Harriet Hilliard Nelson Couldn't Keep Her Brood Apart If She Tried

MOST FAMILIES have to take time to be together as a group, but if the Nelsons—Ozzie, Harriet and their sons, David, fourteen, and Ricky, eleven—ever have any troubles in that direction they will probably be caused by something which tries to separate them. For whether they are behind the ABC microphone or their own breakfast table, they are always the same family unit that has become one of radio's institutions.

Harriet has never needed to develop any special scheme for keeping the Nelsons a family in the strictest sense of that term. Despite the fact that the handsome quartet is together for more hours of the day than most, she explains: "No one has ever evinced a desire to go his own way at times when we don't have to

be working together.

"We have no set pattern that could account for our mutual loyalties, except perhaps for the fact that, as David and Ricky have grown up, Ozzie and I have always tried to give them the idea that they each have an actual vote in every venture we contemplate as a group. Right now we are making our first movie together, and we are doing it because the boys themselves decided to give up their coveted summer vacations to work. And I mean work, because they have as much of a responsibility for the success of the film, "Here Come the Nelsons," as we do.

"If we do have any rule, it is that we must all basically agree on what we want to do before we do it."

From the Beginning

Even as small boys, David and Ricky wanted to "get into the act" on the radio show. It was their own idea that they should play them-

selves. Grateful as they were for the fine interpretations which the original youngsters gave to their parts, they wanted to be part of their own radio family too.

Saturday is about the only day of their busy week that the Nelsons attempt to pursue their separate interests. But even then David and Ricky can usually be found playing tennis with their father, while Harriet catches up on her homework.

The youngsters have shown their preferences for the company of their parents in many ways. Harriet recalls a touching example of this which occurred last year when the Nelsons planned to spend a portion of their vacation in Laguna. They were to leave on a Friday, all except David, who was invited to a party that evening and planned to join them the following day. But just as they were about to leave, David, who had been watching their preparations with extraordinary silence, asked if he couldn't go with them then because he didn't want to miss sharing even a day of the fun they had together.

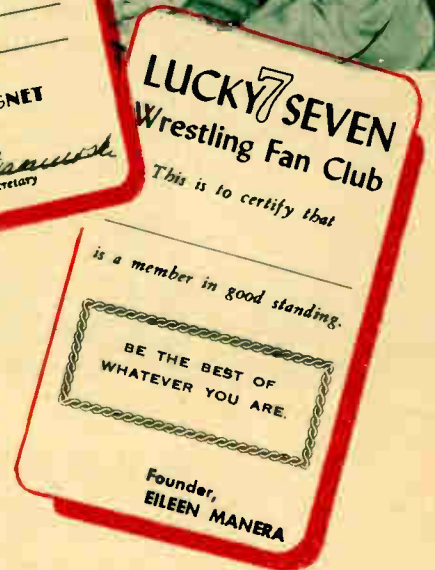

(Editor's Note: Maybe we've "stuck our necks way out" this week, in attempting to cover what has turned out to be a stupendous topic. After several weeks' interviewing and digesting of letters sent in answer to our plea for information on the various fan clubs, we give you, herewith, Part I of our "research" story. Space limitations prohibit our mentioning many of the other fan clubs which we know are also leading a strong and vociferous existence. If sufficient requests and information materialize, however, we may publish a follow-up feature.)

NEXT TO their scripts and show formats, the most important boosts to any actor's popularity are his fans. And when these fans band together into clubs whose sole purpose is the edification of their favorite personalities, both the group and the star attraction evidently benefit handsomely.

Of these hundreds upon hundreds of fan clubs scattered from San Diego, California, to Bangor, Maine, some of the most unusual can be found in our own Los Angeles backyard, as we discovered in preparing this article.

Probably one of the oldest and largest such groups, which is built around a definitely "different" personality, is "The Royal Order of Hoganites," composed of Jim Hawthorne's ever-loving public. Organized back in the days when he was spinning KXLA platters, the group got started because, according to its current president, Jeanne Lawrence, "Hawthorne was the only one we knew who could play records backwards, then break them into a million pieces . . . build a seven-thousand-story skyscraper with not a floor in it, and yet go over in a big way with the listening public. We consulted 'Hawth' and voted on the club's 'Hoganites' monicker since 'hogan' is the byword of our idol."

