"Those We Love" fans are volcing a mighty protest, and our mailman is bearing the burden—but, as far as we now know, there are no plans for the program's return to the air.



Off the Cob

Disc-Jockey Peter Potter Was Born Near a Corn Patch, Says Corn Has Never Left Him; He Likes His Radio Name Because "It's Just Corny Enough"

WAS BORN on a farm surrounded by a compatch, and corn has never left me. I think that's why I'm always off the cob!"

Peter Potter's f a c e broke into a wide, friendly grin as he relaxed on the cushioned bench in one of the small studios of "Music City," and went on to tell more of his life before he became one of Hollywood radio's favorite record-spinners.

On his three-hour "Platter Parade" over KFWB every Sunday morning, he brings music-loving listeners the cream of the season's sweet-music crop of recordings as well as nostalgic tunes of yesteryear, all of them delivered by the show-world's topname performers. Highlight of Mr. Potter's parade of platters (he visualizes a towering grandstand filled with people looking down on the records that march along below them) comes when one of the big-name recording artists suddenly seems to step out of a record to be presented to the listening audience in person. Peter Potter dreamed up this novel method of introducing the guest stars on his show, and, he grins, "I'm proud of it. I think it's nice."

He is also justly proud of the people who have appeared with him on his program — among them, Bing Crosby, Frank Sinatra, Dinah Shore, Ginny Simms, the Andrews Sisters, Duke Ellington and the King Cole Trio, to name but a few.

On h is other show, "Paramount Parade" on KMPC, Potter presents the top tunes of the day and interviews with Paramount Picture personalities.

Born in Henryetta, Oklahoma, and graduated from the University of New Mexico, where he majored in dramatics and history, tall, curlyhaired Peter appeared on the stage in "college stuff" in which he "took all the corny parts." After college, he came to Hollywood "to be a leading man in the movies."

Through the Brittons, Morse is trying to contribute constructively to the enormous readjustment problem facing the country in snow-balling proportions every day.

According to h is undestanding, about 30,000 men are coming back now from the war fronts. This number will probably have been doubled with the surrender of Germany. By the time Japan is defeated, it is expected that servicemen will flood back to the United States at the rate of 600,000 monthly. Many of them will have gone through experiences that eclipse any ever before encountered in combat—for this war is the longest and admittedly the most terrible ever to be waged.

Home Uppermost

Undoubtedly servicemen away from home dwell on thoughts of returning more than anything else. "Is everything all right at home?" is the question asked most frequently by the uniformed man abroad.

HE MAY WANT, rather, to be quiet and by himself in the garden, where he has time to think and make readjustments. Here, Anthony Smythe (Father Barbour) gives Arthur some flower pointers.

But the civilian population is, perhaps, not thinking in long range terms about the return of its men. To facilitate readjustment between serviceman and civilian is a problem that should be borne equally by both groups.

Rehabilitation of the returning serviceman chiefly requires time, four or five months clearing up most neuroses if surrounding conditions are satisfactory. Understanding pa-(Continued from Page 26)

ND A GOOD, good afternoon, friends." Each weekday afternoon these familiar words, delivered with staccato, machine gun

rapidity, bring Pacific Coast radio listeners a 15-minute newscast crammed to overflowing. In the brief fourteen minutes and thirty seconds allotted him, Sam Hayes takes the listeners around the world in eighty seconds.

Over a steaming pot of strong black tea (he drinks no coffee) we asked Sam if this rapid fire delivery wasn't a pretty strenuous workout.

"Anytime I get to thinking that," he answered, "I remember the Mount Tamalplas Festival Plays, in which I did the leads in 1927, "28 and '29. At the foot of Tamalpias is a natural amphitheatre with the "back row" of the audience three-quarters of a mile away. The year we did 'Peer Gynt' I was on the stage for nearly the entire three hours of the production. The script, one of the longest on record (274 sides) called for me as Peer to portray a boy of 16, age to 45, then to 60 and before the final curtain, I was a tottering old man of 85. Much of it was played on the slope of the mountain side. When I wasn't on stage, aging rapidly, I the Pacific Coast news conscious. In the fourteen years since this first news assignment, he and his staff have read through 154 million words of United Press news copy to produce the fifteen million words he has spoken, culling through sixty million words of war news copy alone.

