One bouquet and one gripe from one television viewer: The bouquet first: Video seems to be a perfect medium for the ventriloquists, puppeteers, and other animated species. One of the best of these, in my opinion, is the Province Town Players, a puppet act on the Squeaky Mulligan show seen on KLAC-TV Monday evenings. The puppets are cleverly constructed and costumed; the dialogue is smooth, and the production expert. This act rates a show of its own.

One gripe about the way video is trying to adapt motion-picture techniques to a medium which should develop its own: I refer to the way entertainers refuse to look at the camera while singing, dancing, or playing a musical instrument. A performer on television should look directly at his audience, just as would a performer in a night club. (In a play, of course, the actors should ignore the audience.) This business of a crooner describing circles around the camera with his eyes, always careful not to look at his audience, tends to make both him and his audience downright uneasy. Leave us have the direct approach.

## The Bunch and Judy...

*Clown Through Their Rehearsal With No Cues, Much Laughter, and the Easy Sort of Know-How That Indicates Old Hands at the Comedy Game.*

STAGE of NBC's Studio A was brightly lighted but practically empty. Before the big mulberry curtain with its sparkling cutout announcing that Colgate-Palmolive-Peet presented "Judy Canova," a few shirt-sleeved musicians stood idly, chewing on apples or drinking cokes

procured from the machines behind stage. Their leader, Bud Dant, was exhorting them to remember to make the last line of a song either an E-flat or a B-flat when they ran through it again. They all nodded solemnly.

The famous Sportsmen Quartet, also shirt-clad, were poring over a newspaper whose headline announced that the Los Angeles police

had snared something or someone.

An actual show rehearsal seemed remote.

Suddenly a jacket-clad Judy, her hair in a ribbon and a song sheet in her hand, bounced on stage. As though at a signal, the musicians slid into their seats and picked up their horns. More musicians stepped from behind the curtains, put out their cigarettes, and took their places at piano, harp, drums and bass. The Sportsmen abandoned their crime-doesn't-pay account and congregated at the mike.

No downbeat was given, not a hand was raised in signal, but somehow the first song of the show started, with Dant's band right on the beat as Judy lustily warbled "If I Could Be With You One Hour Tonight." During the singing, a cast magically materialized on stage.

Watching Judy Canova clown through an ad-libbing of the lines in the script's situation comedy would have been entertainment, but add Hans "Kropotkin" Conried, Mel "The Voice" Blanc, Elvia "Mrs. Buff-Orpington" Allman, Gale "Mayor LaTrivia" Gordon, happy, big Ruby "Geranium" Dandridge and announcer Howard Petrie, and you have the full recipe for riotous goings-on.

More than once during the hour in which Judy and her complement of comedians ran through the roles of a socially aspiring "unacceptable" and her snooty neighbors, the "Hemingways," viewer attention was drawn to the musicians. These fellows, who have played on numberless shows and watched many a comic rise and fall, pay Judy and the cast a great compliment just by their lack of laughter. More often than not they sat as one man cradling their instruments in their arms, goggling at the antics of the show participants. A fatuous glee was on every face.

It made an entertaining hour's fun, but this was a rehearsal, where almost anything goes. What calming effect descends at show time to make sure the allotted twenty-five or -six minutes on the big wall clock takes in all the nonsense?

An NBC'er explained, "Oh, these old troupers have clocks inside their heads. They can boil the show down to a half hour without even glancing at the clock on the wall of the control booth.

"But you would be surprised how few changes, outside of their clothes, are made for rehearsal and for the actual audience performance. No one who has heard the Judy Canova show has missed a rehearsal, really. They just hear the fun instead of seeing it."

# Two Beat Or Not to . . .

*A Meakin Family Argument Started the Corn Vs. Pop Question, But It Was Viewers of Their Televised Show Who Settled It.*

**J**ACK MEAKIN sprang delightedly up from the piano bench and rushed in search of his tiny wife, Patty.

"Honey, I've got it . . . I finally worked out an arrangement of 'Coquette' that hasn't a lick of corn in it. Even you will like it!"

Patty's face changed perceptibly, but she accompanied Jack back to the piano and dutifully listened to

the lovely, semi-symphonic arrangement of the standard old favorite. Then she dealt the blow.

"That is lovely, but I have news for you. Our guests tonight are Beverly Wills and Barbara Whiting. You suggested a comedy routine to Art, remember?"

Jack, remembering, groaned. Then brightened. "Hey, that's great. We can work up a terrific vaudeville skit with those kids."

This time Patty groaned. "Swell. More corn. Well, let's get down to the studio and get with it."

The scene is not too unusual to the execution of "The Meakins," jolly fifteen-minute television show beamed four nights each week over KTTV's Channel 11.

Many is the time Jack and Patty

plan a song by Patty, a piano solo by Jack, or a spot for the guest of the evening (since their January 2 opening, Gale Gordon, Yankee Outfielder Johnny Lindell, Lillian Randolph, "Bozo" the Clown, Ben Gage, Eileen Woods, Ted Fio Rito, Pinky Tomlin, Michael Douglas, the Masked Spooner and Harry Fields have been among the notables of radio who stepped under the video lights with their hosts, the Meakins) only to find that writer Arthur B. Jones, who actually executes the brief scripts, has planned a little different tack. That means that in the period from 3:00 in the afternoon until show time, Jack and Patty must revamp their own show idea, learn their lines, rehearse their guests, don make-up and be all ready for the 7:15 signal that means Mr. and Mrs. Television are on the beam.

