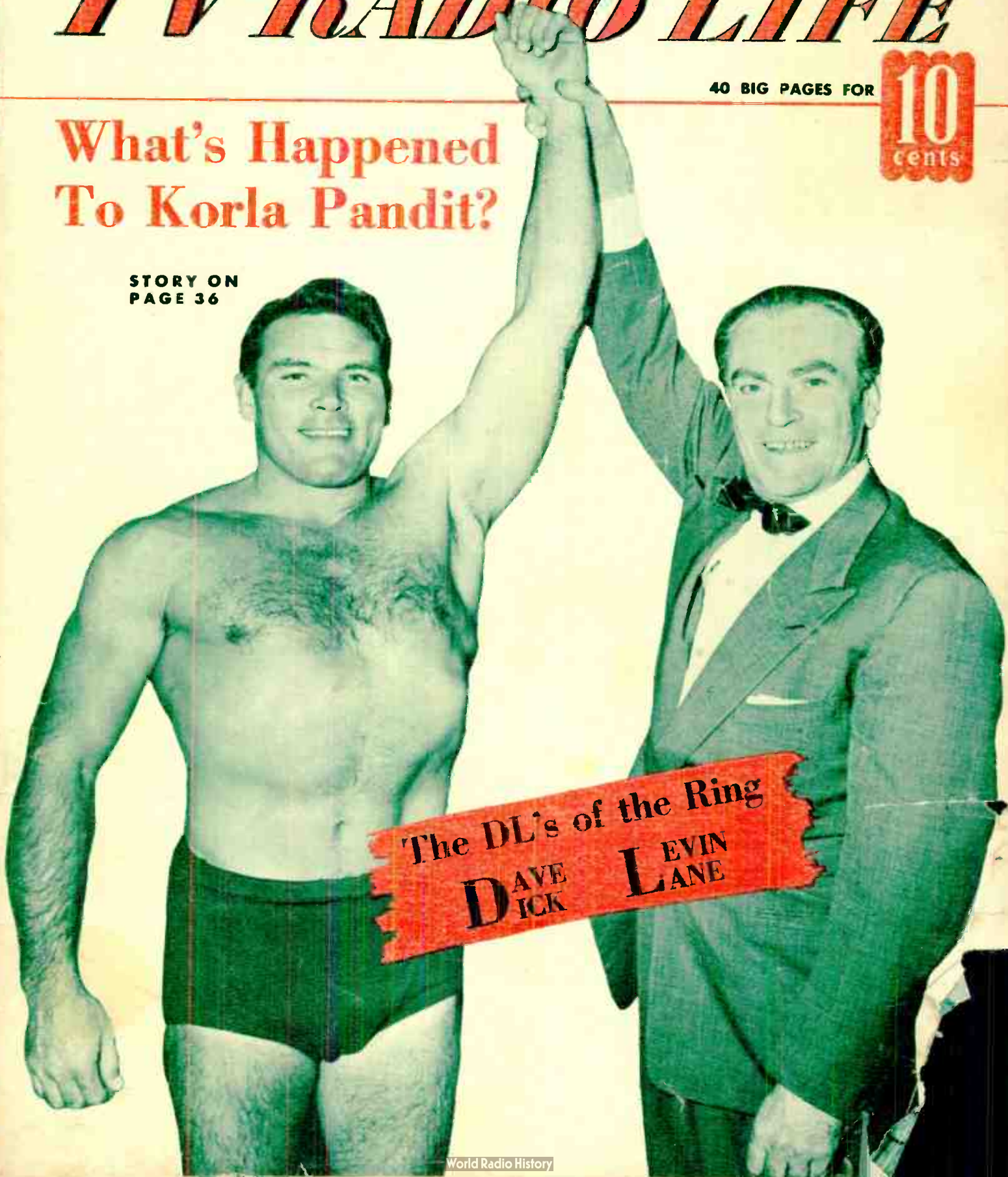

Dreams

DO COME TRUE

*Cathy and Elliott Worked
At Theirs Long and Hard*

CATHY and Elliott Lewis need no introduction along radio row. The fact that "Mr. and Mrs. Radio" established their enviable niche in the drama department years ago is readily recognized. But the fact that they have long cherished a dream to co-star in a dramatic series came to light early in January, when they were launched on their own show, "On Stage With Cathy and Elliott Lewis."

Trying to catch up with this busy pair was no easy task. The only way we could arrange to interview the two of them was at their lovely ivy-covered, English-type home where the Lewises flee when studio chores are ended.

Cornering them in their den, we got to the point immediately with the why and wherefores of "On Stage." It seems that in 1948 they were co-starred in a psychological radio series, "The Clock." Since then they've longed to co-star in another program. Their perseverance and habit of dropping well-placed hints finally paid off when CBS bigwigs decided that maybe those broad suggestions from the Lewises had merit.

When they received the go-ahead from the higher-ups they immediately organized their own company, Haven Radio Productions (which draws its name from the affectionate

tab put upon their home), and packaged "On Stage."

"On Stage" employs their multitudinous talents. Elliott directs, produces and acts in the series. Cathy acts and supervises the scripts, which are assigned to a rotating staff of writers. The scripts are developed around two main characters whenever possible. However, at the onset it was firmly established that Cathy and Elliott would not become victims of stereotyped characters and plots. They resolved not to become foreign agents, newspaper reporters, a private eye and his girl, or a Mr.-and-Mrs. team. Instead their repertoire consists of original scripts, dramas about literary and historical figures, farcical comedy, satire, mystery adventure and melodrama. Variety and versatility are the keynotes for the Lewises. The opening script set off the New Year with a gay, frothy comedy. Contrastingly, a subdued spy vehicle was aired the following week.

