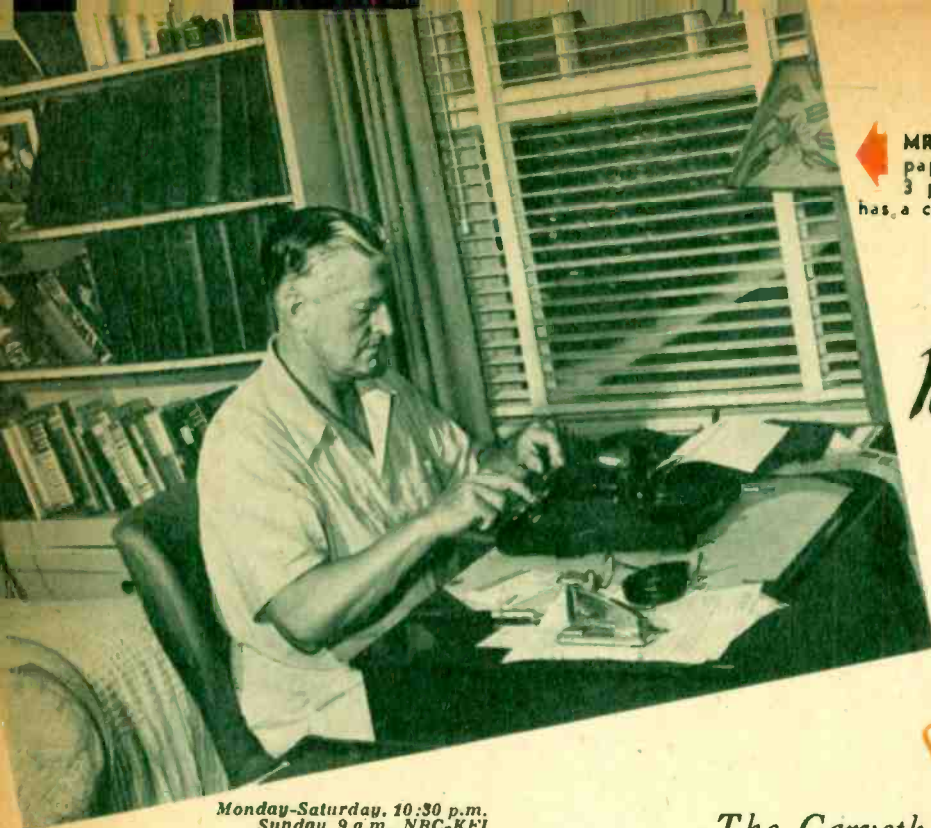

JUST a touch of old Bermuda transplanted to Westwood," Mrs. Carveth Wells had once told us, referring to the then half-completed Wells home. What we visited last week was the finished product, and just as Mrs. W. had promised, one did feel that Bermudan touch upon stepping inside.

We must admit that before calling upon Mr. Wells, we frantically quizzed our friends about what constituted a "Bermuda house." They were no help and off we went in a fogged state of mind wondering if we'd be fortunate enough to recognize it by its thatched roof and rows of romantic palm trees.

Host Tropical, Too

By now you're probably way ahead

of us, because what we did locate was a perfectly charming rose-colored cottage with a bright gypsum (imitation coral to you) roof. And standing in the doorway to greet us was Mr. Wells himself, looking every inch the perfect Bermudan host in a tropical shirt and short trousers.

We were disappointed at not seeing Mrs. Wells, who at this writing is in New York with her own television show, and that wonderful myna bird, Raffles. "Raffles is the star of our family," laughed Mr.

Wells, "and receives as much fan mail as we do."

"Does he answer it personally?" we facetiously asked.

"He would if he could," retorted the commentator, "but to give it authenticity we hand the envelopes to him and he pecks at them."

When we met Wells' charming blonde daughter, Frances, and her very distinguished husband, Wing Commander Bland, we completely forgot we were in Westwood. Un-

consciously we found ourselves copying our British friends' broad "A's."

The Blands had come to stay with Wells while Mrs. Wells was in New York.

"How," we wanted to know, "do you work with such interesting houseguests?"

