simmer for several minutes, stirring constantly, and pour over chicken. Mix 2 teaspoons turmeric powder with 2 teaspoons drained fat, dilute with little broth and stir into chicken. Add another onion, sliced fine and cooked separately in butter to a golden brown. Add salt and plenty freshly ground black pepper. Cover and simmer for two to three hours or until chicken is very tender. When ready to serve put pan aside for five minutes to allow fat to come to surface. Skin off fat and make a sauce, using 3 or 5 tablespoons fat and equal quantity flour and gradually add broth in which chicken cooked, stirring to make smooth, not too thick, sauce. Add little lemon juice at last moment. Put chicken in deep casserole, pour hot sauce over it and serve immediately, accompanied by bowl of rice.
