Sirs: As a reader of Radio Life, I am sending our gripe to you.

Why are more tickets given out for a broadcast than can be accommodated?

April 1, we had to get up very early to take the bus in to hear and see Kenny Baker's "Glamour Manor," and it was raining too. Getting there at 8:40, the doors were closed and no more were admitted to the studio. It was full and here we all stood with tickets in our hands. (No, the "no ticket" line had not been admitted.)

Who is to blame for this happening? I had six young people with me, so you can imagine their disappointment.

Our feelings are entirely with you, Mrs. Archer, because it is crumpling to trek such a distance and then miss a show. But you see, early morning programs such as this often find themselves slightly "shorted" on an audience unless they print a few more tickets than capacity seating. For that reason, it's a little dangerous to arrive so close to the deadline as 8:50, most studio doors closing fifteen minutes in advance of air-time, and slightly earlier if it's absolutely "full house." Our only suggestion to you, sympathetically made of course, would be to allow at least a thirty-minute leeway. If you can manage it. We don't know a single studio audience show on the air which doesn't welcome every single person it can handle!

Paul Weston

He Enjoys His Work on a Show That Brings The Nightclub Atmosphere Into Your Home

PROBABLY most of you know by now that twice a week, right here in Hollywood, there's a party going on that's as entertaining as an hour at Ciro's. The same jamboree is held five nights a week by the Chesterfield Cigarette Company, and they broadcast all five clambakes, three from the east and two from Hollywood.

Radio Life decided to join the

party-goers one night recently, and we hurried off to NBC, arriving at the big studio in just the nick of time, too, for the whole bunch who provide our entertainment were already well into the strains of "Smoke Dreams", the theme they use to open the festivities. The "Supper Club", we discovered, is as lively a place as you could ask for.

Topnotchers featured at the "Supper Club" include Jo Stafford, the "Starlighters" with their spirited vocal arrangements that set your

toes to tapping, and a twenty-five-piece orchestra which bounces out the rhythms so that you know they get the same kick out of playing that you do out of hearing. Who doesn't get his quota of listening pleasure out of a first-rate band with a first-rate man backing the baton? Enough said that the arranger-conductor of the "Supper Club's" music is young Paul Weston.

Paul's been doing all the musical arrangements for glamorous party hostess Miss Stafford for some time, both on the air and on Capitol records. Paul's single platters, too, have proven themselves quite an item to many a fan. His versatility has garnered admirers ranging in type from those who would "simply perish without that swoon dream music!" to other musicians, themselves, who respect his work. He recently waxed "This Time", "I Should Care" and "Aint'cha' Comin' Home?" The records are his own compositions, done in collaboration with Axel Stordahl and Joel Benton.

Watching Paul take the band through its paces accompanying Jo or the "Starlighters", we fell to thinking about the last time Radio Life had brought readers Maestro Weston. Our story related how this young Massachusetts man had set himself aside in the realm of musicians simply by having earned his Phi Beta Kappa key while attending Dartmouth College. He'd never mentioned that honor, though, when plied with questions concerning his musical background.

Turns Arranger

"I'd been studying piano for some years with an eye to making that my work, but I traded my dreams and eight dollars for a clarinet so I could go on the road with the Dartmouth band... for football trips, of course. At the end of the season, my reason re-appeared, and I gave that up. Haven't touched a reed since. I was going to go up to Columbia University at New York for further

We were lunching with the radio "Sherlock" at the Brown Derby, and between forkfuls of his shrimp salad he was doing his best to fulfill our request to tell us all there was to tell about Tom Conway.

"This reminds me," he recalled with amusement, "of an air interview I had in Chicago one time. Amid much confusion, I was ushered to a radio station and given an outline script of questions I would be asked, concluding with a key query, at which, according to my instructions, I was to 'just talk about myself'.

Sherlocking Conway

"That idea disturbed me a bit—after all, how much is there to say about yourself," Conway continued, "so just before airtime, I gestured to him frantically, 'How long?' I meant how long would I have to ad lib about myself, and when he answered fifteen minutes, I thought 'Mygawd—I'd better begin back with my birth!' So, the show went on the air, progressing smoothly until time for that key question. When that came, I took a deep breath and began. On and on I went, for what seemed to me an interminable length of time. Every time I came up for air and looked about for help, the interviewer was looking off into space and impervious to my frantic glances, the orchestra leader was throwing sheets of music on the floor, and my wife, who was sitting opposite me in the studio, was wearing a positively pained expression.

