Norma Gilchrist Combines Beauty and Brains to Be

THE RED-HEADED, vivacious charmer behind the camera who is identifiable as "Helpfully Yours" is none other than exuberant Norma Gilchrist.

Viewers learn thrift, short cuts in homemaking, and beauty and fashion hints from this ambitious young lady. The sum total of her diverse experiences is brought into focus on her KNBH telecasts. The unattached Miss Gilchrist was oriented into the loving-hands-at-home routine at an early age. Her father firmly believed that his daughter should know the fine art of homemaking. As a result of his "Victorian" ideas, Norma knew more about cooking and sewing at twelve than most brides of today.

Norma's interest in fashions was handed down to her from the womenfolk in the Gilchrist family. She studied fashions in New York. During NBC's experimental television era, Norma appeared on the first TV fashion show ever to be telecast. Making new things out of old has become her hobby. She blames her thrift on her Scottish descent. The slogan of her teleshow is "How to do it better without spending a single cent more." She can convert a pair of ruffled organdy curtains

into a frilly peasant blouse or a voluminous petticoat. Every gimmick Norma televises she perfects at home, spending much of her leisure time testing and experimenting with a Gilchrist invention.

Accomplishments

For a gal so young, Norma has had a long list of accomplishments. Apparently her Vermont rearing had something to do with her restlessness or love of activity. (People from that chilly clime have to move about to keep warm.) Norma leaped from fashion designing to modeling. She was a John Powers model for seven years, appeared in Broadway musicals; was sales and fashion coordinator for several New York department stores; was a beauty and fashion editor for national periodicals and an advertising and publicity representative.

Digging behind this forceful personality we found that she has very definite ideas on any subject. Having a gregarious nature, she'll talk about anything, any time and any place.

No Strings

Since there are no strings attached to glib Norma we asked about her dream man. And she told

us plenty! He must possess integrity and intelligence. He must be discriminating and ambitious and must exercise propriety. She would like him to be launched upon his career, but not to have reached his zenith until she comes along to help him. Mutual respect and similar interests are also vital to the scheme of things.

Tastes

Norma is adamant on the subject of crass and phony individuals. Her likes in music run the gamut from Tchaikowsky to Louis Armstrong, Rosemary Clooney, Patti Page, Al Martino, and Eddie Fisher are her favorite pop vocalists. Her pet diversions are almost any form of the theater arts . . . music, ballet, drama. Norma prefers reading historical biographies, and when reading she always keeps a dictionary at her side.

Her plans for the future are twofold . . . a happy marriage and writing a book, which will be a composite of her varied experiences. At present she hopes that her KNBH program will influence homemakers to lead a fuller and richer life, then she will know that she has been really "Helpfully Yours."

Tears and Cheers

Are Natural Accompaniments of Ralph Edwards's New TV Series Re-Creating The Lives of Big and Little People

ESCORTED BY EDWARDS to a nearby love seat, the lovely actress crinkles up to cry as he tells her "This Is Your Life, Joan Caulfield Ross!" (Later, Joan said she felt as if someone had hit her in the tummy. Friends thought she was going to faint.)

A MINK STOLE setting off her blonde beauty. Joan Caulfield arrived casually at NBC's El Capitan Theater to help out her good friend Ralph Edwards. Little did she dream that this night, within the hour in fact, she was to be on television coast to coast as central figure of "This Is Your Life"!

A giant conspiracy had been responsible for getting the lovely Joan into the studio. She had been asked to pose for pictures with Henry Wilson, "an old Colorado miner," supposed to be the surprise "This Is Your Life" guest. Wilson, so Miss Caulfield was informed, was quite a character who had made and lost a fortune near Denver. Wilson's friends and relatives with whom he was being reunited were also rugged characters who had expressed the wish to meet a real live movie star. Nothing would thrill them more. So Joan had consented to appear onstage before the telecast and meet Henry Wilson as the big surprise was sprung. Ralph was going to point him out, then Edwards and Joan would walk down

the aisle to where "the old miner" was sitting to escort him to the platform.

"He would get a charge out of it if you kissed him," Ralph suggested to Joan before the show as they sat quietly in the dressing room while the make-up man from NBC-TV was putting on Edwards's "TV face."

