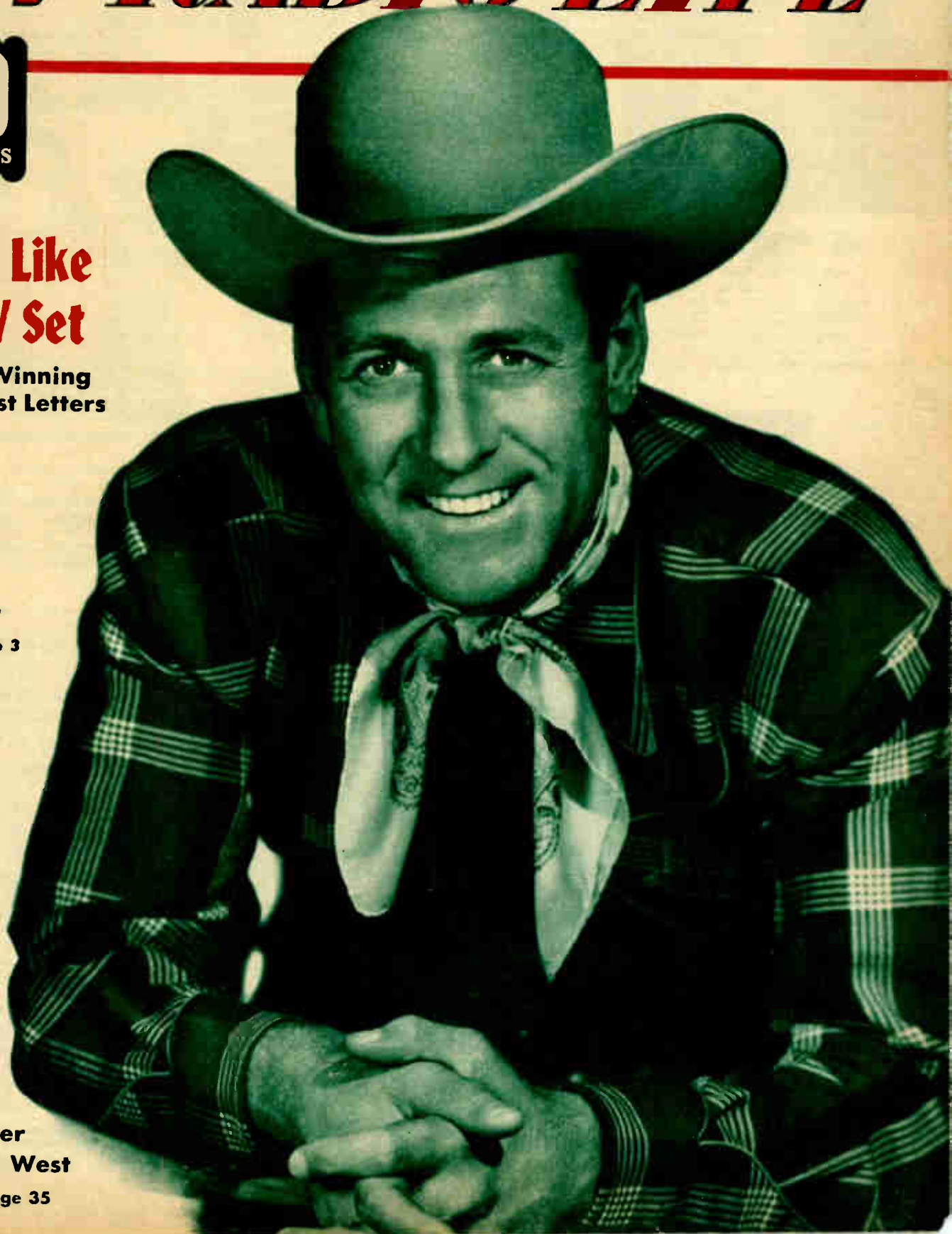

Is Gussie Gorgeous on Camera?

GHE FRILLS that launched a thousand quips, from Santa Monica to Singapore, are evidently a thing of the past for Gorgeous Gussie Moran, who is currently working at being a home-town gal and becoming a new entry in the field of TV glamourites.

And the exuberant miss is making good at her new endeavor via a five-a-week early-evening show in which she exchanges sports chatter with athletically aware Bob Kelley, who, according to Gussie, "keeps me busy learning more about sports than I ever dreamed possible."

Half the people who have looked at Gussie previously on video weren't focusing on her mobile face, but on the much publicized panties which she has sported at tourneys throughout the world. Now, through spending half her days poring over sports sections of newspapers and the other half tossing talk across the cameras at Kelley, Gussie is proving that the pert countenance hides a mind equally as agile as her tennis arm and a personality which bids fair to win her as much acclaim as the famed bits of lace.

All in a Day

"I still spend afternoons practicing tennis, and hope to continue playing in professional matches, but I have had enough globe-trotting for a while. I want to get acquainted with my own back yard," says Gussie on current plans.

Gussie is a localite who was born in Santa Monica. At Lincoln Junior High School, which she attended following her twelfth birthday, tennis is a required subject, so Gussie first took to the racket as a sub-deb. By the time she was thirteen, she had won her first title.

At seventeen the lithesome lass had accumulated shelves full of silverware and gold medals which bespoke her prowess on the courts. However, at that point she began to dread the thought of becoming a muscular Amazon, and so gave up the sport.