Samuel Stewart Hayes was the son of a Presbyterian minister, noted for his oratory and a direct descendant of President Rutherford B. Hayes. At the age of nine, young Sam was preaching sermons 'every Sunday evening in the family parlor, inheriting his "gift of gab" from his father. From this early training in public speaking, Sam made his first break into print and start to fame with his voice, by winning the California State Declamation Contest in 1923, while a student at Hollywood High School.

Football has occupied much of the spotlight in the Hayes career. With six years of football broadcasting to his credit, Sam still keeps close to the gridiron with his annual sports forecast. Looking at the six feet, two inches of one hundred and ninety pounds that are identified with one of the best known news voices on the Pacific Coast, it's natural to assume he's been quite a halfback.

"No," he said, "although football is my favorite sport and always has been, I was too light in my high school and college days to play—it was more to my build then, to wrap my long legs around a polo pony than to hit the scrimmage line."

He's not playing polo now, but can be seen riding horseback near his home in the valley, when he's not out at Lakeside shooting a 78-81.

Is Civic-Minded

Sam's pride in the Pacific Coast area, through his constant years of contact with it, has made him one of radio's most civic-minded citizens. He doesn't talk much about it now "the job's done," but holds a certificate from the Fourth Fighter Command for 500 hours of service in recruiting members for the Civilian Aircraft Warning Service—resulting from his Pacific Coast tour in behalf of the spotters.

His interest in American youth and his life long connection with sports, has lead him to what he terms his real hobby—being Regional Advisor to the American Commission for Living War Memorials.

"It all started like this," Sam said. "On one of my broadcasts I read a feature story about a Washington high school planning to honor its war heroes by financing a recreation park. I was so interested in it, that I guess my great personal enthusiasm crept into the newscast. A few days later I was in San Francisco when Bill Leiser, sports editor of The San Francisco Chronicle called me. Bill had heard the broadcast and asked if I would serve the commission as regional advisor for California. Oregon, Washington and Nevada. My northwestern tour urged communities to erect living war memorials to honor the dead, keeping their memories alive through public recreation centers and encouraging physical fitness by building adequate gymnasiums. athletic fields, swimming and playground facilities—honoring the dead by promoting the fitness of the living."

Speaking of the future, the last question we asked Sam, was "What about television? Any plans for it?" "Sure," he grinned his reply.

"Back in 1935, I made the first televised newscast. experimenting with techniques and methods of presentation. All the stage, movie, mike and platform work I've done up to now is just training and buildup for it."

New Home

KECA, the American Broadcasting Company's Los Angeles station, moved last week to its new studios at 1440 North Highland Avenue in Hollywood. Operations started from the new location on Sunday, May 20, at the beginning of the broadcast day, 6:45 a.m.

Having operated in temporary quarters on Vermont Avenue since August 1, 1044, when the station was purchased from Earle C. Anthony, Inc., the move to the new home marked a step forward in the service which KECA and the American Broadcasting Company pledged to render all Southern California.

KECA's new home has been completely rebuilt to house the station. The first floor physical facilities include three studios of modern acoustical and technical design, executive and production offices, music and transcription libraries; the second floor, an auditorium studio which seats three hundred persons, newsroom and news staff offices supplying service to the Pacific Division of the American Broadcasting Company; and the third floor accommodates the Continuity Acceptance, Publicity, Accounting and Script departments, also a very modern booth for the use of clients when auditioning or witnessing shows

The Voice

Radio-dialers who sat spellbound at the magnificence of Norman Corwin's stirring V-E Day program, "On a Note of Triumph," were particularly impressed with the work of the show's narrator, Martin Gabel. Many spoke in praise of his deep, resonant voice; some said he sounded like Orson Welles. All were unanimous in appreciation of his skilful, restrained narration.

"It isn't the voice that is important," Mr. Gabel insisted. "It is the thought and interpretation."

Norman Corwin brought Mr. Gabel with him to the West Coast specifically for his long-awaited V-E Day show. The actor had worked for Corwin previously on one of the writer-producer's former air series over CBS.

Before that, Martin Gabel had become known to ether audiences chiefly for his work in soap operas (he was "Dr. John Wayne" on "Big Sister" for years), the Columbia Workshop and the Helen Hayes Theater.