The format of the show is refreshing. Cathy and Elliott briefly introduce the week's story and characters. A mere sign-off at the conclusion of the program doesn't suffice. Being an actor's actor, Elliott doesn't slough off the credits. Instead he duly acknowledges the cast with warmth and dignity. The catchy musical theme aired on the show was composed especially for Cathy and Elliott

by their friend musicologist Ray Noble.

In addition to their "baby," Cathy and Elliott appear in motion pictures and collaborate on radio scripts. Elliott produces and directs "Suspense" and "Broadway's My Beat" and handles the role of Frank Remley on the Phil Harris-Alice Faye Show. In recognition of his "Suspense" chores he was awarded TV-Radio Life's Distinguished Achievement Award as the outstanding radio producer-director of 1952.

Cathy, herself a two-time TV-Radio Life Award Winner, is seen and heard as "Irma's" friend "Jane Stacy" on the CBS radio and TV shows.

Despite the many hours a week their schedule calls for, the Lewises try to find time for their hobbies . . . collecting first editions, rare prints, stamps and playing the piano. If Cathy ever decides to give up acting she can qualify as an accredited interior decorator.

Cathy and Elliott will celebrate their tenth wedding anniversary in April, and they claim that "the honeymoon is still going on." After observing their camaraderie and listening to their consistent praise of each other's talents, we know they've got the stuff that makes dreams come true.

Captured by TV!

A Movie Actress, a Make-Up Man, and The TV Cameras Spread the Dragnet

THE JAMES BROTHERS never had it so easy. Their only descriptions came from friends or from post-office circulars which, although widely distributed, couldn't touch the reach of today's televised descriptions of heist artists.

Poor old "Grandma," who aroused in newspaper readers reactions that ranged from greatest sympathy to hearty merriment, didn't have a chance, or wouldn't have, had much more time elapsed between her Robin Hoodings and her apprehension.

Elderly Heist Artist

In case Coronations and Presidential Inaugurations have crowded Grandma's exploits from your news consciousness, she was the elderly woman who held up two Los Angeles banks to the tune of several thousand dollars. Her first daring holdup accompanied words that must have come straight from a televised crime chapter: "I've got a gun here and I know how to use it." That put her crime in the armed-robbery class. Laughable for a "li'l old lady" to pull a job until you remember that same "li'l old lady" might have had an itchy trigger finger that would have resulted in death for innocent bank clerks or nearby depositors.

Limited Description

So the hunt was on. But to no avail. Not enough people had seen

"Grandma" to remember her. And the few clerks couldn't pass out information to everyone. Even before descriptions could be circularized, Granny struck again. This had to be stopped, and Granny's apprehension was one way to stop it.

A drawing of the woman was made, based on descriptions by eye witnesses. Then Roy Neal, head of NBC's Hollywood news department, located an actress who resembled the lady bank robber. She was further made up by Fred Williams, NBC-TV make-up man, to the point where the eye witnesses swore she looked like a double of the suspect.

Finally, the crime was re-enacted for the KNBH cameras and telecast nationwide on NBC-TV so that audiences everywhere could get a complete picture of the wanted woman—her face, body and movements.

Not long thereafter the "Grandma Bandit" was caught. Caught while she was, in the parlance of that trade, "making a bank" in Arcadia, California. Her apprehension was based more on quick-wittedness than on the result of her televised description. But it's a safe bet every bank clerk by this time knew what to watch for.

Here is the way Hilda Plowright, veteran Hollywood performer who has appeared in dozens of films, after years on Broadway, looked as "Grandma."

THE NAME AND VOICE of Jimmy Wallington have been known to radio fans for years. Now his face is becoming just as familiar, through his constant appearances on Channel 4's varied fare.

ONE AFTERNOON early this year a sparkling dark-haired woman was seated in the Hollywood Brown Derby with a handsome, familiar-looking, mustached man. Mr. and Mrs. Wallington were enjoying one of their brief "time outs."

A friend stopped by the small table and greeted Jimmy with a belated birthday wish. "What did you do on your birthday, Jimmy?"

Mrs. Wallington nudged her husband. "Tell him. Go ahead. Tell him."

"Well, nothing," admitted Wallington rather sheepishly.

"Nothing?" laughed his wife. "I'll tell you what we did. We moved. Then we went to a drive-in and had his birthday dinner."

"That's the only day Jimmy had free," she mourned. "You know, when it was just a matter of radio, I had a husband. Now TV has taken him."

"That's why I came down here. You see, Jimmy gets home so late that I can't wait up. We used to try to do all our talking during the time he dressed, shaved and had coffee. Then one day we realized that we couldn't remember a single thing the other had said. We talked so fast and so much that Jimmy finally came to me and asked if he were getting old or something. He couldn't

even remember what I'd said that morning.

"So now one day a week I dress and come meet him. We get a little time to sit down and have a sandwich and visit." She patted her husband's arm fondly. "Of course Jimmy is the one who has to come to work—I just stay at home. Not nearly so exhausting," she grinned.