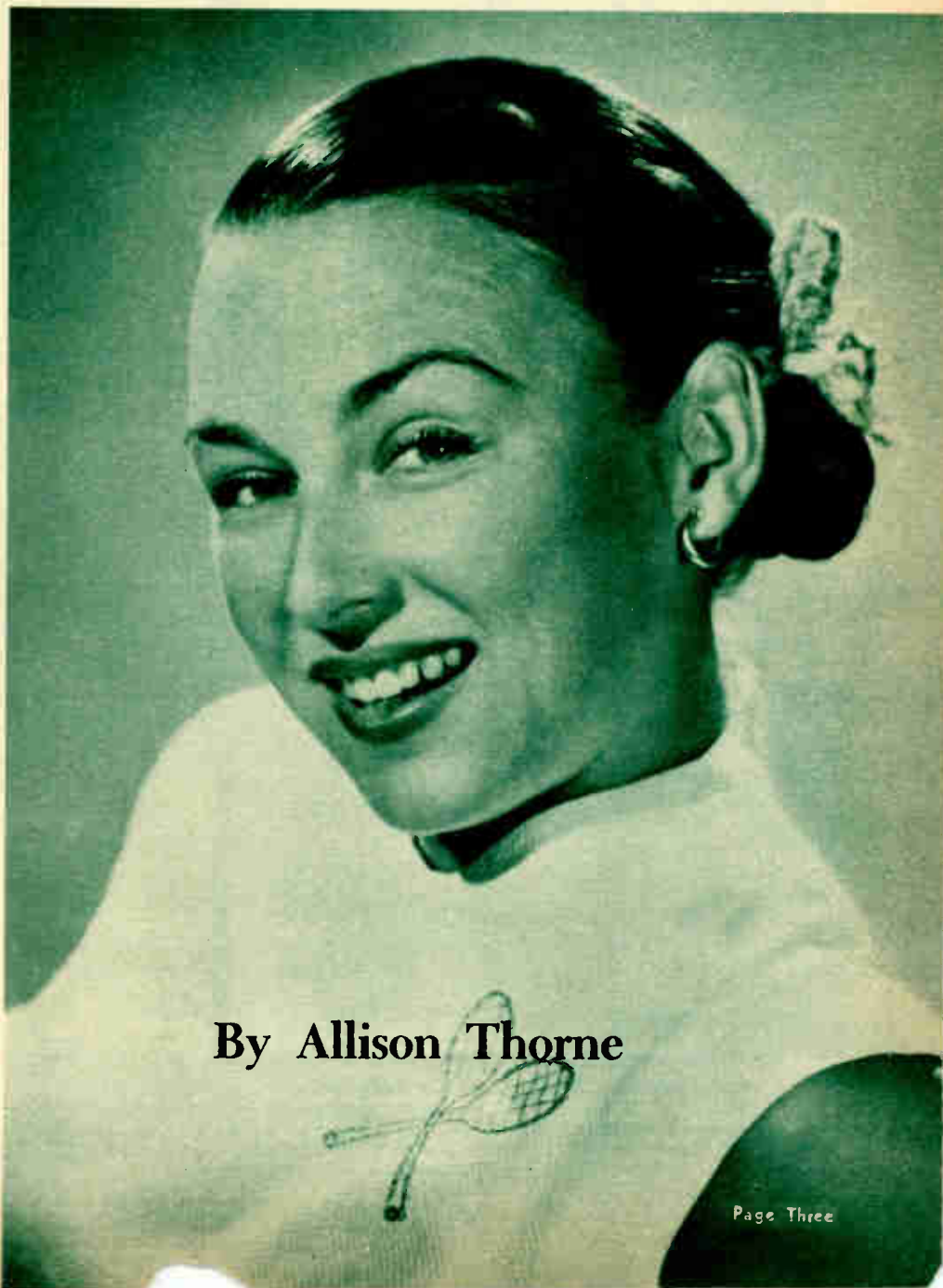
Four years later the lure of tennis proved too much to resist, and under the tutelage of Dick Skeen and Bill Tilden Gussie again joined the court coterie. Before long she had made her mark in the amateur ranks, and in 1950, her last year as a non-pro, she took the championships of

Egypt, India and several in the U.S.

It was during a Wimbledon tennis tourney that her famed lace panties first scorched the tennis scene. "An absolutely unpremeditated move," she explains. "Gordon Tingling, an English designer, asked if he could style a tennis dress for me, but he forgot to include in the finished costume an important item—the pants. When I asked him about them, he came up with the legendary lace trimmings!"

Gussie's interest in clothes extends to mentionables, too. She and her mother design their own wardrobes, keeping mostly to uncomplicated sports-type wearables. Unusual jewelry is another Moran mania, and Gussie sports a particularly intriguing three-banded Indian-ruby-and-emerald ring among her gems.

On romance rumors, the gorgeous one is silent. "I'm happy just being home!" And viewers echo her thought.

