A Television Show

An innovation in the realm of radio broadcasting, "Happy Island" is presented with scenic and lighting effects before the studio audience, with the entire cast in colorful costumes. It is a show that is already all set for television.

Since it is an Ed Wynn show, this should be no surprise, for the funny little man with the bushy wisps of hair who has now exchanged his familiar fire chief's hat for a comic royal crown, has studied his entire

combined starring in a stage play and having a radio show, too. Wynn would just shut up stage the night of the broadcast.

The comedian is also responsible for the first radio studio audiences. He just likes to hear people laugh.

A theatrical headliner since 1904, when he was eighteen years old, Ed Wynn has also stretched his distinctive talents into fields other than comedy. The star comic of two editions of the "Ziegfeld Follies" and the main attraction of eighteen Broadway productions, Wynn has written three of them entirely him-

he is a thoroughly schooled musician.

Wynn has also delved in a journalistic career lasting three years, during which he edited the "Ed Wynn Question Box," carried by 150 newspapers. He is author of the "Ed Wynn Crazy Cross Word Puzzle Book," and has talked for years about writing a book called "The Philosophy of a Fool."

A "Method Comedian"

Instead of depending on funny lines alone, Ed Wynn describes himself as a "method comedian," using comically nervous gestures, ridiculous costumes and his hysterical giggle, as well as wisecracks, to get laughs. He prides himself on having never used any but the cleanest kind of humor during his entire career, and he is also proud of the fact that, when he steps to the mike in his new role as "King Bubbles,"

FRANK HEMINGWAY, sunrise-hour newscaster, not only breaks the day with the first news to hit any western network over thirty-seven Don Lee Mutual stations, he doesn't mind smashing a few die-hard radio precepts while he's about it.

It all started one morning, bright and early, the first morning to be exact, that he aired his initial seven o'clock newscast, sponsored jointly by Scotch Cleanser and Folger's Coffee. When a quotation from one of Hitler's bombastic boasts popped up in the script, the temptation was too much to resist. Before Frank could think twice, he was impersonating Hitler, in German dialect.

"I was no sooner off the air," reminisces Frank, "than I started to kick

myself! First day on a new program for a new sponsor, and I have to pull a stunt like that. Once an actor, always a ham, you know." But nobody DID kick. On the contrary, calls began to come into the Don Lee newsroom immediately following the broadcast, congratulating newcomer Frank Hemingway on his imaginative and daring brand of newscasting.

So, aided and abetted by writer John Reddy, Frank began to do direct-quotes from the news wires in dialect—Scotch, Russian, Scandinavian, German, Irish, British, Japanese, or what-have-you. Delighted with the turn of events, his writer began to prepare special rewrites, dramatizing stories with bits of dialogue. Then, to add more color and interest, he started to write special feature stories from the news for this new adventure in newscasting.

Canadian Experience

Strangely enough Frank Hemingway, a midwesterner by birth, came to radio here in America by way of Canada. Starting as a concert singer in Chicago, Frank toured the midwest with a light opera company, singing baritone leads, then hit the vaudeville stage for several seasons

on the Keith-Orpheum circuit. He was on the west coast, playing leads in various stage shows, when he was summoned to Canada to produce the Dominion's greatest pageant, commemorating Toronto's 100th birthday anniversary. Frank stayed on in Canada to produce three more pageants, and to make his debut before the mike, announcing Canadian network programs for General Motors and Chrysler.

Returning to the states in 1938, Frank began newscasting over KOIN and KGW, the CBS and NBC stations in Portland, Oregon. He was there until July, 1943, when he came to Los Angeles to do the NBC show, "Voice of a Nation"—a radio vehicle peculiarly suited to Frank's talents, because it called for a newscaster that could double in brass with an unlimited number of miscellaneous voices, and who could creditably imitate personalities in the news.

After a year on NBC's "Voice of a Nation" (where he's still going strong) Frank Hemingway was well-primed to show what an actor of many voices could do with a cut-and-dried newscast. Now, it's nothing new to hear him, in one fifteen-minute

Election Bets

The rolling stone became a roll of familiar paper and the force rolling the "rolling stone" by his nose was CBS producer, Stu Garner. Why? Mr. Garner had lost an election bet to actor Lee Miller and this was the pay-off.