Joan responded heartily to this suggestion. "I should kiss him on the cheek and leave lipstick prints," she laughed.

"Oh, no, not that!" Ralph chuckled. "Our sponsor is Hazel Bishop no-smear lipstick!"

"Maybe I could help you with the commercial," countered Joan. "You could notice the smear and then tell me to go backstage and put on some Hazel Bishop."

Ralph fell in with this idea enthusiastically. Their "routine" settled, the young movie star and Edwards turned to interesting small talk.

Other Ideas

But underneath the layer of brain cells prompting easy conversation, the gray matter of Ralph Edwards's busy mind was occupied with far different thoughts. He was mindful of a roomful of persons, all very dear to Joan Caulfield, who, unbeknown to her, were sitting in a nearby room. It had taken Ralph and his staff one solid month to piece together the life of this young lady unsuspectingly chatting in this room with him. Within the hour the fruits of all the research, conniving, planning and polishing would be shown, not only to the surprised star but to a nation of lookers. From here on out, it was up to Ralph Edwards to jell the program into a living, heartwarming, tear-and-cheer-sprinkled half hour.

November 28, 1952

By now it was 6:40 p.m. and the telecast was going on camera at 7:00.

So Miss Caulfield was escorted on-stage, where, behind the drawn curtains, she was introduced to Henry Wilson's friends and relatives. Actually, these people were members of Ralph Edwards's staff who did a splendid job continuing the game of throwing the actress off the track. They went so far as to pretend nervousness, and the last thing Joan said as she walked through the parted curtains was by way of encouragement to Henry Wilson's friends. "Don't be nervous," she admonished. "Just relax. Everything will be all right!"

As you who saw the telecast know, Ralph made an appropriate introduction for his charming guest and then, with index finger pointing, started to single out Henry Wilson. But instead of finding Henry in the third row, the finger circled around until it was pointing squarely at the girl on his arm. And Ralph Edwards was saying, "This Is Your Life, Joan Caulfield Ross!"

She struggled for composure, then seconds later when her father and mother, supposedly in New York, clasped her in their arms, was a delightful specimen of confused and happy surprise.

To be in on the secret of a program like this in the preparatory stages was a great thrill matched only by the post-show excitement when honored guest, friends and relatives rehashed the entire presentation.

Most interesting, of course, was the surprise-star's reactions.

"I didn't suspect a thing," Joan told this reporter. "When Ralph pointed his finger at me I first thought it was a joke. He's warming

the audience, I figured. Then when he said, 'This is the story of a little girl born in East Orange, New Jersey,' I knew he really meant me. The goose pimples came out all over. I felt as if someone had hit me in the pit of my stomach. But it was a pleasant feeling. Some of my friends thought I was going to faint. Then when I sat down on the love seat, I knew it was on the air—I was on—I had to do something. I heard Ralph

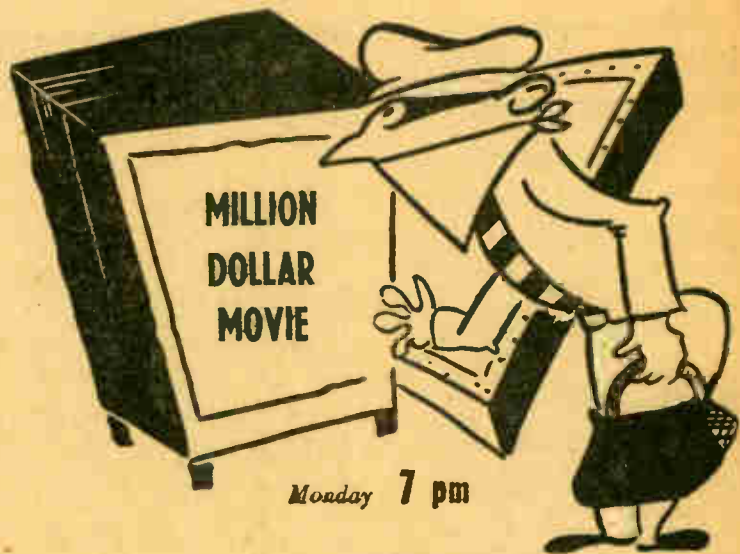

which was made several years ago, is as guilty of bad grammar, but nothing can be done about it. Anyone with wit enough, or sufficiently intelligent enough, to play a role, write a script, ad-lib an interview or guide panelists on today's TV certainly should know a basic rule or two of English. Every time a half million youngsters just learning how to speak hear faulty accusative cases used, it becomes more of a habit to them. It probably does more harm than would a quick-to-be-banned curse. We wish they would all start tomorrow speaking as correctly as they dress!