If Hawthorne himself has an extra measure of devotion to the 10,353 members of the "Royal Order," it is because through the club he met and later married his sweet young wife. She wrote him a fan letter which he answered and the rest is happy history.

Wrestlers Cheerers

Among the most vociferous fans are those who idolize the lions of the squared circle — TV variety. Actually, these outspoken admirers

of Gino and Leo Garibaldi, Roger Mackay, Andre Drapp and the rest do their idols a great service through the furor of friendliness they stir up at each and every match.

Eileen Manera's "Lucky Seven" is an unusual sort of wrestler's-admiration cult. Each of its members votes annually on the seven top mat men, to whom the club pledges loyalty. Current "lucky seven" are Leo Garibaldi, Roger Mackay, Roy Asselin, Andre Drapp, Great Scott, Gino Garibaldi, and "number seven," who is the personal "great" choice of each individual member.

The "Lucky Seven" is one of many glorifiers of the grunt-and-groan group, and each wrestler has several such clubs localized in the different regions where he fights. Roger Mackay's fans are typical. He has at least two staunchly organized clubs in Los Angeles proper. Elizabeth Farnam, president of one, explains that they "help Roger in many ways. We help with his publicity by writing to different wrestling and video magazines. We convert everyone we meet into a faithful Roger Mackay fan — and that's the easiest job we have. All

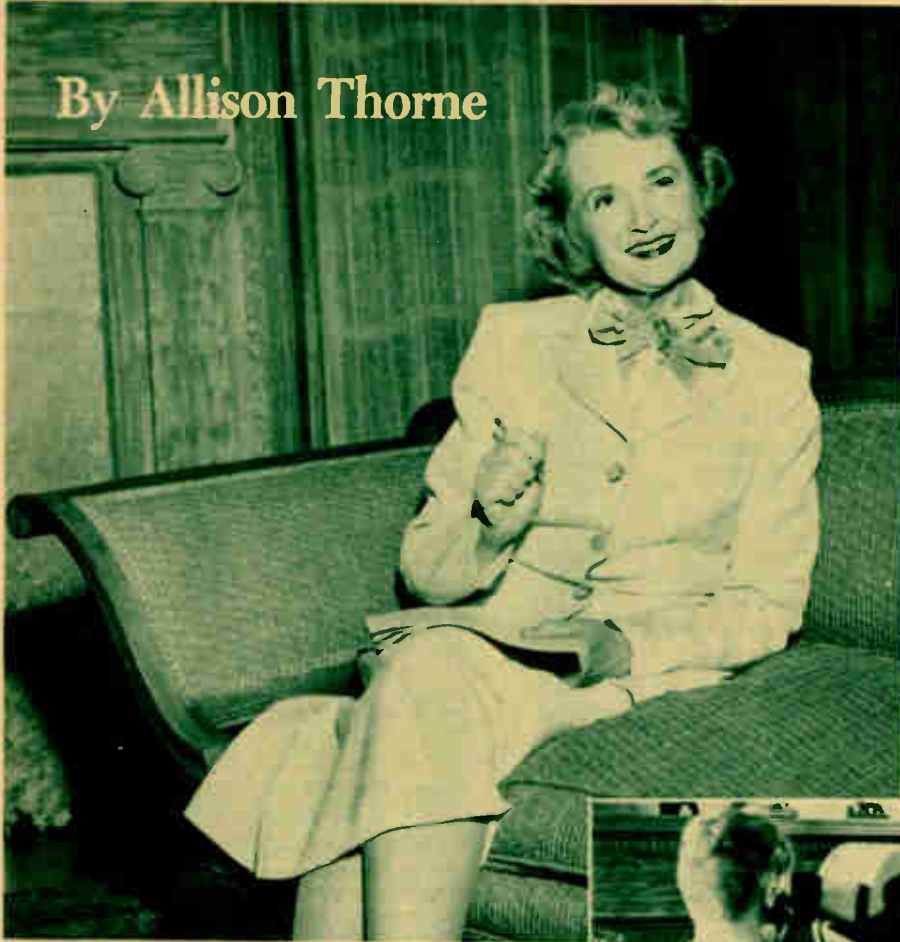

Variety of Visitors

KNBH Breaks Death Story

The KNBH Newsreel, in cooperation with NBC's affiliate station KSTP in St. Paul, Minnesota, scored a clean beat on what may become one of the most sensational news breaks of recent years.