Nor are the holidays most of us enjoy any exception. The Wallingtons just don't get together on Christmas, or New Years, or the Fourth of July. Nor even Saturdays and Sundays.

The holidays have a football game or a Rose Parade or some special event on NBC-TV keeping the well-known Wallington on hand. For KNBH he does such local shows as the Waggy Wengenheim show, the former Florence Chadwick show, "Farms and Gardens," and the former "Food for Thought."

He has to be on hand at the station for what is called "hack and standby" work. Every fifteen minutes or half hour the station must be identified, whether it be TV or radio, and the staff members divide this duty among themselves.

Mrs. Wallington warmed to her subject. "Even when there is an earthquake, and I'd like so much to have Jimmy home with me and the children, he has to rush off with the news crew. I've learned not to mind celebrating our holidays ahead of

time, but I certainly would like to have Jimmy there during floods and quakes," she rued.

Anyone who thinks Mrs. Wallington could get in from Burbank to Hollywood to meet a husband like Jimmy oftener than once a week doesn't know about the short-order house she has to run. With a little girl still almost a baby to feed and watch, a boy nine to feed and help, a husband who rushes in for a sandwich and the night to feed and watch leave, and three cats, Mrs. Wallington has even her capable hands full.

The Cook's Out

"Sundays used to be such an easy day. Jimmy would barbecue, which meant I didn't have to prepare things inside the house. Then along came KNBH's 'Get the Facts,' and out went the barbecuing. TV not only stole my husband, it stole my cook!" she laughs.

A good-natured friend once asked, more in fun than in malice, "And how do you know Jimmy is actually working all this time he's away from home?"

"Know? I'd have to be blind *not* to know! I can see him practically any hour of the day or night he isn't here!"

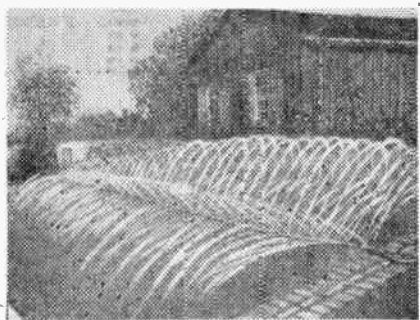

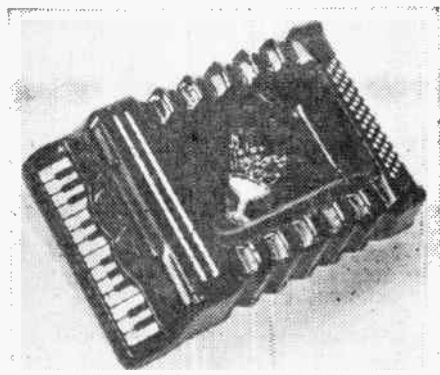

March is a colorful month. It brings a million dollars worth of blossoms at the California International Flower Show at Hollywood Park, and bursting buds on Sierra Madre's wisteria vine. And in your back yard . . . what's happening? Let's spend a minute with our

GARDEN CHECK LIST

ONE: Have any Chrysanthemums? Don't let any old plants grow or you'll have inferior flowers. Instead, divide the roots into small clumps and re-plant, or make several 3 to 4 inch cuttings of new growth and start them in moist sand. Transplant when they are rooted. Some plants improve with age, but not those luscious 'mums!

TWO: When the rains come, preserve the moisture with a mulch on flower and vegetable beds. A blanket of manure, peat moss, leaf mold or sawdust reduces evaporation in warm weather . . . cuts down weed growth . . . and builds up the soil. Good green-thumb insurance!

THREE: Troubled by a bare trellis? Plant some climbing roses, while they are still available as bare-root plants. Recommended (and inexpensive): Red—Paul's Scarlet; Yellow—Golden Rapure; Multi-colored—President Hoover. Don't delay. Bare-root season ends this month.

NOTES FROM THE HOME FRONT

Stuck with that home repair job? Look for a kit, with tools and instructions. You can now get them for refinishing furniture, laying floor and wall tile, tying up tired sofas, refinishing floors and papering walls. The folks who do their own work at home are mighty popular with the manufacturers these days!

Confused by title insurance for that new home? It will guarantee that no unpaid taxes will suddenly appear, a distant relative can't claim your castle as part of an old estate, and you won't discover your private road through the neighbor's back yard is closed off some frosty morning. It isn't required by law in California—but you should insist on it!

It is possible to refinish leather! With a new flexible paint now on the market (name on request) you can brush or spray a new color on leather chairs, luggage or the seats in the convertible. It won't crack . . . and will give you a new touch for old furniture.

Handyman's tip this week—a garage gadget that may prevent an accident. Keep a bottle of window sprayer and a roll of paper towels near the car, for a quick windshield polish before taking to the road. Better vision against the morning sun (important to men living west of the office, wives living west of the market!).

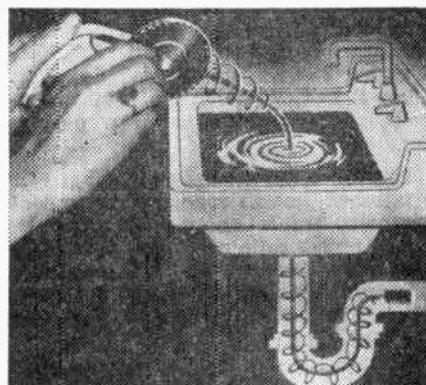

Looking around this week, I've found several interesting items that should be of interest to you. For instance, I ran across a new-to-the-Western-market fan-type heater. The local distributor tells me that it is the only electric thermostatically controlled fan-type heater on the market. It sells for \$19.95, with one-year guarantee on labor and parts.

