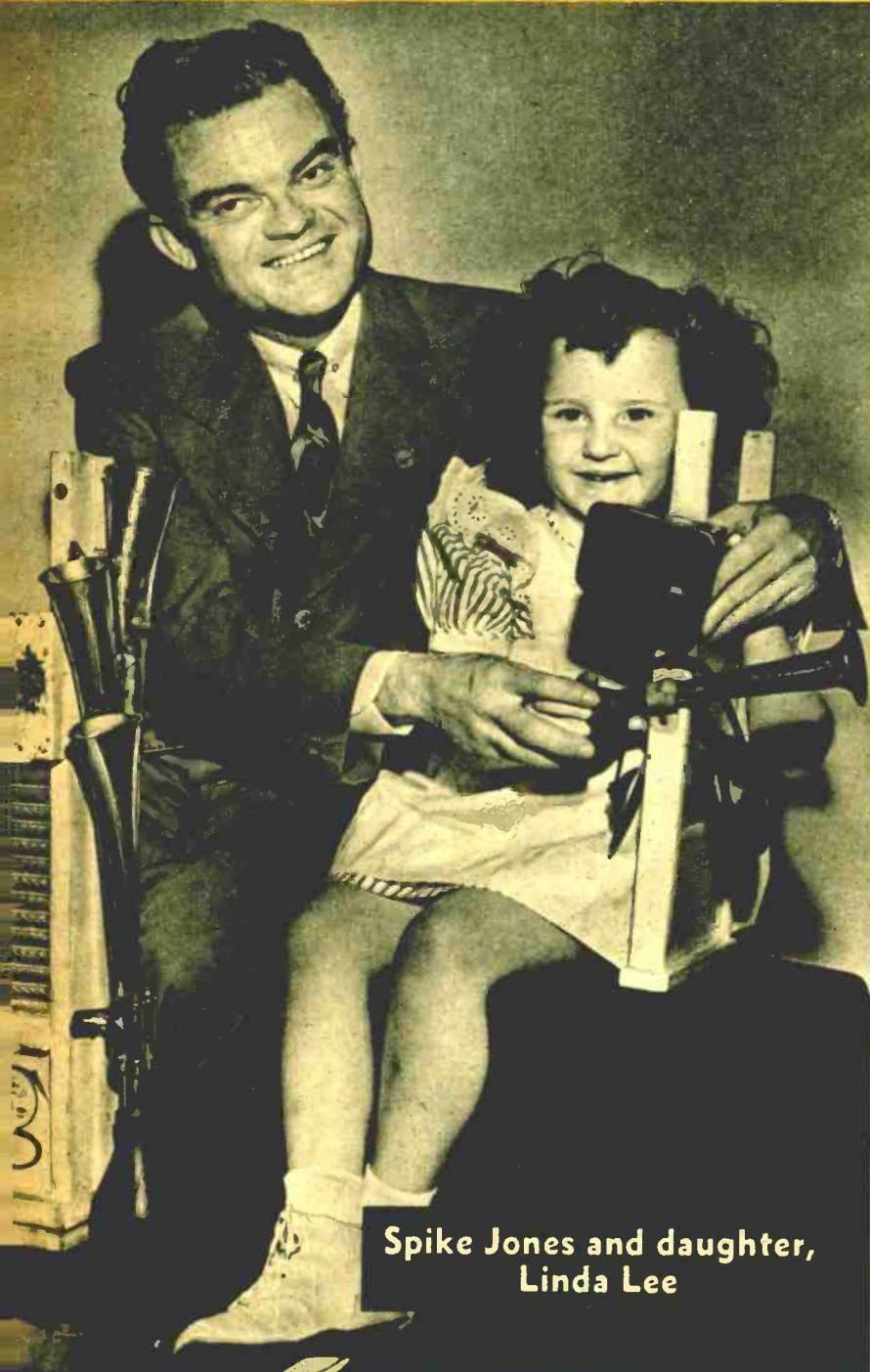

Roosty of the A.A.F.

