I HAD always wanted to play the Palace," Dinah Shore said eagerly. "And I did — the Palace of Versailles!"

On a stage especially constructed for the occasion in the elaborate formal garden of Marie Antoinette, Dinah and Fred Astaire put on a show for American soldiers. She sang "Blues in the Night" and Fred clicked through one of his intricate dance routines. It was the highlight of her two months' entertainment tour overseas, from which she recently returned to take up her singing-emcee duties on the Birdseye Frosted Foods program.

The Dinah who came back from a strenuous, oft-times hazardous entertainment tour for the G.I.'s in France was five pounds thinner than the enthusiastic Dinah who left Hollywood for an undisclosed destination shortly after her radio program signed off for the summer.

But she was weighted down with the wonder and heart-throbbing interest of her tour, and as she related her many experiences, her eyes sparkled, more so, perhaps, because her bridegroom, Corporal George

Montgomery, was sitting close beside her and holding her hand tightly as she talked.

"At Verdun," she continued, "we played in a basement lighted by candles. At the end of the show, the audience of American soldiers sang 'La Marseillaise' with me in French."

Played 170 Shows

Dinah and other members of her troupe consisting of Comedian Sammy Walsh (making his sixth trip), Magician Harry Mendoza, and Accompanist Ticker Freeman played 170 shows to audiences ranging from two to 16,000. The two-man audience drove all day in a jeep trying to catch up with the troupe, finally found the entertainers at 10 p. m., just when the act was finishing.

"We couldn't let them go without anything," Dinah said, "so I sang a few songs and Sammy and Harry filled out about half an hour."

Nudging up to the French beach in a landing barge, Dinah disembarked in her uniform, half hidden under a WAC field bag, blanket roll,

gas mask, and helmet, not to mention three musette bags "loaded with glamour" and some men's shoes, size seven and a half, which didn't point the way Dinah's feet did.

"Believe me!" she exclaimed, "I really looked fierce. Some of the G.I.s saw me and one of them yelled, 'Look, a girl! Let's get her autograph.' When I signed my name they looked at me and thought I was kidding."

"I'm much cuter than this," she explained, as she scrambled onto an amphibious jeep and started to sing. Spike Jones was along and clapped his hands to give her the beat. A half hour later, they were doing a show for several thousand men, who appeared almost as if out of nowhere. "Of course," laughed Dinah, "one reason might have been that a premiere of 'Casanova Brown' was scheduled for that night!"

During the seven weeks she was actually in France, Dinah slept under a roof only six nights, two of

What Price Success?

Dick Brown's Story Raises Question of Rehabilitation Of Real and Fancied Veterans

HERE IS ONE romantic singer who doesn't claim to be another Bing Crosby or Frank Sinatra. Not that he doesn't think they're just about the tops as singers but he just wants to be himself. He is Dick Brown, youthful singer who has just graduated in one leap to a choice commercial show of his own.

What caused this meteoric rise to fame of a comparatively unknown lad from Youngstown, Ohio? A for-

mula of simplicity and intimacy of style. He doesn't copy anyone. He's just a fellow who loves to sing and likes people to enjoy hearing him sing. If you look at the stacks of fan mail he gets, you can see that he has already accomplished this purpose.

Dick was born in Youngstown, Ohio, in September 1919. He was the fifth son in a family of six children born to Reverend Max and Ethel Brown. The Browns were pretty much concerned about the youngest of their brood who wanted nothing better than to sing. Although he sang in his father's choir from the age of

EDITOR'S NOTE:

Some months ago, Radio Life received a publicity story on Mutual's singing star, Dick Brown, pointing out that he was "good copy" because he was the "first veteran of this war to make a success in radio." Knowing that Danny O'Neill of Bluejacket Choir fame was actually the first veteran to make good on the air, we pigeon-holed the yarn to await developments. These came the other morning, when the metropolitan papers carried the headline: "Masquerader Granted Reprieve in Radio Job." Seems Dick was recently asked to appear on CBS' "We, the People." Some of the facts he gave about being shot down in the Southwest Pacific and having his face disfigured as the result of his injuries seemed discrepant to the producer of the program, who checked Washington and found out that Brown had never been outside this country. Inducted at Ft. Thomas, Kentucky, he had received coast artillery training and then was transferred as an aviation cadet. Later, he was hospitalized at Maxwell Field, Alabama, for treatment of a skin disease resulting from a nervous condition. Subsequently he had invented a heroic story to help get himself an air job. The reaction of Brown's sponsor upon hearing the true facts of his case was to fire him. "However," the sponsor later stated, "after thought, we realized

that Dick Brown's problem was typical of that of many other men who are being and will be released from the armed forces. During Dick's army career he had developed a temporary facial disfigurement that was a definite handicap to a career in his chosen profession. It was almost impossible for him even to get an audition. What started out as his simple cover-up story developed into something which grew beyond Dick's control.

