Phil Baker Muffs the \$64 Question

"Take It or Leave It" Quiz Master Takes Some of His Own Medicine, Chokes On It

▲ "TAKE IT OR LEAVE IT" is my subject. Go on, ask me anything."

RADIO LIFE asked Phil Baker the \$64 question this week and we are forced to report that the genial emcee of radio's "Take It or Leave It" couldn't give us a satisfactory answer.

Armed with a sheaf of questions based on the general topic of "Radio" and the specific subject of "Take It or Leave It," your Radio Life reporter caught Baker backstage at CBS, where he tosses his quizzical queries each Sunday night.

For more than two years Phil Baker has been prying into the intelligence quotient of the American public from coast to coast and funneling the result to some 25,000,000 radio sets. If you listen to Baker and his assorted contestants long enough, you'll know all the great musicians whose first names are George; you'll be able to identify all the popular songs mentioning kinds of fruit, and you'll be a cinch to toss off the tag lines of all the radio comedians.

Does He Know?

We decided to put Mr. Baker on

the receiving end of a \$64 set of questions about his own program, to find out what kind of information he has collected about the U. S. mass mind. We offer the result below:

RADIO LIFE: All right, Mr. Baker. Your topic is "Take It or Leave It," and the first question is.

What is the funniest answer you ever got from a contestant?

BAKER: Well, only last week I got an elderly gentleman on the program—a retired grocer named Gusse from North Hollywood. That man Gusse was one of the greatest amateur ad libbers I've ever run up against. He had the audience roaring with his opening remark, and he never stopped. After he'd got the first question, I said, "Now you have one dollar. Are you willing to trust me with it and try for two?" He said, "I wouldn't trust you, but I'll trust your company. Go ahead!" So I gave him the whole \$64 and told him to go on home!

RADIO LIFE: That answer is good for one dollar, Mr. Baker. Will you try for two?

BAKER: This is a cinch. Shoot.

RADIO LIFE: Here's the question.

Have you ever paid anyone more than the \$64?

BAKER: Once in New York we gave a contestant twice \$64. He was a soldier on leave and just before he reached the \$64 question I asked him what he was going to do with the money if he won. He said: "I'm going to pay the hospital when my wife has a baby in two weeks." He won the \$64, and I had a happy thought. "Just for fun," I said, "let's see if you could answer just one more question." So I asked him, "What's twice \$64?" He said, "\$128"—so I gave him the \$128.

RADIO LIFE: For that you deserve the two dollars, Mr. Baker. Now we'll try you on the four-dollar query:

What categories are contestants smartest on?

BAKER: I'd say music and movies. We seldom keep a music or film set of questions in more than a week, but some of those history quizzes stay so long I get sick of 'em. A few weeks ago I gave a lady contestant \$64 even though she missed the last question—just so we could mark the set of questions off the books.

Now for \$8!

RADIO LIFE: That earns you four. Now, for \$8 we want to know:

How many times have you been wrong on an answer?

BAKER: That question kind a pinches. Yeah, I've been wrong a few times, though in self-defense I want to add that usually it's a case of there being two correct answers. Once we had a question about the Douglas Dauntless planes and we asked a soldier if they were used by the Navy or Army. He said Army, I called him wrong, and the next week I discovered, via several hundred letters, that the Army did use the Dauntless plane also, except it referred to it by number only. So we sent the soldier his \$64 by mail.

RADIO LIFE: That earns you eight dollars, Mr. Baker. Will you take the eight and spoil our interview, or will you try for sixteen?

BAKER: I'll continue, if you'll say somewhere that we're making a picture called "Take It or Leave It" at Twentieth Century-Fox and—

RADIO LIFE: You have the plug. Here's the question:

Do you think you're running out of questions?

BAKER: Every week we think so. My associate, Miss Edith Oliver, who is living her life out in the public libraries these days, is convinced every Sunday night that this time we've absolutely scraped the bottom of the barrel. You know, once she tried for two days to find out the name of the man who committed suicide by jumping out of a plane over the English channel, just so she could make a question on it.

BAKER: We've both forgotten. And then there was that matter of the fireflies. We tried for weeks to find out what makes fireflies light up. Every entomologist in New York gave us a different answer. We finally gave up.

