Don't Blame the Weatherman

He's Interpreting Intricacies Over Which Even Experts May Disagree, Says Weather Expert Gene Bollay, Who Calls Shots on TV.

BEVERLY HILLS has the best weather conditions locally, according to KNBH weather expert Gene Bollay. It's high enough to get above the summer fogs and in the winter it's far enough away from the ocean to miss the winter fog and resultant smog. It gets the inland sunshine and is still close enough to the sea to get the breeze. Which explains why smart people live there!

Bollay himself chose his home site after investigating weather conditions. Altadena was his choice—more sun, less fog. Unfortunately, a little

thing called smog came up in the meantime and changed the atmosphere.

The only weatherman on television, Bollay knows he isn't speaking to fellow meteorologists on his Monday-through-Friday show, so he deals in the human terms of the weather. Will there be enough snow for week-end skiing? Will it rain on the next holiday? Viewers who are planning mountain, desert and seashore jaunts are apt to write in ahead of time with the plea—what will the weather be?

Hooray for L. A.

Southern Californians, according to Bollay, are more interested in the weather than folks in other parts

of the country, undoubtedly because the earlier Southland industry was based on its resorts and tourist meccas, which depend on fair weather. Bollay usually includes news of freakish or extreme conditions in other parts of the country on his TV show—it makes natives so happy, and newcomers are smug at the thought of Aunt Mame shivering in Podunk.

Almost everyone makes jokes about the legendary weatherman and his mistakes. They're really not mistakes, explains Bollay, they're a matter of interpretation. Extreme conditions always result in the same forecast, and all experts will be in agreement on a coming heat wave, storm or unusual manifestation. It's when conditions are marginal that the experts disagree.

Few people realize the intricacies of the weather business, but Gene's viewers are learning. Every afternoon, he picks up a weather map at the airport, studies and compares it with previous maps to chart movements. He also gets press bulletins from the weather bureau, the same as those which go to the newspapers. He finds the coldest and warmest spots in the country and also notes any unusual snow or rainfall. In offering a statement on the next day's weather, he must quote the official U. S. weather forecast in addition to his own. He doesn't have to agree with it, however, and he modestly admits that he has been right when the official forecast has been off. "It's like two doctors looking at a patient," he smiles, "both opinions are based on reasonable facts."

Past Record

Gene has been sharing his weather knowledge with TV viewers since August of 1949, when he left the Navy. During the war, he served in several valuable capacities with that branch of the service. In 1941 he taught a P. G. course in meteorology at the Naval Academy. In 1945, he was sent to England on loan to the air ministry, where he charted weather conditions for high-level bombing missions. He also saw service in Pacific, where he was executive officer of weather control in Manila. Back in this country, he set up the San Francisco and Los Angeles offices of naval research and headed the scientific section.

His present program was originally started by A. Showalter, chief forecaster of the U. S. weather bureau in Los Angeles, who relinquished the show for other duties.

There's a difference between actually forecasting weather conditions based on climatic factors and predicting weather through the law of averages. For instance, Southern California has had a drouth for the past five years, a condition that has not prevailed for so many years in succession as far back as records were kept. So if Bollay says that this

The "Voice" Of Loyola

A LITTLE more than three years ago, a group of Loyola University students were having a gab session when one popped up with the idea, "Why can't we have a radio station?" Rather a bolting thought, particularly since they had nothing to start with . . . not a bit of equipment, not even a red cent. But youthful perseverance triumphed over these obstacles with the help of practically the whole student body, and now, located in the cellar of Loyola University's Fine Arts Building, are three rooms . . . two studios and a control booth . . . that gleam under the bright crimson-and-gray banner of station KLU.

Every piece of equipment used in the station was either begged, borrowed or made from scratch by the boys themselves. Their carrier-current type of transmitter was made by students, classified by assistant manager John Montgomery as "electronic geniuses." And well they may be.

All Students Eligible

With facilities to broadcast from all parts of the campus, KLU programs a variety of shows from recorded music to football games and even a "Man on the Street" interview. Any students who want to can do their part at the station if they prove willing to work and, above all, dependable. In this winter semester,

there are thirty-five fellows on the station's staff and they run the gamut of jobs. When they're through announcing, they're likely to be writing scripts or doing some of the other endless duties to keep a station thriving. Many of the boys have had previous radio experience and their help is invaluable.