The story broke in St. Paul when a man was picked up with a stolen car and inquiries revealed that he had been a former inmate of the St. Cloud (Minnesota) Reformatory for Men in 1946.

The owner of KSTP became interested in the case when the man accused the Warden of the Reformatory of graft and mismanagement. During the course of the case another witness, as yet unnamed, revealed that he had seen an inmate named Sturtivant being dragged down a stairway of steep steps, and he knew the boy had died shortly after.

In September, 1946, Mrs. Charles Olson of Los Angeles had been informed by Warden Horace B. Whittier that her son, George Sturtivant, had committed suicide by hanging, and that his body was to be returned to Los Angeles for burial. The body was exhumed last Monday in Los Angeles, and the coroner's report revealed that the neck bones were uninjured. The skull showed positive concussion marks, however. The coroner's report intimated it was possible that foul play, and not suicide, was the actual case.

The KNBH cameramen and newsmen are following the case to its conclusion, with developments being shown as they occur.

A few jabs at the map, and a few pointed questions of a supposed-interviewee threw everything into focus nicely, and the show switched to the action as reminisced by principal Blackmer. The map background had lent such a spirit of authenticity that the following sidewalk-cafe scenes seemed just as real as did the news post first pictured.

Presentation of the whole of the spine-tingling adventure, written by Kenneth Walsh, was loaded with imagination and originality.

Telev viewers throughout the nation are seeing history being made this week at the Japanese Peace Treaty Conference in San Francisco.

Although the actual signing is undoubtedly one of the big news events of the year, there is another behind-the-scenes story which few people know about. It is the story of how the dream of coast-to-coast television finally became a reality.

This dream might never have been realized, at least in so short a period of time, if it were not for the new microwave radio-relay skyway as developed by the Long Lines Department of the American Telephone and Telegraph Company.

Microwaves is the technical term for super-high-frequency radio waves in the 4,000-megacycle range as compared to the ordinary broadcasting range of 550 to 1,600 kilocycles.

Microwaves had many advantages over the lower frequencies. There would be no static because of lightning or man-made interferences; no interference with other radio or TV programs; and because of a new type of lens developed by the Bell System, only a small amount of power was needed for transmission—less than one watt between stations.

Nevertheless, there was one leak in the tube (spelled with a silent "e").

Like light waves, microwaves travel in a straight line. And according to a rumor started in 1492, the earth is believed to be round.

There was only one thing left to do in order to utilize all the benefits of this higher frequency. Man, with all his acquired scientific skill, had to make those waves bend.

And bend they did—by means of 107 microwave relay stations stretching from New York to San Francisco and covering 2,992 miles of plains, fertile farm lands, steep mountain ranges, and huge cities of concrete and steel.

The stations along the transcontinental route are spaced from nine to fifty miles apart, the average distance being 28.2 miles.

Not including antennas, the towers vary in height from a mere two and a half feet on the Utah salt flats (placed near the ground to avoid reflection from the flats) to the gigantic 415-foot tower at Des Moines, Iowa.

At Mt. Rose, Nevada, the highest station in the "modern pony express" is located at an elevation of 10,075 feet. The lowest point, believe it or not, is in the middle of mammoth New York at 11.5 feet above sea level.

The average station is a four-story job, made of either concrete or steel, with square, horn-shaped directional antennas sticking out on top.

Started over three years ago, the entire transcontinental project cost the prodigious sum of \$40,000,000.

The first inter-city channel open for commercial service was the New York-Boston route. After that, the system, which is designed to carry telephone messages as well as radio and television, was extended as far west as

Omaha, Nebraska—the midway point in the cross-country route.

On August 17 the first telephone call was made on the new microwave radio-relay skyway between San Francisco and New York, and this week the final television phase took place. Citizens of the Los Angeles area are able to cash in on the coast-to-coast hookup by means of a coaxial cable to the Golden Gate city.

