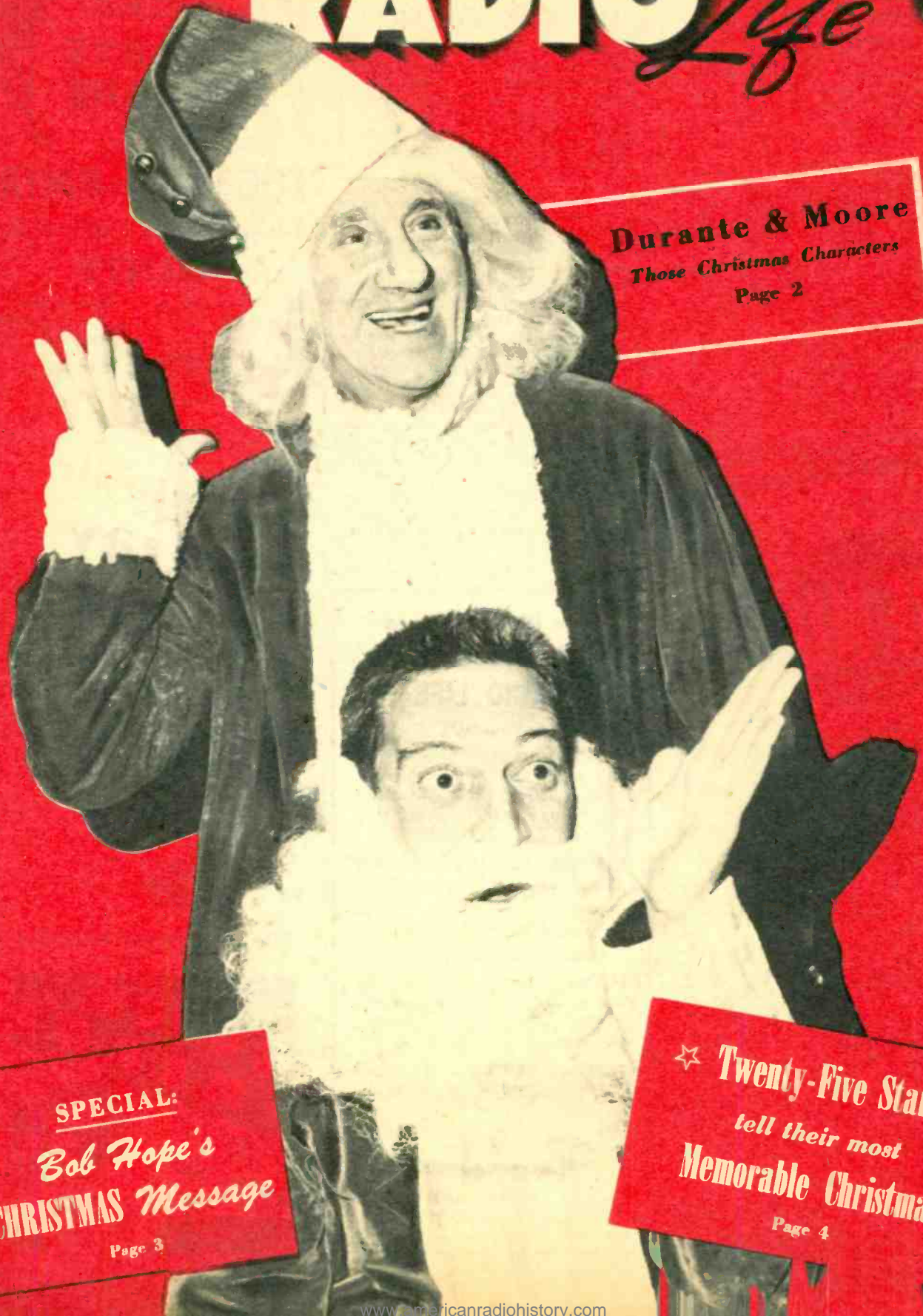

So maybe it's a good time to look at the Christmas package those guys left for the rest of us back here at home. Let's see . . . There's Midway—why, we'd almost forgotten about that . . . And Guadalcanal—something like that comes in mighty handy . . . And Tarawa and Saipan, and U-boats chased out of the Atlantic.


Here's a big package—North Africa, and Sicily's right next to it, and Salerno. There's a date on this one—June 6, 1944 . . . D-Day was a package that cost plenty—in tanks and battleships and PT boats, in bombers and fighter planes, and on foot—especially on foot.