"I'll show you," said Mr. W., leading us down a long hallway to a charming pastel-colored den. "This," he continued, "is where I spend every day from three to nine-twenty p.m. writing the script for my nightly show."

It was a warm, cozy room, conducive to work. Wells had set his typewriter and desk in the middle of the room and within arm's reach were shelves filled with impressive books, a huge bag holding strips of film which he had photographed on his various trips around the universe, and a large globe of the world.

Isolation for Work

"I purposely selected this room because it was away from the rest of the household. But why don't we begin at the beginning and start at the front of the house."

Back through the long hallway we trooped at Mr. W.'s heels. The living room, distinguished from the other rooms by its curved ceiling and raised fireplace, holds many of the collector's collections. It's a room built for comfort and its restful green walls blend with the various pieces of multi-colored furniture. Rows of books line one end of the room, while large windows and Dutch doors (a feature of the house) complete the other walls.

The raised fireplace, Mr. Wells told us, is for convenience's sake. The Bermudans, he confided in his droll manner, are much too lazy to stoop any lower than necessary. Consequently, this house, like all Bermudan houses, is designed with comfort in mind.

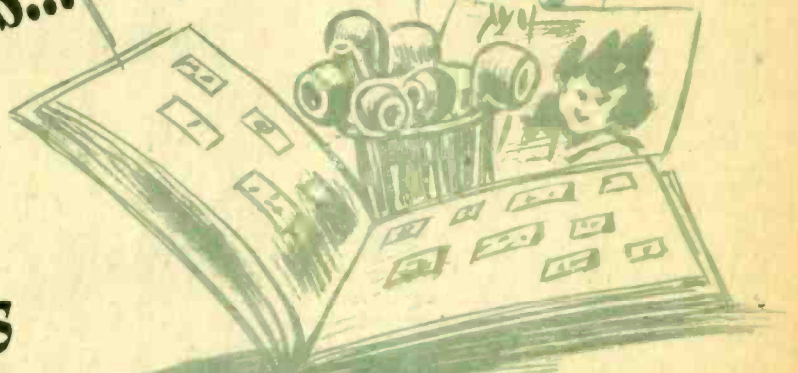

Just Around the Corner

Having just returned from luncheon with young and interesting Richard Hubbell, Production Manager and Television Consultant of the Crosley Corporation, we hurriedly sat down to collect our thoughts (and those of Mr. Hubbell) on the hotter-than-the-atom-bomb subject, *Television!* What most of us know about it would hardly fill the head of a pin—and realizing that you are as anxious to learn about its present status as we, Radio Life eagerly welcomed the opportunity of chatting with such an authority as Mr. H.

His background is as impressive as the books he has authored on television. Obviously the gentleman knows the whys and wherefores of radio and television, having served as writer, director, and producer for various networks; writer and researcher for *Fortune* and *Life* Magazines; and as lecturer on television at various professional societies. It was in the latter capacity that he happened to be in Hollywood.

"As soon as the bottleneck of equipment is licked," Mr. Hubbell stated,

"television should be as well established as radio. In other words, it's a matter of equipment which plays an important part in holding up progress today."

What about the present television shows in New York?

"They are far more advanced than the ones offered on the West Coast. Within a few years, television should be on a regular daily broadcasting schedule comparable to that of radio."

What chance has television for survival?

"Every chance in the world. It is eagerly awaited by radiomen and laymen alike. It will be a valuable medium of entertainment as well as one of the most effective forms of advertising.

"Television was actually ready to go in 1936 but it was 1941 before commercial broadcasting took effect. The war curtailed any further progress and television was shelved. Today, we're set to go again.

"Within three years of licking the old equipment problem, television will play as important a part as radio."

How will it affect radio and motion pictures?

"It wont, in a detrimental sense, that is. Television will have in its favor the advantage of being both visible and audible, of being able to catch events as they happen, of presenting news while it is news."

Mr. Hubbell went on to explain

that if the government were to invest a couple of million dollars in furthering television, within five years color film would be perfected. The black and white film of today, he declared, is as clear and definite as a top-notch movie, but much of the material presented is yet in need of improvement.