Falling to his knees in front of Columbia Square, Garner began to push the roll in the general direction of NBC. Amid cries of "Hey Garner, you going to vote for a fifth term?" he kept doggedly nosing the paper along. Quite a crowd gathered, hiding Mr. Garner and his "stone" from view, and stopped traffic to the complete confusion of bewildered motorists, who had to let "that thing" cross the street.

Puffing and panting, Mr. Garner didn't quite complete the prescribed journey due to the roll's running out, but he did cover approximately two of the three blocks. Staggering to his feet, he was greeted with cries of "for he's a jolly good fellow." Smiling bravely, he fell back moaning, "Boy, I know what they mean when they complain of housemaid's knee. I got it."

The same day another election bet was paid off. Although not a member of Radio Row, actress Ann Sheridan rode from NBC down the street in a large open car with a huge sign covering the front of it. The sign read "I voted for Dewey," and you couldn't see if Annie's face was red or not because it was smeared with black greasepaint.

Arthur Treacher and Brown's adopted son, Major Mike Frankovitch, were among those who offered to substitute for the gallant showman. But Brown went on as scheduled, and at the conclusion of the program, he spoke these words into the mike:

"Don't worry Mummy, Kathryn is much better." This message was directed to the comedy star's mother, seventy-six-year-old Mrs. Anna Brown of Toledo, Ohio.

Joe E's wife was at her daughters' bedside during the November 5 broadcast, the first of her husband's shows she has missed since the series started.

Misfortune has dogged the Brown family ever since the comedian himself was severely injured in an automobile accident several years ago. His recovery was slow. Then, a year ago, his eldest son, Captain Don Brown, was killed in an airplane crash while on duty with the Army Air Forces.

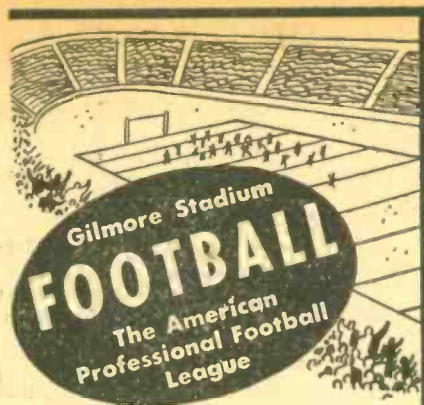

Diggin' Discs

With JACK LAWSON

SINCE WE'RE a dyed-in-the-wool Merry Macs fan, we have never been especially interested in modern quartets. Too many of them have made bad attempts at imitating the Macs' inimitable bouncing harmonic style. This week, however, we were completely captivated by another singing group. It's the Pied Pipers and their latest Capitol release, "The Trolley Song."

BACKED BY an excellent arrangement and orchestral accompaniment by Capitol's Paul Weston and his band, the Pipers zip along at a merry clip on the "Trolley." The song itself is one of the most fetching novelties to come up in recent years, the lyrics painting a vivid word-picture of a trolley romance. Musically, it's the best disc the Pipers have made, with Jo Stafford taking the feminine lead. Its companion side is an intimate version of "Cuddle Up a Little Closer."

LOS ANGELES' own, Andy Russell, who currently is creating quite a furore in New York, has two pleasant new sides for Capitol in "What a Difference a Day Made" and "Don't You Notice Anything New." Mr. Russell possesses much of the same vocal sex appeal that has brought Mr. Sinatra into the six-figure category. Following a radio and p.a. build-up in the Big City, Andy's managers plan to bring him back to Hollywood and put him to work in pictures. Credit Andy Russell as another Capitol star discovery.

NEGRO ARTISTS are producing some of the biggest selling discs today, and Capitol's bid for the Negro music element remains the King Cole Trio. Latest by this group are two slow-tempoed sides, "Gee, Baby, Ain't I Good To You" and "I Realize Now" with vocals by King Cole, both terrific.