At present the system provides for only one east-to-west television channel. Another channel, west to east, is expected to be completed within a few weeks.

When this final link is finished, then the fireworks between Hollywood and New York should really start exploding. Naturally, New York wants to keep as much TV as possible.

In the future, as in the past, TV-Radio Life will continue to keep its readers informed of technical developments in the radio and electronics field. We have several interesting technical stories on the fire.

And as for the forthcoming Hollywood-New York squabble, we wouldn't miss it for the world.

Handy Hints

The hint is:

APPLYING FRICTION TAPE IN RESTRICTED PLACES. The next time you have to wrap a wire or some other object with friction tape, where only one hand can be used for the job, try this handy hint. Unroll the necessary length of tape and re-roll it tightly in reverse upon itself, that is, with the sticky side out. With the tape rolled in this manner, you can apply it in restricted places by using the thumb and fingers of your one hand.

A HANDY HINT FOR THE MEMBERS OF "THE GREEN THUMB FRATERNITY." The new "throw-away" pie tins are of such thin, soft aluminum that they will make good plant tags. Cut off the rim of the pan with an old pair of shears. They may be cut any size needed and round off the corners a little. Place on a surface that will give a little, a folded towel will do, and with a hard pencil write the name of your plant. This will make a permanent tag that will not weather away such as paper or wooden ones do.

GOING ON A PICNIC? If so, this hint will come in handy. You all know how difficult it is to pack salt, pepper, sugar, etc., so they will not spill all over everything. Here is how to prevent this: tear off a piece of waxed paper, pour on the salt or pepper, fold it in half, then seal the edges with a warm iron. Then when you need the salt just tear the paper and there you are.

DON'T THROW AWAY THAT EMPTY SALT BOX, at least not until you've cut the lid (with pouring spout) off, as it can be fitted into the sealing ring of a Mason jar and you then have a handy canister. It makes a nice canister because the contents are visible and the spout makes it easy to pour and measure.

For Love o' Mike (General Comment)

Looks Like

... Dennis Day, singer-comic, will headline the Golden Bear affair in Sacramento at the State Fair, September 6 and 7. He will try his latest impersonations on the State Fair crowd before attempting them for the approval of his radio boss, Jack Benny, and his September 16 return to the air. ... There's no slow-down for quizmaster Walter O'Keefe and his "Double or Nothing" show touring Europe, as they have been forced to tape two or three broadcasts daily instead of the one-per-base they had originally planned. ... all because of the terrific crowds of both military and civilians at the U.S. Army overseas stations.

... "Club 15," with stars Bob Crosby and Gisele MacKenzie, acknowledged as "favorite male and female vocalist" respectively, will be honored shortly by the National Red Cherry Institute of Chicago. Special festivities will be aired over KNX on the regular "Club 15" airshow.

... Bob Hope seems to have hit a new high in salaries, being paid a reported \$15,000 each night (that's \$1,000 a minute) for doing a fifteen-minute program for Hadacol, September 1 and 2 in Cincinnati and Louisville. ... Judy Garland will arrive here soon to rehearse her acts to be showcased in New York at the RKO Palace Theater in October. ... Winchell returns to his Sunday spot this week. ... Tony Martin reports to the Army to do his show in Berlin for the European GI circuit. ... NBC's "Screen Director's Playhouse" moves from Thursdays to Fridays, 8:30 p.m., beginning September 7. ... When Jack Benny's show returns September 16 many cast members are to be congratulated. ... Mary Livingstone for starting her twentieth year, Phil Harris for his sixteenth, Eddie Anderson his fourteenth, Dennis Day his twelfth, Don Wilson his eighteenth and The Sportsmen their sixth year.

... Janet Waldo repeats her radio role in CBS's "Meet Corliss Archer" this week. ... Radio in Review—Continued

Japan Conference at Frisco

Local listeners are being given top coverage by the major networks this week at the Japanese Peace Treaty Conference in San Francisco.

Carroll Alcott and Grant Holcomb, two of CBS's top newsmen, are covering the signing for KNX-CBS on regularly scheduled newscasts and special broadcasts.