#### Ravel and Ragtime

Patty's slighting reference to her husband's "corny" playing, whether voiced at home or for viewers' ears, is strictly part of the couple's comic routine. No one knows better than Mrs. Meakin that her Jack is a fine composer and as hep to the dramatic classics of Ravel, Stravinsky, Debussy and Prokofieff as he is to the backroom piano he indulges in at parties.

#### Good Background

Some years ago Jack was an NBC staff pianist and arranger for Meredith Willson. In fact, Meredith was his very first boss. Jack was also once head of the radio program department in an agency handling the big Lucky Strike radio presentations. More than twenty of Meakin's piano

compositions have been sold, one to the movies.

Even without knowing her husband's background, Patty's ear wouldn't be deceived by his piano clowning. She herself was well known when, as Patty Norman, she was singing star of the "Hit Parade" and vocalist with Eddy Duchin's band. Patty is one of the few girls today who can warble a ballad against a two-beat background.

However, when the Meakins' show started on television, Jack found himself stimulated by the popular "corny" records and general reaction to ragtime piano into playing the real old-fashioned piano he started with years ago. The moniker "King of the Cornballs" sprang up among his cohorts, and Jack gleefully adopted it. This affectionate dubbing was a natural to develop into repartee between Mr. and Mrs. Meakin, for Patty's rendition of ballads old and new is anything but corny.

When mail began pouring in to the Meakins about the respective merits of the popular and the corny, Jack smugly cited the pros as ammunition for his cause.

With Jack playing piano and Patty singing nightly, the number of songs used each week is about twenty-two. The stock of ditties cleared for television dwindled, and the Meakin duo dug into the old standards that lend themselves so beautifully either to a straight melodic treatment or to ragtime—"Baby, Won't You Please Come Home," "Coquette," "Rosetta," and favorites of the same vintage.

More and more viewers joined the

controversy, until Jack hit upon the idea of organizing his defenders. An announcement went out on the show that the "National Fellowship for the Appreciation and Preservation of the Cornball" had been established.

The slogan of the Meakin-instigated Fellowship is "Two Beat or Not to Be Bop." That way Jack had them coming and going. All who liked their Mr. Television Meakin as "The King of the Cornballs" could lend support by writing in for a free "Fellowship" card to the NFFT-AAPOTCB, which Jack says is pronounced "NUF-TAPT CUB." Everyone who likes him playing it straight could just write in.

Corn lovers rallied to their maestro's cause. The mail response definitely established the Fellowship effort, and members happily acclaimed Brother Meakin as "King."

Jack's first boss, Meredith Willson (who for years hasn't played a lick of corn—at least from the podium of radio shows), tropped happily down to the Meakins' show at KTTV's studios atop the Bekins Building in Hollywood, to duly crown this King. The inauguration was complete with sceptre, crimson and ermine robe, and a heavenly crown bearing crossed cobs of corn.

Now, during the evening's televised fun, Patty doesn't dare roll her eyes or "Oh, Jack" her husband when the foot starts tapping, the bass notes start rolling, and the upper range tinkles out a raggedy tune.

Meakin smiles in happy triumph and reminds his Patty, "Remember, honey, the viewers want it this way!"

ute segment, practically a guarantee of excellence.

We most enjoy the fine old show-business discs heard on the program, but all the records played, jazz, oldies or newies, are selected on a basis of uniqueness. Many famous names are associated with the older platters. You can expect to hear tunes sung by Helen Kane, the "Boop-boop-a-doop" girl of the twenties; Harry Richman and Frances Williams duetting hits from "George White Scandals" of twenty-five years ago; Lillian Russell's single recording of "Come Down, Ma Evening Star"; Fannie Brice's famous rendition of "My Man"; records representing the work of Weber and Fields, Al Jolson, Eddie Cantor, Sophie Tucker and many other sock performers.

If you're old enough to remember the off-to-Buffalo days of show biz or young enough to wonder what all the shouting was about, you'll enjoy digging these old-but-in-good-condition discs from the files of Jerry's collection.

### "Beach Party"

Ira Cook, now that he's out of the Music City window each week-day night, is devoting himself to a four-hour session on KECA, Saturdays at 11:00 a.m., titled "Beach Party."

Ira, well established among local jockeys, is classifying his wax marathon in an interesting manner. He has a "Cook's Tour," a brace of tunes devoted to extolling the virtues of Arkansas, Mississippi and other beloved locales. The "Treasure Chest" features those records that have become established favorites, the works of Crosby, Glenn Miller, Goodman, Dorsey, etc. Another good category is the "songs that made people famous," featuring such platters as Margaret Whiting's "It Might as Well Be Spring," "King" Cole's "Straighten Up and Fly Right" and Buddy Clark's "Linda." Our favorite category is "songs that missed the boat," and right now we'd like to institute requests for Harold Arlen's "Last Night When We Were Young" and the Gershwins' "Delicious," in an effort to get 'em on that boat.

### "Deems Taylor Concert"

Added enjoyment has been brought to the daytime dial with the inauguration of "Deems Taylor Concert," KHJ, 2:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. The distinguished Mr. Taylor is added to the ranks of long-haired disc jockeys with the "Concert," a recorded program of classical music. He introduces his famous and tasteful recordings in the well-known Taylor style. Perhaps he doesn't reach the heights of whimsy he once displayed on the old Paul Whiteman hour ("Revolt in Cuba" will now be played by Paul Whiteman and his revolting orchestra.), but his informative prefaces remain charming and intelligent. He explains the music and musicians and yet lets the music speak for itself. He

is still the only commentator we know who can spell out the name of a foreign composer for his audience without sounding condescending. He also gives American composers a better-than-average break during his half-hour musicale.

High points of the programs are the interviews with famous artists and composers. Taylor, a critic and composer himself, conducts the most literate of discussions.