KLU broadcasts on 540 kilocycles (top of the dial), and residents in the Westchester district can easily pick it up. Sometimes (on a clear day) it carries over to Westwood and outlying parts of Santa Monica and Culver City. Broadcasting on week days, the station starts out at

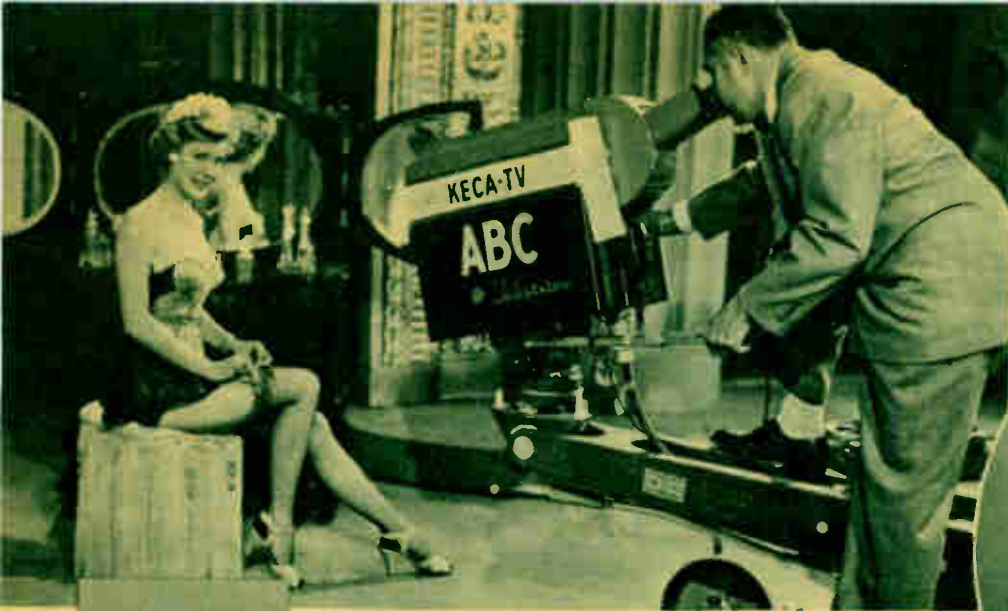

What Have the Qualities of a Cat, an Elephant and a Mongoose Got to Do With Video Camera Manipulation?

▶ **THE ANGLE AND PLACEMENT OF THE ABOVE HUGE CAMERAS** give some idea of just what monitoring must be done while actually photographing live for video. That's where cat-like agility comes in.



▶ **THE TELEVISION** cameraman, if he is a good one, is the poor guy who never knows how the game turned out, who the murderer really was, or who won the evening's contests on the televised show he works.

As John De Mos, veteran cameraman of the KECA-TV crew, explains, "If a cameraman becomes involved in a show, he's dead. You have to be completely objective."

Mr. De Mos's words can be accepted as authoritative because he is a good cameraman. John would never have passed his baptism of fire if he lacked the qualities he cites as exemplary. His own first stint behind the electronic view-finder was the televising of the USC-Notre Dame football game at the Los Angeles Coliseum the year before KECA-TV brought viewers this season's tilts.

Started with Stills

John, a local boy whose first interest in camera work arose years ago when he was gifted with a portrait still camera, later became a newsreel cameraman for motion-picture studios and a photographer for commercial films. In movie newsreel work, football-game filming had been De Mos's forte, so his interest in television's coverage was natural. Camera work on the first pigskin contest he watched not only convinced him there was opportunity for experienced newsreel men to improve the quality of coverage, it also

