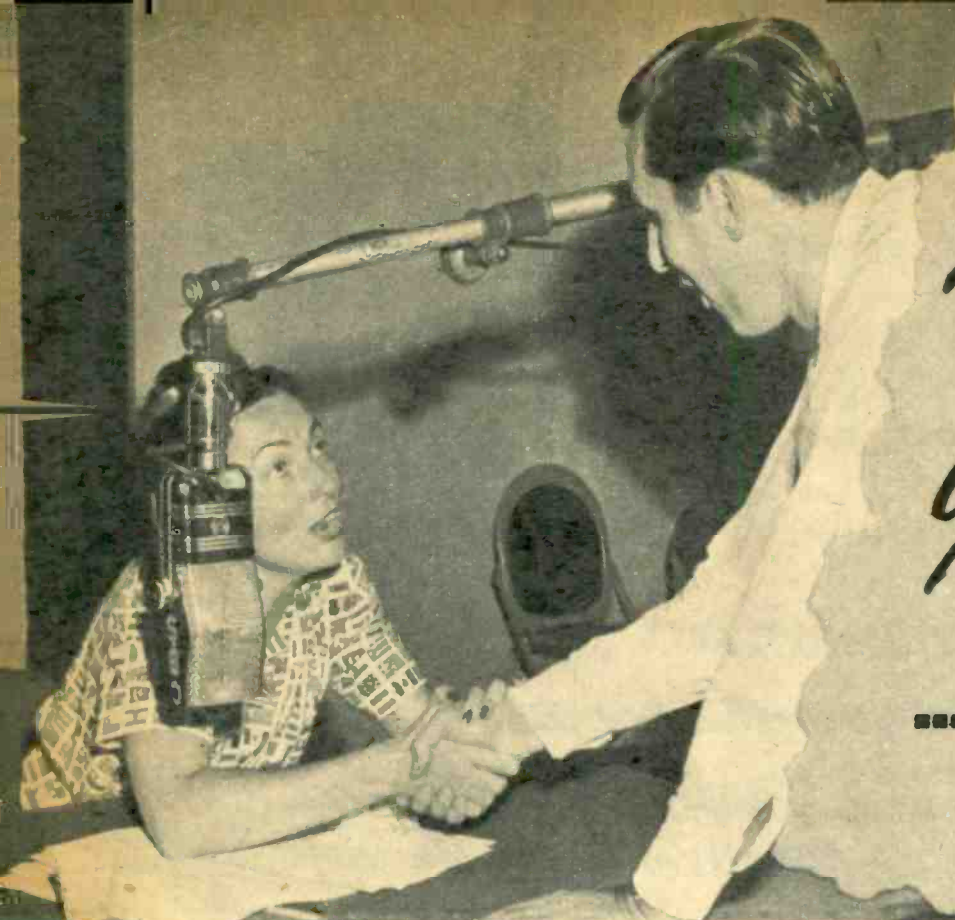

Moorehead Goes Mad...

...ON SUSPENSE

With Her Fourth Performance of "Sorry, Wrong Number," Agnes Moorehead Rings the Bell Again; Has Started Requests for Fifth

Thursday, 9 p.m.
CBS-RSX

AT THE CONCLUSION of her superb performance in "Sorry, Wrong Number," Agnes Moorehead wearily collapsed on the table before her. The thick coronet braids atop her head tumbled down into one long que, and she good-naturedly muttered "Oh, well, who cares what an old character woman looks like anyhow."

The "old character woman" had done it again! For the fourth time within two years she had thrilled and chilled radio audiences into unspeakable terror with her near-monologue of a woman who overhears plans for her *own* murder.

When "Sorry, Wrong Number," written by Lucille Fletcher, was submitted for her inspection in the summer of 1943, Miss Moorehead's first reaction was one of disbelief. "This will never go over. An audience will surely tire of its rising note of hysteria. I'm afraid it's impossible."

But "Wrong Number" proved to be a rousing success and largely due to Agnes' understanding portrayal of the neurotic invalid. Thousands of letters and cards poured into the

CBS offices requesting a repeat performance. In November of the same year, the requests were granted. Still more mail poured in and in February of 1944, the actress repeated it again.

It's Work!

Still this did not seem to satisfy an uncouted audience of dialers who knew what they wanted. So, a few weeks ago, Miss Moorehead undertook the gigantic task of bringing "Wrong Number" to the CBS "Suspense" Theater once more—for the

fourth time.