As much as he enjoys acting, Gabel's prime interest is producing. He took leave of Hollywood immediately after Sunday's repeat airing of the Corwin show to fly back to New York City, where he plans to produce Irwin Shaw's "The Assassin." He also owns a part-interest in "Life with Father."

Although he is surprisingly short of stature and of stocky build, Martin Gabel's appearance reflects the power and persuasiveness that is in his voice. He has wavy brown hair, blue eyes that twinkle; he wears conservative business suits.

He is thirty-two years old and a bachelor. He feels that life is creeping up on him too fast, because there are so many things he wants to do that he knows he won't get done.

Hello, Johnson Family

Jimmy Scribner is moving his Johnson Family of twenty-two to Hollywood. If you're familiar with the adventures of the famous "Chicazoola Family" you'll know that it will be no job, because all twenty-two of the personalities are enacted by genial Scribner himself.

For eleven years the "Family" has been provoking laughs from air audiences. When Scribner made a personal appearance tour to the Southland last fall, theater goers clamored to see their air favorite. News of Jimmy's change of residence from Cincinnati to the filmland city should be welcomed by the legions of fans who at that time expressed their wish that he would originate his show from Hollywood.

Fire

Manager Thelma Kirchner and her KGFJ co-workers were summoned to the corner of Sunset and Vine in Hollywood late in the evening of May 10 to find the proposed new site of their studio in flames.

The complete extent of the damage is not yet known, nor the possible delay this may effect on KGFJ's advent from downtown Los Angeles to the heart of Hollywood's Radio City.

Flannery Reports

Last week from San Francisco's United Nations Conference, CBS correspondent Harry Flannery wrote a letter to Radio Life which we think all readers will be interested in and which we are therefore reprinting for you. Writes Mr. Flannery:

It is a hopeful sign that this conference of the United Nations for International Organization is the first international meeting that has seen open covenants openly arrived at. This is the first such gathering taking place with its doors open for all the world to see and hear through the medium of the press and radio. This is the first conclave of nations at which the representatives of the news agencies outnumber the delegates.

The result is that many persons are jolted again and again by the news of the operations of the conference. Even the press, hitherto kept outside locked doors, and given handouts that insist that heavenly harmony prevails, and that complete accord has been reached on this and that issue, has been occasionally perturbed. Some of the isolationist press and radio that currently hides its selfish, fascist interests behind the folds of the Stars and Stripes, has now and then used these differences to their own sordid ends, but that is to be expected as we practice to the full the freedom that has made us great. Such a press and radio blatantly shouts about the verbal fisticuffs, magnifies them into eight-column streamer headlines, or cries them in loud worried voices over air waves, but despite all this hullabaloo in cold type and heated phrases, *(Please Turn to Page 8)*



(Continued from Page 7) to the astonishment, and sometimes consternation, of both, agreement is reached on issues, and progress is made steadily and importantly.

Some Blinded

Some of this is because some men come with preconceived opinions that international cooperation is impossible and they are blinded because they will not see. Some is because we have never been behind locked doors before. We have not known, though we should, that whenever men get together, men who can think and have opinions, they cannot be in constant agreement. Rational men are not automatons. All do not have the same backgrounds of experience. Here men come from all corners of the universe, and they are of all creeds, colors and classes, as well as from half a hundred different states.

We sometimes forget, too, that even though we may criticize our own Congress for its lengthy debates and its compromises, this United States has got along pretty well. We've made mistakes, many of them. Men must err. They are not gods. As Anthony Eden said here over the CBS, the fathers of our own Constitution did not go on debating whether it would work, but instead saw to it that it did work.

We fail to recall that we went through an election campaign just last fall in which the most bitter accusations were made publicly and in whispers about the leaders of the opposing party, but after we had voted we forgot all that was said. We acted like Americans vitally interested in men and issues. We followed democratic practices, argued and then when the majority had spoken, we bowed to its will.


San Francisco is but a projection on the grand scale of our Congress and our nation, and, as it needs must be of political action. Remember that this is a world and not Utopia. Remember we are moving through a worldly world, and that this is democracy in action; that the beginnings are being made in San Francisco, with the future up to you . . . the people.

tience on the part of the family will promote these satisfactory conditions.