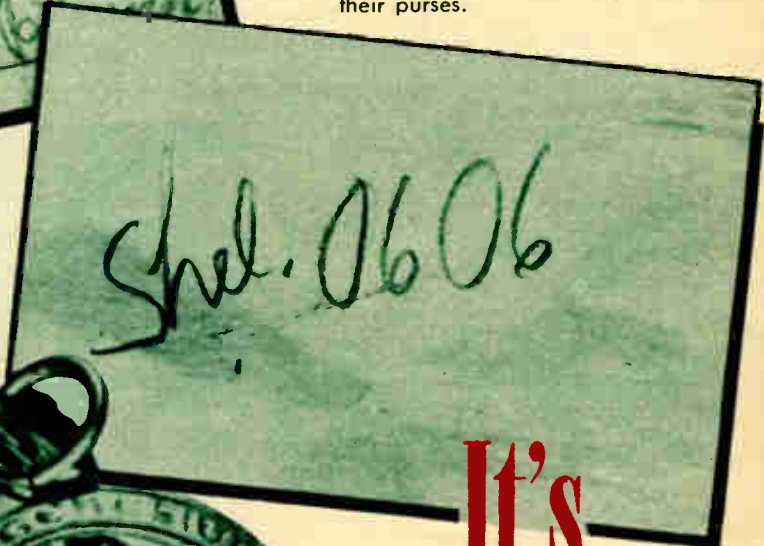

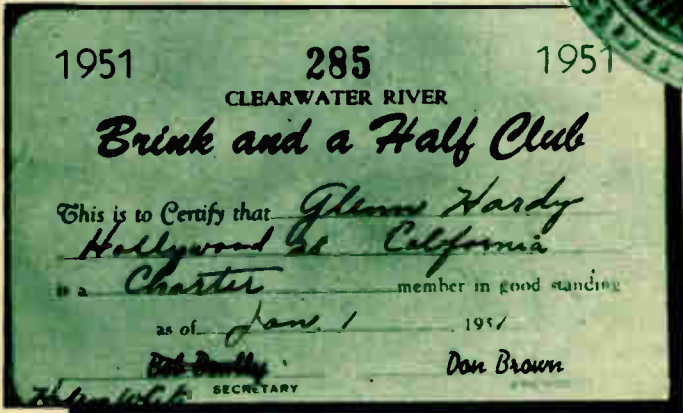

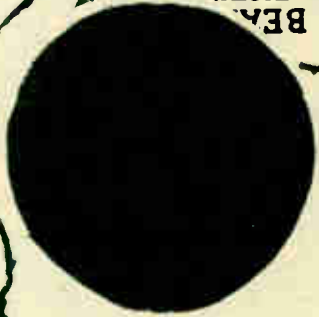

PHILIP NORMAN, radio's gift to the homemaker who is out to cut her budget and yet put the most trustworthy product in her home, could easily be taken for a "pro" football player. He looks the part, with his rugged build, dark crew-cut hair, quick smile and easy, friendly, energetic manner. His ap-

pearance gives one the impression that he is a fellow who is deeply interested in people . . . and he is.

His interest in people and their pets has led him from the mike to a country road and a goat farm populated by 400 pets personally named by their feminine owner. HPL—"Housewives' Protective League"—products have been responsible for Philip Norman, finding himself in some rather outlandish predicaments. Once he plunged into a

bathtub bubbling over with the contents of two boxes of soap suds, just to test the chemical content. Another time he took to chewing wheat germ to discover a product's true value. This chewing test was one that he remembers from his boyhood days in Ohio. He claims that he has tried out everything from vacuum cleaners to diamonds. His wife, who is always far ahead on her food budget, is constantly amazed that all the grocery clerks know him by his first name. Norman claims it's because they see him so often on his shopping excursions for HPL.

His Past

Philip Norman started out to be almost everything but a radio director of a homemakers' airshow. He was born in Columbus, Ohio, and went to the state university, where he played piano in the college band. From music he went into a "pre-med" course at Kenyon College in his home state, later worked as a district circulation manager for the Columbus Citizen, an announcer and salesman for a radio station in Zanesville, Ohio, a butcher and grocer in his father's business, a research chemist during World War II, and later a musical director and producer for the New York Philharmonic and the James Melton broadcasts. It was a little more than a year ago that he came from the East to "Housewives' Protective League," after his recorded voice was selected as "the voice" from dozens of other applicants tested.

His great love for animals is no doubt responsible for the many animal anecdotes which find their way to his airshows. Music, which was at one time to have been his profession, today is one of his hobbies. When it comes to ambitions he has two . . . "to find enough time to get back to playing the piano the way I used to . . . and to get to New Orleans and discover that fascinating city." His passion for history asserts itself in the myriad sidelights from the world's colorful past, which drift effortlessly into his air-time chatter.

The director of HPL lives with his wife and six-year-old daughter, Stephanie, in Hollywood. Although he once collected antiques, Norman has little time for these now in his heavy six-day schedule. In addition to his "Housewives' Protective League" chores, he does an evening KNX broadcast, "Starlight Salute," and spends his Sundays poring over the week's collection of anecdotes gathered by his research staff. The nearest he comes to a hobby now is the ownership of two Siamese cats and the beginning for a chinchilla farm.

Philip Norman's endless interests indicate that he is a man born with more than the average male's share of curiosity, who believes in giving his listeners "constructive and instructive advice" and in warning all buyers that they should "investigate before they invest."

Les Brown and his band are on tour for a couple of weeks, and who has been chosen to replace the Band of Renown on KTLA's "Bandstand Revue," starting Sunday, October 21? Popular Lawrence Welk and his Champagne Music! Welk's two-week stint on "Bandstand Revue" will be in addition to his regular Friday-night-at-10:30 Aragon telecasts. . . . Judy Lawton, popular radio and TV star, is back with "Vets' TV Center," a program designed to inform veterans of their rights, privileges and benefits. Saturday at 8:30 finds Judy welcoming noteworthy guests to KTTV, where they help contribute information. . . . After almost two years of silence on the subject, Erle Stanley Gardner, mystery writer whose "Perry Mason" is better known than his creator, announces that the "Mason" cartoon strip will be filmed for TV. . . . Phonevision has hit a snag in that the Bell Telephone System flatly refuses the system the right to use Bell lines on home-circuit subscription television. Unless Phonevision could prove in court that this sort of coziness on the part of Bell is a hindrance to progress, the stumbling block is a very real one. Only way out is for Phonevision to take specially installed leased wires, but material shortage now makes this almost an impossibility. Zenith is going ahead with an application to the FCC for commercial adoption of the home box-office system. . . . "Boston Blackie," with Kent Taylor starring, is now running on KNBH, Friday nights.

Dinah Shore will start her twice-weekly TV show, for the whole cable, but televised live here from KNBH, on November 27. Chevrolet sponsors. . . .

Mr. William Molder of Long Beach recently had the distinction of being the sender of the 150,000th piece of mail emcee Jack Rourke has received on his KTTV "Ladies Matinee." Mr. Molder thus garnered unto himself a list of valuable prizes for being the lucky sender. Rourke has run up a really remarkable mail count in the first year of "Ladies Matinee," with an average of nearly 2,500 letters a week.

Clete Roberts will return to the United States during the second week of November, following a three-month round-the-world trip. Clete, during his tour, has completed more than 200 fifteen-minute films which have been and are being televised twice nightly over KLAC-TV. Following a visit to Spain, Roberts goes to Israel, Pakistan, Manila, Hawaii, San Francisco, and finally comes home to Los Angeles.

Fight for Fights

That sports-happy razor company doesn't stand alone in its fight to get the Joe Louis - Rocky Marciano fight for televiewers. Several of the major video-set manufacturers are joining Gillette in sponsoring the bout via NBC-TV (KNBH, Channel 4) on October 26.