"Please don't misunderstand," he concluded, "that I feel television is in a perfect state today. For it isn't. There are many kinks in production and equipment to be ironed out, and there exists a great mental inertia in the entertainment industry to be overcome. Yet television is set to go.

"For the first time in history we have the opportunity to take a highly developed but completely unexploited science and out of it create a new industry . . . an industry which must be built from the ground up, and an industry which will provide hundreds of thousands of new jobs. It is an opportunity and a challenge to our system of free enterprise which we cannot overlook."

Lucky Thirteen

Last week's debut of the Fall radio season held no "boogies" for CBS' Lux Radio Theatre. To commemorate the beginning of Lux's thirteenth air year (and in this case, lucky thirteen) "LRT" veteran Claudette Colbert, making her eighteenth appearance, ushered in the airer's opening presentation of "Without Reservations."

Your Radio Life scribe, on hand for dress rehearsal, received the same "opening night" thrill which in the past has permeated the backstage scenes of the CBS Playhouse on Monday afternoons. Absent for its eight-week summer hiatus, Lux's tee-off of last week proved a disappointment to no one and firmly established the ether show high on the Hooper list for the coming season.

Star Colbert, long a favorite of the Lux Theatre, has to her credit two past inaugural airers. "The third time is a charm," she remarked. But from past experience, we've learned Miss Colbert needs no lucky charm upon which to lean when appearing before the mike. She's an expert air per-

While he lived and worked in Los Angeles, Henry always used to do his Times column from his desk at the newspaper building, returning home to prepare his air show. In Washington he has his office in the CBS Building—a place so crowded, according to Bill, that "if you stand up for a minute, you've lost your chair for the rest of the day." "I don't know where I'll find my desk

when I get back—probably on the roof," he added.

Henry dispatches his Times column from Washington by leased wire just in time to make the early afternoon edition. While he was stationed in Los Angeles, his air show was fifteen minutes, as against his five for Johns-Manville. The shorter broadcast changes the complexion of what Bill says. As a five-minute program it's clear-cut news, with no room for editorial comment.

His fan mail, when he broadcast fifteen minutes from Hollywood and had his Times column, averaged 1100 letters a week. Much of this mail he attributed to the editorial context of his airshow. Now his mail runs about 150 letters weekly, most of them from Los Angeles.

Bill claims a slight martyrdom while broadcasting from Hollywood as opposed to Washington. "Back there I have from 8 a. m. to 9 p. m. to do my work. Out here, due to the time difference, I have to squeeze it in from 8 a. m. to 6 p. m." Henry, consigned to work during the early evening hours, confines his Washington social life to occasional parties given by someone close or given in honor of someone he's particularly anxious to meet. He eats most of his meals at the Press Club, manages to attend the National Theater by rushing in late after his broadcast is concluded and, with the help of family members, being brought up to date on what's happened before he came in. Mrs. Henry, still an ardent tennis player, continues the sport in Washington and with her daughter, Pat, won the Mother and Daughter finals recently held at Coronado. She's also become an antique collector, and though professing mild amusement at her hobby, Bill disguises but faintly his interest in old things.

One thing Henry especially likes is his sponsor's complete "hands-off" policy regarding his broadcasts. He's never been contacted about what he should or shouldn't say (despite all the building legislation kicking around Washington). A couple of times he addressed the company's board of directors, answering informal questions, and once he talked to the employees.

"Did you get one of my V-J Day records?" Henry asked abruptly. "No? Then I'll send you one. One side is the actual three or four-minute broadcast I did. The other tells how I happened to do it."

The newsman went on to explain he was in the White House in mid-afternoon, August 14, 1945. The CBS microphone was set up 200 yards across the street. Along with other correspondents, Henry was included in the press conference at 4 p. m. at which Truman announced the war over. Taking to his heels, Bill sprinted the 200 yards across the street to the mike and sped the great news air-ward a few seconds after 4 o'clock. Then he ran back to the White House for extra data, shooting back to the mike to deliver a

Angeleno Bill Henry, Now CBS' Chief Washington Correspondent, Maintains Loyalty to Los Angeles, Thinks City Is Destined to Be World's Greatest

HOLLYWOODIAN Bill Henry, gone Washington for three years, gave us one of his slow smiles. "Won't you," he asked, "put me in the light of a martyr?"