FOURTH DISC in Capitol's latest release comprises a pair by Eddie Miller and his orchestra. The favorite of yesteryears, "Yesterdays," is revived as a showcase for Eddie's smooth tenor sax. Its flip-over is "Stomp, Mr. Henry Lee," a fine instrumental in lively stomp tempo.

COMING UP on the next Capitol release are "There's a New Moon Over My Shoulder" and "I'm Wastin' My Tears On You" with Tex Ritter and his Texans; "I Didn't Know About You" and "Tumbling Tumbleweeds" with Jo Stafford and the Pied Pipers; "Cuban Sugar Mill" and "Small Batch of Nod" with Freddie Slack, and a new Capitol recording artist, Jerry Colonna, featuring "I Hate Music" and "Can't Yo Heah Me Callin', Caroline," which promises to be a REAL novelty!

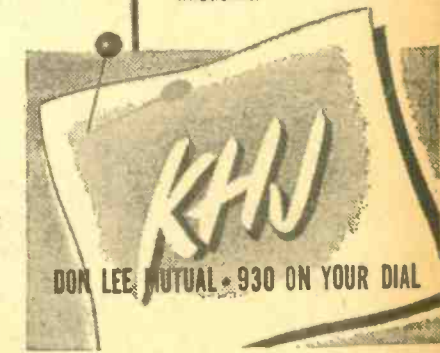

He hit a high point with his impersonations with a three-way interview between Eric Johnson, president of the U. S. Chamber of Commerce speaking English, Stalin in Russian and the Interpreter speaking in broken English.

Done With Phonetics

Asked how he is able to imitate even well-known personalities who have been heard on national and world-wide hook-ups so creditably that people have often mistaken his "voices" for the real McCoy, Frank explains that it's all done with phonetics. Like every actor who has mastered the art of impersonations and dialects, he knows that the secret of imitating the inflections in an individual's voice, as well as foreign accents, lies in understanding the principles of the linguistic science of speech sounds.

An adept spinner of tales, Frank likes to relieve the grim tenseness of war-news bulletins with humorous anecdotes.

Although it's a well-known fact that newscasters, as a rule, have as little fan mail as ghost-writers, no day ever goes by without cards, letters, phone calls and notes from Frank Hemingway's growing legion of listeners. Here are a few typical comments:

From an anonymous XYZ, Los Angeles. "You are killing, and magnificent, too. You must be quite a linguist—don't desert us!"

From Reverend Prendergast, Los Angeles. "I enjoyed your very fine word picture of that North Carolina-West Indies Hurricane."

From Mrs. Miller, Yakima, Washington. "On Monday, September 15, you made the best fifteen-minute broadcast I've ever heard."

From Mrs. J. B. McManus, Huntington Park. "When you can put a bit of humor in (your broadcast), good for you. It's hard for me to smile since my husband went to camp."

From Mrs. Charles Vermillion, Spokane. "I like the way you imitate people."

From Mr. and Mrs. S. Tichner, San

Francisco. "We get a kick out of Frank Hemingway when he goes into 'dialect.' His take-off on Hitler was a riot."

From Mrs. Marshall N. Dana, Portland (wife of editorial page editor of Oregon Journal). "I had the impulse to write to you and tell you how very much we appreciate your broadcast—Mr. Dana will let nothing interfere with the privilege of hearing you."

Mrs. Charlotte Morse, Fullerton, Calif. "Your Tojo and Hitler episodes in this morning's broadcast were strikingly well done."

Versatile Frank Hemingway keeps his acting ability in training by playing parts in various CBS dramatic productions. Latest low-down on radio's fast comer-upper is that Frank is announcing Kellogg's new night-time show on the Blue, "Tom Breneman Highlights."

When Ed Wynn was asked why he was returning to the air (with its attendant hard work and worry about fresh material each week) as long as he didn't need the money, the old-timer smiled and replied, "I wanted to show Keenan he's still not as funny as his old man."