Admiral, Crosley, General Electric, Motorola, Philco, RCA and Sylvania are those preparing to lend support and shekels to challenging the theater TV and film folk who had secured the popular Ray Robinson-Randy Turpin bout for closed-circuit TV in movie houses.

Noted Briefly

Dorothy Lamour early next month makes her bow on NBC-TV's "All-Star Revue." . . . "The Ruggles" of ABC-TV (KECA-TV) last week celebrated a third anniversary on video, and a 105th performance! . . . For the sixth consecutive year, NBC-TV (KNBH) will televise the Army-Navy football classic under Gillette's banner on December 1. . . . Starting Monday, October 22, KECA-TV's daytime programming got a "new look." So don't depend upon your own old dialing habits. Consult a log and save wear and tear on your nerves.

Can YOU Remember These?

When the "Nation's First TV Station" moves to Mt. Wilson on Sunday, October 28, 1951, it will mark a real milestone in the history of television in Los Angeles. First known as W6XAO, then as KTSL, the now KNXT, Channel Two history includes the following epochal dates:

On May 10, 1931, the first television image on this Coast was transmitted from one side of a room to the other on newly developed all-electrical television equipment. (The first actual TV transmission took place in France in the 1800's.)

A couple of years later, in March of 1933, W6XAO started something by running a full-length motion picture of World-Wide Productions, called "The Crooked Circle." (You can probably see the same feature this week end on some of KNXT's sister stations!)

Also in 1933, March 23, W6XAO carried the first TV coverage of a disaster by means of rapidly processed newsreel film; numerous scenes of the Long Beach earthquake were shown over a period of three days.

On January 1, 1940, the first remote television pick-up west of New York City, the Pasadena New Year's Day Tournament of Roses, was telecast by W6XAO. In March of that same year (mark this, Wild Red Berry!) the station made its first pick-up of boxing and wrestling from the American Legion Stadium in Hollywood.

In May of 1947 began the first sustained televising of an outstanding nationwide radio audience-participa-

tion show, "Queen for a Day," a morning TV program, on the station then gradually becoming known as **KTSL** after its owner, the late Thomas S. Lee.

In May of 1948, on May 6, to be exact, **KTSL** started commercial operation.

Remember what happened in September of 1950? The first microwave telecast between Los Angeles and San Francisco was participated in by **KTSL**, the station that some years before had merely shot a picture across the room. On January 1, 1951, just to start the New Year off right, CBS took over operation and ownership of **KTSL** from the Don Lee Network. On April 1 (no comment!) CBS-TV shows moved from **KTTV** to **KTSL**. Since that date **KTSL** has participated in historic coverages and beamed entertainment regularly, distinguishing itself on October 1, 1951, by presenting the first sporting event ever telecast coast-to-coast—the first game of the National Baseball League playoff, between the New York Giants and the Brooklyn Dodgers.

And on October 28, 1951, Channel Two moves its transmitter from Mt. Lee to Mt. Wilson and becomes known as **KNXT**. It increases its effective visual power from 9300 watts to 25,000 watts, or from 2.56 kw to 25 kw, effective radiated power, practically a ten-fold increase. Aural power will be increased commensurately.

Stop, Listen, Look (Shows You May Like)

"I Love Lucy"

Monday, 9:00 p.m.
CBS-KTSL, Channel 2

The emergence of Lucille Ball as strictly number-one comedienne of our time, evidenced by her performance in "I Love Lucy" on TV, must be generating a tremendous despair and a quiet desire for an early demise

in the hearts of the movie makers—at least those movie makers who let her get past their cameras without turning on some of this same brand of pixie whimsy. She's as droll as Emmett Kelly and as brightly quick as Harpo Marx.

Story line of the "Lucy" comedies concerns "Ricky Ricardo" (as played perfectly by handsome young musician Desi Arnaz) and his wife in a series of ridiculous embroilments that also feature a landlord type and his wife, William Frawley, a face as familiar to moviegoers as is the newsreel rooster's, has stepped into TV in a masterly fashion. His landlord-fellow-conspirator role to Desi's harried-husband routine is the second-best bit of the series.

Actual situations of the scripts are pretty silly stuff. They would be old hat for sure were they less expertly written by Madelyn Pugh, Bob Carroll and Jess Oppenheimer, who, among the other radio credits to their collective names, show the Lucille Ball air show. And were the good scripts less perfectly read and enacted, they would again have a chance to turn up ancient chapeaux. Even in these present scripts, however, there bears a big laugh potential.

For all the good qualities of the series, it is still the title which tells the story. "I Love Lucy" is by virtue of Lucille Ball's presence and performance a brand-new thing in TV entertainment, and should prove one of the most lasting.

The one flaw in enjoyment lay in our having seen this series run through live. Desilu Productions had announced that the series was "a play put on film for TV." A live run-through for the Fourth Estate was by way of demonstrating this cryptic explanation. The riotous comedy that ran by our eyes almost took the edge from the TV version. Everything was in bright hue, but it was the shining, incredible blue of Lucille Ball's

bachelor-button eyes that caused the spectator comment. The red-headed Mrs. Arnaz has never been seen to greater advantage, and this show has to run until color television arrives, if only to catch La Ball in tint. (Say didn't a couple of kids in the East build their own set for just a few dollars?)—J.P.

Freddy Martin Show

Wednesday, 10:30 p.m.
KNBH, Channel 4

This "musical" half hour stacks up visually against any variety show we have seen—with the exception of "Shows of Shows," which is a departure from television entertainment entirely and therefore can never be used as a comparison. Martin has turned a band and its music into production numbers of great originality and freshness.

Freddy actually began to prepare for this show back in 1947, when he foresaw that TV was the coming important medium for bands. Accepting a series of nine telecasts from Hollywood's Palladium that year, he soon discovered that the TV audience was not the ballroom audience. What might entertain dancers left living-room viewers icy, and vice versa. So he began to formulate ideas for numbers, which would be visual. He loaded the band with music men who are also entertainers. He secured specially written material. He even changed the band's clothes. Those tartan jackets which look so sharp on the bandstand aren't for TV. Martin keeps the boys in solid colors now.

