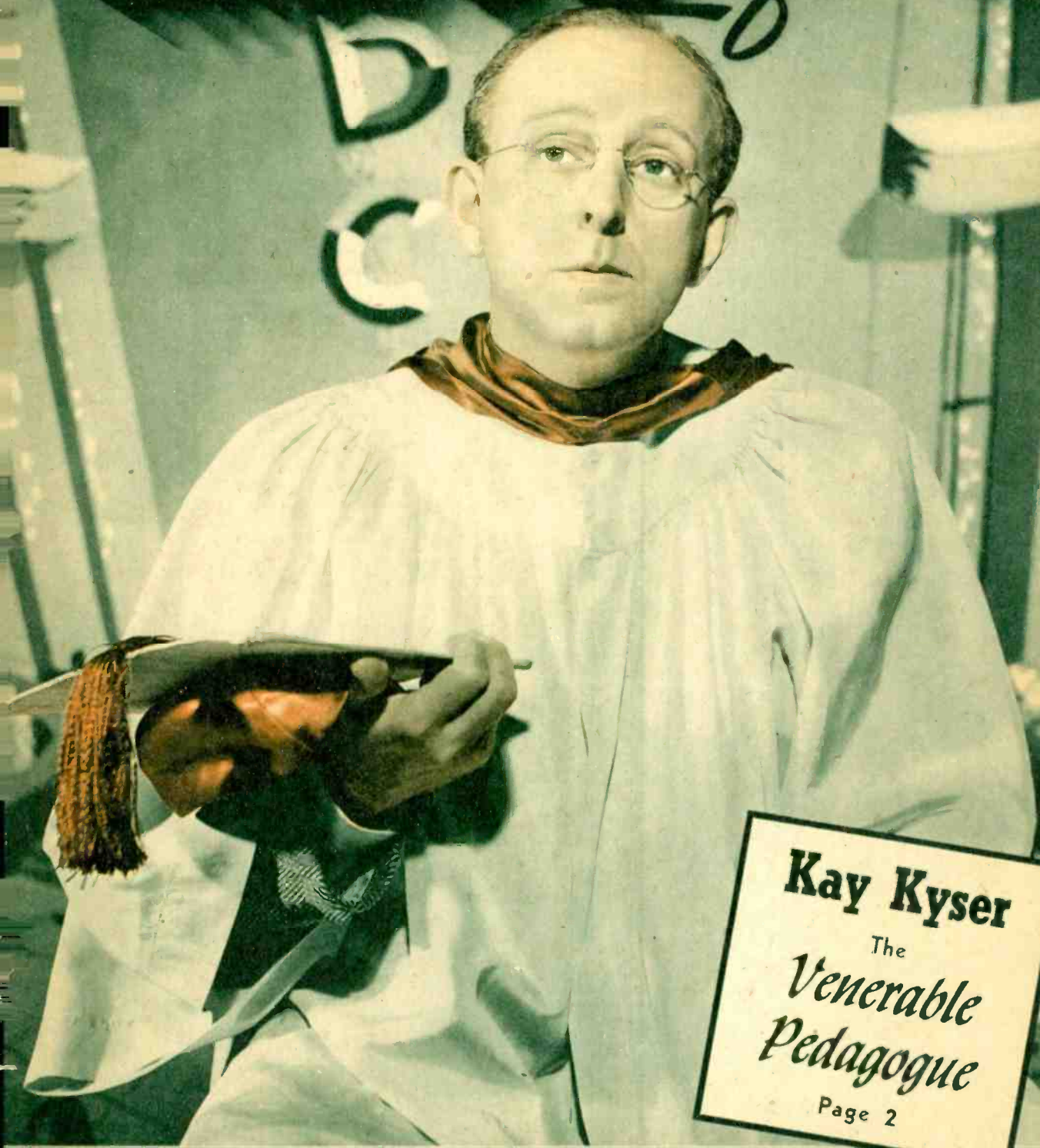

She loved the stage and everything connected with it, and when at an early age (according to her), I began to demonstrate a leaning toward the make-believe, she encouraged me at every turn. When I was just able to walk, she tells me I brought gales of laughter from the family by imitating my paternal grandmother walking with a cane. The nurse we had "saw a future" for me, and went so far as to carry through faithfully a certain superstition she believed. 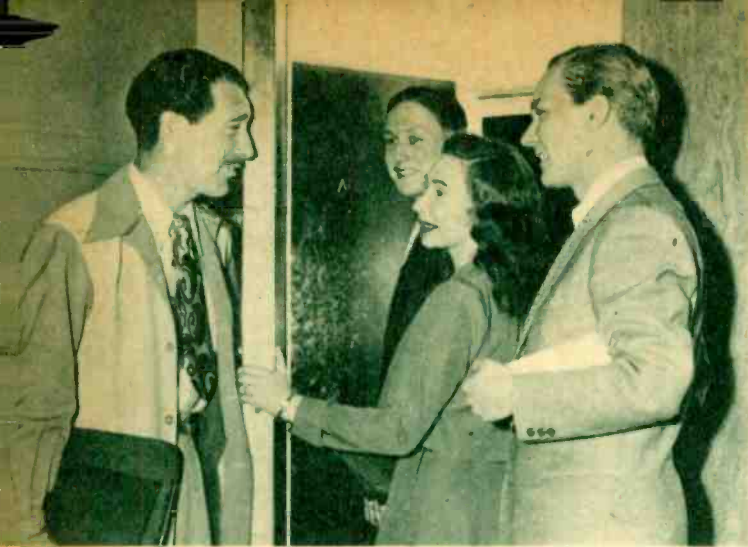

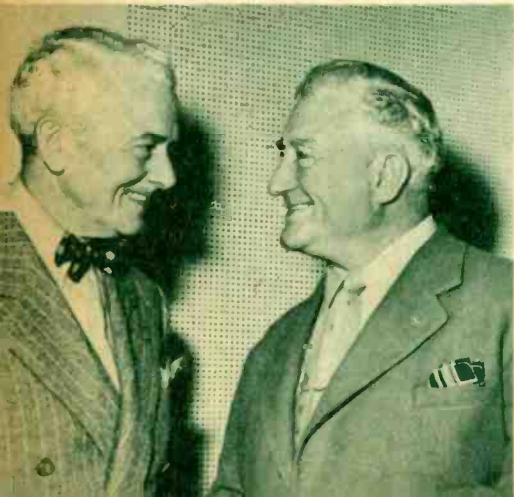

of a "soap opera" to learn what makes it spin millions of radio dials daily. The first factor to command our attention was the smoothness of production.

The actors work diligently under the capable guiding hand of Les Mitchel, who is one of the ether's foremost directors.

"Like a Mop"

Although the actual words in the script are not from the pen of Miss Phillips, it is she who plots the story line. "Irna," explained an associate,

"is like a mop. She absorbs bits from the lives of everyone she meets. You're liable to find *your* experiences in one of her shows."

But "bits" are far from the interests upon which Miss Phillips thrives. She feels that "soap operas" are of a far more important nature than they are accredited, and lists for us three major points which guide her in composing dramas. She never forgets that daytime serials should be dedicated to presenting constructive theories and

because she considers them the most creative form of writing to reflect American life, she projects sound social thinking into her scripts.

