*Youth Takes Over Big-Time Radio as
Jimmie Higson and His "Teen-Agers"
Swing Out on Hoagy Carmichael Show*

*W*HEN Hoagy Carmichael's Monday night NBC airshow was tagged "Something New," they weren't kidding! Heretofore, when a big-time network radio program was being formulated, its musical aggregation was unquestionably no other than a picked group of skilled studio musicians with years of study and experience to their credit.

Complete innovation was the casting for the Carmichael show of a group of adolescent schoolboys with a flair for making music—the "Teen Agers."

Away from the bandstand, they are average American high-school students, keen about sports, addicted to arguing, and always hungry. When there is a rehearsal break, they stampede out of the studio, make for the nearest lunch counter for "Dagwood" sandwiches and chocolate sundaes.

Typical of the "Teen Agers," although older and perhaps a bit more serious-minded than others in the group is Jimmie Higson, the band's youthful conductor-arranger. Jimmie has serious brown eyes and a "butch" haircut. He likes to wear saddle-shoes, old corduroy slacks, T-shirts and sweaters. He is nineteen years old, a student of philosophy at UCLA, and spent two months in the Navy's V-12 program before receiving a medical discharge. He spends some forty hours a week arranging music for the orchestra, but

he "abhors the life of a musician." His hobby is collecting and reading good books. He likes literature "with a capital L!"

Likes "Dixieland"

Jimmie was born in Hollywood, now lives in Beverly Hills with his father, Dr. Alfred R. Higson, an orthodontist. He started his musical career when he took piano lessons as a child. He had to be forced to practice, eventually switched to the drums until they began to seem "too primitive." Then he took up the trumpet, which he sometimes plays with the band when he isn't conducting. Eddie Miller is his favorite musician, "Dixieland" a la Bob Crosby is his favorite style of rhythm. The other boys in the band like the "Stan Kenton drive," so Jimmie has to make compromises with them, arranging half their numbers the way they want them, the other half the way he likes them.

Jimmy and the boys get along fine. They rehearse all day Monday for their weekly air appearance, and call special rehearsals during the week whenever they're scheduled to play some outside engagements.

The original band of 'teen-aged musicians started out four years ago in Santa Monica, California. The present-day aggregation is an outgrowth of several bands that succeeded this initial group. Their manager, Van Tonkins, is, according to Jimmie, "an eager beaver." He engineered their audition for the Carmichael air series.

Among the boys in the band are

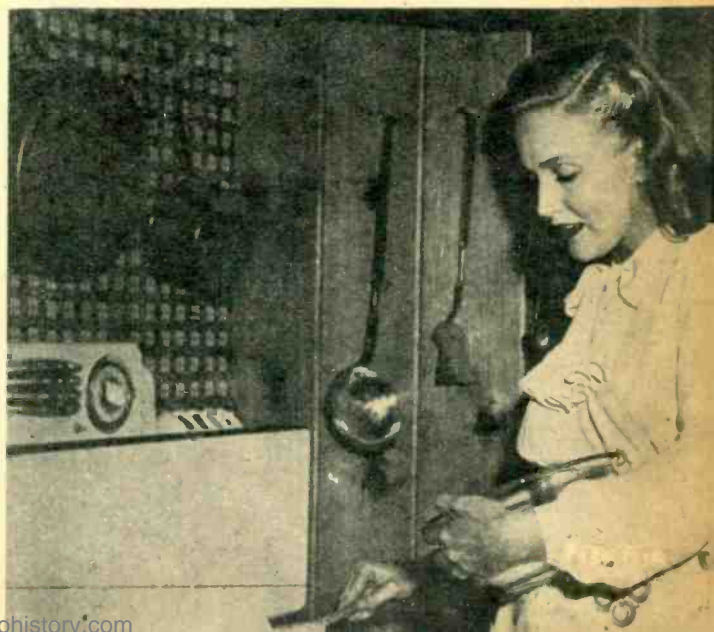
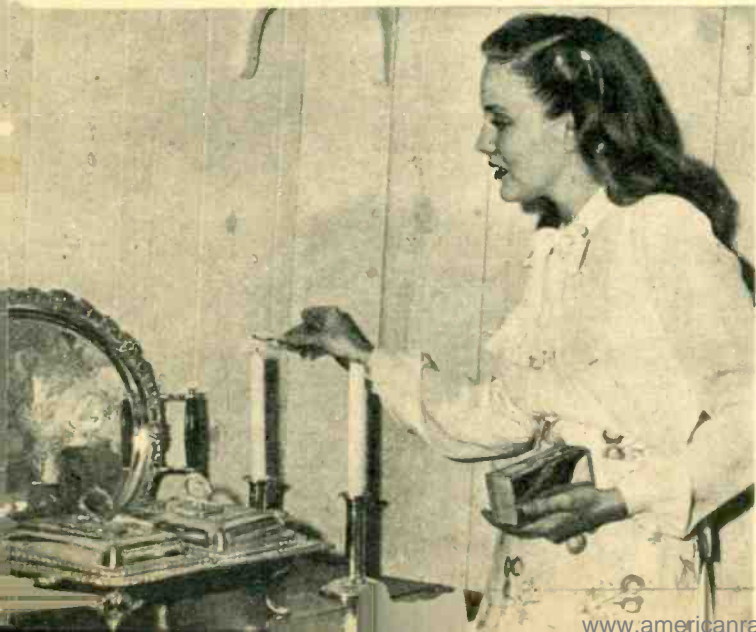