In its initial weeks on the air, "Happy Island" has proved to be loaded with laughs, with the inimitable "Perfect Fool" leading the way with an opening speech such as the following:

Typical Humor

"This is Happy Island. Everything is perfect on our island. We have a special fire engine with a built-in City Hall. That's so the mayor doesn't have to leave his office. Everybody on Happy Island is well-off financially. We have special dollar bills with a picture of Mrs. Roosevelt on them. That's so our money will go a long way. What an island! Everything is so convenient on our island. We even have a bridge which goes halfway across the river, turns around and comes back. That's for people who change their minds. Do you know why our people are so

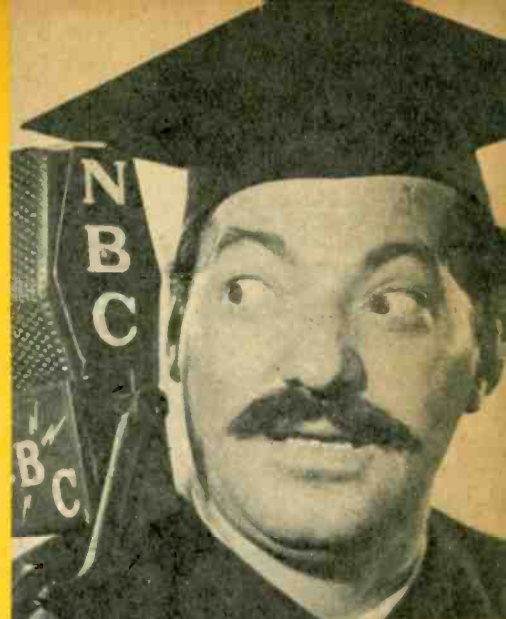

Colonna Flays It Straight

To Bob Hope's "Professor" Everything, Even His Bristly Mustache, Is Serious

JERRY COLONNA doesn't see anything funny about his mustache. He's had it for twenty of his thirty-nine years and he'll tell you, with a very serious look on his round face, that the generous, warm-brown bristles are outgrowth of the original fuzz and that he trims his adornment only once a month. His grandfather, he'll add, boasted a beautiful, long mustache that draped way down over his bosom and furthermore, he, himself, may someday attain to such a hirsute glory.

Jerry Colonna takes his fun-making and life in general as seriously as he does the hair on his upper lip. On the air as Bob Hope's "professor," he is raucous and aggressive. Off the air he is quiet and soft-spoken, agreeable and appreciative to fans.

What few know is that Colonna's trombone playing on the show's warm-up is not a gag. Any time he starts laying eggs on the air he can earn a living tootling his horn, because Jerry has played with bands ever since he got out of school. At

one time just before he left to come West, he was playing eighteen radio shows a week in New York. His experience also includes work with Howard Barlow, Eugene Ormandy, and the Boston Symphony.

Musical Heritage

Both his mother and his father, who was son of an Italian interpreter in the Massachusetts courts, were fond of music. Their son, Gerard (real name Gerard Louis) inherited their musical interest, plus a flare for clowning around. He was always concocting special gag material for the band's use, so it was quite natural that one day when Walter O'Keefe needed a barber shop tenor for his Camel show quartet, someone should think of Jerry. Colonna went over so big on his first appearance that O'Keefe told him he would use him any time he thought up an idea for a spot. Jerry made some eight appearances on O'Keefe's show, but shrunk from using his real name for fear his comedy antics might tarnish his glittering musical reputation.

Fred Allen heard him do a take-off on grand opera in 1935.

Drawled Allen with his nasal

twang, "WE MUST have you on the show!" Colonna's subsequent appearance brought him into the daylight as a potential comedian.

In 1936, he was sick and tired of working hard, so he filled all eighteen of his band spots with substitutes, and with his wife, started driving toward California. "I put my trombone in the back seat in case we needed breakfast," he remarked.

Meets Bing, Hope

Colonna had met Hope before coming to Hollywood, but he really got to know him through Bing Crosby, who used to ask visiting entertainers to his place at Del Mar on Saturdays after the races. Colonna clowning around, Hope liked him, and thus it was that Jerry landed on Bob's air show seven years ago.