Conclusion

"Of course, as all things do, it finally came to an end. The interviewer eventually coughed politely and announced, 'Well, thank you, Mr. Conway, it's been delightful.' The orchestra played a quick 'Tar-um-ta-da' and we were off the air.

"Needless to say, the interviewer had thought I'd asked, 'How long is the entire show?'"

Conway experienced another bad moment at the microphone more recently, he related, when Nigel (Tom calls him "Willie") Bruce's script was marked wrongly, causing "Doctor Watson" to miss a cue completely and forcing Conway to alter the dialogue into a monologue by "Holmes" to complete the story.

"I was absolutely weak when the show was over," he breathed. He further reported that he is not ordinarily uneasy about an air stint, but

for his "Sherlock Holmes" portrayal he attempts to make himself be nervous as he considers it a requirement for a true portrayal of the British sleuth. "I picture Holmes as a man of great nervous tension," he told us.

We were surprised to learn that Conway comes from a non-theatrical family and that his own debut in dramatics came about merely as a part of a business transaction. It occurred during a time when he was working as district sales manager for an English safety glass firm. Traveling through his territory, he stopped over in one section which was the center of much amateur theatrical activity, and while having a business talk with a man who, during his off-hours, was a casting director for one of the local dramas, Conway found himself being regarded as the "perfect type" for a role in the up-coming play.

At the conclusion of their conversation, Conway had agreed to do what was farthest from his mind—make an attempt at acting—persuaded into the move by the man's agreement, in return, to supply him with the stock he required to fill his remaining orders for safety glass.

Conway's attempt to act was effective enough to provoke an offer from the head of a local legitimate theatre group to join her organization at something like two pounds a week. Businessman Conway declined with thanks, and returned to his more profitable sales route.

Went Back

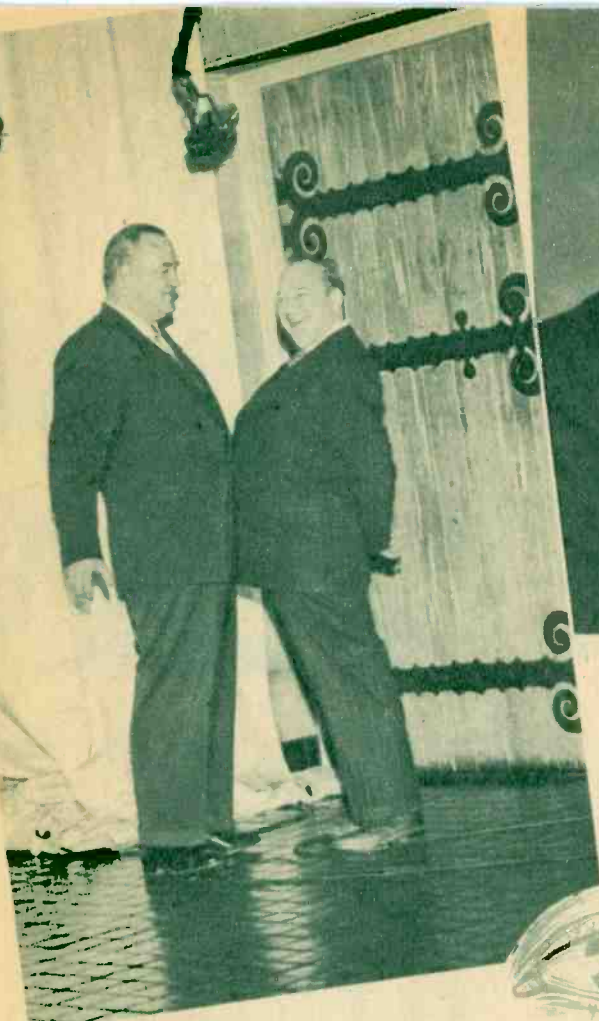
But late one winter night, driving along a lonely deserted road through a miserable downpour of sleet and snow, Tom took a different view of the whole thing. Tired and cold, he made the decision that money wasn't

everything, turned his car around and went back to the legitimate theatre group and its two pounds a week. That was the start of the Conway dramatic career which eventually led him to motion picture stardom in Hollywood and his starring radio portrayal on ABC's "Adventures of Sherlock Holmes".

Preceding his American microphone debut, Conway garnered radio experience in England with his work on the BBC. We asked him if it weren't more difficult to get into radio over there than here. His answer was, "Oh, yes—over there, you see, it's not a question of what you've done, but of what you are. My brother, George," he continued, "tells this story which is quite typical. He was applying for a position with the Imperial Chemical Firm. Upon arriving for the personal interview, he discovered that the executive whom he was to see was a General something-or-other—a General, no less, can you imagine. George entered the man's office and found it set up like that of a Mussolini—you know, long imposing corridor leading to the giant mahogany desk and the glaring, immobile executive. Well, my brother earnestly stated his qualifications and his eagerness to fill a position with the firm, while the executive remained wholly unresponsive. George nevertheless managed to maintain his enthusiasm through his discourse, at the end of which the executive turned to him with no change of expression on his face and questioned impatiently, "But the thing is, old chap, do you play golf?"