"I'm a Californian. I go back to Washington where the one really good dish they have is seafood. I hate seafood. Here I have my Buick (which my girls are gradually wearing down while I'm gone). Back there I don't have any transportation. So I'm a martyr—to my profession."

Bill, eating a leisurely luncheon at Billingsley's, looked like anything but a martyr. His stay in the capital, to which he will have returned by the time this appears in print, hasn't changed him. He's still the relaxed, tongue-in-cheek gentleman with a bagful of fascinating stories—this time about "the center of the world," as he chooses to call the national seat of government.

Year to Root

Three years ago last July 1, Bill Henry took up Washington residence as Chief Correspondent for CBS. The Henrys turned their Los Angeles home over to one of their daughters during their absence, found a three-room apartment near the CBS studios in Washington. As Chief Correspondent, Henry was given recognition immediately, also, as Times columnist, his standing as a member of the press entitled him to other privileges. "It was a year, though, before I had established my contacts," he said. "Any credentialed reporter can get the news, especially during the war, when blanket statements were released to the press. But it's the inside contacts that count. For instance, twenty-four hours after an important representative returned from the Yalta conference, about fif-

teen of his special contacts were called for a confidential conference and given inside information.

"At another time, while our army was still in Western Europe, a select group was called to a confidential conference and given the whole strategy for the rest of the European war. Germany would have paid nine million dollars to have that information.

"Carrying around information like that must have been quite a burden," we ventured.

"Often it was," Bill returned. "Some fellows had to watch their drinks and loose talk. But it's information like that which helps a correspondent understand what's going on and what to expect."

His ability to gain contacts (and keep the ones he's cinched) are in a fast way to making the commentator-columnist famous. In one of his and Mrs. Henry's favorite New York hotels they hadn't frequented for some time, the couple sat down

to dine. A veteran Hungarian waiter, whom they recognized, but who they didn't think recognized them, finally spotted them, approached the table and announced: "Five meenuts for Joe Manville!"

So clever with his hotel contacts had Henry become by last year that CBS New York was calling CBS correspondent Henry in Washington asking him to obtain hotel reservations in New York for homeward-bound CBS European correspondents.

Opinion of Congress

His inside look into Washington operations has not made Henry cynical. "After all," he said, "I HAD been around before I went there." He's not been surprised at anything, unless, perhaps, it may be Congress. He thinks Congress is truly representative of the American people... some silly, some crooked, some smart, and so on. Congress, he feels, tries to do pretty nearly what the people want it to do.

In the World, a Fact Which the Trade
Loves But Which Phone Girls Lament*

A DOG just bit me; what'll I do?"
"How do you make out a check for the Community Chest?"

"My husband's been missing for three days; I want you to find him for me."
"Somebody's following me and I'm afraid to go home."

Sounds like calls to the police department, don't they? They're not... they're calls to KHJ. And there are dozens like them every day.

Radio network operation is big business, and like all big business, highly departmentalized. What sounds so chatty coming over your loudspeaker is actually the product

of several hundred people's efforts, although it's hard to realize that so many have a hand in the broadcasting of a single program.

Just how hard is illustrated by the following conversation:

"Mutual Don Lee KHJ."