RADIO LIFE: You have \$16, and we have the making of a nice story. How about \$32 and some more information?

BAKER: I'm your man.

RADIO LIFE: Here it is:

Has any contestant ever bested you?

Ah! It Gets Tough!

BAKER: This is getting tough. You know I have a reputation to maintain. But I had an Army buck private on the program once who chose Mythology as his subject—and do you know he not only answered

every question as soon as it was out of my mouth; but corrected my pronunciation of all the Greek names!

RADIO LIFE: And that answer is worth \$32. Now for the question we've been waiting for:

Who are smarter—the men or the women?

BAKER: Ah—er—you see—uh. That is, I—

RADIO LIFE: No coaching from the readers, please. Go on Mr. Baker, and be explicit.

BAKER: Well, let me put it this way. I'm being married in June. To Miss Irmgaard Erik, a very charming lady. Now, I don't want to get off on the wrong foot. I guess I can't answer that question.

RADIO LIFE: Sorry, Mr. Baker. You have muffed the \$64 question. Better luck next time!

Guesses

There's an interesting little diversion in progress at NBC's newsroom, where the men have set up a chart and each one participating has made a guess as to the day the war will end in Europe. Some thirty-two news room personnel and their friends in the building have bared their choices, the earliest of which was January 16, 1944. Latest guess on the calendar was for August 14, 1945.

Most popular month picked was May this year.

Last Wednesday one of the men (we'll spare him seeing his name in print) came to the day he'd chosen. In a dull moment, several of his co-workers decided to rig up a fake dispatch just to kid the guesser. It looked quite authentic and he almost believed he'd hit the day until the joke was spilled.

Only thing we have to say is, they'd better hold onto a gag release tightly. Imagine what a premature broadcast like that could do. For one thing, it would back Orson (Marsman) Welles smack into a corner.

Fulton Lewis

Washington commentator, Fulton Lewis, jr., who insists on the jr. being in small letters, not capitals, was a recent visitor in Los Angeles, and while he was doing his broadcasts from the Mutual Network on Melrose Avenue, gave Radio Life an interview. We liked Mr. Lewis after first meeting him and writing about him last year. We tried to present him to our readers, not only as a respected commentator, but also as a charming man. The fact that he would speak to us this time proves, we guess, that what we said didn't make him mad.

Instead, he stretched out into an hour what we expected would be a hit-and-run interview.

Mostly, he talked about his idea for a College of American Radio Reporters. As he envisions it, the college would be a self-regulatory group of ten to twelve commentators. These men would be willing to merit membership in the group by doing several things: they would furnish a complete list of every source of income; would supply background on every job they've had, every club they've been affiliated with, their vote, a statement of their political philosophy, along

with a complete statement of their qualifications for membership. In return for this information, the members would be entitled to membership and its aura of prestige and could use the tag, "Member of the American College of Radio Reporters," when signing on or off the air.

Obviously, Lewis' idea is an effort to clear the air of unqualified "commentators," men who know little of their subject and therefore are not competent to express opinions which may influence millions of listeners. "Network chiefs and station heads have given approval to the plan," Lewis pointed out. "Raymond Clapper also supported the idea."

If arrangements move as expected, Lewis hopes to have the College organized within the next year. If he accomplishes his purpose, it won't be the first time that he has pioneered for his fellows. When radio reporters were not admitted to sessions of Congress, it was Lewis who forced the issue which resulted in radio men taking their places alongside newspaper men in the Congressional galleries.

Dennis Exits

Immediately following his appear-

The entire Jack Benny troupe has left Hollywood's NBC studios for an extended northern tour, during which the cast will give shows for hospitals, camps, shipyards and defense plants.

Quizmaster Stumped

Everything happens to Phil Baker, host of CBS' "Take It or Leave It." In this issue of Radio Life, he muffs the sixty-four dollar question. On his broadcast of April 9, a lady contestant stepped up to the microphone, informed the quizmaster that she was an oikologist, and challenged him to explain to his audience the meaning of the word.

Baker couldn't do it. So his contestant confessed that the word was derived from ancient Greek and simply meant "a housewife"! Bet she had been waiting a long time to spring that one.