"Aside from the fact that it is one of my favorite radio plays," she laughed, "it is a tremendous amount of work." Viewing the actress in action, it was easy to understand why she termed it "work."

Completely oblivious to onlookers, although the show has no audience, (and dozens within the industry turned out to watch), Agnes created a world of her own. Reading from the original script, which by now is torn, tattered and heavily marked,

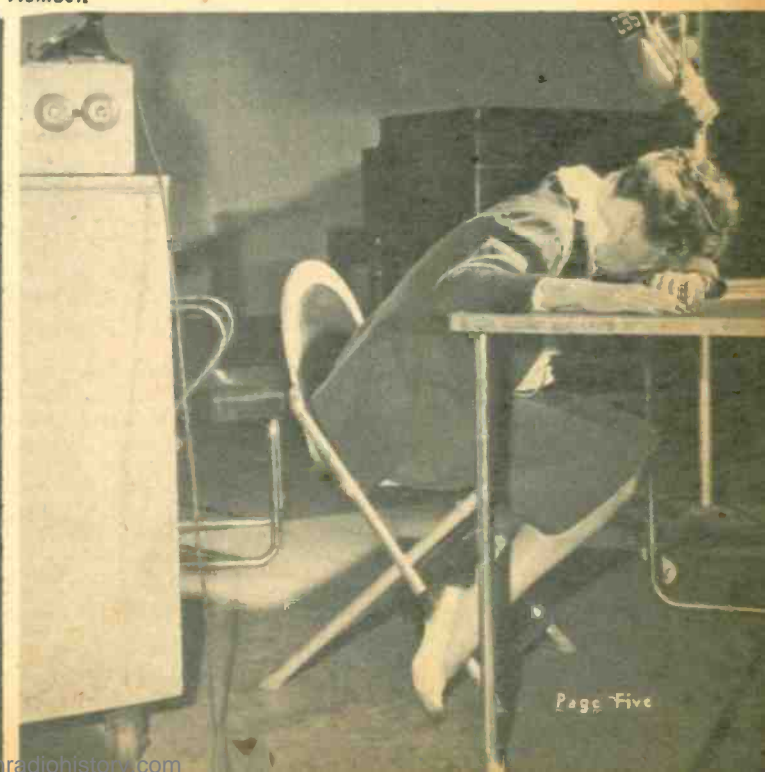
she had much of the dialogue memorized. And by depending upon soundman Berne Surrey, who has been with her on all four performances, for split-second timing, she automatically dialed when he dialed, reached for an imaginary phone when he did, and banged-down her mystical receiver in synchronization with his very - much - in - evidence sound effect.

ambitions for local affairs." It wasn't a very glamorous life for one born to good fortune, so along came Fate in the form of bandleader Ted Weems. Weems waved his magic wand (only bandleaders call them batons) and signed Perry to a contract as featured singer with his orchestra, after hearing him sing at a local entertainment. Perry was with the band for over six years, and if you were paying attention in those days, you almost certainly heard him on the many records he made with Weems, on the "Fibber and Molly" show from Chicago, and on the Catalina Island broadcasts from the Casino.

In Frankie's Footsteps

When Ted Weems went into the Coast Guard and disbanded the orchestra, Perry headed back for his hometown of Canonsburg, Pennsylvania, quite willing to take up the profession of barbering where he had left it six years before. He had no sooner gotten settled than an offer came, doubtless engineered by the same kind Fate, opening a debut at the famous Versailles night club in New York. Perry had his doubts about doing a "single," and none at all about his ability as a barber, so he almost turned it down. Maybe he remembered that the Versailles was where one Frank Sinatra started his famous stampede toward stardom. Anyway, he decided to accept. "I didn't expect anything like Sinatra's phenomenal success," explained the modest Mr. Como, "but they seemed to like me." Which is putting it very mildly. The same audience that loved Frankie, fell hook, line and sinker for Como. So did Twentieth Century-Fox. Today, he has already made one picture, and has just started playing a leading role in another titled "Doll Face." Sales of his records, "Long Ago and Far Away," and "I Love You" have passed the 400,000 mark. He is star of Chesterfield's "Supper Club," and fan clubs in his honor are springing up all over the country. Yes, they liked him!

NO JOHNNY-COME-LATELY is Perry Como. Long before the crooner-craze hit the bobby-soxers, tall, dark and handsome Perry was a favorite with radio and record fans. He's now star of NBC's "Supper Club," and under contract for pictures.

