Dawn of a New Days

WHEN DONALD DICKSON left Groucho Marx's radio show to fill a season of concert dates in the East, the Mad Marx and his director, Dick Mack, began a search for a new soloist. The hunt grew into "looking high and low" proportions.

It happens that part of their weekly routine is cutting a record of the "Blue Ribbon Town" rehearsal, which is played back at a recording studio next door to CBS. One afternoon they stopped by to hear the platter and as they entered, someone was singing "You'll Never Know." Excitedly, both Groucho and Mack decided that here was a singer they wanted to know more about—and quickly.

Right Under Noses

They didn't even have to rub a magic lantern or waste a single nickel on a 'phone call, for the record was one Bill Days had made for a group of friends and he was then in the sound room listening to the playback. Since he was already part of the "Blue Ribbon Town" choral group, "discovering" him as an outstanding soloist was like old home week. One-half hour and two choruses later, Bill was set as the Marx show vocalist, with a shiny new contract and a brilliant future.

A genial, comfortably-padded fellow with pale blue eyes and slightly thinning hair, Bill received his good luck in stride. When news of his success became public, it was heart-warming to see him around the studio halls or just anywhere in the neighborhood of Sunset and Vine. He couldn't walk half a hundred yards without some radio performer—from stars down—dashing up with unmistakably genuine enthusiasm to tell him how glad everyone was that "the break" had finally come. "The fame part is swell for awhile," remarked Days, "but a thing like the Sportsmen quartet can go on for years."

Educated Locally

A St. Louis, Missouri, lad, Bill was

moved to Los Angeles while still a youngster, attended the 30th Street Junior High, and was graduated from L. A. High School. It was there that he met Lucile Friml, of the famous musical Friml family, who was later to become Mrs. Days and mother of Lulinda, now five. Lucile, Bill, her brother, Rudolph Friml, Jr., and another school chum worked up a song and dance act which attracted the attention of a talent scout, quick to grasp the value of the Friml name, no doubt, and also alert to clever new talent. Twenty-four hours later, the ecstatic foursome embarked on a vaudeville bill—big time with Ted Lewis as emcee. For the next year and a half they played all over the country, until Bill decided to come home and study voice seriously. He made his radio debut, not primarily as a singer, but in a character role, that of "Lem Gupton" on a series broadcast from the "Country Church of Hollywood." Later, a real singing opportunity came with the Paul Taylor chorus, with which Bill harmonized three years on Kraft Music Hall. During this time the Sportsmen formed their well-known group, with Bill holding job of first tenor. His radio experience now encompasses work with such famous personages as Marion Talley, Dick Powell, Frances Langford, Bing, Dinah Shore, Ginny Simms, and Tony Martin.

In War Work

"I'm on a very rigid schedule,"

Bill says earnestly. In addition to his solo assignment and relentless duties with the quartet, Days is checking in 48 hours weekly as precision inspector at a local war plant. He and his family live on an acre in Van Nuys and his and Mrs. Days' chief form of relaxation is golf. Clothes are his one extravagance. But he still remembers his leaner years when he was reduced to washing windows in order to finance his musical education. Now, whenever he enters a room, quite absent-mindedly he is apt to pick up any glass object

At least two other nights a week he is doing a comedy act at a service camp or war rally.

I'M AN OSTRICH," Jo Stafford exclaimed with a grin. "That's why I like radio. I'm scared to death of laying an egg," she went on to explain. "In radio, if you do, you don't know it—at least, not while you're doing it."

We would say Miss Stafford needn't worry.



In "Downbeat" magazine's poll on popular femme singers, the songbird who emerged No. 1 above them all was none other than this sweet-smiling, sweet-singing feminine member of "The Pied Pipers." Some people were surprised. Experts, who know how to pick winners in advance, were not. They just beamed and smugly said, "We told you so!"

Popular music-lovers and canary connoisseurs have long had their eyes on Jo Stafford as the gal with a style of song delivery that will send her straight to the top. Jo is no newcomer to radio. While lunching with the singing favorite, we reviewed her airplane career.