The State FISH AND GAME DEPARTMENT has just "planted" a new load, all catching size, of 3600 large-sized rainbow trout in BIG BEAR LAKE.

You can take the guesswork out of pie-crust sizing with a wonderful pastry cloth held firmly in place with a wooden and steel frame. The pastry cloth is marked with eight-inch and nine-inch circles for rolling pie crust to the right size quickly. This pastry cloth has an eighteen-inch rule stamped on it for measuring rolls and bread and they tell us dough will never stick to the cloth.

(Serve first week of the month when charge account statements arrive.)

- 8 thick lamb chops
- 8 tablespoons melted butter
- Salt, pepper—1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1 cup sifted bread crumbs
- 1 cup freshly grated Parmesan cheese

Have chops cut as thick as budget will permit. . . . Add salt, pepper and nutmeg to butter, and blend well. . . . Mix together crumbs and cheese. . . . Dip chops in seasoned butter, both sides, then into crumb cheese mix. Allow to rest five minutes. . . . Broil to desired doneness. Serve on hot, hot plates with "Jeweled" baked potatoes, peas with mushrooms—and a freshly made hot mint sauce.

Mint Sauce: Use crushed mint, pear vinegar, salt and pepper, heated together, brought to table with pride and the fine bouquet permeating the atmosphere. Serves four.

Spanish Tortillas**

Stir 1 cupful boiling water into 1 cup of corn meal (or masa, which can be purchased at Mexican groceries). Add 1 teaspoonful salt and 2 teaspoonfuls of bacon fat or cooking oil. Pat into thin cakes; bake on lightly greased griddle; turn as they brown. This makes approximately two dozen cakes.

Keep in your refrigerator. You'll like them with peanut butter spread on them (after warming them in the toaster) along with crunch cold celery, and ice cold milk. This makes a "different" noon-time luncheon.

Star Revue. Perry always has had the voice. But in this NBC performance, largely aided by his own children and **Patti Page** and **Ben Blue**, he showed he has the personality to go along with his talented tonsils.

We View With Alarm

... The excessive and unnecessary description on the Channel 9 basketball programs, especially by **Hal Shideler** during the UCLA - Stanford game, **Jimmy Powers**, **Russ Hodges**, **Tom Harmon**, **Mel Allen**—almost all announcers for all types of sports events—have adapted themselves wonderfully to the techniques of TV.

When the event is simulcast (that is, on both radio and TV) then the accurate, up-to-the-minute play-by-play is a necessary evil for the TV viewer. This was not a simulcast. When we see what is happening, a great deal of the annoying yak-yak can be eliminated. Granted, even with television, basketball may need more comment than any other sport. But Hal could still have saved a few thousand words, and still have done a commendable job.

While we are panning poor **Channel 9**—we might add that this is no reflection on the fine all-around job, particularly the wonderful camera shots, which **KHJ-TV** has done during the entire basketball campaign.

Off Lens (Personalities)

Jackson Wheeler

As each day passes, **Jackson Wheeler** of **KTTV** is setting some sort of endurance record for television.

The versatile Wheeler—he's a top commercial salesman, news reporter,

sports reporter, emcee and special-events man—is now in his fifth consecutive year of TV. During these five years, he has appeared on your screen five times a week. And he has not had a vacation in five years!

Among his many accomplishments, he was the first man in the local area to fully capitalize on the vast late night and early-morning audience. This is particularly true in **Los Angeles**, where so many of our residents are engaged in defense work, and their only time for relaxation is in the very early morning when they get off work.

KTTV is not the only station aware of Jackson's great appeal. Every station in town, even the networks, have wanted Wheeler on their shows. But Jackson says he's going to stick to Channel 11.

A few of his more recent innovations include the Bendix late, late news, early-morning wrestling films, and some new first-run pictures on **Thursday** and **Friday nights** on **Jackson's Major Feature Theater**.

Get out your adding machine, grandma, because here are some mathematical facts concerning Jackson's on-camera activities.

He is now averaging **twenty-eight** shows per week. He is actually on-camera approximately **twenty-eight** hours a week. In brief, this means that iron-man Wheeler is seen in your living room over **five hours a day**, Monday through Friday.

In addition he has **seventy-one** different sponsors per week, some of whom have complete shows.

Multiply these figures by fifty-two weeks, and then by five years, and you can see what an astronomical figure you arrive at.

Many fans have speculated as to why Jackson did not at least receive a nomination for the recent Emmy awards. But that's another subject. Maybe next year.

Jack Benny

The confusion that resulted from **Jack Benny's** having to cancel his



February 22 TV show because of illness was really something. All during the day **CBS** put on slides saying that the **Benny** telecast would not be seen because of Jack's illness, but he was still heard on his radio program that day—all of which mixed up audiences. Then "**Private Secretary**" was put into Benny's slot and there was more confusion when the film shown was one in which he appeared at the end. As if this weren't enough, the announcer at the close of the **Ann Sothorn** show got thoroughly in a dither and said, "Due to Jack Benny's illness we are unable to present '**Private Secretary**' at this time."