The program is unsponsored, so the commercials are of the public-service variety, messages that fit in rather well with the spirit of the "Concert."

## Playbacks (Critical Comment)

### We Point With Pride

. . . To the "serious" romance that occupied that recent "Sam Spade" script, and to Lurene Tuttle's heart-breaking telephone bit at the end of the show when she sent "Sam's" girl down to meet him in the bar. (We haven't felt so affected since Vilma Banky and Ronald Colman split up.)

. . . To Steve Allen's prodigious memory when he recently interrupted his after-midnight show to carol, "Let's choose up sides for baseball—no chicken claws!" And if you don't remember that expression, you were never a kid who played vacant-lot softball.

. . . To George Martin, Jr., who broadcast the sound of the Washington earthquake on his 8:30 a.m. news on Mutual. Seems that courtroom testimony was being recorded in Tacoma when the earthquake struck and the machine captured it all. In obtaining the disc, Martin scored an unusual beat. Amazing to us was the fact that the recording of the real earthquake sounded exactly like the last twenty minutes of the sound track in the movie "San Francisco!"

### We View With Alarm

. . . The programs that continue to call themselves "The Something Hour," and then are only on for fifteen minutes or half an hour.

. . . The lines on a recent "Sam Spade" broadcast that referred to "a childish improvisation" that the heroine was playing on the piano—as the studio pianist was rendering some Poulenc.

. . . The soap-opera characters who continue to be struck down by either one of two ailments—blindness or the loss of the use of their legs—even after James Thurber's diatribe in his New Yorker series.

## Off Mike (Personalities)

### San Francisco Visitor

Bill Baldwin, popular personality formerly here, now in San Francisco radio and television, visited Hollywood recently and dropped in at the Radio and TV Life office for a chat. On KSFO, Bill is heard with a daily hour-long disc-jockey show that features interviews with visiting celebs.

He's in his third year of broadcasting a Sunday breakfast-club series from the old Hearst ranch in Pleasanton. His latest enterprise is television on KPIX. To prove how popular the guy is, he's been made the subject of an enthusiastic fan club. A number of his listeners have banded together to sing his praises via *Recordingly Yours*, a fan-club journal devoted to the jockey. Bill is also the only wax whirler we've met who is having himself a movie career the easy way—whenever a company visits San Francisco, Bill is signed in a bit. Two of the seven movies he's made, "Impact" and "The Champion," are currently on the screens. In "The Champion," Bill, along with Sam Balter, is seen as a fight announcer. All this sounds like good background for the television series that features Baldwin and whatever variety acts are available in the San Francisco area each week. Now in its third month, the show is the only commercial half-hour in S.F. television. It's on top of the Top 'O the Mark and has 125 miles clear vision. The current television gag in San Francisco, according to Bill, is that you can get in on the ground floor of television by going up to the top of the Mark!

### Radio Actress Dies

Long-time radio fans will be saddened to learn of the death in New York City of Joan Blaine, famed during the thirties as portrayer of the title roles in the popular Chicago daytime serials, "The Story of Mary Marlin" and "Valiant Lady." Out of radio for a number of years, Miss Blaine had appeared most recently in such Broadway plays as "Winter's Tale," "Spitfire" and "And So to Bed," and in one film, "The Knife."

**IF YOU HAPPEN TO BE LISTENING** to Jack Carson some night and during a lull while laughter subsides hear him utter some word like "clunk" or "mush," don't be puzzled, for we can assure you it's just the gesture of a fond and obliging father satisfying the inexplicable whim of his admiring son. One day, seven-year-old John Carson asked his dad if he would do him a favor and, when told "yes," wondered if Carson would say "clunk" on the show that night. At one innocuous spot, accordingly, Jack spoke the word, and John was so thrilled over having controlled the destinies of a network radio show that he came up the following week with another word. Waiting for dad to say the word has become the big Friday night project of John and his playmates. Can't you imagine the triumphant look on John's face when Jack kicks through for him in front of the other boys?

**ANECDOTES ABOUT HIS BOY AND GIRL**, his four-month cross-country personal-appearance tour, television in the East and TV here and what he wanted to do in it were some of the topics discussed recently by Carson at a small press luncheon in the **Derby's American Room**. Jack did over 500 stage shows while he was gone, but looked none the worse for his rigors. After a chance to watch **video in New York**, he felt that Hollywood television wasn't as rank as New Yorkers would

lead us to think. Jack definitely feels that our camera work is as good as, if not better than, the East's, probably because of the wonderful film know-how available to productions here. He rated "The Goldbergs," Godfrey, and Berle the best in N.Y. video.

**JACK HAD A CHANCE** to sub for Godfrey one night as emcee of "Talent Scouts," but could not obtain permission from the Bros. Warner to make the one-time guest hitch. However, nothing in Carson's contract prevents him having his own weekly TV program and the ex-vaudevillian has some pretty definite ideas of how he'd handle it: the backdrops, cast, and what he'd do to lick the problem of the ever-present and necessary script. (Jack thinks the lines could be blown up and projected on the wall, which performers could glance at while looking audience-ward.)

One of the biggest kicks Jack experienced on his tour was having his father as guest on his airshow. The elder Carson has taken to radio in such a big way that he has come to Hollywood and is scheduled to make more appearances on his son's show. Between radio antics of his father and those of young John, Jack Carson is in the middle of a delightful family situation.

So now we can all settle back and wait for the Carson show next Friday night. Maybe Dad will be on, reading lines like crazy, and Jack will humor little John by stopping significantly and uttering some word like "plop!"