To solve their problem, the sponsor and the advertising agency handling the air account submitted Dick's situation for review to three clergymen—a Protestant, a Catholic, and a Jew. Their studied opinion was that "an undue hardship would be placed on Dick Brown were his radio contract to be ended," and they recommended that he be retained despite his exaggeration of his honorable war record. Radio Life herewith submits these new facts, together with the original story sent in on Dick Brown, when he was still masquerading as a wounded veteran of the South Pacific. We would like to ask our readers what they think of this case: Whether, by condoning Dick Brown's deception we are opening the way to similar perpetrations of trading on false war achievements or whether by overlooking it we are helping him and perhaps others to readjust to civilian life.

five, they still thought that a serious profession such as doctor or lawyer would best fit Dick and since his older brother, Jack, was one of the mid-west's outstanding tenors that seemed to be enough for the Brown parents. Dick's persistence, however, caused his dad to relent and so he went to the Cincinnati College of Music for voice lessons.

Subs for Brother

When he was fifteen, his family moved to Binghamton, New York and brother Jack, who was featured

in his hand and a twinkle in his eye. Nobody knows.

On one occasion, when a lady told him that she and her husband always argued over who should get up and give the baby his bottle at the 2 a.m. feeding time, Tom called upon an older woman in his audience to settle the argument.

"Who in your family got up to feed the babies at night?" he asked her.

"Well," she replied promptly, "it certainly wasn't my husband. You see, we didn't have bottles in those days!"

The hour is early, but when Breneman takes to his microphone he finds it necessary to be on his toes. His good-natured guests always prove to be wide-awake and quick with the answers.

Take the time he talked with a lady whose name was Mrs. Pitcher Long. She remarked that six male members of her husband's family had been named Pitcher.

"Too bad they didn't have a Catcher in the family. Then they would have had a ball team," cracked Breneman.

"I'm the catcher," answered the lady smartly. "I caught one of the Pitchers!"

But matching wits with his "Breakfast" guests isn't the only test Tom faces when he steps to the microphone for his early-morning emceeing chores. He finds the crew of his show always on hand to heckle him. It begins with some introduction such as the following:

"Friends, when I was asked to introduce Tom this morning, I stopped for a second and pondered on his name. Tom... Breneman... Well, a tom is a male puss. Brenner is a famous pass. And man is just man. So in introducing Tom Breneman, all I can say is: Man, what a puss! I pass!"

Or—

"Friends, this is our program's second birthday. And we intended to celebrate by having a big cake with two candles on it. But because of dimout regulations we couldn't get the candles. And on account of rationing, we couldn't get the sugar for the cake. So all we have left is a crumb. And here he is—Tom Breneman!"

OR—

"Friends, at this time I would like to bring you the best master of ceremonies in radio. I'd like to bring you the best comedian on the air. I'd like to bring you the most popular entertainer I know. But, this is war and when we can't get what we like, we have to take substitutes. So here is—Tom Breneman!"

So What?

When Tom was voted a member in good standing of the Southern California Sewing Circle, he was introduced to his radio audience the next day as that old "sew and sew." When he became a chief air raid

But Breneman loves the insults. Amid the giggles of his guests, his own booming throaty laugh can always be heard, the loudest of them all.

What is more, he doesn't hesitate to do some heckling himself. He laughingly insults his guests, and they love it.

When one jolly lady showed up at Sardi's on her thirtieth wedding anniversary, she brought along a photo of herself taken the day of her wedding. "Well," laughed Breneman, "you certainly were a mess when you got married!" The lady was convulsed in laughter.

Enter Corny

When lovable old "Uncle Corny" appears on the scene, Tom is in for more heckling.