Whole sequences of incidents have been built around trends of current interest which Miss Phillips feels should be of value to her listeners. In addition to adding a sociologist to her writing staff, she makes frequent visits to national associations for first-hand information about various subjects.

It should be interesting to note the growth and development of "Masquerade," which is the newest of Miss Phillips' quartet, as it starts its second year in California. At present the writer and producer Carl Wester are working on their first night-time show to make a quintet of the lucky foursome.

▲ **WHO DOESN'T REMEMBER** Si Wills of the rubber face, the black curl in the middle of his forehead and the upturned hat in vaudeville? He's still the modest, likeable fellow he was then.

▼ **DAUGHTER BEVERLY, NOW THIRTEEN, MADE HER** stage debut at the age of ten weeks when Barbara Stanwyck carried her on-stage during a show. By the time she was three, Beverly could imitate her comedienne mother perfectly.



AND she straightened me out in three weeks," laughed Si Wills, pointing to a picture of his comedienne wife, Joan Davis, lying flat after one of her famous falls. "That's all the time it took."

Si was seated on the living room floor of his lovely Bel-Air home and before him was a giant scrap book filled with clippings of his and Joan's life together.

"It all began," he smiled fondly, pointing to a clipping yellowed with age, "around 1930. I was in vaudeville at the time" — This modest statement brought a smile from the friends sharing the scrap book.

Who doesn't remember Si Wills of the rubber face, the black curl in the middle of his forehead and the upturned hat? He is just as pleasantly surprised today by your compliments as he would have been in 1930.