To facilitate readjustments, there are some do's and dont's which might be followed. The accompany. ing pictures set forth a few of them, as portrayed by members of "One Man's Family."

But perhaps a blanket rule to follow would be Morse's own suggestion to which he hews in writing the episodes of Arthur and Louise Britton: "Don't build up a difference between servicemen and civilians and don't assume that the returning of treatment for the rest of his days. "I think," Morse told Radio Life, "that mine is the first dramatic pro-

gram to tackle this readjustment

low who supplied comedy relief. He also did two stage plays for Henry Duffy

In 1934, he went into radio on sta-tion KNX where, for the next four years, he wrote, produced and em-ceed "The Hollywood Barn Dance." During that time, the program featured such now famous entertainers as Roy Rogers, the Sons of the Pioneers and Jo Stafford and her sisters. At the same time, Potter also wrote and produced other programs. Later, he went out on his own, "sold automobiles for the Smiling Irishman" for three years. During this period, he did as many as 18 programs a day, including a three-hour Sunday show.

At the times when his radio schedale wasn't that crowded, he did motion picture work. He played in "Bright Eyes" with Shirley Temple and can remember holding the curlyheaded moppet on his lap while she munched on apples with salt on them. Potter also appeared as "a bashful lover with a bouquet of roses" in "Naughty Marietta," as the romantic lead in "Prison Train" ("Never again," he shuddered), and as the Georgia boy with Bing Crosby in "Star-Spangled Rhythm."

In 1942, he enlisted in the Army and the latter picture happened to be playing at the camp to which he was assigned. His buddles in khaki kid-ded him as "our star," called h im "Tyrone Potter," and presented him with a lavish bouquet of vegetables.

Potter was assigned to the Armed Forces Radio Service unit and wrote, produced, and announced special programs for servicemen, including "Ju-bilee," "Sound Off" and "Hymns from Home." On the latter program. he ap-peared as "Parson" Potter, reading

poetry and philosophy. He didn't think that the servicemen would accept him in this wide departure from his customary role as keeper of the swing platters, but the letters he received were heartwarming.

"The boys liked it, and I still get mail addressed to 'Parson' Potter. It makes me feel mighty good," he smiled.

Discharged Last Year

Potter was honorably discharged from the Army on Friday, October 13, 1944, and immediately resumed his platter-spinning activities on the local airlanes.

As his own favorites, Peter names Bing ("The one and only"), Jo Stafford, Ginny Simms, and Lionel Hampton and Benny Goodman's bands. The musical theme of Potter's "Platter Parade" is "Peter, Peter, Pumpkin Eater", sung by Martha Raye. He has used it for some six years, and will always feature it somewhere on his show, even after he adopts the new theme song which Johnny Mercer is penning for him. It is entitled "Peter Potter Picked A Peck of Pretty Platters"

Peter Potter isn't the platter-spinner's real name, although he has now had it copyrighted. His real name is William Mann Moore. He is Irish, and the son of a Virginia mother and a Tennesseean father. He has a broad Southern accent.

The name, "Peter Potter", Was given to him by Charles Vanda, pro-gram director of KNX when Peter started his four-year stint as 'emcee of "The Hollywood Barn Dance".

"I like the name," he remarked, "because it's just corny enough!"

HOSE WERE the days," related Gene Baker, neglecting his Les Comiques

cold turkey plate long enough to reminisce for us about his early start in radio, back in 1926.

Light-haired, blue-eyed Mr. Baker brings sunny songs to KNX's earlymorning audiences daily on his "Smile in the Morning" program, delivers the "Song of the Week" over CBS each Sunday, and announces the Blue's "Lum 'n' Abner." Although only 35, he can already look back on 19 years in radio. He made his debut on the airlanes when he was just 16 years old.

"In those days," he remembered, "there was no allocation of power, and when KEX, the Portland, Oregon, station that took me in as an announcer when I was still in high school, set up its facilities, nobody in its vicinity could hear any other station but KEX from then on. The farmers got so mad that they threw rocks at our transmitter."

Born in Portland in 1910, singer-announcer Gene Baker inherited his love of show business from his father, who toured in old-time medicine shows. But Gene's father was set on having his son take up a different career and insisted that the youngster complete his high school course, then take a job with the rallroad.

