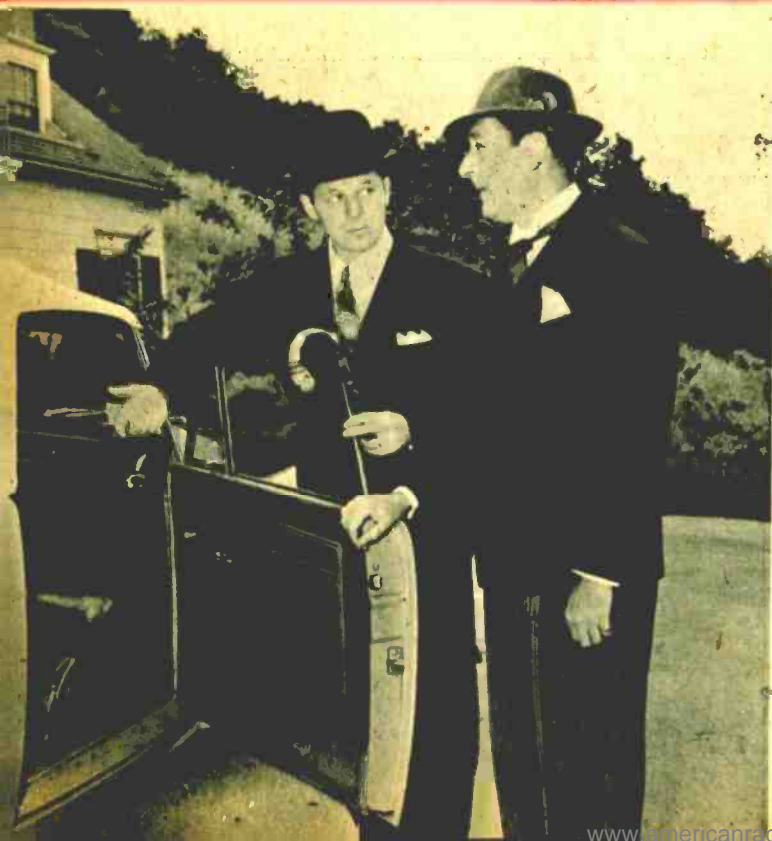

My Life In a Jap Prison Camp

JUST HOW DO American prisoners fare in Japanese prison camps? What are the camps like? How much is there to eat? What do the internees have to "take" from the Japs?

These questions and dozens like them are typical of those your reporter asked Mrs. Royal Arch Gunnison, wife of the KHJ-Mutual Don Lee commentator when she arrived in Hollywood after her recently completed cross-country tour with her famous husband. Mr. and Mrs. Gunnison were interned in two Japanese prison camps—one in Manila and one in Shanghai—for almost two years after the fall of Manila. Slight in stature, brown-haired, brown-eyed, soft-spoken, Mrs. Gunnison looks little able to stand the rigors of a war prison camp; yet she did stand it with the loss of only 18 pounds weight compared with her husband's loss of 40 pounds. A former newspaper woman who was an Asiatic correspondent for the North American News Alliance, Mrs. Gunnison is no stranger to the Orient. Here is her story:

"People ask me how prison camps are constructed. They're usually old, abandoned school buildings made of plaster mud. In the summer the walls turn to dust and in the winter to liquid. The Japs made barracks of the old school rooms, and crammed as many cots into each one as it would hold. Each wall would be lined with cots, with an aisle down the middle, and each prisoner possessed, for his own use, just his cot and the space above and below it—none on either side, for there was no space on

either side. To get in your cot, you climbed in over the foot.

"For a time in Manila, our quarters were palatial—four of us shared a 10x15 foot room with four cots, a table, and a stove, but this was the exception.

Live or Die?