"I was looking for a straight man at the time and Joan was looking for a partner. It was inevitable we should meet. After three weeks of teaming together, I played straight man and Joan took over the gags. She was a natural comic."

"We went on touring vaudeville," he explained, pointing to another clipping dated a few years later, "and were set to go abroad when we discovered our baby was on the way. That decided our moving to California where I had done some work for Mack Sennett and others.

"Following Beverly's birth (Bev is thirteen now) Joan and I decided it was time we settled down, and so our traveling days were somewhat curtailed. We still made theatrical appearances across the country.

At a Party

"One night—" pointing to a clipping of the middle 30's, "at a party, everybody took turns entertaining. That was the beginning of Joan's movie career. She signed with Twentieth-Century Fox and used to bring her scripts home to me. Together we'd work out routines. I became her writer, and today, along with two others, I'm working on CBS' 'Joannie's Tea Room'." (The show is off the air for the summer).

That, according to modest, likeable Si is all there is to the story of the Willses. For fifteen years they've been happily married, balancing two careers as one, and are the parents of a talented thirteen-year-old of whom both are tremendously proud.

"Beverly made her stage debut at the age of ten weeks," recalled Si. "We were touring then, and one of the acts featured Barbara Stanwyck. One night during a curtain call, she carried Bev onto the stage. Bev took to it and has been acting ever since.

Imitates Mother

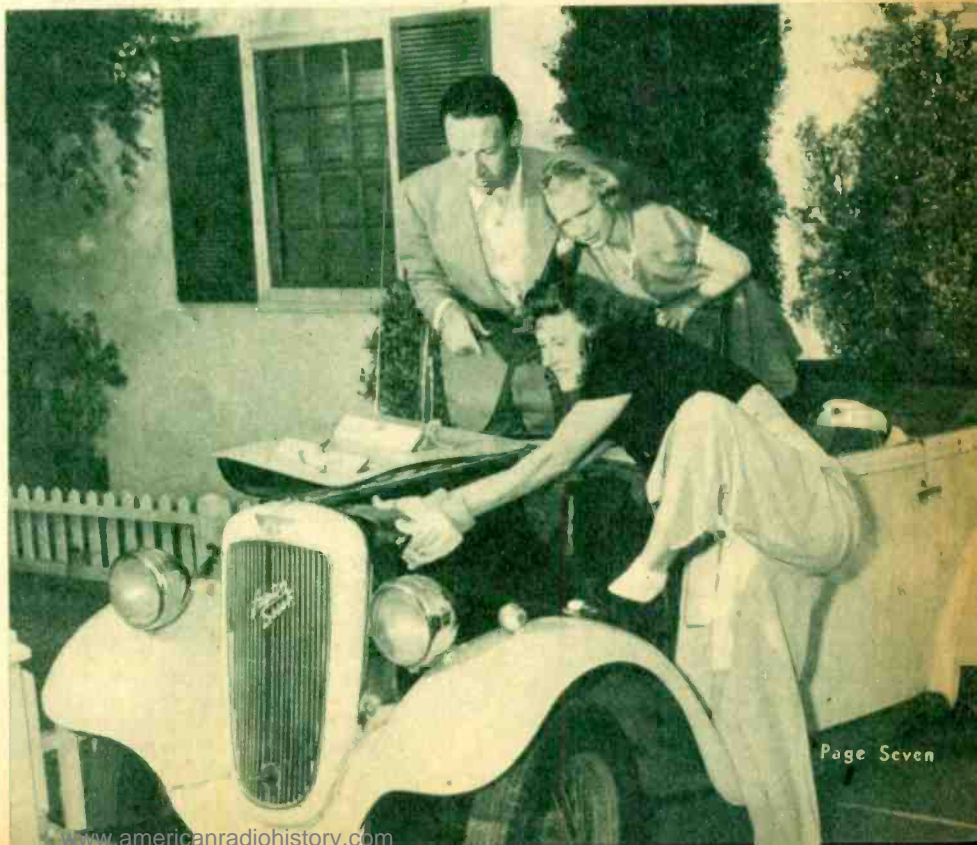
"By the time she was three, she imitated Joan perfectly. Today, at

school, she puts on her own radio programs, complete with microphones, sound effects and direction. She isn't spoiled, is completely unselfish and is an awfully sweet girl."