Bitter Experience

"My job," recounted Gene, "was to

check way bills. The first day I was there, I made an error, and for the next 30 days, I unknowingly added to it. At the end of the month, the whole office force had to stay up all night to get the accounts into order again. My boss told me I had better check my figures with him from then on. I did—and we both made a mistake. The office force had to spend another night straightening things out, and at the end of my second month at the job, I was courteously asked to resign.

"I went back to radio," Gene grinned, concluding the story.

"In those days," he went on to reminisce, "we used the crude, old-time microphones, and to prevent the carbon in them from congealing, we kept them In an 'oven' at night. When we cautiously lifted them out in the morning, they were actually too hot to touch.

"Later, when the station was equipped with more modern microphones, we found it hard to get used to the fact that, unlike our old ones, these newly-perfected instruments picked up every sound in the studio. The station manager went out a nd bought us all-felt carpet slippers, and for a long while after that, we always took our shoes off before going into the studio and tiptoed around in our bedroom slippers."

In time, Gene Baker became assistant chief announcer, assistant musical director and "assistant whathave-you" at KOIN in Portland. His activities included writing five children's shows a week, delivering the news daily, and writing, directing, announcing and singing seven programs of his own weekly.

When he left KOIN, Gene found himself shuttling back and forth between radio assignments on the West Coast and New York City several times — once on his best friend's honeymoon trip!

nery ... shortwave ... fishing ... birds ... pipes ... wood carvings ... farming ... microscopy ... animals ... electricity ... tree culture ... toy-making ... deep-sea sailing ... motion pictures ... gardening ... prize hogs ... weaving ... If we missed your own pet hobby, Bob's probably got it in the back of his mind and will get around to it next week.

Out on his sixty-acre farm in the San Fernando Valley Bob has surrounded himself with every art for making a man contented. He is a practicing farmer on all days when he isn't broadcasting his program, working in a picture or touring eastern hospitals-as he does each summer.

He has made the farm, which he calls his "Bazooka Berk Ranch" after his Berkshire hogs, almost totally self-sustaining. On it he can produce virtually every article of food except coffee and salt. Major crops are alfalfa, lima beans and sugar beets. However, his greatest interest lies in his magnificent herd of Berkshire hogs, including the champion boar, Pala Rey Grandview and a hog barn that is so modern it draws hog raisers from the whole west.

of a small fair. There is his prize mule, "Champ," who once broke all pulling records and worked in a picture at Paramount. There are pens upon pens of brilliant-hued canaries, pheasants, cockateels, parrots, finches, parrakeets ... a pair of Ruddy Shell ducks, the drake being so pugnacious he attacks Bob upon every invasion of the privacy of his pen. Breeders have never been able to propagate these ducks in captivity, but Bob now has hens setting on eleven eggs and if all goes well, he can go into the rare duck business.

Two gorgeous peacocks, one a solid white variety seldom found, roam the yard. Chickens with quaint feathered "pants" flock around Bob at the back door. A half dozen dogs of varied breeds follow him everywhere. Turkeys, geese, pigeons, doves and guineas swarm over the area.

Bob's workshop is a carpenter's dream, with power-driven tools at every hand. With them he fashions intricate motor-run toys, birdhouses, hand-carved pipes, beautiful inlaid wood-carvings and furniture. Once his son Steve was ill and bored with the usual in-bed amusements. Bob whittled a back-yard scene of movable pump, washboard, basket of clothes and a little old lady bending over them, hooked it up with a tiny motor, plugged it in the wall and there was the washwoman energetically scrubbing the Monday wash. He's now working on an entire movable city, with trains and cars running, lights blinking on and off and people walking about-all hooked to a central motor.

Says Bob, "I want to know what's takin' place on, off and in the earth the things that are too big to see and the ones that are too little. I don't try to explain 'em, I just want to know what they look like."

So Bob has a telescope of 150 power — says that with it he can stand in the City Hall Tower and read the street signs in Van Nuys, but he's more interested in reading the markings on Venus or the moon. He also has a microscope and a projector by which he can put a drop of water under the beam and project onto a screen a series of five-foot monsters that are actually minute organisms invisible to the eye.