"Around the school buildings and the compound is a barbed wire fence, and we lived in the area inside the fence. The Japs, of course, didn't care if we lived or died, and if we intended to live it was up to us. So we set up a prison camp government. We had work committees and everybody was assigned to certain jobs. If somebody got sick, then his duties were re-divided among the rest. We had almost no soap, nothing to help us keep clean. The weather was mostly continual, torrential rains with accompanying mud and slush. What little food there was was rotten . . . the rice, for instance, was so poor that the Chinese coolies who exist on it went without, rather than eat ours. It wasn't living . . . it was existing, and if we hadn't set up some sort of community government we couldn't even have accomplished that.

"So we had details . . . one to clean the barracks, one to police the grounds, one to teach the children, one to supervise their play, one to cook, one to sort over the rice and food, and so on. Only under this system were we able to get along under such desperately trying conditions.

"A day in camp begins with roll

call. You line up in the hall outside your room. In the summer, you wear a coat; in the winter you don't, no matter how cold or hot you are, because roll call is a formal occasion and that is the Japanese custom for formality. Japanese officers march down the hall, and one of them calls out 'Numba!' You count off, and after that you have breakfast.

Ate Worms

"Most of the time we had three meals a day, but some of the time it was only two. Our principal diet was congee, which is rice boiled to a mush. The rice came to us in sacks from the sweepings and we cooked it ourselves, first going over it carefully to remove as much of the dirt, stones, and worms as we could. Rice and cracked wheat, which we got sometimes, have two kinds of worms—brown and white. The brown ones you can get out, but the white ones are hard to see, so you just forget they're there. Usually, 40 per cent of the food given us was a total loss.

"After breakfast we worked at our chores, and then we had lunch if we were getting three meals a day. Lunch was more rice, and possibly some poor cabbage and a little fish. The fish was so bony that it only made two or three mouthfuls, so it didn't matter much if we got it or not. For dinner there was soup. Twice in Manila they gave us buffalo meat. It was bloated and it was covered with flies, and we knew we'd get sick if

D Day

Last week, radio did a job of which it may always be proud, and a service to the world which cannot be estimated.

When the Allied armed forces shoved across the English Channel for the "big push" into occupied France, radio was ready. Gathered en masse around their radio dial, Mr. and Mrs. America found themselves in a front row seat to hear history in the making.

For weeks and months in advance, radio had been making extensive plans and preparations for immediate, accurate coverage of the long-anticipated event. When D Day came, radio faithfully fulfilled its duty to the public by sweeping all else aside to bring to its listeners the one item about which all were vitally concerned—*invasion!*

NBC Coverage

Sweeping its schedule free of commercials, the National Broadcasting Company's international news machine, massed for attack, swung into immediate action with the first flash of the Allied invasion.

Working under a carefully prepared

plan devised in great detail by William F. Brooks, director of NBC News and Special Events, and beginning with the advance bulletin by Berlin radio, which announced at 9:41 p.m. on June 5 that the long-awaited invasion had taken place and that Allied forces had landed on French soil, NBC correspondents in this country and abroad supplied a constant flow of flashes, bulletins and analytical comment to the network's affiliated stations and their listeners.

The cancellation of all commercial shows, a move regarded as revolutionary in the business of broadcasting, was immediately ordered.

Loudspeakers were installed outside the Sunset and Vine Radio City building and in the lobby.

Most dramatic episode in revising the schedule was the cancellation of Red Skelton's 7:30 p.m. period, his last broadcast for the duration. Skelton, slated for Army induction on the following day, went on the air in strictly a serious vein with Harriet Hilliard and Ozzie Nelson at 7:50 p.m. for a ten-minute farewell.

Other Changes

Ginny Simms went on at 5:00 p.m.,

the hour she broadcasts for the east, for a coast-to-coast release of a special program built around Dr. Corydon Wassell, famed Jap naval hero, and cancellation of the Ginny Simms west coast repeat airing brought a premiere hearing to westerners of NBC's "Words at War," to be heard weekly over NBC at 6:30 p.m. under the title, "Theater at War". The "Richfield Reporter" deleted all commercials at 10:00 p.m. for complete coverage of the up-to-the-minute news, followed by a splendid round-table analytical recap by outstanding Hollywood commentators, Louis P. Lochner, Rupert Hughes, Fleetwood Lawton and Upton Close, with Sam Hayes, Art Baker and John Wald acting as moderators and breaking in with news flashes.