Says Uncle Corny: "I don't think they treat you right here, Tommy. Every time the announcer says you're a bald, fat man, the ladies laugh."

"Yes," agrees Tom, "it's all wrong." "It certainly is," stresses Corny. "That's no way to treat a bald, fat man!"

More of Corny's "corn" follows:

Corny: Sorry I'm late Tommy. I was busy out on the farm, collectin' cream puffs.

Tom: That is silly. How can you collect cream puffs on a farm?

Corny: My cow smokes!

Also at the mike occasionally to join in the festivities is Bobby Batuga, the Filipino assistant maitre de at Sardi's. He has his own supply of riddles:

Bobby: What happened to the little boy when he ran through the screen door?

Tom: What?

Bobby: He strained himself!

Or—

Bobby: Why does the street light at Hollywood and Vine turn red?

Tom: Why?

Bobby: You'd turn red too, if you had to change before all those people!

Sometimes Serious

\$20,000 A Year for Life!



FOR MORE than a decade millions of radio listeners in the United States and Canada have been hearing the treble call of Johnny—the most famous living trademark in the world. Thrice weekly, Johnny's "Call for Philip Morris" goes over two major networks. Probably every man, woman and child in the nation knows his voice—but few know much about Johnny himself.

Johnny is unique in radio annals for many reasons. He is the only living vocal trademark throughout the world's airways. He holds the only important life-time contract in the history of radio. He is the only radio performer in the entire industry who has "understudies" because his schedule is so heavy. Yet all these unique points which distinguish little Johnny—he is only 47 inches high and weighs but 59 pounds—fade far into the background for drama in comparison with the unusual audition which lifted him out of obscurity (and \$15 a week) to his present prominence and a life-time contract for \$20,000 a year.

Johnny was discovered by Milton Biow, head of the advertising agency that handles the Philip Morris account, who found Johnny working as a bell-hop in the Hotel New Yorker in New York City. Impressed by Johnny's personality, Mr. Biow then and there staged a unique radio "audition" unbeknown to Johnny. The bell-hop was asked to page a fictitious Mr. Philip Morris. For five minutes little Johnny called in vain for "Mr. Morris." Reporting back, he found he had a new job. His chagrin at learning that he had been paging a non-existent person changed to happiness when he found he had just passed—with flying colors—the first (and probably the last) radio audition of its kind ever staged.

A Living Trademark

Since the death of MGM's Leo the Lion, Johnny has been the only living trademark of note—and always has been the only human one. Elsie the Cow cannot be classified in this category since the name Elsie has been passed on each time the last holder journeyed on to bovine heaven.

Johnny's famous "Call for Philip Morris" is not as simple as it seems. It is not an easy matter, for even a skilled musician to pitch a call to B-flat every time. Yet Johnny does this despite background orchestral music which gives him no pitch or introduction as would be expected by any singer. He attributes his ability to hit the B-flat note every time to the fact that he "hears" the tone within his head.

In addition to his radio work, Johnny has been making public appearances. So successful have these been and so great was the demand created for further appearances, that the

Backdoor to Radio

Jack Dempsey, the man who runs NBC's parking lot, is thinking of having a shingle made: Parking Lot Manager, Talent Agent.

Last Wednesday night on Nelson Eddy's Electric Hour program over CBS, one of Jack's parking lot boys made his radio debut singing a commercial and exchanging lines with Eddy and his other guest, Gloria Scott. The good-looking chap is Johnny Baxter and he's the second attendant from the NBC lot to break into professional limelight within the past few weeks. Johnny Strong, a handsome fellow who looks a lot like Sonny Tufts, signed a contract with RKO the other day after Hedda Hopper had seen him on the lot and demanded: "What are you doing here parking cars?"

The same happened to Johnny Baxter, except it was Nelson Eddy who drove into the lot. Let Johnny tell his story.

"I said 'How are you, Mr. Eddy? I'm sorry the lot's full and there's no place to park your car, but I'll take it and park it somewhere for you.'

"Mr. Eddy saw my ex-service button and asked me what I was doing in the lot.

"'Oh, I am interested in a radio career.'

"He didn't say anything," Johnny continued, "but he had sort of a look in his eye and the next morning someone from his office called me and said Mr. Eddy had requested that I appear on his program."