A veteran four-star team comprising Merrill Mueller, Alex Dreier, Elmer Peterson and Bob Letts is calling the shots for NBC.

ABC is also going all-out with a total of ninety-five persons handling both television and radio. Frank La Tourette, Western Division News Manager, is the big boss of the ABC operation, assisted by Vic Reed, manager of ABC's San Francisco News Room. With the exception of President Truman's opening address to the conference on Tuesday, which was simulcast, all other ABC AM and TV conference programs are being scheduled independently of each other.

"Suspense" Schedule

Two of the all-time "Suspense" favorites, Agnes Moorehead and Charles Laughton, are coming up in that order, on the radio theater's new thrill series. Miss Moorehead will appear on September 10 and Laughton on September 17. "Suspense" scripters are also busy on a forthcoming drama based on a basketball "fix" scandal.

"Big Show"

With plans for London and Paris origination of NBC "Big Show" completed, advertisers with this net are complaining about the high cost of the venture, although it is being paid by NBC. They figure the budget should be adjusted, instead, to ease their price per show for broadcasting. NBC, on the other hand, says promotional value gained from "Big Shows" splash reflects radio's stature and showmanship. Tallulah Bankhead hasn't said yes or no as to whether she will lead the parade for the "Chattanooga Show Train," bringing several hundred Southerners to New York City for the October 14 "Big Show" broadcast.

Radio Takes Back Seat

TV has cut Hollywood's radio-industry workers out of approximately \$5,000,000 for this coming year. Nineteen radio shows have been dropped, causing many musicians to go out looking for work, cutting large pay checks for actors and writers, and offering security only to the radio performer who can do TV also. Shows to go off the mike include "Screen Guild Players," "Phil Regan Camp Show," Horace Heidt, Rex Allen, Ginny Simms, Judy Canova, Dennis Day, "Escape," Alan Reed, "Hollywood Star Playhouse," "My Friend Irma," "Junior Miss," "Life of Riley," "\$64 Question," "My Favorite Husband," Roy Rogers, Frank Sinatra, Smilin' Ed McConnell and "Truth or Consequences."

When Carl Schroeder hits the air, he doesn't burn up the wires as some hep Hollywood columnists do, but he does warm them up a bit. His fifteen-minute show, although seldom startling, does provide some informative and highly critical news on the "daily parade of life in Hollywood."

To the background supplied by Dick Abrandt on Jim Hawthorne's nightly—or morningly, depending upon what you call midnight and thereafter!—clambake. Dick is always there with the right note at the right time, real bravo-type stuff. And when Dick does get a chance to latch out with some of his own brand of musicianship, it gets great. Notable was the night Wolfe Gilbert, composer, visited Jim, and Dick played some of the old-timer's top tunes (e.g., "Ramona," "Waitin' for the Robert E. Lee" and others).

Regardless of whether a police-investigating-type radio drama like this is aired to entertain youngsters or adults at this hour of the evening, it should still maintain at least some sort of commendable standard of production.

Every listener who pays any attention will at least expect the plot to be credible and the acting to be above average. Unfortunately, we found the airshow weak in both of these qualities.

A recent story involved a group of hoodlums who tried to run down a police captain, "Captain Scott," a regular member of the air series. The developments prompted one member of the gang to murder another member. Also interwoven in what seemed to us a weakly motivated plot was the idea that one crook's wife was having an affair with a fellow gangster. Such dialogue as "It's me, Ducky," "I'm on the hook and I'm flat," did not strengthen the script, in our opinion.

Another disturbing feature was that the narrator, also a participant in the drama, faded in and out of the script with nothing but organ music to motivate his appearance and disappearance. The story line was supposedly clarified by a technique of reading the police "intermediary report." However, this only confused the listener.

There was an obvious lack of freshness in the approach to the characterization which made the actors' interpretations far less effective.

We realize that it costs money to put on good or weak radio fare. We only hope to tune "Under Arrest" again and discover that it's had some serious revamping and is collecting coin as well as a large listening audience.

TV-RADIO

Lifelines

SEE WHERE SOME SENATOR THINKS NEW TV CHANNELS should remain frozen until an investigation is made on the low quality of TV programs. I think this is ridiculous, even though the senator may mean well.