Eye-Witness Accounts

Following the first communique concerning the invasion from the Allied command at 12:32 a.m. on June 6, NBC brought its listeners General Eisenhower's message to his troops, followed by reports from London and United States commentators. From invasion headquarters, airplane audiences heard King Haakon of Norway and the Netherlands' prime minister in exile, give instructions to their respective countrymen. At 1:17 a.m., NBC correspondent Wright Bryan electrified Americans with the first eye-witness account of the beachhead landings as seen from a plane. The softening-up bombing of the French coastal areas by Allied warships and plane armadas was described at 1:48 by James Willard from London, and at 3:04, Ed Haaker, also speaking from London, gave a brief account of his trip over invasion territory as a passenger in a 9th Air Force plane.

Later, NBC aired the ringing of the historic Liberty Bell in Philadelphia, and the prayers of prominent Americans for the men engaged in the great battle abroad. Less than five hours after the official announcement of the invasion, Stanley P. Richardson, in charge of NBC's London office, had returned from a trip to France on a naval craft to broadcast.

Regular network operations resumed on the National Broadcasting chain Wednesday, June 7.

Blue Pitches In

Immediately on receipt of the news that the Allied invasion had begun, the task of mobilizing an "invasion news force" at the Blue Network headquarters was started under the direction of John Madigan of the newsroom staff.

Simultaneously, a bulletin was rushed to every station on the network to remain on the air indefinitely, and emergency telegrams were sent out to every available newsman and commentator. Radio bulletins were flashed to Blue Network listeners every minute, giving a continual flow of developments as picked up from Berlin broadcasters, preceding the confirmation of the action from Allied headquarters.

A half hour before the first Allied communique came through, Edgar Kobak arrived at the studios and im-

mediately issued to all Blue stations the following statement:

"Invasion news will take precedence over all regular Blue Network programs today. The regularly scheduled programs may be cancelled or rebuilt to fit the news needs of the hour so that all the latest invasion news and invasion features can be presented to the listening public without the slightest delay . . ."

"Blue Network newsmen here and abroad are on constant duty to present calm, serious interpretation of the fast-breaking events. Many features are being prepared hourly, scheduled to be either worked into, or to replace, the regular programs.

"Patriotic and war messages will be substituted for the regular commercial announcements . . ."

Blue Network listeners heard Baukhage covering events in Washington, a special religious service from Chagrin Falls, Ohio, where the townspeople gathered in a church to participate in D Day prayers, and Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt's plea to the nation's mothers to remain vigilant during the trying hours.

At 7:00 a.m., which is the regular time for the network to go on the air, it was announced that one minute out of each program starting at 11:00 o'clock, would be given over to invasion news.

Listeners to the Columbia Network

heard an instantaneous report of the world-shaking international event when newsman Bob Trout, from New York, took a traveling microphone into the CBS News Bureau and was on the spot when word of the Allied invasion of Europe flashed across the teletype wires at 12:32 a.m. on June 6.

In New York City, Trout went on the air at midnight for what was originally scheduled to be a five-minute broadcast period. But an experienced, coast-to-coast CBS news-gathering organization, trained for many months

to handle the inevitable D Day reports, and alert to the possibility that an unconfirmed German announcement might at any moment be confirmed, decided to continue the broadcast beyond the scheduled sign-off time. At 12:05 p.m., Trout announced that he was transferring his microphone directly into the newsroom, next door to the studio from which he was broadcasting. He moved up and down the long line of teletype machines, and at 12:32 a.m., was standing directly in front of the machine that clicked off the news for which the Allied world had been waiting for months.

