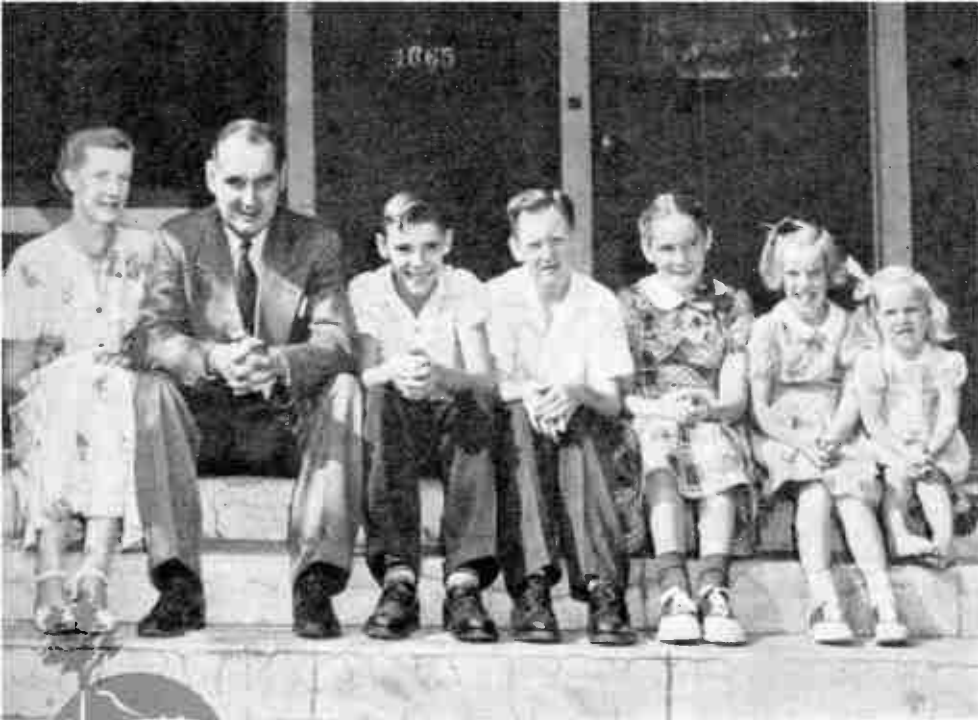
WHY DO they always give you a dinner on your tenth anniversary?" Bob Hope once asked rhetorically. "It's the first year you need the food." Now starting his eleventh year on NBC and his first with a new cast and format, Hope can look back on ten equally successful seasons. "When I had my tenth anniversary, NBC V. P. Sid Strotz took me up to Melody Lane and bought me the blue-plate special. Halfway through lunch he leaned over and said, 'Happy tenth!'" claims Bob.

DURING THE WAR, the NBC comedian gained his greatest fame as an overseas entertainer. Here Hope relaxes with Jerry Colonna and Tony Romano in a not-too-comfortable spot.

1. Where does the "Commander" come from?

During World War I, I was a commander in the Royal Navy and later in the Royal Air Force, when it came into being. Later, when I left the service (where I had done quite a bit of writing) I found that my stuff was accepted if I used the "Commander" by which I had been known for so many years. So the title stuck.

2. Have you actually traveled to every corner of the world? If not, which place has been omitted?


I have been to every country except Nepal, in North India, between India and Tibet.

3. Briefly describe your childhood.

I was born in Somerset, England, in a thing called a castle with a moat, a drawbridge, battlemented walls and everything you'd think a kid would like. But it had one big drawback: it had forty-two bedrooms and only one bathroom. I was the youngest of nine children. When I was ten, the wanderlust got me and I stowed away in a sailing ship. I had circled the globe by the time I was twelve. The officers of the ship helped me with my education and later, when I returned home, I went to naval college, and so, into the navy.

4: Briefly sum up your World War I experiences.

