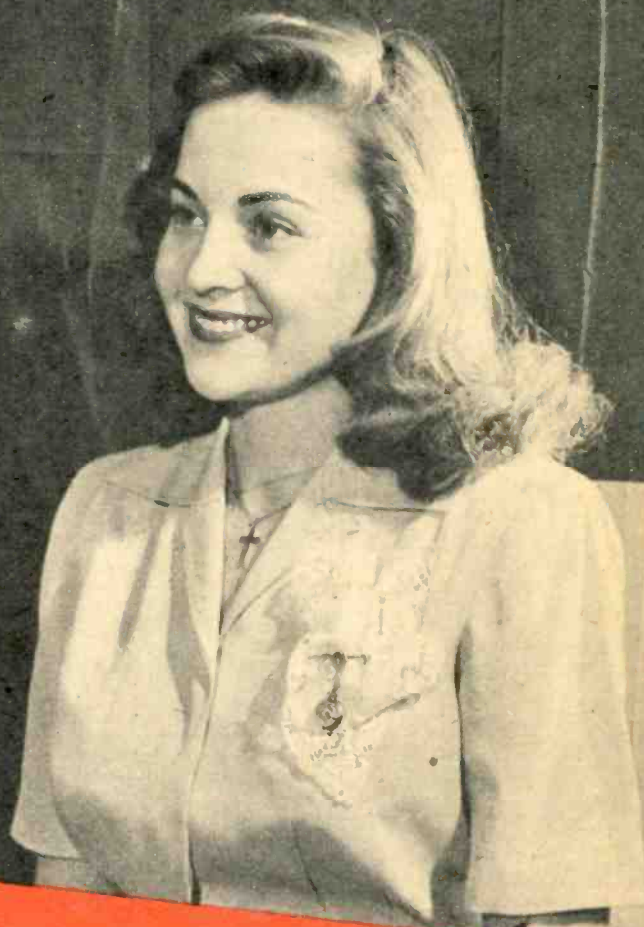

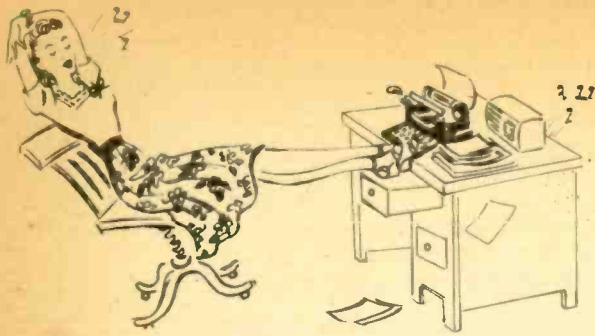

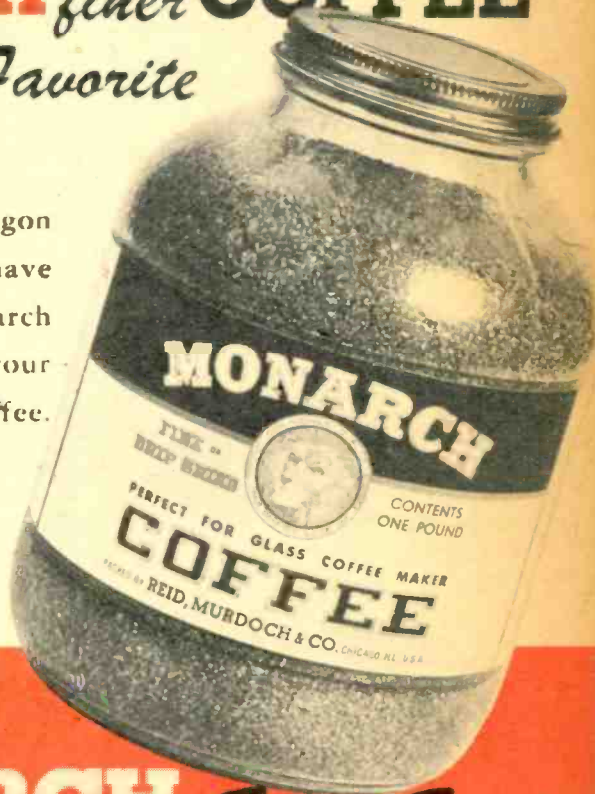

JHERE'S A champagne glass in the nursery at Judy Canova's Valley home. Perched amid a collection of music boxes on top a highboy, the glass is gaily tied with a narrow plaid ribbon.