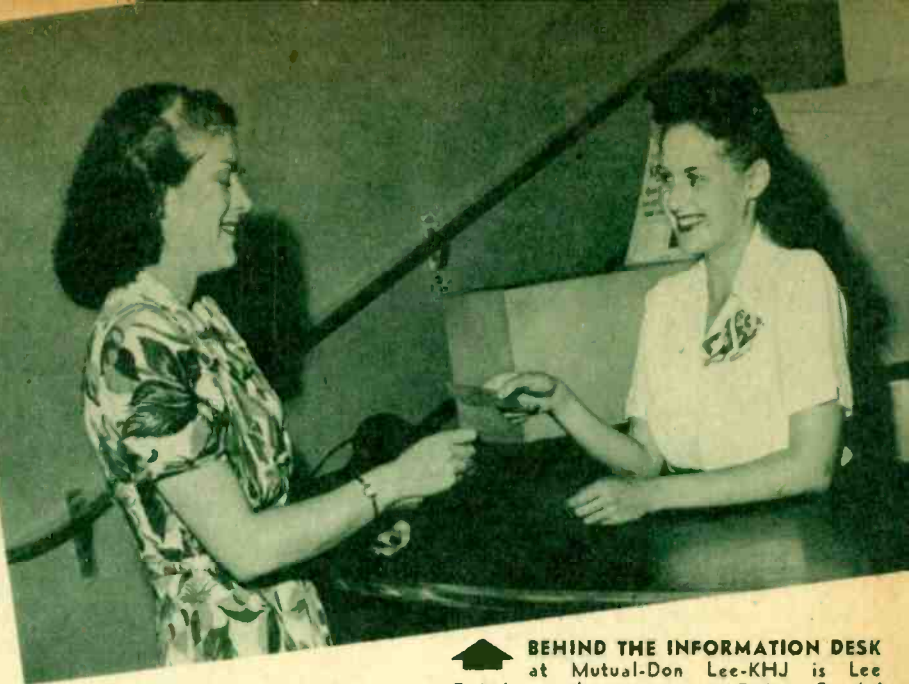
"Is this Norma Young?"

"No; this is the switchboard operator."

"Oh, I'm sorry, I must have the wrong number."

Most people, of course, don't carry things quite so far as to believe that the talent also answers the phone, but on the other hand, they don't have a very clear idea of studio architecture, studio regulations, and the habits of the artists. Of course,

it's impossible to talk to anyone while he's on the air. But often the switchboard operator gets a royal raking over the coals because she can't locate someone who's just finished a broadcast.

The reason is simple. The phone in each studio is located in the control booth. By the time an engineer picks up the receiver, the artist has walked out the other way. Glenn Hardy and Fred Shields of the Alka-Seltzer Newspaper of the Air both have a notoriously quick get-away; are almost impossible to locate after showtime.

Simple Questions Hardest


When you dial the station for information about a certain program, your call is transferred to the information desk—where, if it's humanly possible to do so, you'll be given the details. Yet, oddly enough, questions that would seem the most simple are the ones which can't be answered.

Most common of these are "What's that piece they're playing?"—or "What's the name of that contestant on Dud Williamson's show now?" Believe it or not, the girls at the information desk will not be able to tell you. As a matter of fact, the only people at a radio station who really hear all of a given broadcast are the producer and the studio engineer. Even the master control engineer, who sends the program to the transmitter, doesn't necessarily hear every program, for the reason that he may be handling as many as four different shows through his control board simultaneously, and he obviously can't listen to all of them. Outsiders assume that because it's a radio station, every employee automatically knows what's on the air

IN A MONTH, it'll be old age for me," laughed Quiz Kid Harvey Fischman. Red-headed Harvey, the current events and history specialist, is now sixteen and had completed five years of quiz-kidding in mid-August when, with due ceremony, he was graduated from that most exclusive of Alma Maters.

We met Harvey just before this memorable occasion when he visited Hollywood on an assignment to interview child movie actors for the Chicago Times. Harvey expressed mixed emotions about leaving the program to which he has belonged for so long. "In a way, I'm glad to be getting out," he admitted. "You see, the kids get younger all the time. I felt out of place being the oldest, and also being tall for my age. Sometimes I

felt when I answered a question that the audience was thinking, 'Aw, why don't you give the little kids a chance, you big bully!'"

"Also, my pal Richard Williams is no longer on, and I miss him." Richard, the well-remembered math expert, is now going to the University of Chicago and would like to continue at Cal-Tech, according to Harve.

