#### TV Series

Some of Donlevy's own TV thrillers don't equal Judy's escapades. His "Dangerous Assignment" is the product of three men . . . Brian Donlevy, Bob Reiff, writer, and Bill Karn, director. These three men, after playing around with the idea for over three years, today work together on the film and radio series from nine to five o'clock every weekday. They set some sort of production record recently when they made five films and six radio shows in two weeks. The first day they filmed a TV version they were able to quit a half hour early. After that they did away with the producer and now get along without one.

Donlevy was born in Ireland, came to the United States at the age of ten months and has been a schoolboy soldier, a pilot, an Annapolis student, a collar-ad model and a Broadway actor. He has played in more than sixty motion pictures, including such memorable films as "Wake Island," "Command Decision" and "The Great McGinty."

He collects antiques, which he repairs himself in his own workshop, and is an enthusiastic gardener. He is also fond of flying his plane and keeps close tabs on one of his major investments, a tungsten mine in the Mojave Desert.

When vacation rolls around, Donlevy will be out fishing and hunting, but not because he is an outdoor enthusiast. He said, "I go to some place like Yosemite because Judy wants to go. Whatever she says goes."

The star of "Dangerous Assignment" admits that he doesn't like to talk about himself, but he never stops talking about his Judy. He admitted, too, that "raising a girl is rough. A boy must be easy for a man compared to that."

# Brian Donlevy Is a "Softie"

*When It Comes to Judy*

**B**RIAN DONLEVY was known as a tough guy long before he moved into television on KNBH's "Dangerous Assignment." From where you sit beside your TV screen watching him get knocked around and knock other guys around you feel sure he must be a tough guy . . . but he isn't when it comes to his daughter, Judy.

Judy, according to Donlevy, "is going on ten and is already acting like an actress." It seems that the star of "Dangerous Assignment" promised Judy that she might have a role in one of his future TV scripts. Judy lost patience, however, after a couple of weeks and said to him one night as he was paging through his latest

"Dangerous Assignment" script, "Daddy, if you don't have a part for me in that one, I guess I'll just have to give up the whole idea."

#### A Story About Judy

Donlevy related one story about his Judy which leaves little doubt that she takes after her famous TV private-eye father. One day Judy's nursemaid called him excitedly from his Malibu home stating, "Judy has killed a rattlesnake, Mr. Donlevy." Thinking the nursemaid to be overly emotional about the matter (and believing neither she nor Judy knew what a rattler looked like), Donlevy quickly dismissed the matter. When he arrived home he was greeted by Judy, proudly shaking a string of rat-

# The Show With a Heart

*Southern Californians Have Been Sharing Benefits From a Giveaway That Places "The Loot" in Places Where It Will Do the Most Good*

**T**HE SHOW with a heart. That is the only apt description for the CBS-TV program which each week selects people worthy of help and offers them an opportunity to "Strike It Rich."

This New York-originated show recently became even more interesting to Southern Californians when the sponsors, in an attempt to aid deserving people in Los Angeles and surrounding communities, formed the Helping Hand Club of Southern California.

Almost immediately thousands of letters began pouring in to Box 168, Hollywood 28. Surprisingly enough, many of the letter-writers weren't asking for help themselves. Rather they wanted to see someone else get a break, someone who was less fortunate or who had been beset with an unusual amount of hard luck.

A panel of judges was selected to read through the letters, and each week they picked the most deserving person to be flown via TWA to New York and a chance to "strike it rich" with emcee Warren Hull.

First one to go was Mrs. Irvin Wood, 4173 Woolwine Drive, Los Angeles. She won the maximum \$500 cash award and was given \$350 in ACTH drug for her son, an asthmatic patient, plus clothing, via "Heart Line" telephone calls.

When she reported that her family had to dispose of their car, her engagement ring, a recorder and her husband's \$4,000 violin to meet medical bills, she received additional calls from local "Helping Hands" resulting in donations of three violins, an offer

from the Los Angeles Board of Education for her husband to teach music in city schools, and consideration for her son to be enrolled in the Sun-Air Camp at Tujunga.

#### More Help

The Helping Hand Club was instrumental in making Dorothy Ward of 867-A Seventh Street, Oxnard, a very happy winner. She was selected to make the trip because her husband, just out of the Navy, was killed by a hit-and-run driver, leaving her with five children. Two were seriously hurt and required constant medical attention.