... The hash of characterizations, dialects and non-dialects that show up on CBS-TV's "Meet Millie," a show with all the basic ingredients of good comedy, but an overdrawn frosting of mad, mad goings-on that generate nothing but embarrassment, at least to us. Possibly direction or writing is at fault, for an actress we have always regarded as a competent chick, Florence Halop, shows up in a semi-Brooklyn, semi-Yiddish comedienne, too-young, over-acted role as "Millie's" mother. And the man-trap schemes of the scripts seem to us terribly overdone. True, it all generates a sympathy for Elena Verdugo as the cute "Millie." We kept sympathetically wondering why she didn't blow mother and hearthside and escape what must have been the same discomfort we experienced at watching the proceedings.

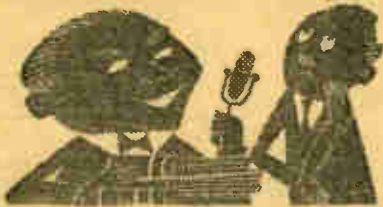
Amos 'n' Andy

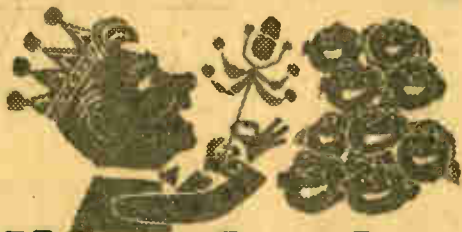

The screech of brakes and the wail of a siren might make you stop and ponder, "But for the grace of God this might have been me."

The Puget Sound Broadcasting Company, in cooperation with the state of Washington's police department, has whipped up a formidable radio program. One that provides thrills and chills simultaneously. The percentage of traffic accidents caused by speeding is unnecessarily high. In an attempt to bring home this point, authentic on-the-spot tape recordings were made of traffic violations.

Listeners eavesdrop while Sergeant George Amans, the program's originator, received a routine call to pick up two cars that were playing tag on an ice-bound highway. The race began as the speed increased. Finally the insane game was sired to a halt. The driver in each case was a teen-ager. One was arrogant, the other subdued when stopped by the officer.

"Why were you driving so fast?" asked the sergeant.

"No reason," came the flippant reply.

"Where were you going?"

"No place in particular," was the answer.

For this the safety of the drivers and the other occupants in the cars was endangered. The stakes were high.

The entire incident was recorded without exaggeration as it unfolded, minute by frightening minute.

Three recorded cases are aired on each half-hour broadcast. The awkward voices, the lame fumbling for words, give the program its ring of reality. It's a concrete way of driving a point home. If you've been speeding and an officer stops you "politely," proceed cautiously because he may have a concealed mike to record the incident.—M. R.

Hawthorne's Prehistoric Gag

When African folk singers Marais and Miranda guested on Hawthorne's show recently they played an "Umbira," a rare African musical instrument made of iron and stinkwood.

They discovered that the instrument sounds exactly like Hawthorne's "Hogantwanger," a weird home-made instrument made of wood and iron that the comedian has featured on his shows for the past several years. Mr. H. admitted that it's the first time he reached back into prehistoric times for a gag.