I was under fire the first time on August 4, 1914, in Antwerp when the Germans poured into Belgium. From that time on, I served variously in

the North Sea, Mediterranean and Turkey, both in the Navy and Air Service. I was wounded — I carry seven wounds from four encounters.

5. What motivated your coming to America?

Having spent my time wandering around the world and seeing life in other countries and being in a position to compare life in other places to that in America, I realized that here was the most ideal country, with the most opportunities. I felt that California was the best part of America. So I left England in 1929, going first to San Francisco, then to Oakland, and finally to Pasadena in 1942.

6. How long have you been a U. S. citizen?

Since October 9, 1942.

7. Describe your most thrilling travel experience.

That's very difficult to do, because to me traveling is a thrilling and wonderful experience. So many people try to compare so many things, even in their own state and country, but each wonder has its own charm, and for that reason it cannot be compared. For example, how could you compare Yosemite with Grand Canyon or Grand Canyon with Carlsbad Caverns and so on? But if you want to pin me down, I guess the most thrilling experience was the first time I saw Ankor Vat in French Indo-China, because here, in the very heart of the jungle, inhabited only by wild animals and birds, was the enormous temple used by a long-forgotten race and then mysteriously deserted. It seemed impossible that the natives living close by had no knowledge of the temple or its prehistoric builders. Of course, now

the area has been entirely opened to visitors, and thereby, to me, has lost much of its charm.

8. Describe the most scenic place you've visited.

I've really answered this in the previous question. You cannot compare the scenery of one place with that of another. However, to me, it is hard to find anything more wonderful than the rows of sky-sweeping redwoods, the majestic splendor of Yosemite or the indescribable color of Bryce National Park.

9. How did you happen to go into the travel business?

It was automatic. People kept asking my advice on how and where to go.

10. What place would you most like to revisit?

I think New Zealand, provided I was sure I was coming back to our own West.

up what otherwise could have been a delightful show. Mary Martin, John Conte, Vicki Cummings and Peter Lawford seemed to get no response on either comedy or song.

. . . The overweening ego of those commentators who remind their audiences archly, "Remember! You heard it here first." Particularly tiresome when it's only movie gossip anyway.

. . . The continual harping on the part of Mona Freeman, being interviewed by Louella Parsons recently, on how hard she had to scrape to get along. Three references to this sort of thing on the part of a young, beautiful girl, under contract to a major studio for three years, at present getting featured and sometimes star billing, married to a solvent young businessman, is beyond our toleration. A quick resume of the facts of life would demonstrate that a good part of our population lacks any fragment of the Freeman income—yet manages to get along quite happily.

"Box 13"

The radio logs list 10:00 p.m. Sunday as "Alan Ladd." The show is his famous "Box 13," still going strong . . . primarily, we suppose, because of Alan's popularity on the screen. Whatever his air abilities, they are clouded by scripts that should be much better, and by acting cast efforts that leave us cold and confused.

One of the roles we liked least was delivered in Chinese and Mexican, by a character named "Nick" (long a traditional Greek tag) who owned a restaurant (also traditionally Greek). Balance of the cast seemed to lack ability to lend even the minimum of meaning to its lines, although the lines themselves may be at fault.

We think the show has star material in Ladd, and should couple him with star-caliber scripts and understandable plots. As it is, the last time we tried to listen, "Box 13" gave us such a headache we snapped it off.

CLASSIC ALBUM OF THE WEEK honors again go to English Decca for the twelve-inch four-side condensation of Tchaikovsky's Ballet Suite, "Swan Lake," by Sidney Beer and the National Symphony Orchestra. . . . Containing only those items which are both the most important and the most popular in the ballet, coupled with flawless interpretation and excellent recording technique, "Swan Lake" is a "must" for connoisseurs of fine music and a top Chord-in-G album. . . . **POP ALBUM OF THE WEEK:** For six sides of nostalgic reminiscing, don't miss Gene Kelly's impressions of the song-and-dance men, past and present—Eddie Leonard, George M. Cohan, Bill Robinson, George Primrose, Pat Rooney and Fred Astaire. . . . This item will again put you in the front row center as you hear the old familiar orchestra intros and tags. . . . The vocals are impressions, not impersonations, since Kelly talks best with his feet—but his dance interludes compare with the best straw-hat-and-cane men who ever trod the boards. . . . If you remember vaudeville, you'll more than enjoy Gene Kelly in this Chord-in-G-er on MGM.