Unable to make the trip, Mrs. Ward designated Horace Ditchfield of Oxnard as her representative. He "struck out" on the \$120 question with Warren Hull, but won a sewing machine and clothes for her. A few days later the Helping Hand Club discovered "Strike It Rich's" research staff had made a mistake on the question Ditchfield missed. Advised of this, producer Walt Framer of "Strike It Rich" ordered \$500 drawn from the "Heart Fund" and sent immediately to Mrs. Ward.

Delores Langley, 2409 Foxglove Drive, Monterey Park, afflicted with an incurable disease of the spinal cord, sought to "strike it rich" for dental work and a typewriter. She won two typewriters, \$260 in cash, a complete outfit of clothing and other "Heart Line" calls.

Mrs. Lloyd Darrell, 1431 Casma Court, San Pedro, was the next to go to New York and "Strike It Rich." Her six-year-old daughter, Jean, was born with a large tumor on her neck and money was needed for a second operation. Mrs. Darrell told Warren

Hull what her little girl had said. "God doesn't love me or he wouldn't have put this thing on my neck so the kids can call me 'fat neck'." Mrs. Darrell won \$500, enough for the operation.

Thomas Goens, 7863 East Hellman. San Gabriel, presented a tragic case and was voted a chance to fly to New York. Returning from a funeral in the East, his car hit a ditch and turned over. His wife was killed instantly and Goens and his five children were injured seriously. It took months in the hospital before they recovered. Goens won \$360 and got numerous "Heart Line" calls offering additional help from all over the country.

#### Another Case

Another winner was Mary Ellen Foran, 3210 Madera Street, Los Angeles. When she went to a doctor to have her right foot examined, it was discovered she had an unusual type of cancer and the leg had to be amputated. At the time of the amputation, she was expecting a child. She already had two children. Her husband was a plasterer but, because of Southern California's "unusual" wet winter, had worked but infrequently.

Mrs. Foran won the maximum of \$500 and "Heart Line" calls guaranteed her another \$125, plus complete outfits of clothing for her children. That "Strike It Rich" is doing a wonderfully warm job to help people is summed up forcefully in the statement Mrs. Foran made when she returned from her New York trip, "It's been the most wonderful experience of my life and proves to me that people really want to help each other!"

At the Western Airlines terminal, Vance Colvig (he's really "Nutsy") was

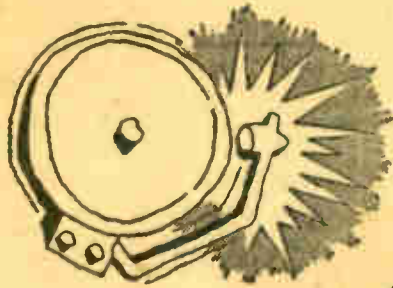

Then the realization comes one day that they have something very much in common—the wrath of John Q. Public (and the press, which attempts to act as a voice of the people).



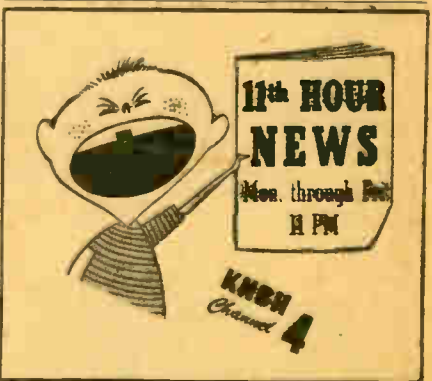

## Collegiate Acting Competition

The Intercollegiate Acting Competition sponsored by CBS Radio's "Philip Morris Playhouse on Broadway" is drawing to a close. On August 31 the four finalists will compete (KNX, 8:30 p.m.) for the \$2000 prize in acting fees and for a foot in the doorway to a drama career. The entertainment field at large has decried the need for "new blood" in its ranks. Maybe Philip Morris will come up with some convincing talent along with their cigarette commercials.

## "Sherlock Holmes" the Master

Writers of whodunit stories for radio revert to the old master, "Sherlock Holmes," for their material, dressing it up in plots revolving about "Johnny Dollar" (Edmund O'Brien), "Mr. and Mrs. North," "Randy Stone" (Frank Lovejoy), or "Danny Clover" (Larry Thor).