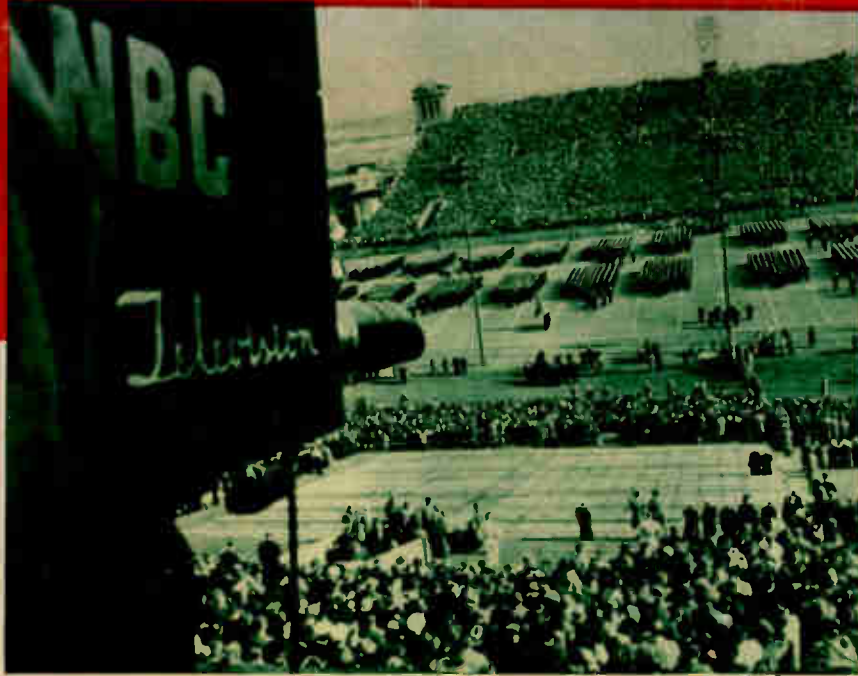

J. Carrol Naish Says

“Luigi” Still Has Lots to Learn

▲ **ALTHOUGH HE** has been in show business all his life, J. Carrol Naish reveals in this story how TV has taught him that he still has lots to learn about show business.

J CARROL NAISH is one of the real “vets” in the acting profession.

Born Carrol Patrick Joseph Naish in New York City, he appeared as a youngster with Gus Edwards's famous kiddie troupe. After seeing action during World War I, he joined Gaby Deslys' “Madame Frou Frou” company and toured three continents, learning four languages and picking up thirty dialects which were later to make him one of the nation's great character actors.

Short stints in New York, Holly-

wood and on the road followed before the Catholic Irishman signed for the first of his many major film roles.

A “Real Pro”

During his years on the Hollywood scene, J. Carrol Naish has been nominated three times for an Academy Award, and has won the Loyola award in 1944, the “Oscar” of the Foreign Correspondents of the World for the finest character actor of 1945, and the Irish Catholic World Award as the best actor of 1947.

On radio, he has given almost two hundred performances as the warm-hearted Italian immigrant. “Luigi Basco.”

Yes, on stage, on film, and on radio, J. Carrol Naish has proven that he is an accomplished, poised, talented artist. A “real pro” in every sense of the term.

Then TV Came

But when it comes to TV, especially “live” TV (which is how “Life With Luigi” is being telecast), then it's a different story.

The short, black-haired actor is the first person to admit that as far as TV is concerned he's just “a rookie breaking in.”

In the comfortable study room of his new Beverly Hills home, “Luigi” explained some of the things he was learning and had already learned about the new medium.

“I've been in show business all my life, but this television show of ours makes me feel as if I were starting all over again. I'm just crawling in and have lots to learn.

“One of the basic problems we have on our CBS-TV show is to sell a whole play in just twenty-six minutes. We have to get our expository material and our punch lines in at just the right time with the right camera effects.”

In conjunction with this point, Mr. Naish pointed out that he believes the writers of television should become more and more important from the production end of it.

New Era

“I've also discovered that television is really a combination of both

the legitimate theater and the movie industry. Unlike radio, and similar to the theater, you must keep remembering to project your character to the first few rows of the audience, because that's the same effect the people at home are getting on the screen.

