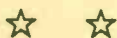

**HAT'S IN A NAME?**

"Dough" — in four figures weekly, if the name chances to be the magical combination, "Academy Award."

The four-figured sum, \$1600, is

forked over weekly by House of Squibb to the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences (Jean "Dr. Christian" Hersholt, president). It buys the title, "Academy Award," which cannot be altered, for a radio series based on presentation of Oscar-winning or Oscar-nominated personalities or vehicles. To obtain this hook-up, House of Squibb was

# "Academy Award"

amenable to signing the longest such contract on record (fifteen years).

There's undeniable luster to either a play or person singled out for Academy Award nomination and the appeal of the name to radio listeners was smart business for Squibb. Opening broadcast, for example, presented Bette Davis in "Jezebel." Subsequent line-up included, among others, "Snow White," Ronald Colman in "If I Were King," Edward G. Robinson in "Little Caesar," Rosalind Russell and Janet Blair in "My Sister Aileen," Randolph Scott and Claire Trevor in "Stagecoach." In all, as the series started, there were 126 properties for possible airing (the Academy has been awarding Oscars for 19 years). Vehicle used for the air series may have been nominated for honor in any of the categories customary (musical score, best screen play, etc.) or the star may be one either winning or considered for the Award.

To produce this impressive ether cycle, Dee Englebach was named. Seemingly an Orson Welles type, talented and not unaware of it, he has been in Hollywood only a year, piloted "The Doctor Fights" last summer and currently "produces-directs" (Englebach prefers this compound verbiage) Dick Powell's "Rogue's Gallery."

Questioned as to background before coming West, Englebach expressed his feeling that what he'd done wasn't as important as what he was able to do now. "Your readers aren't interested in me or my past," he said.

But when we insisted that Radio Lifers always were interested in elements comprising a person or pro-

gram, Dee admitted the following, in casual order, which we've attempted to arrange chronologically:

He has been interested in music ever since childhood and sang in an Episcopal boys' choir . . . he grew up in Cleveland . . . was graduated from college in Ohio . . . studied law, but won scholarships in music and dramatics . . . went to New York, attended Juillard School of Music and the American Academy of Dramatic Arts . . . took a job as page boy at NBC in New York to help pay expenses while still studying . . . one day, through the delightfully fatal circumstances by which so many ambitious get their break, stepped in to produce a big-time operatic program, which led to five years producing radio programs in New York

. . . "Hall of Fame" took off under his direction.

Thus, the listener understands a choice like Englebach for a series like "Academy Award." He has dramatic, musical, and directive understanding and experience.

#### How Show Organized

From the list of possible presentations for Squibb's series, Englebach, Tom McAvity (representative of Famous Artists), Don Shaw (vice-president in charge of radio for the agency, Geyer, Cornell & Newell), and Frank Wilson, the writer, select an up-coming show and its main performer. Englebach and Wilson (who will adapt the picture for radio) then view the film, accompanied by Englebach's script assistant,

Dorothy Brown, who takes copious notes during the screening. Next, Wilson writes a script, submits it to Englebach, and the two go over it together. Leith Stevens, musical director, then consults with the producer-director about the score. Initial casting starts (about a week ahead of show day). Auditions are held for less important roles (Englebach favors using new blood, provided it can deliver). First script reading takes place Friday afternoon, the day before the broadcast, and as early as 7 o'clock Saturday morning, Englebach starts rehearsal of sound effects. Dress rehearsal at 12:30 p.m. involves cutting of a record which the entire cast hears and which enables each "Academy Award" per-

Sports fans attention! The biggest sporting event since the war years will be yours for dialing ABC-KECA, Wednesday night, June 19th, at 6. On that date the Gillette Safety Razor Company will bring you the Joe Louis-Billy Conn heavyweight boxing championship fight from the Yankee Stadium in New York.

The blow-by-blow description of the event, handled by ABC fightcasters Don Dunphy and Bill Corum, will be released over more than 250 stations in the United States and Canada, and by short-wave throughout the world.

Leading up to the important event, Harry Wismer, ABC sports director, has presented dramatizations of highlights in the lives of both fighters, round-table discussions with leading sports personalities, training camp interviews, etc. Harry Wismer is heard regularly every Monday thru Friday evening at 6:55 over KECA, in a summary of the sports news of the day.