British Tom (who came to the West Coast via the Panama Canal and still has an unfulfilled yen to see

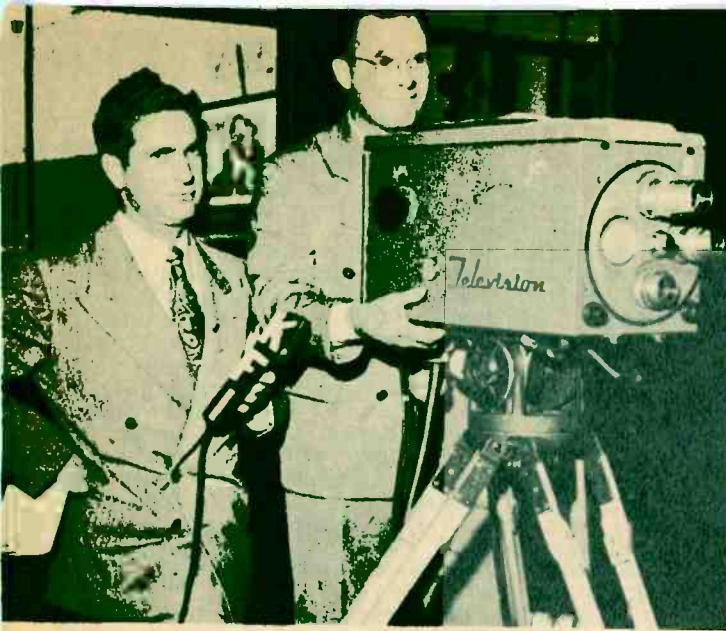

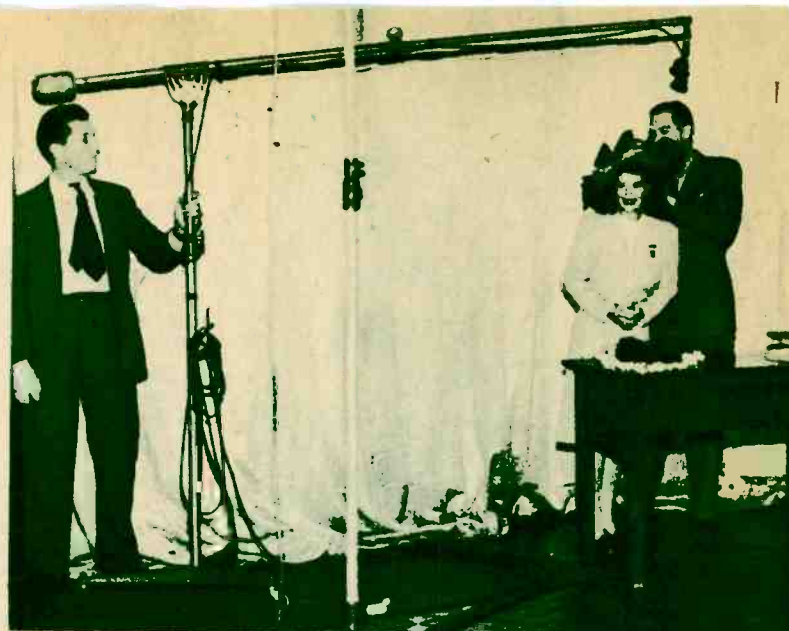

SINCE T-Day when television was officially launched on the Southern California scene, interest in this newest medium of entertainment and information has been rapidly snowballing.

March 10 marked the beginning of the television campaign and since that date over 1800 sets have been sold in this region, a reception of the medium that far exceeds previous expectations, according to Paul E. Bryant, in charge of distribution for RCA-Victor locally. Interest on the part of the public has been greatly aroused by viewing the sets in action in music stores, taverns and res-

taurants. In fact, a local music store reports the case of a man who came in to buy a package of phonograph needles and who got so interested in watching a baseball game that he wound up with a television set.

Baseball games, the Clyde Beatty circus, the harness racing at Hollywood Park, the rodeo and the prize fights are only a few of the special events which have been telecast recently with great success.