Si was on his way to join them. As we bid goodbye on the front steps, we remarked that life must be a round of laughs at the Willses'. "Yep it is," he drawled, "and I'm still playing the straight man who likes putting the funny words into my wife's mouth."

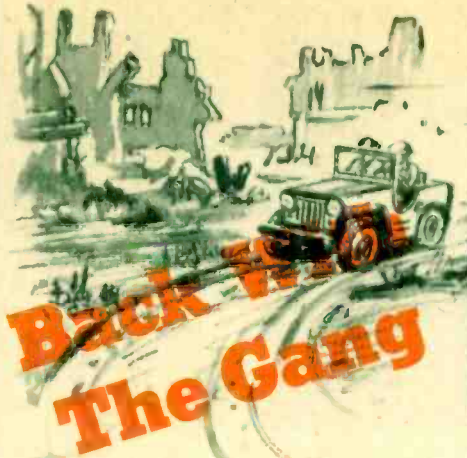

Is Radio Actor Byron Kane, Who Made Good in Hollywood Radio, Went to War, And Is Now Back on the Airwaves

NO, I'M not quite the last of the old gang to return," smiled radio actor Byron Kane. "We've still got Hans Conried in Tokyo. But he'll be back in September, I hear, and then we'll all be together again."

In the service for almost three years, nineteen months of that time overseas, Byron says that the thing his war experience taught him is that "anything is possible—no matter how fantastic it seems. Another thing I learned is always to look on the bright side of things."

Byron was with the Glider Infantry Regiment of the 17th Airborne Division and fought in the famous Battle of the Bulge. After V-E Day he was transferred to the American Forces Network, the European equivalent of Armed Forces Radio Service. "I was with the American Forces Network in Frankfurt, Paris and London, and I learned more about radio there than I ever knew before. I learned to operate a station and a network, and do news-casting. It was wonderful experience." While in London Byron appeared in several dramas on the BBC and also on "Transatlantic Call."

"There's really not much difference in the British Broadcasting Company organization and that of our networks. And, another thing, they've been greatly influenced by the programs put on by American Forces Network. I think they missed us when we left." Most interesting

difference between British and American production methods, Byron noted, was the absence of cueing by the producer. "Cueing is done with a green light. Instead of saying 'Wait for the cue'—it's 'Wait for the flick!'"

"What parts did you play in these BBC dramas?" we wanted to know.

Greatest Change

"Oddly enough," he laughed, "I played Americans!"

Greatest change that Byron has noticed since his return has been the great influx of radio actors from New York and Chicago. He speaks slightly nostalgically of the old days when "everybody knew everybody."

Byron related that he thinks he got the biggest thrill of his life just before he went overseas, when Orson Welles wired the commanding general requesting Byron's services in the opening of the War Loan Drive in Texarkana, Texas, where Byron was stationed. Needless to say, Orson's request was granted and Byron found himself reunited with a plane load of fellow Hollywood radio actors. "All my old buddies!" he sighed reminiscently.

Like most local radio-ites, Byron has brushed briefly with the movies. "I only tried out for a part once," he recalled. "It was for the part of 'Dizzy' in one of the early 'Henry Aldrich' pictures. The director turned me down because he said I wasn't

What Readers Want

Some of our readers may have thought we were kidding when we've repeatedly said our aim was to put out the kind of Radio Life our readers wanted. Through your letters and telephone calls we've tried to keep our ear to the ground. But a few weeks ago, our business manager, Bob Johnson, decided we should stick our necks way out and conduct a Survey of 10,000 Radio Lifers.

The results are now in and tabulated and we thought those of you who were polled and all the rest of our readers, as well, would be interested to know what we found out.

We've always thought of Radio Life as being bought by The Little Woman. This is only part truth. In the families polled, the woman of the house buys Radio Life in 64.5 per cent of the cases; the man of the house, 22.28 per cent; other adults, 3.75 per cent; boys, 4.66 per cent; girls, 4.79 per cent.

We've always considered Radio Life as a "family magazine" and the poll substantiates this belief. In answer to the question, "At your house, whom is Radio Life read by?", here are the answers:

Man of the house.....	27.72 per cent
Other adult.....	12.32 per cent
Woman of the house.....	41.87 per cent
Boy	8.24 per cent
Girl	9.85 per cent

An average of two persons reads one single copy of Radio Life. Sixty per cent of the constant weekly readers like to save their copies as reference material and many have a complete file from Vol. 1 No. 1 to the present.