SO MANY PERSONS COMPLAIN about the poor quality of TV programs and the lack of cultural and educational fare on the TV tube; but I don't think they would if they stopped to realize a couple of things: (1) that TV still is not dry behind the ears and (2) that stations have had to sock tremendous amounts of coin into cameras, studios, personnel, transmitters and other equipment.

RED INK ON THE LEDGERS OF TV OPERATIONS is switching to black, but until TV is completely solvent, don't look for it to stage too many high-brow programs. What is sold as "commercial" will come first. Though there are many excellent commercial programs, both on radio and TV, the fellows who know will tell you that the ultra-intelligent type program is not the first one a sponsor generally grabs. Usually the station or network has to put it on "sustaining."

FOR YEARS, RADIO OUTLETS have had to show proof of devoting a certain amount of time to programs of benefit to the public. Failure to do this placed the outlet in jeopardy of losing its license. It will be interesting to see whether the FCC will make TV toe the mark in this regard.

IN THE PAST, PERSONS CRITICIZING radio for putting out bad air fare have always pointed out that the radio-owning public in this country had a far greater investment in sets than the stations and networks had in their equipment. Because of this, outlets presumably were supposed to forget budgets and spend recklessly on cultural programs. This line of reasoning doesn't hold water beyond the original investment stage. Protagonists of better shows at radio outlets' expense never, to my knowledge, said much about the stations' constant upkeep of radio.

UNTIL THE "POORER QUALITY" COMMERCIALS can carry the freight for both themselves and the quality cultural programs appealing to a much smaller percentage of lookers, an investigation seems pointless. Furthermore, I think there are many more pressing things our legislative body could and should do besides snoop around the hectic halls of TV.

THE TESTIMONIAL LUNCHEON FOR MAL BOYD last week at Ciro's proved that there are lots of nice folks in radio and TV. IN THE TRADE, THERE'S AN old saying among commentators that you "don't read your fan mail, you just count it." That theory must have been designed just for Kelley.

I WISH YOU COULD READ SOME of the letters that I receive at KMPC every day, as an aftermath of my 6:15 "Parade of Sports." Here's an example:



"Dear clown: How can a grown man make himself look so ridiculous? On July 11, you claimed that Bob Waterfield is the greatest passer in football. How

about Otto Graham? On July 17, you were bragging about Artie Aragon, who's nothing more than a second-rate fighter. And just two days later you were blowing off about the Los Angeles Angels—why?, they're a second-division ball club and always will be. So, that's the reason I never listen to you, Kelley. You're too prejudiced!"

WELL, THAT'S A TYPICAL LETTER from a man who never listens to me, even though he can give exact dates when I made certain statements. And it's only one example; I get dozens of such "pan" letters a day. But the fans still listen.

MANY PEOPLE DISAGREE WITH MY format on the "Parade of Sports," I do not run a sports news show; it's a sports commentary. If I'm doing a story on the Aragon-Carter fight, for instance, I don't merely report the weights, heights and records of both boys. I say something like this:

"MY BOY ARTIE ARAGON IS going to lick the world's champion, Jimmy Carter, tonight. Artie is a better hitter than Jimmy, and he's not only going to defeat Carter; he's going to knock him out, in all probability. And there won't be a happier guy in this town than Kelley when Aragon scores the victory."

NOW, AS YOU MIGHT EXPECT, a lot of people get very unhappy with such spiels. But that fifteen minutes on KMPC every night is my commentary on sports. I don't say I'm always right, but when I am wrong it's my own opinion and Old Kel takes all the blame.

THE POINT OF THE WHOLE THING, of course, is that the "Parade of Sports" thrives on controversy. I'm not looking for trouble; but those fifteen minutes on KMPC from 6:15 to 6:30 every night are mine, for my own opinions on sports.

And you know something? Here's one guy who actually enjoys "pan" letters.

IF IT'S to be on the face it should be clean enough to eat." That's the approach Grant Wilson, KTSL make-up artist, takes to paint and powder for video stars. Every powder puff and lipstick brush has its place and keeps its place in Grant Wilson's small ten-by-twelve working room at the TV studio. "Orderliness" is the password observed by the pancake chief and his assistants: Marion Hall, Rochelle Stanton, Leah Hoffman and Bill Knaggs.