And then there are the biggest packages of all—Berlin and Tokyo. Yes, it's quite a package they left for us this Christmas, so let's say a prayer of thanks to the guys who came back—and another prayer for the ones who didn't.

Perhaps, in many instances, they are similar to your own experiences and will bring to mind that Christmas you, too, remember most.






*Your Radio Favorites Herewith Relate the  
Yuletide Experiences They'll Never Forget*


**Gracie Allen:** I don't think any Christmas could be any more wonderful than that of 1936. After years of trouping around the country in vaudeville, celebrating the holidays in drafty theaters and windblown hotels, we had finally settled down in our first house in Beverly Hills. And what is especially more to the point, it was our first Christmas with Ronnie, the baby we had adopted only a few months before. George fell into the Christmas tree, the plumbing didn't work very well, the house wasn't paid for, there wasn't any snow, but Santa Claus had never looked so beautiful before.



**Dinah Shore:** The Christmas when I was five years old. We were living in Winchester, Tennessee, but had spent Christmas eve and Christmas day in Nashville with some relatives. I was an unhappy little girl because I figured Santa would have to pass by our house as long we weren't home. But late that afternoon, when we arrived back at the house, I found a Christmas tree full of gifts. I couldn't figure out how Santa had gotten in.




**Art Linkletter:** Christmas in New York, 1929! I was seventeen years old, and gathering experience before entering college. I'd been a clerk, dishwasher, chauffeur, newsboy and secretary, and really had no idea of what I wanted to do with my life. I found myself wandering the sidewalks, broke, hungry and jobless. I went into a Salvation Army mission and sat down to a big meal of turkey and all the trimmings. Back out on the sidewalk, with a full stomach, I found my luck had changed. I encountered a Wall Street acquaintance who led me to a new job. I haven't been without one since!




**Jack Haley:** Probably the most memorable Christmas of my life was the one many years ago when I was playing the old Keith Circuit with "The Lightner Girls and Alexander." Our act opened in New Haven on Christmas day—and that was the day I met Florence McFadden, one of the prettiest of the Lightner Girls. She's now my wife.

**Ralph Edwards:** The Christmas I remember most was spent on the family farm near Merino, Colorado. I was just beginning to be on the the doubtful side about the man with the long white whiskers. Dad, in order to convince me, went with me out to the barn where we filled a wash tub with hay and put the hay right in front of the farmhouse door. Then, in the middle of the night, he hitched up the team to the wagon, drove it down the lane to the main road, matched the tracks and drove it back up to the house, took away the hay—and so, I was convinced in the morning that Santa had been there.



**Judy Canova:** Christmas 1944 had all the earmarks of being an unhappy one because my husband was overseas, and I knew he was homesick and longing to see his baby daughter, Juliette, as much as we wanted him at home. The family tried to make dinner a festive affair, but we couldn't help looking at Chet's vacant chair. In the middle of dinner, the bell rang and a messenger boy delivered a large crate. We opened it to find an oil painting of my husband, done by a famous European, a prisoner of war. Without a word I placed the picture on the vacant chair at the table, and all through dinner, he seemed to be right there with us.




**Cass Daley:** Last year, we spent our first Christmas in our home in Hollywood. For seven years before that, I'd found myself on a personal appearance tour on Christmas, spending the holiday in such far-off places as London, Memphis, Chicago, Dallas, Boston, Pittsburgh and Washington, D. C. So last year, happy to be home for the occasion, I promised my husband I'd make him a good turkey dinner. I had a broadcast to do at two in the afternoon, so I put the turkey in the roaster and set it to start at three. But my air appearance was postponed till a later hour and I came home at six to find my turkey burned to a crisp. For the eighth consecutive year, we ate our Christmas dinner in a restaurant.




**Leo Gorcey:** The Christmas I was fourteen. My brother and I were in


bed, but wide awake, and my folks made the mistake of leaving the tree unguarded. We sneaked downstairs with an air rifle and did a little sharpshooting at the ornaments. But when the folks came back, we were in bed again and apparently sound asleep. They always wondered what had happened to that tree!