According to Ron Oxford, in charge of television for KFI and a pioneer in development of television techniques, the greatest present need is for more advertisers—big companies to put on big shows. Better programming and better competition will lead to greater coverage and a more advanced level of entertainment for the industry. Right now the emphasis is on sporting events because they are a reasonable way to telecast a big show.

"Firsts" Listed

Pioneer station, Don Lee's W6XAO, is located on the highest mountain accessible by road in the Hollywood-land range. Director of Television Harry R. Lubcke has worked with the station since 1930 and is known as an authority on electronics and an inventor of many important patents. Among many television "firsts", to this station goes the credit for first televising a disaster, the Long Beach earthquake on March 10, 1933; first remote pickup west of New York, the Pasadena Tournament of Roses Parade on January 1, 1940. KTSL will be the call letters replacing the experimental call letters of W6XAC.

Paramount's KTLA (formerly W6XYZ) is the first commercial station in operation in this area and it has been on the air for the past six years. Many other television licenses

have been granted locally, among them NBC, ABC, KFI, the New York Post and the Los Angeles Times.

Color television is expected to become a reality within the next ten years and co-axial cables between Los Angeles and New York and Los Angeles and San Francisco will inaugurate nationwide video.

The prediction that Hollywood is destined to be the television center of the nation is well grounded. Concentration of stations in this area is a natural outgrowth of the radio and picture industries and their facilities, a market interested in showmanship and a population ready to accept advancements and new developments.

Investigator", with the world for his beat. And being radio listeners of any regularity, you can't mistake his cultured tones as belonging to anyone other than Herbert Marshall.

Since this action-packed dramatic show made its debut in 1943, when "The Man Called X" was devoting his efforts to a wartime series of balking subversive agents working against the United States, "Bart", as Mr. Marshall is known to his friends, has delighted in this radio portrayal. And now Ken Thurston is back again as a peace-time operator, on call for private as well as government assignments. He continues to travel the globe, tracking down evil-doers

Mr. Marshall had done nothing more than accord a friendly, normal greeting at that big green door with its doorknob set smack in the center, and usher us into his attractive place. Yet his is such a manner as to leave one feeling as though "Bart" had fallen with glad cries on his visitor as the very person in all the world he wanted to see most.

There was small talk while Marshall provided refreshments and everyone wandered about admiring his collection of original George Price cartoons, or poked among the titles of his excellent library.

When radio became a topic and talk turned to "The Man Called X", both Jack Johnstone and Mr. Marshall started violently disclaiming full responsibility for the show's excellence.

"I'm very fond of the part of 'Ken Thurston', and sometimes I try to get my hand in when we polish the show up the night before it's on the air. But usually I just muddle through doing my best... Jack's the boy who ties this show together."

"Nonsense. Bart has contributed a whale of a lot more than he will admit. He's added greatly to the character of the show by working with me on its development."

Discuss "Pegon"

Both are right, of course. A good show with a poor actor is of as little worth as a poor show that's wasted on a good lead. During their amiable squabbling, as we swished the fresh green mint leaves and ice in the bottom of our glass of tea, wishing for more, "Pegon Zell-schmidt" came up for discussion. It seems that "Pegon" is one of their favorite characters, and when Mr. Marshall turned to elaborate on the characterization, he unconsciously adopted the role. He was looking extremely crafty.

"'Pegon', you know, is an unsavory, pretty unscrupulous character who keeps cropping up in 'Ken Thurston's' path. He seems to have a unique affinity for knowing where I, as 'Ken', am headed, and his in-

Jack Paar

Well, here he is — Jack Paar, the new young comic that everybody has been asking for. At least, every time we read a column about the state of radio, it asks rhetorically where the new talent is, and Jack looks like a good answer . . . good enough at least to deserve a fair chance. Or are you sorry Crosby, Benny and Allen got a fair chance?

Placed in the very difficult spot of following Jack Benny for the summer and pleasing Benny's discriminating audience was a little like saying, "Go on—be funny!" But if you've heard Jack's first few shows you'll agree that in his own sweet way he has more than held his own in the nerve-racking contest.

Jack's comedy is based on his own good humor, ingratiating manner and innocent impudence. He writes much of his own material, and in an era of rough-house comics, acid-tongued characters and wise-crack artists, Jack garners just as many laughs with sweetness and light. Of course, behind the sweetness and light lurks the barbed arrow of satire which gives Jack's show it appeal to the intelligence.

The show hews to no cut-and-dried format and the cast changes from week to week. Elvia Allman and Lionel Stander have both turned in top-notch comedy characterizations in recent weeks. Elvia as an unhappy "Lucky Bride" radio program winner and Lionel as a militant chief usher in a broadcasting studio.

