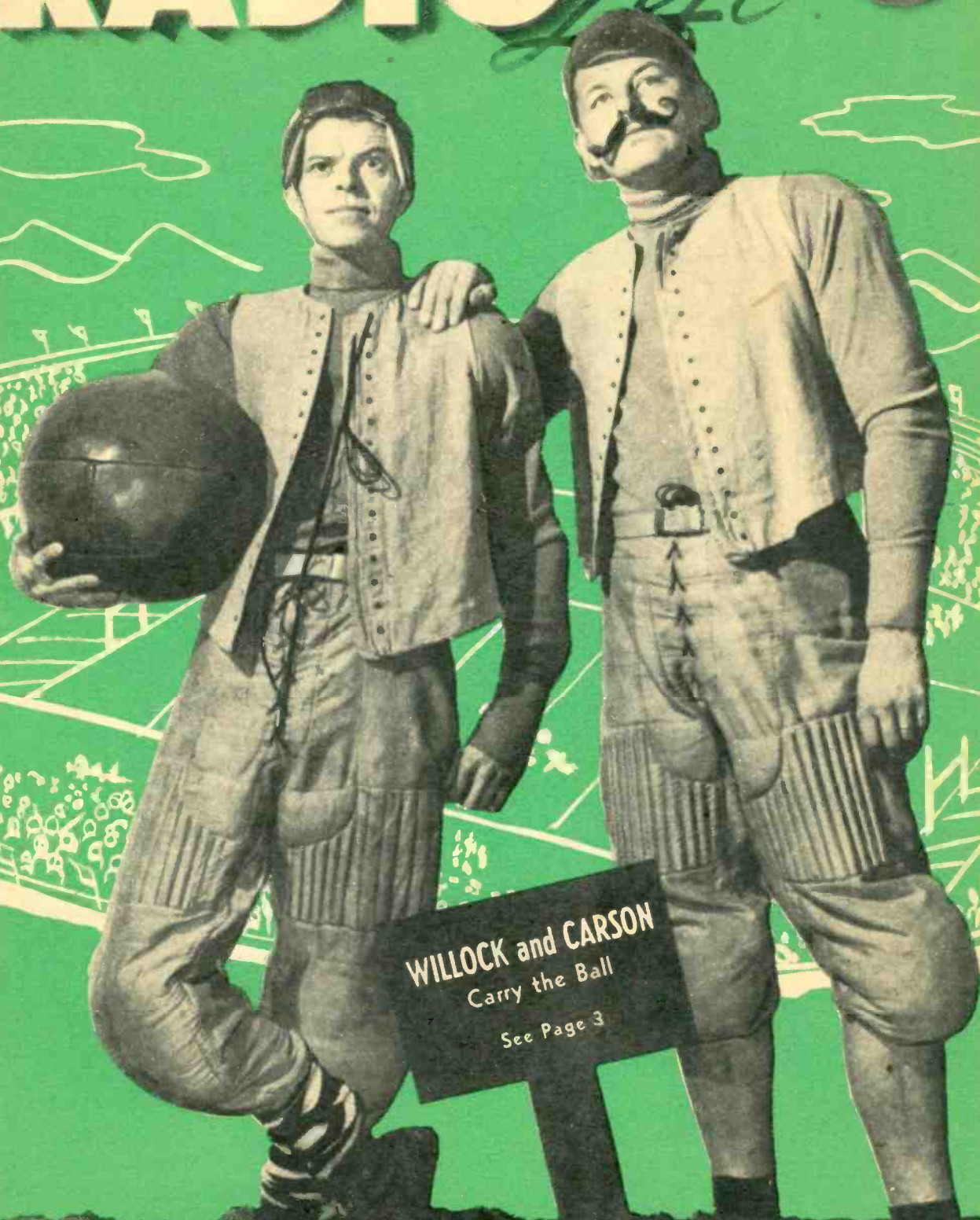

Sirs: Broadcasting stations are supposed to give part of their time for the general public good. Here are two suggestions which would do us all a lot of good, if you would kindly pass them along to the station managements.

1—Stations should either synchronize their clocks or hire some announcers who can tell time. Hardly any two agree on what time it is. Today, for example:

"A transcribed announcement: It is three o'clock by the (name of a widely advertised watch). Tootle-ootle—ootle—toot. (about fifteen seconds of whistling and so-called singing ending with) **THREE O'CLOCK.**" The above has taken about twenty seconds. Then the announcer chimes in with "Three o'clock." In other words, this famous watch, according to its own advertisement, apparently stood still for about half a minute.

Then I switch to another station—about one minute has now passed—just in time to hear an announcer announce: "Three o'clock." Please, Radio Life, ask them to tell us what time it really is!

2—Here is an announcement which could be used on every station several times a day. If it is, I'm sure we listeners will rise up and call the announcer blessed.