**Fibber McGee and Molly:** (Marian and Jim Jordan): This Christmas of 1945 should be our most memorable one for so many reasons. If you can forget for a moment that we are entertainers and remember that we are a family, this will seem even more true. We are all close enough to be together this year. Our daughter, Kathryn, and her husband, Adrian, who is back from a tour of duty with the Navy in the Pacific, and their daughter, our granddaughter, Diane, will be with us. Our son, Jimmy, and his wife, Carmela, will be with us. What family could ask for more at Christmas time? It is impossible to think of our own family's good fortune at this first Christmas of peace following such a horrible war, without wishing that all families everywhere were as fortunate as ours is.



**Bob Burns:** It was the Christmas I was six years old, down in Sulphur Springs, Texas. My uncle found that I wanted a burro, and on Christmas day, I found a rope strung through the living room. I followed it and found a real live burro at the end! It was a cute little tan fellow with long fuzzy ears and a stripe down his back, and it sure made me a happy little boy.



**Iris Adrian:** Christmas 1944 in New York. I had spent several Christmas seasons in California and I was homesick for the good old-fashioned "white Christmas" of New York. So last year, I was terribly happy to find my schedule allowing me to have exactly what I had been longing for. But wouldn't you know it! It was so cold I couldn't venture out of my hotel room, and I caught such a terrible cold anyway that I had to spend the entire holiday season in bed!



**Hoagy Carmichael:** Fifteen years ago, just at Christmas, I left Hollywood, after exhausting all my contacts and money, to return to New York. I didn't relish sitting up on

the train for four nights, but I had barely enough money for a coach ticket. Then I met Paul Whiteman when I boarded the train on Christmas eve. Paul was taking his band back to New York, and he introduced me to a young fellow who sang with the band. During our conversation, I lamented the fact that I was going to have to sit up all the way across the country, whereupon my new-found friend immediately invited me to share his upper berth. That night, as we stretched out for some sleep, I apologetically asked him his name again, since I'd been so preoccupied with my own troubles that I hadn't paid attention. The name was Bing Crosby. What a guy—and what a Christmas I spent on that train!

**Jack Kirkwood:** We were pretty hard up one year and I was just a youngster, but I determined we'd have a real Christmas dinner. So I sneaked over into a neighbor's yard, stole a chicken, killed and cooked it myself. It was the best chicken I ever tasted!

**Rosemary De Camp:** Christmas, 1942. It could have been so beautiful, because our daughter Nana had been born just a month before—but it turned out to be a grim holiday. My husband was away in the Army, and on Christmas day, he had to stand guard in the rain!

**Joan Davis:** The Christmas, in St. Paul, Minnesota, when I was fourteen. I was very large for my age. At an Elk's party, when I stood in line with the other kids to receive gifts from Santa Claus, Santa looked up at me and said, "Nothing for the mothers!"

**Perry Ward:** I was sixteen, in high school, and in love! In fact, I was so lovesick I couldn't even eat my Christmas dinner! But late that night, I got hungry and raided the ice-box!

**Opie Cates:** The Christmas I was twelve, I'd been longing for a clarinet, but my folks kept saying it wasn't a practical gift for a boy living on an Arkansas farm. Christmas morning came and Dad handed me a long narrow box. My heart rose,

then sank when I saw it was a carton bearing the name of an electric train on top. But I opened it and there was the horn! My Dad and Mother had wanted to play a joke on me. The funny thing is, that "impractical" gift paid my way through college!

**Frank Sinatra:** Last Christmas—our first in our California home. I stayed up late on Christmas eve to help Santa decorate our tree. Our little boy was old enough to enjoy it with his big sister, Nancy, and at six o'clock in the morning on Christmas day, she came in and asked me if Santa had come. I lifted her up in my arms to carry her downstairs and her little body was actually trembling with excitement. I almost cried.

**Jimmy Scribner:** When I was seven years old, I wanted a billy goat for Christmas. After Santa had come, I found no goat by the tree, but a large red billy goat wagon and a note from St. Nick. It said, "Sorry about the billy goat. Didn't think your folks would want old Santy to leave him in the living room, so I guess I will have to take him back to the North Pole with me." My Dad read the note to me and I howled with disappointment. Then he read me the post script on it: "Found space in the barn and you will find Billy there." Well, I raced out to the barn in double-quick time and there he was—a coal-black billy goat!