# VIDEO *In Review*

## In & Out of Focus (General Comment)

### Looks Like

KFMB-TV, San Diego, is "racing" to get video going before May 15. . . . Marshall Grant is negotiating a new deal with Luckies. On the first twenty-six of these good "Your Show Time" (KNBH) films, Grant-Realm took a loss of around \$100,000. . . . Strip-teasing via video won't be West Coast fare. The station operators nixed the pitch of a local night spot (which even offered to stand all talent and line charges!) on grounds that show wouldn't be endorsed locally. . . . KNBH may soon carry a weekly fifteen-minute episode each week built around Dick Tracy, funnypaper star. Ralph Byrd would play the detective. . . . "Texaco Star Theatre," "Hopalong Cassidy" and "Pantomime Quiz" were the three favorite TV programs in a March survey of L.A. receiver owners. . . . KTLA has increased its power 30 kw. and will continue its power surge for an indefinite test period. . . . This week it looks as though the Ringling Bros.-Barnum & Bailey Circus will be televised, and by CBS-TV. . . . Both Eddie Cantor and Jack Benny have definitely committed themselves to video work when their summer vacations are over. Benny wants to do a one-a-month; Cantor plans to appear each two weeks. Both shows will be kinescoped here on the Coast. . . . ABC-TV, the only television network with co-operative shows, reports that these tele co-ops, while new, are actually out of the red! . . . Fourteen advertisers have sought the NBC team of Martin and Lewis for television, but the net is holding off for a bankroller who wants both AM and TV. . . . Singer Tony Martin has been signed for a weekly half-hour TV show on NBC-TV. Format has Martin in an intimate musical, with different guests from the show-business world each week. . . . Vallee Video has completed a twelve-and-a-half-minute television film featuring Sidney Miller and Andy Mayo's "Pansy the Horse." Shooting schedule was a single day. . . . NBC is all excited about the possibilities of Sammy Kaye's "So You Want to Lead a Band," and is circulating kinescope of this feature like mad. . . . Three old Bing Crosby short subjects, made for a small company in the East a few years ago, are on their way toward the TV screens locally. And Mr. Crosby is helpless to prevent it. . . . KTLA's "Sandy Dreams" is being shown via kinescope around the Eastern ad agencies for sponsor consideration. . . . The hottest personality of all in video is "Howdy Doody." More dolls, records, toys, play suits and whatever else crosses the human mind have been

patterned after the NBC-TV kid show puppet than anything else. . . . The advertising agencies are having a little trouble dreaming up and bringing off shows demanded of them by prospective clients who would love to advertise in the new medium. . . . KECA-TV's inaugural won't be in May, after all, but probably in June or even July.

### Race Fans, Note

The Kentucky Derby, Preakness and Belmont Stakes will all be telecast by KTTV's Channel 11. Gillette Razors is going horsey with sponsor coverage of the three, which will be shown here via kinescope two days after the actual running.

The Derby, run on May 7, will be filmed and beamed by KTTV on May 10. The Preakness is run May 14; beamed May 16. The Belmont race is June 11; the telecast here is June 13.

### KFI-TV Doubles Business

When KFI-TV switched its schedule to an entirely daytime operation, the move was attended by good wishes but great skepticism on the part of other video operators about town.

General manager of the outlet Bill Ryan now reveals that since the big move of March 1, KFI-TV has cornered 110 new accounts, a number just about double the station's former account schedule. No clients were carried over from the outlet's night-time operation into daytime beaming.

Mr. Ryan went on to say, however, that the low rates KFI-TV offers don't generate great eagerness in the ad agencies to sell their clients, as the commission involved would be negligible. Maybe this will change.

The added coin from new clients is being poured right back into KFI's video, which consumes between \$62,000 and \$66,000 each month!

## Stop, Listen, Look (Shows You May Like)

### Donna Rosa in Hollywood

A new comedy series that is a little of "The Goldbergs" and a little of "Life With Luigi" has taken to television like the traditional duck that took so well to water.

"Donna Rosa in Hollywood," seen each Sunday afternoon on KFI-TV's Channel 9 at 4:25, centers around Anna DeMetrio as "Donna Rosa," and gives the story of her boarding house in Hollywood. The program is filled with a collection of unique non-paying boarders, all full of fantastic and ambitious ideas but completely devoid of any urge to get down to work.

The cast includes Charles LaTour as "Novello," an artist and actor; John Romanos as the traditional family funny man and singer; "Giuseppe,"

who can't remember when he had a paying job, but is always keeping in touch with golden opportunities; Anthony Rocke and Betty Niglis are cast as "Rocky" and "Nina," the adopted son and daughter of "Mama Rosa"; Mela Shepherd as "Mrs. Bernstein"; Joseph McTurk as the fight promoter; Kate Randell, who is the current girl in "Rocky's" life; Vito Scott as "Mario"; and Frank Pucci as "Shakespeare Smith," who believes that Shakespeare will never die while Smith lives.

First show of the series by Mark Kearney (former writer and executive producer of the "Family Theater") caught the household in an uproar because "Donna Rosa" found she needed approximately \$1,000 to settle an account. There was much rushing around and helpful suggesting done (the latter all in the best traditional Italian accents and idiom)—a device that can supplant plot only when the actors and actresses are of the excellent caliber found on this particular show. The helpful scurrying dissolved when some member of the rowdy, happy household smelled the spaghetti sauce burning and all rushed off to avert this worst of tragedies to a robust Italian family.

"Donna Rosa in Hollywood" is the folksiest sort of entertainment, but grandly done. Its almost daring simplicity of plot bears a glowing mantle of finely shaded characterizations and interpretations that would delight even the most rigid of drama critics.