When the now six-months-old Julieta Canova England was less than a week old, her famous mother and her Master Sergeant daddy, Chester B. England, drank a toast to little Julieta in the hospital. Charles tied one of Judy's hair ribbons around the stem of the glass so that when little "Tweeny" grew up she could see what kind of ribbon her mother used to wind in her pig-tails. Then daddy went back to camp, crossed the ocean, and now, in Alsace, eagerly awaits Judy's letters with pictures of the baby he hasn't seen since.

"I'm carryin' on, all right," twanged Judy the other morning when we visited her squat farm house. "But I don't know how I do it!"

Like many another war wife, the rustic Judy is saved by being busy. "When I get blue I work harder

than ever," she observed. In addition to her radio show Saturday night, she always presides over a preview Wednesday evening. "There are twenty-two in the band and forty-five people to run, as the show belongs to me. That's a lot to keep me busy," she smiled. Then there are appearances on such shows as "G. I. Journal" and "Screen Guild," supplemented by picture work.

Family Close

The clannish Canova family all live within a short distance of Judy, and her mother is always at hand to assist in managing Tweeny and the rest of the house. Zeke and Pete drop in often, and Judy's sister, Anne, is within four blocks' walking. Judy herself takes few of her meals at home, preferring frequent chocolate milk shakes or if time permits, a leisurely dinner at Romanoff's or, perhaps, some "little place" off the beaten track. She goes in for golf,

likes to watch baseball and football, but hates the fights. Jack Benny and Bergen are her favorite radio personalities and she likes to read biography. "I always have to read at least two pages before going to sleep," the countrified character remarked.

In personal life, Judy is not the bumpkin. In reality, she seemed interview-shy and inclined to minimize herself. More characteristic of Judy than anything she could say, probably, was her bedroom, a lusciously appointed corner of the sprawling house, decorated in glimmering pale peach and pale blue satin. Her dressing table was ultra feminine, with airy flounces of dainty blue net and a glittering profusion of mirrors and perfume bottles.

"Chet was in Strasbourg just before Christmas and he bought me an oil painting. There wasn't anything else to buy. He said the town had not had anything to sell for four years. But he knows I'd like a gallon of Joy perfume."

Writes Faithfully

Judy's Christmas present to Husband Chet was a satin-finished antique desk, more than two hundred years old. She sits here to write him that all-important letter from home, and averages a message every other day. Sometimes she pens eight or ten pages, again it's a V-mail epistle.

"Stop!" George Cried

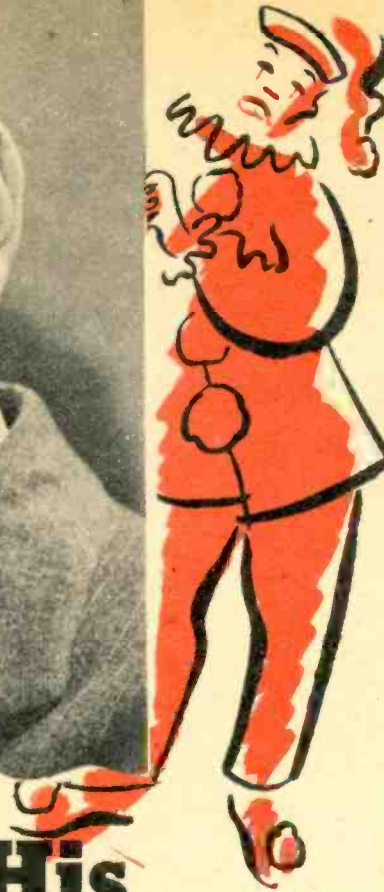

Prior to the status of comedian which he now holds, blond, stocky Harry—who resents being called chubby—was looked upon as one of the best announcers in the business; a man whose rich voice had sales appeal and whose easy going manner was a boost to his profession. It was his mike stints with Fred Allen which introduced him to the listening audience as a new and versatile character. Fred began to write him into comedy spots and one thing led to another until von Zell was no longer doing straight commercials.

But it's his natural flair for comedy and his matchless sense of humor which have been his greatest assets. Some of the situations arising from the introduction of Eddie Cantor von Zell, Jr. into the Cantor script have proven to the last doubting Thomas what an adept comedian Happy Harry is. Do you remember this:

Cantor: What is it, a boy or a girl?
 Von Zell: Huh?
 Cantor: Is it a boy or a girl?
 Von Zell: That's important?
 Cantor: Yes, yes!
 Von Zell: There are two kinds, huh?