PEGGY LEE, one of our favorite people, gets the nod for the top girl-vocal this week with a pair of very fine Capitol etchings, "Love, Your Spell Is Everywhere," and "So Dear to My Heart," with the usual tasteful backing of Dave Barbour's combo. . . . Both tunes are on the slower side, with Peggy at her whispery best for an easy three-notes. . . . **DICK HAYMES** and Gordon Jenkins Orchestra were the right combination to cinch the male-vocal department with "By the Way" and "Whisper a Word of Love." . . . While the latter is based on "Meditation" from "Thais," and the range of the tune seemed quite low for Haymes in spots, the platter is still an easy Decca two-noter. . . . **RE-ISSUES** are still the order of the day, with RCA-Victor leading the parade with its many big name bands. . . . For a pair of triple-noters this week, don't miss Artie Shaw's "It Had to Be You" and "If I Had You," both by Artie's big band—and "Dr. Livingstone, I Presume" (with its dash of Scotch) and "When the Quail Come Back to San Quentin" by Artie's Gramercy Five (Shaw, Butterfield, Guarneri, Hendrickson, DeNaut and Fatool) . . . **KING COLE TRIO**, tops in the small combos, has a very tricky novelty called "Kee-mo, Ky-mo," originally issued as a Capitol kidisc—but requested more by the big ones than the little ones. . . . Instrumental "Rex Rhumba" on the reverse unfortunately held "Kee-Mo" down to two notes. . . . (P.S. . . . Watch for Sinatra's newie about moonlight and autumn. A.M.)

TELEVISION TIPS

By JANE PELGRAM

You're going to see the precious Toni twins on television soon! Yep, the double hair-do's (and we've never been able to pick the Toni twin!) will hit video nationally via one-minute film spots now in the scripting stage, before the first of the year.

The cigarette companies have done very well with their bounding packages or marshalled forces of thin white sticks. Steering clear of the human elements is smart. Can you think of anything more upsetting than the sight of a man making with the Raleigh 903 "W-H-O-O-s-s-h-h-h!"

Yet for all the funny business about what could happen if TV ads became like magazine and some air ads, and despite the present spotty coverage, the sourest cynic must admit that the impact of the televised ads is tremendous. We picked up some apropos statistics from "Western Selling":

Eastern Columbia spent seventy-five dollars on a small video advertisement of nine-dollar-and-fifty-cent tablecloths. As a result of this ad alone, forty-two of the cloths were sold, half the orders being placed by telephone the same evening. The firm offered silverware sets later at \$11.95. The first telecast brought in more than \$800, topped on a second airing by orders for 150 sets.

When KTLA offered a recipe book, the first announcement brought 700 requests, the second more than a thousand. No wonder the annual (39th) meeting of the National Association of Advertisers, held in New York this month, is devoting most of the meeting to the question . . . "How best can television be used by national advertisers?"

It looks as though the American Tobacco Company will become the first sponsor of a series of telefilms. The films, dramatizing well-known short stories, will use featured screen players, and are to make their debut the end of this year on NBC-TV . . . in the East. Undoubtedly anything that's being seen in the East now will be seen out here after the first of the year, long a promised date for practically all the nets to get into the swim. Kinescope filming of Eastern fare seems the only possible answer to early competitive programming on this coast.

It seems that stratovision could now link the coasts, including the Midwest. Westinghouse research engineer Dr. Charles E. Noble told the Institute of Radio Engineers, which recently concluded in Hollywood, that eight Superfortresses could give the U. S. a transcontinental TV and FM network. A fleet of thirty-three of the giant planes, hovering some six miles above ground, could bring video into every home in the United States.