**Charlotte Greenwood:** It was the December of 1942, when, with Red Skelton and the Merry Macs, I was asked to entertain the men of the Sixth Armored Division which was being trained at Rice, California, for the African invasion. We traveled by bus, left Hollywood on Christmas eve, drove all night. Christmas day found us in Indio, where we had our Christmas dinner at a lunch counter. Later, we gave our show for some forty thousand men. I dressed by an old-fashioned pot-bellied stove and was constantly dodging behind it as Marines came in to get coffee off the tange!

**Cliff Arquette:** I believe mine was one Christmas about five or six years ago. I'd been out of work for six

months or more when suddenly, on Christmas eve, I got a job and a substantial advance. In the mood to celebrate, I arrived home that night with two bottles of champagne. That evening, my mother, who was living with me, and I decorated the Christmas tree. She had never tasted champagne before and neither had I. When morning dawned, we hastened to inspect our handiwork. That was the oddest-looking tree I ever saw—because we'd trimmed it on only one side!

**Fannie Brice:** The Christmas my son Bill was just one year old.

**Gene Autry:** The Christmas season I was working as assistant telegrapher on a railroad in Chelsea, Oklahoma. One night I was sitting in the office singing and strumming on my guitar when a stranger came in to send a telegram. He told me, "You have a nice voice. You ought to become a professional." Afterward I looked at the wire he'd written out. The signature was Will Rogers.

**Ginny Simms:** I don't think any of my other Christmases will measure up to the one I'm going to have this year—my first as Mrs. Hyatt Dehn.

**Ozzie and Harriet:** It was several years ago when we had just purchased our first home, in New Jersey. David was very little and Ricky was still a baby. We were doing an orchestra date, and the King Sisters asked us in the afternoon of the day before Christmas if we would be home that night. We said "Yes, about midnight—after our dance engagement," which is when we did arrive home and begin decorating our tree. We finished the job about four in the morning, feeling far more exhausted than merry. But then, through an open window came the singing of Christmas carols. We looked out to find Alvino Rey, the King Sisters and the entire orchestra serenading us. Pretty soon, all our neighbors were joining in the singing and we invited everybody in and had a wonderful Christmas party together!

The American Broadcasting network will use the letters ABC; Associated becomes the Associated Broadcasting System with the initials ABS.

"Speaking of gifts," he continued, "and I'm not hinting"—(aside to Edna)—"I got the brightest tie you ever saw while I was still in service."

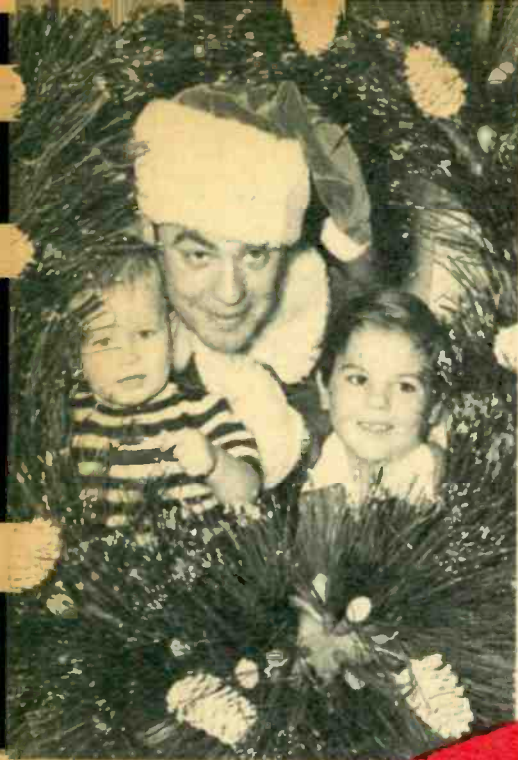

# A Visit to Bethlehem

## ON CHRISTMAS EVE

**J**ERUSALEM, as you probably know, is about five miles from Bethlehem . . . I had been staying in Jerusalem with a few friends and we decided to make our pilgrimage to Bethlehem by walking every step of the way up to the world-famous shrine. It was a wonderful walk . . . filled to the brim with things of historical and Biblical interest. We avoided the modern highway and instead followed the old mountain trail . . . a trail that has changed very little in the last two thousand years. We passed the modest tomb of Rachael (which the Mohammedans sold to the Jews) and walked beside the fields where Ruth gleaned after the reapers and where the sorrow-stricken Naomi returned . . . We saw the rolling hills where David kept his father's sheep and the very glens where he first sang those glorious psalms . . . We passed by the groves of olive trees that are famous the world over, and the walled vineyards, each with its own watch tower built of stones collected from the surrounding fields.