P. S. Jack will do the **Jekyll and Hyde** telecast now on March 22.

I HOLD MY BREATH THAT SOME DAY Ralph Edwards and his capable crew will run out of subterfuges with which to lure "This Is Your Life" stars to the program unaware they are to be "it." Joan Caulfield went to the studio thinking an old miner wanted to meet a movie star. Sheriff Biscailuz was trapped (by NBC executives) into showing up to make a plea. Dinah Shore, most recent surprise guest, was kidded into thinking Eddie Cantor's life was to be re-created.

SHE ADMITTED RIGHT ON THE SHOW that she had toyed with the idea of them switching from Cantor to her own life. Frankly, I don't see how anybody could be asked to participate on Ralph's program without at least secretly giving the matter some thought. But such wishful thinking must usually be smothered by appropriate modesty and Dinah, being one of the most unassuming gals in Hollywood, certainly put the thought out of her mind and went to work with a will to make Eddie's big night a rousing success. Through all the preparations preceding the program which was actually to star her, Dinah kept calling Ralph's office to relate some choice bit about Cantor which might be used on the show. Dinah's husband, George Montgomery, can take a heap of the credit for keeping his wife in the dark. Backstage, after

the show, he said it hadn't been easy to fool Dinah. I know what he meant. She's a lot smarter than she sometimes lets on.

PEOPLE IN TV (and Edwards himself, I am convinced) would rather re-create the lives of ordinary persons than dazzle audiences with stars. I have heard that there was sponsor desire, however, to present names quite frequently. Most of them are such good actors it's always hard to decide whether they're truly surprised when their lives are announced or whether their emotional displays are just another "act." Without casting any aspersions on Dinah's acting ability, I'd like to say she didn't need to convince me of her genuine surprise. Her flabbergasted murmurings and obvious struggle for composure jerked more than one tear from me as I sat in the studio watching. One thing in particular stood out from the

recital of her life: She's bumped over lots of rough spots and had to bury much bereavement for one still young. It's good she has lots of happiness now.

SHUTTLING CROSSTOWN in my car one afternoon last week, I caught Godfrey on CBS radio and thoroughly enjoyed his delightful account of his encounters in England. . . . Coffeed with Don DeFore right after he Tveed on "Hollywood Opening Night" and found him just as nice as he looks. Don is active in the Lutheran Church in Westwood. . . . Saw Roberta Linn in Lucey's on her "night off." She was giggling and enjoying herself as if she'd never heard of a breakdown. . . . Read Dale Evans Rogers's new book, "Angel Unaware," and found it extremely touching. It's about the little daughter she and Roy lost a few months ago. . . . Had tea with Chet Lauck and "Tuffy" Goff ("Lum and Abner") and they look just the same as they did ten years ago. They're taping their show Tuesdays and Thursdays to let Chet spend as much time as possible on his cattle ranch near Las Vegas.

"KUKLA, FRAN AND OLLIE'S" final origination from Hollywood was patronized by a large audience, among it Celeste Holm, Jim Hawthorne, Carmen Dragon, and Bob ("Time for Beany") Clampett. Amazing thing about "KF and O" is that Creator Burr Tillstrom doesn't say a word during rehearsal. He lets Kukla run the whole thing! Kuke keeps bobbing up onstage, looking worried and constantly carrying on necessary discussions with the orchestra leader and control booth. "Okay, Kuke," the others answer. Or "Kukla, do you think we should do thus and so?" Never Burr Tillstrom.


DURING A LULL IN SO-CALLED REHEARSAL, Burr did an enchanting routine with his left hand and Kukla. The hand appeared onstage, then perplexed Kuke screwed up courage to investigate this strange object. After several false starts Kukla and The Hand were on good terms, and finally Kuke dragged The Hand over to the side of the stage, tucked the velvet curtains around it, hovered over and asked, "Are you comfy?"

Ralph Levy is one man who will not fool the public. Recently he has been bothered by the use of a curtain for the opening of his Burns and Allen show. Since the show was not being done in a theater and he realized this was the illusion given by the use of the curtain, he decided to experiment by opening on Stage 6 at General Service Studios where the program is filmed.

George Burns would then give his monologue somewhere on the set with grips, cameramen, assistant directors, and the like in evidence. George would even tell the public where the show was being filmed and how. Levy's integrity may very well have led to an intriguing introduction to a great show.

If some night you're turning your dials and find a picture on Channel 6, don't think you're seeing things—because you really are seeing things.

Last week in our office, **Lionel Van Deering**, public-relations head of **XETV, Channel 6**, told us that this newest of television stations had been operating for approximately a month, mainly on a three-and-a-half-hour schedule in the evening. XETV is owned by **George Rivera** and **Emilio Azcarraga**, prominent Mexican radio and TV figures, with its transmitter at Tijuana but with **San Diego** studios.

Some viewers in La Crescenta, La Canada, Santa Barbara, and other sections which have found it difficult to get all of our local channels are finding it easy to get **Channel 6**. In fact, in **Winter Gardens**, a small town near San Diego, TV reception had been impossible until this new channel began operating. The next day TV shops were mobbed with orders for sets.

While the station is now showing mainly movies, Mr. Van Deering added that **Liberace**, "**Douglas Fairbanks Presents**," and **Frosty Frolics** are only a few of the programs to be seen on 6 in the very near future. The only thing holding up full-scale operation, as we understand, is final FCC okay of XETV's studios in San Diego.