This pioneer in band effects, whose concept of music embraced symphonic treatments of pop tunes and dance versions of the classics, is as genial a guy before the camera as any professional emcee his money could buy. And, we suspect, a lot more talented.

A recent Wednesday night half hour typifies what you will see on the Freddy Martin Show. Opening found the maestro on the phone summoning his band members and singers with "Come On a My House." Tiresome as this ditty is, the treatment almost revived it. When the crew arrived at Martin's "new house,"

The production was handled with a deft hand by Alex Siegel, who produced last season's successful "Pulitzer Prize Playhouse." The camera dissolves from one scene to another sustained the effect of a curtain, rising and lowering with each change of scene. Despite visual lapses, due to unforeseeable mechanical difficulties in transmission, the over-all production maintained high stature.

There are some who may favor action-drama in preference to the drawing-room dialogue prevalent on the legitimate stage, but we'll buy "Celanese Theatre" any time.—M.R.

Al Jarvis Show

On the whole, reviewers are pretty honest people.

Some of the best yarns in the journalistic world, however, are told about those sharpies who fail to see a complete show and then slip back to the office and write thousands of blasphemous or praiseworthy comments.

Although we frown (purely from envy) upon such a practice, we'll have to plead guilty when it comes to reviewing the Al Jarvis afternoon show. After all, for those who keep busy during the day (at least when the boss is around), there just isn't time to watch Al's entire five-hour show at one sitting. Nevertheless, bit by bit and skit by skit, we've been able to catch most of Al's features.

These include such things as Grandmother of the Day, a three o'clock movie, letters from overseas, and special guests, usually public-service officials.

As Al himself has said, it is not strictly a one-man show. His two feminine aides, Betty White and Mary Sampley, add glamour and charm to the performance; freckle-faced Jimmy Boyd strings and sings a tune or two; Cliff Whitcomb makes the guests feel at home; Roc Hillman and his six-piece orchestra supply some very listenable music; Sam Balter keeps the sports fans posted on the latest news and race results; and Dr. Wilson ends the afternoon marathon with a few words of reverence.

Through all this, Jarvis interjects his homespun comedy and philosophy.

Being five hours long, it is inevitable that at times the shows bogs down. And occasionally the format gets a little mushy and over-sentimental.

But Al has got the right idea. The great majority of his viewers are women and that's the kind of stuff they eat up.

In short, Jarvis has hit the jackpot, combining good taste with excellent entertainment.—T.H.

On the Ball

with Bob Kelley

Ever since I came west from Cleveland in 1946, I've more or less defended the proud name of Big Ten football. This has been a great stimulant for pulling mail, but unfortunately some of the loyal Westerners have had some rather uncharitable things to say about Old Kel.

For example, I'll bet that I've received this letter a hundred different times from a hundred different people: "Dear Kelley: If you like Mid-



west football so much, why don't you go back there? We don't need you spies out here on the West Coast."

You see what I mean, very uncharitable. Being a confirmed Westerner now, I hope that Coast teams win all their intersectional games with the Big Ten. And that goes for the Rose Bowl, too. Still, hoping is one thing—and analyzing the facts is another.

It has been my contention that team for team, the Big Ten is a better football league than the Pacific Coast Conference. Before the war, the top Coast teams were certainly on a par with the Midwest clubs. But Western football hasn't come back too strongly since World War II.

At least it hadn't till 1951. Out on the Coast this fall we have outstanding football teams in Cal and USC. Stanford, UCLA, Washington, Oregon State and even Washington State are also good clubs . . . teams that can hold their own with any in the nation.

Thus, in 1951, the Pacific Coast Conference has come back. The Big Ten, on the other hand, doesn't seem to have the power of other years. Illinois, the team that figures to represent the Midwest in the Rose Bowl next New Year's Day, is not a real powerhouse. Ohio State has been something of a disappointment. And Michigan State, which is ineligible for Rose Bowl competition, apparently is not as strong as had been figured.

Unquestionably the Coast has its best chance in history to win the Pasadena classic from the Big Ten representative. If the Western representative can't do it this year—well, we may never salvage a Rose Bowl victory.

And in saying this, I hope I've appeased to some extent my letter-writing critics who think I'm the Big Ten's biggest cheer-leader.

I like California. Please let me stay.

After Twenty Years, Gino Garibaldi Is Granddaddy of the Grapplers

From the looks of this muscular matman, and more important from the appearance of his battered opponents, it is difficult to believe that Gino is forty-two years old and the father of the twenty-two-year-old sensation, Leo Garibaldi.

However, for the past twenty years, Gino's fame and reputation have long been recognized from coast to coast and even in Canada.

Under the guidance of old-timer Lloyd Carter, Gino, who had previously concentrated on weight lifting, baseball, and basketball, began his ring career in St. Louis.

Youthful Gino

Reversing Horace Greeley's advice, Gino went east to New York, where he soon established himself as one of the future greats of the matmen. Jim Londos has been universally recognized as one of the greatest heavyweights of all times—and Gino Garibaldi is one of the few men ever to score a fall over the Greek grappler.

During his many years of campaigning, Gino has won the New England, Rocky Mountain, and Pacific Coast wrestling championships.

Incidentally, Gino claims that Ed "Strangler" Lewis is the toughest man he has ever faced, with George Zaharias (husband of the famed Babe Didrikson) and the same Jim Londos running a close second.

Two Tragedies

From what we have said so far, it may appear to our readers that Gino has led a charmed life both in and out of the ring. However, when he and his wife Mary were first married, they suffered two great tragedies.

Their first child, a little girl, died a year after birth as a result of a disease similar to leukemia. They were told at the time that all their future children might suffer the same disease.

When Leo was born, they were overjoyed that he was not afflicted. However, the Garibaldi's still wanted a baby girl.