The Hope-Colonna spot is usually the one to follow Bob's rapid-fire monologue on the Tuesday night broadcast.

Example: Hope: Well, Professor Colonna, how come you're alone tonight? What happened to your little native girl, Bumpsa?

Colonna: Well, Hope, I haven't told her yet, but I'm going to send her back to the Islands.

Hope: Colonna! So you're giving her the brush, huh?

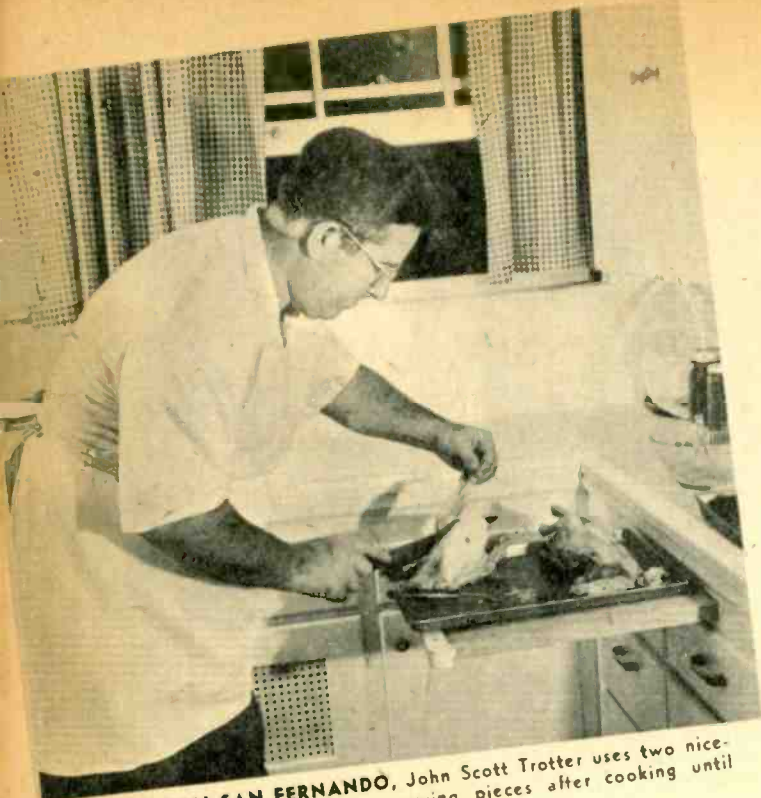
Colonna: I should say not. Let her grow her own mustache!

