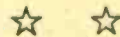

Not Money-Mad

The pretty thespian's prime ambition is to have a part in the theater's

RANDY STUART was born a couple of months ago. That statement, in itself, seems somewhat phenomenal when one looks at Randy, a charming blue-eyed blonde of statuesque proportions.

This was a "blessed event" of unusual circumstance, however, for Randy Stuart was born on CBS' Jack Carson show, with a nation-wide audience tuned in. The occurrence took place with the culmination of Jack's search for the girl with the "hubba-hubba" perfume. Some thirty-eight actresses were tested for the role. Twenty-one-year-old Lorna (sometimes Betty) Shaw emerged the winner, and was promptly christened Randy Stuart.

Appearing regularly on the program each Wednesday, Randy just recently returned from New York where the Carson crew spent several exciting weeks. While in the big city, she made good use of whatever spare time she could manage, doing the things almost every young miss dreams of doing in New York—seeing shows and buying clothes.

Own Designer

But youthful Randy's keen sensitivity to people gives both of these pleasurable pursuits a deeper significance. Speaking of clothes, she confessed, "I'm afraid I'm going to turn into a clothes-horse", and named "any kind of suits" as her favorite garb. She designs her own, making what she terms "very bad drawings", from which Mory's of Hollywood creates suits stylized to her specifications.

Still on the subject of her clothes, pretty Miss Stuart enthused, "I've met such wonderful people! The nicest little tailor. . . and the most wonderful woman who'd whip up a dress for me overnight if I needed it. . . Everybody's so grand. . . This is certainly one business where everybody helps everybody else. . ."

The young actress couldn't praise her comedy cohort, Carson, highly enough. "Some people are just downright good, and there's a guy that is—from the word 'go,'" she beamed, on the subject of Jack.

As for those shows she saw in New York, Randy referred meaningfully to plays like "Deep Are the Roots", emphasizing the thought that the theater wields a tremendous influence on thoughts and actions, and that it should be used to guide them in the right direction.

"A person can't say he's 'sensitive', unless he's honestly nice to all other human beings," Randy went on earnestly. "Down south, I've had Negroes get on their knees before me, and once one offered to become my slave if I'd help him. It makes me so ashamed. To think that some human beings are placed in such a position

contribution to better racial and religious understanding. "I won't deny," she remarked with honesty, "that I like earning a good living, and that I have a desire for nice things just like everybody else. But, believe me, if somebody offered me a thousand dollars to do a simple ingenue role, and somebody else offered me two hundred dollars to write, direct and produce my own show, I'd take the latter and love it."

Randy virtually took the latter (and loved it!) during the war when she whipped up a show of her own and toured the stateside USO circuit, her doctor forbidding her to go overseas. Operating on a minimum of capital, she designed a basic red dress for the chorus girls which, with the addition of a pinafore, a bolero skirt, and some blue buttons, was quickly transformed into an appropriate costume for each of the show's four production numbers.

The show's company included a chorus line of sixteen girls, several specialty acts, and a twenty-five-piece orchestra. "We sometimes had more people on the stage than there were in the audience. We seldom had a curtain, and often some of the chorus girls had to drop out of the line because the stage was too small. As a matter of fact," summed up Randy, smiling, "sometimes, we didn't even have a stage!"

"It took a little doing," she admitted modestly, "but we had a lot of fun. The boys were a wonderful audience, but don't let anyone tell you that they settle for anything. They're appreciative, but critical, too."

Randy Stuart, despite her youth, is a veteran in front of an audience. She made her first professional appearance before she could talk sitting on the stage with her parents, both of them long-time troupers.

Her first opportunity to give a real performance came a few short years later when she was scheduled to sing and recite in a church program. Her mother, a skillful performer on her own, coached her painstakingly, then presented her with loving pride before the congregation.

"But I became so scared and stubborn that I didn't utter a word," remembered Randy. "On the sidelines, Mother was frantic. Finally, I stammered, 'Well, Mother, you didn't teach it to me!'" Nothing could have insulted Randy's trouper mother more!