Their next child was a girl, but within a year she too was afflicted with the strange malady. Gino had made a name for himself in the ring by this time, and he did not let money nor distance stand in his way to save his daughter's life.

She was treated at Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore and then Mayos' in Rochester, Minn.

After a miraculous cure, the child seemed on the road to recovery, and was healthy and happy for several years.

Then one day, while the Garibaldi's were on their way West, the child suddenly became ill again—and died shortly thereafter.

They say that a truly great champion must have the courage and



stamina to make a comeback no matter what the odds. In and out of the ring, Gino Garibaldi has proven that he is made of championship material.

Yogurt Apple Pie

(Just what you've been looking for)

- Pastry for 2-crust 9" pie.
- 5 medium Jonathan apples (4 cups)
- 1/2 c. granulated sugar
- 1/2 c. brown sugar
- 1/2 t. cinnamon
- 1/2 t. nutmeg
- 1/2 t. salt
- 1 container yogurt
- 3 T. flour
- 1 t. vanilla extract

Method:

Line pie tin with bottom crust. Peel and slice apples into a bowl (peeling may be left on, if desired). Mix sugars, flour and spices with salt together, then mix with apples. Fill shell with apple mixture, pour yogurt over all, top with pastry, gashed for steam escape.

Seal edges well, brush top with evaporated milk or cream, sprinkle with sugar, bake at 450 degrees for 15 minutes, then lower heat to 350 and bake for 45 minutes.

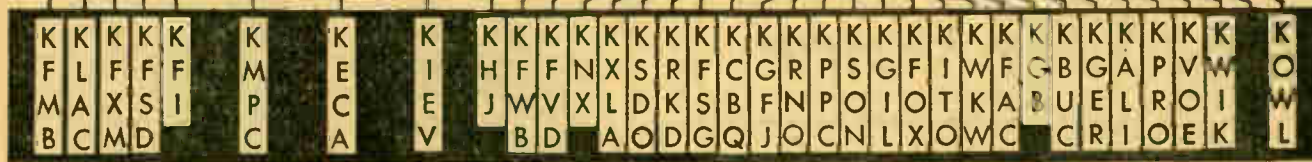

Radio has a lot to offer anyone who has an ear to bend in its direction (even if it means turning eager eyes away from the visual medium) if it presents such air shows as Tuesday night's "Hollywood Theater" production starring Richard Widmark. "Bolero Bones," scripted by Robert Yale Libott and directed by Jack Johnstone, was radio drama at its best. Very appropriate background music added greatly to the effectiveness of the production.

The script unfolded the story of a casual drummer-man who was beating out the music in a small night club in Cuba. When he met the native feminine vocalist, supposedly possessed of weird witchcraft, he succumbed completely. She gifted the drummer with a pair of musical bones, originations of some native women from her backwoods village. These bones continued to haunt him throughout the story. When jealousy reared its ugly head, the drummer-man could not escape the unearthly powers which the singer used to make sure that he never loved another. Even as the story ended, he was pleading with the listener to help him escape her curse, because he "needed help bad, real bad."

This dramatization was handled by experts at the mike, Richard Widmark and Joan Banks. They were ably supported by an excellent supporting cast. One item that made this radio fare outstanding was the sharp, spicy dialogue. There was no doubt at any time that the main character was living, breathing and nearly dying at moments. Without benefit of film or camera the set-sider was captured by the spine-chilling, intriguing tale. Not once did this drama let the listener get away from it. That's saying a lot for any mke offering.

If "Hollywood Theater" continues to put this type of exciting drama on the airwaves it can scarcely help but add laurels to radio's record and increase its vast listening audience. — A.G.

As it turned out, the culprit was not Murder Inc., but only one man—a frustrated comic-book publisher who almost killed "George" and the innocent "Miss Brooks" in a gas-filled room, but who finally fell from a building while trying to escape.

Appropriately enough, the murderer fell through the glass roof of a greenhouse. And where did he land? You guessed it! Smack into the middle of a plot of lilies.

Besides the fact that we scorn the average murder mystery on the air (we are not talking about the well-directed and well-acted ones—they provide radio with some of its top entertainment) we had but one minor objection to this drama. Can't the producers think of a more eerie-inspiring title than "Let George Do It"?—T. H.

Edgar Bergen with his favorite dummy, Charlie McCarthy, came back to radio this season with much the same format and many of the same jokes that brought laughs last year. Of course, with Charlie around dropping Edgar's lines with his own peculiar aplomb, there's always good comedy on the airwaves. Mortimer Snerd appeared in his usual state of confusion, this time over his erroneous school attendance during the summer vacation months.

We suppose that future airings may add fresh approaches to the old stand-by feuds of Charlie vs. Edgar, which will compensate for any slowness noticed in the opening broadcast. Sunday's broadcast originated at the Camp Pendleton Marine base and this setting furnished the opportunity for much jovial dialogue between Charlie and the Marines. "Come On a My House" Rosemary Clooney was the featured guest. She seemed to have great fun doing a disc-jockey skit with Charlie, and only proved again that Charlie always gets the best lines when he has a feminine guest at his wooden elbow. Somehow he seems to get away with a lot more than a live male ever does, and this furnishes more sparkling comedy for the listeners. Rosemary added to the program by vocalizing her "Come On a" hit and a new number "Mixed Emotions."

Edgar Bergen and his writers are always aware of what is going on in the world and know how to twist the timely topics into bright laugh lines. With the competition of television threatening to pull set-siders away from the radio, Bergen does need to keep his eye on comedy story lines. With Charlie and Mortimer on his knee, however, his airshow still promises to offer listeners some of radio's top entertainment during the coming months.—A. G.