Daytime Policy

Now in Hollywood conferring with Don Searle, manager, and department heads of the Pacific Coast Blue Network, Hubbell Robinson, Jr., Vice-President in charge of all programming and production for the Blue, expressed great satisfaction with the public's reception of the network's schedule of daytime programs.

"The success of the policy the Blue embarked upon shortly after our country's entry into the war has been beyond all our expectations," Robinson declared.

As a result of a nationwide personal opinion survey conducted early in 1942, Blue program officials learned that a large segment of the population was not listening to the type of daytime programs presented by other networks. It was then the Blue decided to be different by presenting a variety of programs, appealing to all tastes, during the broadcast hours.

"The impact of the war upon many of our people who have had to change

night into day, and visa versa, because of their war jobs, has changed many of their listening habits, and it is these people, in particular, who have welcomed the variety of programs the Blue has to offer during the daytime hours," Robinson explained.

"Borrowing a phrase from a popular song, it has been the Blue's policy to 'accentuate the positive' in entertainment — with the double accent on laughter and light-hearted fare, with a generous sprinkling of music and real drama for good measure," the New York executive pointed out.

That this policy has paid heavy dividends is to be found in the popularity of such shows as "Tom Breneman's Breakfast in Hollywood," the nation's highest rated morning program; "Breakfast Club," winner of many popularity polls; "Glamor Manor"; "My True Story."

"The tremendous success of our present daytime programs has decided us to continue our emphasis on building programs of nighttime calibre for daytime listening," Robinson declared.

Stork Visits Fibber

Jim Jordan, "Fibber McGee," is a proud new papa. Wait a minute—the sleek, black Aberdeen Angus heifer presented to Fibber and Molly last year, when the comedy team started their tenth year on the air, is the one who paid dividends.

This week she presented the Jordans with a heifer calf, sired by Frank Morgan's prize bull. A second Angus, presented at the same time by the Jordan's sponsor, is expected to increase Jim and Marion's bovine population by still another in the very near future.

Cameras On Cookie

Notable evidence of the presence of a motion picture crew at the scene of NBC's Ginny Simms show last Tuesday was the appearance of orchestra conductor, Edgar "Cookie" Fairchild. Ordinarily, "Cookie" is garbed in casual slacks and a sports shirt. But, with Columbia Pictures on hand to photograph the Simms program for their "Screen Snapshots" series, the irrepressible Fairchild arrived at the microphone impeccably attired in matching coat and trousers, white shirt and necktie!

Nowadays, Mr. Mack doesn't get home for dinner; seldom completes his breakfast without telephonic interruptions—or perhaps trying out a section of this week's show on Mrs. Mack.

Mrs. Mack loves her husband. She doesn't even object to his profession. But she's hungry for an evening out, even for a couple of hours to dine in leisurely splendor together at home.

Does Mr. Mack appreciate her viewpoint? He certainly does. What's more, he's going to do something about it. Yes, sir, that very evening. They will dine at home—and they will dine alone, he, she and their young son.

"Why," says Mr. Mack, "I have been a fool. I haven't done right by you. And when I do find time to get down to breakfast, our son looks at me and says (as they do on those radio programs): 'Mother, who's the strange man.'"

But, little does Mr. Mack realize (or little does he care about the problems which are to rise in his path before evening).

He reaches for the phone, dials the Danny Kaye home, garners the impression that he is speaking to an alien-tongued individual who can't understand his Hollywood brand of the English language—then discovers that it is strictly a Danny Kaye gag and he's in reality speaking to the comedian lurking behind one of the numerous voices which has made him famed from radio set to radio set the nation over.

"Danny," Mr. Mack says firmly, "we shall rehearse this week's program this afternoon at 2."

But it develops that Danny has an appointment for re-takes on his latest film at the Goldwyn studios during the afternoon—an appointment which has been made days in advance. Danny can rehearse, but only this morning. Is that satisfactory with Mr. Mack?

It certainly is, for all that Mr. Mack wants. All that he hopes to have, is an evening alone with his family.

Mr. Mack beams fondly at the little woman, waves his hands as if to say: "Well, there's nothing to it. Everything is all set."

But Mrs. Mack looks none to reas-

Radio Roundup from KFI

Returning to the NBC "Symphony of the Air" podium on Sunday, March 18, Arturo Toscanini honors the late George Gershwin. This will be the fourth such recognition of Gershwin's talents in three seasons by Toscanini.