Local Boy Makes Good

William Hargrave, bass baritone of Culver City, California, emerged as one of the four winners on the Blue Network's "Metropolitan Opera Auditions of the Air," and received \$1,000 in cash along with a much-coveted contract to sing with the Metropolitan Opera Company.

The remaining three winners were Regina Resnik, dramatic soprano, of New York City; Morton Bowe, tenor of Plainsfield, New Jersey, and Hugh Thompson, baritone, of Tacoma, Washington.

Jimmy Durante and Garry "Junior" Moore, the slap-happy stars of CBS' weekly comedy show, are heading this way. They will begin broadcasting from Hollywood's CBS Columbia Square studios on the evening of April 28.

Radio Institute

In collaboration with the National Broadcasting Company, Western Division, the University of California will conduct a Radio Institute during the six-week summer session from June 26 to August 4 on the Los Angeles campus of the university, according to Dr. J. Harold Williams, director of summer sessions.

The Institute will be the second annual one of its kind offered cooperatively between the university and the broadcasting company, and this year will include courses in control room operation, broadcast sales and promotion, radio news preparation, radio writing, radio survey and radio announcing. Registration dates for the Institute are June 24 and 26, with information currently available at the summer session office in the administration building on the Los Angeles campus. In addition to the radio institute, radio work will be available as

a regular part of the summer session offering.

KMPC Boasts

Happily ensconced in its new home on Sunset Boulevard, KMPC is keeping up the news-making pace by telling us about two of the station's employees, Evaleen James and Lillian Sloan. Evaleen and Lillian will appear in concert at the KFWB Concert Hall on Friday night, April 28, at 8:30 o'clock.

Miss James, a soprano, is in reality Marie Hodson, in charge of the music program at KMPC. She received her education in Los Angeles and at Pomona College. Her accompanist, Miss Sloan, is secretary to Don Otis, program director of KMPC, and studied at the University of California.

"So you see," swaggered KMPC, "we are finding hidden talent right here among the members of our own staff."

Diggin' Discs

With JACK LAWSON

THE MERRY MACS, those perennial jackpot hitters, have done it again. Their first recording in eighteen months, "Mairzy Doats," has proved to be one of the biggest hits of their career. They were the first, as a matter of fact, to inflict the tune upon the public. That was last December 11, when they made a guest appearance on the "Lower Basin Street" program in New York. They recorded it at about the same time, and Decca had orders for more than a half million copies on file before it was released.

"MAIRZY DOATS" was important to Merry Macs fans not only because it gave them a new screwy novelty, but it gave the fans a chance for the first time to hear the Macs with two changes in personnel. MARJORIE GARLAND replaced MARY LOU COOK and LYNN ALLEN took the place of the late JOE McMICHAEL when Joe left the act to go into service a year ago. Now, after five months of theater appearances with the new members, the Merry Macs are a greater act than ever before. They have two new ones coming up for Decca in "Something Sweet About Texas" and "Pretty Kitty Blue Eyes."

BIGGEST SONG of today, perhaps, is GORDON JENKINS' "San Fernando Valley." Its popularity started, of course, in California, but through the recordings of BING CROSBY, JOHNNY LONG and others has now become a national favorite. We like JOHNNY MERCER'S waxing of the tune for Capitol, with the radio Barries and Paul Weston's band. It's backed by "Someone's In the Kitchen With Dinah."

"LEAVE US Face It" is the title of a recent disc by HILDEGARDE with HARRY SOSNIK's orchestra. It's a love song introduced on "Duffy's Tavern," written by Ed Gardner himself in Archie's own weird brand of Brooklynese. The label says, "Lyrics, Words and Melody Wrote by Archie of Duffy's Tavern, Aided and Indebted by Abe Burrows and Frank Loesser." Its companion is a tune from the Ginger Rogers picture, "Lady in the Dark," called "Suddenly It's Spring" in the sophisticated Hildegarde style.

FRANKIE CARLE, the keyboard wiz, has a new album of black-and-white magic for Columbia in eight nostalgic "girl" tunes, including "Ida," "Liza," "Charmaine," "Diane," "Margie," "Rose Marie" and "Josephine." Carle, who is called the "modern-day Gershwin," now is playing with his orchestra at New York's Hotel Pennsylvania.