Microphones Are His Meat

Radio Isn't Easy When You Do It Every Day, Says Joe Kearns, But He Sometimes Wishes He Could Do Two Shows at Once

THE phone rang for Joe Kearns while we were talking to him, and when the actor returned from taking the call, his face was furrowed into a frown. "Conflicts drive me crazy," he complained. "I hate to turn down a show."

When it comes to revealing the names of the shows on which you hear the voice (or rather, voices) of Joe Kearns, it is easier to list the very few on which he hasn't yet managed to appear—usually because of the "conflicts" of which he spoke. He frequently has to turn down one show because he is working or rehearsing on another at the same time.

Radio-dialers hear him as the narrator on "Suspense," as the little guy who watches the safe down in the basement on the Jack Benny program, and as any number of other people on such top-flight shows as "Screen Guild," "This Is My Best," Judy Canova, "The Adventures of Harriet and Ozzie" and "Sherlock Holmes." His outstanding work as one of radio's usually-unsung supporting performers won him honorable mention in Radio Life's Second Annual Distinguished Achievement Awards, announced in our April 15th issue.

Radio Nerve-Wracking

Of radio work, Kearns has this to say: "The public may sometimes

think that a radio actor's job is a soft one. It isn't; it's nerve-wracking. We often work week after week without a day off. But we also love it."

Of his own work in particular, the actor expressed a preference for comedy, but likes "meaty" roles, as well—those such as he does on "The Whistler."

Only once has he missed a show for a reason other than illness. That time, he wrote down "Thursday" as the day of the program, went unconcernedly to the movies on Tuesday, the actual day of the show's airing, arrived at the studio Thursday, according to the memo he had made, and discovered his mistake.

Joe confessed that he is absent-minded, and can never remember phone numbers. He also admitted that he is sometimes "moody." But his co-workers call him "a good listener"—"the kind of a guy you save things to tell, because you know he'll enjoy them."

Writes Plays

During rehearsals, when he is not at the microphone, Kearns remains devoted to a deck of cards, and he is lucky with them. When not working, he likes to go to the beach. He reads "incessantly," likes good novels and non-fictional works, just recently finished "The Fountainhead." He also likes to read plays, and has written a number of them himself, including three 3-act productions still playing in eastern stock theaters and a radio script, "The Man From Out of the East," which was aired on "The Whistler."

Joe Kearns was born in Salt Lake City, Utah, toured at an early age in vaudeville with a child act called "The Rising Generation," in which he sang "Salvation Lassie of Mine." He attended dramatic school and played in stock, and, during one of his stays in California, appeared in a coast production of "What Price Glory?"

Back in Salt Lake City, he played Louis XI ("a non-singing part!" pointed out Joe) in "Vagabond King," after which he became a staff member of radio station KSL, remaining there for the next six and a half years.

In 1936, he came to California and with the help of his friend, True Boardman, started his career in Hollywood radio.

Joe lives in Hollywood in a studio apartment which he designed and built himself. It is sem-colonial, has a 24x18-foot drop living room with a gabled ceiling and a big fireplace, and is equipped with a Hammond organ, which the actor plays a good deal of the time that he is home. Joe also has a pet cockateel named "Butch." "He doesn't talk," Joe informed us, "he just whistles."

Is Night Owl

Kearns calls himself a "night owl," and hates to get up in the morning. The thing that annoys him most is loud talking. He is also annoyed

since the age of two, took part in all dramatic activities throughout school, and was graduated from the University of California a member of the school's Dramatic Society, with which she appeared on local radio shows.

After graduation she was chosen to attend the UCLA-NBC Radio Institute and received their intensive training in all phases of radio. While there, she was co-editor of the paper, "On the Beam," written about the Radio Institute members and people in radio. She also wrote interviews about various actors and analyzed current programs.

At the same time, Terry is not neglecting her dramatic ambitions. She has studied Dramatic Analysis and Dialect with one of Hollywood's ablest coaches, and is constantly trying for a break in the acting field, while happily engaged in other phases of broadcasting.