The broadcast, marking the start of Maestro Toscanini's final group of "Symphony of the Air" broadcasts of the 1944-1945 season, also features works by Schumann and Mendelssohn.

The program opens with Schumann's Symphony No. 3 in E Flat Major ("Rhenish Symphony"). Then, following the Scherzo from Mendelssohn's "Octet in E Flat Major," Toscanini for the second time in his career will present "An American in Paris."

He first gave the work on the NBC Symphony broadcast of Nov. 14, 1943, a year after his first performance of a Gershwin composition—"Rhapsody in Blue."

These two air concerts received such wide acclaim that the Maestro, with Oscar Levant as piano soloist, presented the late composer's "Concerto in F" on March 26, 1944. KFI presents the "Symphony of the Air" at 2:00 p.m. on Sunday (March 18)

The man who Prime Minister Churchill said had "almost unrivaled experience in the conditions of modern naval warfare,"—Admiral Sir James Somerville, is scheduled to be heard on NBC's "Pacific Story" over KFI, Sunday March 18, at 11:30 p.m. Somerville, who has been in the British Navy for 46 years, emerged from the strategic Far Eastern theater of the war in March, 1942.

Now head of the British Admiralty Delegation in Washington, succeeding Admiral Sir Percy Novel, Admiral Somerville had special radar duties at the war's outbreak.

In 1940 he was flag officer commanding Force H in the Western Mediterranean, and flew his flag on H. M. S. Renown.

Afternoon drama fans will have an opportunity of hearing a new radio feature entitled "One Woman's Secret" which bows over NBC and will be heard via KFI each weekday afternoon at 4:00 p.m.

The new drama highlight will be presented Monday through Friday.

 Harry Patterson, announcer and newscaster, has returned to KMPC after serving fourteen months in the United States Army.



Diggin' Discs

With JACK LAWSON

IN THE INTERESTS of hot jazz fans and record collectors, Columbia has re-pressed all of its famous albums in huge quantity, making available to the public some of the finest works of leading jazz artists. These albums are now available and include the superior swing of such greats as Eddie South, Louie Armstrong, Earl Hines, Duke Ellington, Frank Teschemacher, Bix Beiderbecke, Fletcher Henderson, the Dorsey brothers, Teddy Wilson, Billie Holiday and others. Unavailable for the past several years due to manpower shortage and limited production, the albums became "gold" in owners' hands and attracted bids running as high as \$10 to \$25 for single records alone. The Beiderbecke album was quoted as worth \$50, whereas the OPA price for the new release is but \$2.50.

WE WOULD like to hear the Eddie South album. We haven't heard Eddie for fourteen years. At the time, we always thought he was ahead of his time. With a small combo, he played at a speakeasy called the Club Rubiyat in Chicago. Musicians used to flock there after other night clubs closed. The music would get good around 5 in the morning, and frequently, we didn't get out of the place until 8 a.m. Maybe our tastes are schmalzty, but we still think Eddie's "Hejre Kati," "Zigeuner," "Melody in A" and "Par Viga Me Voy" were great. Eddie was a Chicago boy, a brilliant musician, who picked up his continental knack in the cafes abroad, where he studied for several years.

ELLA FITZGERALD and the Ink Spots have a likely pair for Decca in "I'm Making Believe" and "Into Each Life Some Rain Must Fall."

HELEN FORREST'S tangy voice does wonders with "Every Day Of My Life" and "I've Learned A Lesson," the former a rhythmic ballad, the latter lush and sentimental. Victor Young's orchestral direction.

THE MERRY MACS, masters of blended-quartet singing, give out with two sides that should achieve wide popularity—"Let's Sing A Song About Susie" and "Up, Up, Up," both clear-cut and sparkling with fine band support.

SINCE "GOING MY WAY" has been mentioned as an Academy Award candidate, Bing Crosby's waxing of "Too-Ra-Loo-Ra-Loo" is getting a new whirl. It's a haunting tune that helped a lot to make the picture one of the best of 1944. We like its plattermate, too. This is Bing's interpretation of "I'll Remember April," one of the most beautiful of modern ballads, which should rate an "A" side in its own right. Written for an Abbott and Costello picture several years ago, "April" didn't get the attention it deserved, although it was sung beautifully by Dick Foran.

Murder Pays Off!

THOUGH it hath no tongue—murder will out!"