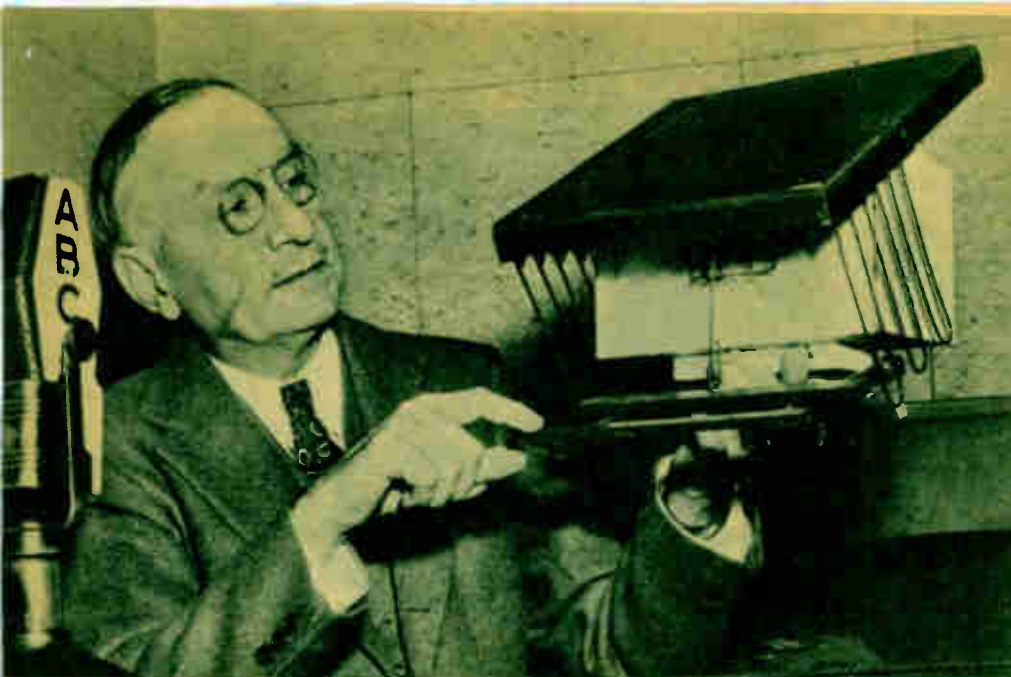

11:30 a.m. with the Loyola fight song (written, incidentally, by Johnny Boudrou, who conducts the Loyola band at the Rams football games), followed by a religious dramatic program, news and recorded music. Several hours are devoted to various courses of the school, such as the Air ROTC training program, business reports and the UNESCO World Review. On these, students majoring in the subjects are able to discuss material based on their class research.

Discover Talent

The station even boasts of several comedians who are reported to have rare ad-lib form. One of these is "The Lowbrow Serenade," on which freshman Clines exhibits his talents. The others are "Rancho del Rey," ad-libbed by McLean, and "Melody Moods" with Lou Rossi and Leo McElroy, whose format is patterned on the old Jim Hawthorne zany stint.

All the students who have had any part of KLU foster a tender fondness regarding the station. In fact, they hardly know any other station exists. But perhaps the achievement of which all are most proud is their accomplishment of just last year when Loyola University inaugurated an entirely new course in its curriculum—the Communicative Arts Major, with the department headed by Paul Blackburn. The past semester found thirty-eight students enrolled, bent towards a bachelor's degree. For this, KLU can take not only a bow, but the credit for establishing the "voice" of Loyola University.

decided him to look into television. He applied at a local station next day, was hired within a week, and after a brief schooling in the electronics phase of television-camera work was sent out to cover one of the West's most important football games without ever having photographed with a TV camera. That coverage was the USC-Notre Dame tilt. And that is the first time John had to ask, after the game was over, "Who won?"

Cameraman De Mos's first studio show after joining KECA-TV's staff was that channel's lavish revue of last fall, "Let There Be Stars." He currently operates the number-one camera on "The Ruggles," "Your Witness," "Mysteries of Chinatown"

and Dick Wesson at Hollywood House.

This activity with the image orthicon has been going on for months, but John still jitters. . . . "Every show to me feels like opening night. I will say, and I think every cameraman in town will back me up, that we are never satisfied with a show when it is over. You see, we never can just keep up with the show—we have to be one step ahead of it. That is why memory is so important. One of the boys on my camera crew, Jim Morris, has never missed a cue. This memory feat must be in addition to good camera manipulation.

"Once the TV camera is on the air, it remains on during the entire interval of the telecast. This means the cameraman is operating the camera every minute. The director of the program relays his instructions to the cameraman by intercom, and there is a red light that glows inside the view-finder to indicate when the camera is cut into the main channel and its pickup is actually going out on the air—this, where two or more cameras are focused on a scene or remote event such as a football game. Back in the control room, the outputs of the TV cameras are channeled to their respective monitors. Here the electronics engineer or program director watches each monitor and intercuts the various camera pickups to provide an interplay of camera angles from long shot to closeups, as the script or his judgment demands.

Depend on Director

"Obviously it is impossible for the television cameraman to follow a script or cue sheet, so the program director does it for him, sending instructions for changing camera angles or lens over the intercom. We cameramen here at KECA-TV harbor the most implicit faith in our director, a factor that makes it easier."

Easy to see why John De Mos sums up the qualities for the good cameraman as being: the memory of an elephant, the agility of a cat, and the ability to anticipate action like a mongoose.

Two nights each week John is free from the exacting excitement of camera work. On Monday and Tuesday nights he sits at home, watching the work of other cameramen.

Whether he got to be a cameraman because of his at-home practice, or whether he can pursue his at-home practice because he is a cameraman we don't know. But John has solved the problem of choosing what to watch on his free nights by keeping his two television sets alight continuously. He watches both at once.

p. m. Friday, did just that as far as we're concerned. If you don't want to read a paean of praise, stop right now.

The show is one of those wonderful products that is full of humor, without slamming out belly-laughs; romance, without mush; sentiment, without pathos; ideas, without preachments. Above all, its delicious comedy and the harmonic playing of its principals stand out.

A rather precious pun—the Colmans are the "Halls" who are married to "Ivy College"—starts off the show. The initial broadcast had Ronald Colman as "Professor Hall," head of the college, anxiously waiting word from the board of regents about a renewal of his term. Benita as ex-actress "Victoria" aids him in worrying. She does hope he is "booked" for another season. Mood and timing of the two are perfect, as perfect as they were on the Benny show. We had forgotten, fools that we are, what a delightful actress Benita Hume was on the screen. It all came back to us as we listened to "Halls of Ivy."

