# She Has No Secret

*Arlene Francis Lets Down Her Brunette Tresses*

▲ **ARLENE'S RADIANT GROOMING** is reflected on the television screen. Cocktail and evening clothes predominate on camera, but even in her casual at-home clothes Arlene looks as sleek as satin.

WHEN WE asked charming Arlene Francis, popular TV-radio personality, how she managed to grow younger and younger with the passing of years, she was both amused and flattered.

Thanking us for the "enormous compliment," she admitted that there was no secret to keeping young. "A diversity of activities and a wide variety of interests keeps one from concentrating too much on themselves. If you have time to worry about wrinkles, I think perhaps that is what creates them. The only lines that keep one looking young are laugh lines." We gather from this that in addition to keeping busy, Arlene doesn't take herself too seriously, which is an admirable trait for anyone.

Arlene's TV and radio appearances

take much of her time. Her schedule often varies from week to week, depending on how many guest-shows she does. Her radiant grooming is reflected on the television screen. The kinds of dresses most in demand for her camera appearances are cocktail and evening clothes. However, she believes that they are more flattering when they have some sort of drapery or sleeve effect as opposed to a bare top. She prefers casual clothes off camera.

Miss Francis has always been a connoisseur of fashions. Whenever possible she emcees fashion shows. Her limited leisure time is devoted to the United Cerebral Palsy Organization, her pet charity. She is one of the co-chairmen of the New York Chapter. "The worthiness of this cause is very close to my heart mostly because it deals with helpless children," she claims.

Arlene's five-year-old son Peter is at an age now where his life is involved in the glories of cowboys and the curiosity of the three R's.

"I make a point," she said, "except for emergencies, to have breakfast with Peter, to see him after his playtime at the close of the day and hear his prayers. On the nurse's day off I take full charge of my family." (Miss Francis's husband is Broadway producer-actor Martin Gabel.)

"I occasionally cook for the family and our favorite food requires no mysterious recipe. We all love steak: steak and more steak . . . budget permitting."

This may not be news to listeners of soap operas, but by her own admission there is hardly a daytime serial that can be mentioned on which Arlene has not appeared: "I had running parts and one-shot character roles on literally hundreds of programs. And incidentally," she added, "this is the best training there is for a young actress seriously interested in her work, since there are no longer stock companies in which to serve an apprenticeship."

The legitimate stage has also claimed Arlene's talents. She considers her most successful stage role that of the Russian sniper in the comedy "Doughgirls." "My most exhilarating theatrical experience, however," explains Arlene, "was being directed by the great Elisabeth Bergner. I also got a great deal of satisfaction playing Mary in Maxwell Anderson's "Journey to Jerusalem."

Arlene met her husband, Martin Gabel, in Orson Welles's Mercury Theatre group. "He was playing the role of Danton and I appeared opposite him. We did not speak socially to each other at that time because I was just a beginner and he was the star."

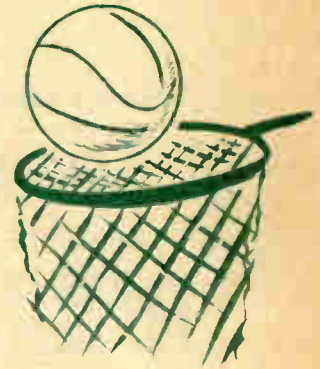




# BB Stars Become TV Stars

For the information of our readers then, here are some of the players you have seen regularly for the past two seasons.

## UCLA

**RON BANE**—a six-foot-two-inch

forward who won his varsity letter last year as a freshman. He's nineteen, weighs 198 pounds, and hails from Alhambra.

**DON BRAGG**—this versatile, sharp-shooting sophomore traveled south from San Francisco to earn his letter last season. He's also nineteen, weighs 190 pounds, and stands six feet four inches.

**MIKE HIBLER**—tallest man on the Bruin squad at six feet seven inches, he's a 202-pound junior who lives in North Hollywood.

**RON LIVINGSTON**—small for a hoop star, five-foot-ten-inch south-paw who is recognized as the spark-plug of the UCLA quintet. A junior from San Gabriel, California, he scored 323 points in 32 games last year and was selected as first-string guard on the NCAA All-Western Regional team.

**JOHNNY MOORE**—strong man, six-foot-five-inch center who is an out-of-stater from Gary, Indiana. Johnny is also only a sophomore, and is a 200-pound demon on both offense and defense.

**DICK RIDGWAY**—although this six-foot-four-inch forward wasn't seen on TV last season, he did earn a letter in 1950-51 when he made 470 points, a UCLA scoring record in a season. Dick is only a junior now and is a local boy.