Maintaining airplanes, no matter how large, would seem simpler and cheaper than the building of booster stations or completing that famous

cable that generates so much conversation (and that seems all!). The average ground video transmitter has a range of fifty miles. Southern California's mountainous area makes beaming to a 100-mile radius possible. The use of "stratovision" has increased the beaming radius to 500 miles, with quality approaching that of ground pictures. Westinghouse has already applied to the FCC for a license covering commercial operation of airborne tele.

Television recently expedited education through making possible the largest clinic in the history of surgery in the East. More than 4,000 physicians and surgeons attending the State Medical Society in Philadelphia last week witnessed a series of operations which ordinarily only a small group would have been privileged to watch

The operations were performed in a building 500 yards distant from the packed auditorium, and constituted a first major demonstration of the new technique in surgical instruction. Wouldn't that sort of thing be a fine idea in our grade schools? The kids wouldn't take it as "study" at all. . . . History could be dressed up to plant dates and incidents indelibly on tiny minds. Manners, grammar and the old business of those twelve tired apples being divided among three people could all be made a joy to learn. The Board of Education could start with just one hour each day from one channel, and by following the adage that a single picture is worth a thousand words, cut down on the labors of many a harried instructor.

Radio Razzle-Dazzle

The Los Angeles Rams Have Tom Hanlon and Bob Kelley as Team-Mates in Broadcasting The Thrills of the Pro Football Seasons

WHEN you hear your favorite football announcer spout authoritatively while broadcasting a hot grid contest, do you fondly imagine that he is picking facts and figures right out of his hat—or that, perchance, he has a little black book to which he refers constantly?

If you do, you are s-o-o-o wrong.

All the sidelight information your sportscaster gives, apart from actual reporting of the plays, comes from his noggin, and it's information that he has collected from personal association with the players over a long period of time.

Take Bob Kelley and Tom Hanlon, for example. Bob handles the straight reporting and Tom the color and analysis of all home and out-of-town games of the Los Angeles Rams over KMPC for Rexall Drugs.

Away back in August, they were hobnobbing around with head coach Clark Shaughnessy, stars Bob Waterfield, Jim Hardy, Kenny Washington and so forth.

They were getting acquainted with rookies like quarterback Tom Keane of West Virginia, said to be the world's best forward passer, and Tom Scott, promising young quarterback from Texas A. & M., Gilgore and Kansas.

Not a day has passed that they haven't been in touch with Clark,

the players themselves or Rams publicist Tex Schramm and Hank Kohnsky and Carl Blume of Smith, Bull and McCreery, Inc., who handle radio publicity for the team.

Thus, they keep up on all the news—the condition of the players, the possibilities of new razzle-dazzle formations, as well as personal anecdotes that can be used during lulls in the game.

Kelley and Hanlon also keep up with the other teams of the league in like manner, so when you hear them on the air you know that they know whereof they speak. It requires a tremendous amount of preparation to do a smooth broadcast.

It is small wonder that Bob Kelley became a sportscaster. He was born and raised practically under the golden dome of Notre Dame University, alma mater of some of the greatest football teams in history.

A speedy quarterback on his high-school team, he abandoned scholastics and active athletics in his junior year to become a sportscaster on WTRC in Elkhart, Indiana.

One of the officials of the Cleveland Rams heard Kelley give an ac-

count of a Notre Dame game in 1937 and offered him a permanent job with the team. He has been broadcasting the Rams' games ever since, with the exception of two years he spent in the U. S. Navy during 1944 and '45.

In 1942 he was secretary of the team, and for two years he was in charge of scouting. He is credited with drafting a young fellow who wasn't holding any particular promise at the time. His name is Bob Waterfield, now destined for pro football's permanent Hall of Fame.

Kelley moved to Los Angeles when the team came out here to become the Los Angeles Rams. He flies an average of 75,000 miles a year to broadcast out-of-town games, and is making his motion-picture debut in Columbia's "Triple Threat," in which he plays a football announcer.