## Second Glances (Critical Comment)

### Macbeth

Everyone who watches video, whether almost completely happy with the entertainment or unhappily critical of the new medium's offerings, has a formula for bettering things. Some-odd thousands of these formulas prescribe a dose of the dramatized classics.

KTTV, the Los Angeles Times-CBS channel, is fortunate in having tied up the Pasadena Playhouse for monthly presentations from its stage. The first telecast on Channel 11 was the Playhouse version of "Macbeth," a dramatized classic if ever there was one.

The venture proved conclusively that, even capsuled into an hour and a quarter, Shakespearean drama can be televised most entertainingly.

From where we sat, the accolades go primarily to the technical coverage. Fifteen sets (copies of the original Globe Theatre sets) and three studios were utilized—and the camera work that covered this rather extensive area left little to be desired. If any criticism is to be leveled, it falls on the cast. Victor Jory as "Macbeth" must have disappointed the motion-picture-goers who have seen him turn in consistently excellent performances. The stabbing scene, a high point in the play, was weakly done. Working in the bad lighting the presentation was given might have undermined the actors' spirits in this case.

If this ambitious undertaking of KTTV's were run as an experiment to probe the potentialities of televising a live (and local) stage presentation, all minds must be at rest. Any technical faults will be cleaned up in time for the next Playhouse venture, one that will undoubtedly be looked forward to eagerly by viewers of the first effort, "Macbeth."

The bard on video proved highly successful, judging by the present standards of television.

## On Lens (About Studio Happenings)

### "The Show," Etc.

Those of you who watched Betty Keeney go through a recent "You're the Star" show playing the part of Empress Josephine, wife of Napoleon, were seeing a prime example of showmanship and adherence to the familiar adage: "The show must go on!"

Just one minute before a recent Sunday's performance of the Rita LaRoy show (7:30 p.m., KTLA, Channel 5) actress Betty Keeney burned her hand severely in a small studio fire. Without time for first aid, Betty went on to give her interpretation of Empress Josephine, while a taxi waited to rush her to a hospital. No one guessed that the tears of "laughter" in her eyes came from excruciating pain.

## Off Lens (Personalities)

### Here's How

One of NBC's New York photographers recently had a long, detailed story in *Minicam Photography* on how set owners could take pictures from the screen of their television sets. This week he received a letter from one of the magazine's readers.

It said in part: "Not knowing anything at all about taking pictures from the screen, and very little about taking pictures at all, I took some before reading your article. I did everything you said not to do."

The writer had enclosed a snapshot which he had taken of Milton Berle from his television set. It was perfect.

### Toscanini Fan

Shortly after the two-part telecast of "Aida" with Toscanini and the NBC Symphony, the famed maestro received one of his favorite fan letters. This treasured note was from an anonymous television viewer, and said, "You have just made yourself a new fan. Go out and buy yourself a good dinner." The letter enclosed a five-dollar bill, with which Toscanini went out and bought himself a good dinner.

tal three times a week over the full Mutual-Don Lee Network.

Master of ceremonies for the picturesque pow-wow was genial Ben Alexander (wearing a ten-gallon hat), while those favorites of the West, Iron Eyes Cody, Johnny Mack Brown, Whip Wilson and Jimmy Wakely, lent their talents to make the day one to be remembered by the thrilled youngsters. Most impressive ceremony of the affair was the coronation of Little Chief "Straight Arrow" and Princess "Straight Arrow." The honors went to Ralph Hoppe and Honey Hollingsworth of Los Angeles, who were chosen by the War Council.

### Strictly for Kids

After the last war-whoop had faded into the sunset, Ted Robertson, producer of the program, explained how "Straight Arrow" started on the Mutual Network. The idea of the juvenile program originated several years back but for some reason never quite took hold. It was last May that it came back to the airwaves with Sheldon Stark writing the scripts and Ted Robertson on the producing end, aided by Ray Kemper, assistant producer.

This type of program was not new to Robertson and Stark, who had worked together on the "Lone Ranger" dramatizations during the 1930's. Commending the "Straight Arrow" show, Iron Eyes Cody said, "This is the first show that has put the Indian in the correct light." To this Mr. Robertson added, "The main idea we want to achieve is to help people get the correct perspective on Indian history, and in our stories we emphasize the Indian as a constructive force in our country."

### Comanche Indian

The legendary "Straight Arrow," played by Howard Culver, is a stalwart Comanche who enforces the cause of law and order throughout the West. In radio reality, "Straight Arrow" is Steve Adams, young owner of the Broken Bow cattlespread, who rides the trail with his companion, "Packy" (played by Fred Howard).

But when trouble ensues, the call beckons Steve to retreat to a secret cave and hastily adorn the dress and war-paint of a Comanche. Waiting for his master in the cave, which glitters with crystals of gold, is the golden palomino, "Fury." ("Packy" is the only one who knows the secret guise of his friend.) Armed with Comanche bow and arrows of gold, "Straight Arrow" rides to danger with the echoing cry of "Kaneewah, Fury!"

A vital integral of the program is the music, which is written, arranged, and played by Milton

Charles on the Hammond. The whiz of an arrow piercing the air is dramatic in its own right, but add the heavy tremolo of suspense (by the organ) and you listen to a vibration that will make shivers tingle down your spine.

### Sound Effects

The gun shots, the rapid hoof-beats of stallions, and all the other sounds that make the "Straight Arrow" shows so realistic are produced by soundmen Tom Hanley and Dick Moblo. Sitting at the controls is Dick Burton, engineer. The rest of the cast includes Gwinn Delano, who enacts "Mesquite Molly," and Frank Bingman, the narrator. Free-lance radio actors play the parts of other characters on the show.