Help One Another

"Of course, don't think it hasn't been wonderful being a Quiz Kid," he continued. "Gee, I never expected to see any place outside of Chicago, and on our trips we've been all over and seen everything. Another wonderful thing about the program is the exchange of ideas and information you get from the other kids. For instance, when Richard Williams first came on the program he was very shy. I've never been shy, and I

think I helped Richard get over it. I know that I learned a lot from him, too."

"Just a minute," we interrupted, "have you never really been shy?" The vision of countless fifteen-year-olds, shy to a man, was recalled to us. Harve smiled.

"Honestly—I never have been. I don't know why," he added. "It comes in awfully handy not to be shy. Of course I'll admit that I wasn't exactly bubbling over the first time I faced a mike!"

Harvey's pet peeve is one that afflicts all the kids. "It's the person," says Harvey, "who simpers and says 'Oh, I'm afraid of you—you're a QUIZ KID!'" Harve's ambition is to continue in radio, "behind the mike." He's had a local quiz show of his own in Chicago for grammar school children, and he enjoys radio. He reads mostly non-fiction though he also confesses a fondness for problematical murder mysteries. Hates to be tagged "intellectual"—considers the present usage of the term an insult rather than a compliment. He enjoys acting, and admitted under close questioning that he's pretty good at it. Favorite role was that of a murder victim in a high-school play.

He's no jitterbug. "My feet are too big, and anyway, I'm a football player, not a jitterbug!" he said emphatically. He also loves baseball and is surprised that we take it so mildly on the west coast. "Right now I'm rooting for the Phillies," he informed us. He's very proud of his chubby little brother Sparky. "We call him Sparky because he was born on the Fourth of July," smiled Harve.

"Another George M. Cohan?" we wondered.

"He could be almost anything," laughed Harvey. "He's been on the Quiz Kids program, too. Sparky's only seven years old, but he's got a 55,000 word vocabulary. I'm sort of

MEMORIES . . . memories . . . memories. Station KFWB is haunted by them. Or perhaps it was that we were, the day we poked through the busy independent and realized that the station was twenty-one years old.

Now a twenty-first birthday anniversary is a big occasion in anyone's life and "WB" is no exception. A raft of important happenings was taking place to commemorate the joyous event, but the most exciting was the installation of the Trans Lux Flashcast news ribbon. WB's newsroom was in an uproar as workmen

were completing last-minute operations prior to the official unveiling.

The actual mechanism had not yet been installed but news editor Al Gordon told us that two specially-trained men will be required to run the news ribbon.

Away from the bustling excitement of the newsroom, life at WB goes along pretty much as sched-

uled. The station, owned by Warner Bros. Studio, operates on 5,000 watts of power. From its 6 a.m. broadcast of "Start the Day Right" to signing off time at 1 a. m. of the following morning, the station practices a policy of Combining Good Radio with Good Citizenship.

mentators, recorded musical shows, programs of current interest and sports are on WB's present agenda of broadcasting. The station boasts two audience studios and numerous smaller studios from which shows emanate.

Tucked away in a corner of the old Warner Bros. Studio on Fernwood, a portion of WB once housed the first sound picture, "The Jazz Singer." One almost expects Al Jolson, Ruby Keeler and the Gold Diggers chorus to pop out of a dark corner and go into a routine.

We nostalgically recalled that WB broadcast the first radio variety show in 1930, aided and abetted by a list of present star names who were then just beginning. Wendell

Niles, the Kings Men, the Boswell Sisters and countless others are alumni of the station and it was WB which brought radio listeners the first accounts of glamorous Hollywood premieres and cinemaland life in the thirties.

WB is proud of the fact that a public service program which began eighteen years ago can still be heard at the same time today, the Los Angeles Breakfast Club. The station has always believed in bringing its listeners important news first-hand; consequently, direct lines to various parts of the nation have provided radio dialers with a ringside seat at history-making events. KFVB was signally honored last year by receiving the coveted Peabody Award for its coverage of the San Francisco United Nations Conference.

During our personally-conducted tour, we encountered old friend Bill Anson winding up his popular "Hollywood Bandstand" show, while in the next studio, those zany "Three Men on a Mike" were standing by for their daily broadcast. We learned from librarian Lee Buck that WB's record-lined musical library holds some 15,000 platters, but we forgot to ask disc jockey Gene Norman if he made up his nightly "Eastside Show" from the aforementioned platters.