Chose Show Business


Randy has always loved show business. "I haven't been forced into it," she assured us. "My Mother and Daddy would allow me to do whatever I want. They're broad-minded. Nice people."


The actress' mother and father had their own company, playing everything from tent shows on. Her mother, Gladys Dickey, still appears professionally, as a pianist.

Randy made her initial radio appearance when she was eight—"just Norma Jean's age," she pointed out. (Norma Jean Nilsson, youngest member of the Carson show.) Randy's air debut took place on her mother's airshow on a Kansas station, and she continued performing at the micro-

"It's The Truth!"

Tales Bob Burns Tells on Air Are No More Fantastic Than His Own Life Experiences

HEN BOB BURNS walks out on the stage at NBC each Thursday to meet his studio audience before the broadcast, he tries to make them feel right at home. He tells how he hit Los Angeles with just three dollars in his pocket and he usually winds up by saying, "And I don't think I've done bad, when you consider that I came out here originally to pick grapes."

Now, that isn't strictly the truth. Bob didn't come out to pick grapes—but he didn't come out to be a star on the radio, either. Landing on the air was just another incident in a crazy career that matches most of the tall tales Bob tells each week.

There are few occupations that Bob Burns hasn't tried. He's been a farmer, hobo, cowboy, door-to-door salesman, ad peddler, carnival shill, dance-hall manager, dock-worker, banana roustabout, civil engineer, cafe singer, doorknob polisher, coastal boat waiter, sergeant and rifle instructor in the Marines, surveyor of high-tension lines, streetcar motorman, street-hawker of windshield-polishing fluid—the list could go on indefinitely. Much of the time he was working just for his next meal. And all the time he was picking up and telling stories, the same kind of stories, the same kind of stories he draws every week on his program.

Sometimes it's hard to tell which story is a Burns invention and which actually happened to him. Like the yarn about Bob's first trip to Los Angeles. It's the truth—but it's as funny as anything Bob cooked up for his broadcast. Let's tell it—then balance it and others with some of Bob's own pet stories—and see which give you the bigger laughs:

These are Burns' yarns

"I've discovered that the people who are most considerate of other folks are the ones who've had some hard knocks themselves. One time a wealthy society woman who never had to work a day in her life came into a store where I was workin' and wanted a piece of linoleum. I showed her every roll we had and when they didn't suit her, I took her to the wholesale house. After she'd looked at every roll they had and didn't find what she wanted, I showed her a catalog.

"Finally" she picked a design she liked and I sent for it. When the roll came from the factory, I called her and she came down and said that was exactly what she wanted. I says, 'Well, lady, how much do you want?' and she says, 'Oh, just a little piece for the bottom of my birdcage'."

These are the truth

Bob was broke in the east when he met a Fox casting director who wanted a blackface team. Bob teamed with John Swor, signed for \$300 a week and headed for Hollywood. He practiced his Negro dialect until he was talking it in his sleep. For three months the studio didn't call him, then one morning he was asked to rush to Western Costumers, get fitted and come direct to the stage. They put him in a Canadian Northwest Mounted Police uniform, gave him a line to say and began shooting. At his cue, Bob came slew-footing onto the set and drawled in the only dialect he was able to talk by that time: "Sahgent, these heah men bin tawkin' 'bout y'all!"

When the director revived, he said, "That may be good blackface, but as a Canadian Mounted Policeman it stinks!"

Bob was fired.



"I don't think there's a better way of studying human nature than bein' a newspaper boy. When I was sellin'

Bob's biggest ambition when he was a kid was to be a traveling salesman. When he got old enough he

papers down in Van Buren, there was an old skinflint who lived back in the mountains and every time he came to Van Buren I tried to sell him a paper, but I couldn't do it.