SOMET Sergeant Roosty Sloane—which is a fictitious name—fresh off a bomber but lately returned from England. Sergeant Sloane was carrying a flight-bag with the grease and mud of a bomber station in its pores. He said it contained, among other things, three pairs of genuine silk full-fashioned stockings which he had bought from a G.I. in Natal, Brazil for three dollars a pair. My mention of these stockings in no way implies endorsement by the War Department. The stockings, for all the War Department knows, may be Grade 3 and full of runs.

"Maybe it comes up tails," Sergeant Sloane said, "and the silk worms were tired. But in England they'd be worth fifteen bucks a pair. The slick chicks over there really go for silk stockings."

Among the other items Roosty

brought home were a pair of dice (no endorsement); a small rag doll named Nicodemus (mascots are permissible at discretion of commanding officers) a quart of Scotch (definitely no endorsement) and a dollar with two heads (possession frowned upon by Treasury Department). Roosty also had some stories about sailors in Algiers (not cleared by Navy Department); some candid opinions of cold toast, haggis, trifle puddings, kippered bloaters (not coordinated with State Department for press release) and a great deal of Army Air Force shop talk.

Roosty's conversation, however, dealt very little with air combat. He was going back to England soon and one gathered that bomber strikes at Germany were an old, grim story.

"Ain't All Tears"

"We laugh it up when we can," he said, "and when we can't laugh we try to keep our mouths buttoned. But it ain't all tears over there."

Roosty's B-24 Liberator "Lovin' Lulu" is a sweet character, he said, and Captain Nails McCabe, the Skipper, is a character too, but not sweet. Roosty has a pal, Sergeant Jedge Jackson, and a crew of eight other boys whom he loves like brothers—even Nails McCabe. Roosty's bomber station is, he told me, full of characters both sweet and sour. There is Stephanie Smythe, barmaid at the

Coach & Eight pub; Hunk Spivak, a line chief; and Stoker Harry Smythe of His Majesty's Navy. There are also several guys named Joe.

But it all added up to this: that war is not entirely a tragic drama of wounds and death. Our men overseas find occasion for laughter too, the laughter that G.I. Joe of the A.A.F. relishes as a blessed relief from grimness. Roosty himself remembers the scrapes and the gags; the comic misunderstandings and the chuckles. He is going back to them as well as to the belly turret of "Lovin' Lulu."

Refutes Blight Idea

As a psychological study, Sergeant Roosty Sloane is a startling refutation of the idea that this most horrible of all wars marks and blights American boys beyond redemption. The A.A.F. has had its psychic-shock casualties, but the vast majority of combat personnel adjust themselves to the strain of war. Roosty's own adjustment is realistic. He believes as follows:

1. The A.A.F. is winning the war but no one outside the A.A.F. will admit that.

2. Roosty Sloane is helping the A.A.F. win the war but no one outside the crew of the Lovin' Lulu will give him any credit.

John Nesbitt's Formula

"The Passing Parade" Impresario Employs a Synthetic Conceit to Command an Audience's Attention; Becomes "Slangy" Away From Mike

MY ambition," smiles story-teller John Nesbitt, "is to be a country squire. I would like someday to do my broadcasts from my own library, where I could sit comfortably in front of a window looking out upon delphiniums growing close to the house and collies frolicking upon the lawn.

"And of course," continued the twinkling blue-eyed radio-film commentator with a grin, "I'd want to see little men rolling wheelbarrows up the walk to deposit piles of money at my door!"

Until the dawn of that golden day, however, John Nesbitt finds himself

satisfactorily content with what he describes as his "serene life."

Serene, we would say, isn't quite the word for it, since it involves the writing and narrating of at least ten movie shorts yearly and four radio scripts weekly. Nesbitt's "Passing Parade" is heard currently over CBS every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, and as a special feature of the Sunday morning Westinghouse show on NBC.