Behind the "Soap Opera"

Proof that there is much talent behind the young heroines who play along soap-opera row at the mike are Teri Keane, petite auburn-haired ingenue who plays the lovable and understanding "Chichi Gerard" on NBC's "Life Can Be Beautiful," and Anne Sargent, who plays ingenue "Jocelyn McLeod" in NBC's sudser "The Road of Life." Teri's mother was a noted Hungarian concert singer and her father a businessman. She grew up in New York City among artistic surroundings and as a child did her share of singing, dancing and acting as she dreamed of going on the stage. As a young girl she had parts as a singer and dancer in Broadway hits, but it wasn't until 1949 that Teri, only an inch over five feet tall, got her big chance with Alice Reinheart as "Chichi" on "Life Can Be Beautiful." She was married over a year ago to John Larkin, prominent radio actor, and now has a daughter, Sharon, born recently.

Anne was born in West Pittston, Pennsylvania, and admits: "I wanted to be an actress for as long as I can remember." She studied dramatics at Carnegie Institute of Technology and made her stage debut on Broadway in 1945 in "The Late George Apley." She appeared in a number of Hollywood movies, but didn't begin her radio career until four years ago when she got a part in another leading NBC daytime serial. Anne and her actor husband, Edmon Ryan, live in New York City.

"The Railroad Hour"

Gordon MacRae's starring vehicle, "The Railroad Hour," would not go traveling along smoothly without the guiding hand of engineer Eddie Miller. His past record as a "ham" operator and musician come in handy when he puts over this airshow. There are many elements such as the orchestra, the chorus, MacRae, the guest soloists, the announcer and the sound effects which must be brought into balance. An ordinary musical program does not have this added and complicating problem, but because "The Railroad Hour" is a blend of music and drama, it necessarily must concern itself with all of these elements. Voice levels are different for different singers, and they also are different for the same singer when he sings and when he speaks. On "The Railroad Hour" not only is there a constant intermingling of speaking and singing, but frequently sound effects punctuate and interrupt both of these. Miller is known throughout the country for his success in blending the segments of the program and for putting the final touches on the show. These make the difference between an ordinary broadcast and an outstanding airshow like "The Railroad Hour."

Record Notes to You

Hottest commercial item of the week are the eight oldies from "Moonlight Bay" waxed by Lawrence Welk's Orchestra for Coral—Try to find them all at one shop! . . . Margaret Whiting (Capitol) has a quartet of contrasts in "Bill," "Beer Barrel Polka," "And So to Sleep Again," and "More! More! More!" Maggie gives the first three her usual top treatment, but "More," a languid lush ditty more suited to April than to Margaret, falls far short material-wise . . . even the last word on the record couldn't change my mind. . . . Ray Anthony Orch. (Capitol) has a great instrumental in "Deep Night," the Rudy Vallee oldie. No sweet discing, this arrangement rolls right along with plenty of beat and no problem at all for Mr. Anthony. . . . Kitty Kallen (Mercury) has a nifty novelty platter in the rhythmic "Old Soft Shoe," and "I Wish I Had a Daddy in the White House," with its lyrics built around you-know-which-soprano's Pop. . . . Mary Martin (Columbia) adds a top postscript to her "South Pacific" album with "Loneliness of Evening" and "My Girl Back Home," both from the same show but missing the album. . . . Tommy Dorsey (Decca) features a swell bit of shellac in "Oh, Look at Me Now," with very able vocal assists from Bob London, Frances Irvin, and The Rhythmaires. Not a new tune, by any means, but TD's version should help bring it back. . . . Les Brown Orch. (Coral) has a new etching of "Sentimental Journey," with the Ames Brothers on the vocal that's a dilly—and, for good measure, same combination has a great waxing of "Undecided" on the flip that's hard to beat. . . . The Band of Renown also has a semi-concert version of Gershwin's "American in Paris" that makes for good listening—in fact, it's the best dance-band version on the market. . . . Louis Armstrong (Decca) puts a solid beat behind the ballads "Cold, Cold Heart" and "Because of You," and what comes out could only be Louis' great trumpet and vocal styling; after all, there's only one Satchmo. . . . Decca has also reissued a pair of sides waxed over a decade ago by the late Chick Webb Orchestra, when his vocalist was an up and coming youngster named Ella Fitzgerald. The tunes, just as good today as then, are "A-Tisket A-Tasket," and "Undecided." . . . Jimmy Dorsey Orch. (Columbia) has another fine instrumental in "Manhattan." Flip is the first discing of Haven ("Santa Claus Is Coming to Town") Gillespie's "Jiminy Christmas," good material for holiday trade, but handled weakly by JD's vocalists. . . . Walter Schumann (Capitol) conducts his great choral group in another top pair of arrangements — "Moonglow" and "They Call the Wind Maria." Emphasis here is on the unusual wind effect achieved by echo-chambered voices for "Maria" and its folk motif. . . . Jo Stafford's newest (Columbia) turns out to be one of her best in the pairing of "Shrimp Boats," adapted from an old Cajun French melody and its folk style that Jo does so well, and "Love, Mystery and Adventure," a light, bouncy minor melody with excellent Paul Weston backing.

ALMOST WITHOUT exception the small fry on Doye O'Dell's nightly "Cowboy Thrills" approach the tall cowboy with awe in eye and the question on lip regarding Doye's guns. The question, arising from a comparison of their own nickel-plateds with Doye's cannons, concerns the reality of the latter.

O'Dell's guns are very real and very old. Their owner is a collector of many old guns from the Western days.

How It Started

Doye, who has always been interested in guns, began his collection a few years ago. Before that, he merely admired them, and was well informed about all types of artillery while he worked in the Colt Firearms factory during the war, previous to his enlistment in the U. S. Marines. He could assemble a fifty-calibre machine gun in "nothing flat," and he knew the gun parts as well as he

knew the strings and keys of his well-worn Gibson guitar.

His real start in gun collecting started, however, more than six years later. It was after his discharge from the Marines, and also after a fabulously good start in Hollywood with a contract at Republic Pictures and a recording contract behind him.

Doye was on a rodeo tour, headlining a show under the banner of his old friend Wild Bill Elliott, when the first real item for his collection happened his way. This was in 1947 in Toledo, Ohio.

A grizzled, weather-worn one-time cowboy who relived his Western days of the past by haunting the rodeos that came to town, hobbled over to Doye one night between acts. He looked Doye over closely, and nodded his head in satisfaction. Then he handed over a forty-one-calibre Rim-fire Derringer, the old-time gambler's gun.