All Hands Poised

First hint of the invasion reached CBS listeners when Chet Huntley relayed an unconfirmed German report on his "Ten O'Clock Wire" news period. From that moment on, a full crew of top-flight newsmen was on emergency duty in the KNX-CBS bureau. Arrangements made several months ago to keep the network lines open between the main news bureau in New York and the West coast were put into action. During Bob Andersen's 11:00 p.m. news program, producer Tom Hanlon was standing a few feet away from the microphone, monitoring eastern network broadcasts with ear-phones, so that the first word of confirmation could be aired

to western listeners the moment it was announced. Following the confirmation broadcast by Trout, CBS kept its listeners informed of the historic event with flash news and special coverage. During the early-morning hours, much work was put into gauging the effect of the invasion news on Los Angeles and reporting such background information to New York by wire to be used on the first round-up reports of D Day activities around the world. The KNX-CBS news staff, headed by Clint Jones and supervised by Fox Case, director of news and special events for the Columbia Pacific Net-

work, announced immediately that it would continue to service its listeners with the latest developments in the invasion, breaking into network and local programs whenever necessary.

Mutual Contributes

Several months ago, Les Mawhinney of the Mutual Network's newsroom staff, put into operation a plan whereby each news editor became supreme in command when on duty, with the authority to interrupt the regular broadcasting schedule if incoming news was of such import as to warrant such a procedure. On the eve of June 6, the first announcement, unconfirmed, of the Allied invasion of France, reported by the German News Agency, Transocean, reached Mutual listeners at 9:37 p.m. followed at 12:30

a.m. by the Allied Communique with its official confirmation of the report.

Eisenhower's message to his troops was aired directly, then re-broadcast for the benefit of those who weren't at their radios in the early-morning hours to hear the initial broadcasts. Harold Ross, Mutual night supervisor in charge of all operations, brought MBS' listeners complete coverage of the historic events, with a special transcribed broadcast at 8:45 a.m., during which the early-morning reports were repeated in their entirety.

Among the special features aired on Mutual were the talks by De Gaulle and King George of England, and the eye-witness accounts of on-

the-spot reporters. Commercial broadcasts were cancelled.

The Mutual Network immediately announced that it would remain on the alert, bringing its audiences flash news regularly, as long as word from the invasion front continued to come in.

KMTR On Job

In advance of the invasion date, station KMTR mailed cards to 500 persons in this vicinity, with the offer to notify them immediately when the news of the invasion came over the station's wires. Eighty-seven people accepted the offer, and were promptly notified in the early-morning hours of the historic D Day. Many of them were awakened out of a sound sleep. All of them expressed gladness over the news, obviously grateful that the long wait was over.

None of the people to whom the news was relayed over the telephone however was reported to have made any remarkable outbursts of emotion. Their response was business-like. The news was expected, and was accepted with calmness and a quiet faith in the outcome. KMTR is to be commended for carrying out this unique service.

KMPC On Its Toes

KMPC, which claimed the distinction of being the only local outlet not to publish the false alarm of the invasion, went on a 24-hour basis immediately when word of the great push was flashed. In addition to its hourly news bulletins from The Times, KMPC also had arranged beforehand

to broadcast news on the half hour, and switched its midnight to 6 a.m. program format so that music and news comprised it exclusively. William Parker was heard frequently on special bulletins. Other local stations, notably KFVB, jumped into the situation and detailed the tremendous invasion news as fast as possible. Through its careful planning, and superb facilities, radio fulfilled its supporters' and listeners' highest expectations. It is to be hoped that having come into its own, radio can play as important a part in the peace as it is now performing in the thick of the struggle.

I'll try to play the piano so it sounds like an orchestra.

(MUSIC ORCHESTRA FEW BARS OF "CARMEN" OVERTURE . . .)