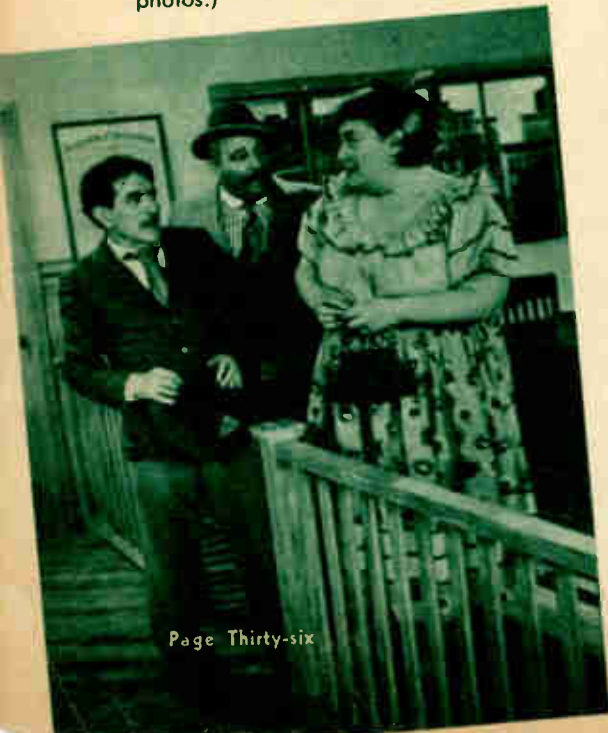
“Of course, doing ‘Luigi’ ‘live’ is a great creative challenge. I love it. I firmly believe that television will provide a great new era for the theater.

“I hope that I can become a part of this new era, and I look forward to it with great anticipation.

“If I fail, then I'll go back to the theater or to plugging songs, as I used to do.”

It looks as if the song-pluggers' loss will be TV's gain—because on TV and radio “Luigi” has become one of America's favorite all-time characters.

That's "Carol" when she leaves the "Space Patrol" set and changes a brief scarlet-and-white bit for the sleek black-and-white, sophisticated street wear she prefers. Is she the kissless, romanceless girl of a million men's dreams?

As far as the kisslessness goes, Virginia alone knows about that aspect of her romances. But of romances there are several. The blonde-haired beauty has about as much chance of avoiding romance as a kitten at a dog show has of escaping attention.

The Categories

Mistress of Magic

*Dell O'Dell Reigns as Belle of the Sorcerers
Despite Constant Rebuffs From the Male Factions*

MAGICIAN DELL O'DELL is never seen without her bag of tricks, and her mischievous bright-blue eyes match her capacity for fun and love of people.

There are so many facets to Dell O'Dell's personality, interests and hobbies that one can't possibly do her justice in a single short story. We can merely hope to scratch the surface of this completely fascinating, complex individual.

Wouldn't Take No

Dell is one gal who wouldn't take "no" for an answer. Her show-people parents objected to her entering the profession, and magicians objected to showing her any tricks. They scoffed at the mere thought of a lady magician. Yet she entered the field of legerdemain despite everyone's opposition.

Before she was out of her teens, Dell was booked at some of the biggest hotels and theaters in the country. Twenty years later the magic of television is bringing the Queen of Magic to a larger and more diversified audience than she has ever known. Dell likes to try her new tricks out on youngsters. "They are more outspoken, they concentrate better than adults and their quizzical whys serve to help me improve my trick," Dell explained.

Although Dell and her husband-assistant Charles Carrer, a noted juggler, have no children of their own, the moppets in the neighborhood are always flocking to Dell's house of magic. They love to match their wits with hers to see if they can unravel a new trick.

Dell is not content with knowing two or three routines. At the moment, she estimates she must have at least 10,000 separate magic feats, of which a good majority are original. Dell composes "patter" or a rhyme for each one of these sleight-of-hand puzzlers, too, in order to make it twice as interesting to her KTLA audiences.

Heavy Mail

Her viewers swamp KTLA with more than 2000 letters weekly. People from six to sixty are curious and interested in magic. Her famous pencil trick alone has bewildered the most astute minds. By way of explanation, her favorite tale concerns the confusion caused among civil engineers, during a conclave,

when a high percentage of them were unable to dislodge the magic pencils which Dell had secured in their respective buttonholes.

Dell maintains a home in Woodside, Long Island, as well as a two-story warehouse which contains all of her magic apparatus and her collection of 10,000 rabbits. She also houses her live little animals in Woodside. She raises and trains her own rabbits and doves which she uses in her acts.