"But one day I happened to find a pocketbook and it belonged to that old skinflint and it had a hundred and forty dollars in it. I knew he'd be worried sick, so I left my corner where I was sellin' papers and started over the mountains. All night long I trudged, still carryin' my bundle of papers. I didn't get to this old man's house till the middle of the next day and I gave the purse to him. He counted the money to see if it was all there and then he says, 'I sure appreciate you bringin' this pocketbook back to me when I can see you didn't even wait to sell all your papers . . . If it wasn't yesterday's paper, durned if I wouldn't buy one'."



"I hope the people in the audience won't talk out loud during the broadcast. It ain't that the noise bothers us, but the things we hear don't do us no good. The other night, right in the middle of my monolog, an old man in the front row leaned over to his wife and said real loud, 'And to think our boy can't get work!'"



"If there was one thing my kin-folks believed in, it was fair play. My aunt used to tell of the time my uncle had a fight with a big bear. She said that they just rolled all over the mountainside, clawin' at each other and tryin' to get at each other's throats and she said it was the prettiest fight she ever saw. 'Honestly,' she says, 'it's the first fight I ever saw where I didn't give a durn who won'."



"My family was always a great huntin' family. I'll never forget the time us boys went blackberry pickin' and Grampa went along. All of a sudden the dogs let out a yell and streaked for home, and I looked up and here come a big man-eatin' bear. I hollered to Grampa to look out, but I didn't have no time to fool with him. I went home as hard as I could tear, and I told Mama, with tears streamin' down my face, 'A big bear got Grampa!'"

"Mama says, 'He did not—your Grampa came in ahead of the dogs'."

answered an ad in the back of a magazine ("You too can make \$50 a week!") and in due time got a kit of silver polish and instructions on how to remove his hat, bow from the waist and start his sales talk: "Madam, I represent . . ."

Bob spent his last cent on a fancy new suit, shoes, straw hat and a flower for his buttonhole. He carried his kit jauntily and practiced his speech as he went along.

He reached the section of town assigned him and knocked at the first front door. It was opened by a tired-looking woman holding a bawling infant.

Bob began, "Madam, I—" but the baby drowned him out and the woman soothed, "Hush, hush." Bob began again, the kid yelled louder and the woman said, "Hush now!" The third time Bob just got his mouth open, the baby howled and the woman, as a clincher, said, "Hush, or the old bum will get you—won't you, old bum?"

Bob holds a life membership in the Hoboes' Association, having fulfilled Rule No. 1, which says a member must hobo in every state in the Union and cover 100,000 miles. When Bob finally clicked on the Bing Crosby program he got a wire from the King of the Hoboes which read: "Congratulations. Your success should be an inspiration to every other bum in the country!"

Bob used to make auditions all over town trying to break into radio. KNX, among others, held a card on him. When he made a big hit on the Kraft show, a KNX secretary sent him the card for a souvenir. It said, "Rural hillbilly type. Plays guitar, tells stories." There was a footnote at the bottom: "Might have possibilities." Bob returned it to her with a note, "Better put it back in the file. You know how uncertain radio is."

Bob was a Marine Sergeant in the First World War and carried his bazooka right with him, but his greatest fame in those days came through his marksmanship. He won the AEF rifle-shooting championship in an open meet against 14,000 men and General Pershing himself pinned on the medal.

"I thought you played the bazooka," observed the General. "How did you get to be such a good shot?"

"Well, General," drawled Bob. "You've heard the bazooka. Does that answer your question?"

"Design For Death"

Radio Combats Accident Death Toll with Gripping Airshow that Pulls No Punches

Thursday, 7:45 p.m.

REMEMBER ME? Mike Malloy, the ambulance interne. The guy that rides behind the siren to pick up what's left of the people who get involved in traffic accidents?"

With a grim reminder like the

above, KECA dialers are challenged to come along on a fifteen-minute ambulance ride, each Thursday evening at 7:45. The listener soon finds that fifteen minutes is about all he can stomach, but he digests the full quarter-hour of Malloy's realistic narration with horrified fascination.

Actor Bob Bruce portrays Mike Malloy (plus all the other characters on the show), and the words "that

don't pull punches" are scripted by Bill Holmes.