Employs 14 Persons

To aid him in the tremendous task of research required for the stories he spins, Nesbitt employs a staff of fourteen employees, among them a military advisor. On his current CBS series, the "Passing Parade" impresario combines wondrous tales of World War II with fabulous, fascinating experiences of the past.

Asked about the sources of the

stories he tells, Nesbitt replied: "I don't exactly know where I get them all, but I know it sometimes drives me crazy."

His files are voluminous and extensive. "But," he laughs, "I have no knowledge whatsoever of where anything is in them."

Generally, a provocative topic comes to his mind, and from then on he is constantly searching for anecdotes which will supply an angle on which to hang his yarn. When he has an effective, complete story in mind, he prepares a rough draft, then writes it in script form. "Putting it down on paper," Nesbitt declares, "is exceedingly easy."

"What is fun to me," the narrator continued, "is being absolutely authentic and completely up-to-date." Another thing that particularly pleases Nesbitt is taking the "little things" that everyone likes—things of the utmost simplicity—investing them with the highest literary quality.

Conceit Is Synthetic

Nesbitt's style of speaking is distinctive and convincing. As one of his co-workers puts it, he has a "mountain-topy" type of delivery. Nesbitt declares that his microphone manner is the result of a pointer picked up from the old-time vaudevillians who stood in the wings and boasted: "Watch me—I'm going to lay 'em in the aisles."

"To command the attention of an audience," Nesbitt states, "one needs a sort of synthetic conceit."

Away from the microphone, the narrator completely abandons his commanding airs, and becomes a relaxed, likeable—or, as he himself names it—a "slangy" sort of man.

Born in Vancouver, British Columbia, and educated at Berkeley High School, St. Mary's College and the University of California, John Nesbitt's early ambition was to be a Shakespearean actor. He received his first vocal training in Shakespearean acting and appeared on the stage with George Arliss in "The Merchant of Venice." After a year as teacher of Shakespearean literature in college, he spent another year condensing the bard's plays to one-hour length for a San Francisco radio station. Then he became an announcer at a Spokane, Washington station.

Trunk Is Inspiration

The birth of Nesbitt's popular "Passing Parade" series occurred when he searched through an old trunk left to him by his father, who was a writer, lecturer, editor, Yale and Sorbonne professor and Unitarian minister. The trunk contained

THINGS are looking up at 79 Wistful Vista. Fibber McGee and Molly have a maid!

Her name is Beulah. "I'm the general factotum for Mist' and Miz McGee. In fact, I tote 'em their breakfast, lunch and dinnah every Tuesday. I is the laundress, the maid, the cook, an' general futtily woman."

"I think," observed Fibber, "you mean *utility*, Beulah. Futtily means it is hopeless."

Beulah (sharply): "I know what I mean!"

To the fireside listener, Beulah represents another refreshing character on a top show that has made a reputation for its brilliant supporting players (Bill Thompson, Hal Peary, Gale Gordon, Arthur Q. Bryan, Ransom Sherman). But to the visual audience, Beulah is a riot, because she is played, not by a talented colored girl, but by a husky young white fellow named Marlin Hurt, practically six feet tall and 175 pounds in weight.

Bet on It

Fans who haven't seen Marlin do the part can't believe that Beulah is a man. "Ninety-five percent of my letters ask whether it is true I'm not a woman," Hurt claims. "A favorite trick of those who know me is to bet on it, an awfully easy way to make five bucks!"

According to her creator, Beulah is the counterpart of the family cook, Mary, who ruled the Hurt household back in Duquoin, Illinois.

Capable, religious, and with fine humor sense, Mary used to tell the boy, Marlin, "Wipe yo' shoes off. Got to have clean shoes, else yo' can neber climb dose gol'en stairs!"