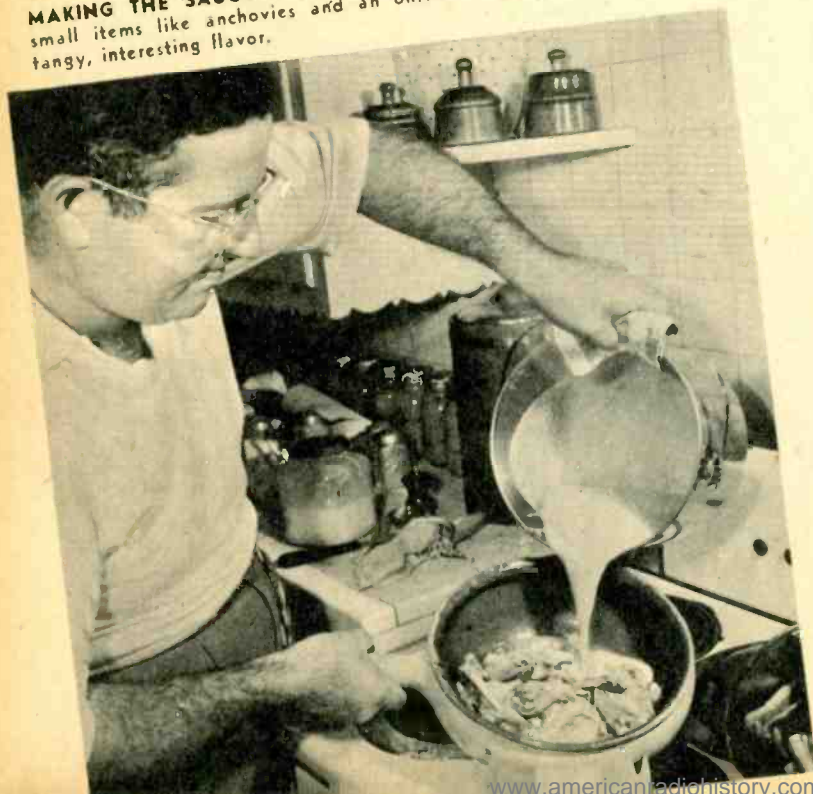

John Scott Trotter: "Interior Decorator"

MAKING THE SAUCE is a particular job, involving addition of small items like anchovies and an onion which give the broth a tangy, interesting flavor.



JOHN SCOTT TROTTER, jovial music master of NBC's "Kraft Music Hall," has attained a wide reputation as collector of antique furniture and interior decorator de luxe. But few radio fans know that the corpulent Trotter indulges in still another kind of interior decoration. He is a chef supreme, owns more than 125 cook books into which he delights to delve, and is a *scientific* cook, able to concoct surefire dishes to tingle the tastes of any blase epicure.

According to John Scott, his mother is a good cook, too, but she doesn't go in for the fancy dishes which her son turns out so modestly but proudly. Bachelor Trotter, who recently purchased Louella Parsons' Northridge ranch, is eagerly awaiting arrival of his parents and his sister, Margaret, who are coming from North Carolina to make their permanent home here. He hopes their presence will encourage his culinary efforts because he'll have an appreciative audience for his special dishes and may have some feminine help in clearing up the kitchen afterward (the one obstacle to his otherwise jolly culinary career).

The other day, Radio Life took a photographer out to Trotter's Northridge place, arriving just before lunch time to sniff tantalizing aromas coming from kitchen ward. Beaming, and forehead beaded with perspiration, John Scott invited us to inspect the meal, in process of preparation. Herewith are the recipes and pictures of his beautifully prepared luncheon.

Chicken San Fernando

Two good-sized frying chickens. Parboil in five cups of water. Remove chicken, saving broth. Skin fowl and cut into serving pieces. Return to the broth, to which have been added:

- 1 small, whole onion
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1 teaspoon salt
- Pepper, preferably white and fresh ground, to taste
- 1/2 cup sherry

Next, add two anchovies or a teaspoon anchovy paste. Simmer slowly until the chicken is very tender. Remove chicken carefully and place on serving dish, take whole onion out of broth and discard.

Add to broth: one cup cream, cup butter blended with 1/4 cup flour. Bring this to a boil long enough to cook flour (about five minutes) stirring constantly. Now pour sauce over chicken which has been kept warm.

Yams Northridge

Two large, well shaped raw yams. Peel and slice very thin. Peel and slice (crosswise) half a dozen oranges. Blend 1/4 lb. butter with 1 cup light brown sugar. Using a lidded casserole, arrange slices of yam, then oranges, then dot with the bits of creamed butter and sugar. Build up alternate layers until casserole is three-fourths full. Top with grated rind of one orange. Bake

covered for one hour in slow oven. Uncover and continue baking one hour or until tender. The juice of the oranges and the butter and sugar should make sufficient liquid. If, however, the dish seems to be dry when cooking, add the juice of two oranges or one cup unsweetened pineapple juice.

Pears A La John Scott

Eight large Barlett pears, selected

for shape and with stem intact. Before peeling the pears, make a syrup of four cups of water, one cup granulated sugar, 1/2 cup sherry or port. Bring this to a boil and let the ingredients blend, because fruit must not boil later lest it lose its shape. Peel the pears, placing them in cold water with juice of a lemon to keep them from turning dark. Place them in the prepared syrup,

turn the flame low, and add the rind of one orange sliced very thin. (Of course you will be sure there is no white part attached to the rind, for it will make the syrup bitter.)