Cold Contrasts

Listeners are conducted through a spine-chilling true-to-life episode that begins on a bright sunny afternoon or a pretty starry-skied night and ends inside the cold white walls of a hospital ward, or as often, within the colder, grayer walls of the city morgue.

Winner of a 1946 "Billboard" Magazine award for public service, "Design for Death" cites as its purpose "the prevention of accidents by education of the listeners along lines of traffic safety".

Before each weekly broadcast, scripter Holmes confers with police officials of the Traffic Safety Unit, Sergeant Frank Crewe, Officer Murphy and Officer Gilmore, and decides what type of accident or traffic violation should be featured on the forthcoming airing. Frequently, Holmes and sometimes Bruce join the police in answering accident calls, checking causes and violations

(the latter including jay-walking, drunk driving, hit-and-run, "hot-rod" racing, speeding, etc.).

Holmes and Bruce also pay grim visits to the Georgia Street Receiving Hospital, interviewing accident victims—and to the City Morgue where the victims cannot be interviewed but offer silent eloquent argument against careless driving.

Holmes then creates an effective story woven around the real-life accident or traffic violation, neither highlighting its more gruesome aspects nor soft-pedaling them. The radio scribe, ex-newspaper columnist, gag-writer, song-lyricist and "Passing Parade" writer, points out that this is probably the only type of program on which it is not necessary to exaggerate for dramatic emphasis.

Program Is Emotional

In writing the story, Holmes fictionalizes the characters, giving them human qualities and faults and making them as real as possible; so that their ultimate fate will give the listener an emotional reaction. Their actual identity, however, is not revealed, nor the factual time and location of the real accident.

At the conclusion of the program, Sergeant Crewe gives a short analysis of the causes of the accident and suggestions for avoiding similar incidents in the future. The program opens and closes with the realistic screech of hastily-applied brakes, a man's scream of terror, a horrifying crash, the eerie tinkle of flying glass, and the ominous moan of the siren on the approaching ambulance.

Narrator Bruce somberly related how he has watched the traffic death toll rise in the months since the program's start in October of 1945. This is due largely to increased number of cars on the road. "It averages forty-five deaths a month," he informed us. "The number jumps up by about eleven to sixteen between the weekly broadcasts."

Bruce, graduate of the University of Minnesota and veteran of fourteen years of network radio, says he looks forward to doing this show more than any other. He plays the character of Mike Malloy "straight", using his own voice, and his other co-workers frequently remark that they don't recognize him on the program. Many think at first that it is the voice of an actual ambulance driver.

Of his trip to the morgue, Bruce stated sternly, "It's too crowded down there." (The population varies from eighty to a hundred, depending on the time of year.)

Bruce adds that his association with the "Design for Death" program has affected his driving. "I'm more careful, and also, when I see somebody else making a fool of himself on the road," he added soberly, "I think to myself 'There's material for me. Mike Malloy'll pick him up!'"

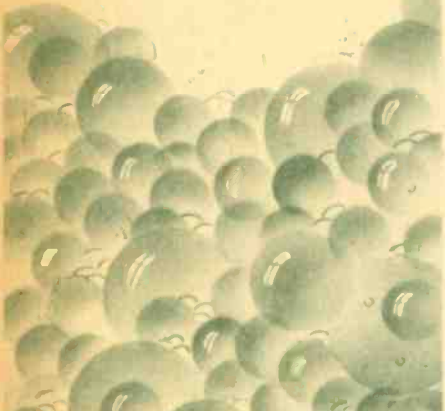

It all came about because the NBC Burns and Allen maestro's song, adopted by the Iowa Centennial Committee as its official ballad during its celebration of 100 years of statehood, carried the words, "Iowa, it's a beautiful name when you say it like we say it back home." An English professor at Drake University wrote a protesting letter to the newspapers, contending the wording should have been "as we say it." He said it

makes Iowans sound like "hicks". Another professor asserted the words were fine when used in general conversation and the song typified that kind of home-folks.