Adrian Conan Doyle, son of the writer, discussing "The Adventures of Sherlock Holmes" on CBS Radio's "Invitation to Learning," revealed that Holmes pioneered such standard detective devices as the employment of plaster of Paris for preserving footmarks and delicate finger and hand impressions; the examination of dust in linings of men's trousers and hatbands; differentiation between kinds of cigarette ash, and recognition of the different types of tobacco ash from pipes, cigarettes or cigars.

That's what George Fenneman, personable announcer on Groucho Marx's NBC "You Bet Your Life" show, believes after facing studio audiences and choosing the contestants for each program.

Fenneman said, "I'll ask if there are any housewives in the studio and a forest of hands will spring up. I know I'm going to alienate a lot of women but all I can choose are a very few, from whom only one is selected. One woman snarled at him, "I'll get you, you rat," after he passed her in selecting contestants.

Fenneman admits that he even has his troubles with the servicemen. "The servicemen are fun, but sometimes a lot of trouble. Asking if there are any Marines in the house practically invites an invasion and I'm always the poor guy in the middle."

This popular emcee has devised a way of shaking some of the responsibility from his shoulders. He'll usually ask about twelve people from the audience to go backstage, and of course only six get on the show. The other six are eliminated by the studio audience by its applause. Fenneman sets up little contests, asking one person, for instance, to pretend he's a reporter phoning in the news of a murder and the other potential contestant to pretend he's a deep-sea diver discovering sunken treasure. The two ad-lib what they would do in such situations and the audience chooses by popular choice.

"Still in all," smiles George, "one of these days I expect some irate member of the audience to swing on me. When that happens, I quit."

# Lou Thesz Sez:

(This week, Jules Strongbow, TV-Radio Life's Wrestling Editor, has Lou Thesz, World Heavyweight Wrestling Champion, doing a guest column for him.)

Being the World Heavyweight Wrestling Champion is a tremendous responsibility, and as long as I wear the belt I will endeavor at all times to meet that challenge. When I won the undisputed title

from Baron Leone and thus hold undisputed recognition by the National Wrestling Alliance, I knew that from now on I must not only fulfill my responsibility to the public by meeting all worthy challengers but that everything I do, everything I say, everything I write will be watched closely by the sports fans of the nation and abroad, and I will always try to be worthy of the championship honors bestowed upon me.

Wrestling to me is the greatest sport on earth. Baseball is fine, but it's a team game—so are football and basketball. But in wrestling, you are on your own when you step into the ring. Boxing is much the same sport, but when it comes to body contact or self-defense—wrestling is tops.



Self-defense is a means of defending yourself in a struggle, sometimes to the death. When our soldiers fought the enemy in World War II and now in Korea—they knew they had to win when the enemy faced them in bodily contact. There were no referees to say: "Break" when they met them. They knew they had to win or possibly suffer death or capture. That's why wrestling is supreme

because any ordinary wrestler can defeat the greatest of fighters in a mixed match. That has been proven time and time again.

This is no challenge, because a champion does not do the challenging. But merely as an illustration, I know I could go into a ring against the three greatest heavyweight boxers in the world—meet them one at a time with myself wrestling and them boxing—and I could defeat them all in less than five minutes.

Wrestling is now, in my opinion, the top body-contact sport, and it is thriving all over the United States and Canada and in many other parts of the world.

The National Wrestling Alliance, an affiliate of promoters in our country, Canada, Hawaii and elsewhere, has put new life into the sport, and the heavyweight and junior heavyweight crowns mean something.

Under the leadership of Sam Muchnick, president of the N. W. A., the organization has jumped from originally six leading offices to thirty-six of the top offices of wrestling and the promoters always are doing things to help the sport.

All wrestlingdom is awaiting the coming convention at Santa Monica on September 5, 6 and 7, when wrestling legislation will be enacted. I am going to Honolulu late in August and will return in time for the convention which promoters from all over the globe will attend.

Rourke and Jack Wheeler entertained nightly for over an hour at a time, with Rourke, in addition to emceeing, dressing up and doing spectacularly funny impersonations. He got himself up as either "Bombo" or "Bimbo" of a clown team by the same name during another period and pitched at juveniles. This particular reporter strongly suspects it was Rourke himself who paraded as "The Masked

Spoooner," a hooded soft-talker who gained national prominence a few years ago with his voice and cloak. Rourke denies this as a ridiculous assumption on our part. He merely "managed" the "Spoooner."