Tom Hanlon, an all-Missouri and all-West tackle in high school at Springfield, Missouri, has been a football enthusiast since then—and local grid fans declare him to be the greatest color-and-analysis man in the business.

Kelley and Hanlon work together as smoothly as oil.

"Bob is a swell guy to work with," Hanlon says. "He doesn't hog the microphone, like some play-by-play experts do."

For his part, Kelley likes to give his listeners an accurate word picture of what is happening on the gridiron when the action is hottest.

One advantage to his long association with the Rams is that Kelley has picked up a priceless collection of anecdotes about the players, which spice his program during time-out periods.

Like the one about Freddie Nau-metz of Boston College. It was the big game of the year and the boys had a big celebration planned for that night. Holy Cross, their opponent, looked like a pushover. But by a quaking upset, Holy Cross won. The Boston College boys canceled their celebration, which was to have been held in a Boston night club.

That night the club burned down—the disastrous Cocoanut Grove fire that claimed hundreds of lives.

"If Boston College had beaten Holy Cross that afternoon, Freddie would be only a tombstone today," Kelley sums it up.

Joe Walters



Early to Bed and Early to Rise Is the Description of CBS Staff Announcer Joe Walters' Air Life

AS THE SUN comes up over Columbia Square in Hollywood, the early-morning workers are busy making entertainment for the a.m. risers at home. Mikeman Joe Walters is one of the group that includes Burritt Wheeler, Jack McCoy, Nelson Pringle, Ben Brady and several engineers—all extremely early risers.

As emcee of "Morning Roundup," staff announcer Walters must be on deck at the station at 5:30 a.m. "I get up at 4:45 at the latest," he says rather wistfully. His radio day ends at 1:30 p.m. This was stretched to 2:30 p.m. when he announced "Your Stand-in" before its switch from afternoon to morning.

Joe admits that sometimes during the crack-of-dawn broadcasts he finds himself nodding. The closing announcement of the show ahead of him wakes him up as the fire bell does a fireman. Coffee at Britting-

ham's brings him around during the next break.

The announcer has been on the morning shift for three years, and wouldn't have it any other way. He claims it gives him a social life that evening and night-time mikemen must forego.

Went Western

Joe's main early-morning task, "Morning Roundup" on KNX, is a program of recorded western music—a field about which he knew nothing until he took over the show. He learned fast. "I told the listeners that I didn't know anything about this type of music," he related. "I said, 'You're the producers, write and tell me what you want me to do!'" This frank appeal touched off what Walters calls "a ton of mail." Letters came from all over the West—as far away as Wyoming and Idaho.

Joe is unusual in the field of radio announcers in that he didn't

start out to be anything else but. He claims that he first heard a radio back in 1924, and exclaimed, "Great stuff—that's for me!" Being about ten years old at the time, he may have phrased this a little differently, but that's what he meant. His first job was working in a dental lab in Oakland; he was fired because "I was so miserable that I made everyone else miserable too."

His first radio break happened when a group of friends used him on a show called "Children of Orpheus," a recorded classical music program on a San Francisco station. Ralph Edwards, now of "Truth or Consequences," was "Orpheus, God of Music," emcee of the program. Joe scripted and acted, Ralph narrated, worked the control board, did sound effects.

Fine Advice

Joe thinks he should go down in history as the guy who remonstrated with Edwards when Ralph decided to go to New York to crack big-time radio. Joe's deathless words on the subject were: "Why do you want to go to New York? Why, you're making one hundred and fifty dollars a month here!" He's very happy that Edwards did not take this astute advice.

Joe's fortunes improved from his sixty-dollar-a-month relief-announcing job and he graduated to CBS network chores in San Francisco by 1937. In 1941 he became program director of a San Diego station. A believer in hunches, he followed one in 1942 and came to Hollywood. A week and a half later he was on staff at CBS here.