Meredith Willson, in answer to the controversy, admitted that, strictly speaking, the grammar was off-base, but contended that the euphony was better the way he had it, and a songwriter had to think first of how a song would sing.

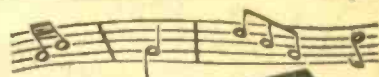

ing of humor and t-r-o-u-b-l-e. Conducting him in and out of many a merry misfortunate situation are Lurene Tuttle as his girl friend, "Candy", and Arthur Q. Bryan as his pal, "Duke".

On the air a fumblingly adolescent-like youth, Coogan off the air is a successful business man, owner of Coogan Company, which buys military planes from the government and sells them for civilian flying. He works from five airports in the Los Angeles vicinity, delivers the planes to their buyers personally.

Sold Eleven Planes

"It's a good business," he reported. "We made eleven sales last month, and have just five planes on hand

right now. We sell largely to veterans who want the ships for use in their businesses. They're big, five-passenger jobs."

Coogan's own prowess at the controls of a skyship was ably demonstrated during the war when he served in India as a member of the First Air Commando Force. He served with Colonel Philip Cochran, the man from whom Milton Caniff patterned the "Flip Corkin" character in his "Terry and the Pirates" cartoon strip.

Coogan was the first flyer to land a glider behind the Jap lines. He is also a charter member of the American Veterans of Aerial Combat, an organization of flyers who have actively engaged in sky fighting with the enemy.

Since his discharge from service in October, 1945, the actor has been appearing in vaudeville. Angelenos have seen him doing a comedy take-off on "The Kid" at Slapsy Maxie's. He may make a return engagement there in the near future.

Currently appearing at the popular Los Angeles nighterie (at this writing) is Coogan's fiancée, Ann McCormack, blonde Boston-born blues singer, whom he plans to wed this month.

"Forever Ernest" marked Jackie's debut on a regular air series, but he had done a number of guest appearances previously and declared that the microphone doesn't make him nervous. It was one of his guest appearances, in fact, which resulted in his current ether program. Producer John Guedel learned of Coogan's stint on "America's Town Meeting of the Air", secured a record of the show, listened to it and liked what he heard.

Brother Radio-Minded

Also interested in radio is Jackie's younger brother, twenty-one-year-old Robert, also a former child star (remember him as "Sooky" of the "Skippy" pictures?) He's now a husky six-footer, and has just received his discharge from the Army. He was on hand for the opening airer of his brother's radio series.