In all departments, the program reflects intelligence and enjoyment on the part of those creating it. Writer Don Quinn's delicious way with character humor is given full rein and the affection he must feel for his creations shines through. Henry Russell's music is as astute as ever, ranging from the hymn-like alma-mater opening to the waltz-clog play-off. Production is excellent—to the credit of Nat Wolff. And as an old tap-dancer, we'd like to say "At last!" to whoever supplied the waltz-clog effect. It was accurate in every beat, right down to the mistakes that a beginner inevitably makes. How good can ya get?

"Mr. Feathers"

Because "Mr. Feathers" (KHJ, Sunday, 1:00 p.m.) is, in our estimation, the kind of program one might become attached to over a period of steady listenings, this review is written with that thought kept in mind. Readers of it are requested to hold the same thought.

In the first place, it is a truth of almost any program (instant charm-ers like the Colmans' "Halls of Ivy" excepted) that it should not be judged by its initial airing. As in the case of tasty wines, the quality, the flavor and the appeal increase with time.

"Mr. Feathers," as portrayed by Parker Fennelly—an expert and experienced hand at lovable, laughable characterizations—is sure to annex a substantial number of loyal listeners.

friends. After all, Fennelly has previously given dialers the delightful "Titus Moody" of the Fred Allen gang in addition to the popular and much-missed "Snow Village Sketches."

His new radio creation is a small-town pharmacist of the kindly, homespun and busy ways of a "Scattergood Baines" or a "Dr. Christian." He is a legendary figure in the town, his store is the hub of all activity. People with problems of any sort gravitate to him, with the result that both they and he go through, say, twenty minutes of trouble and confusion tinged with homey humor, all of which is happily, and somewhat humorously, resolved in the show's final moments. Throughout, "Mr. Feathers" predominates—so much so on this particular debut airing of this particular show that the very name became annoyingly redundant.

The dialogue began to sound thusly:

"I'm going to tell Mr. Feathers."

"Mr. Feathers?"

"Mr. Feathers will know what to do."

"Hello, Mr. Feathers, I've got a problem."

"Just a minute, sonny, I've got to call up Mrs. Feathers about something." Phones. Phone answered with: "Feathers' residence."

After our one-show sampling, our only suggestion to the show would be for the writer to stop punching so hard to make the listeners "Mr. Feathers"-conscious—leave it more to the artistry of Parker Fennelly. To the listeners, we suggest repeated tunings to this show. It should prove one of those that will "grow on you."

"Earn Your Vacation"

Steve Allen has himself another good show in "Earn Your Vacation," KNX, 2:00 p.m. Sunday. The ostensible idea is that teachers should get a free trip some place for answering questions. What comes over is another showcase for Allen. "How old are you?" he asked one lady teacher. "Over twenty-one," she replied guardedly. "Well, so's Grandma Moses."

Actually, Steve is very sweet to the teachers and expresses real concern when they flub an answer. As on all quiz-type shows, the questions never seem fairly distributed. For instance a man teacher got to Hawaii on naming Carson City as the capital of Nevada, while a lady teacher got left when she couldn't name a Republican on the Supreme Court. At any rate, the teacher must answer four questions in order to get anywhere. Those who don't still collect some nice prizes. The listener's prize continues to be Allen.

Guest stars Gene Kelly, Rosalind Russell, Mike Romanoff and Frank Sinatra were worked in brightly and all the Benny accoutrements, the "Stupid dog!" the cry "Just one rehearsal!" and the other gags were woven into a wonderful half hour.

...To Dick Sinclair and Sam Bensussen, KIEV disc jockeys, who play such fine records on the 8:30 a.m. segment. Old Benny Goodman discs with Helen Ward and the Quartet, old and new Crosbys. Some of the best record-programming on the air.

...To the S.C. college professor who won on Tom Hanlon's "Midnight Merry-Go-Round" one night last week. Like they say on "Our Miss Brooks," teachers are people!

We View With Alarm

...That evidently all popular male vocalists (and some of the gals, too) feel they must talk like Bing Crosby as well as sing like him. It's understandable that Bob Crosby would emcee in his brother's style, but it's a little mad when you consider that as emcees Perry Como, Dick Haymes, Frank Sinatra and practically everyone except Vaughn Monroe makes an unconscious effort to banter like Bing.

...The eternally disappointing way in which character comedy shows start off with the best of intentions of playing fair, comedy-wise, and then soon revert to the old gag routines. One of our favorite programs is in the process of doing this right now and we couldn't be sadder.

...Another program conflict that seems unnecessarily perverse, that of spotting "Juvenile Jury" opposite "Quiz Kids." Seems to us that the specialized audience that likes one is the same group that would like the

This type of listener sits at his radio and rants at the newsmen when they say something with which he disagrees. When one says something with which the listener agrees, he goes so far as to growl, "Glad that boy is finally getting some sense."