Simmer (be careful not to boil) Simmer about a half hour. Let fruit cool in the syrup. Place in the refrigerator. Serve pear chilled, in a

ONCE UPON A TIME—'way back in 1927—when little old Hollywood was in the midst of growing pains, a radio station was born. It triumphed over its infancy with success. It weathered the depression, its aftermath—and it kept growing. It grew older, wiser, and larger. By 1943 it had outgrown many of its competitors, and realizing that it was going to continue to grow, it began to look for a new home. In the spring of 1944 it found a location in which it could expand and expand. Today it is firmly established at the corner of Sunset and Gordon and boasts of 56 regular employes. You know it as KMPC, "the most powerful independent of the West."

Recalling genial general manager Bob Reynold's remark at last spring's housewarming, "We're just getting started, but watch us grow now," Radio Life came to pay a visit and to see how many inches the station had added to its stature.

"Hello—come on in and meet the gang," greeted promotion manager Willard Hanes. "You'll get a glimpse of our hard workers behind scenes, and see what constitutes a typical KMPC day."

Newsroom Focal Point

"The day" begins and ends with the activities of the newsroom. Eighteen hours of broadcasting are commenced and terminated with five minutes of news summaries. Nineteen times daily on the hour, every hour, the last-minute news is brought to listeners by five newscasters.

"I'm just a Simon Legree at heart," smiled news editor Walter Carle at his capable staff. "I beat 'em with a typewriter switch." Looking at such dignitaries as Rupert Hughes, Norman Nesbitt, and Vance Graham, this was a little hard to believe. In addition to Messrs. Hughes, Nesbitt, and Graham are to be found James Powell and Dave Manning filling roles as newscasters.

Upon completing their edited scripts, the newscasters disappear into a cozy adjoining studio used for the express purpose of newscasting and auditioning. In addition to being small, it affords the men at the mike complete intimacy in talking to their invisible audience.

Leaving the newsroom, your reporter ran into program director Don Otis, who is the man mainly responsible for consummating the station's desire to combine more live talent shows with the widely varied musical

programs. Six times weekly, twenty-five recorded programs emanate from KMPC with emphasis on presenting entertainment that the public deems a necessity. Don told us that Bill Hay's "Say It With Music" is now wending its way into its fourth month, having completed a program of fifteen weeks, heard five consecutive days, without once repeating the same musical selection. Over eight hundred semi-classical numbers were used.

Has Large Library

To accommodate such needs, KMPC is equipped with a vast musical

library. "I don't know how many records there are myself," confessed librarian Ruth Harris, "but they would approximate around 100,000." It is in this small room lined with countless thousands of records that all musical programs are completed. The music of the masters can be heard on "The Adohr Golden Hour," presented Wednesday evenings, and on the Sunday regulars, "The Western Federal Music Hour," "Everybody's Hour," and "The Master's Hour." In contrast are Otis' "Yours For Guessing," and Keith Heatherington's "Swingshift Show," which consist of half an hour and an hour

and a half, respectively, of the latest popular recordings.

"Hey, wait a minute," called Mr. Otis. "All music would make KMPC a very dull boy. We have some fine programs, many of which are audience shows I'd like you to hear. For instance—'What Would Your Headline Be?' 'Pay Day Quiz,' and the 'Roundups,' 'Webber's' and 'Sports.'

"In addition to our regular programming, we have been very active in promoting public service features. To date the station has presented eight exclusive features including a testimonial luncheon in honor of

Don wasn't able to wave a magic wand and give Radio Life a first-hand glimpse of these shows in progress, but he compromised by letting us meet the "Symphonettes," KMPC's lovely, all-girl string ensemble, watch organist Merle Clark put announcer Jack Sherman through the paces for "Stump Us," listen to Keith Heatherington's afternoon "Swingshift Show," and laugh at Don's half-hour "Yours For Guessing."

"What about your sports department?" we asked. If the station lives to celebrate its thousandth anniversary, it will be, primarily, the leading sports station to many of its friends, due to the enthusiasm of ex-football star Reynolds. Big six-foot-four, Stanford-educated Bob is remembered by many on Radio Row as one of the Rose Bowl alumni to play a straight sixty minutes of football.