Five and thirty-three hundredths per cent like to pass their copies on, usually to servicemen or shut-ins. Seventy-five per cent of Radio Lifers never miss the feature stories; 23 per cent read them sometimes; and only 2 per cent never read them. Popularity of Ear Inspires the Pen department was attested by 75 per cent of the readers who never miss this section, 19.8 per cent sometimes reading it and only 5.22 per cent never eyeing what others have written.

Other pertinent data revealed that 68.24 per cent of our readers do not consult any daily newspaper for log information, depending on the magazine exclusively. One-fourth of our readers have bought Radio Life for a three to four year period and 17.2 per cent have purchased it ever since it started publication more than six years ago. Gives us a real family feeling to know this.

One interesting fact developed from the survey was the interest shown by those polled in appending comments to the questionnaires. Only three per cent failed to take advantage of the space in which we invited suggestions about the magazine. Only two persons answering did so in gay mood; the others took the inquiry seriously.

Most universal request was for more pictures. Many asked for the station finder on each page (we have already heeded this request and this week have tried to place it once on each day's logs). Another suggestion already acted upon was that asking for uniform page numbering.

It was interesting to learn that many readers want critical reviews of programs and more technical information about broadcasting. This request has been noted. Some readers want Radio Life to conduct a campaign for announcers to lower their voices on commercials. We had already secretly thought the Ear Inspires correspondents were doing all right on this campaign by themselves.

One reason for conducting the survey at this time was our rosy prospect of returning to a 24-page news section (we dropped to 20, sometimes 16 pages during the war). Our readers who were polled expressed a wish for many of the features formerly included in this department: a short-wave column, more pre-cast information, general "gossipy" columns, quiz column,—these were placed at the top of our contemplated format for the expanded news section, soon to make its appearance.

Those who want more about Western programs and stars may anticipate our Western and Folk issue September 1. Those who want midnight to dawn logs may clip them from the two articles we've just completed. It may be possible for us to resume periodic publication of these logs, also ticket and contest information.

We here at Radio Life feel a lot closer to our reader family since studying the survey. To the more than 25 per cent stating they liked the magazine the way it is, we offer our sincere thanks and a promise not to let you down. To those who gave us constructive criticism, we also say, "thank you", and promise to do our best to carry out your suggestions. Polled or not, you know you are free to write us at any time with your suggestions. And if we say it again, that our aim is to put out the kind of magazine you readers want, you'll know now we're NOT kidding.

Flash

The talk of Radio Row these summer days concerns the new Warner Bros. KFWB Flashcast News Ribbon, which will officially decorate the Hollywood and Vine Taft Building on August sixth. If you're not sure of the mechanics of the News Ribbon (and we weren't) this is the way it works.

It is controlled by a mechanical "electric brain" which transmits a news flash or story from the editor's desk to the street in thirty seconds. This amazing invention is the result of work and research by Bert Roth, Vice-President of the Trans Lux Company of New York. Roth devised a series of electrical impulses which will carry news from the KFWB studios to the famous corner.

An operator at the studios receives his copy, perforates a tape, then after proof-reading it, runs it through a transmitter. The holes, vertically arranged, pass over a series of metal rods or fingers. The fingers, when hit

How did I get my first break? Once at a party, Larry Allen (then of NBC Artists Service) heard one of my characterizations. Very profoundly he suggested I come in to see him at his office the following morning. I did. Just a few days after this incident came a call for an audition—a one-woman show. There must have been at least 25 women there. The process of elimination went on for several days until finally two were left from which to choose. One was an older woman who had had much experience with "one-woman" shows. The other was I, as a comparative unknown—and you know what that means in radio. Did I get it? No, she did. I remember Larry Allen's remark before the finals: "I don't know how you've gotten this far, Floretta. You must have something—it must be your sublime ignorance that has carried you through."

And that audition was all to the good, because I was kept quite busy on this show and that . . . but I'd had a taste of what it would mean to have my own show. That was what I wanted. Eventually there came along a one-woman show for Tea Garden Products, then another for Caswell Coffee Company (CBS Net).

During the time these shows were on, I continued to hold my job in the attorney's office. I wanted to come to Hollywood so I needed a substantial savings account. Before the Hollywood trip materialized, however, ill health and hospitalization had eaten away my savings account, and several more years passed, with several more radio programs sprinkled throughout them, before I was able to make my way to Hollywood. I arrived in the southern California city in 1941.