Young Baxter, who stands 5.10½ and weighs 150 pounds, has soft brown eyes and brown hair, and says "I'm over 21." He's glad he'd just bought a "swell new suit," because it gave him confidence when he walked out onto the CBS stage—"the death march," he called it. 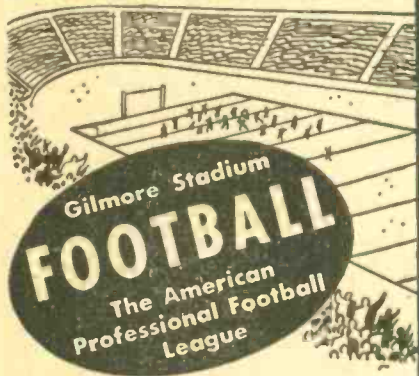

Sniper Amazed

At one show given alongside a bridge across the Seine, a German sniper was captured as the troupe finished performing. Amazed, he had watched while Dinah and the rest went through their paces. "He simply couldn't understand an army that would stop the war to watch a show. When it ended, he fired his rifle into the air, climbed out of the tree, and gave himself up."

Admired Shoes

The singer included a pair of white shoes in her tour wardrobe. These always created a mild sensation among the soldiers because they hadn't seen white shoes for such a long time. The boys would take them off Dinah's feet and carry them around as if they were trophies. "I tried my best to keep them looking clean," she sighed, "but in spite of everything I could do, they were sort of an orangy-gray by the end of the trip."

She learned the art of swapping to obtain preferred articles. Her Max Factor compact brought fatigues, which were exchanged for a pair of paratrooper's boots.

"Patton? Oh, he's wonderful," the songstress exclaimed, as she told about meeting the general and later receiving a pistol which was a gift for Husband Montgomery. General Bradley rated Dinah's appreciation for the loan of his plane in which the troupe flew over Paris and "twice around the Eiffel Tower!"

Broadcast to Reich

Like Bing Crosby, Dinah was utilized by the psychological warfare experts to broadcast messages to the German soldiers.

Her speech, which was written out phonetically, said: "German soldiers! Here speaks Dinah Shore. I have just returned from Paris where I sang for American troops. Meanwhile, our boys have entered Germany to re-establish order, freedom, and justice. I hope they will succeed real soon, for then you will be able to return to your fatherland and your families and start a new life."

Discounting her ability to speak German, Dinah chortled: "What happened to the German language that night should happen only to the Germans!"