We exchanged pleasantries with General Manager Harry Maizlish and briefly met newscasters John Dehner, (Radio Life's Award winner) Val Brown, Dick Garten and Alan Mann. Absent was Dion Romandy, staff orchestra leader and conductor of the station's sixteen-piece band.

We were promised that our next visit would reveal the completed news ribbon in operation. And we understand they've already begun plans for the next twenty-one years.

Though Harve missed out on most of his last month on the program, he was so elated over his assignment for his home town paper that he couldn't pass it up. Peggy Anne Garner, Margaret O'Brien, Elizabeth Taylor, Claude Jarmin (of "The Yearling"), Connie Marshall and Vanessa Brown are some of the juvenile actors he has met and interviewed. Peggy Anne he names as the most interesting. Biggest surprise, he confesses, was in discovering that Margaret O'Brien was shy! Harve also revealed that Vanessa was herself a Quiz Kid about three years ago. Now she's playing Ronald Colman's daughter in "The Late George Apley," and Harve is very proud of her.

And speaking of Colman, Harve's biggest thrill came about when they met on a movie lot.

"I heard his voice as he was finishing a scene, and of course, recognized it before I saw him. I was talking to someone when I went over to meet Mr. Colman. Before we were introduced he said, 'Stop—I know that voice!' He thought for a minute and then exclaimed, 'I know—you're a Quiz Kid!' Imagine!" gasped Harvey. "Ronald Colman recognized my voice!"

at any moment; actually, they haven't time to listen to the radio any more than any other working person.

Some of the questions, of course, are the product of sheer unthinkingness, such as "What time does the 12 o'clock news come on?" "If Michael Shayne is heard at eight in Los Angeles, what time is it heard in Glendale?" Others would try the patience of a saint, such as the following rapid-fire queries which one woman recently asked KHJ's receptionist. Fill in your own answers.

"What's playing now on KECA . . . What's on your station now? . . . What's the dial number? . . . What station is this? . . . Do you have KFI's phone number? . . . Do you know if any other transcontinental programs are being rebroadcast now? . . . Well, which stations should I call to find out?"

"Stupid People!"

That intimacy of radio leads to other difficulties. It's hard for some people to realize that although they

hear Gabriel Heatter so clearly, he is clear across the continent. One man called after a Heatter broadcast; asked to speak with him. He got distinctly indignant over the patient explanation that Heatter was not in Los Angeles. "It's over your station, isn't it? Why can't you get him for me? Of all the stupid people!"

Radio fans are the most ardent fans in the world—a fact which the industry loves, but which information desk girls sometimes lament. Whenever a program goes off the air or is cancelled for a special broadcast, the switchboard is sure to be swamped. The delightful part of it is that each caller is firmly convinced that he is speaking not just for himself but for all of humanity as well. When Fulton Lewis, Jr., was cancelled recently at his regular time for the Louis-Conn fights, half of the calls announced that nobody ever wanted to listen to those fights and the other half as firmly stated that nobody ever wanted to listen to Fulton Lewis, Jr.

Radio networks like to receive expressions of public opinion. Reactions to programs help in planning a program schedule. If you've got a bouquet or a brickbat, call the information desk of the station carrying the program and tell the girl about it. She'll write it down on a form and turn it over to the program director. But if you dislike a program, don't take it out on her. She has nothing to do with station policy, so even though you may not feel like it, give her your opinion quickly and calmly. The same thing applies if you don't like the sponsor's product.

But life at the information desk at KHJ isn't always confined to asking questions. The girls will never forget the night a man walked in, dripping blood, said "Call an ambulance; I've been hit," and keeled over. Or the night the woman calmly announced that she was being followed, was afraid to go home, and wanted the police. Interrogation by the officers revealed that the woman's pursuers were largely in her imagination. "Do you want to go home or want to go to jail?" they finally asked her. "To jail," she said brightly, and the last the girls saw of her, she was happily on her way.