BORGE: And that's how a piano sounds when you play it like an orchestra. Now the curtain goes up and the soldiers march in led by Don Jose . . . the captain of the guard . . . Don Jose sings an aria telling how he got to be the captain . . . He was the only one at that time who had a safety pin and could change the guard . . . Now Carmen enters. She enters singing the "Habanera". Of course, on Broadway now they are doing a modern version of "Carmen" called "Carmen Jones" . . . It's a southern version so Carmen in "Carmen Jones" sings "Habanera You-All". Other than that it's just the same. Carmen has a wild rose in her mouth. On Broadway, "Carmen Jones" has almost the same thing . . . She has a Billy Rose in her hair . . . Now Carmen has to keep the rose fresh so as she sings the "Habanera" she gargles. (GARGLING BIT) Don Jose has been eating onions and that is the reason in one part there is a place in the music for Carmen to turn her head and take a deep breath. (BREATHING BIT) This onion scene is a strong way to end the act . . . and it does . . . The audience rushes back into the opera house because they don't want to miss the intermission . . . The next act opens on a somber note.

(MUSIC . . . ONE NOTE . . .)

That was it . . . The curtain goes up and we are looking into Carmen's boudoir. We don't see very much because she immediately pulls the curtain down . . . And that ends that act. Now we come to the last act . . . Don Jose is waiting for Nicuela, his fiancée, whom he's also engaged to . . . She comes in with a letter from Don Jose's mother . . . Mrs. Rose . . . She has traveled from backstage which is called the north of Spain, to the front of the stage which is called the footlight. She brings the letter . . . If Don's mother could have found a stamp we could have avoided the whole last act. She has heard that Don Jose has been fooling around with Carmen. She asks Don about it . . . and he tells her he wasn't fooling. To change the subject, they go to a bull-fight. The last part of the act takes place at the bull fight. Into the arena come the mattedore, the toreodore, the picadore . . . through the revolving door . . . Don Jose enters the bull ring and everyone sings: Toreodore, Toreodore . . . etc. . . . That's the famous "Toreodore Song" from "Carmen" . . . This song is danced to by the famous dance team—Bessame and Mucho . . . Now everybody enters the ring . . . The army marches around triumphantly . . .

(MUSIC . . . UNDER . . .)

. . . bring news of a great military victory . . . The chorus sings the victory song . . . as they announce that after a great battle, they have captured the second floor of Montgomery Ward.

(MUSIC . . . UP TO FINISH)

My Life in a Jap Prison Camp

we ate it, but we cut off the outside and used it anyway.

"For six and a half months in Manila, we had to supply our own food. We made arrangements with the camp commandant to let us go out into the town to buy it through credit with American companies. This sounds better than it was—there was no food in Manila in the first place, and in the second place, the guards helped themselves to what we could get as it came into the camp.

"We finally persuaded the Japanese commandant to let us set up a canteen in the camp on the only basis on which we could ever make a deal with the Japs—they would profit. They did. They sold us at exorbitant prices goods they had looted from Manila stores on a conditional basis. To buy something we wanted, we had to take an outrageous amount of something we had no use for, at an exorbitant price. But we ate better, and that was what mattered.

"At first in the camps we had discipline once every day, then once a week, then not at all. For discipline, we were ordered into the fields to pick up stones, or to do something equally useless and tiring. But we did it without complaining because our captors wanted us to complain, and finally they got as tired of it as we did and gave it up. But they continued to break up baseball games and things like that. They'd pick enough men out of the game to break it up and say, 'O.K., we go dig fence.' The Japs' game was stall and delay, so our men played it too. They'd dig awhile, rest awhile, stall, then dig a little more.

"For laundry, we made our own troughs out of some old tin. We washed our clothes with soap when we could get it, but most of the time it was just with water. After the clothes were washed, we hung them on the line and then sat there and watched them while they dried. We had to . . . many of the people in the camps were picked up off the streets and had nothing but the clothes they wore at the moment . . . no towels, no extra clothes, nothing. When you live like that, your sense of values changes with your fight for survival. A bar of soap means more than a \$100 bill, because there is nothing the money will buy, and a towel means more than any self esteem you might lose by taking it.