## USC

**KEN FLOWER**—Captain Ken is generally recognized as one of the outstanding hoopsters on the West Coast. The twenty-one-year-old, six-foot-one-inch senior from San Francisco is playing his third season for the Trojans.

**LEROY KASPERSKI**—a six-foot-

two-inch, 190-pound guard who earned his first letter last season. Leroy hails originally from Cicero, Illinois.

**AL LUDECKE**—a six-foot-five-inch center who is counted on heavily to control the back boards. Al played on the Junior Varsity last year, is nineteen years old, and is also a local product.

**CHUCK REILLY**—another sophomore from Alhambra who won his varsity letter last season. One of the smallest men of the Trojan squad at five feet eleven inches, the nineteen-year-old guard controls the offense from the back court.

Most audiences, used to TV's lavish shows, would have long since departed. But this was a Bob Hope audience. They stuck.

And when the tanned, well-groomed Hope finally bounced into place before the mike, he addressed the entire assemblage with a "Good morning, ladies!"

Ladies? Half the audience were men, big enough to throw even hefty Hope off the stage. But a pleased round of applause greeted this misnomer.

#### Select Audience

The attendees knew Hope was doing radio the easy way. He could be forty minutes late because his show was taped. He addressed them as he did because his noontime daily strip is slanted primarily for madam housewife.

It's radio the easy way. Come late. Say what you want to. Don't use a band. Rehearse in the dressing room with the girl who plays "Lady Editor of the Week." And it turns out as highly entertaining radio fare. Despite the fact that Hope each week does fifty-five minutes of funny busi-

*The Old Master of Comedy Has No Kind Camera To Help Out His Gags. Just a Noon Audience, A Girl, and Gags He Once Wouldn't Have Tried*

ness, as opposed to an actual twenty minutes on his once-weekly show that features also music and song, it is an easier chore. Of course both shows are taped.

Furthermore Bob now gets help from his audience, a turn he would never have employed in the old days. His head writer, Howard Blake, sees that every audience member who comes to supply laughs on Bob's taped show receives a card. Strange abilities are listed, the cards collected, and from them a novel stunt chosen with the guest plucked from the audience.

#### Kindness

When the script is thrown away and Bob deals with, for instance, two girls who talk "G-talk," some of the funniest things come up.

"He's one of the quickest men I've ever heard, fantastically quick, and essentially a very kind guy, so we never have to worry about things

getting out of hand," explained Blake.

"Another part of the show he handles perfectly, that entails no writing, no rehearsing and no trouble, is Bob's advice to women who come up out of the audience presumably to be given advice by Bob's woman editor of the week.

When Arlene Dahl was on, she, as a fashion editor and a beauty expert, was to tell audience members what they could do to improve their appearance. Bob took it away from her, and it was one of the most comical sessions between audience and star you have ever heard.

Those things make it easier for the writer and the producer, but actually more work falls on Bob. He seems to like it, though. He often rushes into the studio between takes at Paramount, cuts a show and rushes out, without getting to have lunch.

#### The Test

And how does the public like Mr.

Hope sharing the microphone with strangers? In an unfair move that seems typical of the men who take ratings, Bob Hope's very first daytime fifteen minutes was graded. He came up with a three something. Just half of what Arthur Godfrey has taken some years to build.

As long as Mr. Hope continues to sprinkle any show liberally with the sort of gags that endeared him years ago, and which haven't failed him even on TV, that rating could well go right on up.

Judging from the shows we have heard, it will. The "li'l old lady," of course, is a rich vein for Bob. His favorite explanation of the elderly bank robber who at this writing is puzzling even psychiatrists, to say nothing of the police, is typical:

"They found a man trying the same trick. But he was just a fat old fellow with a gray wig. But Bing had his alibi. He was golfing with me at the time."