ONCE UPON A TIME" is really the right way to begin a story about Perry Como, the singing star of NBC's "Supper Club." Perry was born the seventh son of a seventh son, and if you remember your Grimm Fairy Tales, you'll know without being told that all seventh sons of seventh sons contrive to be handsome, talented and charming. As if that weren't enough,

they always manage to achieve a happy ending, too.

Perry follows the tradition to the letter. For instance, when the now tall, dark and handsome Perry was a sprout of eleven years, he met a girl, Roselle, at a children's party. She may not have been a princess in disguise, but Perry thought she was pretty enough to be. "Right then and there," he said firmly, "I decided that someday I would marry her. And nine years later I did!"

Perry became a barber. "I was a pretty good barber," said Perry modestly, "and I reserved my singing

Luck may have had a little something to do with all this, but the fact that Perry is quiet and very determined certainly helps. He has an honest dislike of publicity stunts, and hates demonstrations of any kind. In his spare time he plays guitar and trombone, and though it doesn't fit in with the Brothers Grimm conception of life, his favorite dishes are spaghetti and corned beef.

He has a four-year-old son, Ronald, with whom he romps whenever he gets a chance. He's still happily married to Roselle, the girl he met at that party, and we think a fitting end to Perry's story is the one with which all stories should really end—"and they lived happily ever after."

Hizzoner Returns

"Fibber McGee and Molly" fans had a double cause to rejoice with the NBC show's recent return to the air. Not only were all their old friends of last season back at the microphone, but they brought with them a member long-absent from the cast—Gale Gordon, well-remembered for his role as "Mayor La Trivia."

Gordon joined the Coast Guard in December of 1942, and following his boot training and a year as instructor on the gunnery range at San Clemente, he was assigned to an LST, with the rating of Chief Gunner's Mate, and headed for New Guinea where the craft served as a PT boat tender for eight months. Then came a transfer to another LST and a part in the invasion at Lingayen Gulf and Zamboango, which included a near-sinking of his ship and some rough action.

Comments the actor: "LST means Large Slow Target!"

Conried in Manila

Another Hollywoodian muchly-missed along radio row is Hans Conried, actor of distinguished ability and distinctive dress, who is still overseas.

The colorful Conried is manager of radio station WVPN in Manila. His father told Radio Life that the time of his son's return to the States is still guess-work.

"He has three programs of his own out there, and he is doing some producing," the actor's father reported proudly, then added: "But I'd rather he had no programs of his own and was doing no producing—and be back home!"

We found the players assembled on the CBS theater stage, awaiting the start of dress rehearsal. Miss Davis in a simple black frock, cigarette in hand, was animatedly discussing the play (in which she previously starred on the screen), while Mr. Henreid, tall, blond and suavely attired in a light gray suit and matching maroon tie and socks, listened intently. The supporting cast, headed by Joe Kearns

and including Jack Edwards, Gloria McMillan, Marjorie Riordan, Dorothy Scott and George Neise, sat studiously studying their scripts.

At a signal from director Fred McKay, the show's rehearsal began. Bette emoted admirably, turned on screaming hysterics for one sequence until her face flamed, then blew her nose and switched emotions with ease for the dialogue that followed.

At one place in the script, her line to Henreid was, "Would you like to kiss me?", whereupon her handsome co-star leaned over the rail of Lux's microphone stand, peered around the mike at his leading lady, rolled his eyes and gave her an impish grin.

Elliott Lewis Back

Radio Lifers who have long been requesting news of actor Elliott Lewis will be pleased to know that he is now back at the microphone regularly as "Archie" of MBS' "The Amazing Nero Wolfe."

Elliott, whose wife, Cathy Lewis, plays "Phyl" on the Mutual "Michael Shayne" detective series, is returning to radio after three years in the army.

This pleases Guy. "Only one out of seven kids not in the music business," he laughs, "isn't a bad batting average. He (the brother who isn't in the band) is an interior decorator and mostly does work for musicians, so it's almost like having another musician! My other sister works for the T. Harmon Publishing Co. and is married to our ex-singer, Kenny Gardner. We're really one big happy family."

When asked how he had been able to maintain his musical standards

throughout the years, Guy admitted with a grin that he was a fighter for his musical principles. "We've got a lot of loyal fans to whom we are eternally grateful, but it was one barber back in Chicago who 'saved our band.' We were just kids and we had organized the band and were playing our first season in Chicago. Well, the band was a sensation!"