CLASSIC OF THE WEEK (Capitol-Telefunken): The many lovers of Tschalkovsky will revel in the brilliant and majestic reading by Mengelberg and the Berlin Philharmonic of Symphony No. 5 in E Minor, now available on LP Microgroove. Especially impressive is the stirring finale where Mengelberg's flair for dramatic full-orchestra volume comes to the fore.

CARMEN MIRANDA-ANDREWS SISTERS (Decca): "Wedding Samba" and "I see, I See" are another pair in the Souse American way that'll haunt your dreams with their samba rhythms and lightning lyrics as given the Good Neighbor treatment by the Fruit-Salad Gal and Sisters Three. Olay! . . . **CONNIE HAINES** (Coral)

joins voices with the Lee Gordon vocal group for a pair of hand-clapping goodies titled "Me, Myself and I" and "Sugar-Coated Lies," strictly in the up-tempo that Connie likes and as effervescent as the Little Lady herself. . . **JERRY GRAY ORCH.** (Decca):

Glenn Miller's former arranger steps forth in his own right with music in the Miller mood—"Sitting by the Window" and "Just for Old Times," both featuring Tommy Traynor vocals and the GM touches so traditional. Here is music in the best fashion, but whether Jerry, Ralph or Tex can wear Glenn's style, remains to be seen. . .

DORIS DAY (Columbia) joins Ray Noble's orchestra for a brisk disc in lighter mood, "Save a Little Moonbeam" has the maestro commenting on the lyrics, while Doris naively asks advice on "Mama, What'll I Do?" Too bad one can't hear what mama says at this top novelty disc's close.

VERA LYNN (London), one of Britain's choice songbirds, has a good duo in "Too-Whit! Too-Whoo!" and "It's the Little Things." Both are tuneful rhythmic ballads with fine orchestral backing by Bob Farnon with "Too-Whit" having the edge in both material and Vera's styling. . .

JO STAFFORD (Capitol) should have a potential hit in "Diamonds Are a Girl's Best Friend," a fast novelty with the Starlighters. Even Paul Weston's backing smacks of the days of yore with the inclusion of Red Norvo's xylophone. "Open Door, Open Arms" is in direct contrast with its homey melody and lyrics on the flip. . .

BLUE BARRON ORCH. (MGM): Listen for some great Mercer lyrics on "Big Movie Show in the Sky." "Mr. Disc Jockey" on the reverse is a slow rhythmic ballad, easy on the ears but weak in comparison. . . A. M.

Debonair as ever, Duff generously offered to go back inside and buy a whole box of them to split up among the teen-agers.

Jack Gregson, busy radio-television emcee who does "Your Stand-In" on the West Coast and "Auction-aire," a video show, from New York, just recently received the **First Annual Linguaphone Institute Award** for the best enunciation in Television. . . . **Marion Morgan**, blonde songstress formerly "patroned" by **Joan Crawford**, is joining the cast of **KNBH's Ernie Felice** show. . . . **Fred Allen** won't do any video this year, and possibly no radio outside of guest shots on his old friends—**Hope, Crosby or Benny's**—shows. He says "night-time radio is disappearing while TV hasn't progressed to the degree warranting his participation." Get him! . . . **Frank Wisbar** is looking for new talent faces for his ten P&G television series currently being made at Roach lot. . . . The "Beulah" show is soon to be tested for television. . . . **Olsen and Johnson** are making a deal for the **Lupino family's** library of comedy routines for new teevee material on another **NBC-TV** show that should be coming up next month. O & J would profit by a hundred years or more compilation, wouldn't they, in obtaining the **Lupino family records?** (Which one will try to dance like **Lupino Lane?**) . . . **Colgate** will do a television show with one of its stars, **Dennis Day, Judy Canova** or **Eve Arden**, the show to be done here, on film. Pix probably will be made at **Fairbanks studios**. . . . **ABC's** tele-comedy "Hollywood House" has been renewed for six weeks. . . . "Miltie" is still in the top ten lead, according to **Pulse**, which measures the LA area. . . . **CBS** and **Arthur Godfrey** have conducted a long-term contract affording the network exclusive radio and TV services of the comedian. . . . When and if **Mary Pickford**, who harbors the greatest unconcern over time and its fleeting of anyone we saw, ever does go on the air or before the television cameras, it will be for **NBC**. She recently signed a pact with them—a contract that reserves for **Miss Pickford** rights over rejection of story material, any specific type of program or format, and the right to okay

on any prospective sponsors. All those considerations take time! Plans call for a five-a-week daytime show and a half-hour weekly nighttime one. Daytime would be commentary and guests; nighttime would be the "Theater of Valor," which finds **Mary** in role of commentator on dramatized feats of heroism performed by **American G. Is** during the war. No TV ideas are definite just now. . . . **Luis Van Rooten** has the role of "Dr. Thompson" in the TV version on **KNBH** of "One Man's Family."