"Don't have no kin to leave this to," he muttered in a hoarse voice, "but I know a man who respects

good things when I see one. Reckon you might like this."

Appreciative

Doye took the small gun in his hand and listened to the old-timer's tale. The gun had originally belonged to one of the many smooth-talking, fancy-dressed gamblers who had infested the frontier towns in the youth of the West. This old fellow had won it fair-and-square in a poker game. When the gambler tried to get it back in a later ambush outside the saloon, the old-timer had not only won a gun but had provided the town sheriff with a wounded gambler ready to be run out of town.

Although Doye tried to tell the old-timer he hated to take the keepsake away from him, the old man had made up his mind that he liked Doye, and that Doye was to have it. Thus the gun collection began.

Now O'Dell's collection is fabulous. He has gathered several single-action forty-five-calibre Colt Frontier models as his preference—besides the little Derringer—as these guns are known as "the gun that won the West." He has two of the first double-actions that Colt ever put out, and also several twenty-two-calibre pistols that were made in the 1880's. His prize and most cherished items, though, are a perfectly matched pair of Colt single-action forty-fives. These guns he wears every night on TV—the same guns all his host of young partners point at awestruck, to say—

"Say, Doye—are them real, honest-to-goodness guns?"

life. "My biggest thrill was becoming an American citizen. My calendar was circled on a certain June 2, many years ago, as the big day. For some reason the judge who issued the citizenship papers withheld mine. He invited me to be his guest at a typical July 4th celebration. I'll never forget that Independence Day in 1929. In Seattle's largest park, before an assembled crowd, the judge presented me with my cherished citizenship, citing my successful adjustment to my adopted country. I was so touched by his magnanimous gesture that I broke down and cried unabashed."

Apprentice Jeweler

This energetic sexagenarian almost became a jeweler instead of a renowned chef. Following in the footsteps of his late father, who was a jeweler for Italian royalty, he became an apprentice to a Chicago jeweler. However, when young Joe Milani received his wages at the end of his first week's work—the exorbitant sum of \$2.50—his ambitions to create a thing of joy and lasting beauty faded, but fast. His acquaintance with the famous Parisian Chef Bonner, of Chicago's Palmer House, opened new vistas for Milani. Determined to become a successful gourmet, too, Joe started as a potato peeler. From that day on he parlayed thrift, good taste and his own delight in food into radio, television shows, the food-canning business,

Insight into the lives of people he interviews is a Tusher forte. But still more commendable is his attitude toward his audience. He firmly believes in the existence of adult, intelligent listeners. He will *not* talk down to "mythical eleven-year-old mentalities." With no script to guide the stars, no prompting by anyone, the fast-talking commentator puts his stars on their toes and gives listeners rare glimpses of off-screen personalities.



Tusher is most gratified that his audience recognizes what he is trying to do. When listeners register approval via such letters as one forwarded from a fan in Pasadena, "It is refreshing to find such frank, honest, intelligent appraisal of moviedom and its folk," Tusher reaffirms the efficacy of his "Hollywood Without Humbug" byword.

News His Business

His experience as a news reporter and editor is evident in the work of this stocky, curly-haired man. His frank approach to news was evident in such earlier assignments as a by-line column in which he alternated daily with Earl Wilson on the New York Post, and in several other editorial positions he has held since he first left high school in his native New York City to become a sixteen-year-old court reporter for a Manhattan daily.

He arrived on the Hollywood scene in 1946, shortly after his discharge from the army, accompanied by his lovely wife, former actress Elizabeth Willett.

He's been seeing stars in a new and better light ever since, and his glimpses, transmitted to listeners, have proved some of the most enlightening on the Hollywood scene. Numbered among his staunchest listeners are four-year-old Dayton, William Jr., two, and nine-month-old Wendy Lynn, who, Tusher is sure, will grow up with "a healthy attitude toward Hollywood, without humbug."

From Novel To Soap Opera

*"Kings Row" Lives On
After Author Is Dead*

"KINGS ROW" lives, although its creator has died. Katherine Bellamann, who is in her sixties now, is continuing the story of "Dr. Parris Mitchell" started ten years ago by her now deceased husband, Henry Bellamann. The noted author and musician died before he could complete the second of the three planned novels concerning the "Kings Row" people. The radio script is now being done by Welbourne Kelly, noted script writer.

But this is not really the first time that the Bellamanns have been concerned with radio. For a number of years they had music studios across from Carnegie Hall in New York City, where Henry Bellamann taught piano, and his wife Katherine, singing. Many times Major Bowes would call upon them to rush some of their pupils over for his Amateur Hour.

Her Husband

After her husband's death, Mrs. Bellamann went back to Jackson, Mississippi, where she was born. From there she carries on a constant three-way correspondence with Max Wylie, director, and Welbourne Kelly. In speaking of her husband, Mrs. Bellamann said simply, "He was a

great man and spoke four languages like a native. After we were married, we went to Europe to study. We lived on the left bank of the Seine, as all struggling young artists do. We had a little flat and almost no money, but my husband began collecting the works of Dante, a collection which was later presented to Duke University, and many times we went without dinner so we could buy another edition. My husband was a great advocate and student of psychophysics, and was one of the first in this country to recognize the genius of Sigmund Freud. At our home we often had gatherings of the great psychiatrists of the time. That is why I can write with authority on the subject, and I am almost as flattered as my husband was by the fact that 'Kings Row' is required reading by the staffs of most hospitals in Canada."

Adult Drama

"The young actor Francis DeSales, who plays Dr. Mitchell in the radio series, looks much like our conception of the character. I'm so proud to be associated with the radio production and I enjoy hearing the characters come to life from the pages of our books. I want to write another book about 'Parris Mitchell,' and the serial program is proving a great inspiration."

The sponsors of "Kings Row," which was their first radio show after nine years' absence, are dedicated to the premise that they are going to "do adult daytime drama for the first time and get away with it."