Even as a small lad, Marlin perfected imitations of Mary. He seemed to come by it naturally; then, too, his father was a theater manager. After he had finished high school and had worked in a coal mine and cigar factory, young Hurt auditioned for radio. It was one of those zany situations where he played, according to his own admission, "a very

bad sax" and his teammate played piano. But the confused station manager hired them as a vocal combination and they had to deliver or give up the chance. A mix-up that worked out, because from there Marlin went into the "Tom, Dick and Harry" act. As Dick, he worked from 1930 to 1943, when the death of Tom terminated the long association.

Meantime, Hurt hadn't forgotten Mary and he kept his dialect parts polished. Beulah had already made her advent in 1940, when he introduced her to the air on NBC's "Showboat," in which Marlin played five roles.

Comes to Hollywood

Following the break-up of "Tom, Dick and Harry," Hurt came west last summer. Two days after his arrival here, he was cast in the part

of Beulah on the Fred Brady show, which replaced Bob Burns for the summer. The character was such a hit that each Thursday night Beulah's laugh brought the program on the air. Don Quinn, Fibber McGee and Molly scripter, who had known about Hurt's character since "Showboat" days, liked the role for Fibber and Molly's show. "I had always wanted to be on with them," commented Hurt, and as simply as that, he joined the Wistful Vista family in January of this year. In addition to the role of Beulah, Hurt also plays the part of Beulah's boy friend, Bill.

On the first broadcast, the dialogue skimmed along like this:

Molly: What uniform do you wear, Beulah?

ablaze with light. Every single man out front had lit a large match and held it up before him.

"That's it!" a nearby army officer hastily explained to the bewildered little performer, "That is the men's greatest tribute to an entertainer. In other words, they think you're tops!"

Servicemen's Queen

In the opinion of servicemen the world over, Sara Berner is tops. Radio audiences who have heard her in a vast variety of comedy and dramatic characterizations, have much the same opinion of this clever young lady, but to the boys in khaki and navy blue, she has become someone special. Servicemen stationed all over the world write to her, singing their letters simply, "Your friend, George—or Bill, or Jim, or Jack." She is their friend because she talked to them one night when they needed someone to talk to, because she handed them a laugh when they needed a laugh so desperately.

Sara Berner is the little gal who was flown out to the battle-scarred aircraft carrier, "Saratoga," to give a show for those war-weary pilots and crewmen on board ship who immediately returned to action in the Marshall Islands. Sara is the clever little mimic who has taken her comedy act to over 300 army camps, in addition to giving eighty-four performances at the Hollywood Canteen and appearing frequently on radio's "Command Performance," the program that is shortwaved exclusively to our fighting men abroad.

An especially poignant experience for the actress was her personal appearance at a crowded embarkation camp. Right in the middle of her act, some of the soldiers out front shouldered their rifles, strapped on their helmets, smiled sheepishly at her and waved a timid farewell. They marched out of the post theater to report immediately aboard ship to sail for "somewhere in the Pacific."