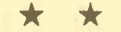

IT'S a bash for no cash, the "Coke Sesh" at the Broadway-Hollywood Department Store each Saturday afternoon, with jive bombers from eleven (no less) to seventeen (and more) congregating to slap the trap, shoot the stars, ride the shoe-saddle and dig the Cole, meantime pitchin' the hoke and the coke. It's a reet meet for Ubangies as well as sharpshins—for all but the weary weasels and the beat beetles.

Or—if you like it straight—it's the Broadway-Hollywood "Coke Sesh" parties, aired over KHJ weekly, that we're talking about, as is every feminine 'teen-ager. Huge parties they are, with about five hundred junior misses there to dance, talk, listen to Buddy Cole and his trio, and drink all the cokes they can down. DON'T "Understand" ME

Those Magic Words of Rehabilitation Are Proving Themselves on "Welcome Home," Thanks to Maypole and Sollars

A USO troupe was wandering through a hospital ward. It consisted of a comedian, a guitar player, a pretty singer, an acrobatic dancer, a witty master of ceremonies, plus Roy Maypole, ex-Marine and Ray Sollars, writer and psychiatrist.

The troupe continued on through the ward, but Maypole and Sollars stood smiling at a wounded man propped up in the high, steel bed. Suddenly Sollars, deliberately drawing his arm into his coat so as to conceal it, stepped forward and said, "I hear the draft board is looking for me."

For a moment the wounded man's eyes flashed . . . and then he slowly smiled. "Thanks," he said. "At last

I'm given a chance—somebody to whom I won't have to say 'Don't understand me.'"

"I think," Sollars told us, "those are going to be the key words in solving this most important problem of post-war rehabilitation . . . DON'T 'UNDERSTAND' ME," another way of saying don't pity me."

"The wounded man has as many trepidations about facing you, as you have facing him. He doesn't want pity. He wants to see in your face and in your eyes that he is useful."

Is Real Welcome

"And that's how 'Welcome Home' came about," interrupted Maypole. "In fact, that's what it means. 'Welcome home, fella. The place is yours! . . . and thank God, the men and women we present feel that way. They come to tell you their story

because they want to. It's their show. It's for them."

Listening to Maypole and Sollars, producer and writer respectively of the KNX "Welcome Home," it was easy to understand the infectious excitement which has completely taken hold of the two men. While touring hospitals they saw a job to be done . . . and they are doing it. There are no sponsors, no salaries . . . and no big drawing names. The stars are the men themselves and whatever they want to do.

As for tackling this tremendous job, Maypole and Sollars are more than qualified. Roy Maypole, combat correspondent landed on the Jap-held Bougainville with a magnetic wire recorder strapped to his back and made the first recording of U.S. Marine landings. (They said it couldn't be done.)

The recorder was later shot off his back, severely wounding him. He was awarded the Purple Heart and sent home for six months' convalescence in a Navy hospital. Maypole fought along-side and almost died with the now-legendary Marine Corps in the South Pacific. He knows what he is doing.

Ray Sollars calls himself a "made" writer. He studied at the University of Missouri, and has been a writer-producer for radio for the past thirteen years. Previously, he studied medicine, but gave up thoughts of becoming a doctor when he felt he didn't have the required practical temperament. As a son of a physician and surgeon, Sollars likes to combine his knowledge of psychiatry with his own style of radio writing.

Maypole and Sollars work well together because they understand and like one another. They understand

the men with whom they are dealing. But, perhaps, the most important fact is they are giving their combined efforts and asking nothing in return but a keener effort on our part to comprehend the problem at hand.

As for the actual mechanism of the show, Maypole and Sollars hold auditions without the men knowing it. Still conducting the weekly hospital tours, they encourage the patients to join in. The men begin to talk to Ray and Roy, some eager to pour out their stories, others reticent.

Before they know it, they've accepted the bit to leave their hospital bed or wheelchair and come to Columbia Square to participate in the next week's show.

Sollars then prepares a script, which is often discarded for ad libs. With the program off the air, festivities don't end. The men may attend the Masquers Club for dinner or are included in another treat. It's a full and exciting day.

Participants Thrilled

"The program, you might say,"

Maypole continued, "got off to a banging start. The response on the part of the participants was swell. One old duck received his first week-end pass since his entry into the hospital several months before. But he wouldn't take it because he'd rather be on the show. Can you beat that?"

"For every thrill it gives them, it gives us twice as many," Sollars concluded. "Here's one example, I'll never forget. One wounded man was more eager than the rest to come

JACK OWENS is radio's one and only *Cruising Crooner*. His shy, soft-sighing colleagues prefer to swoon 'em at a distance, but Jack likes to sing a burning ballad directly to milady. None of your namby-pamby expiring at the mike for him. He sings to the bobby-soxers face-to-face and sometimes cheek-to-cheek. The squeals, groans and laughter that go out on the airways make listeners wonder whether they've tuned in the "Breakfast Club" or a girls' dormitory that's been invaded by Van Johnson.