"Listen to your radio, folks. How loud is it? Are you playing it for your own enjoyment, or are you trying to make everyone in the neighborhood listen to the program you want to hear? Listen to your own choice of programs and let other people do their own listening. How about tuning your radio down a bit and confining the program to your own room. What do you say?"

DURING THE PAST three years, ABC's tall, darkly handsome war correspondent, Clete Roberts, has spent exactly thirty-five nights at home with his comely wife, Mary, and their seven-year-old daughter, Penny.

The other 1061 nights Clete has been out with the boys.

Yes, out with the boys in the Pacific, where he covered the battle fronts and won a Purple Heart, and more recently, out with the lads in Europe, where he visited every area except Scandinavia.

Clete has come home now, to stay and to relate how he finagled the first interview with Benito Mussolini's widow; how he broke the news of her husband's death to Frau Himmler; interviewed Edda Ciano, Il Duce's daughter, from Italy's Devil Island (Lipari Island); gave the first broadcast from Vienna; interviewed

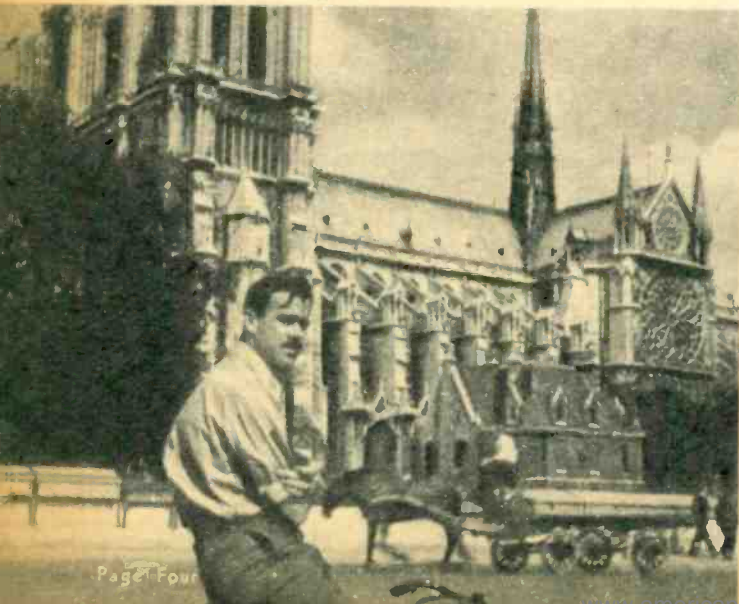
Clete Comes Home

ABC War Correspondent, Away from Hollywood For Three Years, Highlights His Experiences

Dr. Renner, chancellor of the Provisional Austrian government; and eye-witnessed the surrender, on the Isle of Crete, of 12,000 fully-armed Nazis giving up to 400 British, armed only with clubs.

Three Most Interesting

Of these events, naturally the most interesting from the human angle were the interviews with the three women, Mrs. Mussolini, Edda Ciano, and Frau Himmler.

Roberts found Edda a "hard, intelligent woman who spoke excel-

lent English" . . . and who readily admitted her fascistic fanaticism with the cold remark: "I thought it was a good idea."

Contrary to popular conception, Donna Rachele Mussolini, Il Duce's widow, was not at all a bedraggled housewife. Roberts describes her as "smart," with nails well-manicured, gray hair caught up in a silk scarf black open-toed shoes, and navy blue dress topped with a jacket.

Throughout his interview with her, Clete struck in Donna Mussolini a solid defense of her husband, a non-

chalant contempt for his affairs with women, but fierce disdain for Clara Petucci and the manner in which she and her entire family got anything they wanted from Mussolini. "It was good they hanged her!", Mrs. Mussolini spit out in reference to Clara.

Perhaps the interview with Frau Himmler was most dramatic because Clete managed to discover her hiding place at Villa Cine Citta, where she was being watched by British guards. As he entered the villa

"Homespun Sincerity" Is KRKD's Guarantee to its Radio Dialers

IN 1932, Station KRKD (then KMCS) moved from Inglewood to its present studio in the downtown Los Angeles Spring Arcade Building. With the change of locations and call letters (in KRKD, the word "Arcade" is obvious), the newcomer became the friendly station of the west, through the years losing none of the home-spun sincerity which has made it a favorite with radio dialers.

Perhaps its most familiar contribution to the enjoyment of radio dialers has been that of colorful Doug Douglas, chief announcer of KRKD, who is largely responsible for the station's cheery, good-natured policy. Early morning risers have been greeted by Mr. Douglas' dulcet tone for the past twelve years.

Mr. Douglas' genial policy for newscasting, stressing equal importance for every man, is explained by the announcer in words to this effect: If your dad hits your mother with an axe, that is much more important news than if the mayor uses an axe on his wife, even if he is mayor and you are just plain Joe Doakes.