Stories of local radio men achieving fame and fortune when "discovered" by networks, are not unusual. But when a network personality heads for the hinterlands, the critics wag their heads, albeit with sympathy. broadcasting station on the **Island of Guam**. The application specifies a 1000-watt transmitter.

Guam and the other islands of the Marianas Group have a combined population in excess of one hundred thousand. Guam itself, with thousands of United States civilian and military personnel, in addition to a large native population, has become the metropolis of the Marianas Group.

If the FCC approves the application, Station Guam will be a new venture in commercial radio.

The "Suspense" series made a commendable deviation with their airing of "Saint James Infirmary Blues" starring Rosemary Clooney.

The talented Miss Clooney proved she could handle lines as well as she does lyrics. The stanza opened dramatically with a few plaintive bars of "St. James Infirmary." Subsequent musical bridges were highlighted by another verse of the blues.

Briefly the plot unfolded a tale of a girl who sought excitement by falling in love with an underworld character. Their brass, bold, brutal code of living appealed to her. When her sweetheart Nick (Tony Barrett) was bumped off for doublecrossing the boss (Bill Conrad) she found revenge in song and murder.

Miss Clooney's terse delivery blended with the throaty quality of her lyrics. Restraint was keynoted throughout her performance. The able supporting cast of AFRA players (in addition to Barrett and Conrad) included Billy Halop and Joe Kearns.

The script was written by Mort Fine and David Friedman, both of whom collaborate on "Broadway Is My Beat." Their dialogue was concise and punchy. Elliott Lewis directed and produced in his usual top-notch manner. Lud Gluskin conducted Lucian Morawek's music.—M.R.

THE BEAN-HALL FIASCO

Hank Weaver was on the spot. He had to make a decision. And he had to make it fast.

Dale Hall stood next to him in the middle of the ring at the Hollywood Stadium asking him to read aloud the typed statement he held in his hand.



Five minutes earlier, the same Mr. Hall had left the ring, crying. Referee Abe Roth had raised the battered Willie Bean's weary arms as the victor in the eighth round on the grounds that Hall refused to make a fight of it. Hall claimed that Bean

was using illegal kidney punches.

Hank gave the paper a quick reading, and then decided not to broadcast it over Channel 7.

I was in the locker room after the fight. It was a madhouse. Nobody knew exactly what was going on; but everyone had something to say about it.

"I've covered a lot of sports events during my life, but this is the strangest thing that's ever happened to me. I did what I thought best," Hank said.

The notarized statement, which Lou Nova and I looked at in Hall's dressing room, claimed that Hall had been beaten up by six Los Angeles officers following his arrest January 31 on a drunk charge. The resulting injuries, according to Hall, forced him to quit.

Contrary to the opinions of many fans, this fight was not fixed. If it was, Dale Hall should get some sort of Emmy award for the year's outstanding acting job. He was a tired, disgusted, and completely confused boy in his dressing room.

I asked one of Hall's handlers: "Why didn't you tell the doctor about the injury before the fight?"

"We did," he replied. "We told the doc he was having trouble with his kidneys."

Dr. John Fahey, the examining physician, reported that Hall made no complaints about rib or kidney injuries or pains when he was examined before the fight.

That's the way the whole story went. One person said this. The other that. Two probes, one by the boxing commission, the other by the police, are still trying to find out all the facts.

The events and conflicting statements which followed the next few days proved one thing. Hank Weaver made the right decision.

you have a million friends out there who are waiting for what you have to say." Up to that point, Dave was feeling as fine as could be expected.

He was figuring, rather hopefully, that only his wife, daughter and relatives were eagerly anticipating his words. The sudden realization that one million faces were looking at him nearly collapsed him. Popular showman Dick's pat on the back worked in reverse—but you all know that the interviews had a happy outcome.

If Dave had only realized it, he would have known he had nothing to worry about—there were four other great guys besides Dick pulling for him—engineer Johnny Polich, director Johnny Silva, promoter Harry Rubin and cameraman TV Walker, who claims that he never missed a shot in his life.

Overcoming obstacles is old stuff to Dave, who started out as a butcher boy in Brooklyn and became interested in wrestling by matching strength with the other butcher boys—all big, strong fellows. They entered an amateur grappling tournament in New York and, when Dave was eliminated by a smaller man, he realized that there was a lot more to wrestling than brute strength. So he joined the YMCA and began a serious study of the profession which was to carry him to the world's heavyweight championship.

In 1937 a streptococcus infection flattened him. Dave said the doctors told everybody but him that he couldn't survive—so he did. All hope was abandoned that he would walk again—but the stout-hearted German boy was determined. He moved to Santa Monica and still credits the California sunshine for his complete, amazing recovery.

Of course the story about Dave's knees turning to water is his. I don't think he does himself justice, as he has been doing a commendable job.

With Dick, who loves wrestling, and Dave, who lives it, television fans have many hours of enjoyment in store.

What Happened to Korla Pandit?

WHAT'S HAPPENED to Korla Pandit? Ever since November 7, 1952, when Korla made his last telecast on Channel 11, this has been the question most frequently asked by our readers—particularly the women.

After over four years of being regularly seen and heard on local stations, Korla's eyes and organ have practically become a "TV institution" here in Southern California. It's little wonder then that his fans have been curious as to his recent activities.

The Good Word

Here's the good word on the popular organist: Korla is still very active in television, and intends to be for quite some time to come. (As a matter of fact, between the time this story is written and the time you read, Korla may very well be back on your TV screens. Consult our logs for this information.)