The slick new music of the Page Cavanaugh trio fits in with the youthful high spirits of the show, backed up by Jerry Fielding and his orchestra. Hy Averback, the announcer, makes his personality important, and writers Larry Marks, Larry Gelbert, Artie Stander and Semon Jacobs assist Paar in building the laugh lines.

After only two hearings, we'd say that Paar is okay. We've been hearing about and waiting for this new talent for a long time—now that one of its representatives has arrived we feel the least we can do is give him a hearty "welcome — hope you stick around."

"Silver Theater"

All that glitters may not be gold — but it might be "Silver Theater" which has returned to KNX at 2:00 p.m. Sundays with a glittering new idea for radio.

Conrad Nagel still emcees the star-studded dramas — but this time it's

the radio stars who are allowed to shine. With all due respect to the real names of these thespians, it's their radio show identifications that make news. Billed thusly: "Casey,

Crime Photographer", "Mr. District Attorney" and "Cynthia Swanson" of the "Romance of Helen Trent" in "Guardian Angel", Staats Cotsworth, Jay Jostyn and Mary Jane Higby, on the first program of the series, were able to identify themselves to the listeners with their widely known roles and also show what they could do with a very different type of casting. The following week "Stella Dallas" and "Ma Perkins" teamed as two wacky old ladies in a whimsical comedy.

We're looking forward to hearing the "Lora Lawtons" of the air in comedy roles, the "Hop Harrigans" as men-about-town and the "Big Sisters" as sultry sirens. The interesting twist given to the usual dramatizations by "Silver Theater" proves to us that there's still many a good little idea available to spark the old formulas (granting that nobody wants to change them completely) if the idea men just bother to think them up.

"The Guiding Light"

With searchlight-strength, "The Guiding Light" is once more back, shining on your CBS dial, Monday through Friday, at 9:45 a.m., due to tremendous listener request.

We tuned in to find gentle psychology and tangible prayer as abundantly given as ever. Although the "Light" is technically labelled "soap opera", it continues to throw its beam far beyond such inhibiting limitations, and as powerfully as any larger series of its kind.

Actor Hugh Studebaker plays his role of "Guiding" Dr. Charles Matthews with measured quietude. Likewise impressive are enactments of the human failures who arrive requesting peace in the solitude of his study. A good seven minutes of each program is told in monologue—a "thesping" assignment calling for more than ordinarily intuitive reading.

Drama is assembled in a practical number of essential pieces. You won't be frustratedly trying to put together an endless and complicated jig-saw. You'll find how superior it's possible for a five-a-week serial to be, even if you follow "The Guiding Light" only the shortest listening distance.

"Abbott Mysteries"

If you don't mind blood on the carpet, the corpse in the closet and poison in the Daiquiris at 2:30 of a Sunday afternoon, the "Abbott Mysteries" are back for the summer on KHJ for excitement.

The locale of the "Abbott" nail-biters is San Francisco, and how they manage never to jostle the efforts of San Franciscans "Sam Spade," "Pat

Their cases are neat but not gaudy and whatever mayhem may disturb them during the plot is dismissed in time for them to tag each drama with an insinuating "at home with the Abbotts" scene, also a la "Thin Man."

New York radio actors Charles Webster and Julie Stevens are pleasant as the "Abbotts" and their voices project the sex appeal necessary to this type of sleuthing. If you've room for another mystery drama on your list, add the "Abbotts."

in the country. The clues are assembled and capsuled by Wallace H. Burdette, into well-played and interesting dramatizations. Counselor and adviser on the air is James Marshall, and his kindly-judge manner further prevents the show from becoming a cut-and-dried factual affair.

If you should find yourself hearing about some forgotten limb of your family tree who departed in a beautifully solvent state; or if you should pick up a few clues that lead you to believe someone you may know is in line for one of the large or small fortunes, follow the directions given on the program and get in touch with the "Board." The first person sending information leading to the discovery of a missing heir receives seventy-five dollars. Aided by the long questionnaire the possible heirs are sent to be filled out and returned, the creators are experts at smelling out frauds. Incidentally, the program refuses any sort of compensation for its efforts from the happy beneficiaries it may discover.

Land of the Free

"Land of the Free" is the title of KHJ's 9:45 p.m. Wednesday, and 4:00 p.m. Sunday program, adopting a worthy premise and weaving true success stories of various American notables around it. The show doesn't attempt to ram down listeners' throats any namby-pamby axioms about working hard, early and late, and winding up rich and honored. The premise adopted is that "one of the secrets of the world's greatest national success is 'freedom'."