Stresses Music

KRKD's entertainment policy has always been the best in music. Enjoying the bracket of a parttime station (operation between 5:30 a.m. and 7:45 p.m., with the exception of Friday nights) it has constantly endeavored to give the public the best in entertainment and public service. Striving to serve the best of recordings programmed to the best advan-

tage, the station sponsors continuous musical entertainment.

In the line of public service, the station's most outstanding local contribution to Southern Californians has been its broadcasting of election returns. For more than a quarter of a century KRKD has consistently devoted all of its time after the closing of the polls each election evening to the airing of the returns.

Another aim of the station is to keep on "top of the news," not only during the war times but in peace as well. Giving the best of national and international news, KRKD still provides a complete picture of Southern California activities, with as much emphasis on the weather forecast and farm quotations as European happenings.

The Town Criers staff (the station's announcers) consists of Gordon Browning, Wes Youngblood, Lou Place, Charles Clifton, and Doug Douglas. KRKD boasts as alumni Harry von Zell and Truman Bradley.

Pioneers in Western Music

It was KRKD which blazed the trail in Southern California for the latter-day hillbilly and cowboy programs. In earlier years by the Beverly Hill Billies, the Arizona Wranglers and others, this type of music swept again into the high listening brackets with the influx of Southwesterners at the beginning of World War II. Thousands of people demanded this type of entertainment and Foreman Bert Phillips first brought that music and song to them over KRKD.

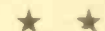
SLEEPING BEAUTY

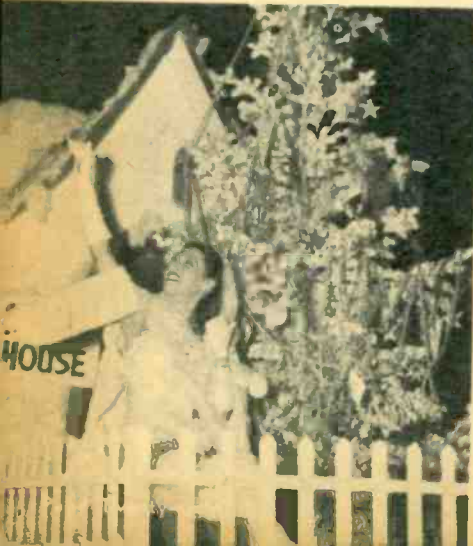

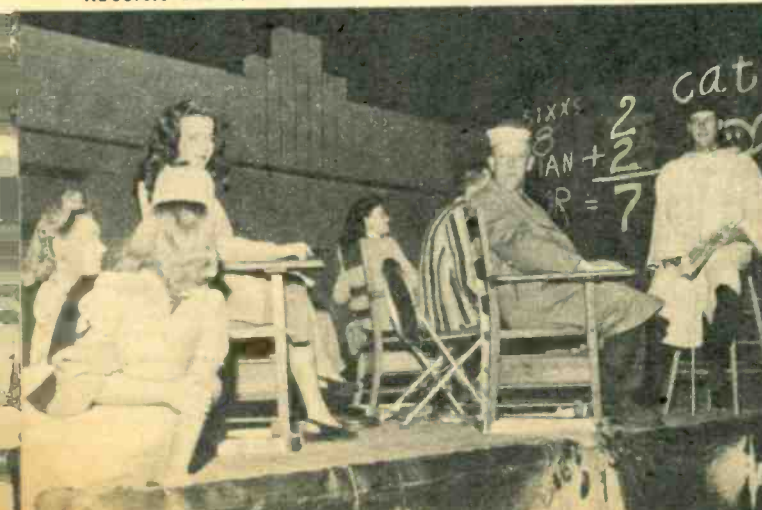

hair, is tractable. Fix her hair a new way and she'll live up to it."

Do's and Don'ts

Here are some of his rules, to apply generally:

1. If you have a wide forehead, wear your hair parted in the middle (it narrows the width).
2. If you're very short, don't wear your hair fairly short. It makes you look dumpty.
3. If you have a cherubic face, don't wear a pompadour. It makes your face look rounder and your body shorter.
4. If you're tall and thin, don't let your hair flare out in the back. Shape it to your head, then let it flare from the nape of your neck.
5. If you have a hook nose, never wear bangs. They create a curve that accentuates the curve of the nose.
6. If you have a heart-shaped face, never wear the hair parted in the middle, because you'll destroy the charm of the heart-shape.

Wallis Warfield, now Duchess of Windsor, was one of Ricardo's first customers several years ago in Baltimore. "She was wearing her hair straight down, with a middle part, wound into a knob in back. Her face was all angles, her high cheek bones stuck out, and her face, though thin, looked like an accordion.