Lecturer

Whoops! Now what . . . I had to make good. It's not easy to break through the inner circle here, but I made the usual rounds; wrote the usual letters; had the usual interviews; and the usual waiting for a call. My first was a commercial on the Al Pearce Camel show.

One day a call came through that wasn't for a radio job, but I answered, with the result that, from October of 1942 to June of 1943, I played the role of lecturer at North American Aviation on related beauty subjects, the primary purpose behind the project being that pride in one's appearance brings greater pride in one's work. The actual knowledge I gained from this assignment I have incorporated into

a show idea for a daily serial which NBC now has packaged for sale. It's called "Life Unlimited."

Following the above job, I was determined to work out a show of my own. "Remember with Floretta" was the result, an idea based on the premise that all memories are good—unhappy or otherwise. It's easy to understand the value in happy memories, but the unhappy periods, they serve, too. It's all in knowing how to make use of them. We all have more strength and courage than we realize.

At present, "Remember" is not on the air, but I have hopes it will be soon again. Now, and for the past year, I have been bringing radio listeners "The Musical Jewel Box," music and stories about famous jewels and jewelry traditions. Sponsored by the Macy Jewelry Company, it is heard on KFAC, Monday through Friday, 7:30 p.m.

I've been able to do most of my own writing for the various radio shows which I have created. It's been work, and is, but it's worth it to have helped prove that a woman can make a place for herself in radio—other than as a singer, dramatic actress, or in the field of home economics.

I've continued working also as a dramatic actress on various shows, but naturally, haven't been able to "pound that beat" as much as I would like.

What other tid-bits would you like? I eat practically anything, excluding hominy—now, take rare

ugly enough. You can see I wasn't too disappointed!"

Byron is a comparative rarity in that he's a self-taught actor. "Oh, I went to the Hollywood High dramatic class, and didn't learn a thing. I didn't pay any attention. In fact, I don't even know what they taught." Byron's great love of radio, though, made him study the techniques of different actors. A study which he made so thoroughly that, when he auditioned for the first time he won the lead opposite Margaret Sullavan in a Norman Corwin radio drama. He was a junior in high school at the time. "And the really amazing thing about it was," he smiled, "the fact that everybody heard me—even the producers." Roles in the distinguished aircasts of Orson Welles and Arch Oboler followed. Byron grew a moustache six years ago when a producer suggested that it would make him look older. "I've had it ever since," he said, "and now they never think of me as a juvenile."

A Fan, Too

If he had his own show, Byron's ambition would be to play a completely different part every week. "Not always the lead," he added,

"And, oh yes, I'd give every actor in the cast *air credit!*" New York radio actor Everett Sloane and Hollywood actors Elliott Lewis and Lou Merrill he picks as his favorite portrayals of drama. Of all men in radio, he most respects Norman Corwin.

"Conquest," "Michael Shane," "Don't You Believe It," "Romance of the Ranchos" and "Cisco Kid" are some of the shows on which you've been hearing Byron lately. We can't tell you what type of character he plays, because he might turn up as an old man, a murderer, a victim, a doctor or a romantic lead.

To those anxious to break into radio Byron says that equal amounts of perseverance, talent and good luck are necessary. These Byron has had in his interrupted radio career, and something more—a really undying love for the medium of radio. If he wasn't an actor, he'd be the country's number one fan!

toting grudges is a waste of time and effort.

Likes "Normalcy"

"Lots of people dislike me," he went on. "Everybody doesn't like Fidler. But it's a man's or woman's own business whether or not he likes me."

What the columnist likes in other people is "normalcy." "I'm an average person," he admitted. "I live in a small house . . . I have a baby . . . I like golf, swimming . . . am not a big gambler . . . not a big drinker . . . not a big night-clubber."

By nature, Fidler is a nervous person and his tension work accentuates this. Last summer, he had run himself so far to the ground that his doctor forbade his continuance on the air unless he took time out to recharge himself.

This year, as he approached his vacation, Jimmy was nervous, but not as much so as last year, for he has followed a schedule of golf and romping with his daughter and has left more work in the hands of his large staff.

The Fidler personnel is divided into three sections:

1. The news and material collectors—five steady employees—six occasional.
2. The editorial group which works on Fidler's newspaper column—two persons.
3. The discussion and comment group on radio—three persons. These meet with Jimmy for about two hours every Thursday to discuss ideas for his Open Letter and Editorial. Each in the group reads every important newspaper and column in an effort to cull provocative items.