The stories, such as the following one of Helen Traubel, just go entertainingly ahead and demonstrate that, possessed of enough talent and determination, anyone can make his or her mark. The statuesque Wagnerian soprano, and our own American contribution to the greatest in opera, was the daughter of Otto Traubel, of St. Louis, Missouri. Otto was the owner of a very ordinary drugstore, and further, never one to coerce Helen into a bout with the scales if the natural, healthy daughter preferred tagging father to the baseball games.

Helen went her way, made her choices (one choice being not to accept her first Metropolitan Opera offer, at the age of twenty-three), and lived a normal life of ups and downs. One of the downs occurred when the same Met she had once decided against turned the tables and caused her to wait until 1939, when her appearance at Carnegie Hall with the New York Philharmonic brought the opera company running. Her stellar roles since have written operatic history.

Shows are prepared under the direction of, and narrated by, Dr. George Benson, Chairman of the Department of Education at Harding College, in Arkansas, and come to KHJ, thence to us, by means of transcription. Excellent narration, good acting and an interesting program.

"Adventure Parade"

A century or so ago (when there were no comic books), the juvenile

contingent found its adventure in the great and mighty action classics . . . remember "Moby Dick," "Last of the Mohicans," "Kidnapped," "Don Quixote"?

And at last, with a wise perusal of untapped story resources, Mutual network has built a grand new radio offering of the same, called it "Adventure Parade" and placed it at a special children's listening hour, 3:45 p.m.

The uncluttered format includes a single story-reader, master dramatist John Drake. Taking a chapter at a time, he stays continually at a climax of sustained and compelling suspense. "Swiss Family Robinson" is currently in progress, with all those thrilling days at "Falconhurst," and the fascinating island explorations of Jack, Ernest, Fritz and their father, magnificently come alive again.

Drakes makes all of the voice changes himself, and of course with such fast manipulation a few of them sound off-kilter. But he so hurtles you along through the story that you can't possibly pause for a recount. Melodramatic organ backgrounds further accelerate the action . . . until every word sounds important to the gathering, galloping intensity.

Such handsomely superior excitement is as vital to your young folks as dreams of knights in armor. John Dryden said it, we think . . . "What the child admired, the youth endeavored . . . and the man acquired!"

study in music, but unfortunately a train wreck and six months in a hospital finished that. But it proved a turning point, for during my convalescence in that hospital I turned to arranging."

Paul was cheerful, even in discussing his ill-fortune, and well he might be, for his first arrangement was sold to Joe Haymes, popular band leader. Rudy Vallee heard Mr. Haymes' music, found out who had done the arrangement, and quickly acquired Mr. Weston for his own. From Vallee, Paul went over to Phil Harris, who oddly enough had part of the old Haymes band by that time, so Weston started through a long period of arranging for such ace orchestra leaders as Tommy Dorsey and Bob Crosby's old band.

The shove up into the blue chip class came when Paul began handling Dinah Shore's record dates, not only as arranger but also as conductor. Writing for "Fibber McGee and Molly", "Duffy's Tavern" and Johnny Mercer added to his fame and skill, and one bright day, in October, 1943, he found himself musical director of Capitol Record Company, in complete charge of all music recorded by the waxworks. It was here Paul Weston and Jo Stafford started combining their highly successful efforts, and with the advent of a "Chesterfield Supper Club" here on the Coast last December, Maestro Weston was the natural selection as co-host for Songstress Stafford.

When Paul isn't talking, he appears to be a mild-mannered young man with blue eyes and brown hair. Nice looking young man, you'd think. But the minute he starts to converse, the enthusiasm that is the keynote of his personality is brightly evident. No wonder he's never needed a press agent. Too, Paul funnels his exuberance along productive channels, and the results are what have shoved him into the upper brackets. And how he enjoys the "Supper Club"! Hearing his jovial comments on the group of fun-makers he works with, we could see why all his co-workers term him a "wonderful guy, that Weston." We mentioned to him that we had spied familiar faces in the band, and he laughed.

"Yes, it's like old home week seeing so many of the boys I arranged for in the big bands. Lot of fine musicians in this Supper Club bunch. And we have a wonderful time here with the Club. If anything goes wrong . . . as it many times can on any show, we play it to the hilt. This show is no high-powered production that leads to a war of nerves. We want everyone else to have a good time, because we certainly have fun. And our guests love it. We don't let them idle by, just wait-

ing for their bit to say . . . everybody who comes to that party has to get into the act."

Bachelor Weston's ideas of relaxation aren't strict. He can relax over a book, or he can get away from work by listening to a group of fellow musicians. Louis Armstrong is a favorite of the young maestro, and his own extensive record library contains many an old platter of Armstrong and his contemporaries.