"Straight Arrow" packs plenty of action in each half-hour show, and never includes any scene that might be tagged as detrimental to the minds of youthful listeners. From the amount of fan mail it can be deduced that the children are great admirers of heroic "Straight Arrow," and that includes boys and girls of all ages . . . spring, summer, and yes, even the wizened winter years.

## MENUETTE

### Apricot or Peach Refrigerator Cake

(Just the thing for the Easter Dinner)

- 1 angel-food cake
- 2 c. apricot puree and juice from dried or canned apricots, put through sieve
- 1 T. plain gelatin
- 3 T. cold water
- ½ t. almond flavoring
- ½ c. sugar
- 1 a. whipped cream

Cut center from angel-food cake, leaving a ½-inch wall on sides and bottom. This portion of the cake may be used (if someone doesn't get it) as a base for soft custard.

If lady-fingers are used, separate them, then line spring mold, having rounded side of the lady-finger out, also cutting off one end of the lady-finger so that it will fit base of the mold. Line rim of the spring mold with the lady-fingers, then fit on the bottom, and the small pieces from the lady-fingers may be used to fill in. Sometimes jelly roll is used, cutting it in half-inch slices.

Soften the gelatin in cold water, then add to the apricot puree, which has been heated with the sugar (if it was needed). Let cool, add flavoring. When just about ready to set, whip with a rotary egg beater and fold in the whipped cream. Spoon into the cavity cut in the cake. Cut a thin slice from the removed portion of the cake and place over the apricot puree in the cake.

Put in refrigerator for 12 to 24 hours, then frost with whipped cream, which would take about a pint, to be whipped. Make it in swirls to look pretty.

## RECORD NOTES TO YOU

Somebody once said that anticipation is greater than realization, but after listening to the first **CAPITOL TELEFUNKEN** release, quite the contrary is true. We had heard for some time about these Telefunken "masters," recorded in Europe, buried in underground German vaults during the war, and flown out by the Berlin Air Lift for pressings in this country. All this sounded pretty good, but we had no idea of the musical thrills in store until we listened to each item. Here is the great music of the world, so realistically recorded it's hard to imagine one is not actually listening to these fine artists in a concert hall; there's depth to these recordings that nearly approaches third dimensionalism. A full page, rather than a column, would be inadequate to describe the five albums and four single releases (all twelve-inch), so imagine the great **BRUCKNER** "Mass in E Minor," with Max Thurn conducting the choir and orchestra of the Hamburg State Opera . . . or **HINDEMITH** and the Berlin Philharmonic playing his own very colorful "Matthias the Painter." . . . **ERNA SACK**, the German coloratura soprano whose phenomenal high notes have often been the subject of much debate as to whether true or falsetto, again exhibiting magnificent voice control that defies description. . . . For lovers of operetta, selections from three of **FRANZ LEHAR'S** best will again transport you to the gay Vienna that used to be, with its gold braid and swirling skirts. . . . We particularly enjoyed the **BEETHOVEN** "Symphony No. 3" (Eroica) as played by the Amsterdam Concertgebouw Orchestra under Mengelberg's baton. This great work (inspired by the composer's one-time admiration for Napoleon) with its departure from established form and structure is given brilliant interpretation and, by its sheer majesty, rates high as a truly great masterpiece. In addition to the above five albums, these single records are also available: **OVERTURE TO THE SICILIAN VESPERS** (La Scala Orchestra of Milan) . . . **OVERTURE TO ALCESTE** (Berlin Philharmonic Orchestra) . . . **ROMAN CARNIVAL OVERTURE** (Mengelberg and the Amsterdam Orchestra) . . . **VOICES OF SPRING AND THE NIGHTGALE** (Erna Sack). . . . That's the story of Capitol's first Telefunken release—and if my words have been too brief, I'm sure that for clarity, brilliance, and thrilling performance, these recordings will speak for themselves. . . . # No Sugar, Please!

**T**HE SACCHARINE sweetness and light that so often typify husband-and-wife programs get the "twenty-three skiddoo" from Jack and Lillian Kirkwood. "Go on," they laugh, "why should we pretend that our days consist of bowing and scraping to each other when they don't? We're just like other people, with the same old ups and downs."

There was even the time on their "At Home with the Kirkwoods" stint when they engaged in a real knock-'em-down, drag-'em-out session of fisticuffs. "It was quite a battle with both of us beating each other over the head," they remembered with pleased smiles of satisfaction. And what did listeners think of this rather unusual family show? Why, they loved it!

Laughing Jack Kirkwood, who tips the scales at 240 pounds, and his petite blond wife, Lil, are no newcomers to this business of entertaining the public. They met and married while they were both members of a touring vaudeville troupe, "The Highland Company." Lil was the featured comedian and Jack was a comedy-dance man. Their routines together were so good that they have made a living by being able to make people laugh.

## No Dull Routine

Before their present ABC variety show, "The Kirkwood Corner Store," they were the peppy couple of "At Home with the Kirkwoods." Their ability to inject into the dialogue

just the right amount of homey atmosphere was enjoyed by listeners everywhere. Instead of making a boring repetition of the situations that occur in hundreds of homes every day, they would highlight the common incidents with a result that brought amusement coupled with understanding to listeners who remarked to their better halves, "Say, those Kirkwoods do the same things we do!"

Although their "At Home" program was aired in the late afternoons and rated high with housewives who liked recalling the laugh-provoking lines to their husbands, the amount of mail from school-age listeners surprised all. When their time was changed to an earlier spot, a downpour of letters from youngsters bemoaned the fact that they couldn't very well listen to the stories and be in class at the same time. One forthright letter from an irate young chap ordered the network in no uncertain terms to "put the show back on at the later hour so *we* can listen to it." Period.