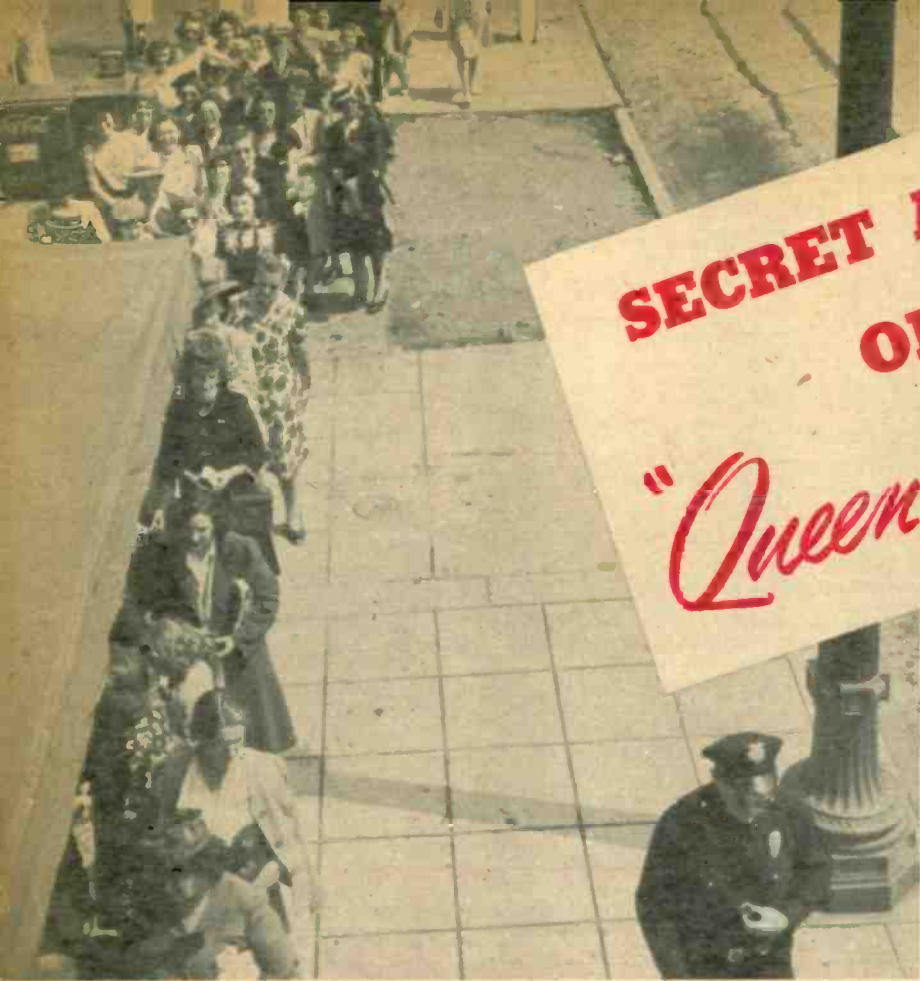


OLDEST OF THE LOMBARDOS and maestro of the famous band is boat-loving Guy.

Have a pedicure—with one for her husband, too!

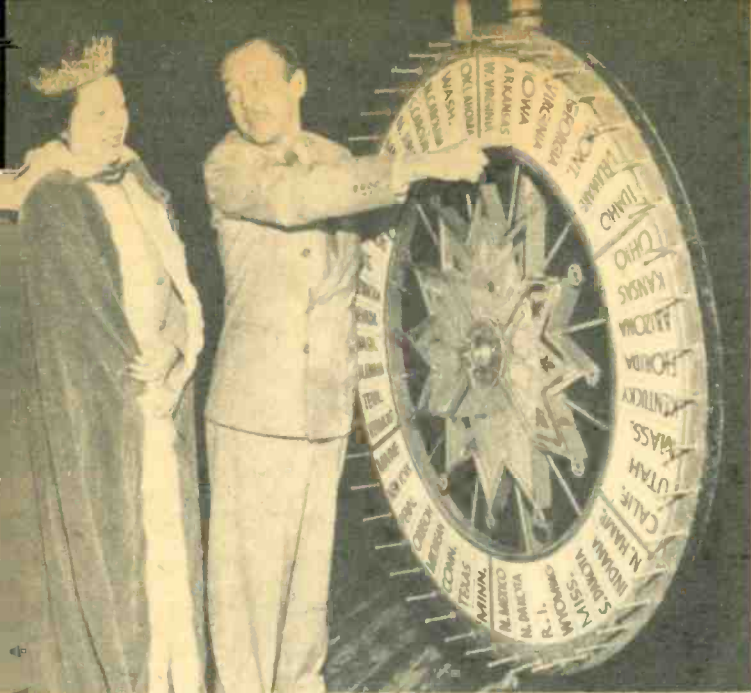

"Could be," commented Carmen.