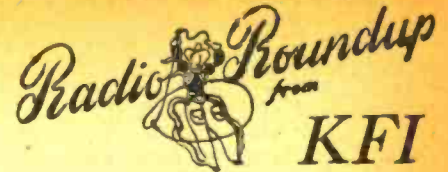

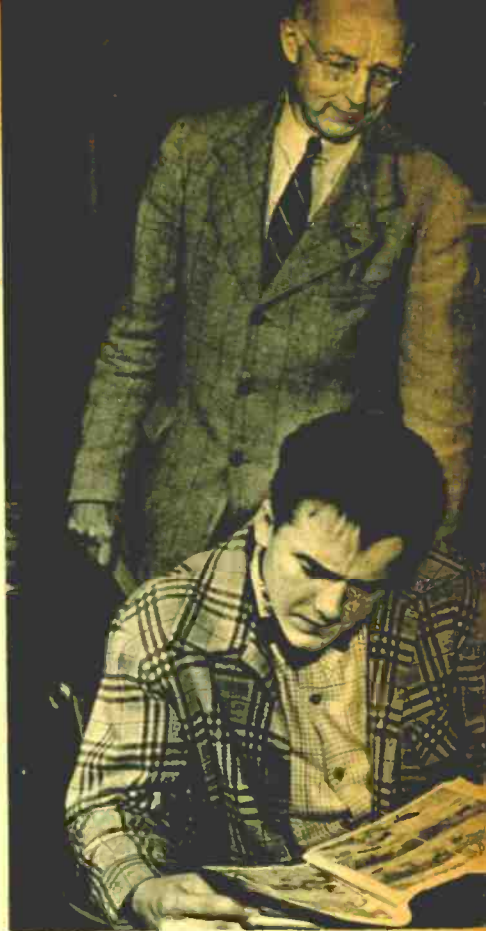
Broke Resistance

Before that momentous event occurred, however, Hildegarde Sell (born in Nadell, Wisconsin, and raised in Milwaukee which she considers her home town) toured the vaudeville circuits as the only girl member of a twelve-piece orchestra; then in an act called Jerry and Her Three Baby Grands. When the act folded, she became an accompanist for the dancing DeMarcos and other outstanding artists.

Played For Movies

As a child she had studied voice and piano under the guidance of her mother, who was a choir singer. Then, at the age of sixteen, she made her professional debut playing piano accompaniment in the pit of a local movie house for the silent epics of the screen.

It was when she became tired of one-night stands and the insecurity of playing the keyboard that the songstress abandoned her climb toward a stage career to take a job as a song plugger in Irving Berlin's New York establishment. The office manager there heard her present one of Berlin's hit tunes and quickly advised: "Go back to the stage."

Comedian Joe Laurie Jr. arranged an audition with Gus Edwards for her, and it was then that one of the show world's most spectacular personalities came into being. It was Edwards who told her, "Drop your last name. Become just "Hildegarde."

Originally billed as a Dutch comedienne, her sophisticated showmanship became apparent in a short while. Martin Poulson, then in New York to seek talent for his Cafe de Paris in London, signed Hildegarde after a series of auditions which eliminated four hundred other aspirants.

After her London debut, she entertained in Parisian cafes, where she was simply "an interesting American performer." She was constantly encouraged by Poulson, who told her that she was merely ten years ahead of her era. At that time, however, Hildegard needed money. One night, at the Club Casanova, King Gustave of Sweden heard her. It was on that same evening that her engagement terminated, however, and the next morning after

World Events Program Featuring Well-Known Commentators Marks End of First Year. On the Air

It was 12:59 p.m.—on Monday, March 15, 1943. In spacious Studio "H" of the Blue Network at Hollywood—a group of men was poised. Three were standing at microphones. One was seated at a table. All eyes were turned toward the producer's booth. The red second hand crept slowly down the right side of the clock. "Thirty Seconds" came the warning.

Just as slowly, the second hand climbed up the left side on the big white face of the time-teller. It reached the top. On flashed a red light.

"The Blue Newsroom Review." It was the voice of Announcer Henry Weaver, heralding the birth of a new program on the air, a full hour of news and comment. It was the fulfillment of weeks and weeks of strenuous work by Program Director Leo Tyson.

For the first time, Weaver—"Hank" to the Blue Network—radiant in a sports jacket with more colors than the Coat of Joseph, a jacket that would shock even blase Hollywood Boulevard out of its lethargy, told the radio listeners of the Pacific Coast that they were to be informed and entertained by a program that would cover the world.

Awaiting Cues

In Studio "H" were Reed Browning, to report the headlines of the hour, Collman Willson to give the news on the Pacific Slope. And there was yours truly, seated at a table—to comment on news of the world, in a radio debut on the "Blue Newsroom Review." Waiting for his turn at the microphone was Chapin Hall, with his review of "That's What Goes On Today."

There was a quick switch to San Francisco, where General Paul B. Malone, U.S.A. retired, gave his expert analysis of the war news. There

"Everywhere I go," the actress emphasized, "I have found it easy to mingle with the enlisted men. I've talked with them, eaten K-rations with them, and signed autographs for them by the hour. I have had no gold-braid or brass-hat trouble. American officers are wonderfully democratic, informal and fun."