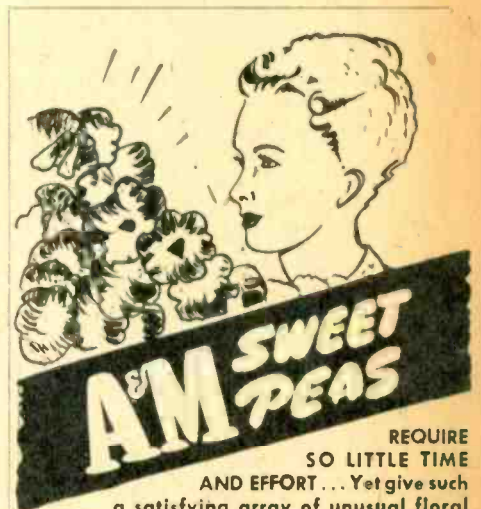

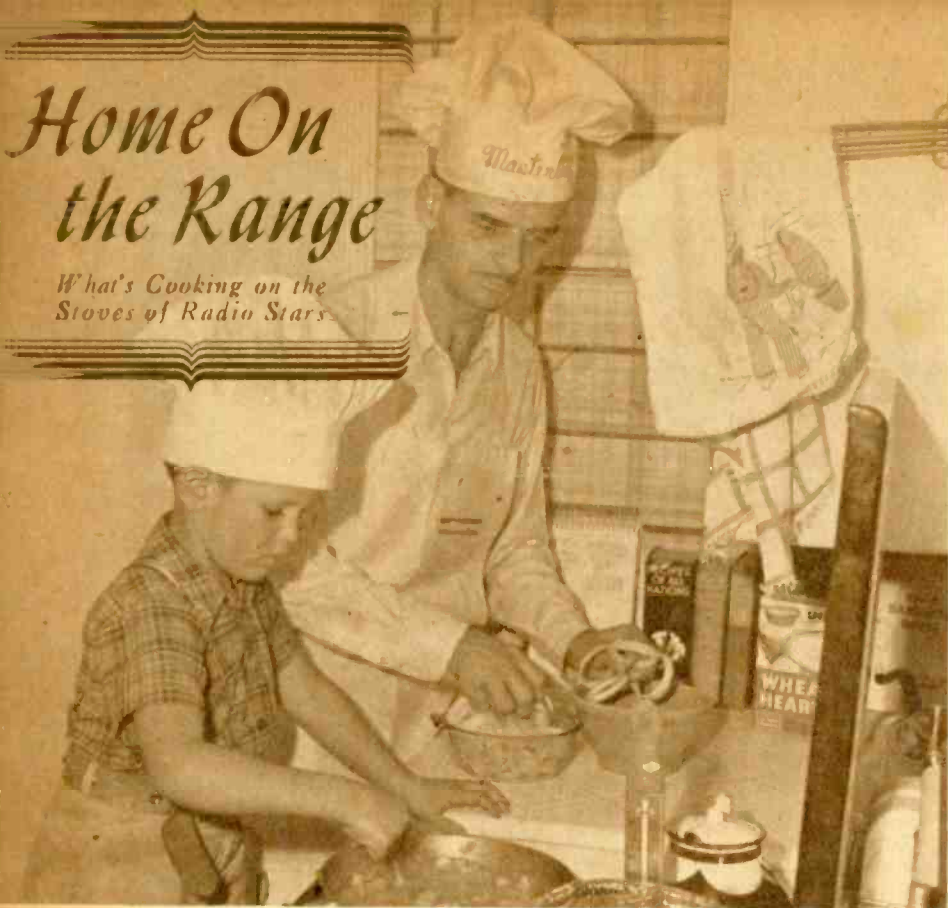

NELSON PRINGLE, popular CBS news commentator more familiarly known around radio row at "Pete," proves his prowess in the kitchen by producing a tantalizing meal consisting of hidden hash topped by Yorkshire pudding, fried onion rings, corn sticks and a pear salad. "Pete" modestly admits to being a pretty good cook and confesses to a love of the art. His skill was acquired as a youngster. His folks had to be away from home a good deal, leaving young Pringle money for his meals. "Pete" proved ingenious in the kitchen so that he could spend the money in other pleasurable pursuits.

Now Pringle finds his young sons, "Pete" and "Jim," interested onlookers upon occasion of his culinary activities. In fact, Jimmy, his five-year-old, already takes delight in frequently frying his own eggs and bacon for breakfast!

Mrs. Pringle smiles on her husband's culinary skill. "When he's cooking," she told us, "he won't even let me near the kitchen!"

Herewith are Nelson's pet recipes:

Forest Hall Corn Sticks

1 cup corn meal	1/2 cup hot, boiled
3/4 cup flour	homy
3 tsps. bak. powder	1/4 cup butter
1/2 tsp. salt	1 cup milk
1 egg	

Sift together corn meal, flour, bak-

ing powder, and salt; then add hominy, to which has been added butter, milk, and egg, well beaten. Turn into buttered bread-stick pans and bake in a moderate oven twenty minutes.

Pear Salad

Place half of pear on lettuce leaves. Cover with creamed cheese topped by grapes, which have been skinned, seeded, and halved.

Hidden Hash

Brown the onions in butter in a large frying pan. Add vegetables, salt, pepper and water, and simmer until vegetables are barely soft (25 to 30 min.). Add the diced meat. Blend flour with a little cold water and thicken the sauce around the meat and vegetables. Turn into a buttered baking dish, cover with Yorkshire Pudding and bake in a hot oven, at 425 degrees, for 30 min. Four servings.