"Sickness of course was rampant in the camps. At one time 700 out of 1050 prisoners were seriously ill from the rotten food. But it wasn't just the physical condition—it was the mental state that broke so many prisoners. When you're caged, petty things assume ridiculous proportions. The only way it was possible to keep going was to tell yourself, over and over, 'even though this lasts for five years, it's still only a small part of my life!'"

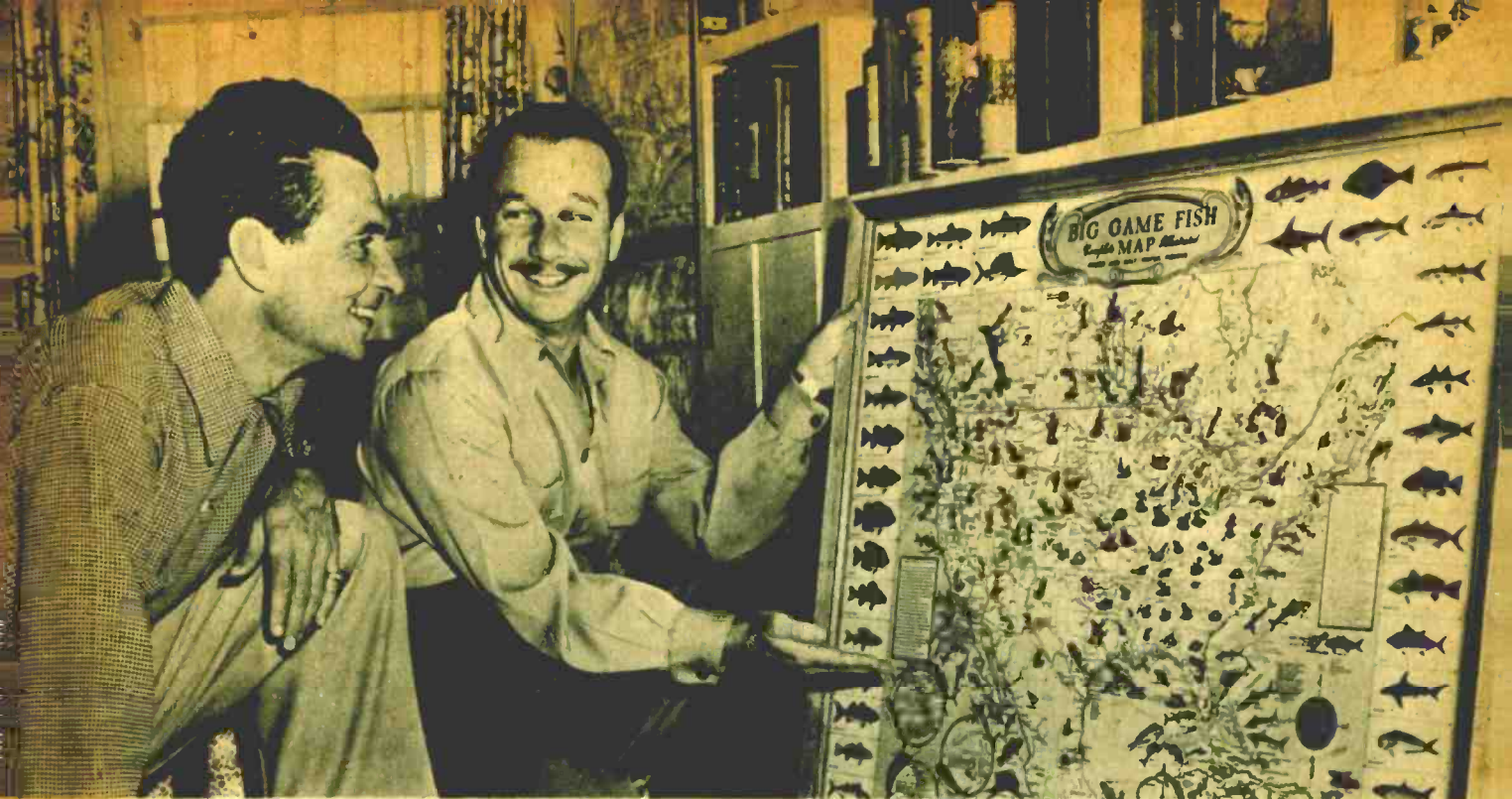

For Your Enjoyment We Reprint That Borge—"Basin Street" Script

Victor Borge, Danish pianist turned comedian, who started his climb to radio fame right here in Hollywood a year or two ago, has come back as a regular on "Chamber Music Society of Lower Basin Street" and has acquitted himself more than creditably on recent broadcasts. We caught this one and liked it so much we thought you might, too, so are reprinting excerpts from the show, heard on the Blue-KECA, Sundays, 6:15 p.m.

Cross: Tonight we are adding a new black sheep to our fold. He is Victor Borge the Danish comedian, pianist and pastry . . . Mr. Borge will appear here for several weeks to come, after which the concert hall will probably be closed by order of the Board of Health. Mr. Borge is probably most distinguished for . . .

Borge: Pardon me, Dr. Cross. You know you didn't have to hire me. You could have gotten Ronald Colman.

Cross: That's right, Mr. Borge, but he didn't have anything on our sponsor.

Borge: Well, we'll put it up to the audience. How many of you would rather have Ronald Colman on this program.

(LOUD APPLAUSE)

Borge: Fine. Now how many of you would

rather have me?

(LOUD SILENCE)

Borge: You see, Dr. Cross, it's a tie. But now that I'm going to be here for some time, don't you think I should be given a decent dressing room?

Cross: What's wrong with the room we gave you?

Borge: Nothing, except that I keep bumping my head on the roller towel.

Cross: Mr. Borge, you must understand that we give out dressing rooms according to the people's importance on the show. I have one on the first floor. Maestro Lavalie has one on the second floor. Dr. Chappell's is on the third floor.

Borge: What about me?