Danced With General

At one camp, to the delight of his men, a two-star general condescended to do a jitterbug routine with the actress. Then after the dance was over, the general's wife requested Sara to do an impersonation of her husband. "But I didn't have the nerve," grins Sara.

It is unusual for the gifted Miss Berner to lack the nerve to give any impersonation. Consciously or unconsciously, she is liable to mimic anybody, anywhere, at any time. That's how she ended her career as a salesgirl at Wanamaker's exclusive department store in Philadelphia. She made the mistake of mimicking one of the institution's best customers, unaware that the infuriated subject of her impersonation was standing right behind her. Sara and Wanamakers promptly parted company.

She turned to her true element—show business, joining a vaudeville troupe which eventually landed her in Los Angeles, where she did a stint at the Orpheum Theater.

Her radio career began with a spot on the Eddie Cantor airshow. She did an impersonation of Katharine Hepburn. Cantor became so impressed with her work that he handed her some of his own biggest laugh lines. Sara still appears often on the Cantor program, playing, among other roles, the part of Ida, Eddie's wife. On the Jack Ben-

ny show, she is heard frequently as "Gladys," Jack's girl friend.

On Other Shows

In addition to the Benny and Cantor show, the actress does a variety of characterizations regularly on such programs as Dinah Shore, Amos 'n' Andy, "A Date With Judy," "Ceiling Unlimited," Judy Canova, Jack Carson and "I Was There."

For some time, producers could think of her as nothing but the "dumb telephone operator" type. Then Paul Pearce had the foresight to cast her as the dramatic lead in his presentation of "Cat People" on "Stars Over Hollywood." On "Hollywood Radio Theater" she starred in a play about a serviceman on leave who called every girl whose telephone number was listed in his buddy's "little red book." There were eight girls and Sara Berner played them all.

"Radio," she declares, "is the most wonderful teacher there is."

Sara also does many of the cartoon voices that are most familiar to every moviegoer—including those in the unique George Pal Puppets. In the course of her career she has played roles ranging from a ten-day-old baby to a sixty-year-old woman. She supplied the cries of the ten-day-old infant for the Greer Garson picture, "Blossoms in the Dust." In preparation for the part, she donned a hospital mask and mingled among a roomful of newborn babies to study the sound of their crying.

"Sure," She Says

She has done just about everything to add another authentic accent to her amazing repertoire. Arch Oboler called her at one time to do an old Armenian woman. "Can you do it?" he queried.

"Sure," replied Sara; then made a frantic dash for the phone book to find the address of the nearest Armenian rug dealer!

"You never can tell what Sara's going to do next," exclaims her ever-indulgent husband, Arthur Solomon. "She is liable to bring anyone home with her, if the stranger's accent happens to intrigue her."

When one is walking down the street with her, she is apt suddenly to disappear at any moment. If she hears a voice that interests her, she follows it eagerly eavesdropping on every word. She talks to cab drivers for hours at a time, learning about people and studying their all-American accents and mannerisms.

When conversing with a soldier, she absorbs his personality so readily that she often finds herself unconsciously speaking in exactly the same manner he does. Result is the boy is delightfully certain that she came from his own section of the country.

Trick Bag Is Full

Actually, Sara was born in Albany, New York; then moved to Tulsa, Oklahoma, where she received her schooling. She started acquiring her repertoire of voices by attending the

movies and mimicking screen personalities. Her act now includes inimitable impersonations of Bette Davis, Una Merkel, Fanny Brice, Gracie Allen and Eleanor Roosevelt.

But her impressions of all kinds of people are inspired by persons from ordinary walks of life. She once had a landlady whom she had cause greatly to dislike. The voice of that landlady has been heard by moviegoers the world over, and is still being heard in theaters today.