Nevertheless, between the months of November, 1952, and January, 1953 (and with the exception of a guest spot on "All-Star Revue" and a glimpse of him in the Rose Parade on New Year's Day), Korla was not seen on local screens.

Naturally, people began to wonder about his career. So did we. And when we interviewed the mysterious musician, this is what he told us about his absence and his future plans:

First and foremost, Korla was disgusted with the treatment he has been given by local TV stations.

"Never again will I sign up with a local station strictly as a staff man. In the future, I will sell an entire package," explained Korla.

Although the brown-eyed, "ageless" musician has had one of the most fantastic and faithful followings of any TV personality in Southern California, for some strange reason stations have never been able to convince sponsors of his selling prowess over a sustained period of time.

Starting in 1949, Korla performed for over two years on Channel 5 and over six months on Channel 7. Finally in January, 1952, Manchester Boddy and Channel 11 came up with a proposition that looked ideal to Korla.

Korla has always maintained that his primary interest was in playing beautiful music for his audience.

Concrete Results

"Mr. Boddy," Korla declared, "stated that he was interested in my program mainly as a public service. Mr. Boddy knows what his financial status is, I don't. I do know that before my program went on Channel 11, that on a week end five people visited the Descanso Gardens.

"After I had been on the air for only six weeks, over 3,500 people went through the gates at the Gardens in one week. On one Sunday alone,

they had a crowd of 1,800. And this attendance I built up from practically nothing.

"Consequently, I was greatly disappointed when they informed me that the program was going to be discontinued, despite the fact I had several weeks left on my contract."

Learned a Lesson

These experiences have taught Korla a lesson, he says. He is not going to do a show until he knows exactly where he stands with the sponsor, with the station, and with everyone else concerned.

Also, in the future, Korla says he would like to do his shows on film. And he wants to be seen on some coast-to-coast program. He feels he's ready for national recognition now.

"The ten Snader telecriptions which I made in August, 1951, and which have been shown all over the nation for the past year, have been tremendously successful. But a person has to be careful about films. Because they can be shown over and over again. I want to be sure that I control them."

This is what Mr. Manchester Boddy had to say on the cancellation of Korla Pandit's program:

"We were very happy with Korla. He is undoubtedly one of the best people any sponsor could have in this area.

"Unfortunately, we had set aside

"Rocky King" Remembers

When a Military Uniform Got Him a Job; When Mae West Played Ingenue; And TV Was a "Buck Rogers" Threat

ABOUT THE first of this year, Roscoe Karns, veteran actor who plays the warm, kindly-hearted chief inspector of a big-city detective bureau in KTTV's "Rocky King, Detective," celebrated a fourth year in TV. That's a long run, by TV standards.

By the standards of the series' principal, this is mere infancy. Roscoe Karns can remember back over a span of years and wealth of show-business experience rivaled by few active "thesps" today.

Can you remember the picture "Night After Night," which boosted two other players to eventual stardom—Mae West and George Raft? That was a Karns starrer, an old picture, but one which richly rewarded Roscoe Karns.

Doubling in Brass

A military uniform started Karns on an acting career, and he has never attempted to earn so much as a dime in any other work. He was attending military school when the stage bug hit him. In order to study acting techniques, he applied for an usher's job at a Los Angeles theater. That's where the uniform gave him a break over seven other candidates for the job. The theater manager decided it could double for an usher's outfit, and save the cost of costuming the new jobholder.

To his Hollywood colleagues, Karns has long been known as a "lucky" actor. The implication is "lucky" to them. Among actors who made their film start in pictures in which Karns

had important roles are Gary Cooper, Franchot Tone, Robert Young and William Bendix, to name only a few.

He regards his own lucky picture as the "Night After Night" which helped Mae West and George Raft. This brought Karns a ten-round contract at Paramount.

Favorites

Karns can look back on "It Happened One Night," Claudette Colbert and Clark Gable starrer, in which he played the traveling salesman. He terms this his best picture. He recalls "Twentieth Century" as his most satisfying. In this he worked with John Barrymore, and wound up a fervent admirer of the late star. He will talk Barrymore with anyone, any time, any place.

Broadway also featured the Karns talents. He played for forty-five weeks as the star of "School for Brides," and on the West Coast he went for seven months in the Los Angeles company of "Front Page," in the "Hildy Johnson" role created by Lee Tracy.

Millions of film fans saw him in more than 200 pictures. Newspapermen, detectives, salesmen and press agents provided most of his screen roles. Frequently he used to comment, "I would love to do a serious role. But I know I never will. I'm definitely typed as the light comic type."

As "Rocky King," Karns has an opportunity to mix his serious side more deeply with his humor. Not that he doesn't provide the usual Karns quota of homey laughs, but his role comprises more than that.

As "King" he goes about his job sympathetically and understandingly, not with the hard-boiled, smart-cracking technique that stamps the majority of fictional detectives.

Remembering

Probably Karns will go right on doing "Rocky Karns" for a good many years and the good many viewers who each year purchase TV sets. Should he ever weary of the role, as an ardent admirer of Barrymore could, he can always remember that many another TV actor never set foot on the stage with the Great Profile. He can also remember Mae West as a beginner, in a Karns starrer.

But above all, Roscoe Karns can reflect that few other TV characters have safely passed their third anniversary in television. And he's happy, remembering.

