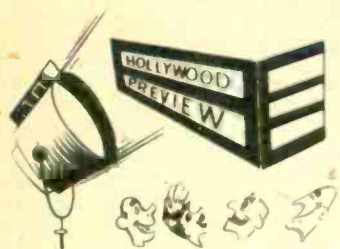

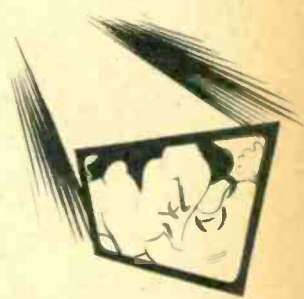

Trunks of Gags

Carpentry is one of the comedian's chief hobbies. His workshop is in the garage which, incidentally, also houses his trunksful (literally!) of gags and jokes that he has collected through the years. In his other "workshop" (the den in his home where he and partner "Lil" spend most of their time, working on the scripts for their airshow), the book shelves contain innumerable volumes of comedy material, including

the original Joseph Miller joke book, published in 1790.

"It's the unfunniest book I've ever read," chuckled Kirkwood. "It's full of 'shaggy dog' stories.

"You know the 'shaggy dog' story," he interpolated, "about the little boy who was asked by his mother to bring home a bottle of milk from the store. 'And if you break the bottle of milk,' admonished his mother, 'I'll kill you.' So off went the little boy to the store where he bought the bottle of milk and with it tucked carefully under his arm, he started

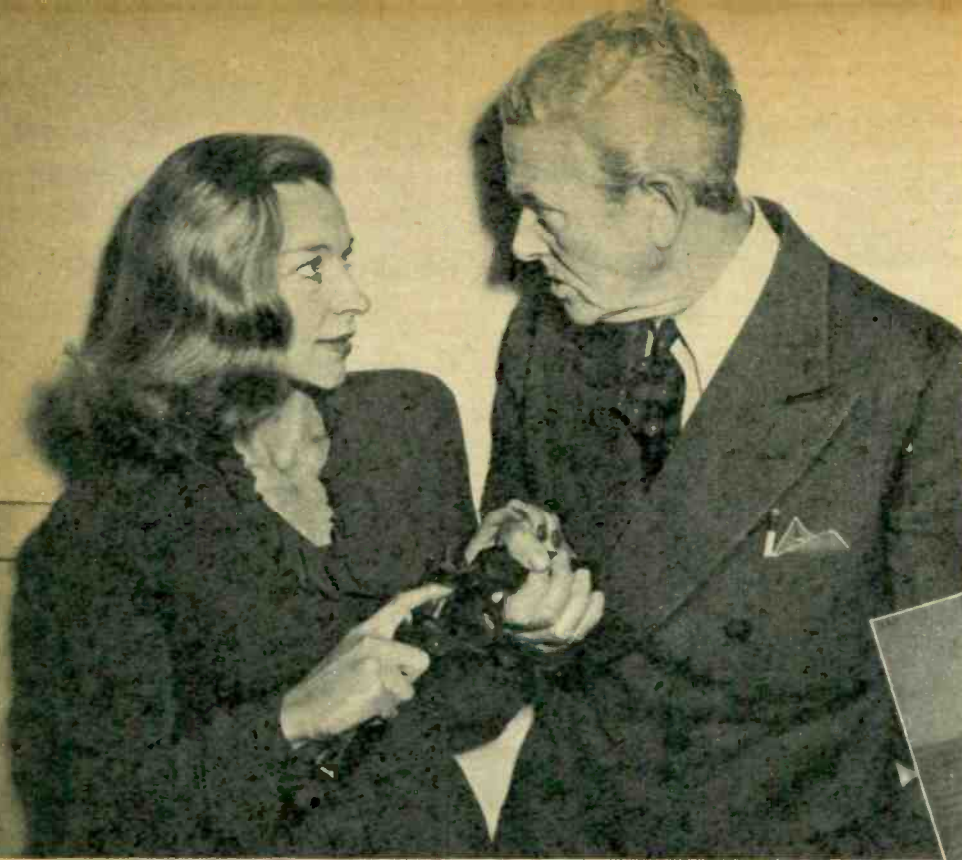

has afforded her the chance to play G-Man.

Although winner of Radio Life's 1945 award for the best written dramatic script ("Mr. District Attorney"), Devine is at present producing the powerful "This Is Your FBI," based on actual happenings in the FBI files.

When Radio Life learned that its award winner was bringing the FBI show to the Coast for a few weeks, we eagerly took the opportunity to watch him in action and to discuss with him his "career in crime."

Stickler for Authenticity

A stickler for authenticity, the writer-producer has always based his cases on actual happenings, changing names, dates and places only as necessary. The stories of "Mr. District Attorney" often grew out of newspaper happenings or old police records. The format for "This Is Your FBI" follows the same policy.

Sometime ago, Devine conceived the idea of presenting the FBI's side of crime. In addition to entertaining the public, he hoped to enlighten and familiarize it with the workings of the G-Men, the fabulous behind-scenes of detecting crime.