Many poignant memories are brought to life by listeners when Jack and Lil give out with some old-time songs. "We don't claim to be second Frank Sinatras or Margaret Whiting," they chuckled, "but *we* enjoy the singing." So does the audience.

## Impromptu

The switch from theater to radio happened rather surprisingly. Jack was traveling with a road show in Portland, Oregon, and appeared on a local station there as a publicity

stunt. The stunt consisted of his telling a little about the production he was in and then making a quick exit. However, the "other person" who was supposed to keep the program rolling didn't show up. Jack saw the show was "on" with nothing but vast silence. He looked frantically at the microphone for a second (that seemed as long as an hour) then grabbed a ukulele and started an impromptu stint of song and talk. Listeners perked their ears to this stranger's originality and swamped the station with requests for more. That was when Jack made up his mind to stay with radio.

San Franciscans enjoyed Kirkwood's "Breakfast Club" on KFRC during the thirties. He produced, wrote and acted as many as six roles during this five-morning-a-week package, which was a sure cure for those "getting up on the wrong side of the bed" blues. Another chatter and chuckle show originated by Jack was "Mirth and Madness." He also is responsible for the popularity of the gag line, "Put something in the pot, boy," which bowed on the Bob Hope show last Christmas. The response of the listening audience to this phrase was overwhelming. They reacted in the same fashion when he would answer questions like "You're sure funny, how did you get that way?" with the optimistic reply of "Oh, I dunno . . . just lucky, I guess."

## Favorite Funny Man

However, it really isn't luck, to our way of thinking, that has made Kirkwood such a favorite. He is a

## Hoosier and Harmonica

*That Describes Indiana's Herb Shriner, Who's Living Up to His Promising Start with His CBS Show*

Monday-Friday, 4:00 p.m.

**I**N A RADIO LIFE article back in 1942, we predicted that Hoosier Herb Shriner was the comedy discovery of the year, destined for big things. We still think we were right—it was the world that was wrong. The war came along and young Shriner went along with it.

He did gain enthusiastic reception for the shows he put on for fellow GI's during those years, however. After the war, he toured the night-club and supper-room circuit. Cast in the Broadway musical "Inside U.S.A." with Beatrice Lillie and Jack Haley, Herb awoke after opening night to find himself the surprise hit

of the show. Radio got interested in the homespun humorist all over again, and he returned to CBS for his present Monday-through-Friday show. At this writing he is still appearing in the Broadway hit each night, facing the mike with the Raymond Scott Quintet during the day.

### Tuneful Debut

The harmonica-playing Shriner made his radio debut at sixteen. As the leader of the "Hot Hoosier Harmonicists," a group of six boys of his own age, he was heard ten times a week. After an extensive tour bookings became difficult, so Herb took the boys back to Indiana and set out alone. He was booked on an Australian tour and recalls that he played some places where people had

never before heard a harmonica. On his return to the States, Herb was signed as headliner on the old "Camel Caravan." That's when Radio Life made the glowing prediction that's coming true today.

Herb is a tall, gangling guy who gives the impression of being terribly embarrassed as he stands at the mike and comments on current events and human foibles in a shy, self-deprecating manner. His harmonica solos are performed on specimens from his collection of more than 300 instruments, most of which he says are of no interest to anyone except the junkman.

Hoosier Herb is serious about his instrument, however. When an Austrian proposal to change the conventional pitch of musical instruments was presented to the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, Shriner wrote to Trygve Lie protesting the change. A change in pitch, Herb pointed out, would be all right for instruments that could be adjusted or retuned, but it would mean that some fifteen million harmonicas would have to be scrapped. Either that, or harmonica virtuosi, of whom Shriner is not the least, would have to play unaccompanied. And with composer-conductor Raymond Scott on Herb's "Alka-Seltzer Time," that just can't be.

BACK IN 1934 THE PICKARD FAMILY delighted Chicagoans with their home-spun entertainment, which included folksy chatter and musical fests where everyone took part.

# A Real Family



*Without Formality, the Pickards Bring Their Folk-Song Show to An Audience That Enjoys Joining In With the Old-Time Melodies*

**A** LIFETIME of music was described by the Pickard Family when Radio and Television Life paid a visit to their charming home in San Fernando Valley. Our knock on the door was answered by the lively master of the Pickard domain, Obed Pickard, who immediately asked us to call him Dad (even the telephone directory lists him that way).

Dad and Mom Pickard and the rest of the family, Bubb, Ruth, Charlie and Ann, are stars of their festive folk-song show on the NBC television station, KNBH. The homey chit-chat and toe-tapping melodies have been met with great approval by video viewers. But one question in the minds of many watchers has been, "Are they honestly a *real* family?" We found out . . . and it would be hard to find a nicer, more closely bound family anywhere. Dad put it in his own words when he informed us emphatically, "You bet your life we are a real family! More than that, we're a real NBC family, having started on that network twenty-five years ago."

### Mom's Doings

That quarter of a century on radio wouldn't have taken place if it hadn't been for Mom Pickard. Back in Ashland City, Tennessee, Dad was a member of the "Grand Ole Opry" (he credits "The Judge" George Hay for having given him his start), Mom

accompanied him on the piano, which she consented to do when Dad offered her five dollars to play for him. "By the way," she reminded, "I haven't collected that money yet!" One fine day Mom decided they were going to go to New York. "I didn't want to go," remembers Dad, but Mom made the decision final when she rented their brand-new home and they had to move out. So on they went to New York, where they gained immediate success on NBC's

"Cabin Door." Their popularity rose to another height when they joined "The National Farm and Home Hour" in Chicago.