Stop, Listen, Look (Shows You May Like)

"Hancock Adventure"

On Sunday night a couple of weeks ago, **KNBH** inaugurated a new series called "Hancock Adventure." Should you find this series listed in any log merely as "Adventure," that brevity arises from many publications' reluctance to include a sponsor's name in a title. But whatever the title, the series is not one you'll want to miss.

Under the series, two fifteen-minute features, each on film made especially for television, are shown at 8:30 p.m., Channel 4, just before "Philco TV Playhouse." First two we saw were the modern snapper-ended "Smooth Fingers," and "Germelhausen," a twentieth-century treatment around an old German myth. It was generally very well done, with film quality, acting and dialogue all good, but any attempt to portray the little folk of the past is at odds with preconceived notions, and not as happily acceptable as the straight cops-and-robbers formula.

"Smooth Fingers," starring **John Abbott** and **William Phipps**, found the home of vacationing sportsman, hunter and number-one bachelor "Roger Mannerly" being entered by "Fingers Malone," a disciple of **Jimmy Valentine**. "Fingers" is apprehended by "Mannerly," who apparently wasn't vacationing at all, but sitting home to catch breakers and enterers. After catching "Fingers," the host gives him what he fondly refers to as a sporting chance. This means that "Fingers," at gun's point, can either open a special secret wall safe, using no tools, in three minutes, or take his chances with the law. To the accompanying yukkety-yuk from his host (the only frail part of this film) the young burglar sandpapers his fingers and goes to work on the knobs. The safe opens, and "Mannerly," with apparent great surprise, pays off the young culprit, then ushers him out. In a clever and completely unsuspected switch, "Mannerly" turned out to be

the real "Fingers," and immediately upon his victim's departure could be seen stuffing his own pockets with money and attempting to negotiate a getaway. Happily, this master con artist got his.

"Germelhausen" dealt with the myth that concerns a German town and her people, all of whom sank into a swamp hundreds of years ago when the townsfolk turned their backs on God. Each hundred years, for a few hours, it rises up again to show the people what they missed forever. The film employed dialogue between an occupation Army captain and a corporal, with flashbacks illustrating. The young corporal was supposed to have stumbled across **Germelhausen** during one of its living periods. His sketches, and a small hankie with the date 1244 embroidered on it substantiated his story.

This latter is one of the much-talked-of **Frank Wisbar**-produced and -directed films, from the teleplay by **James Griffin Jay**. The photography was by **Benjamin Kline** and special effects were by **R. Glass**. General Television Enterprises distribute.

Fortunately, the **Hancock** commercial responsible for our even getting to see this series is an amusing commercial. If it were dull, in addition to being as long as it is, not a dialer would stick by for the second show.

The lighting, dialogue, direction and camera work on these fifteen-minute shows were of the caliber you see in big movies that require admission. The plots and acting were better. Continued creation and presentation of film like this, made especially for TV, will result in a path paved not with shining good intentions, but with glittering accomplishment.

On the occasion of **Disney's** appearance, the viewers were treated to sketches and facts galore concerning the behind-scenes work on the **Disney studio's** newest animated triumph, "Cinderella."

They heard the picture's hit novelty tune, "Bibbidi, Bobbidi"; saw a delightful hand-size model of the heroine's fabulous mouse-drawn pumpkin coach; watched "Cinderella" get outfitted in her fancy dress for the ball, as **Disney** flicked a sheaf of single sketches to give them the animation seen on the screen; received intriguing tidbits of information (e.g.: "Drawing pretty girls for animated

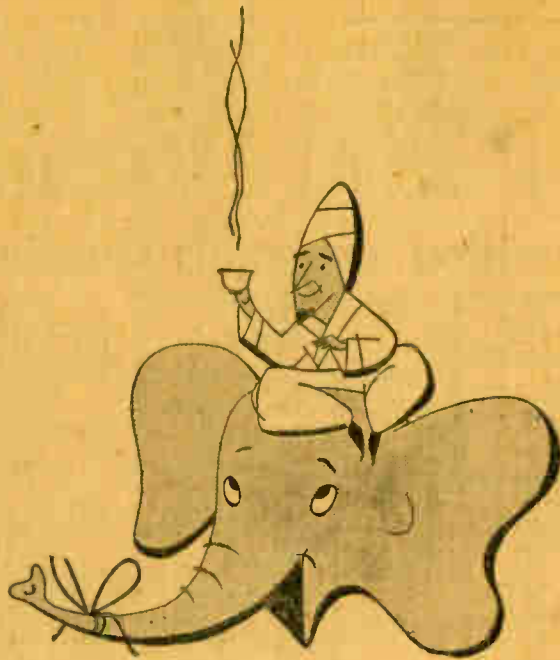

"The Black Robe"

A Manhattan Night-Court Judge Invites Viewers to Sit Up on The Bench of Justice With Him.

Monday, 9:00 p.m.