"Of course, listening to records at home has one disadvantage. I can hear a lot of music otherwise gone forever, but I can't order a plate of fried onions."

A dawning idea showed on Paul's face, and he rose to his feet with a smile. "Say, speaking of a plate of fried onions. . . ."

Nothing Spike does surprises us any more, but be ready for laughs and a Super Suds commercial when his "Barefooted Pennsylvanians" do a Waring on "Love in Bloom" and hit the chimes for three notes. (RCA-Victor 20-2245.)

Two tunes from "Brigadoon" you'll have to hear quite often to appreciate are "There but for You Go I" and "It's Almost Like Falling in Love" . . . on which Sinatra does a very commendable job for a pleasing two notes. (Columbia 37382.)

You'll like Mooney more every time you hear him, especially the novelty-treated "You Should Have Told Me" and the slower-tempoed "As Long As I'm Dreaming" . . . in anybody's language (even Mansfield's) it's a three-noter. (MGM 10034.)

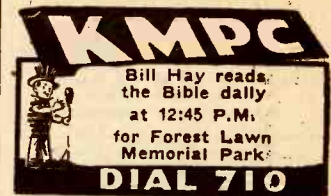

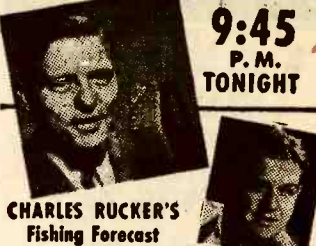

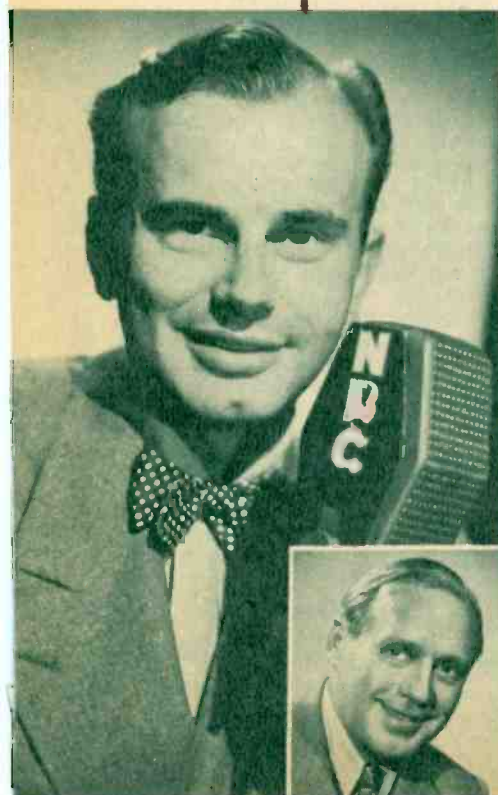

HERE IS a school of thought among radio producers that holds that if the public sees a picture of a soap opera favorite, it will lose interest in the character created on the air series. The casts of a few of the most popular daytime serials are shrouded in mystery for this reason. We think the whole idea smacks of mysticism and that people become more interested in a performer for whom they can establish a personal identification.

Here are a few personal cast members from the "Young Widder Brown" series, now in its eleventh year on the air:

Ned Wever, who plays "Anthony Loring", is heard in many radio dramatic casts. He's "Peter Carver" in "Lora Lawton" and "Bulldog Drummond", among many other characterizations. Romantic-voiced Ned is a native New Yorker who prepared for a career in show business starting with preparatory school days. He continued his interest at Yale University, where he was active in dra-