Cross: Here's a ladder—start climbing . . . Here's your key. I'll see you later . . . and if I don't—bravo! Now, music lovers, Maestro Lavalie turns the spotlight on the percussion section of our orchestra in the person of our drummer, Sammy Amadaeus Mozart Weiss. Mr. Weiss is the tallest member of our orchestra. He measures six foot three from his shoes to his toupee. Mr. Weiss is very proud of his skull dolly. It's the only toupee I've ever seen that lights

up and says, "I use Vitalis." Now, as the orchestra plays, "Ida," . . . Mr. Weiss will prove that he is not only a musician but an octopus as well by performing at top speed on the drums, the traps, the cymbal, the vibraphone, the chimes and other assorted instruments. Maestro, will you give the downbeat? . . . No, hold it a second . . . Mr. Weiss hasn't finished glueing on his toupee. There! He's ready. Okay Maestro.

(MUSIC IDA FEATURING SAMMY WEISS WITH ORCHESTRA) (APPLAUSE)

Borge: Well, Dr. Cross, I've been looking around this place, and I finally found a nice dressing room with plenty of sunlight and air, and I started to undress . . . and the roof caved in.

Cross: On your head?

Borge: Under my feet . . . Dr. Cross, I have never been treated this way. I feel like revolting.

Cross: Mr. Borge, you are revolting.

Borge: Dr. Cross, I don't know why you act this way. You're not so great. Yesterday I heard you narrating the opera "Carmen" and you were what we call in

Danish—lousy.

Cross: What do you call it in English?

Borge: (SOMETHING IN DANISH.)

Cross: I didn't think I did such a bad job.

Borge: Dr. Cross, you don't know anything about "Carmen" . . . not a thing.

Cross: I suppose you think you're an authority on the subject.

Borge: Of course, I know everything about "Carmen". I met her once.

Cross: You met her?

Borge: In Denmark. She was making a personal appearance. She was so wonderful and beautiful . . . I told my father I would like to go back in her dressing room after the show and meet her. But, my father, he said I was too young . . . to go in a lady's dressing room . . . He said I might see things I shouldn't see. But the next night, I sneaked backstage after the performance, went into her dressing room anyhow.