20% Good

To Fidler, good material is the type folks discuss around the luncheon table. It's stimulating, conducive to controversy and definite opinions. Of the stuff gleaned by his office, Fidler eliminates seventy-five to eighty per cent. About sixty per cent is uninteresting or old. Fifteen or twenty per cent is otherwise unsuitable.

Sometimes Fidler tries to guess the news. Certain facts point, for instance, to a marital break-up. The facts are so numerous and so certain, the conclusion seems inevitable. He cites as an example, the Martha Scott-Carlton Alsop split-up, which he predicted with certain facts at hand. This was promptly denied, soon substantiated. The recent Page Gilman divorce was prophesied likewise, immediately denied, "but five days later," commented

Fidler, "Mrs. Gilman filed suit for divorce. Of course I can't blame a couple for denying a rift. Maybe they're still hoping to patch things up."

15% Wrong

As to his predictions, Fidler estimates he's right eighty-five per cent of the time. Often it seems that he has made a mistake, as when he announced the Cary Grant-Barbara Hutton divorce. "Both Cary and his lawyers called me and asked for a retraction. I made one when convinced I was wrong. But soon after, Grant and his wife did separate."

Twice Fidler has been sued: Once by Constance Bennett and again in the "Scarlet Street" case, now pending. Suit against him has been threatened a dozen times.

Asked about the Bennett suit, Fidler replied: "Frankly, I don't know why she sued. I still don't know. It was a conglomeration of things, but the thing that probably irritated her most was a New Year's Open Letter in which I had Resolutions I Would Make If I Were a Star. For Miss Bennett I said: 'Resolved that the only splinters you get on the ladder of fame are those you get sliding down.'"

For the first five months of 1946, during which Fidler has addressed Open Letters to twenty stars, four or five have registered protests. Few call him personally. Generally, he hears about the star's disfavor from other persons. Fidler does remember, however, that Martha Raye and Pat O'Brien were two who thanked him for his criticism. (Martha was taken down the line for her carousing in night clubs. Jimmy can't remember why he lit out on O'Brien, "but," he says, "it was the beginning of a good friendship".)

Tipsters

The mail averages 1500 letters weekly in winter and five hundred in summer. They both agree and disagree with Fidler. Most letters come from fans, fan clubs, fanatics. The one issue which has elicited most mail response is his "campaign to clean up the screen." Agreeing with the columnist on this have been government officials, professional men, and heads of youth groups.

In addition to his paid staff, Fidler has a corps of unpaid tipsters—hat check girls, nurses, waiters, etc. An anonymous scribbled note tucked in his mail box gave him the lead on Priscilla Lane's marriage and a similar note put him on the trail of the divorce in San Bernardino.

He's often held up scoops for vital reasons—one of them friendship. The Wayne Morris divorce action went unmentioned as a Fidler scoop because of the friendship between Morris and Fidler.

Jimmy considers his Errol Flynn scoop his biggest, along with the Clark Gable divorce. He got the tip on Flynn from a nurse in Mexico City, who relayed the information

of Nora Eddington and of Flynn visiting her in the hospital. It cost Fidler \$125 in phone calls to check the facts and \$50 more to hire someone to check personally in Mexico City. He paid the nurse \$50 for the tip ("fifty dollars was worth more than \$50 in Mexico"). Twice Fidler has paid \$100 for hot leads.

Reverting to the question of liking and disliking persons, of being liked and disliked, we asked Fidler how he and Errol Flynn stood at present.

"We're friendly," he answered. "Flynn was being put up for membership in Lakeside Golf Club and the rumor was going the rounds I would black-ball him. I wrote the club a letter, saying I had no such intention. Flynn was admitted. The next time we met at the club, he thanked me.

"Yes, we're friendly now. But that still wouldn't stop me from writing an Open Letter about him tomorrow."

At the sound of my voice he begins calling "Florie" (that's what my parents call me). Irving Berlin and I have something in common—our pet tune is "Always"; I fear my taste in music is rather simple; I must have melody, and I can't stand blaring, blaring boogie-woogie bands. Advice

My advice to all the little kiddies trying to make their way is just set your sails right, be sure you are equipped to guide your boat, never kid yourself about your own capabilities—and you'll reach harbor.