SOME MONTHS ago, Phillips H. Lord, creator of radio's "Gang Busters," "Mr. District Attorney," "Seth Parker" and "We, the People," was quoted by Time Magazine as saying: "I felt it was time for television to get out of the little tap-dancing acts." His contribution toward this end is NBC-TV's "The Black Robe."

Title of the show was taken from the black judicial garb of a Manhattan night-court judge. Its absorbing stories are taken from authentic night-court cases, with all the living drama preserved.

Cross-Section of Humanity

To add to realism, no one on the show is a professional actor, with the exception of the judge himself and his bailiff. Instead, the producer scours New York for interesting types—people who look the part of the character roles they are induced to play in the night-court setting. From the Battery to the Bronx, from Forty-second Street's dance halls to the Harlem slums, types ranging from mild-mannered old ladies to strident dock hands are sieved, selected and persuaded into their participation. The motley crew who

amble through the night-court procedure for the delight of televisioners do not memorize a single word of their roles. They are versed in the situations taken from the night-court records and police blotters, but they "tell it to the judge" in their own real-life jargon.

Every emotion and motive is laid bare for both the judge and the television cameramen. Smart fakers posing as salesmen, bewildered petty thieves, phony evangelists, befuddled old ladies fighting over the possession of a cat, or a young married couple whose trouble can be traced to the husband's occupation, act out the basic dramas in their own fashion.

Keeping It Real

Only occasionally does some night-court culprit violate realism with a bit of staged attempt at comicality. Most of the time the justice dispensed to solve the seamy situations is accepted with a genuine sorrow or