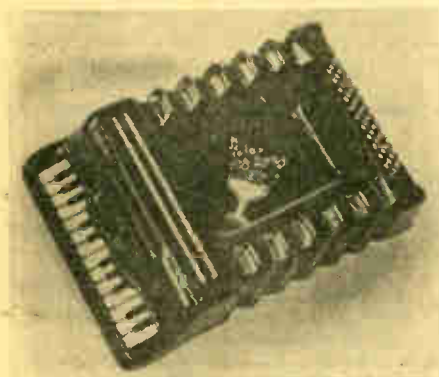

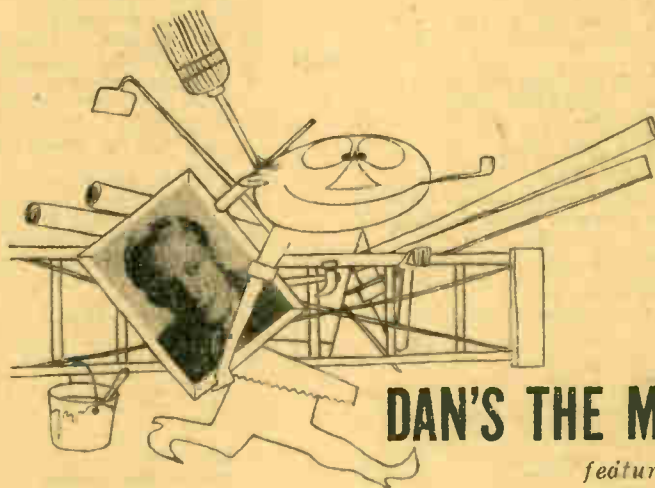

Helen Alvarez of Tulsa, Oklahoma, is manager of and co-owner with Wrather of KOTV Tulsa.

A ten-minute news analysis dealing mostly with San Diego happenings will be heard nightly, Monday through Friday, over radio station KFMB at 8:15 p.m. beginning Monday, February 2. The analyst will be Paul W. White, nationally known editor who is director of news and special events for KFMB. "Swiss Miss." (7) Feb. 10, 10:45. **Laurel and Hardy**, those two masters of sophisticated badinage, cavort around a mountain chalet in this one, and, of course, cause no end of distress. Hilarious scene: Laurel tries to persuade a St. Bernard to part with a shot of brandy from its cask, but the hound eighty-sixes him.

"Father Steps Out." (4) Feb. 9, 11:15. A Caspar Milquetoast type husband and father decides to do a little worm turning and assert himself. So, as the title definitely implies, he steps out, and becomes a new man in the process. With **Jed Prouty**, **Frank Albertson**, and that fine character actor, **Caspar Milquetoast**.

Again it should be pointed out that one of the secrets of his success is his willingness to let his cast members get the laughs while he's the butt of their jokes, the goat of their pranks and the victim of their violin smashing. This is all the more remarkable because some stars have been known to fire performers off their shows because the latter were getting too many laughs.

**PRODUCER ERNIE GLUCKSMAN** and crew did an excellent job with the problem boy, Jerry Lewis, quietly recuperating from his knee injury. Handling of the Martin and Lewis film excerpts with live portions made for smooth integration and a chuckle-packed show.

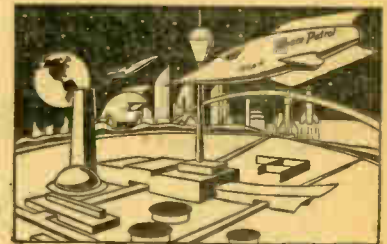

Bob Hope's return to nighttime radio had a familiar ring. It's the same Bob, same format, same fun and folly.

On a recent airer Bob, always quick on political quips, put Mamie in the gag category. If we know Hope, the new family in the White House will be the brunt of good-natured Hopisms from here on out.

James Stewart guested on Hope's show. The pair, along with regular Margaret Whiting, presented a satire on the Hope-Crosby Road pictures. Their version, "The Road to Cactus Gulch," was tired, unoriginal and unfunny.

Miss Whiting's renditions added more to the show than did her comedy efforts. Her timing, intonation and ad-libbing suffer by comparison to Hope's.

Although Stewart is a fine actor, comedy is not his forte and his slow-as-molasses voice is incongruous to Hope's fast patter. Stewart's is too subtle for Hope's type of comedy.

We believe Hope is trademarked and when the ingredients of his show do not live up to that trademark his program suffers.

Les Brown and his band were on hand to provide the music, which is always done up just right.—M.R.

The potentialities of nighttime and early-morning radio are tremendous. This is particularly true in such a city as Los Angeles where thousands of workers are busy until the wee hours in the morning with their defense jobs.

For six hours a night, from 10 p.m. to 4 a.m., on six nights a week, Finley spins discs, pitches products, and interviews personalities from all walks of life on his KFVB show. Meanwhile, Kolpack is busy supervising the restaurant trade which pours into "My Own Place" in the heart of the Sunset Strip.

This all-night radio marathon has many pleasing and profitable angles. First, the audience loves the format and the music, and the response to the program has been tremendous. Second, both Larrys enjoy their work and are making it pay off.

"Finley does all the mike work. He's a big ham," says Kolpack, smiling. "I know it," says the other Larry, "and I love it."

The third, and most surprising (and yet not so surprising) angle has been how sponsors have grabbed up all available time on the Finley show. Starting from scratch, the two Larrys have sold all their available time to reputable sponsors.