She made her initial bow before a microphone just shortly after her graduation from high school in 1935. She had sung with the high school glee club, appeared as soloist in sev-

eral operettas and studied voice with private teachers. Her professional debut was made as a member of a trio composed of herself and her two older sisters, Pauline and Christine. Today Pauline is retired and married to radio's Galen Drake.

Jo Stafford's earliest air appearances were on the "Happy-Go-Lucky" program emceed by Bill Goodwin, "California Melodies," the General Electric show and the "Oakie College." On the latter, and later on the Al Jolson airshow, Jo had solo spots. She did a good deal of solo work on the Johnny Mercer program too, as well as harmonizing with her three singing escorts of the popular "Pied Pipers." Today the group is heard each week on NBC's Bob Crosby-Les Tremayne variety show.

With "T. D."

Some of Jo's most valuable experience was gained when she sang with Tommy Dorsey's orchestra. "At first I was petrified by the thought of facing audiences," the singer remembered. "But after those three years of touring with the band, I felt like I could do most anything."

Jo and the Pipers made a number of recordings with the Dorsey orchestra, with the smooth Stafford styling of "Embraceable You" being among the most well-received. "I didn't set the world on fire, however," Jo de-

We're the Last

When you go to the market check stand next week and prepare to pick up your copy of Radio Life, fish among your coins and have not three, but five cents ready. Yes, Radio Lifers, after repeatedly considering a rise in the magazine's price and consistently deciding against it, at last we've had to come to it and "up" the price two cents. With our mounting production costs it became a question of slighting the quality of our product. We felt that our readers would rather pay a couple pennies more for Radio Life they have become attached to than lose any of its distinctive features.

Practically every periodical in the country has had to meet the same problem with a price rise. In 1943, out of 1725 newspapers in the United States, four sold at one cent; 84 at two cents; 556 at three; 175 at four; 899

at five cents, and the balance above five. But in 1944, only three remained to be sold at one cent; 62 sold at two cents; 398 sold at three cents; 279 raised to four cents; 974 had gone up to five cents, and the remainder sold for more than five cents.

Selling for a nickel at your market, Radio Life will be entered as a subscription by mail for \$2.75 a year, or \$1.50 for six months.

Price change becomes effective with the issue of April 9, which will be our fourth birthday number and will contain eighty-eight pages of features and pictures.

We are confident that our loyal family of readers will understand the conditions which have brought about this change and that none will let it interfere with the weekly purchase of the magazine. As so many of our readers have time and again re-

marked, "We don't see how you can print Radio Life for three cents!"

We intend to keep on throwing everything we have into production of a bigger and better magazine. We want it still to be a bargain, at five cents.

Biggest break for Jay was his assignment to handle the Kate Smith Hour during its west coast broadcasts. He was also selected as the current alternate announcer on the new "Mayor of the Town" series, with the possibility of becoming the show's steady mickeman.

But not only in his professional life did he find March his lucky month. In addition, he located two of today's proverbial "needles in a haystack"—an apartment in North Hollywood serviced with a French phone!

New Civic Program

"The Citizens' Forum," first radio round table on the future of Los An-

geles, is being aired Thursday March 30, 9:30 p.m., and every subsequent week thereafter. Radio Lifers might like to tune in and hear Dr. Frederick P. Woellner, prominent public speaker, Professor of Psychology, U. C. L. A., and Los Angeles Civil Service Commissioner, who has been selected as permanent moderator for the program.

The purpose of the Forum broadcast is to answer many of the questions now being asked by residents of Los Angeles regarding their post-war future.

Citizen Forum guest speakers have been carefully selected for their knowledge of the topic and represent both sides of the controversial subject under discussion. Participants scheduled for the first broadcast were Manchester Boddy, distinguished commentator and publisher; Dr. Arthur Coons, prominent educator and Dean of the Faculty at Occidental; Sumner Spaulding, well-known city planner, and Don Thomas, Managing Director of the All-Year Club.