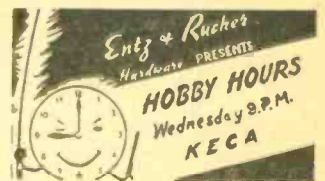

Recently Sammy took his "So You Want to Lead a Band" program on tour. One of the towns they hit was Hutchinson, Kansas, which showed its appreciation of the first name band that had ever played there, by declaring a holiday, "Sammy Kaye Day." Sammy was worried about the five thousand school kids on the streets for the day, so he rounded them up and gave a lengthy concert—free.

Sammy gives no credence to the idea that jazz has anything to do with juvenile delinquency. In the band business since he was a high school student, he believes that an interest in music is a healthy sign. He's even gone so far as to have juke boxes installed in church recreation rooms so young people may listen to the music they want.

### Poetry Encouraged

In connection with his program, "Sunday Serenade," he is further demonstrating his interest in the younger generation by launching a poetry contest for high school and college students. For the two best poems submitted, he is awarding a year's scholarship to any college in the country to the high school and college student who qualifies.

The "So You Want to Lead a Band" contest will culminate this week at the Hollywood Palladium. Finalists from the south, east, mid-west and west coast will compete for the \$1000 cash prize (among other things) and the honor of the country's number one amateur stick-waver.

Sammy's newest venture is picture production—he's planning a screenplay built around the "So You Want to Lead a Band" program, and will produce it himself.

Current Kaye best-selling records are "The Gypsy," with vocal by Mary Marlow, ex-NBC page girl, and "I'm a Big Girl Now," sung by Betty Barclay who only three years ago left an orphan asylum. You can see that maestro Sammy Kaye encourages young talent not only in his contest ants but also in his own band.

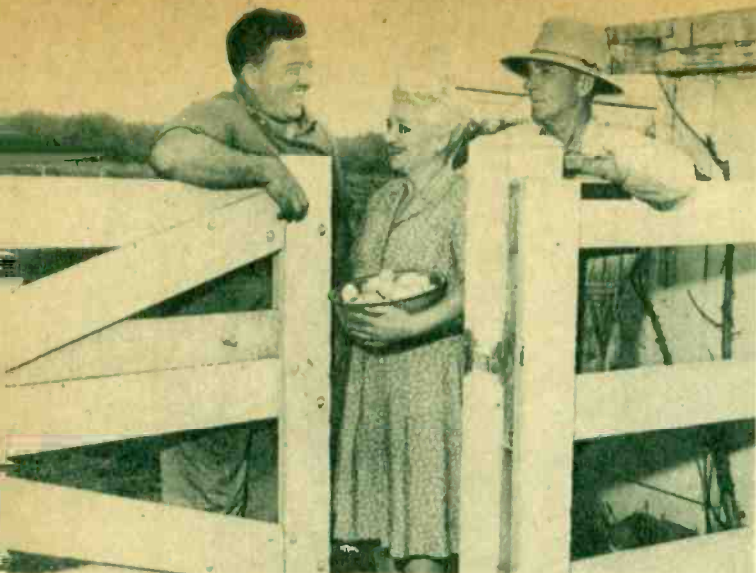

**G** here've been some changes made around KWKW. Just a few minutes with Manager W. J. "Bill" Beaton discloses multifarious activity around the studios housed in Pasadena Athletic Club.

"Our trend," stated Beaton, "is heavier and heavier toward sports. Our new program and sports director is Ken Barton, recently returned from

service. He was one of the most decorated men in the Los Angeles area—one of the original paratroopers to go into the service, participated in six invasions, five of them airborne, received the Purple Heart (four times) the Presidential Unit Citation (four times) the Bronze Star (two times) and was decorated by the French, Belgian, and Dutch governments."

#### Four Men Added

Selection of Barton, who, with

John Wald, was the original two-man "Richfield Reporter" and who formerly worked for KMPC, is typical of the new blood coming into KWKW. To the staff during the past six months have been added four men, bringing the total station personnel to 16.

"We are trying," commented Beaton, "to build an organization with stronger radio background. We're a young station (we'll be four next September) on the outskirts of Los Angeles and until now it has been hard for us to get experienced help."

the microphone, are Wes Mears, announcer, formerly with KFI, who was a lieutenant (j.g.) and who is now assigned some news chores in addition to straight announcing; John Van Guilder, formerly with KMPC, KFWB, KFI, and KNX, where he was known as John Forsyth (he has assumed his middle name as his surname to avoid confusion with the movie actor); Jack Volheye, formerly with KXL, Portland; and Rowland Gibbs, announcer and musical librarian.