"Heritage"—A New Radio Series Which Traces Man

From Middle Ages to Modern Times

WESTERN CIVILIZATION as we know it today is a relatively young phenomenon. By a measurement of time, and in comparison to many ancient civilizations such as those of China, Egypt, Babylon, and others, Western man is still a babe in the arms of culture.

But by any other standard of measurement, the progress of Western man since the Middle Ages has been a fantastic and magnificent achievement. Almost unbelievable developments have been made in the fields of science, art, literature, exploration, invention, and religion.

It's important—and lots of fun too—to study and understand the motives and drama and consequences of our achievements. It is important because it helps us to evaluate ourselves and our neighbors. And it is even more important because it makes us realize the tradition and background behind the very issues now being defended by Western civilization in its fight against Communism.

History of "Heritage"

Last year, LIFE magazine published a "Picture History of Western Man," tracing our heritage from the Middle Ages to modern times. It was

an outstanding job, from both an aesthetic and a pictorial standpoint.

In December, the American Broadcasting Company, under the guidance of LIFE magazine, began a series of broadcasts dramatizing the magazine's articles. It was a tremendous undertaking, but the radio magnates decided it was worth the effort. They called it "Heritage."

The first program presented the life of Leonardo da Vinci. Leonardo, with his precise, logical and imaginative brain, is generally considered the supreme example of the Western mind. His innovations in the fields of art, science, inventions, and philosophy have affected the life of every human being born after him.

Bill Shakespeare

"Bill Shakespeare in America" was the theme of the second program in the "Heritage" series. It was the amazing story of how the eighteenth-century pioneers on the American continent reacted to the words of Shakespeare, which were presented in most frontier settlements by traveling thespians. Strangely enough, the rough and ready pioneers took their Shakespeare very seriously. It was not unusual for street fights and brawls to break out immediately after a performance of "Hamlet."

The third program—and we are

merely enumerating them to demonstrate the immensity of the program's subject matter—explained how "time measurement" has affected cultural development.

Other programs included: the origins of the Christmas tradition held dear to Western civilization; a dramatization of three of Chaucer's "Canterbury Tales"; and many others. All of them are concerned with the intricate, struggling, and rewarding tales of modern man's "Heritage."

Besides the guidance of leading scholars and educators, Director Sherman H. Dryer utilizes outstanding production work in music (by leader Ralph Norman), unique sound effects, and excellent narration (by Charles Irving).

Dryer and the entire ABC network have striven for and have achieved top-notch entertainment and education for all age groups.

Anyone Can Write a Song!

You Don't Have to Be a Musician or a Singer With an "In" Like Flynn's Around Hollywood's Busy Publisher's Row . . .

THERE'S A certain formula to this racket, just as any other, that is usually followed. Of course TV and its contests have introduced some mighty worthwhile tunes. But generally an ex-bandman sweats over notes and words for months, then plods around Hollywood with his final effort, finding a company that will invest in publishing this tune. Or two fellows work on it. One is a music man, one does the lyrics, or words. They have two sets of feet to plod with.

Prose and Pops

Once in a while a singer comes up with a dilly. In Frankie Laine's case, he wrote a tune before he was accepted as a singer, and had to dust it off to present after success struck.

William Saroyan departed from penning his great, sometimes puzzling things to collaborate on a ditty that swept the nation. Remember "Come On a My House"? That same song didn't hurt Rosemary Clooney a bit, either.

But how does a sixty-year-old socialite get a look-in? By simply writing a tune, and matching lyrics, good enough to have it accepted by one of the nation's top band leaders. You can bet being a socialite has nothing to do with it, either. Too many *un*-socialites have more talent, and more time to tout that talent, and can get to a busy band leader like Freddy Martin more quickly.

But Mrs. Marie McHenry, a sixty-

year-old Westwood resident, wasn't daunted by being either a socialite, or sixty. She worked on her song, then fitted words, and called the whole thing "Let's Dance Tonight." It's true that Freddy Martin had been a friend of Marie's for years, but not such a friend that he would adopt the tune's title, "Let's Dance Tonight," as the title of his new album. The song heads the list inside that album, too.

New Life

And with acceptance of her song came a series of experiences a middle-aged socialite would seldom have occasion to experience. First of all, Freddy Martin himself arranged a birthday party for the song-writer. He introduced her tune coast to coast on the NBC radio network from the stage of the Hollywood Palladium, where the party was held. Two score or more, all relatives and friends, were invited to join Marie at the Palladium, where she was presented with a sixty-first-birthday cake and candles while her song was being played. Doubtless some of these socialite friends hadn't been aware such fun existed outside Romanoff's and Mocambo.

Mrs. McHenry was sent onto disc-jockey shows to "plug" her song, just like any other composer with a hit. She didn't know the song writer's jargon at all. Mrs. McHenry just visited sociably, had a good time, and left the listening hopefuls with the distinct impression that "anyone can write a song."

a definite budget for Korla's program, and the budget ran out before Korla's contract expired. However, we did pay Korla for the full time of his contract.

"Originally, we had signed Korla in the hopes of getting a national show. These plans never worked out.

"Also, the season at the Descanso Gardens ended before the contract did and we had a longer contract than we anticipated.

"All in all, our association with Korla during the time he was on TV for us was very satisfactory."

That, folks, is both sides of the story. And that is "what happened to Korla Pandit."