The Forum program will be strictly "ad lib" with Dr. Woellner channelling the discussion along lines most interesting to the listening audience. A typical question and answer will concern the future value of real estate in the so-called "blighted" areas of the city.

Subsequent programs will be confined to smaller but no less important facets of post-war Los Angeles. The future of aviation in the southland has been slated as the second on the Citizen Forum series. Arthur Ayres,

Airport and Airways Engineer for Pan American, LaMotte Cohe, General Manager of Northrup Aircraft, Robert L. Smith, President of the Airport Commission, and Richard Millar, President of Avion Inc., may be expected to answer many of the questions now being asked by thousands of aircraft workers in Southern California.

Invasion Coverage

Encouraging is the report that radio is at long last fulfilling its obligation to bring to Americans at home eyewitness accounts of battles abroad. NBC has issued a statement that the networks in this country and the British Broadcasting Company will pool their resources to present to radio listeners here and in England vivid on-the-spot coverage of the Allies' coming invasion of Europe.

Special personnel has also been selected and trained to follow United Nations armies and start broadcasting from Rome, Copenhagen, Paris and Oslo when these capitals are liberated.

Declared Sheldon B. Hickox, manager of NBC's station relations department: "It will be the first time in many years that free speech will be heard from those countries."

Two For The Show

Debonaire Screen Hero, Ronald Colman, And Radio's Dynamic Arch Oboler Unite To Present Program for Fighting Men

Tuesday, 9:00 p. m.
NBC-KFI

DEBONAIRE, distinguished-looking Ronald Colman stretched his arms, heaved a hearty yawn and exclaimed: "I'm hungry! Let's eat!" The famed actor always carries his lunch to the studio in a small wicker basket; then invites his guest artist of the week to share it with him.

It was noon on Tuesday. Actor-host Colman, with Writer-director Arch Oboler and Guest-star Greer Garson, was huddled over the script for the evening's broadcast of NBC's new weekly entertainment treat, "Everything for the Boys."

Attired in his customary casual "working clothes" consisting of wrinkled, loose-fitting trousers, a worn corduroy jacket, a slipover sweatshirt and a slouch hat, the amazing Oboler gestured earnestly to demonstrate to his players the effect he wanted to obtain in the climactic conclusion of his radio adaptation of "Berkeley Square." Miss Garson, an actress who has distinguished herself by winning the Academy Award, listened eagerly to the dynamic dark-haired little radio director's instruc-

tions. Colman, too, forgot his craving for food, for the moment, to lend a responsive ear to his program partner.

For when Arch Oboler, a writer then comparatively unknown in west coast radio, first came to Hollywood from the middlewest, Ronald Colman had phoned him personally. The famous film actor had been so deeply impressed by the single Oboler broadcast he had heard that he was anxious to appear in one of the Chicago scribe's original radio dramatizations.

"I met Ronnie for the first time then, and found him to be his ever-charming self," Oboler declared. "Hollywood seemed pretty frightening to me in those days and Colman made things easier." For the union-scaled salary of \$17.50, Ronald Colman made his initial appearance in an Arch Oboler offering called "The Most Dangerous Game in the World."

Today the actor and writer are combining their distinctive talents regularly to present a weekly program planned particularly to please our men in the armed forces.

Overseas Pick-up

Special feature of each "Everything for the Boys" broadcast is the

OBOLER WON COLMAN'S interest in his radio writing when Arch first came to Hollywood. The film actor arranged for a personal meeting with the writer; then appeared in one of his dramas for the union-scaled salary of \$17.50.

overseas pickup with a pair of Army-selected servicemen who converse with Colman and his guest star of the week. In case their overseas contact should fail, however, Oboler has on hand two alternate stand-by scripts for that portion of the program—one for use upon the occasion when it may be completely impossible to establish overseas connections, and one for emergency use in the event of a partial failure in the two-way hookup.