Powder Room

Grant Wilson came to the make-up room of KTSL via backstage high-school drama make-up and Max Factor's school of practical experience. Although he has four pairs of helping hands adding the glamour to the players, he believes in one person "putting it on" a performer, because the face becomes a puzzle if more than one pair of hands is making up at the same time. Usually it takes about twenty minutes to apply straight make-up to a woman and close to fifteen minutes to fix up a man's face for the TV camera. Often a person needs a little "corrective make-up," and this may add a few more minutes to the job. Wilson allows "plenty of congenial talk . . . even rehearsing lines" in his powder room, but states firmly that "no temperament is allowed here . . . we meet them all as friends, and no one is pampered in our beauty parlor."

Strict rules are enforced for sterilizing the tools of the trade . . . with soap and water being used along with antiseptics to treat brushes and sponges after each application, and with skin refreshers used generously. Lipstick does not need special attention because it is an oil and germs do not live in oil. A typical facial treatment starts off with a

skin refresher, then comes a bit of eye shadow for glamour . . . followed by the right shading with one or more shades of pancake make-up and any corrective measures for highlighting or subduing obtrusive features and then brushing on the lipstick. Wilson does all his make-up jobs on the lighter side, aiming thereby to achieve a more natural appearance. He doesn't believe that color TV will call for any major changes in painting and powdering video touches. In the recent color television "premiere" held in the East it was found that "regular color TV make-up" consisted in first applying a grease-stick base to the face, over which was put a neutral shade of powder and then the face was given a special make-up wash. The eyes and eyebrows of the feminine performers required no special treat-

ment for the color broadcast, merely the application of an eyebrow pencil and the proper shades of mascara. The lips were colored with a special pink lipstick.

Paint the Ears

One of Grant Wilson's special painting tricks is to "paint the ears two shades darker with pancake . . . because ears do not tan and the light hits the ears and makes them go white." He prefers to do a lady's face, but thinks a man's face is easier to do, with the only major make-up problem for the man being the softening of his beard.

Putting on new faces may take an artist's touch, but according to Grant Wilson it also takes a mechanic's precision and a doctor's cleanliness . . . because half the job is "keeping it clean."

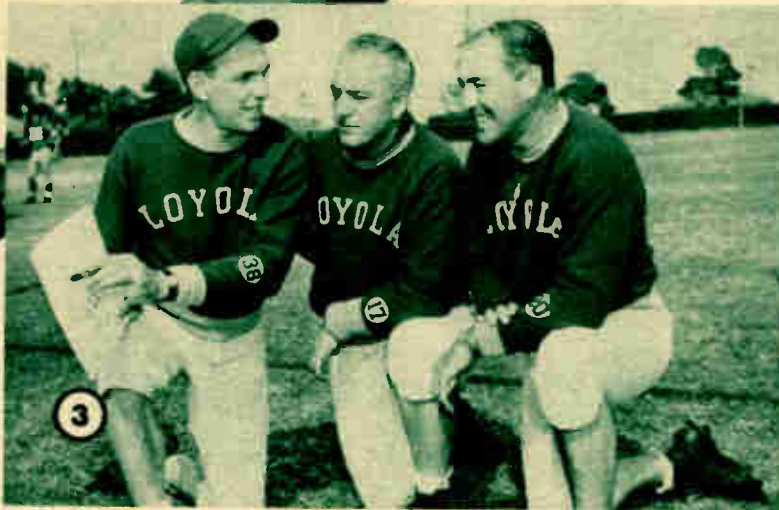

Watch Out For Loyola!



Warns Bob Kelley, Who Calls "The Notre Dame of the West's" Games

IF THE MALE readers will bear with us for a paragraph or two, we will pass on a few pointers to the little woman. Most of us gals have all we can do to follow a football game and know which end of the pigskin is up. Adapting an "Oh, the pity of it all" attitude, sportscaster Bob Kelley patiently ex-

plained some behind-the-scenes football techniques. Bob is perennially as crisp-looking as a prep-school boy, and among his thirty-odd broadcasting assignments for the current season he will cover Loyola's gridiron clashes.