Yorkshire Pudding

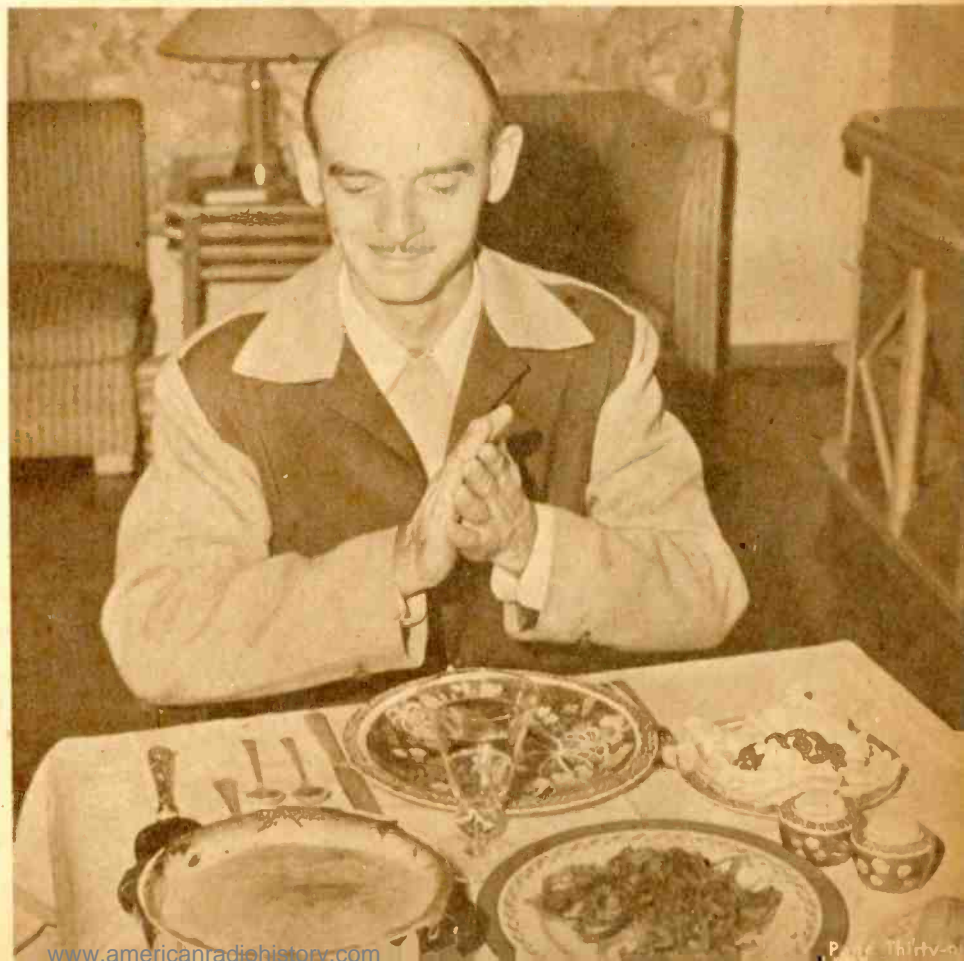

Sift flour and measure; sift again three times with baking powder and salt. Beat eggs well with a rotary beater, add milk, and add to dry ingredients, and beat with egg beater 1 minute. Add melted butter last, and pour into well-greased pan unless directed otherwise (as in Hidden Hash). Bake in a hot oven, 425 degrees, for 25 to 30 min. Four servings.

at the Hotel Bennett there, decided that Dick would substitute for him while he was on vacation. It was a very successful decision and Jack continued to look for opportunities to give Dick a chance to gain the much needed experience.

Meanwhile, in order to keep himself self-sufficient, the young tenor tried his hand at selling everything from shoes to vacuum cleaners, filling in spots here and there for brother Jack.

Then followed minor success on his own. He gained his own radio program over Binghamton's radio station WNEF and appeared at important night spots throughout the south and middle-west.

Dick was finally starting on his own, reaching the first rungs on the ladder of singing success, when the war broke out. Like all of our country's young men, he couldn't stay out and watch the fireworks from a ringside seat. He took up his duties in the Armed Forces assigned to the Coast Artillery, 71st Division, as a Coast Artillery Anti-Aircraft observer. He applied for a transfer as an air cadet and graduated as a Second Lieutenant, flying those small unarmed reconnaissance planes.

He soon had his chance to view the war at closer range and found himself flying over those South Pacific islands with Jap zeros close on his tail. Like most of the lads over there he had many close shaves, but

one was a little too close and Dick was sent back to a hospital with the other wounded, here in the states. After six months of, as he puts it, "being pasted together again," he received an honorable discharge from the service, but still remains on their "Reserve" list.