#### His Met Debut

# Baseball Ain't What It Used to Be!

**C**OMPARING PERCENTAGES, performances, and persons has always intrigued the human mind. This is especially true of baseball fans.

How many times have you heard such arguments as who was greater, Ruth or DiMaggio, Feller or Johnson, Gehringer or Gordon? Who had the best teams? the best hitters? the greatest this? and the greatest that?

This hot-stove-league chatter is endless, sometimes even pointless, but always interesting.

One of the oldest controversies (which will never cease) is: "Are the baseball players of today as good as the old-timers?"

In a recent, provocative magazine article, Ty Cobb defended the old-timers. Bert Dunne, KHJ-TV sportscaster, agrees with Cobb, but for different reasons.

Whereas Cobb was speaking from the player's viewpoint, Bert approaches the subject from the scholar's angle.

A former pro himself, the forty-nine-year-old announcer has written several textbooks on baseball, and in the words of his lifelong friend, Joe Cronin, "He is the greatest exponent of the art of hitting."

## Bert's Background

Born in Boston, Bert received his

degree in English at Notre Dame in 1926. A former publicity director for Knute Rockne, and one of South Bend's finest baseball products (his .519 batting average for one season is still the school's record), outfielder Dunne joined the New York Giants in 1926.

He was later farmed out to the Eastern League, where he hit a neat .353. However, "The Brain" always had arm trouble, and as one Giant scouting report stated: "He can't throw across the street." (Because he had never been taught to throw properly as a youngster, this is one big reason Bert has tried to teach kids the right way.)

Rather than knock around the minors, Bert completed his graduate studies, worked as a sports scribe, and finally went into the advertising business for thirteen years. Since 1942 he has written five books on baseball and made over nine visual-education pictures.

## Bert Explains Why

Bert's main premise has always been that "ball players are made, not born. With the proper training any youngster can be taught to play baseball up to his maximum potential.

"I'm not saying everyone can be a major-leaguer. Naturally, that's not everyone's potential.

**DURING ONE OF BERT'S KHJ-TV programs, Chuck Stevens of the Hollywood Stars was presented with a plaque by the girls from the Associated Telephone Company, who named him the "Star player least likely to get a busy signal from a phone operator."**

"But I do say—and I've proved this—that no boy can be a ball player if he violates certain basic fundamentals.

"There are many reasons why the players of today do not live up to the old standards. First of all—and something to which I've devoted a great part of my life—they learn too many habits during the formative years. You can't do much with a boy over sixteen because his throws and hitting are already formed.

"The boys of today also have many more activities to keep them busy.

"Then there are always other sports cutting in on baseball. Football and basketball, in particular, are more lucrative for young, promising athletes."

What is Bert Dunne's solution?

"A baseball academy. That would help. A place where boys would eat, sleep, and talk baseball, and only baseball. If such an academy were formed, I believe the players of the future would come closer to the old-timers than the players of today do."

During 1942-45, Bert took twenty boys at random in San Mateo. He taught them the fundamental dos and don'ts of the nation's favorite pastime.

Today, of these same twenty boys, eleven are in pro baseball or the Army; five are in college, and four of them quit the game and didn't play at all.

Besides these, Bert has helped thousands with his books and movies—and his TV show "Dugout Dope."

"Mr. Scientific of Baseball" (as former umpire Beans Reardon calls him) is one scholar who has put his theories into actual practice.

He claims he has the friendliest fifteen minutes on the air. According to Jack, "It's not the most important show, but we have never faked a thing. We're honest and we don't believe in gimmicks or hokum."

When Jack came West, he left behind a rambling farmhouse in Yorktown Heights, New York, his wife and four children: Carol, twenty-one; Shirley, seventeen; John, nine; and Molly, five. Carol is about to graduate from Finch College in the East. Shirley has ideas of her own about her future. John wants to play the piano, and Molly isn't quite sure yet what she wants.

Although Jack is about to get his feet wet in his own TV show, he said, "I'm very happy in radio and I hope it will go on forever."

## About TV

About TV he stated, "A lot of people crowded into it before they realized their own limitations. I believe in being Jack Berch on whatever medium I appear. Once I wasn't Jack

Berch on TV and it was a fiasco. Good horse sense will work in every medium."