Cross: Did you see anything you shouldn't see?

Borge: Yes—my father.

Cross: And that makes you an opera authority, Mr. Borge?

Borge: Dr. Cross, I'll have you know I was born in an opera house. But when my parents saw me, they were certainly disappointed.

Cross: What did they expect?

Borge: "Tannhauser" . . . Why, Dr. Cross, I'll bet you don't even know how the authors got the inspiration for "Carmen" . . . how they happened to write it?

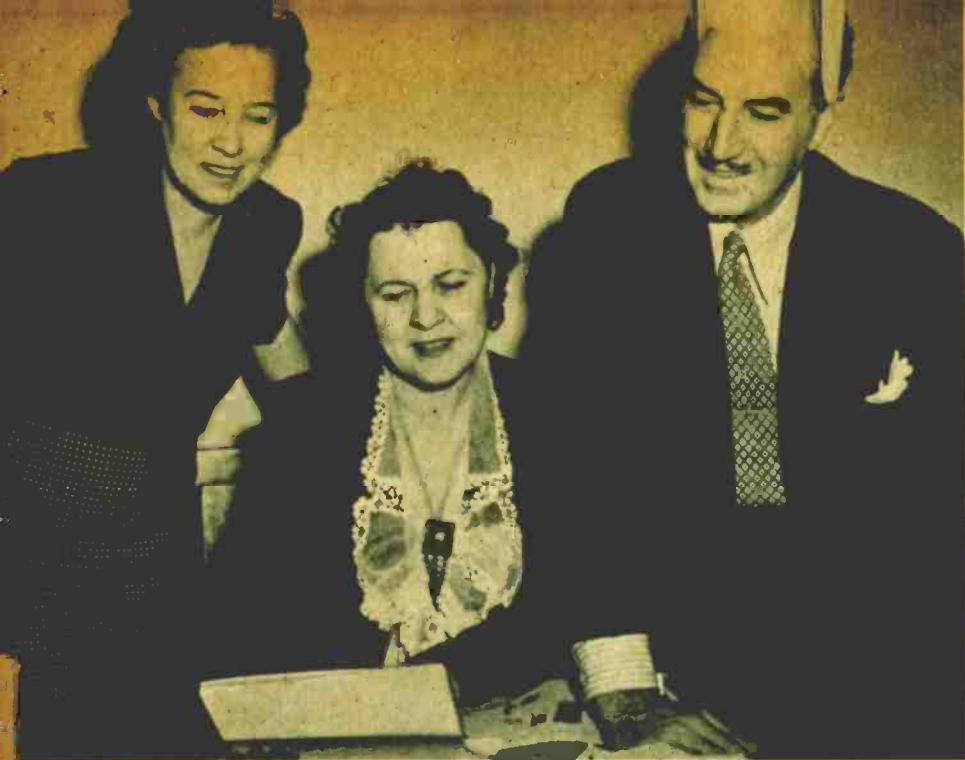
Cross: I can't say that I do.

Borge: I'll tell you about it. You see, Bizet wrote the music and some fellow who writes words wrote the words. One day they met on a corner of Montparnasse in Paris, and Bizet said: hello, how are you? The other one said: fine, how are you? Bizet said: fine, what are you doing today? The other one said: nothing. So Bizet said: good, let's go home and write "Carmen". So they started on their way home. Two days later they finally arrived at home . . . they went home the hard way . . . And they started to write . . . But something happened . . . The fellow who wrote the music wrote faster than the one who wrote the words. That's why in some parts of the opera Carmen has to sing . . . (TRA LA LA BIZ) And now about the overture . . . But first, I must tell you "Carmen" has four acts . . . act one, act two, act three, and act quatre . . . the fourth act is in French. The third act is only there because it would be silly to jump from the second to the fourth act . . . Now for the overture . . .