Obtaining permission from FBI headquarters in Washington, Devine then went to a school conducted by the Bureau for instruction of its G-Men. "It was like a vacation. I had two heavenly weeks, delving and probing into the whys and wherefores of law."

With the files of the FBI open to them, Devine and writer Frank Phares went to work. Devine feels he has an inexhaustible supply of material on hand and tries to base his stories on timely topics, with less emphasis on bizarre happenings. "Crime is a squalid profession and should be presented as such. For every 'star' of the crime world, there are a hundred average people plugging along at it."

Extremely interested in juvenile delinquency, the producer has been instrumental in presenting programs designed to familiarize youngsters with the procedure of the FBI. Recently in Syracuse, New York, "This Is Your FBI," was presented from the stage of a local high school auditorium in conjunction with illustrated speeches and exhibits from the FBI. The audience reception was excellent and Devine hopes to see it

Then there was the morning Steve's typewriter went on the blink. By the time they found one that was in working order, "Smile Time's" opener was jelled. The theme was sung with every "I" replaced by an "O." The boys liked this idea so well they did it twice.

There's practically nothing from bank robbers to Boy Scouts that Wendell and Steve haven't lampooned via "Smile Time." Just mention stock-brokers, for instance, and they're off: *Sound: Stock Market Ticker Machine.*

STEVE: Here come the daily stock market reports, Mr. Richbottom!

WEN: Hmm. Flabbergasted Steel — 78½. Amalgamated Garbage Collection is picking up too! Let's see — American Butcher Knife has cut down a little. Transcontinental Pogo Stick is improving by leaps and bounds.

STEVE: Here comes the report on your investment, Mr. Richleigh!

WEN: Let me see! Oh no! It can't be! Consolidated Trousers Corporation! Oh! The bottom has dropped out of the market! I'm ruined — wiped out! (CRIES) I'm going to end it all!

STEVE: No, Mr. Richleigh! Wait! I know something that will make you happy again! It's **SMILE TIME!**

Usually Noble and Allen handle the openings themselves, but sometimes they write the distaff side of the program, June Foray, into the picture, as follows:

From Hyenas to Twigs

"It's Smile Time" openings tax the ingenuity of the sound man no end, because he never knows what he's going to be expected to produce. One morning it will be reveille bugle call at an army camp; next it will be jungle drums and the sound of a laughing hyena as Noble and Allen stalk the perils of the African veldt. Wednesday, it may be a steamboat whistle and harbor sounds; Thursday, the laboratory of an electrical engineer; Friday, country evening sounds, with the script specifying, SOUND: CRACK A TWIG, AND IT'S A GOOD TWIG IF YOU CAN DO IT.

Whenever possible, Noble and Al-

len like plenty of action in their openers, especially when it gives them a chance to lampoon some time-honored old American Tradition, to-wit:

Sound: *Horses hooves fading in.*

WEN: From out of the Wild West rides the last living rider of the Pony Express. Through rain and snow, through desert and over mountain he comes!

Sound: *Horse still dashes madly. Distant shots.*

WEN: Savage Indians fire on this intrepid postman, but still his gallant steed fights through deadly peril along the lonely Western trail. Faster, faster, faster, till it seems the man and horse can go no farther, but still they press on. What message is it that our hero bears? Up to our studio he comes . . .

Sound: *Horse coming to sudden puffing stop. Man leaps from horse, runs on mike.*

WEN: . . . bearing a message of vital importance.

STEVE: (GASPING) Here y'are pardner. Here it is.

WEN: Thanks, old man.

Sound: *Tearing open paper.*

STEVE: What does it say?

WEN: Why, IT'S SMILE TIME, that's what.

Yes, it takes a lot of work to dream up good openings for "Smile Time". Sometimes Wendell and Steve reach a long way . . . but they'll never reach further than this one:

STEVE: Wendell, what will we do for an opening for the show this morning? We gotta have an opening!

WEN: An opening? Don't worry a bit! I've been working here in the studio all night with a pick and shovel, and I've got the biggest opening you ever saw!

"House On 92nd"

Devine considers one of the show's most unusual stories a radio adaptation of the movie, "The House on 92nd Street." The stories are narrated in a documentary form, thereby gaining "FBI" a reputation of one of the most influential documentary shows of the air.

Ex-gag writer Devine is one man who has found that writing about crime does pay. Turning from acting to writing, Jerry began his scripting as funny man in 1937 and later wrote the dramatic sketches for the "Kate Smith Hour." With the smash success of "Mr. District Attorney," he was established as a top crime writer.

With only the production of FBI to keep him occupied, he is contemplating another show. One he will write again—and one which won't be crime. But crime won't take a back seat, because Mr. Devine has at least a million more FBI plots at his fingertips for his G-Man fans to unravel.

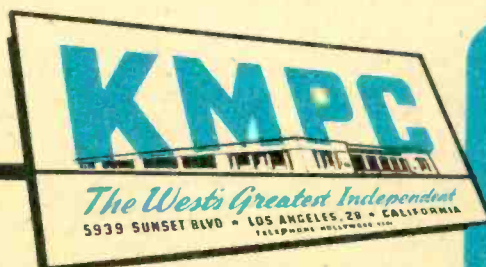