But at this writing, the show has not had a single failure in its trans-oceanic hookups, successfully contacting soldiers in such far away battle zones as New Guinea, Australia, Algiers, Munda Airport, a bomber base near London and an invasion center facing the coast of Europe.

The boys get a "bang" out of conversing with Colman and his guest performers, not as much because they are famed celebrities, but more because they are able to talk of home and of Americans and of the things about which a soldier is thinking. The participating serviceman knows, too, that those he loves are listening to him.

Sometimes the stars have special messages for the boys overseas. Greer Garson relayed to one fighting man in Australia a message from his wife. In her best Southern accent, Miss Garson repeated the young wife's exact words: "Jes' tell 'im I love 'im!"

Ronald Colman now receives mail regularly from servicemen's families here at home who express approval and appreciation of the way the actor talks to the men. With his warm, pleasant voice and manner, Colman is regarded as an excellent choice for the duty of voicing the channel of conversation between Americans at home and our soldiers abroad, via the miracle of radio.

In Other War

In World War I, Colman himself was a member of the famed London Scottish Regiment and was among the first English soldiers to see service in France. Disabled there, he came out of the war wearing the Mons Medal with the 1914 bar.

His work for war causes today—for the American Red Cross, for British War Relief, and the Hollywood Victory Committee—is extensive, yet is accomplished with little fanfare.

There is in fact, never more than a minimum of fanfare accompanying any of Colman's activities. Never disguising his dislike of publicity, he is consistently reluctant to give interviews and insists that he is definitely "dull copy."

Born in a small town in Surrey, England, he states "there is no proof that there was ever an actor in my

family before my time." Yet the legend persists that he is a descendant of George Colman, famous 18th Century thespian.

Portrayor in films of the "weary but whimsical sophisticate," Ronald Colman is in reality a quiet, unassuming person with a preference for fishing, hunting and reading. He speaks a smattering of French, German and Italian, and is especially fond of French and Italian dishes.

With his wife, the beautiful Benita Hume, stage and screen star whom he married in 1938, he lives quietly on his San Ysidro Ranch near Santa Barbara, Calif.

Here Is Schedule

"Everything for the Boys" is Ronald Colman's first regular starring part in radio. In addition to his two-way shortwave conversations with servicemen overseas, he appears each week in Arch Oboler's twenty-minute digest-dramas. Forthcoming Oboler-Colman offerings that are scheduled for broadcasts are "Girl of the Road," "Chinese Gong," and "Death Takes a Holiday." Guest stars tentatively set to appear are Jean Arthur, Jack Benny, and Bing Crosby. Oboler hopes to secure Academy Award-winner Jennifer Jones for his dramatization from the Bible on April 4th.

In a survey conducted among servicemen to form a basis for the selection of plays to be presented on this program, the Bible was among the soldiers' primary selections. Oboler threw up his hands at the thought of the task ahead of him. A twenty-minute dramatization from the Bible is no easy assignment, even for Oboler, who has done just about everything.

He has over 500 radio plays to his credit, among which have been such outstanding achievements as the hour-long symphonic presentation of "The Lonely Heart" starring Nazimova; his prize-winning "Alter Ego," in which Bette Davis appeared; his more than eighty-five "beat-the-axis" plays; and his morale-building originals—"Johnny Quinn, U.S.N.," "Hollywood's Salute to the President," and "This Precious Freedom"—which thrice won for him the Radio Academy Award.

The digest-dramas on "Everything for the Boys" are, however, accord-

Careful thought and clever planning have made "Newsical Time" the delight of radio's jive-weary, dial-spinning audiences. Music presented on the program is of pleasing album melodies, varying to no great degree so that listeners are not driven to switching the station off at a sudden blasting of swing tunes. In the three hours, six 25-minute periods of stylized melodies are presented. They include favorites such as the follow-

ing: Hits from the Shows, Songs by Bing Crosby, Gypsy Music, Light Concert Airs, Melodies by Irene Dunne.