And this during an era when they say "radio is dead!" The two Larrys don't believe it, and one can readily understand why when checking their ratings and financial gains.

There hasn't been such a fuss in Philadelphia since the boys got together in 1776 and told Mother England to go fly a kite. This time it's a "TV Declaration of Independence" that the U. S. government and the National Football League are fighting over.

At first I thought that the government was in favor of unlimited TV—whereby the separate clubs could not deny the right to any station to negotiate for TV rights. This seemed to be a preposterous stand and a complete refutation of the principles of free enterprise and individual rights.

Attorney W. Perry Epes made it very clear on the first day of the trial that this was NOT the case. The government does not seek to infringe upon the individual clubs' privileges.

The government does claim, however, that outside groups, such as the National Football League, should not have the power to say "yes" or "no" when it comes to TV and broadcasting rights.

This is a "test" case, and if the government wins it may take similar action against other organizations which condone "TV blackouts." The NCAA and various boxing commissions' "blackouts" would be challenged, and conceivably it could affect almost every phase of television.

For the average TV set owner, and for the immediate future, a government win would be a great TV victory. We're sick and tired of these crummy "blackouts"—especially when various sponsors are eager to foot the bill.

However, as with all problems, there are two sides to the argument. The NFL is out to protect the pro teams. The NCAA wants to protect collegiate football. These organizations, and others, are not AGAINST the TV public. They are merely FOR their own groups. You can't blame a man for defending his own bread and butter.

Like the shot fired at Concord, the final decision by Judge Allan K. Grim will affect every TV owner in the land.

So keep your eyes on Phil-a-del-phi-a, men, 'cause TV history is being made there.

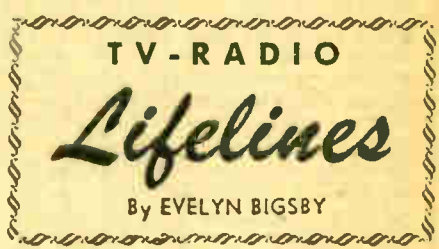

Our radio writers have been missing a good bet lately, though. They're always writing shows that have "Irma" and "Mrs. O'Reilly," the two tuneless wonders, trying to sing. I agree this is the way to get laughs, but our listeners are getting cheated. Cathy used to be the featured singer with such wonderful bands as Red

Nichols, Glen Gray and Ray Noble. If "Irma" and "Mrs. O'Reilly" had their way, they'd keep their mouths shut and let Jane do all the singing. Then you'd get to hear Cathy sing. And so would we.

# The Eleventh Commandment

*Says We Should Love Our Neighbors.  
Lots of Folks Are Showing That They  
Do on Bill Anson's "Have a Heart"*


**EW TELEVISION** programs are created for the sole purpose of being humanitarian. Selling the product is the paramount consideration, with entertainment and/or public service a secondary motive.

But one local show that does render a genuine service to humanity, while it sells the product, is Bill Anson's "Have a Heart" on KTTV.

The show is based on the ever-present problem of needy individuals. Any city of some four million people is bound to have many families who are desperately in need of help of one kind or another.

It is the intent and purpose of "Have a Heart" to help as many of these down-on-their-luck folks as possible. Taking three such cases each week, the program manages to give a helping hand to at least twelve families per month who otherwise might despair of their fellow man being their brother's keeper.

Bill Anson, as emcee of the show, interviews each case in front of the camera, bringing out the specific problem and need. Tommy Crosson, who sponsors the show to sell TV sets in his more than thirty neighborhood stores, acts as sort of an emcee, junior grade. He helps make the people feel comfortable and more at ease. Being interviewed on television isn't a chore most persons enjoy.

"Have a Heart" can point with pride to having given genuine help to a lot of persons since it started a

couple of months ago. For example, it has raised more than \$850 in cash for a paralyzed local youth whose life depends on immediate hospital treatments and whose parents can't afford them.

It collected fifty-seven pints of rare O-type blood for a woman who was badly in need of transfusions.

The show was responsible for raising enough money for sixty X-ray treatments for a woman who has cancer and whose life can be prolonged only by such treatments. She had hoped to be able to get a dozen treatments to stave off a doctor's prediction that she had only six months to live.

When a farm woman near San Bernardino lost her house, furniture and all her earthly possessions by fire recently, the Bill Anson show helped her get back on her feet with a flood of donations from a generous public.

Anson and Crosson played Santa Claus to a family of six youngsters who had never had any toys. They helped a destitute family furnish an empty house.

Most of all, they have given these needy and desperate folks a chance to hold on to their self-respect.

Each week a panel of telephone operators take the phone calls that come in to the "Have a Heart" show during the program. One of the operators is Mrs. Bill Anson, who insists on giving her time to the cause.