Becomes Test Engineer

Instead of going right back to his first love, singing, he believed strongly that he could still have a front seat in the war proceedings and that was on the assembly line. He signed up with the Wright Aeronautical Corporation in Cincinnati, Ohio, as an engine tester. He stayed there six months despite the fact that physicians were telling him that his wounds needed rest and quiet and finally he was convinced that he would have to stop all strenuous work.

Dick had amassed a fortune of three hundred dollars while working at the airplane plant and decided to go back to singing. The question on hand however was, where? He didn't know a soul in New York and he was told that Chicago had some opportunities for young singers, so he took out his lucky silver dollar piece, which he claims is still his charm, despite the fact that it may have been looking the other way the day that zero nailed him, and tossed it... heads, New York, tails, Chicago. New York won.

Like most unknowns, he couldn't get an audition anywhere until the day he went up to the Mutual Booking Artists. They liked him and he was signed to appear with Walter Pernet's Orchestra at New York's swank Roosevelt Grill at the Hotel Roosevelt.

During one of the shows at the Grill, someone unknown to Dick came over and mentioned that he should go over to see Jimmy Rich, the man who had been instrumental in the success of Dinah Shore, Frank Sinatra, Barry Wood, John Payne, and hundreds of other big name stars. He was also warned that if Jimmy liked him he would help him; if not, he would tell him to go home and forget about singing entirely.

The very next day, Dick brought a recording to Jimmy, who listened quietly, made no comment other than "Dick, I'll try and have a radio program for you in a couple of weeks."

Lands Show

Soon Jimmy called Dick to tell him that he was to start the following Sunday on his own half-hour show with Jimmy Rich at the organ.

During his first show on the afternoon spot, Dick noticed a crowd in the sponsor's booth and thought it was the staff coming in to greet a newcomer. Imagine his surprise when Jimmy introduced him to his new sponsors after the show and thus started the "Around The Town" show, six mornings weekly, which kept up for over nine months, until the present major commercial over a national network made its appearance.

Dick's new show has a simple format, Merle Pitt and his orchestra provide the background music, while Dick emcees and sings in his own inimitable manner. As for Jimmy, Dick has signed him as personal manager for seventy years, at which time they both, think they'll be a little too old for anything.

Dick is a handsome fellow, with jet black hair and brown eyes, 5'10½" tall, weighing 150 pounds. Not forgetting his piloting days, he loves to build model airplanes. He likes horseback riding and any winter sports. His ambition in life—well girls, he wants to settle down with the kind of girl that married dear old dad. He believes in large families and hopes his will be as close and happy as his brothers and folks are. He has a cocker spaniel which he calls "Moish" after a dear friend of his who is now somewhere in Italy. He collects pipes and ties, has about seventy in his collection.

Philip Morris Company found it necessary to hire a number of understudies which the company calls "Johnny Jrs." Thus today a corps of midget Johnnies—each of them proudly trained by the one and only Johnny—appears throughout the United States. Probably the most outstanding of Johnny's understudies is the Johnny, Jr., who each Tuesday night, steps before the Hollywood NBC microphone to introduce "Johnny Presents Ginny Simms" program. This "understudy" was made necessary by the fact that each Friday and Sunday nights in New York City, Johnny himself appears before the CBS microphone to introduce "It Pays To Be Ignorant" and "Crime Doctor," respectively.

How valuable the tiny living trademark is in dollars and cents cannot be estimated. Millions have been—and are being—spent to make known Johnny's voice and image throughout the country. Each day that goes by makes him more valuable—but to endeavor to put a price tag on this would run into astronomical realms.

During 1943 the average rating for the radio stations over which Johnny broadcasts, multiplied by the coverage of the networks, indicated that he was heard in 497 million homes. According to the Hooper Survey, more than three persons listened to each radio during the evening hours. Johnny broadcasts over 119 CBS stations and 127 NBC stations.

An avid Dodger fan, Johnny lives in Brooklyn, New York City, with his mother, father and sisters. All of them are normal in size as are his two brothers, one of whom is in the Army, and the other is employed in a defense plant.

Is Coffee Flend

Although a light eater, Johnny

drinks eight cups of coffee a day. He wears size 2 shoes, size 8 shirts and has much difficulty in getting size 6½ hats.

Johnny's favorite form of recreation is the motion picture. He abhors musicals, liking fast war or crime movies. He doesn't drink.