Each month a "Newsical Time" calendar, itemizing the program's scheduled musical treats, is printed on our back cover for the convenience of Radio Life's readers.

On every broadcast, the show's announcer presents the latest news releases every half-hour. Figuring that a listener enjoying the musical portion of the program might be inclined to turn his dial to catch the latest news on the hour, "Newsical Time" foresees the listener's intention and presents news bulletins five minutes before the hour and again thirty minutes later. This is added proof of the program's clever advanced planning.

Minimum Plugs

Her Favorites

Jo Stafford's own singing favorites are the Big Foursome—Dinah and Ginny, Bing and Frank—and in addition, Lillian Lane, vocalist with Claude Thornhill. The composers whose work she most admires are Cole Porter and Jerome Kern.

Looking at the menu before us, we asked Jo which were her favorite foods. She replied with a laugh, "Everything that's fattening, of course."

Inclined to be overweight, Jo is nevertheless very attractive. She is tall and gracious, with pretty eyes and a sweet manner. On the afternoon of our luncheon date, she was looking gay and charming in her flowered print blouse, novel earrings and upswept hairdo crowned by two soft velvet bows.

She declared she has never been particularly clothes-conscious, however, and selects outfits that seem slimming for her figure.

Returning to thoughts of dinner, Jo ordered scrambled eggs, explaining that the doctor advised her to eat often of yellow foods to aid her weak eyes.

"Being nearsighted is very bad in this business," she smiled. "Everybody thinks I'm high-hat because I'm continually passing people I know on the street and not speaking to them. It's only because I can't see them!" She wears glasses only when driving or viewing a movie.

ing to Oboler, the toughest thing he has ever tried to do. Condensing the classics into a twenty-minute script is unjust, the radio writer declares. That is why, when presenting "Of Human Bondage," he wrote a supplementary story based on Somerset Maugham's original novel and received author Maugham's approval. "The Prisoner of Zenda" has been requested for a digest-dramatization by his soldier audiences but, Oboler reasons, "it just can't be done."

He hopes eventually to turn to original scripts which he will write for effective presentation in the limited time allotted on this new series. Such was his play, "The Women Stayed at Home," which starred airline actress Mercedes Mc-Cambridge.

On the same broadcast, Ronald Colman read Helen Deutsch's lovely poem, "The White Magnolia Tree," and the comical discourse on General Montgomery called "Monty's Pants." Oboler hopes to present Colman in such features on the programs more often.

Viewed working together, Ronald Colman and Arch Oboler appear as two strikingly contrasting personalities, yet they successfully complement each other's distinctive abilities.

Study In Contrasts

Chicago-bred Oboler is short of stature, casually-dressed, energetic and emotional. Handling the reins at rehearsal, he sat behind the glass partition of the control booth, dynamically gesturing his minute, meticulous directions for the effective coordination of the performers' lines, the sound effects and the beautiful background music supplied so skillfully by the gifted Gordon Jenkins.

At intervals Oboler ran out on the stage to demonstrate further his directions; then the next moment kneeled down on the floor searching for some previously-discarded pages of script.

"I can't keep up with this," Arch exclaimed. "I need a dozen secre-

aries!" He declared that radio is like a hamburger factory. An author has to keep grinding out material without stopping, because radio eats it up so fast.

The characteristically British Colman, in contrast to his co-worker, dresses in a casual but debonaire fashion (usually a sweater and tweeds), and his manner seems to be always calm and unruffled. During the morning rehearsal of their show, while Oboler dashed madly from control room to studio, rewriting his script at intervals of every few seconds, Colman stood by quietly, leaning lazily on his elbow; then softly voiced a suggestion that aided in calming the chaos.

Colman's unemotionalism, however, sometimes shows in his first readings of the script, and in one of the typically humorous comments which he always mutters while directing the dramas, Oboler then queries wryly:

"What's the matter, Ronnie? Is it too early in the morning for you to turn on your charm?"