## In the Kitchen

**W**HEN THE director's delight, easy-going, blond Ed Reimers, took over KP duty at KTTV, the crews who worked with him on his sports show and his emcee chores openly laughed.

"Cripes! Reimers is going to try to cook! He'll poison us all."

"Within a week every one of that bunch was lined up after the show to eat all he could," muses Ed now. "My first dish was oyster and ham pie, and I guess they figured that as the acid test."

The good-looking actor-newscaster whom you saw on the Ada Leonard Show, the "Calo Pet Exchange" and now on Leo Carrillo's "Dude Ranch Varieties" turned chef because he reasoned that a lot of fellows like to mess around the kitchen, but it has never been made easy.

"You can build a meal on one good dish, and coffee, and cut yourself out of a lot of dishes, pans, and extra work," reasons Reimers.

"You see, the 'Cinema Chef' doesn't do his browning, beating and basting on camera. There's nothing duller than the sight of a mixer running. The swing-shift worker who is home, cooking along with me, would rather watch a movie and just hear the instructions, 'beat' or 'heat' or 'brown.'

"And that same guy wants it kept simple. There's nothing worse than a beginning cook's cream sauce. It usually turns out like the stuff we made relief maps from in school," disdains the practical chef. "So I use canned mushroom soup whenever cream sauce is called for. Tastes better, too."

"We have had some nice response from men. Apparently a lot of guys who like to horse around the kitchen were always stymied by elaborate instructions. But a single dish like steak pie made in a skillet with no crust is right up their alley. Do it the easy way and they'll go with

you," Ed casually explains. "Plenty of mushrooms and a dash of red wine is my answer to the home economist who uses a dozen pans and two dozen rare spices that would baffle most viewers."

Ed explains the alcoholic addition to this mouth-watering goodness hasn't elicited any beefs from viewing Carrie Nation descendants, probably because a guy suggests it. "Anyway, you don't put wine into a dish because of its alcoholic content. You use it for its flavor. And if anyone with a prejudice against using wine in cooking should call me, I can only suggest they check the percentage figures on their vanilla bottle," he grins.

If you pin the emcee-sports commentator down to an honest explanation of his day-after-day success with surprise dishes and 'Favorite Foods of Famous Folks,' Ed Reimers will blithely admit that the most beautiful girl in the world, whom he met on a street corner, secretly helps him.

Former model Katherine Farrell, whom Ed did meet on a New York street corner chatting with a mutual friend, and whom he married as quickly as possible, joined her husband's decision that 1948 New York TV was fun, but the country would be even more fun. The first move was to Albuquerque, then North Hollywood. In his three-year association with KTTV, Ed has become a Hollywood favorite and has also managed to start a satisfactory movie career.

It is this Katherine who many times tries the dish at home the night before, under Ed's prodding tutelage, just to see how it comes out. They eat it for dinner. Then Ed cooks it next day. He's glad to let the crew take over this second effort.

Asked what part of the TV cooking he most enjoys, the frank, easy-going Reimers laconically admits, "Never having to do the dishes."

### Took a Dare

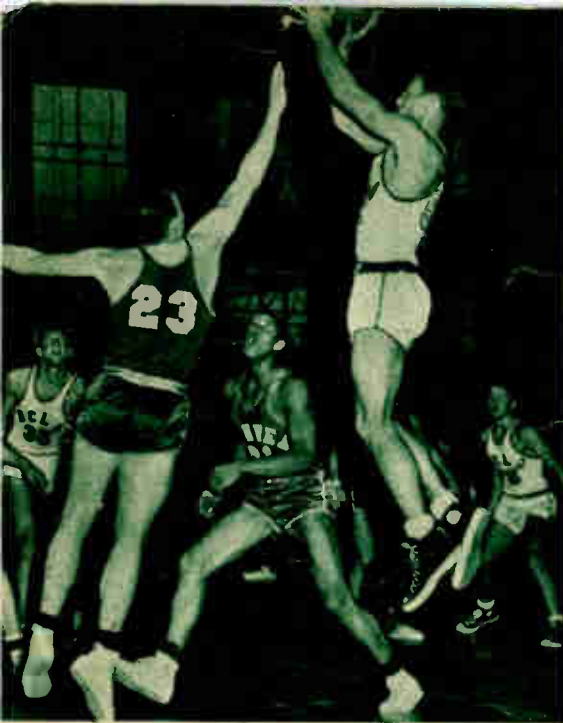
His first dramatic venture came as the result of taking a friend's dare to audition for a San Diego teen-ager participation radio show, and winning the audition.