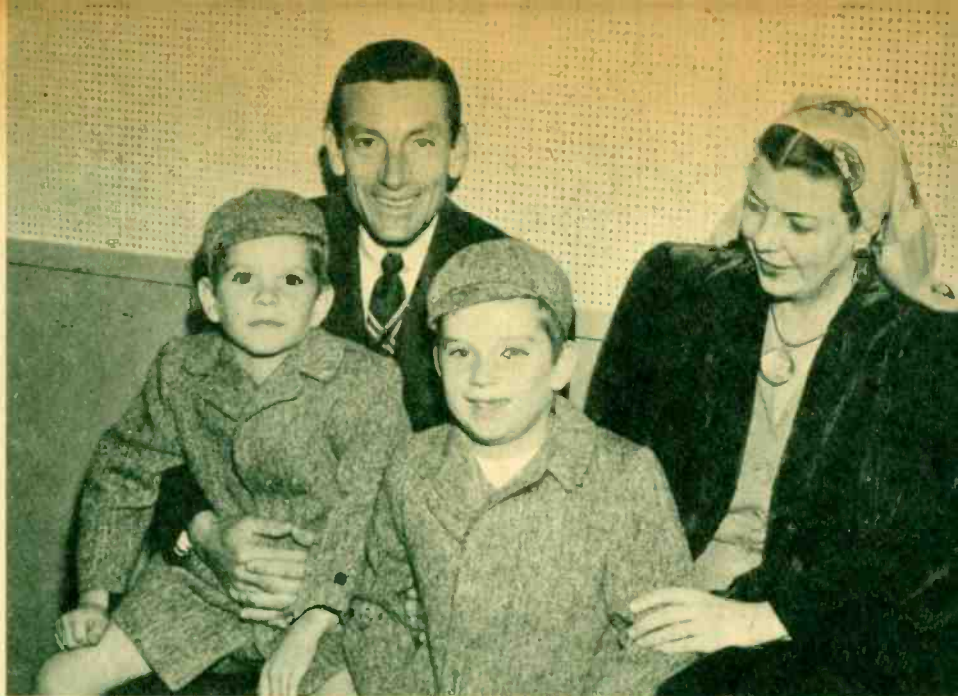

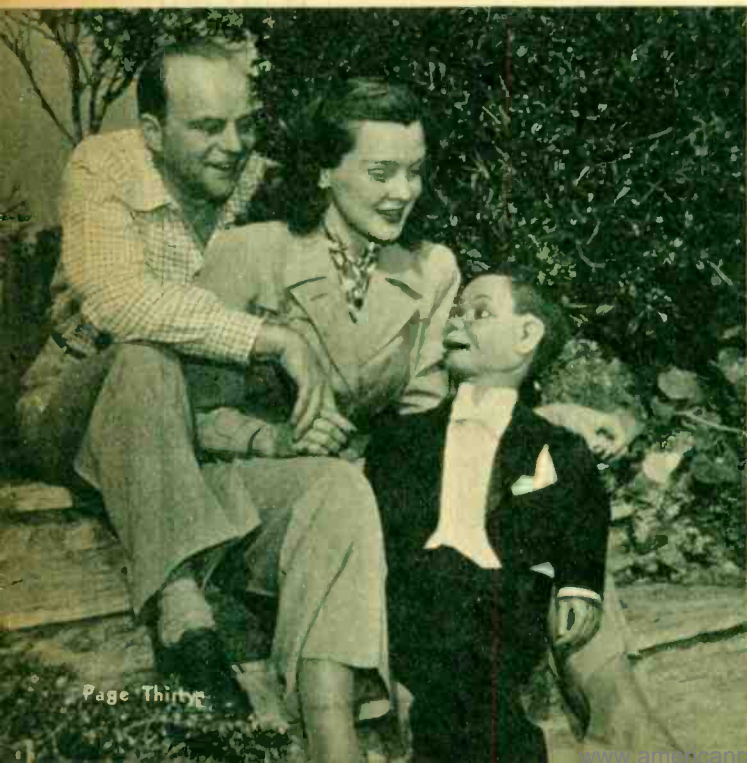

Actor's New Air Role Makes Him Pompous Tyrant, Almost Opposite Of Outdoor-Loving Award Winner

JONATHAN TRIMBLE, Esquire, KHJ-Mutual Don Lee's newest radio characterization, is a man with a mind of his own. A pompous gentleman—a tyrant in his own household—a man who attempts unsuccessfully to halt the wheels of progress—Jonathan Trimble is nevertheless underneath a kindly, likeable soul.

Not to be confused with the original is Mr. Donald Crisp, veteran Academy Award actor who is, except for his basic kindness, the exact opposite of the 1905 newspaper publisher he portrays on the broadcast. Mr. Crisp is strictly an outdoor man, and "when you like to hunt and fish, you haven't got time to be a tyrant... even a lovable tyrant like Trimble."

Mr. Crisp likes to fish so much that he goes every chance he gets. He has two outboard motors which

he takes with him on his trips, and when anything goes wrong with the motors, he repairs them himself.

"I'll spend five weeks fixing a motor that I could have had done for five dollars, just to see if I can get it back together and make it run right."

Gives Game Away

But even more than fishing, Mr. Crisp's forte is the hunt. Each year for the past fourteen years, he has gone to the rice fields near Sacramento and shot ducks and geese. His bag goes to the Children's Hospital here in Los Angeles, and Mr. Crisp is such a deadeye dick that he has always managed to send the children all the game they can eat.