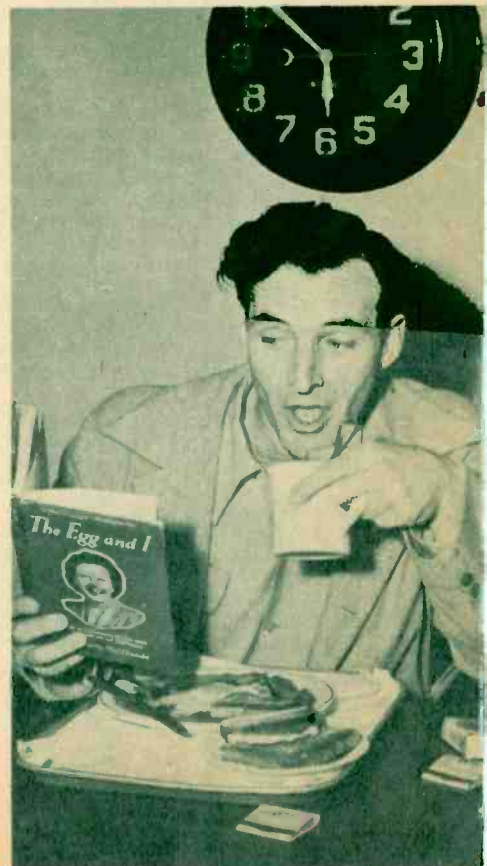

When a friend scoffed at her dramatic ambitions, she applied for an audition at a small station and, to her own amazement, was hired on the spot. After appearing in summer stock and on local stations, she was chosen to appear on a network show. In 1935 and '36, she appeared regularly on "Show Boat", "Shell Chateau" and "Radio Guild". Since 1937 she has been playing the title role in "Young Widder Brown".

"Janey Brown" in "Young Widder Brown" and "Gail Carver" in "Lora Lawton" are the same person — blonde, blue-eyed Marilyn Erskine. Marilyn made her air debut at five and within the year was a regular cast member on a sponsored program.

At six the precocious Marilyn was asked to audition for the directors of a children's radio program in New York and was well launched on a career before she began school. At eleven she made Broadway with a role in "Excursion" and in the next seven years appeared in many stage hits, including "Our Town".

Despite a lifelong acting career,

Marilyn has managed to study languages and music and has written several stories and poems. Her hobby is collections—preferably foreign dolls and miniature animals.

Gray-haired, green-eyed Bess McCammon plays "Olivia McEvoy" in the "Young Widder Brown" series. The death of her husband at the time her sons Tom and Bill were seventeen and ten turned her abilities toward radio drama in order to earn a living for the family.

A graduate of the Schuster-Martin School of Drama, she returned to the school as a faculty member and director of the children's theater at her husband's death.

Deciding that she could handle two jobs as well as one, she applied for a position on the dramatic staff of station WLW. She remained there for six years. She has been prominent in Chicago and New York radio since 1940.

tentions of abetting depend on a price." Here Mr. Marshall adopted an oily expression and made the old familiar gesture of hand out, rubbing money-greedy fingers together. You could just see "Pegon's" cunning.

"Sometimes he blocks my efforts as 'Mr. X'; other times, always for that price, of course, he's of inestimable value."

Jack interrupted him, "'Pegon' is done by Leon Belasco."

Marshall dropped his imitation for a bit of real admiration. "Oh, yes, Leon. He's a wonderful actor. He also does that series of vague sort of cousins to 'Pegon', and equally unattractive men, that harry 'Mr. X' on the show. And Jack, here, has stepped in for a part or two himself, haven't you, Jack?"

(Mr. Johnstone started a legitimate acting career when he was five years old, and is one of the few directors in radio who is an AFRA member. True, he has done bits on this show and others he handles, but he squirmed and muttered something about. . . "just for fun", under Marshall's teasing tone.)

But there was as much generous recognition as there was fun in Mr. Marshall's mention of Johnstone's help. It was Jack who also directed Herbert Marshall when "Bart" was hosting on "Hollywood Star Time", and the two men have become firm friends since they met a few years ago. It's the sort of friendship that permits an exchange of badinage and pokes. And Mr. Marshall is possessed of a dry wit and an intriguing choice of words that lend humor to his simplest conversation. We heard him throw away more good comedy in a few minutes than we'd

been treated to in a month of Sundays.

Is Raconteur

He's just finished "Ivy", the new Sam Goldwyn production, and some of his anecdotes concerning the shooting of the picture were side-splitting.

Remember Herbert Marshall "way back when" with Greta Garbo in "The Painted Veil"? Or "The Dark Angel" with Merle Oberon? And now the more recent notable performances in "Duel in the Sun" and "The Razor's Edge". Strangely enough, with all these years of success and experience, this talented thespian still admits to a pre-broadcast nervousness a rank beginner would experience.

"I guess it's because I like radio so very much, you know. But I think apprehension is a very healthy thing. The only time I wasn't nervous before a show, I fluffed twice, loudly and clearly immediately upon approaching the mike. So I rather welcome those butterflies that precede a broadcast. I'd be perfectly content to do nothing but radio the rest of my life."

Herbert Marshall shows so well what a trained, interested actor can do with a characterization he adopts. He can make it adopt him. When you hear "Mr. X" in his dealings with bands of swindlers, or pitting his wits against crooks from all walks of life, isn't it easier to imagine this "Ken Thurston" as Herbert Marshall himself than any other possible figment of your imagination?

Anyway, who'd want to supplant Mr. Marshall with some old "make-believe"?