With these ominous words, another spine-tingling, brain-teasing murder mystery is brought to Blue network listeners each Tuesday evening when Edmond McDonald and Eddie Marr step to the microphone in the guise of Inspector Burke and Detective Nolan. The ensuing half-hour brings radio-dialers a challenging story of crime and detection — and the chance to play detective.

This new mystery-quiz show is radio's most recent gift to America's steadily increasing army of mystery lovers who, in the past few years, have clamored for murder in every medium from the intrigue of paperback novelettes to suspense on the silver screen.

Mystery fans find fun in fancying themselves as amateur sleuths tracking down a crime to its conclusive solution. "Murder Will Out" not only affords mystery lovers a made-to-order set-up for self-styled Sherlock Holmes', it offers the added

inducement of worthwhile prizes to the winning amateur detectives.

To learn every detail about this novel new airshow, we conferred with Lew Lansworth, its prolific scripter.

In Reverse

Lansworth explained that he plots stories backwards. He decides upon the convicting clues, then builds the logical web of events which lead to its discovery. He keeps in mind certain rules by which he abides in maintaining his strict policy to "play fair" with the listeners.

He presents all evidence and clues exactly as the police find them. The listener accompanies the police inspector in every step toward the solution of the crime. He doesn't "draw red herrings" in front of the listeners' noses, nor employ trick murder devices. He presents nothing of a supernatural quality, supplies a physical explanation for every occurrence. No important developments are based on coincidences. The motives for murder are understandable ones—robbery, jealousy, revenge and the like. He keeps the mood of the story in one predominant key.

He presents no more than two, and usually just one murder, because murder mystery fans have reacted unfavorably toward stories of multiple murders.

Writer Lansworth gives somewhat the appearance of a police inspector himself. He is a broad-shouldered, stockily-built man with luxuriant steel-gray hair brushed back in a smooth pompadour and his upper lip is covered with a bushy sandy moustache. He wears glasses tinted a dark green, and smokes a pipe.

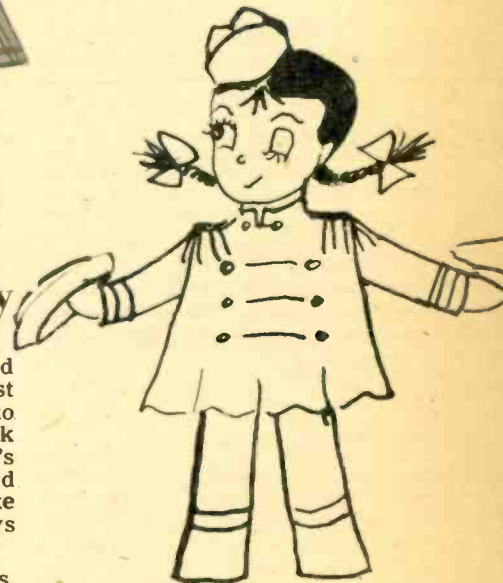

Soon the Victory Committee started sending Shirley and Judy out to entertain the soldiers and sailors. Judy did most of the talking because she thought she was very important. Sometimes she embarrassed the boys

He's Not as Quish as You Think

HE MAY sometimes sound as if he spent his childhood in the County of Cork, but Morton Downey didn't. He was born and raised in New England, U. S. A., and he didn't set foot on the soil of Erin until years later, after he had attained world-wide renown as "that famous Irish tenor."

Downey, now heard five days a week on Mutual, spins Irish stories like a true native son, but he speaks no Gaelic. He is a great party-lover, enjoys large gatherings of people, but he neither drinks nor smokes. (Ice cream is his favorite dish.)

He has the roguish charm and the easy-going manner of an Irishman, but not the temper. He remains unruffled, and keeps laughing. He likes to play practical jokes.

Ted Husing remembers the day that Downey and Mark Hellinger strolled into a radio studio just as he (Husing) was delivering a newscast at the mike. The two jokesters accosted him right in the middle of his broadcast and took off his tie, coat, shirt, shoes and socks, leaving him to finish his newscasting chores, half-dressed and helpless to do anything about it, while onlookers in the studio guffawed.

Early Talent

As a boy in Wallingford, Connecticut, Morton Downey was frequently bribed by his parents to stop singing. They were worried about the neighbors.

Later, at the age of eight, Downey learned that other people would pay him if he *didn't* stop singing. He turned professional then, when some fellow who had heard him warble at a social offered him five dollars if he would sing at a dance being staged.