Last Tuesday, when we were wandering around NBC trying to locate the Ronald Colman show, we rambled into Studio C, where the Wistful Vista folks broadcast. At three o'clock in the afternoon, the place was deserted except for a musician practicing on his sax and a repair man mending a seat. So we had a good chance to look at the sound effects which are set up every week for that great moment when Fibber McGee opens that closet door and the stuff comes tumbling down.

To make the best effects, the sound man arranges a stairful of articles. Then, when McGee gets ready, opens a prop door and kicks the mess on the stairway over to create that utter confusion you always hear. What makes the noise, we found on close inspection, is several pairs of shoes (wondered why someone hadn't salvaged them), some empty oil cans, a pair of roller skates, a bowling pin, some broken crockery, a couple of boxes filled with pieces of useless metal and kitchen utensils, a little toy soldier, and an egg beater.

No wonder there's such a racket.

Soundmen who can upset assortments like this one must be rather uninhibited persons, we contemplated, as we left the motley scene.

"Pitchman" Eddie Marr of CBS' Jack Carson comedy show sometimes talks like a medicine show barker even when off the air. The other day he walked into a restaurant and unconsciously went into his "spiel" while ordering lunch. The waitress wrote furiously for a moment and then hurried away without a word. A few minutes later another girl came up and took the order—in shorthand!

Rabbit Retires

Orson Welles' famous rabbit—the one he pulls out of a hat during his pre-broadcast fun sessions—has been retired at an advanced age, and a new bunny debuted at a recent warm-up show which precedes the weekly airing of CBS' "Orson Welles Almanac."

Ballad for Americans

One of the most thrilling tales yet to be told of incidents occurring in enemy prison camps was the one narrated recently by Mutual commentator, Arch Gunnison, who was interned in the Philippines for months after the fall of Bataan.

Gunnison reported that on the Fourth of July, 1942, one of the prisoners played a recording of Bing Crosby singing "A Ballad for Americans," while the imprisoned Americans stood in silence under the cruel, watchful eyes of Japanese guards.

"If Crosby never makes another recording, never sings another song, he may be sure that this one recording alone has paid off," Gunnison declared somberly. "Not in applause, dollars or publicity, but in giving Americans in distress the feeling of home and the renewed determination to hang on."

Since October of 1935 she has been playing Mother Sherwood, living the radio mother's life for so long that it has become just as real to her as her own personal life, whose pattern follows strikingly the fictional one. Natalie Park has not always been Marietta, but she has been a member of the "Hawthorne House" family group for more than five years, and has been so steeped in that imaginary atmosphere that it invades her private life. But Natalie, instead of marrying her radio sweetheart, Ray Lewis (Capt. Tommy Richards), broke the carry-over by marrying another member of the cast. Jack Moyles has been playing Mel Sherwood for so many years that he's taken on many of his "alter-ego's" traits. Dixie Marsh, Yvonne Peattie and Bert Horton all created their current roles of Martha, Adrienne and Duke Calloway, and have been playing them long enough to fall "into character" off the air, as the pictures show.

Dorsey and his orchestra will be the show's guest band.

Busy Little Beaver

WHEN radio actor Tommy Cook was nine years old, he wrote a letter.

"Dear Mother:

I have something I don't want to tell you, but I'm going to tell you. I don't like dramatic stuff. If I could get a chance to be in a good play, I probably would like it.

Yours truly,

TOMMY."

The letter was written four and a half years ago. Since then Tommy with the flashing black eyes and abundant crop of curly, dark hair has had a chance to be in a "good play"—scores of them—and if his opinion were taken now, he'd say, "I like dramatic stuff!"

To his credit may be listed more than 650 air shows including 409 appearances as "Little Beaver" on the "Red Ryder" series and four starring roles on Arch Oboler productions. During the week of last December 20, he played on sixteen programs including "Blondie" (as Alexander), on "Mayor of the Town," "Gallant Heart," "Fashions in Relations," "Great Gildersleeve," "I Was There," and "I Love a Mystery"—all within seven days' time.