"People don't believe it when you tell them about it, but I've seen two million geese in the air at one time", he says. "Along about twilight they'll come in in what looks exactly like one long heavy bank of fog. Once in Imperial Valley when I was on the board of directors of the Bank of America there, a flight of ducks like that cleaned out eighty acres of lettuce in a single night.

"It wiped out the farmer. The bank had to take over his house, land, and everything. The next season they planted the acreage to onions, and posted a guard of men armed with blank cartridges to patrol the fields and keep the game off. Now they use revolving spotlights.

"It's one thing to want to preserve the wildlife of America, but it's another when you realize how much damage too many birds can cause—even to taking away a man's home and all his savings. That's especially true in Imperial Valley, which is the only place in America where the hunting season is extended for six weeks... simply to keep the proportions even."

Is Dog-Lover

Like all outdoor men, Mr. Crisp loves dogs. He's even appeared in

two movies with them . . . "Lassie Come Home" and "Son of Lassie". Right now, he's considering a third, "Bob, Son of Battle".

The dog in the story is a sheep dog, and Mr. Crisp has an intense admiration for the training and intelligence of sheep dogs. Many is the time he has watched the sheep dog trials at Hyde Park, London, which have already been photographed for inclusion in "Bob, Son of Battle".

"They take twenty-five sheep," Mr. Crisp explains, "and put ribbons on twelve of them, herd them together a mile away from the judge's stand. On either side of the sheep are two pens. The dog on trial has to run down to the sheep, cut the ones with ribbons away from the others, put these twelve in one of the pens, run back, herd ten of the remaining sheep into the other pen, bring the three remaining sheep to the judge's stand, and then go over and lie down."

"Thousands of people line up to watch the trials, and it's the only audience I ever saw where everybody is mum. While the dogs are

working, people won't even talk to each other in whispers. You see, the owner of the dog is standing near the judge's stand, and all he has to direct the dog is a low voice and arm signals. If there's noise, the dog can't hear.

"It's amazing how they do hear. The owner chatters along in an ordinary speaking voice and the dog seems to pick up every word, even though he's a mile away. And the dog, of course, can't bark or bite the sheep. If he does either, he's disqualified. When he obeys a command correctly, the owner will say 'good dog, good dog', before going on to the next, and the dogs always acknowledge by one single tailwag."

One Dog For Him

But much as he admires sheep dogs, and fond though he became of Lassie while working with him on the set, there's only one dog that's tops for Mr. Crisp . . . and no wonder. For that dog, owned by his wife, was the inimitable Strongheart, now buried in the garden behind Mr. Crisp's Hollywood home.

Mrs. Crisp bought the dog in Belgium for \$5,000, not including all the cost of shipping him home. When Mr. Crisp heard about it, he thought his wife had gone out of her mind. Five thousand dollars was a lot of money for a dog—even for a dog who had won every trial of German police dogs in Belgium.

It didn't take long for Mr. Crisp to see the value of Strongheart, but it took Strongheart quite a while to see the value of Mr. Crisp. It was a year before the dog accepted him.

"You mean, it was that long before he decided you were his master?"

"No . . . I mean it was a year before he decided I was worth being master over. It didn't make any difference what you were doing; if Strongheart wanted a walk, you went. He would come over to the

chair where you were reading, take your hand in his big muzzle, and without hurting you, still definitely pull you toward the door. He ordered me around for seven years.

"He was wonderful with children. He would stand utterly motionless while they threw their arms around him and pawed over him, but if an adult reached out a hand to pet him, Strongheart, without ever seeming to draw back, would always manage to be just out of reach.

"For a while, there wasn't a police dog on Hollywood Boulevard that didn't claim to be a son of Strongheart. In dogdom, it was what coming over on the Mayflower is to Americans. Two of Strongheart's best-known genuine sons were Rint-Tin-Tin and Peter the Great. We kept some of the other pups around, but none of them were Strongheart. He died in my lap—and after having known him, no other dog has ever seemed the same."