At fourteen, however, young Morton's boy soprano voice began to change and he forsook singing to take on odd jobs as an office boy, store salesman and news-butcher on the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad.

Soon after that, he left his Connecticut home for singing assign-

ments in Manhattan, for by then his voice had matured into the golden tenor that has won him fame and fortune as the Irish balladeer. Today, he is celebrating his twentieth anniversary in show business.

During that time, he has made some thirty-five cross-country trips over the United States, and at least thirty trips to Europe, where he has appeared in practically every leading nightlife center, including the Lido Venice in Rome, the Cafe de Paris and Embassy in London, the Casanova in Berlin and the Ambassadeur in Paris.

He began his career abroad when he joined Paul Whiteman's band and journeyed with the Dean of Jazz across the Atlantic on the Leviathan. In 1925, in London's Kit Kat Klub, Downey became the first American to broadcast over the British Broadcasting System. Later, back in America, he made his film debut in "Syncopation," one of the first of the motion picture musicals.

On Air

First of his important radio shows was the Camel Hour, on which he appeared with Jacques Renard and Tony Wons. After that, he stepped

into the starring role on the Woodbury show. The start of his current contract with Coca-Cola marked his bow in daytime radio.

He originated this type of mystery-audience participation program five years ago when he noted the rising popularity of such parlor games as "Murder" and "Indication." He is accurately familiar with police procedure in investigating a homicide case, having worked with the police force in San Francisco to study its methods first-hand. He takes pride in the fact that police officers who have heard his shows comment on their complete believability. It is the quality he strives to maintain.

Based On Actuality

It takes him two or three days to write each weekly script. His stories are based on actual cases, fictionized to add emotional interest. He has an extensive reference file containing material on every phase of modern crime detection.

He describes the character of "Inspector Burke" as "a believable law-enforcing officer, a literate person with a thorough background of knowledge and experience in crime detection." "Detective Nolan," he hints out, is a man with a sharp sense of observation, and a characteristic sense of humor, a man who works himself up from the rinks and who is keenly familiar with all types of criminals and the way to handle them.

Edmond McDonald, who plays the inspector, was born in Cambridge, Massachusetts on May 7, 1908, became interested in acting because his aunt, Katherine McDonald, was an actress well-known on the New York stage. Ed appeared in a total of thirty-five New York stages plays before turning to radio in 1936. Since coming to Hollywood, he has been in thirty-nine movies, including "Flying Tigers," "Shores of Tripoli" and "Brigham Young." The actor's hobby is flying, and he has had more than four hundred solo hours in the air. For fourteen months, he served in the Signal Corps of the Army, was released from service in November of last year. He is six feet, two inches tall, weighs one hundred and sixty-eight pounds, has black hair and blue eyes. He is married to Dauna Allen.

Marr in Cast

Eddie Marr, who portrays "Detective Nolan," appears frequently on many leading Hollywood airshows, among them, "Sandra Martin," "Lux Radio Theater," Jack Carson, Dinah Shore, "Don't You Believe It" and "I Was There." His acting background included tours with stock and road shows, and appearance in musical comedy. Jack Carson's audiences know him for the line, "Tell me what I'm gonna do." Eddie was once a barker for the House of Illusion concession in Palisades Park,

New Jersey. He now lives in Hollywood with his wife, Maybelle, and his dog, Zito. He gets a kick out of going out into the kitchen and demonstrating his culinary skill.

Following the dramatization of crime and pursuit on each "Murder Will Out" airing, announcer Larry Keating calls to the microphone two men and two women chosen from the studio audience to act as amateur detectives. They answer questions concerning the solution of the crime, then submit the results of their sleuthing—the name of the murderer and the identity of the clue. Prizes of war bonds and special Gold Detective Certificates are awarded to the winners, war stamps are presented to those who have merely answered the questions correctly.

Lansworth has found that the contestants most frequently find the murderer but not the clue. In addition, he has discovered, women make better amateur detectives than men!

With his first year as announcer-performer drawing to a close, Harry still regards this comparatively new field with mingled hope and apprehension. But don't misunderstand—he plans to hang around for a good many more years.

"All my radio life people have been telling me they heard me on the air last night. Nine times out of ten I wasn't near the mike—but that didn't make any difference. They still insisted they heard me. So what chance would I have?" winked smart Mr. von Zell, "if I quit? That's one thing I'm sure I could never do—play the little man who wasn't there."

But he's not all-out Irish. He doesn't like the color, green!