Stressing the sports picture, KWKW recently signed with UP for its new twenty-four-hour wire service covering all sports. This feature, until recently not released west of St. Louis, supplements KWKW's local sports coverage. KWKW, so far, is the only station in Southern California to contract for this feature.

On the air now from 6 a.m. until sundown, the station is devoting at least a third of its broadcasting day to sports. Fully twenty-five per cent more of its programs are "live" than were a year ago. Most of the new "live" shows relate to sports. "Today at the Races," heard Monday-Saturday at 4:45 p.m. presents resumes from all tracks; "Ken Barton at Bat" (Monday-Saturday, 6:30 p.m.) emphasizes baseball; and the Western Harness Racing Meet at Santa Anita,

former an opportunity for candid appraisal.

Englebach has apparently established himself as an esteemed director. It would not be simple to chart inflections or directions for some luminary who has an Oscar standing on her mantel-piece and who, perhaps, won her statuette for portraying on the screen the very role to be interpreted on the air. But Englebach, in addition to his generous and versatile experience, has virtually memorized both movie and radio versions of the show, combines all these assets with imagination and know-how which are respected by the entire crew from star down.

### Excellent Aides

Of course he realizes, too, that in Berne Surrey (winner of a Radio Life Award) he has an expert sound man and that in Joe Schweiger he has an engineer of comparable value.

Like most producers, Dee is nervous at show time, but his edginess is on the humorous side. He claims never to give slow-down or speed-up cues once the program is on the air, believing that once a characterization is set it will be upset by artificial regulation. Instead, if the show is running long, he makes cuts far enough ahead to enable actors to readjust to future lines.

"We're ten seconds behind," he reminded Englebach.

### Capsule Information

Another KWKW sports feature is a 10 a.m. half hour detailing information on all sports for that day, with emphasis on racing and baseball.

Although the station is stressing sports, it has not overlooked other interests in programming its time.

Bea Boynton, formerly of NBC, conducts a daily woman's broadcast (11:45 a.m.); Ora Belle Theurich, Pasadena high school instructor and State Chairman of Radio for the California Home Economists' Association, presides over "Kettles and Calico" (Saturday, 9:15 a.m.); every morning from six to eight, Spanish language programs are conducted by Rodolfo Hoyos and Ernest Gonzales; Italian and Jewish programs are highlights of Sunday's broadcasting; there is a daily (12:30 p.m.) Farm Hour for growers and farmers in Los Angeles County (the richest agricultural county in the United States); and news on the hour every half-hour.

KWKW is also attempting to give recognition to young talent in the metropolitan area. Currently, Craig Wilkins, lyric soprano, is heard Saturday, 5:30 p.m. "We'll give any other worthy young talent an opportunity to show their wares," Beaton said.

The station, now operating on 1430 kilocycles with 1,000 watts, has made application for a change to 830 kilocycles and 5,000 watts. Indicating even bigger and better things for "KW."

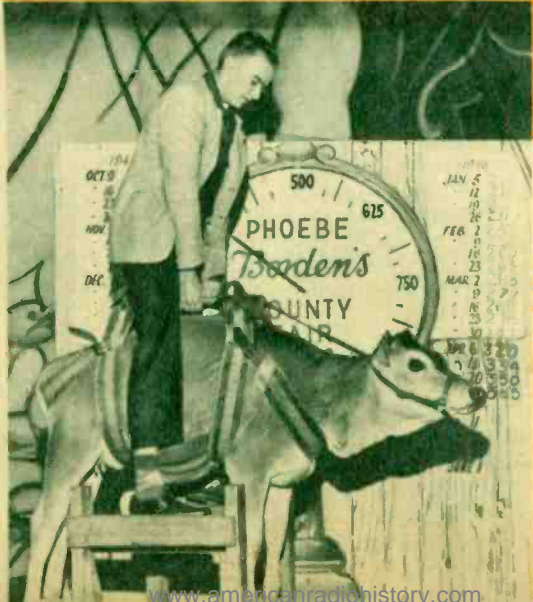