When he goes into his own television format, Jack said it will be more or less the same type of thing he does on the air. "I want to tell the story of wonderful people. I'm only a mouthpiece for them."

When he was here he received one of his highest compliments. He called a long-distance operator to place a call to his sister-in-law in Santa Ana. When the operator heard his name she promptly told him, "Oh, Jack Berch. I listen to your show . . . and you always make me feel so nice."

Although he leads a busy life, as he also is sales manager and partner of an industrial film company, Jack said, "I live a wonderful life."

If there is anything wrong with his life, it might be his unsatisfied desire to originate his air show from Hollywood. He told us, "I'd love to originate my show from the West Coast, but it's just a happy dream at present."

These famous "Sons" ad-lib as much as they follow the rehearsed portions of their daily "Lucky U Ranch" radio show. They have no printed business agreement that binds them together; they just stick.

Lloyd Perryman, spokesman for the group, explained how the song men managed this friendly arrangement. "If one of the boys gets out of line, we just beat the hide off of him." Lloyd, the youngest member of the group, is a native of Wild Cherry, Arkansas. Before joining the "Sons" he rode the rods to California, where he spent many days working on ranches. He has been with the aggregation for sixteen years, lives in Burbank with his wife, "Buddy," and seven-year-old son, Wayne.

Many of those classic Western arrangements such as "Cool, Cool Water" and "Tumbling Tumbleweeds," which the "Sons of the Pioneers" have recorded and aired, feature either Lloyd's tenor voice or vocal treatment by Tommy Doss or Ken Curtis.

## Ken Curtis

Ken, whom you have probably seen many times in Western movies, was born and raised on a cattle ranch in Colorado. He has done more than his share of riding, roping, and "shootin'" besides singing. It was after his memorable platter vocalizing with Jo Stafford on "Tumbling Tumbleweeds" that he went with the "Sons." Ken is single, lives in Hollywood and possesses a charm that is the envy of many of the nation's top male vocalists. At one time he traveled with top hands and sang with both Tommy Dorsey and Shep Fields.

Tommy Doss is the member of the vocal group whose gravel-like voice you hear doing the solo part in their ever-popular rendition of "Cool Water." Tommy has two sons, Dennis, eight years old, and Tim, three. He came from Oregon, where he was a lumberjack, married an Oregon girl, and now lives in Burbank. Tommy's idea of vacationing is to spend his free time in Oregon hunting and fishing.

Two of the "Sons" are brothers, Hugh Farr and Karl Farr. They came from Texas and have both spent time punching cattle on the ranch. Hugh is known as "the man with the flying fiddle," while Karl is often called "the man with the galloping guitar."

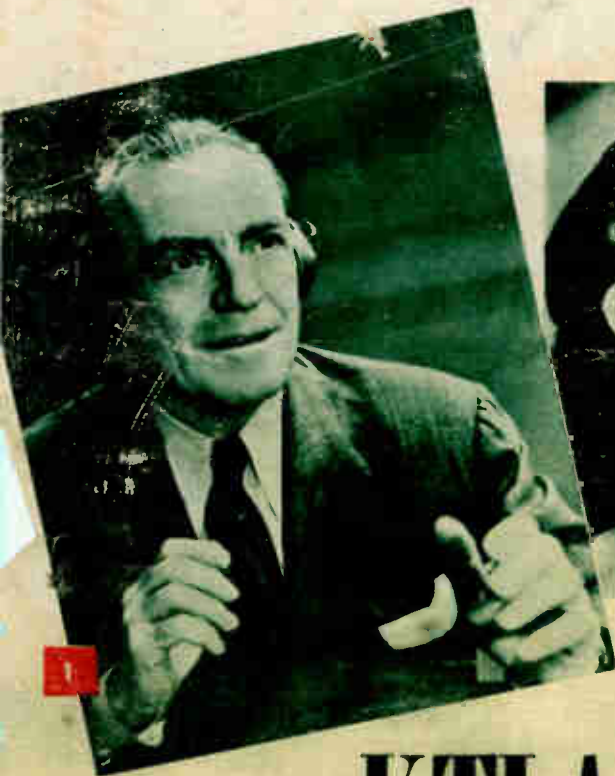
They hope soon to branch out into TV, but are waiting until they can find the format that will allow them to bring viewers the same informality for which they are so well known.