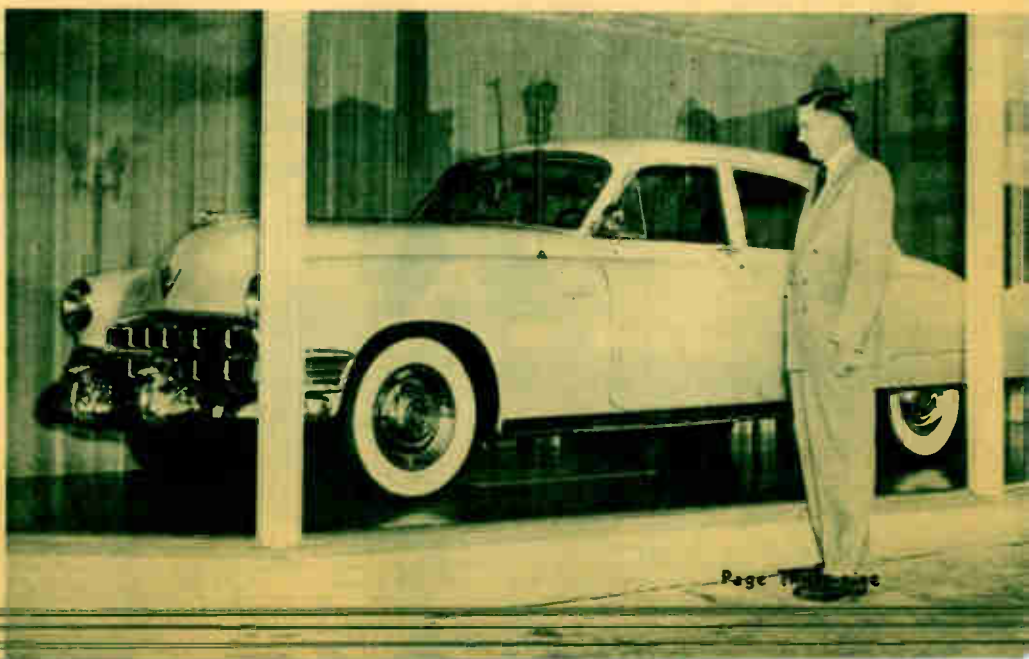

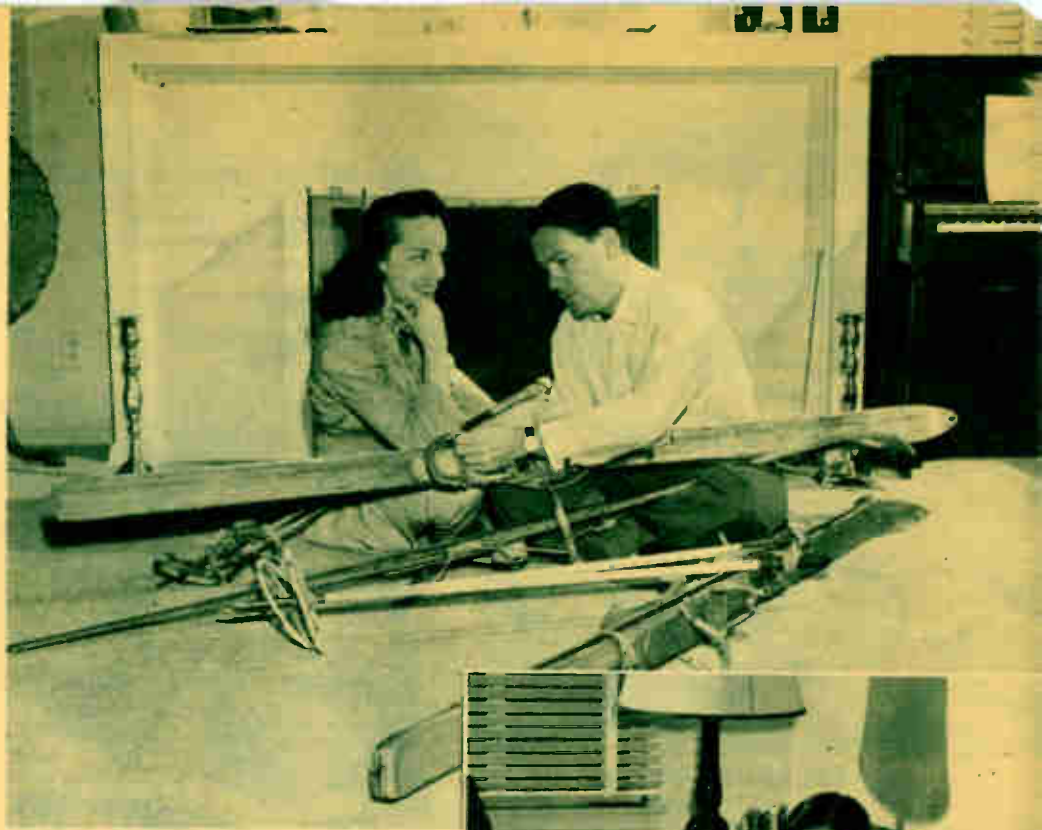

tables are turned and the star shoots questions at the press.

The programs are taped ahead and the questions to be asked of the star are submitted to him for approval in advance. In view of this careful procedure, it is to be noted to the show's credit that never has anything had to be eliminated from the recorded interviews before their airing, and only once has a star requested that a question be eliminated. (Kirk Douglas considered one query too personal; the panel agreed.) It was Kirk, too, who cooperatively got up out of a sickbed to do the program as scheduled.

Surprisingly, in spite of its cautious method of advance preparation, each "Hollywood Byline" broadcast is a happily unstinted production, faithfully packed with surprising statements, openly candid discussions, and hilarious personally related anecdotes.

"Every show is different," points out Latourette, "because each builds itself around the character, personality and individuality of the week's guesting celebrity."

We sampled some samples and got the idea.

Durante Regales

The Jimmy Durante edition was strictly "Schnozz"-flavored, smacked of "The Nose's" brash, informal lovableness as Jimmy unabashedly related endless entertaining stories. He told of his run-ins with the law during prohibition days ("Ya see, I had me dis club, and dese boys showed up, and dey said, 'Hello, Jimmy,' and I said 'How'ya fellas' on accounta I allus says hello ta anybody what says hello t'me, and den I buys 'em a drink and dey buys me one, and da next day, da jernt's locked up and dey're lookin' fer me!"); of his beginnings in show business ("In dis one jernt, I was at da pianer an' m'friend Eddie Cantor, he wuz da singin' waiter, and folks would ask us fer a number an' if we didn't know what dey was talkin' about, we'd just make up a song with da right title. If dey'd file a complaint dat it wasn't right, Eddie'd allus say to 'em, 'What! Two of 'em, there ain't?'); of his self-styled New Year's Eve celebration of last year ("It was da first year I didn't celebrate it in a night club. I was sick in da hospital and four of m'pals was there wid me and when it was about midnight, I got up and dressed and we went downstairs and sat out front in da car. I turned on da radio and da band was playin' and everybody was shoutin' 'Happy New Year,' and I turned to m'pals and wished dem da best, and dey turned to me and says 'Happy New Year, Jimmy,' and

relief spread largely across the wranglers' faces.

Ex-movie director Ed Sutherland now handles the reins of this novel show for its creator, and his technique of filling ninety per cent of the screen time with close-up changes of expression and emotional stress has resulted in the amazing camera studies of human personality.

Whether or not Phillips H. Lord's premise is correct, that before "The Black Robe" brought viewers a peek into night court, television was still in the "little tap-dancing acts" stage, his contribution is a typical Lord production, headed for the smash commercial success his other ventures have realized.

Lounging about at home in front of a television set is a particularly attractive way to find out what goes on in a city at night, especially when that city is great New York.

In complete contrast was the "Hollywood Byline" broadcast which featured Charles Laughton, on which the reporter panel shot a most pertinent query to the esteemed English actor when they asked what he thought of Laurence Olivier's "Henry V."

Laughton replied that undoubtedly he and Olivier would find much to disagree about ("We would go on for hours about it, I am sure"). Then Laughton paid Olivier an unusual tribute: "Larry has had the guts to fight the good fight I wish I had. Maybe it is not yet too late."