Press Box

High up in the press box at the stadium, Bob and his two spotters take command. Handling the offensive and defensive plays, they chart

each player's move on their respective peg boards. Binoculars, the old standby, are supplemented with a television screen, situated in a position visible to all three. With lightning-fast observations Bob calculates the plays and calls them. His intensive knowledge of the game also goes a long way in providing interesting side comments. Kelley complements his description of the action on the field with informative, timely remarks on the sport, interspersed with some speculative comment on what the next play might be.

Preparation

Some people do not realize the preparations necessary for staging these gridiron classics. Each team "scouts" its opponent, and the coach is fully informed about the opposition's strong and weak points. Films are made of every game played and they are run and re-run so often that they leave each player with a mental blueprint of the opposition's touchdown plays. Each Loyola player's performance is graded. A top rating is as esteemed as admission to Football's Hall of Fame. Loyola's eleven spend hours poring

Football Lingo

MOUSE TRAP—A defensive lineman is allowed to charge through unmolested; then he's picked off from his blind side by another blocker.

SUBMARINE — Defensive lineman goes *under*, instead of through or over, his blockers in an attempt to stop the ball-carrier.

SCREEN—Pass play where virtually all of the defensive rushers are allowed to charge the passer, who then loops the ball over their heads to a receiver. Point to the play is to give the receiver a number of blockers, hence the title "screen."

STATUE OF LIBERTY—An old play, still used occasionally. The ball-carrier fades back as if to pass, raises his arm, then hands off to a teammate coming by.

STOP AND GO—This is not a traffic signal, but the name of a pass pattern. The receiver goes downfield, stops, then goes on again in an attempt to throw off defending backs.

BUTTONHOOK — Another pass pattern; receiver heads down field, then hooks back toward the line of scrimmage to take a pass.

SALLY RAND—Pet play of Bob Waterfield; the quarterback hides the ball on his hip and goes around end without any interference. Similar to naked reverse.

BOOTLEG—Same as Sally Rand—just another name for play.

PITCHOUT—Quarterback in T-formation pitches ball out to another back who is running wide. This is an underhand, backward pass.

MAN-IN-MOTION—Back on offensive team runs laterally or backward before the ball is passed.

PLATOON SYSTEM—Has nothing to do with armies. Designates modern trend of football where two teams, one offensive specialists and the other defensive experts, are employed by the same school.

QUICK—Just what the name implies. A running play where the quarterback hands right off to the halfback (usually) without even faking. Idea is to get a quick start before opposing linemen know what's happening.

of the fellow in the position opposite him, but he knows his number, his weight and his playing idiosyncrasies. A nervous shifting of the leg may be the giveaway as to what direction the play is going.

Loyola's Bid

Have you ever been the little fellow in the neighborhood gang—just as sturdy and capable as the big fellows—but because you didn't belong in the big boys' league you were excluded from their games? Yet . . . last season seven of those "little" Loyola players were signed by professional teams. Coach Jordan Olivar's charges will be out to retain their championship this season. KNBH will telecast the Lions' home games, emanating from Pasadena's Rose Bowl on Saturday evenings. Loyola has always scheduled evening games to beat the gate competition of the other colleges.

Kelley Calls the Plays

Bob Kelley was selected to telecast Loyola's games because of his excellent presentation. Bob began his career in Elkhart, Indiana, while still a student, by broadcasting his high school's football games. Several years later, Bob captured an enviable sportscasting assignment when he broadcast Notre Dame's great games. Bob has been director of sports for WGAR, WJR and KMPC respectively. Currently, he airs a nightly quarter-hour commentary, "The Parade of Sports," over KMPC. His diversified sportscasting has covered football, baseball, golf and hockey. Broadcasting the Los Angeles Angels baseball and the Los Angeles Rams football games are his exclusive year-round standbys. Kelley's telecasting of the 1950 Rams games won the "Emmy" as the top TV sports show of the year.

There has been speculation that USC and UCLA might some day heed the challenge of "little" Loyola and invite it to play. If they do, you can be sure Bob Kelley will be up in the press box calling the plays.