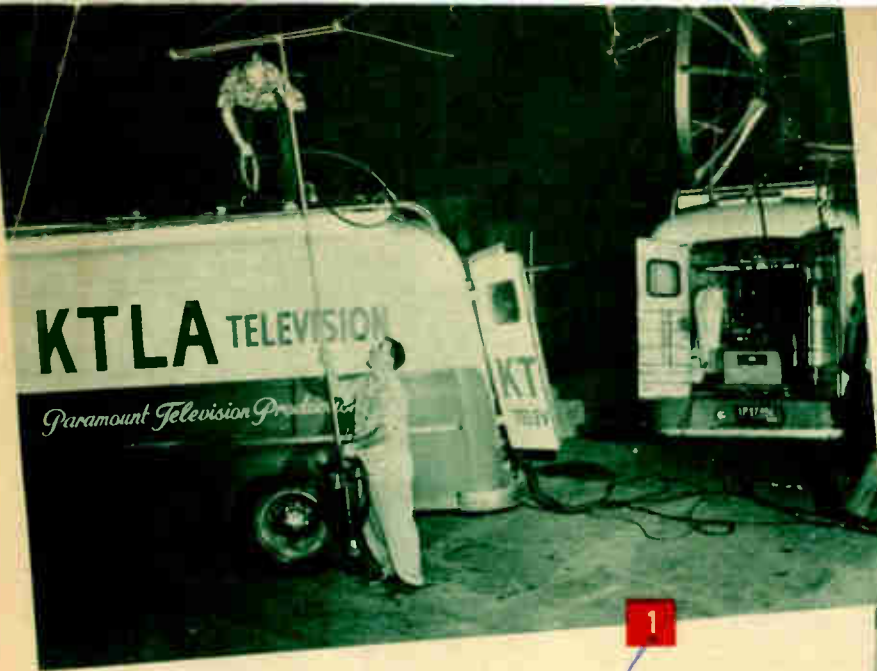
Dell is a gourmet and a photographer, dabbles in physical-culture aids and is active in magician circles. Now that she is settled in California her second homestead is a beautiful thirty-three-foot custom trailer. Dell and her husband Charles, who incidentally builds all of her equipment, work together as a perfect team. There's only one point on which he finds Dell incorrigible. Instead of going on a shopping spree for new clothes, like most women, Dell will take that money and go on a shopping spree for pets. She figures rabbits will last but clothes won't, and he certainly can't argue that point with her.

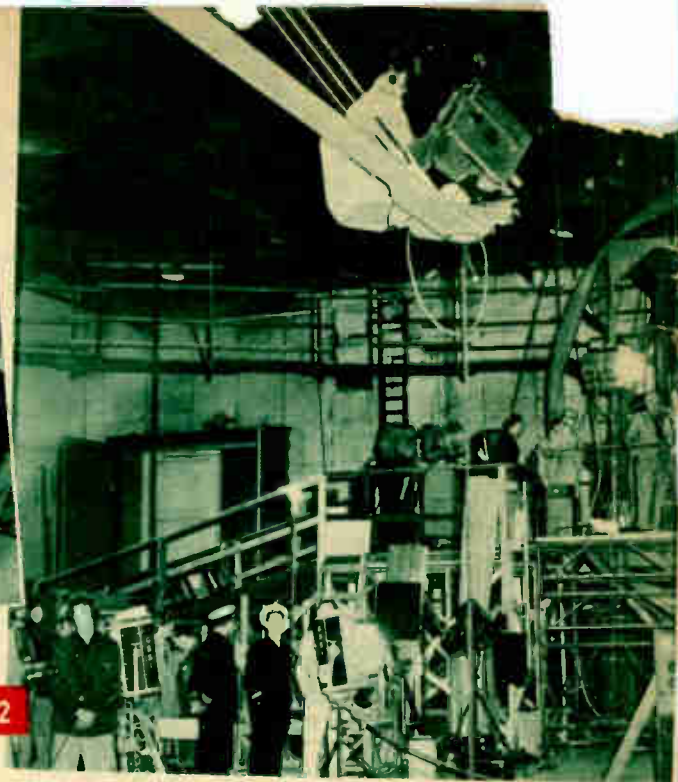