Tommy has also had numerous parts on shows like "Silver Theater," "Point Sublime," Bob Burns', and Lux.

Regular Fellow

A busy little trouper, as evidence shows, but in spite of his many radio demands, Tommy is a regular fellow who attends public school, worries if he thinks he's getting a C in arithmetic, and ponders the adolescent problem of taking Dorothy or Betty to the movies. Although his mother watches his manners, we've seen Tommy revert from an autograph-signing star to a hungry boy wolfing his salad at dinner time. He may have all the poise of a seasoned adult when he's on the studio stage, but give him free hand after school and he'll comb the neighbor-

skates who want to give orders for scooters.

We've watched Tommy for several years and he seems to be born for acting. He made his first appearance at a father and son banquet in Duluth, where his dad owns a large clothing store. Tommy, who won a prize because he was the youngest guest (only four), surprised the assemblage by making a "speech."

Gets a Break

When the Cooks moved to Los Angeles because Mr. Cook's health was failing, Tommy was enrolled at Ben Bard School, won a talent contest conducted by the Examiner, and attended Pasadena Playhouse. His first radio break came when he competed in public audition at NBC. First time in front of a microphone was February 8, 1940, when Arch Oboler used him in "A Story in the Night." Tommy didn't know what a cue was, but managed to get by his initiation without upsetting the ether apple cart. Mae Regan, manager of NBC's Artists Bureau, noticed the energetic little boy with the expressive voice and took him under her wing. According to Mrs. Cook, Tommy's real chance came in radio as the result of Miss Regan's interest, his biggest opportunities have been given him by Arch Oboler, whom he worships.

Tommy has done some work, too, in pictures, where he has met many famous stars. One day while walking across the Columbia lot, he

passed Jinx Falkenburg. Turning to his mother, he gasped: "Gee mom, I hope they'll have girls like that when I grow up!"

Personal Appearance

One night "Jungle Girl" was playing at Tommy's neighborhood theater. Because he had had a part in the picture, Tommy was determined to see it. He sneaked away from home and presented himself to the theater manager.

"I haven't any dough," he said, "and I want to see the picture very much. I'll make a personal appearance on the stage if you'll let me in. You see, I'm in the picture."

All he could lose was twenty-five cents admission, the manager argued, so he let Master Cook in. The appearance was a colorful success. Probably the lowest paid personal appearance on record.

The young actor is also interested in writing and producing. When his dad suffered a recent illness, Tommy cheered him up by cutting a record of a one-boy show written, acted, and produced by himself.

His biggest air thrill was emceeing the president's birthday celebration in 1942, in which he introduced sixteen big stars to a coast-to-coast audience, and his biggest personal thrill was the kiss bestowed by one of the actresses—Marlene Dietrich.

"But I'll be doggone mad," Tommy told Radio Life, "if you ever put anything in the magazine about me and girls."

Fellow Americans, Under Al Jarvis' Leadership, Doing Great Job Bringing Laughs To Convalescent Servicemen

commentator for the only one-hour record show, as far as is known, currently broadcast on a network.

But in his new role of emcee for his greatest sustaining sponsor, the convalescent men in Army and Navy hospitals, Jarvis has arrived at a summit of altruistic endeavor.

Every Sunday, with the exception of seven, during the past year, Jarvis has headed the Fellow American enterprise—a two-hour show which is staged in service hospitals within a radius of 150 miles of Los Angeles.

How It Started

Let Al tell in his own story how this remarkable entertainment series began and perhaps, then, you will realize how peculiarly he is equipped to help with this project.

"A year ago, Corporal Bill Willard, who is a sergeant now, was selecting records at one of my record shops. Bill admitted that his forte was classical music and since he was selecting records for the men at the hospital where he was stationed, he wondered if I would like to help

him select the records. I'd go down to the hospital and personally play them for the men. Well, the following Sunday we found ourselves at one of our Army hospitals with a handful of records and about three hundred men hungry for entertainment.

"I couldn't just play one record after another, so I broke it up with talk about the records—a little quiz show that the fellows seemed to enjoy tremendously."