In addition to shows already mentioned, Joe has been heard as announcer for Frank Sinatra, Dick Powell, Johnny Murray, Harry Flannery,

"Don't You Believe It," among others on CBS-KNX.

His main hobby is finding time to travel in his Interstate plane—a joint holding with two friends. On a recent flight to San Francisco, he lost his glasses over the side and had to be driven back to Hollywood.

Joe recalls as one of his most exciting moments in radio the occasion when guest star Tom Breneman set fire to the script he was reading. "And I didn't fluff," he says righteously. Walters also suffered a little unwelcome excitement recently when he stumbled while sleep-walking, fell and broke his collarbone. He was off the air for a week and a half, wore a heavy (and heavily autographed) cast for some time afterwards.

This staff announcer would like us to voice one of his favorite opinions on staff announcing. Consider the case of these boys, he pleads, as against that of the big-time star announcer. The star always does one type of thing — his speciality. He sounds excellent all the time. Top writers furnish his every word. On the other hand, the staff man may do a newscast, announce a sentimental organ program, do a time signal, present a girl singer, wind up with a straight commentary. "And you can't beat the CBS staff," he concludes proudly, "dependable, friendly, all good guys."

Highways" for thirteen years and during that time I've never missed a single program. If all the scripts of "Romance" and the other travel programs were bound, they'd reach from floor to ceiling in three columns.

12. How much travel information have you written and in what form?

I've had three books published and three more are ready for publication. Also more than 200 magazine stories and so many short articles that it would be impossible to estimate.

13. Can you recall your most interesting human-interest story encountered while traveling?

They went back to work to earn another stake and today they're living at Fort Carmack, have a wonderful baby son and together they lay and tend their trap lines and are making a real success as trappers.

14. Are you a family man? Wife? Children?

I have five children and one wife. The youngsters are George, thirteen; Bobby, eleven; Ann, nine; Cathleen, seven; and Helen Jean, three.

15. What are your favorite pastimes?
Travel. Work. Photography.

16. Favorite food and clothes?

Food, cracked crab; I like sports clothes and my favorite color is blue.

17. Pet dislike? Worst fault?

My pet dislike is people who can't see and enjoy the beauty in things around them and who go to visit the most scenic gems just to say they've been there. I can't forget the man and woman who drove into Bryce. She took one look at the Canyon, coldly checked it off her list, and said, "Well, that's Bryce, darling. Drive on." I think they spent all of eighteen minutes in the Park.

18. What's your greatest ambition?

To take my entire family by very leisurely trip around the world so that they too can enjoy the wonderful things that I have seen in my travels.

19. Your greatest disappointment?

The day I had to retire from the Navy, owing to an airplane crash.

20. What do you want to do when you retire?

Visit Nepal.

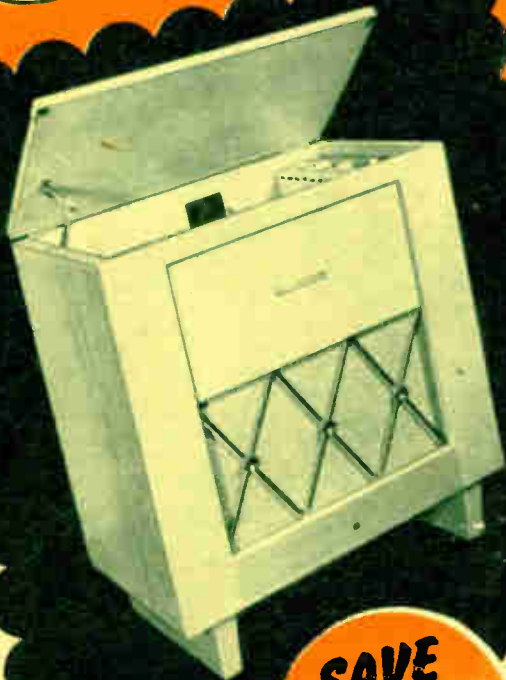