Saw Demonstration

Bob first saw this done at the Chicago World's Fair and it furnished one of his favorite stories. As part of the demonstration the man enlarged two microbes to enormous size. They were deadly enemies and a battle ensued on the screen. The good woman standing next to Bob was outraged and exclaimed: "I'm going to report this to the Society fcr Prevention of Cruelty to Animals!"

Bob is rarely seen without a pipe from his collection of 150. An Indian peace pipe is an original Sioux model made from pipestone found only in Minnesota. Another shows a Javanese girl's head carved from meerschaum. Bob even makes his own from olive wood grown on his farm.

His den is littered with figures of the characters he talks about—Aunt Boo, Uncle Unie, Grandpa Snazzie and Uncle Slug. One corner is filled with guns, for Bob is an expert marksman holding a medal pinned on him during the First World War for winning the championship of the AEF. He has a pistol capable of shooting shotgun shells and another gun that throws its own clay pigeons. Only gun missing is the Army's bazooka, named for Bob's two pieces of gas pipe and an old whiskey funnel and Bob says he's going to get one after the war.

Bob's interest in radio extends far beyond his own Thursday broadcasts. He has a complete shortwave set hooked up with a home-recorder. Since the early days of the war he has been recording shortwave broadcasts of U. S. prisoners and mailing these messages to relatives—a sympathetic gesture that has earned him the heartfelt gratitude of hundreds.

Raises Worms

Bob plants his own Victory Garden and is already munching contentedly at turnip greens, radishes, onions and strawberries. He built his own hand-loom and makes harness for his mules and belts for himself. He grinds his own breakfast food from barley raised on his farm. He raises his own worms for his birds—worms with high vitamin content that produce fat pheasants and tuneful canaries. He grows his own trees from seeds and can now make his own camphor from his camphor tree. He is making plans to build a large lake where he can raise his own fish for sport and food.

But there, finally, Bob will not be satisfied. He loves the sea and the sport of deep-sea fishing. He's designed and built a harpoon that shoots like a bow-and-arrow and he's waiting until the Navy will let him back on the sea to try it out. He's reading a lot about sea navigation, too, for back in Bob's mind is a project.

His voice via radio has gone 'round the world, but he hasn't been able to follow it. His telescope will not look around curves, and what he knows about the other side he has had to read.

So Bob is going out to sea and to see. He'll handle his own boat, and when he comes back, dialers will probably hear about the strange doings of Persia's Aunt Boos and the Uncle Slugs of the Fiji Islands. For the one hobby Bob never stops practicing for a day or night is his hobby of collecting and telling the tall tales of the common folks of the earth.

Following this period, he abandoned his active airlane chores, went to Chicago and worked at being an advertising manager for a year and a half. But he found himself missing the microphone and set about finding a place for himself on the ether once more. It meant competing in auditions which he, in his previous position as a producer, had formerly conducted. He found people a bit begrudging of his former authority and not quickly inclined to give him a break at the microphone again, but in the course of the next two and a half years, he had managed to land the announcing chores on some 15 or 20 of the top network airshows emanating from the Windy City—among them, the "Quiz Kids," The General Mills Hour. "First Nighter," "Knick-erbocker Playhouse," and "Road of Life."

Meantime, his family had a yen to come to California, so over the telephone, Gene bought a home in the San Fernando Valley for them. It turned out alright, but even if it hadn't, Gene admits that he wouldn't have learned a lesson, "TII do such things as that all my life," he smilingly declared.

When the "Quiz Kids" came West to do some broadcasts from Mr. Baker's "home towns," Portland and Seattle, the mikeman happily accompanied them and remained on the coast to accept the Hollywood assignments aforementioned, in addition to his previous spots on "Potluck Party," "American Rhapsody," and "The Story of Sandra Martin."

Gene has learned not to worry when he loses out on a good radio assignment. He adheres to a philosophy he acquired from Doris Rich, with whom he worked on "Houseboat Hannah" several years ago. She told him, "You never lose a job except to make way for something better."

"It works out that way," said Gene.

When not at a microphone, the affable Mr. Baker relaxes by playing the piano, likes to hunt and to fish, never turns down a good game of gin rummy, and rushes from the studio at every opportunity to hurry home, don shorts, grab an old blanket, and lie out under the sun in an endeavor to get a California tan!