After the program, a wounded captain walked up to Jarvis and talked with him about music. The moment the soldier left, one of the nurses said, "Congratulations. For the six weeks that man has been here he has thought of nothing else except wanting to go back to his men in Africa. This is the first time anyone has been able to penetrate his thoughts with anything else. It's a good sign. He'll be out of here before you know it."

Results Amazing

Because he was amazed at the results of his unpretentious little record show, Jarvis decided to follow through. His Fellow American campaign, made possible by the audience of his "Original Make-Believe Ballroom," on KFVB, has grown to thriving dimensions and today, instead of presenting the records, Jarvis emcees his Hospital Surprise Show which presents the recording artist in person. He started by asking members of the radio audience

His "Original Make-Believe Ballroom" on KFVB is full speed ahead (three and a half hours daily, 23 participating sponsors).

He is emceeing a new, one-hour record program called "Downbeat Derby," sponsored by Union Oil on KHJ-Don Lee, which has whisked off to a fast start over all 36 stations of the Don Lee net. The platter show, heard on Saturday night, is unusual because Jarvis' comments and spot appearances of noted musical stars give the whole program the flavor of a live broadcast.

On "Downbeat Derby," radio veteran Al, who has been spinning and talking about discs for a dozen years,

So far, \$2,569.11 have been donated and 20,000 packages of cigarettes have been given the convalescents. Packages are presented in the name of the person sending in money and bear a small note "Best wishes for a speedy recovery." Instead of one man to distribute the gifts, from ten to thirty hostesses, white and colored, hand-picked from more than 400 applicants, accompany the troupe.

Use Psychology

The girls are selected not only for their looks but for their brains. "Believe it or not," comments Jarvis, "we have three psychology majors, two school teachers, one girl who is in her last year in medicine. None of the entertainers gets paid."

The show is called a "surprise" because it is not billed in advance in order to avoid disappointment in case of last-minute changes in personnel. While the main program is progressing before a grouped audience, some of the players visit the wards. No part of the hospital is passed up. "The psychopathic ward is where we do our most important work," remarked Jarvis as he went on to tell how cleverly the girls handle the serious mental cases.

In one ward, a Negro was burned so badly that he was repulsive. "You don't have to go in there," Jarvis warned the girls, but unhesitatingly they brushed past him. When the leader saw the Negro stoically sitting on the edge of his bed, she tipped her head back and laughed. "Gosh, you're a mess!" she exclaimed, and when the man saw that she was laughing at him rather than shunning him, he started to laugh, too. Then the troupe proceeded with a jolly show.

Jarvis Ideal M.C.

Because he has been in radio for fourteen years and knows show people, Jarvis occupies an enviable spot which makes him the ideal emcee for a hospital program. Asked whether he had ever added up the score of important band leaders whom he has interviewed, Al replied: "I honestly think it would be easier to take it the other way around and say that if you were to take all the band leaders I haven't interviewed, you could add them up on one hand."

Among talent volunteering to

make the Sunday trip have been Ransom Sherman, Spike Jones and his Slickers, Woody Herman and his band, Hal McIntyre, Cab Calloway, Bing Crosby, the Charioteers, Arthur Q. Bryan, Marlin Hurt, Jo Stafford and the Pied Pipers, Johnny Mercer, the Barrie Singers, the Four Blazes, King Cole Trio, and many more.