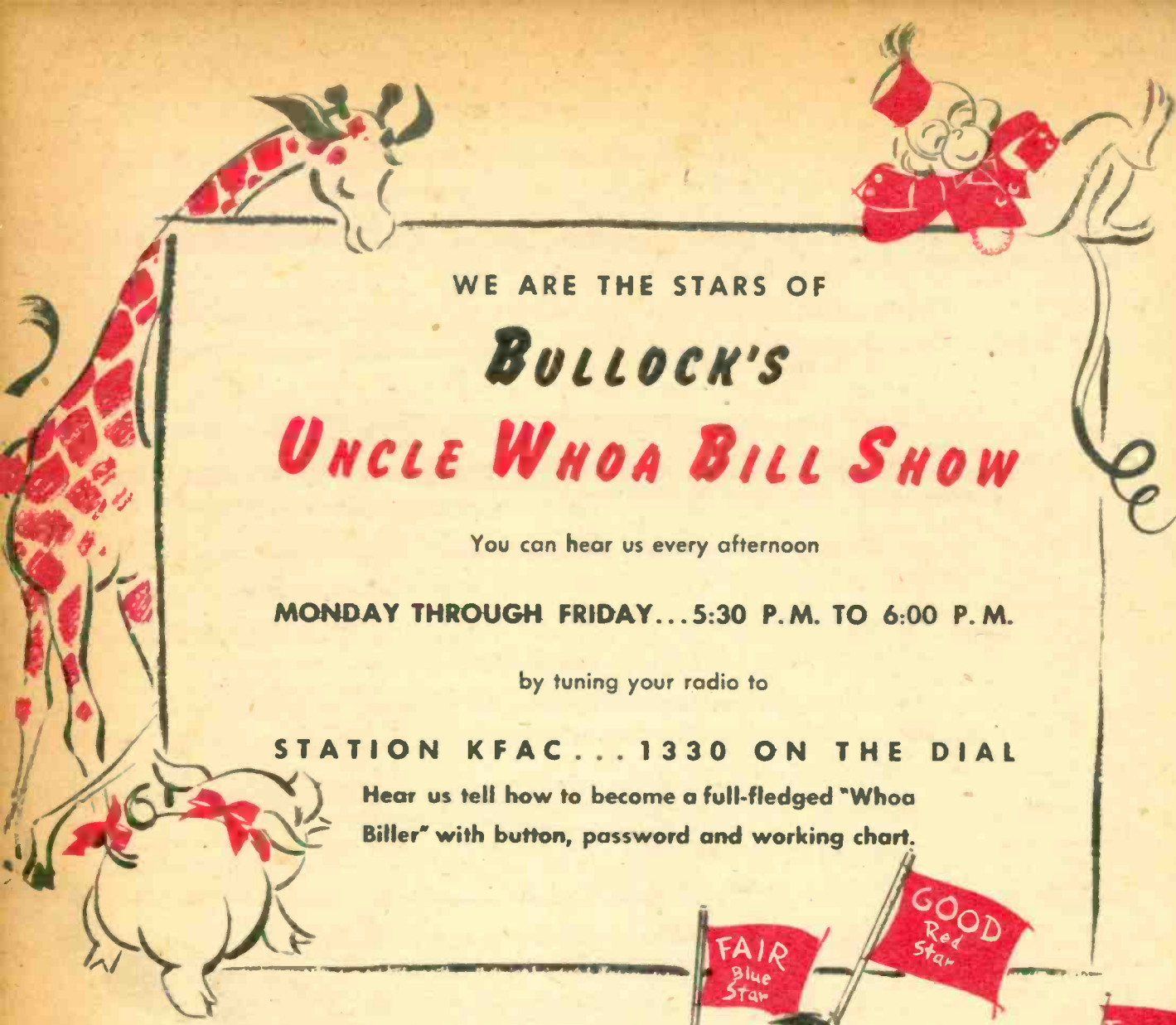
Boating Enthusiasts