Not only does Jack serenade the bobby-soxers, but matrons, housewives and grandmothers, as well. "I like to sing to someone," Jack explains. "It helps to bring out the romantic qualities of a song. Try singing 'I Surrender Dear' into the unresponsive microphone; then sing the same tune to a pretty girl and you'll see what I mean."

Persons lucky enough to get tickets for an early morning broadcast of the Blue Network's "Breakfast Club" in Chicago's Merchandise Mart are treated to this spectacular sight. Jack's emergence as the *Cruising Crooner* came about through a curious twist of fate. One morning his wife visited the studio to watch him perform. Midway in the broadcast Jack sang "Love Is the Sweetest Thing," and, by the way of tribute to his helpmate, left his place on the stage and sang directly to her. The audience responded with such enthusiasm that emcee McNeill insisted upon inclusion of personal sere-

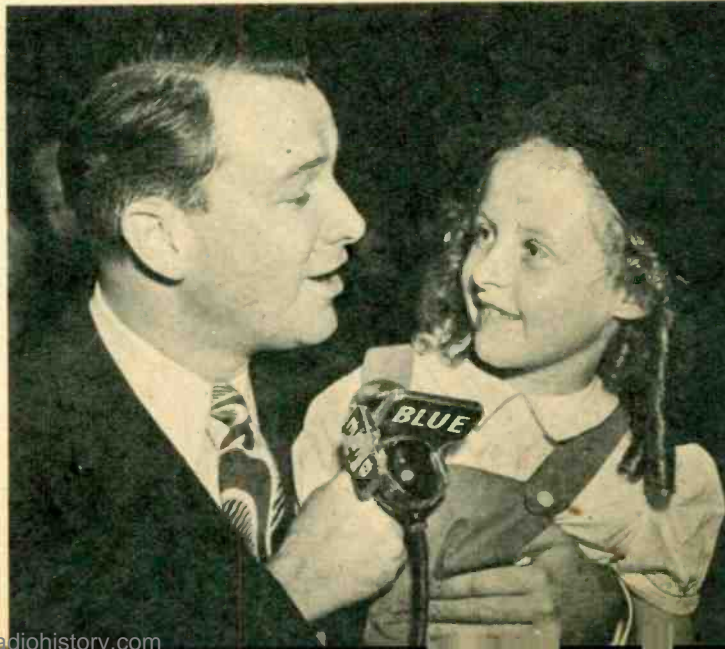

nades as a regular feature of the "Breakfast Club."

But let's go back to the beginning. John, Jr. (nicknamed Jack) made his entry into radio, due to a break, but not the usual kind. In the early summer of 1930, while playing pushball at a highschool track meet, someone pushed him instead of the ball and he ended up on the ground with a broken arm.

His talents at that time included a nimble wit, a pliant baritone voice, and the ability to play the piano. The last was temporarily beyond use, but his vocal chords were unimpaired and he set out to exploit them.

In 1933 he entered a contest, sponsored by the late Hal Kemp, to discover the most promising young singer of popular songs in the city of Chicago. Jack won first place and the prize went with it; a job as vocalist with Kemp's celebrated band.

Jack signed on the Blue's "Breakfast Club" in April, 1935. After two years of entertaining early morning risers, he decided to try his luck in Hollywood. While he was waiting he became a song writer and turned out hundreds of songs. Of these, best remembered are "Louisiana Lullaby," "I Dood It," and "I Know Somebody Who Loves You." In March 1941, he published a novelty tune called the "Hut Sut Song."

Jack continued his radio work via the Blue Network program, "Song Shop Romance." It was this show which brought Jack back to the attention of his old friend, Don McNeill. When the star tenor of the "Breakfast Club" left to join the Navy, McNeill called on Jack to return to the program.

Jack and wife, Helen, have three children—Mary Ann, nine, Johnny, six, and Noel, three. Mary Ann has

appeared on several "Breakfast Club" broadcasts to sing duets with her father. She has a lovely voice and her father wants her to become a songstress when she grows up.

The Owens family lives in a charming suburban home near Chicago. Their former home in San Fernando Valley has been rented for the duration to the son of General Chennault. Jack spends his evenings romping with his children or working on a new song. He writes an average of a song a week, few of which he releases for publication. He also writes an occasional short story, several of which have appeared in national magazines.

Mrs. Owens doesn't feel qualms of jealousy when she sees the bobbysoxers clinging to her husband. "It's the way he brings home the bacon," she philosophically observes. "And everyone knows that Jack is merely going through an act."

Recently a visitor asked Mary Ann what her mother said when she heard her husband swooning the girls on the radio.

Said Mary Ann, "She says, 'Well, kids, there's your Pop.'"