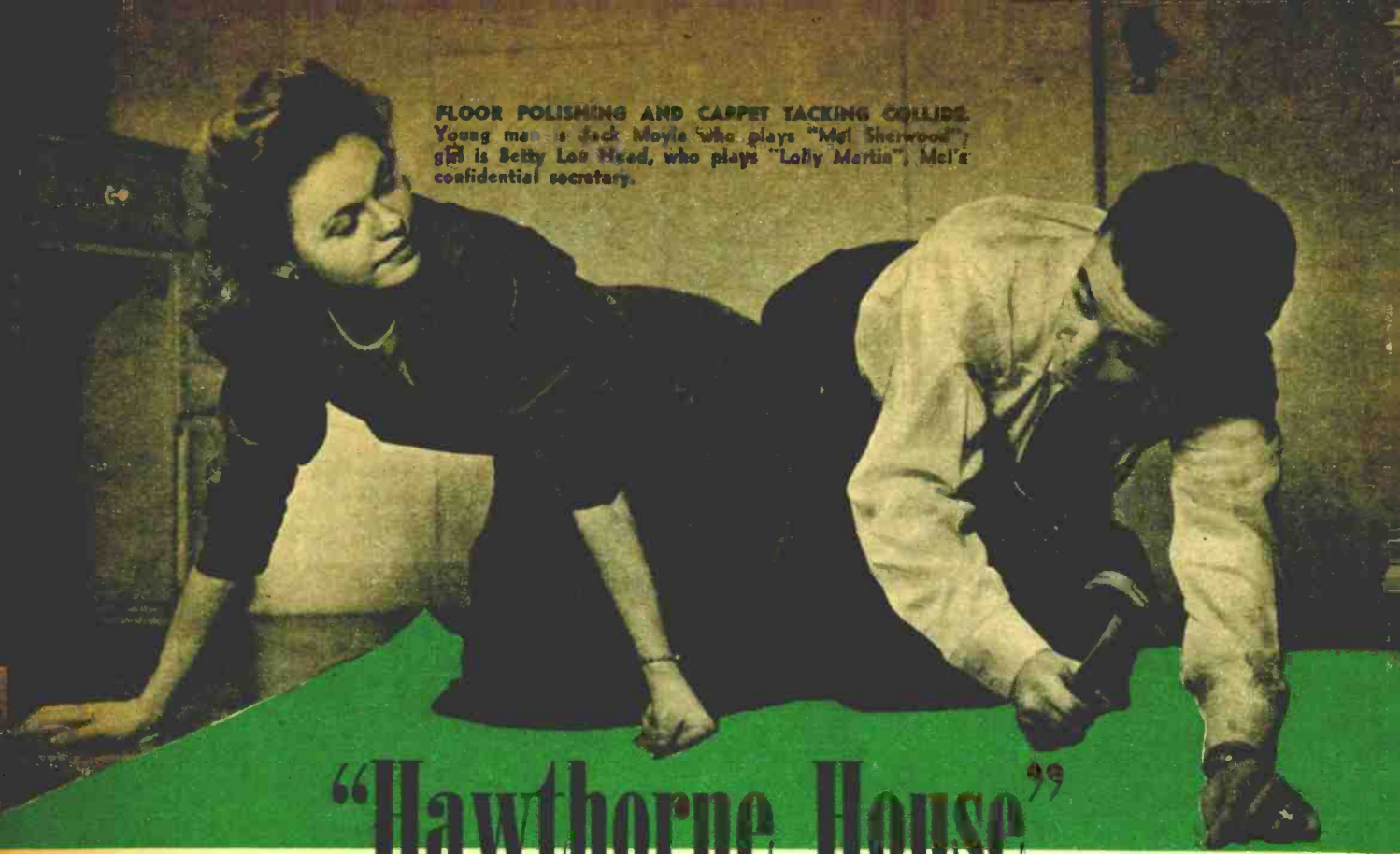
Jarvis thinks the troupe has played to more than 32,500 men. He dreams of the movement being enlarged to take in more hospitals and to pre-

sent more shows. Although unable to emcee all of them, he could train others to carry on with the original format. For remember, and we must, that the problem of hospitalized service men will grow increasingly important as time goes by.

Radio folk may be proud that they have a part in solving the entertainment quest for these men and that they have an experienced showman like Al Jarvis to take the initiative in organizing the movement.

Monty Mohn. Shortly after that, the new husband was called to the service of his country and had to leave his bride in the old house which they had just bought and had begun to fix over.

Roles Carry Over

Well, Natalie's ether mother and the other members of the Sherwood household carried their radio roles right over into real life and banded together to help her with the house. For one thing, Natalie was determined to have a charming home to

which Monty could return for short furlough visits and, finally, for good and all, after the war. Her second plan was to turn over all but a few rooms to paying guests for the duration, as Mother Sherwood had done at Hawthorne House.

One day a few weeks ago, Ray Buffum, author-producer, and his entire cast met at Radio City, San Francisco, and piled into waiting cars which drove them across the Golden Gate bridge into Marin County, to

Get to Work