They were one of the first to play folk-type ballads on the air, and have now set another precedent by being the first to introduce the same type of program on television. Dad's musical ability was demonstrated to us as he played a version of "Turkey in the Straw" on the Jew's harp. He uses the up-stroke on the instrument and denounces the down-stroke, exclaiming that it "just doesn't sound the same."

When he had finished playing, Dad looked at the tiny music-maker fondly and told of the time he played the mouth piece for Henry Ford, who had said after hearing Dad, "You're the only man I've seen who could get a tune out of a Jew's harp." To make the time really something to

# Western Music --- "Uptown Style"

*The Ambition of the "Westerners"  
Is to Sing and Play Good Music—  
Hillbilly, Popular and Even Jazz*

EVERY week-day morning the "Westerners" bring to you "the best in Western music" over the KMPC airwaves. The eight happy-go-lucky fellows who comprise the group inject into their daily show a full hour of folksy chatter and good Western music that has made the program garner a vast number of listener compliments for a show well done.

Frank-speaking Red Rowe, who is the good-natured, easy-going master of ceremonies, claims that it is "strictly an uptown Western show," and that the arrangements of the tunes plus the dude-ranch atmosphere add up to one of the finest of the Western variety programs he has ever heard. "That would be my opinion," he admitted, "even if I weren't part of the show."

The "Westerners" theme the idea

of bringing to listeners the easy fashion of living and the advantages of the West. Each Friday, an audience is present to watch the antics of the musicians, who appear all decked out in their cowboy regalia. The hour revolves around a daily salute to a Western city, a Western news roundup, a request hymn, musical numbers, and interviews with such guest stars as Red Ingle, Spade Cooley, and other favorites in popular as well as Western music.

#### Catchy Tunes

The question as to why Western tunes are so popular was answered by Red, who stated that the numbers are basically easy to sing and are catchy. "Hillbilly music has the same beat as other music," declared Red, "and ninety-nine per cent of the top hits have been of the real hillbilly type." (Several of the numbers he cited as examples included recent hits like "A Little Bird Told Me" and

"Powder Your Face with Sunshine.") Red also added that every one of the "Westerners" can play jazz.

The group has been in a number of Western motion pictures and the Plainsmen are national recording artists. They often play for benefit shows and private dances. Before the KMPC "Westerners" originated, the musicians were members of other musical groups. Remembering how readers often become interested in what people did before their present occupations, here is a little personal and professional information about the "Westerners."

Red Rowe, head man, who sings and plays the guitar, began his career at the gangly age of thirteen. Red never studied music, but taught himself to sing and read notes. His musical talent may well be inherited from his mother, who instructs music at the University of Alabama. He attended the University of Missouri, working at the same time. But, as often is the case, his occupation left little time for studies, so Red finally devoted full time to his work. He had his own dance band for seven years, and has been on the air every week for sixteen years. A full day finds Red greeting the sun at six, then rushing to his "Western Stars" recorded show at seven. This is followed by several other programs (Red is also on Stuart Hamblen's KFVB "Lucky Star" show), leaving him little time for his favorite sport of golf. Red was recently married to a vocal lovely by the name of Irene.

#### The Plainsmen

The Plainsmen consist of George Bamby, Charlie Morgan, Andy Parker, and Clem Smith. Andy organized the group in 1945. He claims Oklahoma as his native state, where he had his own Western band. Besides playing the guitar and the bass, Andy does acceptably on the vocal side. Clem and Charlie are the two bachelors of the group. Clem plays the

remember, Mr. Ford pulled out of his pocket another Jew's harp (which had been made in Switzerland), and he and Dad played a duet. When the fun was over, Mr. Ford presented the instrument to Dad, who has cherished it ever since.

It was music that brought Mom and Dad Pickard together. She plays the piano (her rhythm is great) and the organ, and Dad is talented on almost every instrument. They were the only ones in Ashland City who could play enjoyable melodies, and consequently, whenever there was a party, they were invited to come and bring their music. "Took me seven years to win her hand," recollected Dad with a flirtatious wink, "and we have been making music together ever since."

The children, too, have played and sung ever since they were big enough to talk. From the time they were toddlers, the Pickard boys and girls have been part of the radio show; Bubb, with his guitar; Ruth, with her accordion; and Charlie, who strummed in with his banjo. With so much music being made by the strings and keys, Ann took over the vocalizing.

It was little Ann who brought about their appearance before Mrs. Teddy Roosevelt, who was then living in Long Island. Mrs. Roosevelt had listened fondly to the show and had become pleased enough to want to hear three-year-old Ann and her folks in person. They were asked to appear in the church that Teddy Roosevelt had built. The visit was delayed three times until all the Roosevelts could be together. It finally took place, much to the pleasure of all.

A matter of missing their loved ones brought Mom and Dad Pickard to California. Ruth had married a Los Angeles businessman and was residing here. Mom missed her daughter very much . . . Dad did, too. So in 1939 they left Chicago and moved to the West Coast. Both agree that it was the best move they ever made. Three of the Pickard children are married (two are busy raising another generation) and Charlie is the bachelor of the family. "I'm waiting to find a girl as beautiful as Mom," he smiles. Dad and Mom Pickard celebrated their fortieth wedding anniversary this past February . . . years that have been warm with the glow of happiness that still is reflected in their kind faces.

The Pickards enjoy presenting their show on television. "It makes you feel much more like you're actually with the people," they say. All the wishes of this very real family were expressed by Dad when he hoped sincerely, "All we want to do is make everybody forget their troubles for a while. If we accomplish that, then we're happy, too."

Now that you've met them, you will probably agree that the "Westerners'" ambition to keep on playing good Western music has been established with a great amount of experience that speaks for itself when you listen to their show. No amateurs, these boys!