Pausing at the foot of the hill, we drank from the large old well where wayfarers still stop to water their animals . . . It is known as the "Well of the Wise Men," for it was at this well that the Three Wise Men halted to water their camels while on their way to Bethlehem . . . They didn't know then that they had practically reached their goal, for the City of Bethlehem was still hidden from them by the hill. But as they leaned over the mouth of the Well they saw to their delight the reflection of the star in the water . . . the star that had led them from the East . . . and

as it was almost directly overhead, they knew that their journey was almost ended.

As we climbed the hill we heard the shepherds piping to their sheep . . . a strangely appealing, plaintive sound . . . The pipes are made from reeds by the shepherd boys, and these same quaint instruments were the forerunners of the modern church organ, and are identical to those originally used by David himself . . . We passed the brick-lined caves in which people lived two thousand years ago. And finally we approached the huge fortress-like Church of the Nativity, built on the spot where the Stable once stood. It was built by Constantine the Great in the year 330 A.D.—over sixteen centuries ago—making it one of the oldest, if not the oldest, existing church in Christendom today . . .

### Reason for Low Door

All of the main streets of Bethlehem lead to the market place that fronts this church, and underneath this square are extensive cisterns cut into the solid rock and surrounded by numerous stone troughs . . . As we approached, a caravan of camels had just arrived and were waiting for some donkeys and goats to finish drinking before quenching their thirsts. Passing them by, we were very surprised to discover that the entrance to the Church was both low and narrow, although above and at the sides of the low opening we could see the outlines of the original stately portal which had long since been walled up. We learned that there were two reasons for this low door,

first, to compel pilgrims to bow their heads before entering, and second, to keep the ancient infidels from riding in on horseback or camel.

We entered the little doorway and found ourselves in a dignified and simple interior set off by beautiful Corinthian columns of native red sandstone, with a roof of massive English oak. As we entered the hallowed chapel the moonbeams streamed through the lofty windows into the subdued light of the interior, as if intent on gladdening and brightening this already beautiful spot . . . Overhead silver lamps of burning olive oil were suspended on gold and silver chains . . . Below these a giant guard was keeping vigil over a silver star . . . a star fastened to an altar with silver nails and marking the exact spot where the Infant Jesus was born . . . For twenty-four hours a day throughout every day of the year an armed guard protects that Star to see that no over-enthusiastic Christian takes away so much as a single nail.

### Many Caves

Facing the chapel where the Star is kept, three steps lead down to a small cave-like recess. This is the Chapel of the Manger where Christ was cradled. Beautiful tapestries and rugs are draped across the walls

and fifteen silver lamps are kept burning there day and night. The entire hill where the Church of the Nativity is built is virtually honey-combed with a labyrinth of caves. We visited the cave where King Herod slaughtered the innocents of Bethlehem . . . We visited the cave where St. Joseph is said to have received his warning to flee to Egypt . . . We visited the cave in which St. Jerome translated the Bible into Latin . . . Then returning again to the Chapel of the Nativity, we saw devout white-robed nuns kneeling in adoration around the Silver Star . . . As I knelt a little to one side, I felt almost stunned to experience such a glorious privilege, for in the stillness of that underground sanctuary were representatives of many Christian nations kneeling in common before the birthplace of Jesus . . . There was an old Egyptian farmer (travel-worn and weary) directly beside two American girls . . . Then there was a young German and his bride, and near them knelt a woman of Bethlehem wearing a strange conical head-dress . . . There was a stalwart man from Alaska . . . a son of an English Lord . . . an old Italian Lady from Rome, and close by, a senorita from Andalusia . . . A constant stream of all types of people poured down the narrow stairway, knelt, a few moments in silent prayer and then left . . . There was no confusion; not a word nor a whisper was spoken and scarcely a footstep could be heard . . .

As we came out through the same little door we had entered, the heavens above were magnificently lighted by God's own glorious stars, which almost seemed near enough to touch . . . The myriad of candles within the gorgeous Church cast glimmering streams of light down the hill toward Jerusalem, and precisely at the stroke of twelve, the bells and chimes resounded to the skies with their joy . . .
